TALENT ON DISPLAY IN PETER PAN

A deep field of 12 will do battle in today's GII Peter Pan S., New York's final major prep race for the GI Belmont S. Brereton C. Jones homebred **Mark Valeski** (Proud Citizen), runner-up in the GII Risen Star S. Feb. 25 and GII Louisiana Derby Apr. 1, leads the way after bypassing the GI Kentucky Derby. "It wasn't because we didn't have confidence in the horse," trainer Larry Jones said. "He's a nice horse. But we felt he was still a week or two away from being at his best, and we didn't want to run him at Churchill Downs if he wasn't at his best." Barry K. Schwartz's **The Lumber Guy** (Grand Slam), a sharp wire-to-wire winner of the GII Jerome S. at the Big A Apr. 21, lands in this spot after flirting with the idea of heading to Baltimore for next weekend's GI Preakness S. "He's been doing very well since the Jerome," conditioner Mike Hushion commented. "We'll have to go two turns with him sometime. But if we do the right thing by the horse now, maybe there's a big race for him down the road." The very promising **Summer Front** (War Front) tries dirt for the first time here. The Waterford Stable colorbearer scored in his first three on the spinach before placing second as the 2-1 favorite in the GIII Coolmore Lexington S. over the Keeneland Polytrack Apr. 21. **Peter Pan News, p8**

ONE DOZEN SET FOR POULAINS TEST

Simon Springer's **Dabirsim** (Fr) (Hat Trick {Jpn}) has drawn the inside hole for tomorrow's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp, for which a total of one dozen colts go to post. Having lost his unbeaten tag in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau last time Apr. 15, last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero has yet to prove he stays a mile. Defeat in that course- and-distance prep is not a disaster, as Aussie Rules (Danehill), Astronomer Royal (Danzig), Lope de Vega (Ire) (Shamardal) and Tin Horse (Ire) (Sakhee) all failed to score in the Fontainebleau before succeeding here. Gerard Augustin-Normand went close to winning this three years ago with Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre) and is represented by another held in high regard by the Jean-Claude Rouget stable this time, **Beauvoir** (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}). He plainly failed to see out the 10 furlongs of the G3 Prix la Force at Longchamp last time Apr. 8, where he was passed by his own pacemaker, but had shown real quality prior to that hiccup. Having beaten a field containing the subsequent G3 Prix de Conde scorer Loi (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) on debut at Deauville in August, he had the Listed Prix Omnium winner Coup de Theatre (Fr) (Gold Away {Ire}) behind when adding a 7 1/2-furlong conditions race to his tally on that track's fibresand Mar. 9. **Cont. p3**

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Beauty Parlour (GB)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) will face a total of 13 rivals as she bids to extend her unbeaten record in tomorrow's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp. Drawn in 7, the impressive Apr. 15 G3 Prix de la Grotte scorer will attempt to become the 10th filly to win that course-and-distance trial and go on to glory here since 1990. She faces some unknown quantities, including a trio from a deep current crop of 3-year-olds from Ballydoyle. Joseph O'Brien has opted to ride Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Up (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who was fourth in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf last term and who was a latest eye-catching third in the G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. She finished behind the ultra-impressive G1 1000 Guineas heroine Homecoming Queen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and the David Wachman trainee **Fire Lily (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) in that seven-furlong prep, and was 3/4 of a length in front of stable companion **After (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), but after the winner's subsequent tour-de-force at Newmarket on Sunday, nothing can be taken for granted with the Co. Tipperary sophomores.

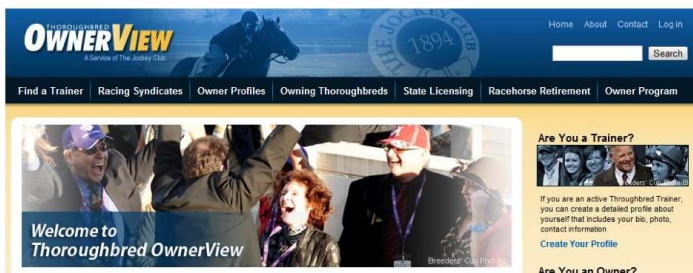

Mar. 24, the GI Florida Derby Mar. 31, the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Wood Memorial Apr. 7, and the GI Arkansas Derby and GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 14. The broadcasts

garnered viewership ranging from 50,000 (the Spiral, on NBC Sports Network) to 1.2 million (the Wood and Santa Anita Derby, on NBC proper), and average some 400,000 per telecast.



“We were thrilled to add these important and historic major prep races to the programming schedule of the rebranded NBC Sports Network, and the escalating viewership confirmed that racing fans and newcomers had a keen interest in these events,” said Gary Quinn, senior director of programming and acquisitions for NBC Sports Group. “As the home of the Kentucky Derby, Preakness S., Belmont S. and Breeders’ Cup, we look forward to televising important races from around the country that feature horses that will be running in these major events.”



The Derby itself enjoyed a 6% bump in the ratings and was the third most-watched Derby of the past 23 years. “The racing programming in the weeks leading up to the Run for the Roses helped boost awareness of the Kentucky Derby,” said Quinn. The report stated that discussions are underway about additional programming leading up to this year’s Breeders’ Cup at Santa Anita.

In other advancements, a new website, www.followhorseracing.com, was launched Apr. 15. The site hopes to attract and entertain racing fans with original content, including blogs by the likes of Hall of Fame rider Gary Stevens and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Rosie Napravnik, as well as video vignettes produced by the Hennegan Brothers, who produced the award-winning documentary film “The First Saturday in May.” There were 50,000 unique visitors during the site’s initial promotional period.

The Jockey Club and partners plan to tap into the popular free-to-play online video game market with the imminent launch of Major League Horse Racing, expected to be up and running by the Belmont. The game will teach newcomers how to wager, and prominent personalities are currently being engaged to compete in a celebrity league, which will run from July through September.

A “social” game in the same vein as the wildly popular FarmVille is also about to be launched on the social networking site Facebook. Called “Thoroughbred World,” the game was developed by Lloyd Melnick, the executive producer of “Gardens of Time,” one of the most popular social games to date.

In other news, The Jockey Club said that programs to help race secretaries best structure racecards in order to maximize handle are also in testing. **To view the entire report, click [here](#).**

"Dullahan won the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 14 and rallied from 12 lengths behind in the Derby to finish less than two lengths behind I'll Have Another.

Gemologist Injured; Pointing for Summer Campaign...

WinStar Farm's **Gemologist** (Tiznow), a disappointing 16th in the GI Kentucky Derby, has emerged with a bruised left front foot, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The bay won the first five starts of his career, including the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct Apr. 7. "As Todd [Pletcher] said, 'I've been beat many ways, but I sure didn't see that coming,'" WinStar's Elliott Walden told *Daily Racing Form*. "This horse wouldn't have laid an egg without an excuse." Walden also told the publication that Gemologist will likely target the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park July 29.

DERBY WINNER GETTING NEGATIVE PRESS

A number of stories focusing on GI Kentucky Derby-winning trainer Doug O'Neill's past have surfaced this week following **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley)'s victory Saturday at Churchill Downs.

The California-based horseman is currently facing a possible suspension of up to 180 days by the California Horse Racing Board for several carbon dioxide overages. The allowable carbon dioxide level in a horse's blood is 37 millimoles per liter. An increased presence of carbon dioxide is associated with the practice of milkshaking. This would be the fourth milkshaking-related suspension for O'Neill, whose career as a trainer spans nearly 25 years, among more than a dozen violations in a

number of jurisdictions. O'Neill has vehemently denied that he has ever milkshaked a horse.

A recent story by the *New York Times*'s Joe Drape and Walt Bogdanich entitled [A Derby Win, but a Troubled Record for a Trainer](#) has asserted that, in addition to his medication violations, a statistical analysis of Doug O'Neill's runners demonstrates an increased injury rate. "According to an analysis by The *New York Times*, the horses [O'Neill] trains break down or show signs of injury at more than twice the rate of the national average," the piece said.

O'Neill said in response: "I have been guilty of running horses more often than I should. Through some moments in my career, I've learned to be more patient and more cautious."

According to the *Times*, the average horse injury rate nationwide over the past three years is 5.1/1000 starts. O'Neill's runners have been injured at a rate of 12/1000 starts from a sample size of 2,300 races. "It's a horrible statistic to be associated with," O'Neill admitted.

More generally, the *Times* story also pointed out that, "Of the top 20 trainers in the United States--measured by purses won in 2011--only two, Christophe Clement and Graham Motion, were never cited for a medication violation, according to the Racing Commission International database."

Drape and Bogdanich also talked to Mark Verge, a long-time friend of O'Neill as well as a horse owner who was recently named Santa Anita Park's new chief executive officer. Verge postulated that O'Neill's positive tests might have been due to sabotage.

"People hate his guts because he wins," Verge said.

J. Paul Reddam, who has had horses with O'Neill since 2004 and who owns **I'll Have Another**, cited the high number of horses the trainer runs as a possible explanation for his medication violations.

"Doug races a lot of horses, and I think the numbers catch up to him," Reddam told the *Times*. "I don't think illegal drugs are rampant in his barn. Horse trainers, like people in all sports, look for whatever edge they can to win. Everyone thinks the other guy is doing something."

When asked Thursday if he was concerned with the light his past might cast on himself and the Derby winner, O'Neill said: "Right now I owe it to the owners and to the fans and to the horse to just focus in on **I'll Have Another**. He went through every medication exam and every physical exam you can think of before all three races this year... I think with all that previous stuff I'm going to come out on the good end there and hopefully we can kick some butt in the Preakness and kick some butt in the Belmont. Then after that we can sit down and talk about all that."

Memphis Tennessee had been on shelf since hitting the board in last term's G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh, and made a triumphant return to action by taking out this staying test. Having closed a two-race juvenile campaign with victory in a Dundalk maiden, he opened his sophomore season with a runner-up finish in last May's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown. The imposing bay continued on the upgrade with a fourth to Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in Epsom's Blue Riband before registering a then personal best in The Curragh's equivalent last time June 26. Joseph O'Brien attempted to employ similar tactics utilised aboard Astrology (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) half an hour earlier in the G3 Dee S., but, having dominated initially, was usurped for the lead by last year's G1 St Leger runner-up Brown Panther (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) going past the judge first time. Memphis Tennessee was relegated to third with a half-mile remaining and was ridden along on the home turn as Vivacious Vivienne set sail for home. However, O'Brien was in no mood for panic and soon had his mount on terms and the partnership gradually asserted, staying on strongly under continued coaxing in the closing stages to earn a first pattern-race score in ultimately cozy fashion. "I jumped and travelled okay, but he raced a little bit keen going along the straight first time," admitted O'Brien. "It was a tactical race and I was happy enough to make the running, but he was being annoyed on the way around which made him eager. It wasn't suiting him so I gave him a pull and allowed him to take a lead."

With unsuitable ground claiming the participation of likely favorite Bonfire (GB) (Manduro {Ger}), it was Astrology who nonetheless lit up an otherwise dank Roodeye to claim an impressive triumph in this trial for the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby. The bay opened up with an Aug. 11 maiden win at Leopardstown before hitting the board behind subsequent Group 1 performers Dragon Pulse (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}) and Parish Hall (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) in the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh nine days later. He completed his juvenile education with another third in the Oct. 8 G3 Autumn S. at Newmarket in his first overseas foray.



Astrology broke swiftly to claim immediate control of this. Maintaining absolute control throughout, he surged clear on the home turn and was kept up to his work by Joseph O'Brien in the short straight to stop the clock in splendid isolation. "He jumped quick, went a nice pace all the way and stayed on well," said the winning rider. "He was out in front a long time and was getting a bit idle in front so I gave him a few cracks [of the whip]. He stayed on well all the way to the line." Trainer Aidan O'Brien added, "Astrology is a lovely moving horse and a typical Galileo. He is really genuine and a real sweet mover. He was a nice horse last year and progressed nicely over the winter. We ran him to educate him last year and it's good that he's started nicely [this year]. He didn't seem to have any problem with this trip and found the pace easy. Joseph had him in a nice rhythm and just let him roll along. He'll stay further and both the Epsom Derby and [June 30 G1] Irish Derby [at The Curragh] are open to him."



Unraced as a juvenile, Saint Baudolino took three goes to break though--having finished second in maidens here Mar. 22 and at Longchamp Apr. 12--and did so back at the Bois de Boulogne track last time Apr. 26. The homebred bay, a G1 Prix du Jockey Club and G1 Grand Prix de Paris entry, was supplemented for this trial and justified that €4,800 outlay by overcoming a nightmare trip to claim a career high. Saint Baudolino was settled third along the rail in the wake of Mandour as that regally bred rival set steady fractions on the front end. Found wanting for room as the field bunched approaching the final quarter mile, Saint Baudolino seized every opportunity when the requisite gaps appeared thereafter and ran on strongly in the closing stages to oust Sofast in the final stride. "Saint Baudolino was very relaxed early in the race and he took a while to get going today," winning jockey Maxime Guyon told *Racing Post*. "He really had to accelerate today and I think he'll certainly stay further." Reflecting on a possible rematch back here in the June 3 G1 Prix du Jockey Club, racing manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said of the runner-up, "Sofast has run a very good race, but we have to hold him up like that for him to produce his best form. We'll have to discuss plans with [trainer] Freddy [Head], as it's an extra 300 meters [in the Prix du Jockey Club] and he comes from a speedy family so we'll see."

MAINTAINING THE SEQUENCE

Today's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial will be staged on Polytrack for the first time due to Britain's current monsoon season and that should help the prospects of the Niarchos Family's unbeaten **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran). Having won at 50-1 on debut at Yarmouth in September, the David Lanigan-trained homebred took a nine-furlong nursery at Newmarket before returning to the latter venue to annex a 10-furlong handicap Apr. 19. Another colt from a smaller yard putting a perfect record on the line is Richard Pegum's **Ed De Gas (GB)** (Peintre Celebre). The Rae Guest trainee scored by 12 lengths in a Catterick conditions race when last sighted Apr. 25. Marcus Tregoning puts forward Guy Brook's **Cavaleiro (Ire)** (Sir Percy {GB}), who returns after signing off with a win in the oft-informative Haynes, Hanson & Clark Conditions S. over a mile at Newbury in September.

Akeed Mofeed Plans Altered...

Jaber Abdullah's G2 Beresford S. runner-up **Akeed Mofeed (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) has met with further disruption to his training regime and has been ruled out of the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby, according to connections. The bay sophomore, who was originally slated to make his seasonal return in tomorrow's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown, will now resort to an alternative plan which revolves around targetting The Curragh's May 26 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and June 30 G1 Irish Derby. "Akeed Mofeed has got a problem with his hock," the owner's racing manager, Bruce Raymond, told *PA Sport*. "It's not much of a problem, but it couldn't be medicated because it's so close to the [Leopardstown] race. [Trainer] John [Oxx] said he'd rather not go for the Derrinstown, and he's not going to go for the Derby at Epsom without a prep race. His new programme will be the Irish Guineas and Irish Derby. The problem he had before was in front and this time he strained a hock when he worked well on Tuesday. It's one of those unfortunate things. John waited until Friday to make up his mind and he wasn't 100% happy with him."

ALL EYES ON MONMOUTH ONCE AGAIN

Monmouth Park has been in an state of flux for several years now, but today dawn breaks anew on the historic track, which kicks off its 67th season with a 12-race card. It will be the first of 65 live meetings this year at Monmouth, with the season running through Oct. 7. First post today is 12:50 p.m.

Why the fanfare? Well, it wasn't so long ago that it appeared that Monmouth might not open at all in 2012. Last year, New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie demanded that the state get out of the racing business--the state-controlled New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority previously ran Monmouth--and when real estate developer Morris Bailey backed out of a deal to run the track in December, there was justified cause for concern about Monmouth's future.

But in what is perhaps an unprecedented agreement, the state's horsemen have been granted the right to run the tracks. The New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NJTHA) signed a five-year agreement a few months ago, with the possibility of three 10-year extensions going forward. Darby Development LLC will manage the track for the horsemen, with longtime Monmouth Park executive Bob Kulina helming the operation.

"Everyone is looking forward to this meeting and all it means to the New Jersey horse racing industry," said John Forbes, president of the NJTHA. "Our 2012 meeting is the first step in ensuring Monmouth Park's prominence within the racing industry as we strive to enhance our simulcast appeal, develop a more fan-friendly atmosphere at the track and provide our fans with world-class Thoroughbred racing."

Like last year, the track will conduct live racing primarily on a Friday-through-Sunday schedule after racing just Saturdays and Sundays the first three weeks. There have been some changes for 2012, though. The track has installed four new video boards that range in size from 10 feet to 33 feet. There's a new caterer, BAM Management LLC, whose executive chef Erik Weatherspool became nationally known after he won the Food Network show 'Chopped' in 2010. And there are some new wagers, with a 50-cent Pick 3 added to the mix.

"We are taking what we know worked in the past and coupling that with some new ideas," added Forbes.

The track welcomes some new horsemen, too. Trainers Bret Calhoun and Dale Romans will have strings at Monmouth for the first time. Each trainer will have roughly 30 horses at Monmouth.

Dennis Drazin, former chairman of the New Jersey Racing Commission, was an integral player in securing the lease from the state as an advisor to the horsemen, and will continue to play a prominent role. "It's exciting that the horsemen will now control their own destiny," said Drazin. "We look forward to working with the NJTHA to build a long-term, sustainable racing industry in the Garden State."

The lease gives the horsemen rights to manage an off-track wagering facility in Woodbridge, New Jersey, and calls for the addition of several others that could be up and operating by January of 2014. There has also been talk of developing the Monmouth property to include year-round attractions like an indoor water park, a hotel and retail space, among other things. All that is in lieu of expanded gaming, which Drazin has said is, in the near future at least, is a nonstarter.

"While Thoroughbred racing will always be our core business, we need to explore alternative revenue sources that enhance the operation and prove popular with locals and shore visitors," said Drazin.

In the meantime, the show goes on at Monmouth. In addition to its regular schedule, holiday cards will be added on Memorial Day, July 4 and Labor Day, and the track will conduct four Thursday twilight cards in August with a first post of 4 p.m. The racing schedule also includes 10 days of turf racing at The Meadowlands. Two were already run on May 4-5, and the remaining eight will be held Fridays and Saturdays from Oct. 12 through Nov. 3. As always, the \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational will anchor the meeting. This year, the nine-furlong race for 3-year-olds will be held Sunday, July 29. For more information, visit www.monmouthpark.com.
