DERBY HERO SECOND CHOICE IN PREAKNESS

GI Kentucky Derby hero I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) drew post nine for Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico and was made the 5-2 morning-line second choice in his bid for the second leg in American racing's Triple Crown. Favoritism in the 1 3/16-mile event goes to the Derby's gallant runner-up **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker), who is 8-5 on the morning line and will break from post seven. "I thought the draw was really good," Derby-winning trainer Doug O'Neill said. "I'm very happy with that. Being outside of the legitimate speed [Bodemeister], most jockeys would be real happy with that. We're OK with that."

O'Neill suggested that I'll Have Another will be closer to the speedy Bodemeister than he was in the Derby. "It's in [Bodemeister's jockey] Mike Smith's hands to set the pace," he said. "For whatever reason, if he breaks slow or decides not to go, we'll take the lead and take it from there. You never know, but as long as we continue to train like our horse has trained, we won't be that far off Bodemeister. If anything, Bodemeister might be behind us early. I could see him chasing us, I really could."

The Southern California trainer added that he understood why Bodemeister, trained by five-time Preakness winner Bob Baffert, was the morning-line choice over his own charge.

"Bob Baffert has won five of these; I've never run a horse here," O'Neill said. "I totally respect that. I'm just hoping that anyone who bets Bodemeister is regretting it Saturday night."

O'Neill said the two weeks since I'll Have Another's Derby victory have been, "Unbelievable. It's been a blast."

Baffert was also pleased with Bodemeister's Preakness draw. "I think it's a good post," Baffert said of the seven hole. "With him, anything in the middle would have been fine. In the Preakness you just don't want to be stuck down on the inside, where you have to use your horse a little bit."

Kentucky Derby graduates occupy the next three spots on the morning-line, with fast-closing fourth-place finisher **Went the Day Well** (Proud Citizen) and fifth-place finisher **Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) both at 6-1 and breaking from post five and six, respectively, and 10th-place finisher **Daddy Nose Best** (Scat Daddy) at 12-1 and breaking from post eight. *Cont. p3*

NYRA RESPONDS TO STATE REGULATORS

The New York Racing Association, the subject of an ongoing state investigation into inaccurate take-out rates, released a statement Wednesday in response to a letter sent by John Sabini of the state's Racing and Wagering Board and Robert Megna of the Franchise Oversight Board calling into question the validity of the organization's recent elections and the continuation of its casino subsidies. Of its recent election of Ellen McClain and Kenneth Handal as president and secretary, respectively, NYRA's statement read, "NYRA's Board acted to ensure that there was professional management in place to operate a complex business which has a significant economic impact on New York State. The NYRA Board has a fiduciary obligation to exercise its business judgment to protect the best interests of racing and the income stream that pari-mutuel wagering provides to the state." The statement added that neither the Racing and Wagering Board nor the Franchise Oversight Board had authority over the naming of NYRA officers. The statement concludes, "The suggestion in letter from Chairman Sabini and Chairman Megna that the NYRA Board and other NYRA executives have a potential role in the improper take-out investigation, thereby making the NYRA Board's action inappropriate, is flawed. This reasoning would effectively paralyze the corporation based on innuendo. The Inspector General's investigation is ongoing and there should not be a rush to judgment until a final report is issued, and due process is provided."

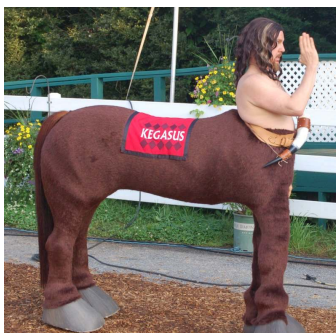

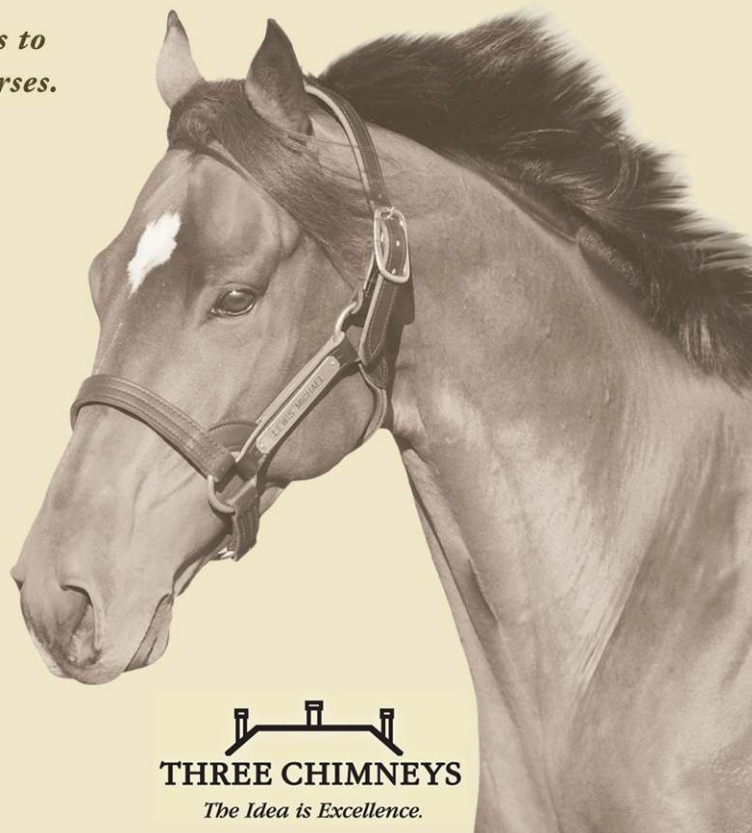

“Shake and bake, brother,” O’Neill said with a laugh while heading over to do an interview with *HRTV*’s Carolyn Conley.

Media representatives began to flock to **I’ll Have Another** (Flower Alley)’s current digs at the more tranquil secondary stakes barn at roughly 8 a.m. as temperatures remained quite pleasant in the upper-60s under partly cloudy skies.

The years have been very kind to seven-time Grade I winner Lava Man (Slew City Slew), who seems to be thriving in his second career as a stable pony for the O’Neill barn. The 11-year-old accompanied I’ll Have Another to the starting gate en route to his triumph on the First Saturday in May, and signaled that he was ready for more action yesterday, playfully tossing his head while in his stall as the Derby winner began to get tacked up. Once walking the shedrow, the popular California-bred gelding gave a long look to see what all the fuss was about outside as the crowd began to disperse to get a better angle on the action.

I’ll Have Another exited the barn to the familiar sound of clicking camera shutters, then did a couple of laps in a small adjacent paddock, fittingly decorated with a lawn jockey freshly painted with the blue and white silks of last year’s Preakness hero Shackleford (Forestry). The chestnut perked right up once joining forces with his old friend upon entering the track at the gap, and the dynamic duo began to walk the outer rail in tandem.

Stationed by the grandstand apron, Team O’Neill watched the J. Paul Reddam colorbearer jog/gallop with good energy after heavy rains cancelled a trip to the track Tuesday. Despite looking a picture, streaking New York-bred and Preakness outsider **Zetterholm** (Silver Train) entered the track relatively unnoticed just as Lava Man and I’ll Have Another made

their way back home, with the latter receiving a nice pat on his shoulder by exercise rider Jonny Garcia for a job well done.

O’Neill was directed to the outdoor podium by Maryland Jockey Club’s Mike Gathagan after the big horse cooled out following his *very* well-attended bath at around 9:30 a.m.

“He looks fantastic; great energy,” said O’Neill, who threw out the first pitch at Tuesday night’s Baltimore Orioles/New York Yankees baseball game at Camden Yards. “He’s maintained his beautiful, long stride. We’re just very happy with each day that goes by.”

The action figures to pick up Thursday, with the expected arrivals of major contenders **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker), **Creative Cause** (Giant’s Causeway) and **Went the Day Well** (Proud Citizen). Stay tuned...

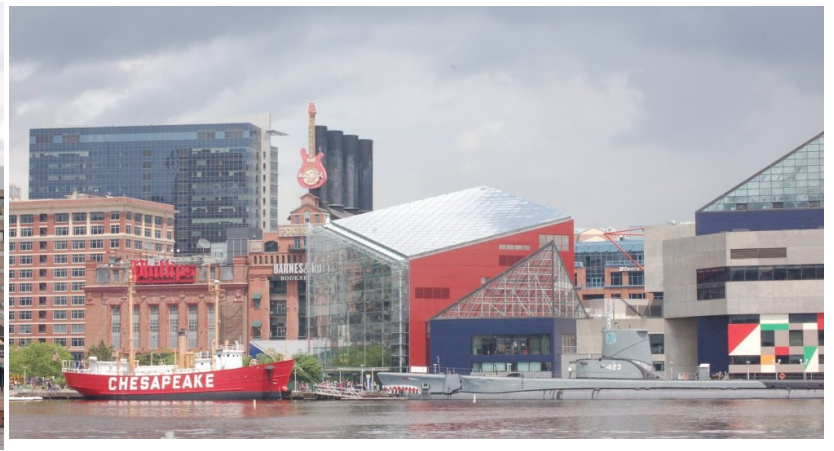

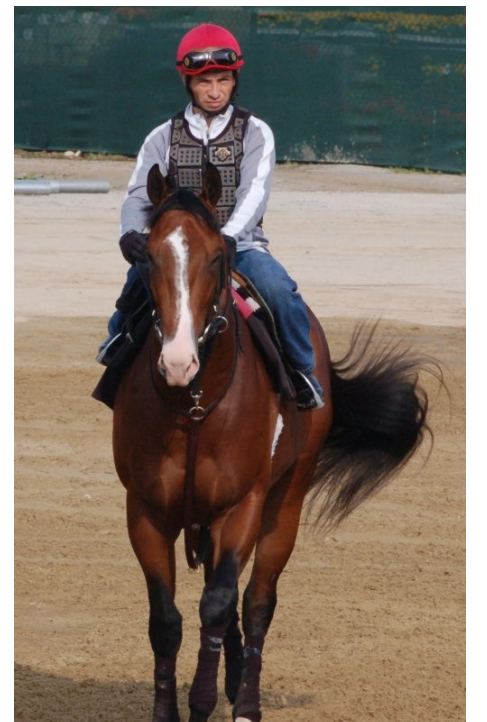

The Fugue was the subject of positive spring reports, having created a favorable impression when winning her sole juvenile outing over seven furlongs at Newmarket in late October. Picked by William Buick over the fellow Gosden representative Starscope (GB) (Selkirk) in the May 6 G1 1000 Guineas, she was 1 3/4 lengths behind that runner-up and Maybe (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in fourth as the trio chased Homecoming Queen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in vain. Reportedly struck into early on at Newmarket, The Fugue's late effort smacked of Oaks potential, and it was a surprise that she was usurped for favoritism by Ballydoyle's strongly backed Twirl here. Always traveling strongly as Aniseed (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) was moved up to set genuine fractions, the bay cruised upsides Twirl as Joseph O'Brien took control on the market-leader approaching the quarter pole.

William Buick was holding on to a double handful as the pair matched strides and, as soon as The Fugue was let down a furlong later, the result was settled in an instant. "They were a nice bunch of fillies and she was far superior," Buick said. "She ran in the Guineas only a short time ago and was unlucky--there was a barging match there and she got struck into--so I didn't want her to have a hard race today. She is a very reactive filly and was keen early on, but she is class. The Guineas wasn't a very nice experience for her and she was sharper here, and will learn as she goes on. She has tactical speed and I'm very hopeful of her staying a mile and a half, so she feels like a filly who has all the attributes you need at Epsom." Lady Lloyd-Webber added, "We were thrilled with that and we bred her mother, so she's second-generation and it was fantastic. It's so unlike John [Gosden] to race a filly that quickly after the 1000 Guineas and now they are talking about the Oaks, so fingers crossed. She is bred to do that, but the ground would have to stay good for her to. She hardly touches the ground and floats across it. She didn't like the ground at the Guineas, and did well to be fourth." The Fugue's dam has a 2-year-old Dansili colt named Ducab (Ire), a yearling Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt, and foaled a Shamardal colt Apr. 13.

Despite being overlooked by many, it was another progeny of that sire who stepped up to the plate here to upset some big names. Tiddliwinks was third to Delegator (GB) (Dansili {Ire}) in this contest 12 months ago before finishing runner-up in the G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh 10 days later, but had only a five-furlong Nottingham conditions win to his name in six subsequent outings. The latest of those came when last of 10 in the Listed Abernant S. over this trip at Newmarket Apr. 19, but that inauspicious start to the season failed to deter connections, and he lined up for this competitive renewal with stable confidence behind him. Settled well off the fast early tempo, the bay had only three behind by halfway and was angled wide soon after for his effort. As stable companion Bogart (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) began to tire up front, Tiddliwinks was finding top gear and, after grabbing the lead with a furlong to race, kept on to deny the closing pair The Cheka and Society Rock.

It's great to train a winner of this race for Mr. Reed, and it's a shame he can't be here today." Ryan added, "Bogart ran a massive race for a 3-year-old and he's going to improve for the run." The Cheka will be aimed at the [June 23] G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot, which was won last year by Society Rock.

Princess Highway, eighth at Leopardstown in her only juvenile start Oct. 30, stepped up from a Mar. 28 maiden score back at the Foxrock track to dent some lofty reputations--while enhancing her own--with an impressive score in this renowned Classic trial. Racing in second until looming large in the straight, the homebred bay took over at the quarter-mile marker and was ridden out to comfortably best Aaraas for a career high. Despite holding a trio of Group 1 entries, trainer Dermot Weld is inclined to target the June 21 G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot, a race he won with her dam in 2002. "That was a nice performance by her and she is a lovely filly," Weld told *irishracing.com*. "We won the Ribblesdale with her dam and I think that is the logical way to go with her. It was always in my mind to come here and then go to [Royal] Ascot. She is a very nice, progressive filly, and I hope she might be as good as [G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Irish Oaks victress] Blue Wind, who this race is named after. Epsom might be a bit premature for this filly, and I think it is the right strategy to go for the Ribblesdale." Irresistible Jewel has a 2-year-old Henrythenavigator filly named Midnight Thoughts, and recently produced a full-sister to the Blue Wind heroine.

TOWNHALL CALLED IN KY LASIX DEBATE

Have an opinion on Lasix in the Commonwealth of Kentucky? You soon might be able to have your voice heard. Yesterday, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) called for a townhall-style meeting in Frankfort in early June to debate the issue of treating horses with Lasix before they race.

The KHRC called for the townhall meeting as it considers a new proposal to phase-out the anti-bleeding medication in all listed and graded stakes in Kentucky beginning in 2013. The proposal would ban horses from being treated within 24 hours of a stakes races for 2-year-olds beginning next year. The ban would extend to 3-year-old stakes in 2014, including races written for horses 3-years old-and up. In 2015, Lasix would be banned in all listed and graded stakes. Last month, the KHRC voted narrowly against a gradual phase-out of Lasix in all races, black-type or otherwise, contested in Kentucky.

John Ward, in just his second session as executive director of the KHRC, said the meeting would probably be held in Frankfort on June 4, 5, or 6, which are dark days at Churchill Downs. Frankfort was chosen because it is roughly equidistant from Louisville and Lexington. The meeting would be held after training hours, so that as many trainers who would like to attend could, said Ward.

"As I told the First Lady [of Kentucky, Jane Beshear] the other night at the Derby trainers' dinner: this is an emotional issue that is like abortion and gun control wrapped in to one," said Ward. "It's near to everybody's heart, and I want everybody who wants to be able to speak to the issue, whether they're in favor of [the proposal], not in favor of it, or if they think it can be improved. We are very open-minded on this document."

Wednesday's KHRC meeting was far less contentious than its previous gathering, but nonetheless yielded some strong opinions on what's become a national issue in racing. Several opponents of the proposal talked out against it, including Dr. Foster Northrop, Burr Travis, Jr., Frank Jones and Thomas Conway.

Travis questioned why the KHRC was further debating the issue a month after the proposal to ban Lasix in all races had gone down to defeat in a 7-7 tie (a majority is needed for approval). Conway agreed, and motioned that the KHRC table any proposals regarding the banning of Lasix for 12 months. The motion was defeated by a 7-4 margin.

"I think we have an obligation to the state, and we have an obligation to the industry, to address this issue, and I think we would be passing on that obligation if we remanded this for 12 months," said Committee Chairman Robert M. Beck, Jr.

Earlier in the day, the Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council voted against the proposal by a 4-3 margin.

Yesterday's KHRC meeting was the first for new commission member John Phillips of Darby Dan Farm, who was appointed by Gov. Steve Beshear to fill the spot left vacant by Ward when he accepted the position of executive director of the KHRC.

Albarado Remains Suspended...

In other news on the day, jockey Robby Albarado met with the KHRC's License Review Committee in an attempt to get his current suspension lifted. Albarado was suspended indefinitely on May 4 after he was arrested on fourth-degree assault charges in Louisville. Albarado reportedly had a physical altercation with his live-in girlfriend. The jockey was arrested on similar charges last year after an incident with his wife. A lawyer from the National Jockey's Guild representing Albarado in the matter said the father of three should be able to make a living and support his family before the criminal matter is settled in court. The Committee initially said a decision would likely come Thursday morning, but WHAS news later reported that Albarado's suspension would be upheld. Because of reciprocity agreements between states, it is unlikely Albarado will be able to ride in other states pending his court case.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

ROCKET MAN GROUNDED

Fred Crabbia's champion **Rocket Man (Aus)** (Viscount {Aus}) will not be able to defend his title in Sunday's G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint in Singapore after sustaining a ligament strain in his left foreleg. "It's like twisting an ankle," explained trainer Pat Shaw. "All it needs is rest and he will get over it. If we were to press on, it could cause long term damage or even worse irreparable damage and that was not a risk I could take, and remember he has a screw in the other leg as well. He can have a good rest now and we will get him back up for his next campaign." Hero of the 2011 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, the 7-year-old gelding was second in this year's renewal.

SOUMILLON GIVES UP DABIRSIM LINK

Christophe Soumillon has told owner Simon Springer that he has given up the ride on **Dabirsim (Fr)** (Hat Trick {Jpn}) after the duo flopped in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp. Only sixth in the mile Classic, the sophomore was beaten at odds-on in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau over the same track and trip Apr. 15 after ending his juvenile campaign as France's unbeaten Horse of the Year. "I have gone over my two rides on him and I don't think I've made any big mistakes, but you have to look at the facts," Soumillon told *Paris-Turf*. "For some reason which I can't explain, I don't seem to get on with the colt. I'm not superstitious but the results speak for themselves--the chemistry isn't there between us. Regarding the horse and his connections, I think it's best for me to step aside and hope that the next jockey can help him rediscover his sparkle."



BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

COMETH THE HOUR

Godolphin's current crop of European 3-year-olds are badly in need of a headline act, and it could be that **Mandaeen (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) is the one to fill the void as he steps into the breach in today's G2 Dante S. at York. After earning 🌟 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🌟 status over nine furlongs on debut at Longchamp in October, the ex-Andre Fabre trainee justified that tag when following up in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud over a furlong further the following month. While that form has taken a knock or two, his greenness was there for all to see on the day and the impression was that he was clear best. "He had a good racecourse gallop at Newmarket and he is coming to hand nicely," trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni commented. "The trip will be fine for him and I expect the ground to be no problem. He wandered around a bit in the Criterium de Saint-Cloud, but it's hard to tell whether it was due to the going or inexperience, and he won his maiden on a faster surface. His main aim for the first half of the season has always been the [June 2] G1 Investec Derby and I expect him to improve for the outing, because we want him to be spot on for Epsom." Having been scratched from Friday's G3 Dee S. due to the rain-soaked ground, **Bonfire (GB)** (Manduo {Ger}) is certain to line up here and put his lofty reputation to the test. Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's G1 Criterium International third lacks the benefit of a prior run, which is not the case with another 🌟 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🌟 in **Ektihaam (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Given the speed he showed at two, it was a surprise to see how well he stayed this trip when hammering the highly-regarded Wrotham Heath (GB) (Dansili {GB}) by five lengths in an often informative Newbury conditions event run on soft ground on his return Apr. 20. Trainer Roger Varian said, "This has been his target since he won well at Newbury. I have been happy with him since that run and his work has been good. He is a big, strong horse, so we hope he will be suited by York's galloping track." George Strawbridge's **Fencing (Street Cry {Ire})** represents the form of the May 5 G1 2000 Guineas, in which he was a promising sixth and takes an inevitable step up in trip. "He ran a great race in the Guineas, and we always felt he was a mile-and-a-quarter horse on pedigree," trainer John Gosden commented.

TAKE TWO FOR TEUFLESBERG FILLY

A filly by Teuflesberg, helped by the exploits of her speedy full-brother Trinniberg and a force to reckon with on her own after a sparkling :09 4/5 breeze, was the talk of the sales grounds before the Keeneland April sale. A throat ailment knocked her out of that auction,

but bidders will have another chance at the juvenile during next week's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training sale.

"She had some pharyngitis at Keeneland and a small, I guess you would call it an ulcer, in her throat and of course

then everybody was saying that she would be penalized because of this, this and this," explained Fred Hertrich, who owns the filly as part of a group of horses in a pinhooking partnership with Kevin and J.B. McKathan. "Up until that point, she was absolutely perfect. So, rather than really discount her at that sale, because we knew how outstanding she was, we just decided to go to this sale where we have had very good luck in the past."

The McKathan Brothers and Hertrich sold a son of Harlan's Holiday at last year's Midlantic sale for \$250,000. Now named News Pending, the colt was second in this year's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. for Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence and trainer Dale Romans.

Hertrich wasn't at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale, but his partners convinced him this daughter of Teuflesberg out of stakes-placed Bella Dorato (Goldminers Gold) was one they needed to add to their pinhooking portfolio.

"The McKathan brothers called me up and they said 'Before you say anything, Fred, we have seen the best filly that we have seen at the yearling sales all year,'" Hertrich recalled. "I asked all the obvious questions and they said, 'She is a full-sister to a graded stakes 2-year-old and they kept leading me on, but not telling me anything. And then I said, 'Well, OK, who is the sire?' And they said 'Teuflesberg.'"

The filly stood out on her own merits though and her speedy full-brother was just a bonus, according to Hertrich.

"The way we grade them, she graded the top of all the fillies that we looked at last year," the 66-year-old explained. "The most important thing for us is conformation and presence. Because in the end, if you are going to pinhook something at a 2-year-old in training sale, sire doesn't mean as much as how fast can they run, how sound is the horse, how does it x-ray and how does it scope. Then you get into, it's a full-sister to a very, very good 2-year-old."

Hertrich expected the filly would bring over six figures last October, but, "[The McKathans] were so high on the filly, I just said 'You are going to have to buy her,'" he explained.

The filly sold for \$80,000 and Hertrich said, "In my mind, it was an unbelievable bargain for the package that we got."

After the hiccup at Keeneland April, the dark bay filly has been doing well and is ready for the Midlantic sale.

"She is doing unbelievably well," Hertrich said. "People have been to the farm and everybody's asking questions and I'm getting phone calls every which way. She'll work well, she'll scope well, she'll x-ray well, and she looks every bit the part--she is absolutely gorgeous. She is just so outstanding, somebody is going to get an excellent horse."

Hertrich, who operates a string of car dealerships in Delaware, Maryland and New Jersey, is primarily known as a breeder. He is owner of Watercress Farm in Paris, Kentucky and has a broodmare band of 80 head. Still, he finds his pinhooking venture is a good way to gauge the industry.

"The breeding is what I do," Hertrich said. "The pinhooking is just another activity during a different time of the year. We are breeders first and foremost, but what happens, the pinhooking kind of gives you an idea, especially with something like first-crop sires--who is precocious? Like with the Street Bosses, people were kind of asking how is he going to be? Well, people rewarded breeders and paid pretty good prices for Street Boss and now all of a sudden he's had two winners. And Colonel John sold well, he way oversold his stud fee and, when you are down in Florida in the winter watching these things, it influences who you breed to. Because it is a risk/reward. So we bred back to Street Boss and we bred back to Colonel John, even though it is in a very chancy year because we just liked what we saw."

"So pinhooking is more a case of keeping track of what is going on with the market," he continued. "You see things you wouldn't really know about if you weren't there participating. It is just another part of the annual pilgrimage through the horse business."

Hertrich said his pinhooking venture has been successful so far in 2012.

"It's been a good year," he said. "And, depending on how this filly sells, it could be a great year."

Hertrich has high expectations, both for his filly and for the Midlantic sale.

"If she is not the sales topper, I'll be shocked--as far as the fillies go," he said. "I can't imagine a filly that will be better than she is at this sale, so she should stand out.

"I think it is a great sale," he added. "I think it is a great venue. There are still people who have an appetite to purchase. There are some empty slots in barns, so I think it will be a very good sale."
