I'll Have Another Moves to Stakes Barn Today

Triple Crown hopeful I'll Have Another (Flower Alley), originally slated to move to the Belmont S. barn Tuesday, will relocate today, instead, according to

trainer Doug O'Neill after the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner galloped at Belmont Park yesterday morning. O'Neill, who was in Manhattan for a press luncheon Tuesday, altered plans so he could be present when the move actually took place. O'Neill added that I'll Have Another's stable pony, Lava Man, would not be

joining him in the stakes barn as had been planned. "He's not going to go," said O'Neill of Lava Man. "I went over there [Monday] and I just think it will be nerve-racking for him. So we'll leave him [in Mark Hennig's barn]. He'll still chaperone [I'll Have Another] every morning. I'll Have Another is such a relaxed, cool horse, I worry that Lava Man will get a little anxious and that I'll Have Another will worry what his big brother is all anxious about. We'll leave Lava here, he's settled in nicely here, and we'll just move I'll Have Another." O'Neill, who was pleased with the chestnut's progress thus far, said the late change in schedule was not a concern. "Everything is good," he confirmed. "The horse is doing great, so we're all doing good, ready to go. I thought he galloped great this morning, looked good, good stride, good energy. Three more days of galloping and if we get lucky, ooo-fah!" The morning of the 1 1/2-mile Classic, the trainer indicated that I'll Have Another would stay in the barn and walk the shedrow. "He actually galloped the morning of the [GII] Bob L. Lewis [S.] and the morning of the [GI] Santa Anita Derby, but he didn't in the Kentucky Derby or the Preakness, so we'll maintain," he said.

Optimizer Arrives at Belmont; Close Call for Lukas

Optimizer (English Channel) arrived at Belmont Park at 4 a.m. Tuesday following a 14-hour van ride from Kentucky. Bedded down in John Hertler's barn, the Belmont aspirant--11th in the GI Kentucky Derby May 5 and sixth in the May 19 GI Preakness S.--was accompanied on the trip by 3-year-old **Skyring** (English Channel), slated for the Easy Goer S. on the Belmont undercard; and **Hamazing Destiny** (Salt Lake), who will compete in the GII True North H. Yesterday afternoon, Team Lukas had a momentary scare when D. Wayne Lukas was taken to Winthrop University Hospital in nearby Mineola after Hamazing Destiny reared up and struck him on top of his head. "I don't need this on Belmont week, but I guess these things happen," Lukas said from the hospital. "I will be fine, it's just a matter of getting it cleaned up. I fully expect to be at the track [Wednesday]." Corey Nakatani's agent Ron Anderson, who was at the hospital with Lukas, informed that the maestro was conscious and talking, but would need stitches. This morning, Lukas will have Optimizer gallop in the first set, at approximately 5:30 a.m., before moving him into the stakes barn. Thursday and Friday, the colt will take to the track at 8:30 a.m. to train with the rest of the Belmont field. **Triple Crown news cont. p3**

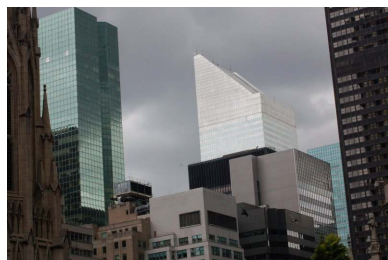

luncheon at Rockefeller Center in Manhattan, but Tuesday's well-attended renewal certainly did its job of setting the tone for what lies ahead this weekend.

The event officially kicked off with video replays of I'll Have Another (Flower Alleys)'s heroics in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. shortly after 1 p.m. as the crowd began to make its way inside from the scenic seventh-floor balcony.



Jockey Mario Gutierrez, the subject of a photo

shoot atop the world-famous Empire State Building earlier in the morning, was the first to take mic from NYRA analyst and emcee, Andy Serling.

"He has a tremendous heart and he's the one that makes me confident," the 25-year-old reinsman said of the J. Paul Reddam colorbearer.

Trainer Doug O'Neill, sporting a dark gray fedora, continues to embrace every moment during the magical run provided by his gritty chestnut.

"I can see why guys like Dale Romans, [Bob] Baffert and [Todd] Pletcher show up at these races every year, because it doesn't get any better than this," O'Neill offered.

Who does O'Neill fear most in the final jewel?

"Dale [Romans]'s a big guy and he's right in front of me, so I better say Dale," O'Neill joked. "Kenny [McPeck]'s pretty big too, but he's sitting a little further back."

He continued, "I respect Dale and Kenny's horses a ton, but my biggest fear is I'll Have Another waking up with a headache or something else. If he shows up and runs his race I think he's going to be very tough to beat."

Hard to disagree with him there.

Does Romans have any mixed emotions about potentially derailing I'll Have Another's Triple Crown bid with GI Kentucky Derby third Dullahan (Even the Score)?

"None at all," said Romans, who was accompanied to the Big Apple by longtime partner and exercise rider Tammy Fox as well as the couple's son Jake. "I'd like to have 120,000 people booing me on the way out. Those are great horses who have won the Triple Crown and I think they want to earn it. We owe it to the past Triple Crown winners to make him earn it."

Former President Bill Clinton's recent pledge of public support of the Donegal colorbearer while attending Meadowlands Racetrack in New Jersey last weekend wasn't much of a surprise to Romans, apparently.

"He and Jerry Crawford are very close--Jerry ran his campaigns for him in Iowa," Romans revealed. "I don't know if he knows much about what's going on in the 3-year-old crop this year, but I tell you what, I think he's a pretty smart man."

Soon-to-be Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez was honored with a video tribute of some of his career highlights, including Flower Alley's win in the 2005 GI Travers S. Velazquez got his first look at **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) while guiding the handsome bay through a five-furlong bullet in :59 at Fair Hill June 3.

"I just got on him last Sunday and he was just very impressive," said Velazquez, who piloted Rags to Riches to a memorable decision in the 2007 Belmont. "I couldn't have asked for a better work."

Union Rags, a runaway winner in last year's GI Champagne S. at Belmont and the GII Saratoga Special S. in the slop, has had his share of poor racing luck this term, including a well-documented troubled seventh in the Derby.

Any special requests from his new rider?

"I'd like to ask the racing gods to bring rain and make it wet," Velazquez enthused.

Ken McPeek is hoping to play the role of spoiler again with his duo of **Atigun** (Istan) and **Unstoppable U** (Exchange Rate). He saddled Sarava (Wild Again) to a 70-1 upset to foil War Emblem (Our Emblem)'s Triple Crown hopes in 2002.

"It's a weird race, and Sarava and Da 'Tara proved it," McPeek said. "It's a great sport because you never know. I'll probably never be a 25-percent trainer because I'm probably more of a home-run hitter than a single or double [hitter]."

Come Saturday, it looks like McPeek will be swinging for the fences once again.



Ravelo's Boy Sets Up Shop in Stakes Barn


Following a 23-hour van ride from Calder in South Florida, **Ravelo's Boy** (Lawyer Ron) arrived at Belmont shortly after 7 a.m. Tuesday and became the first horse to take up residence in the track's designated Belmont Stakes barn. The chestnut, who was accompanied on the trip by Roberto Riasco and Enrique Barcenas, assistants to trainer Manny Azpurua, walked the enclosed shedrow before bedding down in stall 2.

"He had to walk--it's a long trip," Barcenas said. "He behaved real nice. There was a lot of rain and a lot of wind on the drive but no problems. Everything was fine."

A winner in a Dec. 3 optional claimer at Gulfstream, the Korina Stable-owned colt was fifth in the GII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 10.

"We came to win the race," said Barcenas. "If we can't win the race and we come in second or third, we'll be very happy. But we came all the way from Florida for the race, and the horse is doing real good."

Strike Could Disrupt Belmont Racing

The union representing Belmont Park's maintenance crew and starters is threatening to go on strike Friday, the day before I'll Have Another's historic Triple Crown bid in the GI Belmont S. The workers have been without a contract for two years. "They've taken a strike vote two weeks ago and have authorization to go on strike," Local 3 business manager Chris Erikson told New York *Daily News*. "I'm not saying they will. It's up to NYRA, but the membership is authorized to strike. Hopefully, cooler heads will prevail." Negotiations with the New York Racing Association continued with the assistance of a mediator Tuesday. In a statement issued yesterday, New York Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, whose office took control of NYRA last week, said, "This year's Belmont S. has the potential to be a truly remarkable event, attracting worldwide attention and millions of dollars of economic activity for the New York metropolitan area and the entire region. The event has been planned for months with excitement continuing to build. It is simply unacceptable that a two-year-long labor dispute would imperil this special event. My administration has been in touch with NYRA and the unions, and we have urged both to resolve this dispute amicably. Both sides should put aside their differences and do what is best for the people of the State of New York: ensure a smooth and successful Belmont S."

PRO-LASIX CROWD DOMINATES TOWNHALL

Pro-Lasix supporters were out in full force yesterday as a group of 50 or so industry participants gathered in Frankfort to debate a proposal before the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) that would phase-out the raceday use of furosemide (Lasix) in black-type races in Kentucky. The townhall-style meeting was organized by the KHRC to facilitate discussion on the issue before a possible vote at its next scheduled meeting on Wednesday, June 13. Of the 17 speakers at the forum, 16 came out against the ban. The group included no fewer than six veterinarians and several representatives from horsemen groups, as well as a mix of trainers, breeders and handicappers.

"I am extremely pro-Lasix," is how conditioner George "Rusty" Arnold began his address. "I'm pro-Lasix because it is the best option available to me to prevent EIPH [Exercise Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhage] in horses. It's the best for the owner, it's the best for the trainer, and most importantly, it's the best for the horse. There's a reason why Lasix was introduced some 30 to 40 years ago. Simply, horses bleed, and Lasix helps control it."

The issue of Lasix in Kentucky came to a head in April when the KHRC voted on a proposal to phase-out the use of Lasix in all races over a three-year period. After contentious debate, the vote ended in a tie, and since a majority was needed for approval, the ban was defeated. Last month, the KHRC revisited the issue, and the proposal was amended to include only black-type races, beginning with 2-year-old events in 2013. At the time, KHRC Executive Director John Ward announced plans for the townhall meeting, and encouraged an open dialogue.

Yesterday, Ward got it, even if that dialogue was largely slanted to one side. During the roughly two-hour meeting, several speakers spoke passionately about Lasix and its effectiveness combating EIPH--the bleeding in the lungs of horses during strenuous exercise--while others offered a more scientific approach.

"The 300 veterinary members of the Kentucky Association of Equine Practitioners unequivocally supports the use of raceday furosemide as a preventative for Exercise Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhaging," said Dr. Andy Roberts, a member of the Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council. "It's been proven through long clinical experience of rigorous prospective scientific studies that a majority of horses worldwide bleed into their lungs during strenuous exercise during racing. Each episode of EIPH results in cumulative damage to the lungs, [and] severe episodes of EIPH put the life of the horse and the jockey in danger. Furosemide has been proven safe and effective at significantly reducing the rate, occurrence and severity of EIPH in the Thoroughbred racehorse. The decision to ban the use of raceday furosemide unnecessarily jeopardizes the health and safety of the Thoroughbred racehorse and its jockey."

Others portrayed the view held by some that Lasix is a "performance enhancer" as inaccurate. "It's a performance enabler," said Rick Hiles, president of the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (KHBPA, who added that the perception of Lasix as a masking agent for other drugs is also misguided.

For his part, Barry King, owner of last year's GIII Debutante S. heroine Flashy Lassie (Flashy Bull) and a self-described handicapper, worried that horseplayers would have a hard time trying to anticipate which horses might bleed in a race, or which horses would return successfully to the races after a bout of bleeding.

Two members of the KHRC went so far as to say that, should the commission ban Lasix in black-type races, they would not buy racing prospects in Kentucky in the coming year. Attorney Burr Travis, an owner and breeder, said he'd be wary of racing his horses in Kentucky without the benefit of Lasix. "I will not buy horses at Keeneland this year, we will not spend our money," he said. "I'm a Kentucky person, I spend my money in Kentucky, I race my horses in Kentucky, and I want to watch them race in Kentucky."

Thomas Conway, also an attorney and co-owner of Grade I winner Stately Victor, added, "If we ban the use of Lasix in Kentucky, I'm not buying any 2-year-olds next year, and I'm not buying any yearlings at the sale at Keeneland in the fall. The use of Lasix is not about what's best for the owner, trainer or gambler. It's about what's best for the horse, and it would be irresponsible for us not to advocate its use."

Another common theme among the pro-Lasix crowd was that Kentucky's struggling industry could ill-afford to become an "island" on the national racing scene should it be the only state to enact a ban. "I'm here to help ensure that this commission gives the owners, trainers and racetracks of Kentucky a fighting chance," said Rusty Arnold. "At a time when [they're] in a fight for their lives, why make them go it alone? At a time when we are back on our heels due to a shrinking horse population, loss of racing dates and slots-fueled purses in neighboring states, and a Kentucky state senator [David Williams] who has turned his back on Kentucky's signature industry, why now? Owners, trainers and horses are leaving Kentucky daily...don't help push them out."

Standing as his own island was William Koester, a commissioner on the Ohio State Racing Commission who described himself as a small breeder with horses based in Kentucky. "I disagree with everyone who has spoken before me," Koester declared as the day's penultimate speaker. "I believe we should get rid of Lasix on raceday. A gentleman here mentioned gambling. Let me tell you something--75% of HANA [Horseplayers Association of North America] believe that raceday medication should be eliminated. Talking about owners, 77% of [the members of] the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders of America [TOBA] believe that raceday medication should be eliminated. As a breeder, I come down here and watch the foals run around in the field, and it's beyond my belief that every one of them has to have a needle in their neck four hours before a race to compete."

Koester also said any veterinarian who gave Lasix shots had a financial conflict of interest, a contention that Dr. Dr. Foster Northrup, the afternoon's final speaker and another KHRC member, took umbrage with. A practicing racetrack vet, Northrup said only 3% of his income came from Lasix shots, and just 1% from raceday Lasix shots.

At the meeting's conclusion, John Ward made note that the KHRC had received, as of Tuesday morning, 776 emails about the issue. He said 643 were in favor of the ban on Lasix for black-type events, while 133 were against, or a roughly 83% to 17% margin.

One group that didn't proffer an opinion was The Jockey Club, which has supported a ban on raceday Lasix. However, The Jockey Club's executive vice president and executive director Matt F. Iuliano was on hand. "What else could we say?" Iuliano said afterward. "We've presented the facts, and we've always supported a very measured and methodical phase-out of Lasix starting with a select population...and that's what this proposal calls for. We've supported this throughout, and our support hasn't wavered. We take a very factual approach, and there's no emotional exclamation point we could add do it."

Andrew Tinkler's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas runner-up **Foxtrot Romeo (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) is set to run at either Royal Ascot or Chantilly next, connections announced yesterday. Sent off at 33-1 for last Saturday's Curragh Classic, the Bryan Smart-trained colt almost pulled off a shock win only to be denied a length by Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). "He ran well at the Curragh and he's a nice horse," the owner's racing manager Tim Jones told *PA Sport*. "He's not done anything wrong. It was great to see him justify Bryan's faith and run so well in Ireland. There is obviously the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 19]. He's got an entry in that and that is the natural course. Alternatively, you can sit and let Ascot pass you by and wait for a race like the G1 Prix Jean Prat [at Chantilly July 1], which is an option out of the heat of the Ascot furnace."

STALLION ECONOMICS 101

In the wake of Camelot's commanding five-length win in last Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby--the fourth winner of the race in eight crops of 3-year-olds by his late sire, Montjeu--all sorts of helpful suggestions are being made as to what his program should now be. One contingent, evidently led by the *Racing Post*, has been very vocal that he should attempt to become the first English 'Triple Crown' winner since Nijinsky II in 1970 by pointing for the 14-furlong G1 English St. Leger, run at Doncaster the second weekend in September. Another contingent--or maybe the same one--insists he should drop to 10 furlongs. This became a very popular route for a while, because people mistakenly believed that winning Group 1's at 10 furlongs after winning them at 12 furlongs proved more versatility and would be popular with breeders. Plus, this year, everybody keeps trying to find ways to match horses up with Frankel. But Montjeu himself, and Galileo--the world's two best sires--have proven beyond all reasonable doubt that top 12-furlong horses can make top sires. Why mess with a formula that works? What really needs to happen is that top middle-distance 3-year-olds, in the second half of the year, should take on the top older horses to find out where they really stand in the pecking order. What Camelot really needs to do is prove he can beat the top older horses at 12 furlongs by contesting a race like, I don't know, the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. That's what tells industry professionals who are not carried away on some wave of utopian idealism where a horse really rates; all these other things are diversions, because what really needs to happen is Camelot needs to run against the top older horses at his best distance before he retires to stud at Coolmore, to succeed Montjeu, in 2013. He broke the mold by winning the G1 English 2000 Guineas, and Coolmore needs him much more at stud in 2013 than they need him running in more Group 1's which are not going to tell anybody more than we'll already know by the end of this year, provided, touch wood, he gets a clean run and stays sound. There's an awfully lot of bleating going on just now, and maybe it is well-intentioned; but it also betrays a failure to understand the true economics of this industry. In losing Montjeu this year, Coolmore lost the second-best sire in the world. His best son--the one who won the Guineas as well as the Derby--needs to move in there to try and become his best sire son, too. The only race that really matters for him now is the 'Arc'. That should be the target. Everything else is the warm-ups. Even the reputation of Sea The Stars--considered the Secretariat of Europe just three years ago--was really established by three races: the English 2000 Guineas, the Epsom Derby, and the 'Arc'.

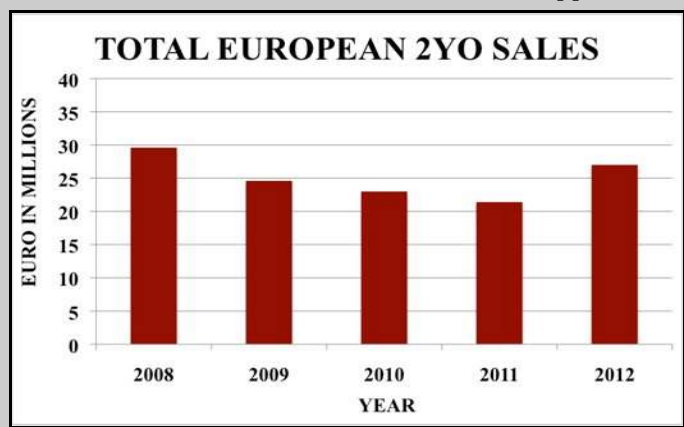
Yes, he won three 10-furlong Group 1's between the Derby and the Arc, but those didn't make him a superstar; winning the Guineas, Derby, and Arc did. If you really want a European Triple Crown, that's it. As last Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby had just nine runners--the smallest field in 105 years--and only four other horses were seriously backed, we're entitled to ask how good a race it might have been anyway? It really is notoriously hard to judge 3-year-olds until they start to run against older horses, but there was a time comparison available from Saturday which looks significant: Camelot ran the mile and a half three-fifths of a second faster than 5-year-old St. Nicholas Abbey (also by Montjeu, of course) ran an hour earlier. 'St. Nick' won the G1 Coronation Cup by 4 1/2 lengths. In theory, Camelot would have won it by about seven. Second favorite Bonfire, from Manduro's first crop, didn't really seem to handle it all too well, and finished sixth, but the other horses which were supported ran two-three-four. Camelot was assigned a *Racing Post* Rating of 127 (*Timeform*: 130p). The Niarchos Family's previously unbeaten Main Sequence (by Aldebaran, but whose second dam is a half-sister to Shiva and 2007 G1 Epsom Oaks winner Light Shift) just got up on the post to grab second for now Lambourn-based trainer David Lanigan, from Coolmore number two, Astrology (Galileo), the G3 Dee S. winner who had led all the way, until his stablemate eased by him. Both Main Sequence, who had previously won the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial, and Astrology were assigned RPR's of 119. Camelot won by five lengths; the placed horses were six lengths in front of G1 English St. Leger winner Lucarno's full brother, Thought Worthy (Dynaformer). The form book pretty much went out the window for the weekend's other two Classics, last Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks, won by 20-1 shot Was (Galileo), while Sunday's 20-runner G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby, 10 1/2f.) was littered with hard-luck stories and won by a little-known 30-1 shot, Saonois, the second 'Jockey Club' winner (after Vision d'Etat) for his late sire, Chichicastenango (he died of colic in Japan earlier this year). In my preview of the Oaks last week, I mentioned five lightly raced fillies which were being backed against the experienced European 2-Year-Old Filly Champion of 2011, Maybe (Galileo); the winner was yet another making her third career start, though she hadn't been on my five-selection short list. This was also a messy race: Was (RPR 116) sat third behind dawdling pacesetters Nayarra (Cape Cross) and Twirl (Galileo) and stayed out of trouble. Meanwhile about everybody else ran into trouble, especially eventual favorite The Fugue, by Dansili out of Twyla Tharp, who finished third (RPR 113). She was pretty much knocked sideways early on, and I thought probably should have won the race for her owner/breeder, Lady Lloyd-Webber.

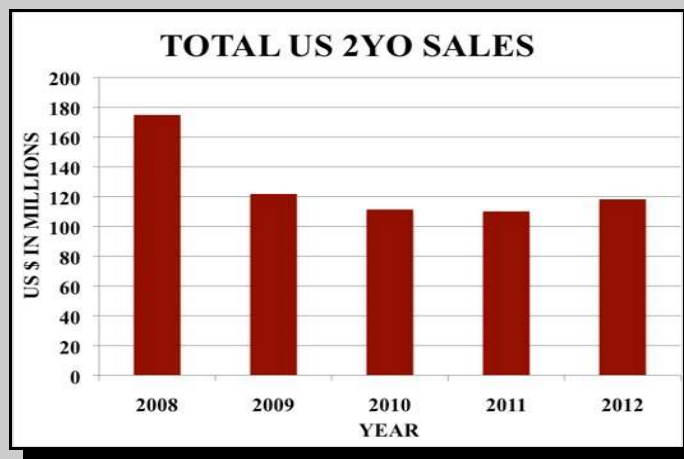

The number sold in North America dropped another 11% this year, but the gross was up by seven percent, and the average by 20%. The North American gross is still down by a third from 2008."

Shirocco Star, by, obviously, Shirocco, ran a very good race to finish second (RPR 114), while the well-fancied Vow (Motivator) didn't look like she really handled the track either, and ran well enough to finish fourth (RPR 112). Maybe, in fifth (RPR 109), failed to stay, and will drop back in trip. The first four would certainly be entitled to have another go in the G1 Irish Oaks in a few weeks' time; and if they do, The Fugue will likely be an even shorter price to prevail than she was at Epsom. Trainer Freddy Head had been quoted beforehand to the effect that 20 runners for the 2100 meter G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly was bound to cause traffic problems, and his worries proved to be prophetic. It looked just like trying to drive around the Arc de Triomphe in the middle of Paris--chaos, no lanes, traffic going in all directions. Two of the four favorites finished second and fourth: Godolphin's G3 Prix de Guiche winner Saint Baudolino (Pivotal) finished an honorable second (RPR 117) in spite of finding trouble; and the Aga Khan's G2 Prix Greffulhe winner, Kesampour (King's Best), was always on the premises and stayed on okay for fourth (RPR 117), in a three-horse photo for second. Saonois was assigned RPR 118, while the third, Nutello (Lemon Drop Kid), supposedly a pacemaker for more fancied stablemate Sofast (Rock of Gibraltar), stayed on again to also run an RPR 117. Meanwhile, the other two favorites, French Fifteen (Turtle Bowl), who had run such a great race when second to Camelot in the G1 English 2000 Guineas; and heavy-ground G3 Sandown Classic Trial winner Imperial Monarch (Galileo), for Coolmore, both found plenty of trouble and finished 10th and eighth, respectively. G2 Dante S. second Ektihaam (Invincible Spirit) was always struggling, and finished towards the rear. You'd have to bet Main Sequence and Astrology to beat the lot of them, really; you wouldn't think anything out of the 'Jockey-Club' would be troubling Camelot. Two tips of the hat from the weekend, too: The Derby Festival has been revitalized since Bernard Kantor's Investec Bank realized that a great marketing opportunity had arisen, and took over sponsorship in 2009; that has been a great partnership for everybody--the track, the company, and the fans, too. Kudos also to Tattersalls Sales Company; my good friend Jimmy George, their marketing supremo, reminds me they have now sold four winners of five of the six British and Irish Classics run so far (Camelot x 2, Power, Samitar, Was). That's a good strike rate, for sure.

SIRE UPDATES (Europe):

Ireland's Rathasker Stud stands 2003 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains--French 2000 Guineas winner Clodovil, by Danehill out of a Linamix mare. His first foals raced in 2007. His first crop included his only two group winners, G1 Falmouth S. winner Nahoodh and the G3-winning sprinter Beacon Lodge, as well as last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye second, Secret Asset. The combination of first-crop success plus England's maybe hottest trainer of 2012, Mick Channon, produced his third group winner last weekend when the 3-year-old filly Laugh Out Loud followed up a listed success at Haydock (in which she beat Electrelane, the Dubawi filly who won last weekend's G2 German 1000 Guineas) with an impressive all-the-way win in France's G2 Prix de Sandringham on the French Derby undercard. She will likely be pointed to Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation S., along with Channon's first Classic winner, G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Samitar (Rock of Gibraltar). But Laugh Out Loud was only one of four black-type horses for Clodovil last weekend: two 3-year-olds (Laugh Out Loud and Sandy Lane S. second Es Que Love), and two 2-year-olds in listed races in Rome, one winner and one second. His 3-year-olds of 2012 also include the Richard Hannon-trained Coupe de Ville, a listed and sales race winner at two who was fifth in the G1 English 2000 Guineas and seventh, beaten a length and a half, in France's G1 'Poulains'; and Gregorian, who was fifth, beaten under a length, in the Poulains but then was down the field in the 'Jockey-Club'. Clodovil's had those few quiet years after first-crop success, but it looks like he's back in the news to stay now.

SECOND-CROP SIRES (Europe):

Turtle Bowl and Dylan Thomas still top the charts (<http://www.the-racehorse.com/stats/sires/races/RC2/2012/all/e/max+0+all+any+any>), but the big movers, among what increasingly looks like a good group of sires, were last year's Leading European Freshman Sire, Dutch Art, and Juddmonte's 2006 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner, Rail Link. Cheveley Park's Dutch Art had two 3-year-old listed winners, Slade Power in the aforementioned Sandy Lane S. at Haydock (Es Que Love, by Clodovil, second), and Producer won the seven-furlong Surrey S. at Epsom on Oaks day. Dutch Art moves up to third on the European second-crop sire list (discounting Scat Daddy).

Darley's Manduro is fourth, adding listed winner Sopran Montieri in Italy, with Stormy River fifth. Rail Link moves into sixth, courtesy of G3 Prix de Royaumont winner Sediciosa, followed by Dark Angel (leading European second-crop sire of 2012 winners, with 26) and Red Clubs, who had a good 2-year-old listed winner at Naas on Monday. Lawman, Teofilo, and Excellent Art come next. In North America, deceased Sunriver, a son of Saint Ballado who stood in New York and had dual California Grade I winner Weemissfrankie last year, had a NY-bred black-type winner on the weekend, and there were black-type placed runners for Political Force, Hat Trick, Discreet Cat, Utopia, and Stonesider.

FIRST-CROP SIRES (Europe):

First black-type winners for New Approach (Dawn Approach, at Naas on Monday); surprise first-crop success Sixties Icon (Chilworth Icon, at Epsom), winner of the G1 English St. Leger, but he has the advantage of having several, including Chilworth Icon, being trained by man-of-the-moment Mick Channon; and the top French miler Tamayuz (Sir Prancealot, in the National S. at Sandown last Thursday). Henrythenavigator is getting quite a few runners now, too, and there could be fireworks from him as well, sooner rather than later.

ALL THE MARBLES:

Yes, we've had five Classics over the last two weekends, including seeing a budding star in Camelot. But this weekend the spotlight turns full beam to Belmont Park, Long Island, New York (this is going to be shown on TV in the UK, right?) for I'll Have Another's attempt to become the first Triple Crown winner in 34 years after 11 others have failed. I've been a hard-headed handicapper all along, and backed I'll Have Another every step of the way. The fact that I've known and admired Paul Reddam for a few years now, and my pal Jamie McCalmont is his racing manager is an added bonus. So I'm really hoping he wins, and by the way, it would be great for the game, too. With very little money on Betfair on Tuesday, I'll Have Another is 7-5, with only three horses likely to be seriously backed to beat him: Dullahan, Donegal Racing's half-brother to Mine that Bird (by Even The Score), who was third in the G1 Kentucky Derby, skipped the Preakness. He worked in :45 and change earlier in the week and he's the 3-1 second favorite on the morning line. Union Rags (Dixie Union), third in the G1 Florida Derby and seventh in Kentucky, is third choice at around 11-2 and Paynter, an Awesome Again colt trained by Bob Baffert for Zayat Stables. The latter won impressively on the Preakness undercard when running a Beyer 106--second best in the race to I'll Have Another's G1 Preakness S. 109--is trading around 9-1. This one's for all the marbles.

The granddaughter of the great Urban Sea (Miswaki) was fourth on debut behind the very smart prospect Princess Highway (Street Cry {Ire}) in a Leopardstown maiden over this trip in March, where Sonia Rogers' re-opposing **Dane Street (Street Cry {Ire})**, a Jessie Harrington-trained half-sister to the 2009 G1 Dewhurst S. scorer Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway), was a place ahead in third.
