BODEMEISTER CONFIRMED FOR PREAKNESS

Zayat Stables and Michel and Tiffany Moreno's **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) will renew his rivalry with GI Kentucky Derby winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) in Saturday's GI Preakness S., connections confirmed yesterday. The decision was announced after trainer Bob Baffert

watched the Derby runner-up gallop 1 1/2 miles over a muddy Churchill Downs track Monday. "He looks good, his coat is good and he is eating well," Baffert, a five-time Preakness winner explained. "I see no reason not to take him [to Pimlico]." Baffert added that Bodemeister "was glorious in defeat" after setting swift fractions in the Derby and came out of that race surprisingly well. "He cooled out quickly and started to eat right after the race," Baffert said. "I was worried that he might be wiped out and just stay in the back of his stall for three days and sulk, but he never did."

Hansen Out

While Bodemeister was confirmed for the Preakness, juvenile champion **Hansen** (Tapit) was officially withdrawn from consideration for the race. "He is not going," confirmed trainer Mike Maker. "That would be coming back a little quick." Hansen will be pointed towards the June 9 GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont Park.

Bullet for Cozzetti

The Albaugh Family Stable's **Cozzetti** (Cozzene) tuned up for Saturday's GI Preakness S. with a bullet five-furlong drill at Churchill Downs yesterday in :58.80. The gray colt, fourth in the Apr. 14 GI Arkansas Derby, worked in fractions of :11.60, :23.20, :34.80, and :46.80. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:12.40 and seven furlongs in 1:27.40. **More Preakness News p3**

MCCLAIN NAMED NYRA PRESIDENT

Ellen McClain, who had been serving as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, has been named President of the New York Racing Association, NYRA board chairman C. Steven Duncker announced last evening. McClain replaces Charles Hayward, who was let go two weeks ago following the release of an interim report from the New York State Racing and Wagering Board regarding inappropriate take out rates.

In addition, Kenneth Handal, who was yesterday named acting general counsel and chief ethics and compliance officer for NYRA, was also tabbed as the organization's secretary. Handal, an attorney of 40 years, has expertise in corporate ethics and compliance, governance and risk management and was most recently served as President-Governance, Risk and Compliance for Guidepost Solutions LLC, according to a NYRA release. He also served as executive vice president, general counsel and corporate secretary of CA Technologies, Inc.

In announcing Handal's appointment Monday, McClain said, "This is a critical period for New York racing. NYRA is a \$2-billion racing and wagering company, and we must operate with the highest standards and practices in the areas of corporate compliance, governance, risk management and internal controls. Ken is a crucial addition to the NYRA senior management team and has the expertise to help guide our company through the current crisis and beyond."

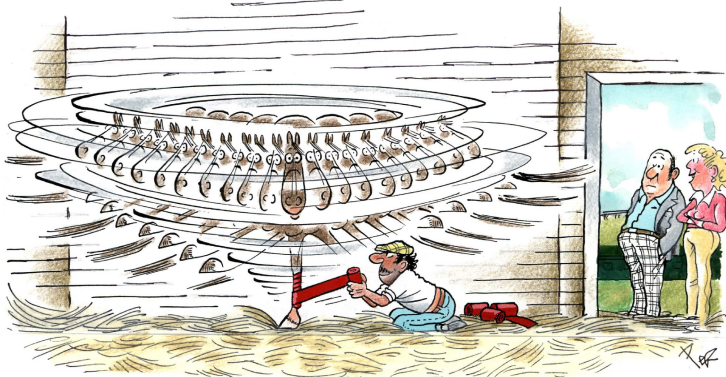

Daddy Nose Best Likely for Preakness

Cathy and Bob Zollars' **Daddy Nose Best** (Scat Daddy), 10th in the Kentucky Derby, likely worked his way into the Preakness field with a half-mile work at Churchill Monday in :53. "The decision will be made on Tuesday after we see how he comes out of his work," said Bob Zollars. "He came out of the Derby fine. We had him all checked over. [Trainer] Steve [Asmussen] and I will talk it over on Tuesday." Fellow Asmussen stablemates **Hierro** (Hard Spun) and **Isn't He Clever** (Smarty Jones) will skip the Preakness.

Also working at Churchill yesterday, Bluegrass Hall's **Optimizer** (English Channel) went a half-mile in :49.80. "That was perfect," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said of the work.

Guyana Star Dweej Added to Preakness Field

Guyana Star Dweej (Eddington) has been added to the list of Preakness contenders. A maiden winner at Aqueduct in his eighth start Apr. 7, the chestnut will be making his stakes debut in the second leg of the Triple Crown. "After his maiden win we knew he had run a better Beyer Figure in every race and he beat older horses," explained trainer Doodnauth Shivmangal. "He ran against some good horses. One of the horses that beat him at Aqueduct, Morgan's Guerrilla (Ghostzapper), that's the horse they took to the [GIII] Illinois Derby."

Morgan's Guerilla was runner-up in the Illinois Derby before finishing 11th in the Apr. 21 GIII Coolmore Lexington S.

Shivmangal admitted he had been planning on running Guyana Star Dweej last weekend at Belmont Park. "I was really heading to the [GII] Peter Pan," he admitted. "Since we didn't get to the Peter Pan, I decided to give him a shot in the Preakness. He's a horse, I think, that can go the mile and three-sixteenths."

TRF FILES MOTION TO DISMISS

The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and its board of directors yesterday filed a motion to dismiss the suit filed by the Attorney General of the State of New York against the foundation on May 3.

The motion, filed by Barry Ostrager from the firm of Simpson Thacher & Bartlett, states, "There has never been a case in which directors and officers of a charitable foundation have been removed absent either misappropriation of charitable funds or self dealing. This case does not begin to approach the legal standard required to overcome the business judgment rule that protects directors and officers of charitable organizations from liability of any kind. Rather, this law suit is a shocking case of misguided regulators knowingly and intentionally making false allegations that would constitute actionable libel if the allegations were not contained in a complaint. The affidavits and exhibits accompanying this motion demonstrate that this law suit constitutes a serious black mark on the record of our recently elected New York Attorney General (Eric T. Schneiderman). The complaint should be dismissed and an inquiry conducted as to how such a monumental misallocation of governmental resources has been permitted to move forward into the courts of this State."

Reached by phone, Ostrager said, "I think the papers speak for themselves. Clearly, we believe that the filing of the complaint was an egregious misallocation of state resources, because we think the complaint is utterly meritless and the New York Attorney General's office was aware of the falsity of many of the principal allegations of the complaint. I am very troubled by the circumstance that a filing that could potentially adversely affect the ability of the TRF to continue to raise money would be made on the record that is laid out in our motion to dismiss."

The record that the TRF motion lays out includes assertions that:

- *The Attorney General has refused to accept clear and convincing evidence offered by the TRF in the form of affirmations and affidavits from veterinarians and farm managers on virtually every horse in the TRF herd attesting to their proper care and excellent health.

- *The Attorney General has refused to accept written opinions of eminent counsel attesting to the propriety of every financial transaction to which the Complaint refers.

- *The Attorney General has ignored the endorsement of the TRF and the TRF's current leadership by every major constituency in the thoroughbred breeding and racing industry. *Cont. p5*

*The Attorney General has not and cannot allege a single act of self-dealing by any TRF director or officer.

*The directors and officers of the TRF have donated and loaned millions of dollars to the TRF to support its excellent work.

Ostrager said that the NYAG had less than 10 days to answer the motion.

TOBA PENS LASIX LETTER TO NYSRWB

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association has released a letter addressed to John Sabini, chairman of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, in response to a call from the NYSRWB for public comment on the race-day use of furosemide. The letter outlines TOBA's position that performance-enhancing drugs should not be allowed in graded stakes. "It is the belief of the American Graded Stakes Committee and the trustees of TOBA that the integrity of the grades is compromised if horses are competing under the influence of performance-enhancing drugs," the letter reads.

"TOBA owes it to its members, of which 76% support a measured phase out of race-day medication, as well as to sales companies, prospective buyers and sellers, fans and international organizations that rely on these grades to ensure that they are a true representation of quality based solely on athletic ability." The letter cites South African and Australian studies questioning the efficacy of furosemide and queries whether horses racing on the medication merit black-type in the eyes of the international racing community. The letter concludes by saying, "We applaud the leadership provided by the NYSRW Board on this important issue, as we have also commended the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission for taking similar steps. These reforms are long overdue and will be a cornerstone to leading our sport to a brighter future." The letter is signed by TOBA Chairman Peter Willmott and TOBA President Dan Metzger. 
CARNEGIE LEAVES BREEDERS' CUP

EYES TURN TO BALLYDOYLE

Aidan O'Brien, who has sent out five seconds since he last won the G1 Investec Derby with High Chaparral in 2002, might still have 24 entries for the Blue Riband Classic at Epsom on June 2, but the record-breaking Ballydoyle trainer had eyes only for G1 2000 Guineas winner **Camelot (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) when he unveiled his team of superstars at a press open day Monday morning at the famed training center.

Asked whether he was confident that Camelot, who came from last at Newmarket, would have the stamina for the mile and a half, O'Brien said: "Being by Montjeu, you would have to be optimistic that he will stay, but there are also serious Danehill and Kingmambo traits in Camelot, and he has always been a horse with tremendous speed."

O'Brien continued, "Epsom is a unique atmosphere and can get to many horses, and, while Camelot is a calm individual and very relaxed, like so many with such an explosive burst of acceleration he has lots of nervous energy, so we have to be careful with him, and he won't do too much more work before the big day."

"I am a born worrier and so many things can wrong. There is the opposition and also the undulations, though he seemed to handle the dips well enough at Newmarket and he works regularly around our replica of Epsom, which includes our version of Tattenham Corner."

Joseph O'Brien, who will be 19 next week, celebrated his first British Classic success on Camelot at Newmarket, and his father admitted that both he and his wife Anne-Marie will be the proudest parents in the world if he happens to win at Epsom.

"We are enjoying what is a fairytale with Joseph riding these big winners, but I don't even want to think about how I would feel if the dream became reality at Epsom," he said. "It could all have ended in disaster in the French Guineas on Sunday when Furner's Green took a fatal fall passing the winning post."

O'Brien added, "We were all so very sad for the horse, but Joseph was so very lucky. If it had happened a furlong earlier three or four horses could easily have trampled all over him, and he could have been seriously hurt as they were travelling flat out."

"Camelot has been a special horse from day one," O'Brien said of the likely Derby favorite. "We were very nervous before the Guineas, especially as we knew that Joseph was going to drop him out and ride him like a doubtful stayer.

Joseph wanted him to learn at Newmarket, and what I liked was the way that Camelot came through the gaps between horses and put his head down and fought. Camelot has the looks, the pedigree and the presence, and he reminds me of a dressage horse in that his movement is perfection.

As for his rising star stable jockey, O'Brien offered, "Joseph has never known anything but horses from the moment he could walk. He used to sit in the back of the jeep with me on the gallops in the mornings before he went to school, and then he would ride out every weekend. He has been involved in all the discussions about the horses from an early age, and he has been with us in the good days and the ordinary days.

"Joseph rides out every morning, and our other three children have also starting riding out, but we all know nothing else. We don't do holidays--apart from when we go to the Breeders' Cup!

"We are all very excited about the Derby, but it is a long time since we have won [39 losers since High Chaparral], and many a year we have come home feeling very humble. We have done everything we can, and now we can, but hope and pray that Camelot is good enough."

Other Ballydoyle Standouts

Aidan O'Brien also touched on other Ballydoyle runners likely to see action. **Ernest Hemingway (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will start in the G2 Dante S. on Thursday. "He will go if the ground is good or better, but it is doubtful he'd go to Epsom if he misses York," O'Brien explained. "Whether the boys would let all of them go to Epsom, I don't know. All these horses are bred and reared for Epsom and the Derby is the race that shapes the breed."

O'Brien also expects a strong representation in the previous day's G1 Investec Oaks, adding, "**Maybe (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Kissed (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will go straight for Epsom and we could look at the race for **Was (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who we might run at Naas on Thursday, as well. **Wading (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) didn't come right in the spring and I don't want to force her, so I'd be surprised if she makes Epsom."

She is re-opposed by Gerard Augustin-Normand's **Brocottes (Fr)** (Lando {Ger}), who was fourth in the Penelope on her first start since finishing runner-up in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in November. Three other fascinating and unexposed rivals are headed by His Highness The Aga Khan's **Dalkala** (Giant's Causeway), who is two-for-two after giving the smart Lady Apples (Fr) (Enrique {GB}) four pounds and a head beating in a 10-furlong conditions event at Longchamp Apr. 15.

GIANT'S CAUSEWAY COLT TOPS COPA BULLRICH DAY ONE

The 2012 edition of the Copa Bullrich Sale--presented by Antonio Bullrich SA--kicked off at San Isidro Racetrack in Buenos Aires, Argentina Sunday. Heading the opening session was a colt by Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). Consigned by Haras Chenaut, the bay was secured for 570,000 pesos (*US\$128,668*) by John Fulton Bloodstock for a consortium of American owners. The partnership previously enjoyed success in Argentina with last year's G1 Polla de Potrillos winner Chuck Berry (Arg) (Grand Reward), who was purchased at this venue two seasons ago. Named Undomiel (Arg), the colt is out of top sprint mare Luna Real (Arg) (Mutakddim), victorious in the G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Sprint. Exported to the United States following her racing career, the mare was later returned to her native land by the yearling's breeder, Haras Chenaut.

The second highest price of the session was Suska (Arg), a member of the first South American crop of Exchange Rate (Danzig), who brought a final bid of 470,000 pesos (*US\$106,095*) from the Palm Dessert stable. Offered by Haras La Leyenda, which was making its first foray at the yearling sales, the filly is out of Summer Scent (Kingmambo). The chestnut is from the extended family of Grade I stakes winner Twilight Agenda (Devil's Bag).

At the day's conclusion, a total of 61 head passed through the ring--with 17 failing to meet their reserves--representing a buyback rate of 28%. Gross closed out at 8,068,000 pesos (*US\$1,821,218*), with an average of 183,364 pesos (*US\$41,391*).

In this day and age, it is essential that a potential stallion has a resume which is strong on fashionable bloodlines, first-rate performances and excellent conformation. Without one or the other of these, he is unlikely to enjoy the type of support which goes a long way to guaranteeing that he has a future.

Of course some stallions still manage to make the grade despite not enjoying all these benefits, and Turtle Bowl--sire of Sunday's unexpected G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Lucayan--appears to be one of them. Indeed, Lucayan comes from a male line which has consistently shown the ability to exceed the purists' expectations.

Turtle Bowl's grandsire Night Shift was a perfect example of the rags-to-riches stallion. He arrived in Britain in 1984 after a distinctly ordinary racing career, having earned only \$9,282 in compiling a record of 7-1-0-2. As he also stood only 15.2 hands, you might ask why anyone would want to use such a stallion. The short answer is that Night Shift possessed a magnificent pedigree.

For a start, he was a son of the peerless Northern Dancer, whose unique ability as a sire of sires had already been firmly established by Nijinsky, Northfields, Be My Guest, Lyphard and The Minstrel. To this could be added the fact that Night Shift was a brother to the champion filly Fanfreluche and to the good Canadian colt Barachois. His half-sister Somfas had already done very well as a broodmare, as had Fanfreluche.

Night Shift quickly proved that his outstanding bloodlines were far more relevant than his failings as a racehorse. Despite having to start his career in England as a virtual unknown at a modest fee (which was as low as £2,500 in his fourth season), he did so well that he was eventually recruited to Coolmore's stallion squad. His tally of nine Group 1 winners featured such stand-outs as Azamour (St James's Palace S., Irish Champion S., Prince of Wales's S. and the King George), In The Groove (Irish 1,000 Guineas, Juddmonte International, Champion S., and Coronation Cup) and Daryaba (Prix de Diane and Prix Vermeille). Not bad going, I'm sure you'll agree, for a Monmouth maiden race winner.

Turtle Bowl's sire Dyhim Diamond wasn't among Night Shift's Group 1 winners, but he was a brother to one of them--the GI Hollywood Starlet S. winner Creaking Board. Dyhim Diamond did rank among Night Shift's 30-odd group winners, thanks to victories in the G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise at three and the G3 Benazet-Rennen at four. These victories over six furlongs established him alongside the likes of Lochangel (G1 Nunthorpe S.), Baron's Pit, Eveningperformance, Vision of Night, Struggler, Deportivo, Night Prospector, Nipping and Lady Alexander, as one of Night Shift's sizeable number of fast performers.

Nowadays two Group 3 victories are barely a basis for a successful stallion career and Dyhim Diamond's prospects weren't helped when he managed to win only a minor sprint in his last season in France in 1999, before being switched to the U.S., where he managed just one third-place finish in six starts.

Consequently Dyhim Diamond was modestly priced when he commenced stallion duties in France in 2001. He had only 26 first-crop foals, followed by 13 in his second crop, 18 in his third, 14 in his fourth and 16 in his fifth. Yet his first crop contained Turtle Bowl (G1 Prix Jean Prat), his second produced Bannaby (G1 Prix du Cadran) and his fifth contained Milanais (a neck second in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere). Dyhim Diamond ultimately moved on to stand in Spain.

With this type of background, Turtle Bowl seemed likely to face an uphill struggle when he retired to Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaignu, even though Gilles and Aliette Forien have previously enjoyed plenty of success with stallions, most notably with Kendor. Although Turtle Bowl had achieved Grade 1-winner status, he had never ranked higher than 117 on the World Thoroughbred Racehorse Rankings. **Cont. p11**



It's a measure of his reputation that he started at 33-1 when he was beaten two short heads in the 2007 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot.

On the plus side, he is, by all accounts, an excellent physical specimen and he is out of Clara Bow, an excellent broodmare daughter of Top Ville. Top Ville also ranked as the broodmare sire of such outstanding representatives of the Northern Dancer male line as Montjeu, Yeats, Rewilding, Dar Re Mi and Belmez.

Consequently, Turtle Bowl's first crop numbers only 43 foals (with 52 in his second crop and 38 in his third). So how enormous must the odds have been against his first crop containing two Classic colts? It was only by a neck that his son French Fifteen--already a winner of the G1 Criterium International--failed to beat Camelot in the G1 2,000 Guineas. The stallion gained full compensation for that narrow defeat when another son, Lucayan, triumphed in a desperate finish to the French equivalent. No doubt Turtle Bowl is now guaranteed considerably larger books, plus the close attention of leading breeders.



French Fifteen's dam was only a provincial winner and Lucayan's dam, the provincial middle-distance performer La Vltava, managed just two wins from 22 starts, including one on all-weather. Lucayan, who cost €85,000 at Arqana's Breeze-Up sale, has a second dam, the once-raced Lavanda, whose previous main claim to fame was that she had produced a champion in Spain.

However, don't jump to the conclusion that his pedigree isn't worthy of a Guineas winner. In fact he comes from a female line which has made a tremendous impact on the various Guineas races, as his third dam, One Life, was a half-sister to none other than Miesque. This magnificent daughter of Nureyev won the G1 1,000 Guineas and Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in 1987 before becoming the dam of Kingmambo (1993 Poule d'Essai des Poulains) and East of the Moon (1994 Poule d'Essai des Poulaches and Prix de Diane). Yogya, another half-sister to One Life, produced Six Perfections, who gained compensation for her tremendously unlucky defeat in the 2003 1,000 Guineas by winning the Prix Jacques le Marois and Breeders' Cup Mile.

One Life was herself a daughter of the 1983 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner L'Emigrant. Lucayan's second dam, Lavanda, is by Soviet Star, winner of the 1987 Poulains, and his dam La Vltava, is by Grand Lodge, who was beaten a whisker in the 1994 2,000 Guineas. In other words, the bottom half of Lucayan's pedigree is packed with links to classic milers.

As Soviet Star was a son of Nureyev, Lavanda was bred along similar lines to Miesque, whose name also cropped up over the weekend as the second dam of Tower Rock, a close second in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial.

OBITUARIES

GUSTAVE SCHOENBORN SR. DIES

Gustave Schoenborn Sr., a pioneer of the New York breeding program, passed away at his home in upstate New York last Friday. He was 75. After serving in the U.S. Army from 1952 through 1956, Schoenborn and his brother Everett founded Shoeborn Brothers Farm in New York.
