BODEMEISTER DRAWS 6; MADE EARLY CHOICE

Zayat Stable LLC and Michael Moreno's **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker), last-out winner of the GI Arkansas

Derby, drew gate six and was made the tepid 4-1 morning-line favorite for Saturday's 138th running of the GI Kentucky Derby at historic Churchill Downs.

"I think everybody had a sigh of relief," admitted trainer Bob Baffert. "Nobody wants to be in the one hole. I like post six, it's been one of my favorite numbers. I've had good luck with it." As for his other Derby entry, **Liaison** (Indian Charlie),

Baffert added, "I am disappointed with the 20 with Liaison, but you just have to take what they give you."

Jockey Mike Smith, who will partner Bodemeister Saturday, was asked by NBC's Donna Brothers at yesterday's draw how he would handle having speed horses like **Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg)--breaking from post nine--and **Hansen** (Tapit)--coming out of the 14--to the outside of him. The always quick-witted Baffert quipped, "Don't tell her, Mike."

Smith, however, graciously obliged. "Naturally, he's a very quick horse," offered Smith. "He always gets away well, and if he leaves just a tad slow, I have some time to get him where I want him. We'll just have to play it off the break and see what happens."

While Baffert had his questions answered early in the draw, the connections of reigning juvenile champion Hansen were forced to sweat it out a bit. With two pills left in Dan Bork's shaker--the dreaded inside post and the 14 hole-- and the names of Hansen and **Daddy Long Legs** (Scat Daddy) left to be assigned, it was the Coolmore runner who landed the rail. Wearing sunglasses, perhaps to mask his internal strife, Dr. Kendall Hansen reacted with a fist pump and three taps of his right hand over his heart. Hansen exits a runner-up effort in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and is a 10-1 chance on the morning line.

"I wanted the 14 [hole] or 15 from the start, so we can keep our eye on Trinniberg and Bodemeister," said Dr. Hansen. "I really wanted those spots to get the gap, so you have less chance of getting pinned back at the start. I'm extremely excited about it."

Track handicapper Mike Battaglia made GI Fasig-

Tipton Fountain of Youth S. winner **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) the 9-2 second choice on the morning line yesterday. Trained by Michael Matz, the bay drew position four. In his latest start, the Chadds Ford runner was third in the GI Florida Derby behind **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy), who was given a 15-1 chance.

"The horses in the one [Daddy Longs Legs] and the three [Take Charge Indy] maybe don't have that much speed," said Matz. "We'll just have to see what Take Charge Indy does and **Dullahan** [{Even the Score} from post 5] comes from behind, so that should push us closer to where Bodemeister is and we know that horse has speed. It looks like we're ok, but we just have to come away running and Julien [Leparoux] has to have a nice position. It's up to them at that point."

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas drew the two-hole with **Optimizer** (English Channel), who squeaked into the field at the 11th hour when Mark Valeski (Proud Citizen) was pronounced out of the Derby Tuesday. The Bluegrass Hall runner was listed at 50-1 on the morning line.

"There were a few up there I'd rather have, but it's Ok, because we have a speed horse anyhow and it is pretty much the shortest way around there. We'll accept in and make the best of it."

Dishing at the Derby Draw...

TAKE CHARGE INDY (*Post position 3, morning line 15-1*) -- **Trainer Pat Byrne** -- "I love that we are inside and are going to have an inside trip. I'm glad we didn't get the one. I called [jockey Calvin Borel's] agent [Jerry Hissam] and to quote Calvin, he said 'dangerous.' It's a great spot. Borel wanted three to eight and we got three. We were three in the Florida Derby and he was three the first time he ran [and won by 6 1/2 lengths at Arlington last July]."

CREATIVE CAUSE (*Post position 8, morning line 12-1*) - **Trainer Mike Harrington** -- "It's perfect. The post gives him a chance to get out and get a good stalking position. Depending on the speed, I expect him to be three or four lengths off the leaders. That's the way he runs."

ALPHA (*Post position 11, morning line 15-1*) -- **Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin** -- "We're first in the gate, but he's been great. It's just going to make me more nervous. But he's going to be fine. We can't do anything about it. I'll just be nervous until they spring the latch."

DERBY IMPRESSIONS: WEDNESDAY

The posts are drawn and the field is set for the 138th running of the GI Kentucky Derby. No earth-shaking draws for the favorites; in fact, the first two positions

from the rail and the four farthest--generally regarded as undesirable posts--are occupied by horses who are likely to be at odds of 25-1 or higher come post time. The lone exception being GI Santa Anita Derby

winner **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley) in the 19. Horses that could be single-digit odds, however, all drew well: morning-line chalk **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) is in the six hole, with **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) in the four, **Dullahan** (Even the Score) in the five, **Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) in the eight, **Hansen** (Tapit) in the 14 and **Gemologist** (Tiznow) in the 15. Hopefully, a bad post--we're thinking of you, Lookin At Lucky--won't play into the race's outcome.

The draw itself was held in the Secretariat room on the second floor of Churchill Downs, a cavernous room with white walls and floors that has the feel of an upscale dance club. Well, sort of upscale. Anyway, the event seems to have become increasingly popular in recent years, and the increasing number of people in the room directly parallels its mean temperature. It was warm.

The Owners' Group of the Night Award easily goes to the Dullahan, whose backers were vocal and seemingly intent on embarrassing someone named Steve Webster. Steve--if I am indeed getting your named right--you have raucous friends.

Union Rags's owner and breeder Phyllis Wyeth was on hand with some friends, all sporting tan Union Rags hats. Wyeth, who gets around in a motorized wheelchair after a 1962 car accident left her with severe nerve damage, thought her colt could have drawn better, but as she said, "It could have been worse." Asked what would have been ideal, she said, "Don't we all want seven, eight, nine?"

Wyeth has been a constant presence around her star sophomore this week, visiting Michael Matz's barn in the mornings and calmly taking in the scene. Yesterday morning was particularly hectic; there must have been 50 or 60 people in the grass yard behind Barn 42, circling Union Rags as he got a bath and then nibbled on grass. Wyeth herself chatted with Matz and with jockey Julien Leparoux; Matz brought over an Indian Charlie newsletter with a story that referenced Union Rags that he thought was amusing.

Back at the draw, Tammy Fox, assistant trainer to and wife of Dale Romans, said she was fine with Dullahan's post five. "You can't complain about it," she said. "As long as they all get away from there clean and everybody has a safe trip, that's all you can ask for." Dullahan is a big horse, but Fox said she's confident he and jockey Kent Desormeaux will be able to extract themselves from traffic issues. "Kent has a lot of confidence in him and he's pretty much push-button, so if Kent has to do something really sudden, he'll do it," she said.



It's no surprise, given the Kentucky Derby's significance, but it's still nice to see how much the local TV and radio stations support and cover the Run for the Roses. Each morning, crews are out on the backstretch in the pre-dawn hours, and there must have been 10 or 15 different outlets covering the draw, interviewing guys like Steve Asmussen and Doug O'Neill. At one point, Bob Baffert was being interviewed by one station while, just feet away, his wife Jill was being interviewed by another.

The crowd participation is equally heartening. Earlier Wednesday, a huge mass of race fans joined with horsemen and

media types on the backstretch to watch the Derby and Oaks horses go through their morning paces. Standardbred owner and Thoroughbred fan Greg Schuler, with his wife of 33 years Barbara, said, "I've been coming here for a long, long time--typically on the Wednesday before the Derby, because it's usually not so crowded--and this is as many people as I've ever seen back here."

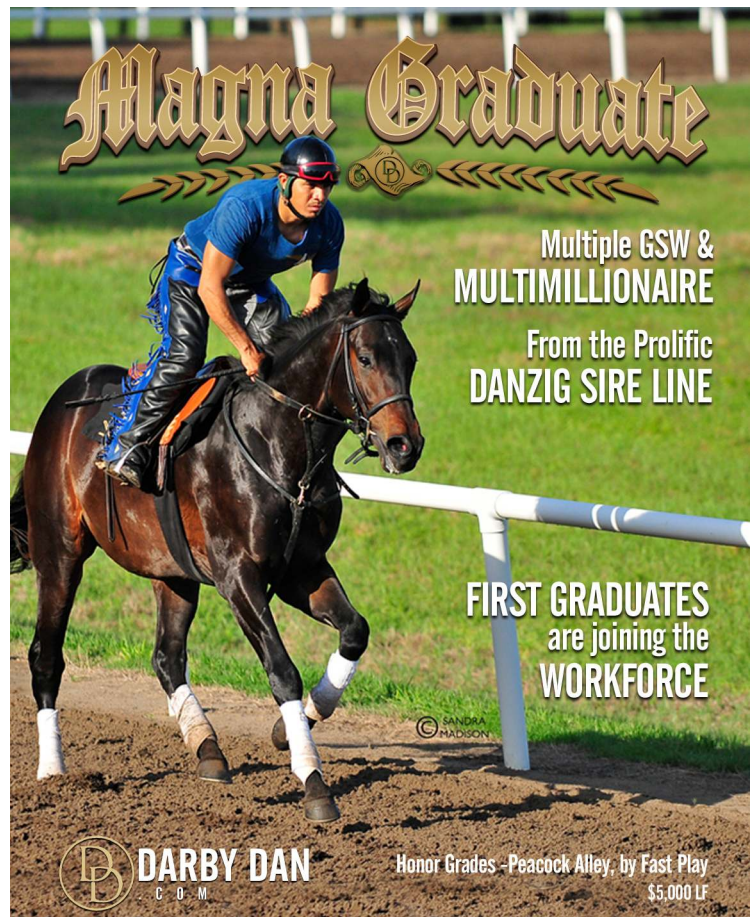
At the middle gap, Baffert remained stationed with trainer and friend Bernie Schiappa, and was joined by another of his owners, Kaleem Shah. Shah has invested plenty into the sport in recent years, and while he doesn't have a horse in this year's Derby, he's well-represented by **Eden's Moon** (Malibu Moon) in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Connections have reported the GI Las Virgenes S. heroine is training superb, and though she took a step backward when third in the GI Santa Anita Oaks last out, her 12-1 morning-line price seems too high. She's playable at half that, and continues to look well in the mornings at Churchill.

Also standing at the gap this morning were Hidden Brook Farm's Jack Brothers, Nicoma Bloodstock's Headley Bell and Glennwood Farm's Tanya Gunther, with Lane's End's Sarah Champion and Spendthrift's Sean Feld taking in the scene, too.

I saw a few more horses today that I hadn't previously seen. Gemologist, who arrived at Churchill Tuesday, is a handsome horse, not a shock given his sire's propensity for throwing some real Hollywood-types. **Grace Hall** (Empire Maker), the morning-line choice for the Oaks, also looked good. She's a thicker filly than I expected, and longer. Optimizer, having just secured a spot in the field on Tuesday, made the short trek to the track from trainer D. Wayne Lukas's barn. He's not an overly big horse, and doesn't have the giant engine behind that a lot of dirt horses do.

Given his pedigree, obviously it wouldn't be a surprise to see him on the turf sooner rather than later. **Went the Day Well** (Proud Citizen) continues to be a horse that looks good--especially on the track. He's not a bad-looking horse in the shedrow, by any means, but he really seems to puff up a bit on the track.

I also saw **El Padrino** (Pulpit) for the first time at Churchill yesterday and came away with a very favorable impression. He's a big, strong chestnut. I saw him as a 2-year-old at J.J. Pletcher's training center in Florida, and he was handsome if unrefined at that point. He looks like a different horse now--stronger through the back and withers--and has an air of confidence about him.

The star of the show, however (for me at least), has definitely been **Union Rags**. He just looks awesome out there; never seems to get riled and appears to be a confident, happy horse. As mentioned, he drew a big crowd yesterday while getting his bath--one would imagine that was a first for him--but he didn't care much. He looked at the crowd, played with his groom. Later, he schooled in the paddock, and it was much the same. He watched the horses go by, looked back at the cameras with interest. Eh, what's next?

BROOKDALE'S DERBY DUO

Twice each year, Brookdale Sales' Joe Seitz makes a trip out to Virginia see the yearlings at Audley Farm, a Brookdale client for the better part of a decade now. During one such trip in early 2011, he was eager to see the progress of a colt whose pedigree stood out on paper, a son of Empire Maker out of a fast graded stakes-winning daughter of Storm Cat named Untouched Talent.

As he sat on the back porch of farm manager Jamie Mcdiarmid's house at Audley, which abuts a big yearling paddock, he watched the colt, not overly big, playing with some of his friends.

"We were sitting there just shooting the bull, and that yearling walked by three or four times, just because he was messing with some of the other horses, and he had such a huge walk to him," remembered Seitz. "We started joking about it: this sucker's gonna run."

Seitz and Mcdiarmid's impression wasn't wrong, and on Saturday the colt, better known as Bodemeister, will show just how much running he can do.

Bodemeister is owned by Ahmed Zayat's Zayat Stables and Mike Moreno's Southern Equine and is trained by Bob Baffert, and will be one of the favorites for the 138th GI Kentucky Derby after his GI Arkansas Derby romp.

Brookdale sold Bodemeister on Audley's behalf for \$260,000 at the 2010 Keeneland September Sale. But he wasn't the only horse in Brookdale's September draft who, some 20 months later, would find themselves in the Kentucky Derby starting gate. In a 'Tale of Two Horses' sort of story, Brookdale also sold I'll Have Another (Flower Alley). His price? Just \$11,000. I'll Have Another has since well outgrown that price,

as well as his subsequent \$35,000 OBSAPR tag, winning the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Robert B. Lewis S. for owner J. Paul Reddam and Doug O'Neill.

"Bodemeister wasn't very big--he was medium-sized--but he just stuck out," Seitz said when asked about the pair. "He sold for \$260,000--which is good money--but I think if he was an inch taller, he'd have brought significantly more. After that, he blossomed from his yearling to 2- and 3-year-old years. He really filled out quite a bit."

If Bodemeister was handsome and just got better looking, I'll Have Another was going through an

ugly-duckling phase when Victor Davila signed for him as a yearling (the colt later sold to Dennis O'Neill at OBS). "He was unimposing," said Seitz. "He was kind of narrow through his chest and light in his hip, and slow to mature. He was pretty nondescript. But he was very correct, and he was athletic and balanced."

Despite two very different starts, the colts now find themselves in the same place under the Twin Spires of Churchill Downs, and Seitz said watching the pair this spring has been "indescribable."

"The way Bodemeister won the Arkansas Derby was breathtaking," said Seitz. "And it's Baffert and Zayat, people who have been very solid horsemen who campaign their horses the right way. Because Baffert's horses get so much press we see a lot of him, and it's been great. And I'll Have Another has improved remarkably over the past two months. The way he won the Santa Anita Derby was pure grit and desire. He is peaking at the right time."

As for selling a pair of Kentucky Derby starters, Seitz said all the credit belongs to the horses' breeders.

"I can't compliment the folks at Audley enough on their ability to raise a horse," said Seitz. "I've always called them the Claiborne of Virginia; that's what I tell people. It's just huge fields and rolling hills. And the people at the farm, Jamie McDiarmid and Dr. Jens von Lepel, are amazing horsemen. That's why they're having this success."

Brookdale itself raised I'll Have Another, but again, Seitz says the credit belongs with his Lexington-based breeder Harvey Clarke.

"Harvey's owned broodmares and some horses-in-training with my father [Fred Seitz], and he is a salt-of-the-earth, very special friend and client," said Seitz.

**NTRA SAFETY & INTEGRITY ALLIANCE
STRENGTHENS CODE OF STANDARDS**

The NTRA Board of Directors recently approved a revised and updated Code of Standards for racetracks seeking accreditation through the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance in 2012. This effort continues the Alliance's commitment to introduce new, more rigorous Code standards each year.

Major changes in 2012 include a requirement for regulatory administration of furosemide (Lasix), elimination of adjunct bleeder medications and a lowering of the threshold level for Phenylbutazone (bute). Also added are newer, more stringent guidelines for race day security.

Racetracks accredited in 2010 that are seeking re-accreditation in 2012 and those applying for accreditation for the first time in 2012 must meet the Code's new minimum standards.

Racing fans, regulators, racetracks, horsemen, jockeys, veterinarians and others helped shape the new Code through a series of Alliance Advisory Committee meetings and a period of public comment earlier this spring.

The Alliance, formed in October 2008 with the goal of establishing national uniform standards in the areas of safety and integrity, includes 55 racetracks in North America and every major horsemen's organization. Twenty-one racetracks have been fully accredited to date by Alliance safety teams. Read more about the work of the Alliance [here](#).

Clarke is perhaps best known as the man who co-owns last year's GII Fountain of Youth S. winner and Derby contender Soldat (War Front). Soldat placed 11th in the Derby, then went missing before returning to win a grassy optional claimer at Gulfstream Mar. 4.

Clarke still owns the mare that produced I'll Have Another, the 10-year-old Arch's Gal Edith (Arch), whom he purchased for \$80,000 as a juvenile-in-training in 2004. The mare won her lone start, a six-furlong maiden special at Belmont in 2005. Arch's Gal Edith didn't produce a foal in 2011 or '12, but has an unraced 2-year-old filly named Gloria S (Tapit) whom Clarke has retained as a racing prospect. Arch's Gal Edith is currently a member of Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat)'s first book.

Meanwhile, Bodemeister's dam Untouched Talent was acquired by Audley for \$1.2 million in 2007 while in foal to Unbridled's Song. Bodemeister was her first foal to make the races and second overall. The mare didn't produce a foal in 2010, but has a Smart Strike yearling filly going for her. She produced a Tiznow filly this spring. Untouched Talent was bred back to Unbridled's Song. "The Tiznow filly that came down with the mare this year when she was bred to Unbridled's Song, and she's just a super foal," Seitz reported. "She's making her older brother proud." The Smart Strike filly will likely sell at Keeneland September in a few months; sales plans for the Tiznow are undecided. **cont. p9**

While the Seitz family will be cheering for other people's horses on Saturday, they've got their own standout sophomore to root on Friday. Fred Seitz, Joe's father, will saddle the undefeated ♂ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♂ Flashy Dresser (Flashy Bull) in the GII American Turf S. at Churchill. The colt, making his grass debut, is coming off back-to-back wins in the Rushaway S. at Turfway Mar. 24 and the \$250,000 Robert Hilton Memorial S. at Charles Town Apr. 14. "It's been fun--he's done everything we've asked," said Seitz. And who knows? Maybe we'll be looking at a Brookdale trio in a Classic race in the near future.



HANNON PAIR PRIMED

Jockeys Richard Hughes and Jamie Spencer have provided positive bulletins on the Richard Hannon-trained duo **Trumpet Major (Ire)** (Arakan) and **Bronterre (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), respectively, ahead of Saturday's G1 Qipco 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Hughes, who rode his first winner yesterday since returning from a lengthy ban handed out in India, will take the mount on John Manley's G3 Craven S. winner Trumpet Major, who was also fifth in the G1 Dewhurst S. at the same venue in October. "I was very impressed with him in the Craven, as I didn't think he'd go on the [soft] ground," he said. "He ran once last year on soft ground and ran terrible, but he managed it this time. He's tough and has certainly improved from two to three and Johnny Murtagh got off after the Dewhurst and said 'I think he should have won'. If he had done, he'd be second favourite now." Jamie Spencer said of Bronterre, who was fourth in the Dewhurst and third in the G3 Greenham S. on his 3-year-old bow Apr. 21, "Ryan [Moore] said he was very gassy at Newbury and just did too much early on. If he comes back to his Dewhurst run, he ought to have a chance, but it will be an interesting race with Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in there. He looks an amazing horse, but looked a good mover at Doncaster and might not want extremes of going." Newmarket's ground was drying out yesterday and Director of Racing Michael Prosser was on hand to provide an update. "The GoingStick reading at 2 p.m. today was 6.8 from 6.1 yesterday and the ground is now good-to-soft," he said. "There has been a stiff breeze, particularly this afternoon, and the Rowley Mile course has shown its drying qualities. If we get the anticipated quarter of an inch of rain between this evening and Thursday lunchtime, it will put the ground back to soft. But should the forecast for Friday and Saturday prove correct, the ground will inevitably improve again ahead of the start of the meeting."

Godolphin will be without a runner in Saturday's G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas at Newmarket after racing manager Simon Crisford confirmed both **Mandaeen (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) and **Mighty Ambition** (Street Cry {Ire}) will sidestep the one-mile contest. Mandaeen, who entered winter quarters undefeated following impressive wins for Andre Fabre in an Oct. 16 newcomers' event at Longchamp and the Nov. 12 G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, will wait for the May 17 G2 Dante S. at York to make his debut for Mahmood Al Zarooni. Mighty Ambition, who bagged a juvenile maiden at Newbury in September, was a last-out fifth in the Apr. 19 G3 Craven S. at the Rowley Mile track and will be aimed at lower targets in the immediate future. "Neither will run in the Guineas," Crisford told *PA Sport*. "The Dante is the race we have always been looking at for Mandaeen, we just kept him in the Guineas to see what the race was like. I think we'll find Mighty Ambition a listed race somewhere."

Colour Vision stepped out of handicap company to run fourth in the Aug. 15 Listed Prix Michel Houyvet at Deauville, but was off the board in his next two goes at Salisbury and Chester. Successful in an Oct. 3 Pontefract conditions heat, he ran third in the marathon Cesarewitch H. at Newmarket five days later, and occupied the same berth behind Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the Oct. 15 G3 British Champions Long Distance Cup at Ascot in his final start representing the Mark Johnston yard last time.

Colour Vision was detached in rear for most of this seasonal return and Godolphin debut. Making smooth headway to take closer order from the half-mile pole, the grey quickened to the fore in impressive style with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and surged clear before gearing down late to easily claim a first black-type score and a new track record to boot. "I can't say we were expecting that because we thought he was a bit undercooked, but he clearly runs very well fresh," Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford told *PA Sport*. "He'll definitely be aimed for the [June 21 G1] Gold Cup at Royal Ascot and we will have to decide whether he has one more run before then, perhaps in the [May 31 G2] Henry II S. [at Sandown]." Red Cadeaux, runner-up in the Nov. 1 G1 Melbourne Cup and third in the Dec. 11 G1 Hong Kong Vase, satisfied Ed Dunlop with this comeback. "It was a good run with a three-pound penalty," the trainer said. "He's been beaten by a progressive horse, but this was very much a prep run for the [May 18 G2] Yorkshire Cup. All being well later in the year, we'll look to be going back to the Melbourne Cup, but I wanted to get him out in the early part of the season."

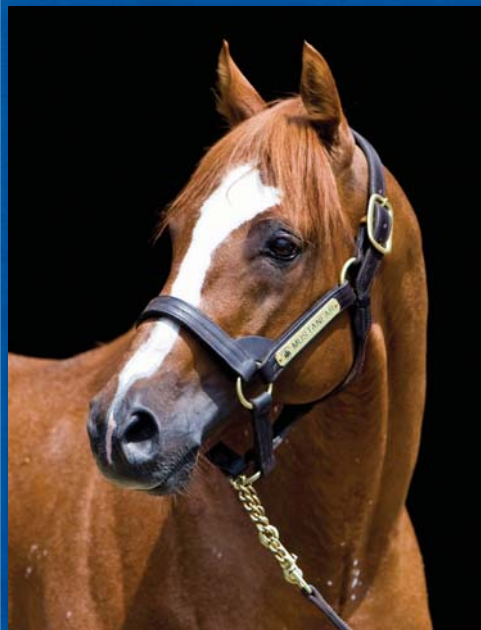
