### I'LL HAVE ANOTHER LOOKS FOR ONE MORE

GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) drew post 11 yesterday for his date with destiny in Saturday's GI Belmont S. The chestnut, who has yet to be favored in any of his seven previous starts, was installed the 4-5 morning-line choice. Asked what his strategy for the 1 1/2-mile race will be, trainer Doug O'Neill said, "We're going to huddle up and talk; being in the 11 hole, we're able to kind of see how the pace sets up. If they're crawling, we'll hopefully be leading the crawl, and if they're flying, we'll be sitting in behind the horses flying."

O'Neill added that I'll Have Another seems primed for another big effort in Saturday's 1 1/2-mile Classic. "He's doing great," O'Neill said of the J. Paul Reddam colorbearer. "He's continued to gallop good, his

energy's been good, his appetite's been strong, and he's handled this whole journey as good as you could possibly ask a horse. He hasn't lost a bit of his flesh at all, his coat continues to shine and look great, so we couldn't ask for him to be coming in to this any better."

Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score), a late-closing

third in the Kentucky Derby, is the 5-1 second choice on the morning line and will break from post five. Trainer Dale Romans is relishing his role as a potential spoiler. "I wouldn't trade places with anyone," said Romans. "I want to walk out of here with 120,000 people booing me."

**Union Rags** (Dixie Union) was the last Belmont starter to arrive on the grounds, checking into the detention barn at 11 a.m. Wednesday. All Belmont starters were required to be in the detention barn by midday. "We were the first ones on the track at Fair Hill--we were waiting to get on it at 5:30," said trainer Michael Matz. "He galloped a mile, we got him back, cooled him out, gave him something to eat, got him on the van and tried to be here before 12 o'clock. The driver did a wonderful job." The Gil Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. winner, off since running seventh in the Kentucky Derby, drew post three and is the 6-1 third choice on the morning line. "If I had my choice, I would have picked a little further out," Matz admitted. "I think the horse has enough speed to be in a decent position."

The last horse to arrive at the detention barn was the star of the show. I'll Have Another pranced down the shedrow in front of a throng of media at 12:04 p.m., following a short walk from Mark Hennig's barn where he had been stabled since May 20. "No complaints, no hurdles," Doug O'Neill said of the relocation. "He's being good." ([click for video of I'll Have Another's move](#))

### BELMONT STRIKE AVERTED

A threatened work strike that could have effected the GI Belmont S. has been averted after the New York Racing Association and Local 3 of the International Brotherhood of Electric Workers (IBEW), which represents the track's maintenance and assistant starters, agreed to a labor contract. "I am pleased that, by coming together, NYRA and IBEW Local 3 have been able to forge a labor contract agreement that helps allow the much-anticipated Belmont S. to be held this weekend," New York Governor Andrew Cuomo said. "With the potential for the nation's first Triple Crown in more than three decades, this year's Belmont S. holds particular excitement for horse racing fans here in New York and across the globe. I applaud the negotiating units on both sides for their hard work and commitment in reaching an agreement."

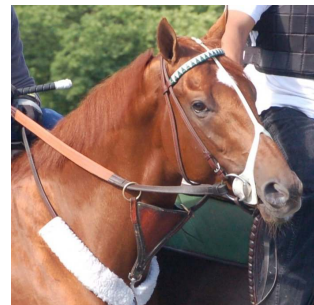

Connections of the GI Belmont S. contenders packed the house for Wednesday's traditional breakfast and post position draw at the racetrack's spacious Garden Terrace at 9:30 a.m.

NYRA's Andy Serling wasted little time getting the man of the hour to the stage after dual Classic winner **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley), drawn in post 11, was installed as the 4-5 morning-line favorite.

"It's been an unbelievable ride, and I think we've just stayed focused on the whole journey because of the great 'I'll Have Another,'" said O'Neill, who was joined by owner J. Paul Reddam, jockey Mario Gutierrez, brother Dennis O'Neill, and longtime friend and Santa Anita CEO Mark Verge. How is the 25-year-old Gutierrez dealing with his new-found fame?

"It feels good," he responded. "I try to enjoy every single minute of it. This is once in a lifetime."

Owner Jerry Crawford discussed his decision of skipping the GI Preakness S. with GI Kentucky Derby third **Dullahan** (Even the Score), despite trainer Dale Romans's urges to run in the second jewel. The Donegal Racing head also revealed a conversation that he had earlier in the morning with Reddam.

"Ahmed [Zayat] and I talked with Paul [Reddam] and told him that we're going to do everything we can to keep him from being a Triple Crown winner, but after what he has already done, and if he gets it done Saturday, he'll not only be a worthy Triple Crown winner, he will have exceeded all possible expectations," said Crawford, who greeted Reddam with a solid handshake on his way back to his seat.

Zayat will be represented by a fresh face in the Belmont after suffering a pair of heartbreakers with the speedy Bodemeister (Empire Maker) in Louisville and Baltimore.

"I don't think disappointed is the right word," Zayat admitted. "We were just beaten by a better horse, fair and square."

☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Paynter** (Awesome Again) is far from a second stringer, though. The bay earned a gaudy 106 Beyer in a two-turn allowance on the Preakness undercard, and also finished a valiant fourth behind I'll Have Another after stumbling at the start in the GI Santa Anita Derby.

"From day one, Bob Baffert thought Paynter was the better horse," Zayat added.

Chadds Ford Stable's Phyllis Wyeth was on hand to see last year's GI Champagne S. hero **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) draw post three in the big one. Has she been frustrated by her charge's season, including a troubled seventh in the Derby, thus far?

"Obviously, we have been a little disappointed, but we still feel Union Rags hasn't run his race," Wyeth warned.

Conditioner Chad Brown will have his first starter in a Triple Crown race with GI Peter Pan S. third **Street Life** (Street Sense).

"A horse is going to have to run the race of his life to beat I'll Have Another," said Brown, who added that his charge continues to mature with experience.

Trainer Ken McPeck, double-fisting in the Belmont with longshots **Atigun** (Istan) and **Unstoppable U** (Exchange Rate), reflected on his monumental upset courtesy of Sarava (Wild Again) with a Triple Crown on the line in the 2002 renewal.

"It was kind of neat," McPeek admitted. "Nobody threw any stones at me on the way out. I'm a bit bullet proof, anyway. I think it would have been one thing if we'd have beat him in a photo, but we didn't."

McPeek added, "It's a big jump up in class [for my two], but weirder things have happened. I'm running two that made \$200,000 total, but David did get Goliath, didn't he?"

**Five Sixteen** (Invasor {Arg}), a maiden winner of six starts, was freshened with the Belmont in mind after a fourth-place finish in an Aqueduct allowance in April.

"You've got to be in it to win it," Anthony Bonomo Jr., son of owners Mary Ellen and Anthony Bonomo and assistant to trainer Dominick Schettino, said of the 50-1 outsider. "The way he's going, I think he'll get the distance."

Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas remained his usual upbeat self despite suffering a nasty gash on his forehead, which required stitches and a trip to a local hospital, courtesy of Hamazing Destiny (Salt Lake) Tuesday.

"I've got a severe headache, that's the bad news," said Lukas, who will saddle Derby 11th and Preakness sixth **Optimizer** (English Channel) Saturday. "But the good news was that I got a date with the head nurse and I sold both doctors a racehorse while I was there last night."

The always entertaining owner/trainer Doodnauth Shivmangal--the man behind 50-1 bomb **Guyana Star Dweej** (Eddington)--closed out the festivities as Serling joked that he was on a time limit this year.

"I want to wish everybody in the Belmont S. a safe trip, and a safe journey, and good luck," Shivmangal concluded. "We're hoping to have a large crowd, which is good for our state and will make us pretty proud to have this event going."

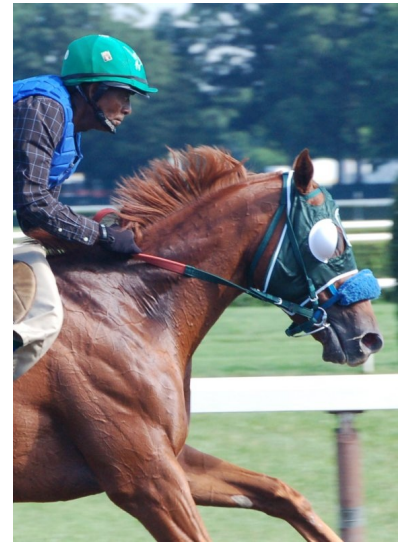

David Redvers, racing manager to owner Sheikh Fahad, confirmed that a Royal Ascot showdown with Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) is on the cards for last year's G2 Lennox S. and G2 Challenge S. scorer. "Strong Suit worked extremely well," he said. "Both Richard Hughes and Richard Hannon were thrilled to bits and believe it is as good a piece of work as he's ever done. The Queen Anne is still the plan, but it's an interesting one. All common sense tells you we're going there to get a thumping, but, equally, as sportsmen we really need to have a go, and Sheikh Fahad is certainly a sportsman." His trainer Richard Hannon had news of another possible Royal Ascot contender in Robin Heffer and Qatar Bloodstock's unbeaten G2 Richmond S. winner **Harbour Watch (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}), who has been sidelined by injury and who is in the wings for the G1 St James's Palace S. at the meeting June 19. "[His work] was very encouraging and Harbour Watch is coming along very nicely, but obviously the clock is ticking away with regards to Royal Ascot," Hannon said.

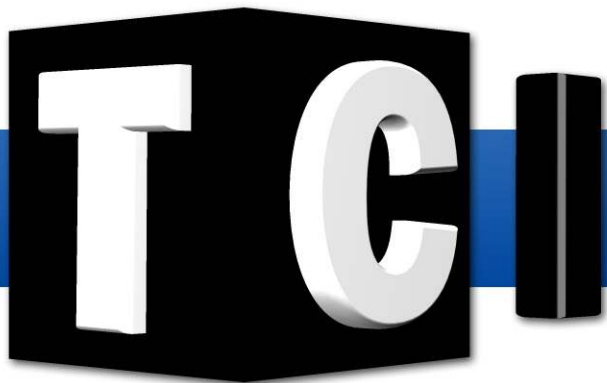
### Cirrus is King George Bound

Jean-Claude-Alain Dupouy and Xavier Niel's **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) is being aimed at the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot, trainer Corine Barande-Barbe announced yesterday. Successful in last year's G1 Champion S. and the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and Apr. 29 G1 Prix Ganay this term, the 6-year-old was runner-up in last Sunday's G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp as he continues on the road to the July 21 feature. "We plan to run Cirrus des Aigles in the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. and he will either run in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 20] or the [June 24] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud beforehand," his conditioner commented. "I want to see what is entered in both races before making a decision, but there will be good horses in both races. He has been in very good form since the Prix d'Ispahan. I wasn't disappointed he got beaten at Longchamp, because we had to make the running. In hindsight, we probably should have gone a faster pace, because Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was having her first start of the year and we know Cirrus des Aigles has more stamina than her. It's hard because there is no pace in French racing and the horse had run over 12 furlongs in Dubai and then 10 1/2 in the Prix Ganay after that, so how the race panned out was not in his favour."

## IRISH DERBY AIM FOR CAMELOT

**Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) is set to contest the G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby at The Curragh. After reporting Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby hero to be none the worse for his exertions, Derrick Smith's unbeaten colt will be targeted at completing the double June 30. "We will see how Camelot is in about 10 days' time and make a decision then when we sit down and discuss plans," trainer Aidan O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "He seems to have come out of Epsom well, and the Irish Derby is a race that means a lot to us. It has been a very solid race and a very fair test over the years, and The Curragh is the best Derby track. At this stage, there is no point looking too far ahead. We will take one race at a time." Camelot was also yesterday revealed as one of the 37 entries for the July 21 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. and, if he were to capture the Irish Derby and that Ascot midsummer feature, he would be the first to do since Nijinsky in 1970.

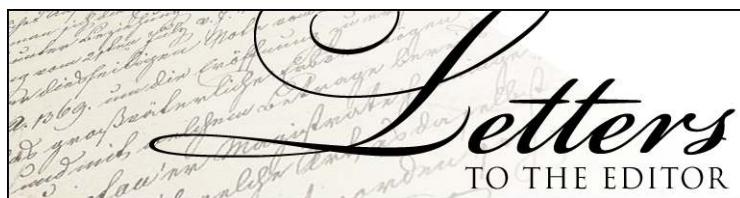

I read Bill Oppenheim's June 6 column in the TDN ([click here](#)), but take exception to his position that Camelot should bypass a bid at the English Triple Crown. In a sport often clouded by uncertainty and confusion, one thing is for sure: you have very few shots at racing immortality. People of a certain generation, inside and outside the racing world, know where they were when Nijinsky II last claimed the Triple Crown in 1970. My father, not an avid racing fan 42 years ago, reminded me of this the other day. Don't get me wrong, I fully agree with Bill's sound reasoning in the aptly named Stallion Economics 101. It makes total commercial sense for Camelot to be pointed at the 'Arc' later in the year, and not the St. Leger. There are not many races that would increase his stallion value at this point, bar the aforementioned race and of course the Breeders' Cup Classic. Winning the St. Leger over 1 3/4 miles at Doncaster wouldn't add a single penny to his potential stud fee. According to this reasoning, it could be argued that the Triple Crown is somewhat meaningless. And Paris in autumn is a little more pleasant than Doncaster--no offence intended.

Saying all that, sometimes in sport there is no place for commercial considerations. Coolmore experienced this with Yeats a few years back, although this would represent an even greater gamble. Hopefully, the heart rules the head in Co. Tipperary and Camelot will be given a chance to become etched in the memory of a generation.
