CHINCHON, ATO SHINE IN SINGAPORE

Singapore's Kranji Racecourse hosted a pair of international events Sunday night, with French invader **Chinchon (Ire)**

(Marju {Ire}) claiming the marquee S\$3-million G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup and locally based **Ato (SAf)** (Royal Academy) coming up trumps in the S\$1-million G1 KrisFlyer Sprint. It was an emotional

win for the connections of Chinchon, whose trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias flew back to Seville Friday night following the death of his father. "This is for Carlos. We are all thinking of him now," said his wife Patricia. "We are very very happy Chinchon won, but it's also sad he's not here to celebrate with us." **Cont. p3**

LA BELLA DONNA

Sunday Racing's **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) annexed her second straight Classic with a sharp turn of foot in the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) yesterday in Tokyo. The bay filly defeated **Verxina (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) by a half-length in the G1 Oka Sho Apr. 8 at Hanshin, and was five lengths clear of her rival while stretching out to 2400 meters. She stopped the clock in 2:23.60, establishing a new stakes record. Unhurried in the early stages, Gentildonna swept into contention up the center of the course and, despite drifting out slightly, stamped her authority in imperious fashion. **Cont. p4**

FRANKEL FINE AFTER NEWBURY ROMP

Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) has emerged from Saturday's sensational G1 Lockinge S. success without any hitches, connections reported yesterday. While the Newbury race was the first time Khalid Abdullah's colt had raced since his injury scare last month, he was showing no ill-effects a day after his highly impressive five-length victory. The owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport* yesterday, "Obviously, we were a bit apprehensive after the injury scare, but he's done it really nicely so we're delighted. I've spoken to Sir Henry this morning and the horse is fine and very pleased with himself. All being well, it will be Ascot next. I would think the [June 19] G1 Queen Anne S. would be the most likely race."

I'LL HAVE ANOTHER SHIPS TO BELMONT

GI Kentucky Derby hero **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley), who handed the speedy **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) his second consecutive defeat in Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico, was boarded onto a New York-bound van at 9:05 a.m. Sunday morning. Trying to annex the Triple Crown with a win in the June 9 GI Belmont S., the GI Santa Anita Derby winner exited his latest score in good order, according to trainer Doug O'Neill. "He looked great," O'Neill said. "He had licked his feed tub. Once we cleaned the poultice off, his legs were ice cold. He had good energy."

Chinchon, who began his career in France, took his show on the road in 2010 by annexing the GI United Nations S. at Monmouth Park, and built up his frequent flyer account last season. Fifth in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan, the bay filled the same spot behind Gitano Hernando (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) in this event two months later. He missed by a half-length when attempting his title defense in the United Nations last July, and was given the rest of the year off. After kicking off 2012 with a victory in the G3 Prix Exbury at Saint-Cloud Mar. 17, Chinchon travelled to Sha Tin and wound up eighth in the G1 Audemars Piguet QEI Cup Apr. 29.

The start was delayed a bit when Godolphin's City Style (City Zip) became fractious, then refused to enter the stalls before being scratched. With Flax making the running, Chinchon settled into a ground-saving spot in midpack. Jockey Olivier Doleuze angled him off the fence entering the stretch, and the 7-year-old came through between rivals on his way to the big prize.

"I took the risk to be on the inside during the race and Felix [Coetzee, aboard California Memory] improved in front of me and took me into the race and we could finish off well," said Doleuze. "With the cut out of the ground, it made a big difference and he was travelling like the winner the whole way. In the straight, once I was able to switch him out to the outside, he accelerated very strongly."

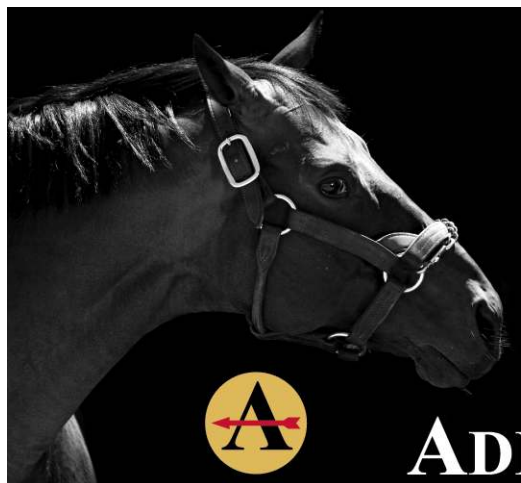

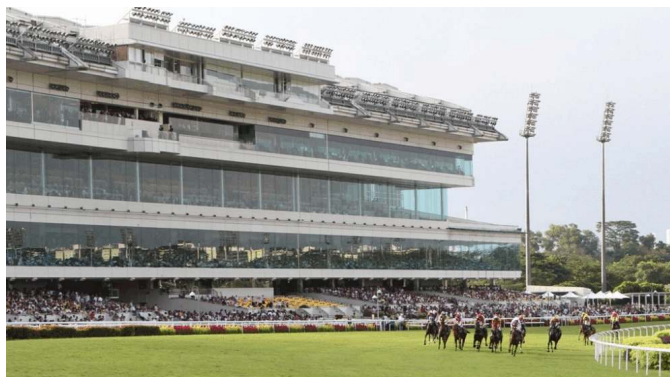
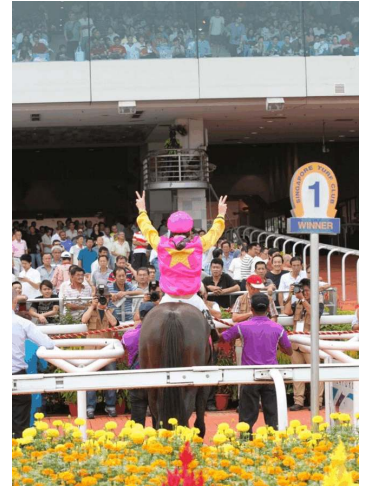

Trainer Patrick Shaw saddled Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}) to capture this event last year, but that champion came up with an injury last week and was unable to defend his title. Shaw had an able deputy in Ato, however, and found his way back to the winner's circle. The South African-bred bay finished second in each of his first four outings this season before running fourth to Rocket Man in the local prep for the KrisFlyer, the Lion City Cup over this course and distance Apr. 29.

Shaw took the blinkers off here, and Ato responded with a career-best performance. Riding the rails in

fourth, he switched out to challenge leader Mr. Big. That runner dug in gamely, but Ato matched strides and asserted himself in the shadow of the wire. "Great run, I always gave him a big chance," said Shaw. "He has always been a bit

of an unlucky horse and always been the bridesmaid, but on the day, today, we had him spot-on. He was a very good second choice to have in the race. It was a pity about Rocket Man, but it goes like that and he is safe in the box."

The conditioner said he had considered gelding Ato, but that's not in the cards at this point. "Obviously, now he is going to be a stallion," said Shaw. "I'm sure now the owners will take him home as a stallion for sure. Otherwise I would be cutting him. I would have liked to have done it, but now definitely not."

Ato, like SIA Cup third-place finisher Flax, is campaigned by the Newbury Racing of South African Dennis Evans.

"I'm in dreamland--I can't believe this is happening," said Evans. "There could a chance we could send him somewhere like Australia or New Zealand where he is probably better known. Andreas Jacobs of Maine Chance Farms [in South Africa] owns 25% of the horse. So it is something we will have to speak about."

Gentildonna, from the second crop of her champion sire, led home a clean sweep for Deep Impact fillies in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) last month at Hanshin. Deep Impact's daughter Beauty Parlour (GB) confirmed her sire as a budding international presence with her victory in last Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp, and Gentildonna continued the good work here. Her dam Donna Blini, heroine of the G1 Cheveley Park S. and G2 Cherry Hinton S. in 2005, was bought by Katsumi Yoshida for 500,000gns at Tattersalls December at the end of her 3-year-old campaign. The mare's 2010 Neo Universe (Jpn) colt sold for ¥80,000,000 (US\$975,610) as a yearling to Eclipse Management at the JRHA Select Sale last summer. She has a yearling colt by Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) and produced a full brother to yesterday's Oaks winner Mar. 21. Donna Blini was bred back to Deep Impact. President of Sunday Racing Club Shunsuke Yoshida said, "I expected her to win today, but did not expect this kind of decisive win in great style." Hiroaki Akita, farm manager at Northern Farm, added, "I am very glad to see Deep Impact sire a Grade I stakes winner over mile and half. Donna Blini is great mare."

Off the mark when partnered by the visiting British rider Robert Havlin for the first time in a 10-furlong conditions event at Munich Apr. 9, he followed that with a 3 1/2-lengths second to Black Arrow (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) in Hanover's Listed Derby Trial over this trip Apr. 29. Rank early restrained in fourth by Havlin, he wore down the positively-ridden Wild Wolf in the last furlong for a tenacious win. Real Solution was close enough to launch his challenge at the top of the straight under Frankie Dettori, but failed to deliver his customary surge and never threatened in seventh.

idea where we were, but besides that, the horse was happy. He was just looking out the window the whole time. He and [stable pony] Lava Man were together, they were just chatting away the whole time. We were at Pimlico almost two weeks and we shipped in a week before at Churchill, and now we're here for the three weeks. So far, so good. It's kind of working out for us, so we're not

going to change that. I think the sooner he gets over the track and gets familiar with the surroundings [the better]. We'll walk him [today] and then take it from there. One day at a time."

O'Neill, who returned to California Sunday, confirmed that he will arrive in New York in about a week to oversee I'll Have Another's training up to the final jewel in the Triple Crown set for June 9. "We'll have to play that by ear," he said. "It depends on the weather and all that stuff, but we'll maintain the same type of exercise that he's had."

"There's the old line about you can't take a sprinter and train him two miles and make a router out of him and you can't take a router and work them three-eighths every week and make a sprinter out of him. If we've got a true route horse, which we do, he's going to maintain his fitness and his exercise. If they can go a mile and a half they will. And he will." O'Neill added, "Obviously, there will be fresh horses; Union Rags [Dixie Union] and Dullahan [Even the Score] come to mind. They're fresh-legged and ready to go, but we're pumped our horse came out of this race in great shape. As long as he stays injury-free we've got a big, big chance."

Prior to his two Classic defeats, Bodemeister was an easy winner of the Apr. 14 GI Arkansas Derby. "He's a pretty amazing animal," Baffert said. "He didn't act tired after the race. He came back to the barn and he wasn't as tired as he was after the [Kentucky] Derby."

Baffert indicated that another Zayat Stables sophomore colt--**Paynter** (Awesome Again)--might start in the GI Belmont S. instead. Paynter, who won an allowance race in convincing style on the Preakness undercard, was shipped to Belmont Park Sunday morning. "We're going to train him there," Baffert said. "If it looks like he snapped out of his race, we'll run him in the Belmont if he looks really good."

Creative Cause (Giant's Causeway), third in the GI Preakness S., boarded a van Sunday morning to head for Baltimore-Washington International Airport for a scheduled 9 a.m. flight back to Los Angeles and his home base Hollywood Park. "He came out of the race OK," confirmed trainer

Mike Harrington minutes before putting the grey on the van. "Back to California, regroup." Creative Cause, who also shipped back to California between a fifth in the May 5 Kentucky Derby and last weekend's Preakness, is expected to follow the same pattern before a possible stab at the June 9 GI Belmont S. "I'd say right now it's 50-50," said Harrington, who was scheduled to get on a flight Sunday evening with assistant/exercise rider John Cisneros for the trip home.

Trainer Dale Romans said he was unsure if **Cozzetti** (Cozzene), seventh in the Preakness, would run in the Belmont in three weeks. Irrespective of that decision, Romans will have a Belmont starter in the shape of GI Kentucky Derby third **Dullahan** (Even the Score). "He worked Saturday morning [five furlongs in 1:00.20, second-best of 26] at Churchill," Romans said of the GI Blue Grass S. winner. "He's on track for a big Belmont." Romans, who won the 2011 Preakness with **Shackleford** (Forestry), opted not to run in the middle jewel of the Triple Crown and give Dullahan some extra time between races. "It should help him," he said. "He'll be a fresher horse."

Expected to forge on to the Belmont is Preakness sixth-place finisher **Optimizer** (English Channel), while **Teeth of the Dog** (Bluegrass Cat) (fifth) and **Went the Day Well** (Proud Citizen) (10th) are likely to bypass the 1 1/2-mile test. "Went the Day Well seems OK," said trainer Graham Motion from Fair Hill Training Center Sunday. "He has a couple of scrapes, but all in all, he's good." Motion indicated a possible target for the bay is the GI Travers S. at Saratoga in August.

Stealcas Possible for Belmont...

Trainer Mark Casse said he is considering running John Oxley's **Stealcas** (Lawyer Ron) in the June 9 GI Belmont S. The chestnut, who broke his maiden at Gulfstream in January, was sixth in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct before finishing fifth in the GIII Vinery Racing Spiral S. on the Polytrack at Turfway Park. Most recently, Stealcas was third behind Hierro (Hard Spun) and Paynter (Awesome Again) in the GIII The Cliff's Edge Derby Trial at Churchill Apr. 28. "The Belmont is definitely under consideration," Casse said. "His last race was big and [Saturday] Paynter ran a huge race [won an allowance race on Preakness undercard by 5 3/4 lengths]." Stealcas worked in company with Prospective (Malibu Moon) May 18 at Churchill Downs. The duo covered five furlongs in 1:01.20, the second fastest of 17 at the distance. Casse said Stealcas would work in Louisville again next weekend. "I think the horse fits [in the Belmont]," Casse said. "We've always thought he was the best 3-year-old colt in the barn. We've got three weeks. We'll see who is going before we make a decision. We are also considering the [GIII] Matt Winn [S. at Churchill Downs June 16]. If I had to say one way or the other right now, I would say 'no' [to the Belmont]. But he's a possibility."

Besilu Stables' **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) turned in her third breeze following her ninth-place finish in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March, covering four furlongs in a bullet :47.52. "She could run a month," noted Mott. "She'll most likely go to the [GII] Fleur de Lis [S.] at Churchill Downs [June 16], or she could go to the [GI] Vanity the same day at Hollywood Park. She's doing very well. She had a nice work this morning, she had a nice work last week, and it looks like she hasn't lost much from the trip."

Rail Trip likely to Return in L.A. 'Cap...

Trainer Ron Ellis indicated 2009 GI Hollywood Gold Cup winner **Rail Trip** (Jump Start) is likely to kick off the season with a start GI Los Angeles H. May 28th. "There's a good chance I'll run him in there," said Ellis. "We're better off getting a race into him now. He grabbed a quarter out of the gate and tore off half of his foot in his last race in New York [Nov. 17, 2011 at Aqueduct]. "The foot gave me more trouble growing out than I thought it would. So we're getting a little bit of a late start and that put us out of sync with the stakes here. That was basically the only difference since I had him before. He came back in pretty good shape, other than that. And that was nobody's fault, it just happened. So we're on Plan B. We're kind of evolving our plan with him now. We'll get a race into him and see where we are. My goal now is the GII San Diego H. [at Del Mar, which begins July 18]. He's run well enough with these sprinters and it looks like seven-eighths might be good a month after this one. So we'll go six [furlongs], seven and then a mile and one-sixteenth. We're going to do it gradually."

In 2010 Rail Trip captured the GII Mervyn LeRoy H. and GII Californian at Betfair Hollywood Park before being sent to New York following a second place finish in the Hollywood Gold Cup.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Mott Outlines Plans for 'Honor' & Royal Delta

To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) completed major preparations for the May 28 GI Met Mile with a 1:00.03 five-furlong breeze over Belmont's training track Sunday. The Live Oak homebred has accounted for four of his last five starts, including the GI Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct in November and the GIII Westchester H. Apr. 28. "He's had two good works, and he seems to be looking good," said trainer Bill Mott. "It looks like it's a good race coming up. Nice horses here, without a doubt."

F-T MIDLANTIC SALE STARTS TODAY

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training sale begins its two-day run this morning in Timonium, Maryland with the first of 540 catalogued lots scheduled to enter the ring at 10 a.m.

Consignors remained optimistic that the strong results from recent juvenile sales will continue in Timonium, with several pointing towards the juggernaut OBS April sale as a sign that demand is strong. After four days of action, the April sale average was up 41.7% to \$44,351, while the median was up 35% to \$27,000.

“OBS April was a great sale across the board,” commented consignor Niall Brennan. “There was a great middle market, which drove up the other markets and this is a similar sale. It usually reflects similar to OBS April—it has the same kind of dynamics about it. Hopefully we’ll have a good market here.”

Justin Casse agreed. “I think we will probably have a good carryover from the OBS April sale,” Casse said. “At least that is what I am hoping for.”

Among the 2011 graduates of the Midlantic sale is GI Las Virgenes S. winner Eden’s Moon (Malibu Moon), who brought a final bid of \$390,000 from Kaleem Shah. Last year’s top-priced lot was Ever So Lucky (Indian Charlie), who sold for \$600,000 and is now twice graded stakes placed for George Strawbridge’s Augustin Stable. Other recent graduates include multiple graded stakes winner Musket Man (Yonaguska) and Grade I stakes placed Trappe Shot (Tapit).

“They have sold a lot of good horses here in the past and it is a great place to sell a horse,” commented consignor Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree Stables. “I think it is going to be a good sale again.”

The Midlantic sale has a strong core of buyers from around the region and offers something for everyone, according to Brennan.

“This has been a good market here for several years,” Brennan explained. “It is a good regional market, it draws from many areas because there are several racetracks within a couple of hours of here. You’ve got a lot of people who can come here for different types of horses. We’ve got guys from New York, from Monmouth and Delaware, but you’ve also got guys from Mountaineer, Charles Town, Penn National, trainers looking for all kinds of horses. So it has a good regional marketplace to draw from and it is easy for these guys to come to the sale. It is two days, so there are plenty of horses to bring people in.”

The sale benefits from its location, both geographically and on the calendar, according to consignor Barry Eisaman.

“This sale has been gaining momentum for several years,” Eisaman said. “A lot of people really get in the mindset to want to restock with young horses in the spring. So those who don’t necessarily shop in the select sales in February and March, they are now ready—especially those that are in this northeastern corridor. We bring a lot of Pennsylvania and New York-breds here specifically for this crowd. They like the regional programs.”

Consignor Nick de Meric sees the Midlantic sale gaining strength as it moves forward.

“I would say that the recent trend towards these later sales and towards these open sales where people make their own selections and aren’t told what is a select horse and what isn’t, as these sales have become more popular, and we’ve seen a gravitational pull in that direction, it has got to bode well for the future of this sale.”

During last year’s Midlantic sale, 343 juveniles sold for \$16,211,100. The average was \$47,263 and the median was \$25,000.

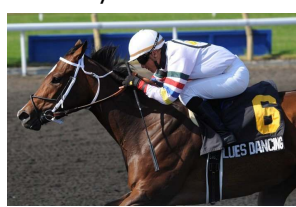
