'MAMMA' LOOKS TOUGH IN BLACK-EYED SUSAN

Peachtree Stable's **Mamma Kimbo** (Discreet Cat) will look to remain unbeaten and kick off a potential Bob Baffert double this weekend at Pimlico in today's

GII Black-Eyed Susan S. for 3-year-old fillies. The bay received the **"TDN Rising Star"** distinction and a 101 Beyer Speed Figure for a 5 1/4-length debut romp sprinting at Santa Anita Feb. 18, and handled the stretch-out with ease to take the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn Apr. 11 by

1 1/4 lengths. Her connections opted to bypass the GI Kentucky Oaks two weeks ago, but Mamma Kimbo fired a pair of bullet drills over the Churchill Downs strip May 6 and May 12 to allay concerns about her condition.

While the expected favorite will take some beating, A G S Thoroughbreds's **Welcome Guest** (Unbridled's Song) could prove a formidable challenger. A 5 1/2-length graduate going 7 1/2 panels second out at Gulfstream Mar. 7, the grey comes off a second to Oaks runner-up Broadway's Alibi (Vindication) in Aqueduct's Apr. 7 GIII Comely S. at a flat mile. An extra furlong could prove prove right up the alley of the close relative to Grade I winner Political Force (Unbridled's Song), and trainer Chad Brown is bullish on his prospect's future. "I thought her race in the Comely was good," the conditioner offered. "She's still lightly raced, but she's developing nicely. The timing of this race was right, and it's the Black-Eyed Susan. It's a very nice, prestigious race, so we're excited about bringing her over there and running in it." **Cont. p7**

PIMLICO SPECIAL RETURNS WITH A BANG

It's been four years since the last renewal of the Pimlico Special S., and while the historic race is now a Grade III rather than a Grade I for now, you wouldn't know it if you looked at Friday's field of nine. Pin Oak Stable's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Alternation** (Distorted Humor) comes in with a trio of stakes tallies in Hot Springs, most recently when he went box to wire with little pressure in the Apr. 14 GII Oaklawn H. Noting that the addition of blinkers last fall has given Alternation an added bit of versatility, trainer Donnie Von Hemel told *Daily Racing Form* that post eight will allow rider Luis Quinonez to see how things develop early before determining whether or not to go to the front. "I think we drew a great post, have a nice run to the turn to look things over and assess it," Von Hemel told *DRF*. "He's a top horse, and I think you'll see that bear out over the course of the year." **Cont. p8**

SET ABLAZE

One of only two in the line-up for yesterday's G2 Dante S. without a prior run this term, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Bonfire (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) emerged as the leading G1 Derby contender connections always felt he would be and is now poised to take on his one-time paddock mate Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) on the first Saturday in June. Reared alongside Ballydoyle's G1 2000 Guineas winner and also the same Pocahontas syndicate's Oaks contender Vow (GB) (Motivator {GB}) at Highclere Stud, Bonfire has become one of the most talked-about horses this spring after going from a Salisbury maiden win in September to a luckless third in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud a month later. Held up by an imperfect blood picture in April, he was taken out of Friday's G3 Dee S. at Chester due to soft ground and was forced to take on a field containing mostly race-hardened competitors at York Thursday. Traveling smoothly in second early by Jimmy Fortune as the 11-4 favorite **Ernest Hemingway (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) set strong fractions under Joseph O'Brien, the bay took over from that rival with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining, when he was joined by **Ektihaam (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). He may have been briefly headed by that rival, but the 3-1 second choice asserted under mainly hand riding in the final yards to score by 3/4 of a length, with four lengths back to the 2000 Guineas sixth **Fencing** (Street Cry {Ire}). **Cont. p5**

It looks like he took to the track nicely," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He was pretty cool out there. I am not seeing anything to make me think anything different about him. He bounced right out of the Derby. His weight has held. He can handle it."

What's Your Alibi?
 The connections of Saturday's GI Preakness S. entrants packed the house at yesterday's traditional Alibi Breakfast at Pimlico, given the opportunity to talk up their charge, or in some cases, receive a few laughs from the crowd.

The home team will be represented by a pair of longshots in

Sagamore Farm's **Tiger Walk** (Tale of the Cat) and Kidwells Petite Stable's **Pretension** (Bluegrass Cat). The historic Sagamore Farm, located in Glyndon, Maryland, was purchased by Under Armour founder and Maryland native Kevin Plank in 2007. *Cont. p4*

"It was Kevin's vision to save a Maryland landmark, one of the most storied farms in the history of Thoroughbred racing," Sagamore Farm General Manager Tom Mullikin commented. "It's a big deal to have a horse in the stall [for the Preakness], and come Saturday, I think it's really going to hit us--it means a lot."

Tiger Walk, a two-time winner just across town at Laurel Park, enters off a decent fourth in the GI Wood Memorial at the Big A Apr. 7.

Pretension got back on track following a pair of unplaced efforts in the GIII Gotham S. and GIII Illinois Derby to capture Pimlico's Cananero II S. May 5.

"Mr. [Irving] Kidwell and myself are both Maryland natives," trainer Chris Grove revealed. "We're fulfilling a dream of his to have a horse in the Preakness."

Team Valor returns to Baltimore with Derby fourth **Went the Day Well** (Proud Citizen) off the heels of a second-place showing by Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in the 2011 renewal. Barry Irwin was inspired to tell a story of his earlier days as a Turf writer, recalling a botched interview with legendary trainer Laz Barrera, after watching Tim Layden of *Sports Illustrated* receive the Old Hilltop Award earlier in the program.

"When he spoke to you he used to keep a small ball of gum right under his tongue and he played with it, and he also had that thick Spanish accent," Irwin said. "When I got up to the press box, I couldn't understand a word that he said [on the tape recorder], and I had to go back and re-do the whole interview."

Trainer Mike Harrington, seemingly under constant fire for having **Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) skip a couple of days of training during Derby week, has kept his dry sense of humor through all of the criticism.

"How come everybody second guesses you so much with this horse?" Harrington recalled a journalist asking him recently. "Well, it's obvious. They don't think I know what the hell I'm doing."

The Heinz Steinmann colorbearer finished fifth, beaten only three lengths, after a very wide trip in Louisville.

Bob Baffert, never one to shy away from the spotlight, put on a good show, as always.

"It's my favorite stop on the Classic trail," the Hall of Famer, who will be represented by Preakness morning-line favorite **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker), said. "You always look forward to coming here. Win, lose or draw, you leave in a good mood."

Has the recent health scare changed things at all?

"Well, usually I have about *six* pieces of fried chicken here," said Baffert, having some fun at his own expense after suffering a heart attack in Dubai in March.

How did Baffert hold up after seeing those wicked early splits set by Bodemeister in the Derby?

"I got my Nitroglycerin ready," he joked.

The **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley) team was out in full force at Pimlico yesterday, led by owners J. Paul and Zillah Reddam, trainer Doug O'Neill and jockey Mario Gutierrez.

How did the Derby winner get his name again?

"He just likes cookies," Mrs. Reddam said of her husband. "Contrary to popular belief, I don't make them every day for him."

Doug O'Neill has handled the leading role right there with the best of them, and discussed the thrill of throwing out the first pitch at Tuesday's Baltimore Orioles game at Camden Yards.

"It would've been a little chin music to a right-handed batter," he said of the toss. "What a thrill, it was a lot of fun. My whole team was there; we had a great time."

As for the business at hand this weekend, O'Neill added, "Anyone who's had a chance to watch [I'll Have Another] gallop, you could see how special of an individual he is. He's loving Pimlico. We're pumped and ready."

D. Wayne Lukas, represented by Derby 11th **Optimizer** (English Channel), closed out the show to some of the loudest laughs of the day, including a few at the expense of one of his best pals.

"I remember when Bob [Baffert] called me up and was real excited that Jill was pregnant," Lukas, a five-time winner of the Preakness, responded when asked if he ever considered naming a horse after anybody. "I said, 'Really, don't worry about a thing. I'll find out who did it.' In all fairness, he loves him just like he was his own."

Based on the two trainers' entries in the big one, though, there's little doubt who will be laughing last.

"I was getting a little bit uncomfortable with all the hype, because he's not a brilliant work horse at home and he's only done it in flashes this spring," trainer

Andrew Balding said of Bonfire,

who was following up the win

of his half-sister Joviality (GB)

(Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G3

Musidora S. here last year. "It

was a great relief to get him

out and he behaved like a

professional most of the time.

He did it well and Jimmy

[Fortune] was very

impressed--it was a truly run

race and a proper trial, and the

second had already run this

season. He was always a horse that we thought would

improve at three, and I think he has grown up--the trip

to France helped in that respect, as did the aborted

mission to Chester last week. Jimmy said he was

getting a little bit leg-weary in the last furlong from lack

of race-fitness rather than lack of stamina. That is all

the more encouraging and, although we've only got

over a fortnight, if he comes out well we've got to give

the Derby serious consideration. He traveled well and

that is key at Epsom, so it looks like he's got the

natural ability to handle it. I've never had a Derby

runner, but he has it all, and hopefully this race has not

taken it out of him."

Fortune added, "He traveled like a good horse and was probably in front long enough. We went a decent gallop and it was a good trial, but it's as much as we wanted to do. He's a playful little horse and he likes to do things his own way, but he's very genuine."

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Ekhtiham also emerged with great credit, but a tilt at the Derby is unlikely, according to trainer Roger Varian. "We're competitors and you're always a bit annoyed when you don't win, but I'm thrilled with how he ran," he told *PA Sport*. "He traveled into the race really well, and I'm delighted that he's shown he's up to this level. He's a horse with the physique to improve through the year. I'll speak to the owner before we make any definite plans, but it's nice to be going home knowing we've got a really good one on our hands. He's in the French Derby [G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly June 3] and the other race to consider would be the [June 21] G3 Tercentenary S. over 10 furlongs at Royal Ascot. He's not in at Epsom, and I think 10 furlongs is as far as he wants at this stage. Just 25 yards from the line, the winner was finishing better than we were."

Just like her dam Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic) in 2003, Izzi Top stamped her class on this all-important staging post for the leading older fillies and mares to suggest a Group 1 success is around the corner. While Zee Zee Top did not make the track until the autumn of her 3-year-old season, Izzi Top had a sole start at two and returned to take a mile maiden at Windsor last April, only to be stripped of the win due to a prohibited substance. That meant the homebred was getting off the mark when beating Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in Newbury's Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial S. over 10 furlongs on this weekend a year ago, and she may have found a mile and a half too far when third on her next start in the G1 Epsom Oaks. Coaxed back after a four-month rest to win the G3 Prix de Flore over 1 5/16 miles at Saint-Cloud, she again showed how effective she is when fresh when capturing the G3 Dahlia S. over nine furlongs at Newmarket 11 days prior to this race.

Middleton S. cont.

Racing enthusiastically in second early as Mohedian Lady (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) established a clear lead, Izzi Top traveled strongly to the front approaching the quarter pole. Immediately joined by last year's runner-up Sajjhaa there, she asserted in the closing stages despite drifting left. "We weren't going to run in the Dahlia, but we decided to, as we had trouble getting the gallops into her and she won nicely," trainer John Gosden commented. "That brought her on and she traveled well here and had the race controlled from two out. She's very competitive and a lovely filly. Races like the G1 Nassau S. [at Goodwood Aug. 4] and [Oct. 7] G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp are her targets, but there is a bit of a gap now. She is in the G2 Windsor Forest S. [at Royal Ascot June 20], but she might not settle as well over a mile and a quarter if we drop back to a mile for that. I always like to go up in trip rather than down, so we might freshen up and wait for the Nassau." Buick added, "I love this filly--she's top-class. She tries her hardest and what she really needs now is a Group 1. She really deserves it and I think that is the obvious step up that she's going to take. She jumps very well from the stalls and although I could probably afford to ride her from a bit further back, you can get away with it from the front here. She was just looking around in front a bit, so today she was there soon enough."

"I was a bit worried beforehand, as he has never ran on a left-handed course before, but we practised at home and in the end it was very easy," commented winning jockey Mirco Demuro. "I would love to keep on riding him, but nothing is clear at the moment, as he is now trained in England."

The Todd Pletcher outfit boasts a pair of contenders in GIII Bourbonette Oaks romper **In Lingerie** (Empire Maker) and **Disposablepleasure**, who was a distant third behind Oaks heroine Believe You Can (Proud Citizen) in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 31.

"To be honest with you, we've been a little bit disappointed in both of her races this year," admitted Pletcher of Disposablepleasure, who will carry the same Glencrest silks as 2007 Black-Eyed Susan winner Panty Raid. The grey overcame a disastrous start to take last November's GII Demoiselle S. by a nose over **Wildcat's Smile**, but was a non-threatening fourth in the GII Davona Dale S. in her seasonal debut. "We felt a little bit better after the Kentucky Oaks that the Fair Grounds race was maybe a little bit stronger than it seemed at the time, but she continues to train like a filly that's better than that," Pletcher explained. "Hopefully, she's rounding into form, and it's just taking her a couple starts to get there."

Of In Lingerie, whose two wins from three starts both came at Turfway, Pletcher said, "We flirted with the idea of the Kentucky Oaks, but we felt like, with a filly that had only had three starts, that perhaps this was a better progression for her. She has trained very well."

Alternation didn't scare off many of his Oaklawn Handicap also-rans, however, as third-place finisher **Yawanna Twist**, fourth-place finisher **Hymn Book** and sixth-place finisher **Nehro** are back for more. Yawanna Twist took the GII General George H. over **Toby's Corner** going seven panels at nearby Laurel Feb. 20, while Hymn Book won a photo over **Mission Impazible** in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 11. Nehro, last year's GI Kentucky Derby runner-up, kicked off his 4-year-old season with a 7 1/4-length optional claiming romp at Fair Grounds Feb. 25.

Mission Impazible, a two-time Grade II winner with a pair of Grade I placings last term, and Toby's Corner, last year's GI Wood Memorial S. winner, were second and third respectively behind runaway winner Nates Mineshaft (Mineshaft) in the GII New Orleans H. Apr. 1. "The last time at New Orleans we had a long way to go and the track was very speed favoring that day," said Graham Motion, who has been prepping Toby's Corner in Maryland at Fair Hill. "He had a nice breeze, going six [furlongs in 1:13] and change and we believe this spot fits in very well with what we're trying to do."

ABSOLUTELY FABULOUS

Godolphin's record in the G2 Yorkshire Cup speaks for itself, with five winners since 1995, and **Be Fabulous (Ger)** (Samum {Ger}) is charged with extending that record today. Nurtured by Andre Fabre last term, the lightly raced bay was highly progressive and ended her 4-year-old campaign with a win in Longchamp's G1 Prix Royal-Oak in October. Penalized for that effort, she carries the hopes of the Mahmood Al Zarooni stable. "She is in really good form at home and Frankie [Dettori] rides her, and we hope she can run a really good race," Al Zarooni said. "She will improve for the run, but we want to find out if she is good enough to run in the [June 21] G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot."

Brian Haggas' **Harris Tweed (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) has always looked primed for a race of this nature and comes here on the back of an impressive five-length defeat of the subsequent G3 Prix d'Hedouville winner Allied Powers (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), with Arctic Cosmos (North Light {Ire}) back in fifth, in the G3 John Porter S. over 12 furlongs at Newbury Apr. 21. Trainer William Haggas told *PA Sport*, "He won over a mile and six [furlongs] as a 3-year-old and he seems very well. The ground's fine, but any more rain would help him."

Ronnie Arculli's G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who was also third in the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin in December, was put in his place on his return when runner-up to Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) in the two-mile G3 Sagaro S. re-routed to Kempton from Ascot last time May 2. "Everything's gone well since the Sagaro and he seems in good form," trainer Ed Dunlop told *PA Sport*. "As expected, it's a competitive race and we hope for the best. This race fits in well with his programme. We wanted to have a fairly early campaign--he might or might not go to Royal Ascot after this--then have a break and come back for an autumn campaign which will include going back to Australia for the Melbourne Cup."

On the sidelines for 16 months after an 11 3/4-romp in the Pleasant Colony S. at Saratoga, he resurfaced with a 5 1/4-length triumph in the Harlan's Holiday S. at Gulfstream last December. He suffered his first loss when sixth in the Feb. 11 GI Donn H. last time out. 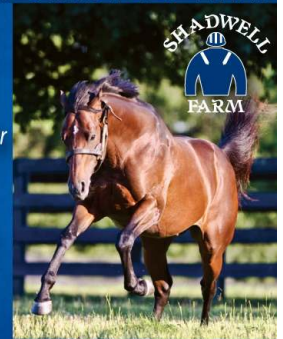
