(Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) and fourth-placed **Trumpet Major (Ire)** (Arakan), who have been allocated neighbouring stalls nine and eight, respectively. "Hermival did his last piece of work on Monday and everything went well," said trainer Mikel Delzangles. "He has recovered quickly from his run at Newmarket and I hope he has improved." ♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ **Born to Sea (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) failed to match the heroics of sibling Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) on the Rowley Mile, pulling too hard under full gas and fading to 12th there. O'NEILL GETS 45 DAYS

Trainer Doug O'Neill was handed a 45-day suspension during the California Horse Racing Board's closed session Thursday. The Hearing Officer also suggested an additional 135 days of suspension stayed for 18 months provided O'Neill commits no further Class 1, 2, or 3 violations, regardless of jurisdiction, and a \$15,000 fine. The suspension won't impact I'll Have Another (Flower Alley)'s shot at history in the GI Belmont S.; the suspension will begin no earlier than July 1. The horse in question, Argenta (Mineshaft), exceeded the regulatory threshold for total carbon dioxide when eighth at Del Mar on Aug. 25, 2010. While the Hearing Officer agreed with O'Neill that the evidence demonstrated proved that the horse wasn't milkshaked, it was determined that O'Neill still be held responsible for the TCO2 overage under the trainer insurer rule. **CHRB Meeting Wrap-Up, p1 ATW**

Stealcas Taking a Pass...

John C. Oxley's **Stealcas** (Lawyer Ron), third in the GIII The Cliff's Edge Derby Trial S. Apr. 28, will bypass the GI Belmont S. "He's not going to run in the Belmont," trainer Mark Casse revealed. "We're going to point for the [GIII] Matt Winn [at Churchill Downs on June 16]. We want to get him some confidence and it looks like the Belmont is going to come up pretty tough." Stealcas breezed five furlongs in 1:02.40 at Churchill Thursday. "We're going to aim for the [GI] Travers [S. at Saratoga Aug. 25]," Casse said.

Ravelo's Boy Possible for Belmont...

Korina Stable's **Ravelo's Boy** (Lawyer Ron), last seen finishing fifth in the GII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 10, is under consideration for the June 9 GI Belmont S. "The Belmont is an option," revealed trainer Manny Azpurua after the chestnut drilled four furlongs in :46.60 at Calder Thursday. "But we're not ready to say for sure that's where we are running. So far he's doing everything right, and he just flew over the track this morning." Azpurua continued, "We won't make any official decision until after Sunday. [Jockey Alex] Solis is coming down to get on him. They'll go to the track about 7:30 a.m. and after that we'll have a better idea where we are going. If it is the Belmont, we'll probably just gallop him up to the race."

Balding a Fan of Bonfire...

Speaking at Epsom's annual 'Breakfast With The Stars', trainer Andrew Balding gave an upbeat bulletin regarding his live Derby contender **Bonfire (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}). Although not represented by last week's G2 Dante S. winner at the show gallop, Balding was on hand to provide insight on his first runner in the June 2 Blue Riband. "Before this year, I haven't had a horse who has got to this stage in the Derby," he said. "I was delighted with Bonfire at York--he did everything we could have asked for and he seems to have come out of the race very well. He gave a buck on the gallops yesterday which is a good sign, and he is a naturally fit horse. It is very exciting. We had a big meeting at the beginning of the year with the owners, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, and sat down to talk with Harry Herbert and John Warren about the best way to progress to June. Unfortunately, he had a dirty scope when we first hoped to run at the Craven meeting and the horse was getting bored and needed some stimulation. Carolyn Warren came up with the suggestion of sending him to Dan Jocelyn, a very accomplished event rider, who lives near us. We sent him there for a couple of sessions just to break up the routine. That helped and obviously we had the aborted mission to Chester, which might have dragged some horses down, but it seemed to really stimulate him which was good. For everyone who trains racehorses, [The Derby] is the race. It has got over 230 years of history and, people like myself look through the records of the past and you see all the great names there. Obviously, you have got to have the aspiration to have your name on the list as well. It is a big occasion and I am really looking forward to it."



Haggas Has Faith in Vow...

Newmarket conditioner William Haggas was also at Breakfast With The Stars, and issued an update on June 1 G1 Epsom Oaks contender **Vow (GB)** (Motivator {GB}), who is owned by the Pocahontas branch of Highclere Thoroughbred Racing. Haggas has a 100% record with Epsom Classic runners, having saddled Shaamit (Ire) (Mtoto {GB}) to 1996 Derby success and Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) to an Oaks triumph last year. Vow, who garnered the Lingfield's Listed Oaks Trial earlier this month, will become his third. "Vow is a good mover and a good stayer, but quite idle," explained Haggas. "She tries quite hard. I have no idea how she has come out of her Lingfield win as she is idle. She is similar in that way to Dancing Rain, who did not look an Oaks winner last year. It is a leap of faith. It is quite a difficult one to judge really--have I got them fit enough? The temptation is to work them too much, but fortunately I have been doing this for a long time. I have made so many cock-ups over the years, I will try not to make one this year. Johnny Murtagh is coming over to ride her."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **▲** will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a **+** will indicate first-time starters, an **(S)** will be used for state-bred races, a **(C)** will be used for maiden-claiming races and an **(R)** will be used for other restricted races.

O'Brien Issues Camelot/Maybe Updates...

Aidan O'Brien is responsible for both ante-post favorites for the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby and the June 1 G1 Epsom Oaks--**Camelot (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Maybe (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})--and he issued reports on both yesterday. Having confirmed that his son Joseph will continue in the plate aboard Camelot, the trainer said, "Camelot has been good since winning the 2000 Guineas and everything is fine. He has been going gently and everything is well so far. I am happy with him. He has always been a very special horse here, from day one. He was a very short-priced favorite when he went for his maiden and then I was very happy with him in the Racing Post Trophy. His first big test was the Guineas. He is one of those very special horses. He is very relaxed, very straightforward and very calm, but has a lot of nervous energy. We are under no illusions with the Derby. We had two very special horses in High Chaparral and Galileo, and have not won it since. The race is a very difficult test of a horse. There cannot be any chink in their armor and everything has to go right on the day." Turning to the distaffers' event, O'Brien added, "We were very happy with Maybe's run in the 1000 Guineas when the ground was a bit on the slow side. Obviously, she is by Galileo and she has a very fast pedigree, so the mile and a half of the Oaks is unknown until we do it."

Turner to Become Second Female Derby Rider...

Hayley Turner is set to follow in the footsteps of Alex Greaves and will become just the second female rider in Epsom Derby history after it was announced she will ride G3 Lingfield Derby Trial third **Cavaleiro (Ire)** (Sir Percy {GB}) in the Blue Riband event June 2. Greaves entered the Blue Riband record books when partnering the filly Portuguese Lil (GB) (Master Willie {GB}) to finish last of 20 behind Shaamit (Ire) in 1996. "It's nice to have a ride in the big race," said Turner. "I won on him last year, and then Richard Mullen won on him when I was injured. He ran in the Lingfield Derby Trial on the all-weather, which was probably not ideal, and I'm really pleased to get a ride in the race. He's progressing with age and I think is a horse who will suit the course as he's a strong traveller. He'll definitely stay [the trip]."

DEL MAR MEET IN TROUBLE?

A threatened boycott of the upcoming 37-day Del Mar meet by the California Thoroughbred Trainers was the surprise hot topic of the monthly meeting of the California Horse Racing Board at Betfair Hollywood Park Thursday.

With the Del Mar meet due to open July 18, there is currently no agreement between the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, which conducts the meet at the San Diego County racetrack, and the CTT. The issue is exchange wagering. The CTT, according to its president, trainer John Sadler, is vehemently against the introduction of exchange wagering and thus taking a stand.

“It’s all about integrity, integrity, integrity,” Sadler told the CHRHB.

Exchange wagering, if implemented in California, would essentially allow individuals to take action from each other, which would include betting on a horse to lose. Sadler claims that it would be trainers and jockeys who would absorb the brunt of the blame whenever there was a fishy result.

“This shows just how important the issue of exchange wagering is,” said Alan Balch, the CTT’s executive director.

Exchange wagering will continue to be a major topic at the CHRHB’s next meeting on June 28 at Hollywood Park. If the rules and regulations pertaining to exchange wagering get CHRHB approval at that time, it would take other state agencies another 30 days or so to approve them as well. Del Mar officials believe exchange wagering would generate additional revenue that would increase purse sizes and thus attract more horses and increase field sizes. It is unclear if it would be feasible to implement exchange wagering during the meet, which ends Sept. 5.

The CHRHB, at its meeting Thursday, passed a motion to approve the meet, with the stipulation that the CTT and Del Mar officials continue to have a dialogue in hopes of reaching an agreement before the next CHRHB meeting on June 28.

Going into Thursday’s meeting, the expected hot topics were the possible suspension of Derby and Preakness winner I’ll Have Another’s trainer, Doug O’Neill, and, to a lesser degree, the possible banning the drug clenbuterol. *CNN* was there because of O’Neill. However, discussion regarding that case took place in a closed session, which O’Neill did not attend.

The Clenbuterol issue appears to have reached a conclusion with the passing of a motion by CHRHB member Bo Derek, who is also chair of the CHRHB’s relatively new medication and track safety committee. The motion, which will be in effect for one year beginning with the opening of the Del Mar meet, does not totally ban Clenbuterol, but prohibits the use of the bronchodilator at least 21 days in advance of a race. The 21-day limit is the recommended amount of time needed for clenbuterol to get out of a horse’s system. Clenbuterol is generally used to help a horse with breathing problems but if used at certain levels can act like an anabolic steroid and build muscle.

CHRHB Chairman Keith Brackpool said the ruling on Clenbuterol is “a model of how such cases should be handled,” calling it “a balance between necessary therapeutic use and abuse.”

At the start of Thursday’s meeting CHRHB member Jerry Moss, whose second term expired on Jan. 1, was honored with a resolution and a video tribute. Moss’s replacement is Steve Beneto of Carmichael, California.

Stronach Racing Initiative Goes Live :

A new racing investment opportunity--a Frank Stronach initiative--recently became effective in the equity market and is currently in the initial public offering stage. S-1 registration statements were filed in late December with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission for the IPO, which features six separate racing corporations with a share price of \$10. Offered to residents of nine states (California, Florida, Illinois, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, New York and Oregon), the six racing corporations are named after past Adena Springs champions: Awesome Again, Red Bullet, Ghostzapper, Perfect Sting, Ginger Punch and Macho Uno. Each corporation is made up of 20 2-year-old Thoroughbreds (generally half colts and half fillies)--purchased as yearlings in 2011 for prices ranging from \$4,000 to \$380,000. A total of \$405,000 (originally \$450,000--10% were purchased by Stronach for market capitalization) in shares are offered in each corporation. The average yearling cost per horse in each partnership is approximately \$61,000. Share prices will include fully funded expenses (estimated at \$150/day per horse in training and \$50/day for lay-ups) and basic veterinary services (with \$100,000 set aside for emergency care for each corporation) until November 2013, at which time all remaining horses in each partnership will be sold at public auction--purse earnings and sale proceeds will be distributed to shareholders. The individual corporations are managed by Golden Pegasus, a private company created by Stronach Group which holds a 10% share in each corporation. Stronach is Chairman of Golden Pegasus, which is supported by a board of directors, including Jack Brothers (who also serves as CEO of the individual corporations), Alon Ossip, Howard Walton, Lorne Weiss and Ron Charles. Mike Rogers holds the position of CEO of Golden Pegasus, while Mark Roberts serves as president. CAPE MARE SALE SURVIVES TOUGH MARKET

The Cape Mare and Weanling Sale, hosted by South Africa's Thoroughbred Breeders Association (TBA), took place in Worcester, just outside of Cape Town Thursday. The sale, which consisted of 274 horses following 19 withdrawals, faced a tough market, but fared as well as could be expected in the circumstances.

The sale was given a timely boost when it was announced Wednesday that revisions had been made to the African Horse Sickness Code Chapter at the recent World Organisation for Animal Health's General Assembly. This should ensure the future possibility of realistic exports from South Africa, which would be a huge boost for the breeding industry.

The overall aggregate rose from last year, but that was inevitable as the catalogue included 118 more lots. The sale's final aggregate was R7.678 million (last year's was R5.547 million). The average dropped markedly, falling 23.4% from R53,854 to R43,625, but in light of a decidedly flat market this was only to be expected. A large percentage of horses failed to make their reserves, with 89 lots (or 32%) not finding new homes.

The one-day event was topped by lot 19, the stakes-winning mare Kiribati (SAf) (Model Man). The mare, who sold in foal to successful sire Toreador (Ire) (Danehill), is just six years old, and is a half-sister to the G1 sprinter Archipeligo (SAf) (Restructure {ire}). Kiribati, who was consigned to dissolve a partnership, fetched R450 000, and was eventually bought by Philip Kahan.

The top price for a maiden mare was the R325 000 spent on lot 201, Waywest Goddess (SAf) (Way West {Aus}). A G2 winner on the track, Waywest Goddess, consigned by Arc-en-Ciel Stud (Agent), was purchased by Moutonshoek.

The TBA's CEO Jan Naude was realistic about the sale, saying, "This was a normal mare sale, the good stock fetched reasonable prices, but poor horses battled in a flat market." Marketing manager Tom Callaghan, was most upbeat about the results, saying, "This is a low cost sale for the TBA, and is a great sale for buyers. It is a great venue, and it is encouraging to see a number of breeders and buyers purchasing weanlings as potential pinhooking prospects."
