ANOTHER CRACK AT A CLASSIC

J. Paul Reddam's GI Kentucky Derby hero **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley) goes for the second jewel of the

Triple Crown in today's GI Preakness S., but it remains to be seen whether he'll be favored in the 9 1/2-furlong event. The chestnut was tabbed at 5-2 on the Preakness morning line in deference to speed merchant **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) set as the 8-5 chalk. In the past 50 years, the Derby runner-up has turned the tables in the

Preakness just twice, with Summer Squall accomplishing the feat in 1990 and Prairie Bayou doing the same in 1993. "On paper, it looks like he's going to be the speed," said Bodemeister's trainer Bob Baffert. "He has to break well. He has a high cruising speed and, hopefully, he doesn't go as fast as he did in the Derby." **Cont. p3**

FOR CLARKE, IT'S ALL IN THE FAMILY

If Soldat (War Front) had already provided Harvey Clarke with a "once-in-a-lifetime thrill" by carrying his green and white silks to an unplaced effort in the 2011 Run for the Roses, how do you think the 71-year-old felt after watching a horse that he bred in **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley) win the 138th renewal?

"It was amazing," said Clarke, president of the Manhattan-based A.J. Clarke Real Estate Corp. "Who would ever think it? It's just surreal. I didn't win a stakes race until 1988 and didn't win a graded stakes until 2009. To be involved in two Derbies two years in a row--for a little guy from the Bronx who got into the horse business 30 years ago to have a little bit of fun--it's just something you never could've imagined happening."

Clarke acquired the Derby winner's dam Arch's Gal Edith (Arch), named with the popular 1970s sitcom *All in the Family* in mind, for \$80,000 at the 2004 OBS March 2-Year-Old Sale. The dark bay didn't make it to the races until September of her 3-year-old season, but proved well worth the wait, delivering a 27-1 debut victory going six furlongs at Belmont Park.

"She hurt herself as a 2-year-old kicking a wall," Clarke revealed. "I brought her back as a 3-year-old, but she came up with a chip in her ankle after the debut. She never returned the right way after we popped it out. Given the fact that myself and [trainer] Kieran McLaughlin had liked her a lot, I figured what the heck, and took a shot and bred her. The rest is history as they say."

I'll Have Another is the third foal from the 10-year-old mare. Clarke credits Brookdale Farm's Freddy Seitz for suggesting the mating to Flower Alley. **Cont. p4**

“He was a big, good-looking correct horse,” Clarke said of the Three Chimneys stallion. “The stud fee was in the range that I was looking to spend; he was at \$25,000 at the time. It seemed like a good cross. It didn’t make sense to send a mare like that to his father [Distorted Humor]. He was the son of a wonderful horse who could get two turns and won the Travers; it seemed like a good match to me.”

Clarke currently has about a dozen horses in training with McLaughlin, including partnerships, and also owns nine broodmares.

“Every one of them is a filly that I had raced,” Clarke said of his broodmare band. “If I liked them, I figured what else am I going to do with them when their career was over.”

The licensed insurance and real estate broker was willing to part ways with I'll Have Another for only \$11,000 at the 2010 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Dennis O'Neill went to \$35,000 on behalf of J. Paul Reddam at the following year's OBS April Sale.

“He brought what he was worth because nobody else raised their hand after they got to \$11,000,” said a very realistic Clarke, who apparently isn't suffering any seller's remorse. “Commercially, I'm not really a breeder. Some of them I keep and some I sell. In 2010, I needed some money to pay for a bunch of bills. I think we sold everything that we bred that year.”

Arch's Gal Edith's eldest produce, the 5-year-old Those Wer The Days (Thunder Gulch), is currently riding a five-race winning streak for Clarke, most recently annexing a \$50,000 optional claimer at Aqueduct Apr. 13. Her 4-year-old When Willy Win (Soto), a \$6,000 FTKOCT yearling graduate, has posted a solid record of 15-6-2-4, and last faced the starter at Will Rogers Downs in late April. Clarke held on to Arch's Gal Edith's unraced 2-year-old filly by Tapit named Gloria S.

“The Tapit was a June foal, so we gave her a year off in 2011,” said Clarke, adding that Arch's Gal Edith was bred to Gio Ponti this spring. “Then she had a red-bag foal [by Midnight Lute] this year which died. It always happens to the good ones.”

Any plans to sell his prized possession?

“As I said to somebody the other day, if I had any sense I would sell her, but I have none, so I'll hold on to her,” Clarke replied.

After attending last year's Kentucky Derby with a large group of family and friends, Clarke decided to stay back home in New Jersey at a friend's house two weeks ago on the first Saturday of May.

“I don't think there was anyone who was yelling at the TV louder than us,” he admitted. “We all thought Bodemeister had the race won, then all of a sudden somebody said, ‘Who's that with the purple cap coming up on the outside.’ I said, ‘I think that's our boy!’”

It was indeed Clarke's boy.

I'll Have Another sat a perfect trip beneath Mario Gutierrez, and ran past the extremely game pacesetter and GI Preakness S. morning-line favorite **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) for a 1 1/2-length score.

Clarke's initial introduction to the game came as a teenager by making frequent trips to take in the harness action at Yonkers Raceway in New York. He didn't catch what he describes as "the virus," until his children began taking riding lessons in the 1970s.

"Steve Shahinian, who ran the place, picks out the horses for me now," he said. "We got to talking, and me and two other guys decided to buy a horse together. Once you get infected with that virus, you don't stop. I just kept going and going. It's been quite a ride."

The ride continues today in Baltimore.

Dominguez Takes Reins on Tiger Walk

Sagamore Farm's **Tiger Walk** (Tale of the Cat) will be ridden by Ramon Dominguez, who takes over from Kent Desormeaux. Desormeaux failed a breathalyzer test at Belmont Friday and was taken off his three New York mounts. He is not suspended, but the New York State Racing & Wagering Board is conducting an investigation following a new rule that came into effect Apr. 27. "It was a team decision," trainer Ignacio Correas IV said. "Ramon is a great rider. We're happy to have him."

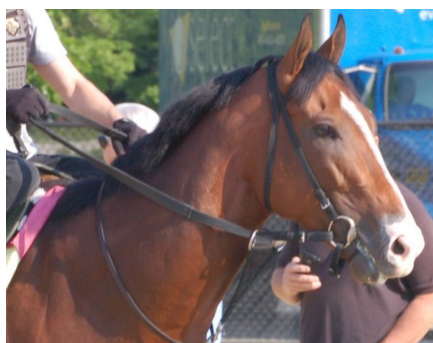

In Lingerie, a granddaughter of champion Phone Chatter, made her debut at Turfway Jan. 14 for trainer Stephen Lyster. She led every step en route to a 6 1/4-length tally and caught the attention of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, which turned her over to Pletcher. The bay filly lost her cool in the gate prior to a Feb. 25 allowance test going a mile at Gulfstream and wound up a non-threatening second to Zo Impressive (Hard Spun) that day. Stepped up in class last out, In Lingerie made a triumphant return to Turfway's Polytrack with a wire-to-window triumph in the Gill Bourbonette Oaks Mar. 24, but her connections skipped the GI Kentucky Oaks two weeks ago in favor of this spot.

In Lingerie bobbed at the break and grabbed a quarter, but recovered quickly and settled into stride in seventh as Mamma Kimbo assumed her usual spot on the front end. In Lingerie took the overland route on the far turn to reach contention. The favorite began to shorten stride in the lane and In Lingerie drove past her en route for her second straight graded trophy.

"She stumbled there, but she got a good position in the first turn," said winning rider John Velazquez. "I just wanted to get good position into the first turn, and we did and after that it was pretty easy for us." Disposablepleasure, bottled up entering the stretch, angled out and made up ground belatedly.

The winner's dam has an Unbridled's Song 2-year-old filly that sold for \$250,000 to Nobutaka Tada at KEESEP. She has a yearling Candy Ride (Arg) filly and produced another filly by that stallion Apr. 21.

Alternation captured the GII Peter Pan S. 12 months ago, but the rest of his sophomore season was a bit disappointing, and he finished up 2011 with a narrow loss in the Oklahoma Derby Oct. 16. He kicked off his 4-year-old campaign with a sharp win in Oaklawn's Essex H. Feb. 4, then outfooted Tapizar (Tapit) in the GIII Razorback H. in Hot Springs Mar. 10., and continued his ascent by defeating a tough group in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 14.

Alternation settled in third as Endorsement sailed through a :46.88 half up front. The Pin Oak colorbearer rallied between rivals turning for home, moved past Endorsement in deep stretch and timed his strides perfectly under the wire as Nehro came charging. "It's good to see him back," said Nehro's trainer Steve Asmussen. "He was very unlucky to lose the head-bob like that. But he ran great."

Winning trainer Donnie Von Hemel said that Alternation's next target would likely be the GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs June 16, but added, "Let's just enjoy this and we'll worry about that in about a week."

Getting a Handle...

The 13 races on Friday's card at Pimlico generated a 28% increase in handle to \$13,786,798. "What a fantastic way to start the weekend by being up over \$3 million in wagering," said Maryland Jockey Club President Tom Chuckas. Red Cadeaux has been an admirable talisman for Ed Dunlop's Newmarket base, but had fallen just short when tested at the highest level. Having hit the board in September's G1 Irish St Leger at The Curragh, the chestnut came agonizingly close to glory, but was denied by Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) in the Nov. 1 G1 Melbourne Cup at Flemington, and fell to that rival again when finishing

third in the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin the following month. He opened this campaign with a second to the impressive Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) in the rescheduled G3 Sagaro S. at Kempton May 2, but earned his day in the sun with a gutsy performance here for a career-best win. Red Cadeaux employed patient tactics just off the pace in fourth for most of this marathon. Sent in pursuit of the leaders with three furlongs remaining, he battled his way to the front inside the quarter-mile marker and, despite drifting left once there, he stayed on resolutely under a drive to safely hold the late rush of Glen's Diamond. "He's been a good old servant, but we got to the front too soon and I thought he was going to throw it away," admitted winning rider Tom McLaughlin. "He's always had a tendency to run left, but fair play to him because he kept going. He was unlucky in the Melbourne Cup and ran well in Ireland and Hong Kong. He's a tough old campaigner."

Dunlop was equally fulsome in his praise. "He's been a star for all of us, and it's a great day for the horse and the team," Dunlop enthused. "He's a gentle giant, he doesn't worry about life and has improved phenomenally as he's got older. Thank goodness there weren't any French here today, as Dunaden has beaten him twice. The plan is to go back for the Melbourne Cup, but I don't know what we'll do in the interim. He's in the [June 2 G1] Coronation Cup [at Epsom], we might give that a go, and he's also in the [June 23 G2] Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot. He will race on until Royal Ascot, and after that he'll have a holiday. We'll then bring him back and give him a prep before Australia, where he might run twice, so let's hope he stays in one piece."

"It was marvellous for the Prince to keep him in training, as a lot of people commercially would have retired him," Cecil commented. "If you have a horse of that calibre, they don't come along every day, and they don't grow on trees. It's nice to actually see his full potential, and the Prince has taken that chance. Some of the opposition have had a race, which is a great advantage, but I feel he has done enough to give a good account of himself. One thing I am pretty sure about is that he will come on for the race and will be a stronger and more settled horse this year."

Newbury's crowds are set to give Frankel the star treatment he deserves today. The owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe is feeling the weight of expectation. "For Group 1 racing, you have to bring your A-game and we will need to," he commented. "People like to see horses properly tested now that the breeding program demands it, which means that sometimes they are going to get beaten, and sometimes they will come back and show everyone how good they are. That's the great thrill of it."

AN AMERICAN IN ROME

Ken Ramsey could be spending a lot of time across the pond this year, and the native Kentuckian hopes to kick off his 2012 European Tour in a big way in tomorrow's G2 Derby Italiano at Capannelle in Rome. Ken and wife Sarah will see their red and white colors carried by Real Solution, a homebred son of their breakout sire Kitten's Joy who is thus far unbeaten and untested in three career starts. The colt, who comes in off a five-length romp in the Listed Premio Boticelli in April, will be partnered for the first time with Italy's favorite son Frankie Dettori. The flashy rider has won the race twice before.

"I'm hoping to get that flying dismount he's famous for!" Ramsey said yesterday from Rome.

Ramsey's journey to Italy took much longer than a nine-hour flight. It began several years ago in Florida, when he met Dr. Paolo Romanelli, an Italian-born dermatologist who is a professor at the University of Miami. Romanelli, as it turns out, is also the American representative for the Italian company SGA Sales, and met Ramsey and his family at the track one day when they were visiting Florida. Romanelli took the Ramseys out to dinner, and, in a gesture of friendship, offered to put them in touch with a colleague, Dr. Ralph Sacco, regarding the health of Sarah Ramsey. Sarah, or 'Kitten,' as Ken calls her, was battling the effects of a stroke that occurred in February of 2007. Sacco was president of the American Heart Association, but also a renowned neurologist.

"He really, really helped my wife," said Ramsey. "He prescribed some stuff and turned me around on my thinking about stem cells and research and things like that."

As a way of saying thanks to Romanelli, Ramsey agreed to send some horses to Italy to race. "I kind of felt like it was payback," said Ramsey. "So the trainer flew to Ocala in Florida, where Eddie Woods had my 2-year-olds, and picked out five. I ended up giving him three."

One of the horses the trainer--Gianluca Bietolini--chose was of course Real Solution, who has proven to be a rising star in Europe's 3-year-old division. "He's very typical of his dad," said Ramsey. "He's got that devastating kick at the tail end of a race. He'll be going a mile and [three-eighths] on Sunday, and a lot of them get a little tired after a mile and an eighth, so, hopefully, that'll be his time to shine."

In addition to gratitude, Ramsey had another reason to send the horses to Italy: to familiarize Europeans with the offspring of Kitten's Joy, already one of America's leading turf and synthetic sires.

"The Kitten's Joys prefer the track to be a little on the firm side, and in Ireland and England, it's usually good or heavy or yielding," said Ramsey. "Over here, as you know, they have palm trees in Rome, and they don't get nearly as much rain and the ground is firmer. So it's a good place to get Kitten's Joy established."

If all goes well Sunday, Ramsey has big plans for Real Solution. He's already penciled in the 1 1/2-mile G2 King Edward VIII S. at Royal Ascot on Friday, June 22, and said the colt could head to

Chantilly in France to prep for what could be the ultimate goal: the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October.

"The trainer thinks he might be good enough to go in the Arc," said Ramsey. "A lot of 3-year-olds have won it in the past. We've got high hopes for Real Solution. We just hope we get a good, firm racecourse Sunday, and he's feeling his best."

Ramsey could have as many as six starters at Royal Ascot--all by Kitten's Joy--led by G1 Coronation S. hopeful Stephanie's Kitten.

And the next crop of Kitten's Joys will soon be headed to Italy. Ramsey confirmed he currently has three juveniles in quarantine in Ocala who ship over next week.

Ramsey is currently enjoying his Italian sojourn with his son Jeffrey and John D'Amato, who is assisting Ramsey with his Italian stable...as well as acting as a translator.

“Both of John’s parents were from Italy,” said Ramsey. “I only speak broken English, so it’s a little difficult to understand the Italian.”

It is Ramsey’s first time in the country, and he says it’s been quite an experience so far. “We’re staying at a hotel probably 200 feet from the Pantheon, so I’ve been over there to look at that twice,” he said. “We’re going to the Colosseum [today]. We were out to Caesar’s palace and where they had the chariot races, and got up close and personal with the aqueducts. I threw three coins in the Trevi Fountain and made a wish. So we’re generally just taking in all the tourist attractions. I also had a first cousin who was killed over here in World War II, so we’re going out to the American cemetery where he was buried in Florence. But Rome is quite a city; the Eternal City, they call it. There’s a lot of history over here, and a lot of lessons to be learned from the past and what could happen in the future.”

While taking time to see the sights, Ramsey said he’s nonetheless keeping his eye on the prize: Sunday’s Derby Italiano. “We’re hoping to have the same outcome as Caesar,” he said. “Remember his famous quotation: I came, I saw, I conquered? I’m not going to say that if I make it to the winner’s circle, but that’s the way I’m going to feel. So I hope to have the same outcome as Julius Caesar did, but not end up in the end like he did!”

It seems to be a particularly challenging time for racing. What do you see as the main challenges that lie ahead for the Breeders' Cup?

"Economic challenges abound for many industries domestically and internationally. Fortunately, the leadership of the Breeders' Cup have ensured the financial stability of this organization for many years to come. The product continues to be in high demand, as evidenced by the sustained history of an expanded racing program, increased international participation and the overall popularity of the Championships with our fans. Already, we have received very strong initial presale ticket purchase requests for this year's event at Santa Anita. Going forward, our challenge is to be judicious in the use of our capital to ensure we not only continue to fund financial results for the Breeders' Cup, while also utilizing those resources to introduce new audiences to the grandeur of horse racing."

You spent 13 years at Turfway. How will your background there help you in your current position?

"The Breeders' Cup experience is very reliant on our Track partners. As a track operator, I have an understanding of the practical implications of delivering on the expectations of the fan, the horsemen, the owners, and the community, and can work hands on with the track partner to exceed those expectations. Further, having worked within the complex regulatory environment for 13 years, I have a familiarity with the rules of racing that can be an asset to our participants."

Recent articles in the *New York Times* and other sources have cast racing in a particularly bad light. As an industry, in what area do you think we need to focus on most? Elimination of raceday medication? Uniform medication rules? Track surfaces? Something else?

“Clearly, there are smart, well-intentioned people in our industry who have divergent opinions about each of these subjects. My sense is that regardless of your position on a specific opinion, everyone of these people are trying to solve the same problem: how do we bring new fans, and new capital, to our industry? Horse owners want higher purses and a better chance at a return on investment. Breeders want more buyers with larger capital sources to compete for their stock at public or private auction. Racetracks want more horses, more fans at their venues, and more money in their betting pools. Having said that, how we conduct our business from an integrity and compassion for the participants, both human and equine, should always be at the center of those conversations.”

What are some things the Breeders' Cup has done well in recent years? What are some things you think could have been done better?

“If you look at the participation from foreign connections, both in terms of BCWC starters, simulcast handle, and nominated stallions/horses, the Breeders' Cup has grown the international complexion of its organization tremendously. Moving forward, we understand the desire for a more defined plan of where the World Championships will be held in upcoming years, and we are actively working toward that.”

What do you see as the biggest growth opportunities for the Breeders' Cup?

“Unequivocally, I believe we can drive new fan creation for the entire sport centered around an incredible event experience that transcends just the two days of racing. The Enhanced Experience Committee, created by the Breeders' Cup Board, has already made tremendous improvements that were implemented at Churchill Downs in 2011, and are actively considering additional improvements for Santa Anita this fall, and future events, as well. As great as these two racing days have become, the goal is to create a transcendent entertainment and sporting event worthy of mention in the same breath as the Masters, Super Bowl, or the Final Four.

“Additionally, we are expanding and upgrading our digital media program, which will include the creation of social games to reach a potential new audience of fans, allowing them to become more familiar with the Breeders' Cup and Thoroughbred racing.

“Finally, we're very excited about our new relationship with the NBC Sports Network, our broadcaster for this year's World Championships. We are especially looking forward to the Breeders' Cup Classic being shown, for the first time ever, live in prime time on NBC from 8-9 p.m. ET. We feel this is a great opportunity to expose new viewers to our Championships and introduce them to the climactic event of the racing season.”

Do you have any specific plans that you're bringing to the Breeders' Cup? Any goals?

“Day 5, and I feel like I am drinking out of a fire hydrant! At some point, the acclimation period will be over, and we will move into providing value-added ideas, strategies, operating ideas. Having said that, on Day 5, I couldn't be more impressed with the caliber of my colleagues, and the passion that the Breeders' Cup Board has for not resting on the laurels of nearly 30 years of excellence.”

U.S. JUDGE RULES IN FAVOR OF COOLMORE

Judge John A. Kronstadt, a U.S. District Court Judge in California, has upheld an international arbitrator's ruling that Jerry Jamgotchian owes Coolmore Stud and affiliates over €310,000 for stud fee payments from 2007 and 2008. The ruling was made May 11. The arbitrator was Sam Sheppard, the chief executive of the European Breeders' Fund who was appointed by England's Thoroughbred Breeders' Association for the dispute. Jamgotchian alleged bias because Coolmore is a supporter of the EBF. However, in his ruling, Judge Kronstadt said Jamgotchian "has failed to present any clear evidence of bias" and "has failed to meet his burden to establish sufficient evidence that Sheppard was biased or acted contrary to public policy." The ruling also stated, "As the prevailing party, Petitioners may submit a bill of costs and file a motion for attorneys' fees."

A two-time winner at Charles Town last term, Sensible Lady couldn't handle this circuit in a pair of subsequent starts, finishing fifth in the grassy Selima S. at Laurel Oct. 15 before checking in a distant seventh in the Nov. 19 Smart Halo S. on the main. The dark bay caused a 22-1 upset over Jazzy Idea in a course-and-distance allowance Apr. 1 and was returning to Old Hilltop off a well-beaten fifth in the Trevoise S. on the dirt at Parx Apr. 17. An outsider in this unlikely spot, Sensible Lady saved ground to the turn before easing out to the two path on the bend. She went after pacesetting Inspired at the head of the lane, put a couple of lengths on her rivals and held save to the wire. "I'm not surprised at all," said trainer Tim Salzman of the upset. 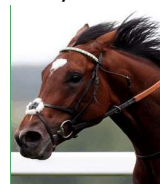

SOLID TRADE AT BADEN-BADEN BREEZE-UP

Europe's relentless march of Breeze-Up sales moved on to Baden-Baden's Iffezheim venue yesterday, and improvements were registered across the board as a daughter of Montjeu (Ire) led the way when selling for a top price of €70,000. Offered as hip [61](#) by MM Racing Training & Breeding, the well-made May foal is a half-sister to the 2006 GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup H. and GII San Clemente H. victress Attima (GB) (Zafonic), and fell to the winning bid of Tina Rau Bloodstock, providing a significant profit on the €17,000 she cost at last year's Arqana October Sale. "I remember this filly as a yearling and have seen her a couple of times over the winter," said Rau. "She's come on leaps and bounds in the last few months and has done nothing but improve. I thought she put in one of the best breezes this morning and has taken everything in her stride. She has a great mind on her for a Montjeu filly and was bought for an existing client." Within the opening hour, GTM GmbH's hip [10](#), a daughter of Big Shuffle who had breezed particularly well, set the early standard when realising €58,000. The chestnut, already named Ratana (Ger), is a granddaughter of the 1996 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Matiya (Ire) (Alzao), who also hit the board in the G1 Ascot Fillies' Mile, G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Prix de Diane. She was knocked down to Cologne-based conditioner Andreas Lowe, who outlasted Heiko Volz, and came with an entry in tomorrow's maiden at the adjacent track.

Baden-Baden Breeze Up cont.

"We're thrilled with that and she was bought for the Belgian team of Stall Molenhof," revealed Lowe. "She'll race under Christian Sprengel's care on Sunday, but will then be shipped to my yard in Cologne." Bronze-medal position on the podium was claimed by Hans-Jorg Gartner's hip [70](#), a March-foaled filly by Distant Music, who went the way of agent Ronald Rauscher, on behalf of Australian interests, for €38,000. She is a half-sister to last term's G1 Melbourne Cup third and MGSW Lucas Cranach (Ger) (Mamool {Ire}). "She will head to Australia eventually, but for the time being she'll remain in training here in Germany," Rauscher explained. "She'll try to attain some black-type before heading down under to continue her career. She's a nice filly who should do well." At the end of a solid day's trade, BBAG's Managing Director Carola Ortlieb commented, "We are happy with the turnover which improved by [almost] 40%, but are also surprised that some very nice horses were not sold for fair prices. We want to thank our national and international vendors who have sent us some outstanding horses." The market strength was reflected in the benchmarks as an improved clearance rate, coupled with an enlarged book, saw the sale aggregate surge by over a third to €626,600.
