**'ANOTHER' DREAM BITES THE DUST**

The Triple Crown will have to wait at least another year. Rumors began to circulate on Twitter Friday morning that something was amiss with GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley--Arch's Gal Edith, by Arch), and a few hours later at a press conference, his connections confirmed that the chestnut had sustained an injury and would be retired. Swelling in his left front superficial tendon emerged Thursday, but went down after treatment. However, the swelling returned after J. Paul Reddam's colt galloped Friday morning ([click here](#)).

"[When he was] cooling out, you could tell the swelling was back, and at that point I didn't feel very good," said trainer Doug O'Neill. "I talked to Mr. Reddam, and you know, immediately we got Dr. [Jim] Hunt over here, and he said it was the start of tendonitis in his left front tendon."

Though the veterinarian indicated that the colt could return to training in three to six months, the decision was made to retire him.

"Obviously, he's done so much that it was unanimous between the Reddams and my brother and I and everyone at the barn to retire him," O'Neill added.

"And it is a bummer, but again, far from tragic, but it is very disappointing."

According to the New York Racing Association, I'll Have Another will lead the post parade for the Belmont. Mario Gutierrez will be in the irons.

In addition to his Classic wins, I'll Have Another captured the GI Santa Anita Derby and GII Robert B. Lewis S. earlier this year, and also finished second last summer in the GII Best Pal S. He bankrolled \$2,693,600 while compiling a record of 7-5-1-0.

**Dullahan New Belmont Favorite...**

Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) had been the second choice when the Belmont was drawn, but, following Friday's announcement, was installed as the 9-5 favorite for the 12-furlong Classic.

"I feel his pain, believe me. Everybody in racing does," trainer Dale Romans told *Daily Racing Form*. "Obviously, it makes our job easier now because he was the horse to beat, but we really wanted the opportunity to compete with him. It's devastating news for them, for us, and for racing."

Trainer Michael Matz, who will saddle **Union Rags** (Dixie Union), echoed those sentiments.

"We have all had similar problems like that happen, but at a level like this it's pretty devastating, especially after having won the first two legs of the Triple Crown," Matz told *DRF*. "Obviously, nobody likes to see a horse come out of a race like that. Just having him participating would have meant a lot for racing. You always hope, in races like this, the best horse wins. Whether he's the best horse or not, we'll never know now."

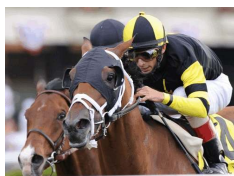

**I'll Have Another Out of Belmont cont.**

Owner Paul Reddam was philosophical about the 11th-hour withdrawal.

"I just want to thank Doug and his entire team for the great care they have given this horse," said the Ontario native. "It was a hell of a run and I know they are all personally very disappointed, of course, that he didn't get to show his stuff for tomorrow.

"I really thought he was going to run off tomorrow and really show something. So we were all a bit shocked, but we have to do what's best for the horse and if he can't compete at the top level, you know, he's done enough, and Doug, thank you."

Stud plans for I'll Have Another will be announced at a later date.

"I guess we would be open to talking about that at some point here," Reddam added. "But it's not an emergency to talk about where he's going to stand or what he would stand for, or this and that. The races are going to go on today. The big race is tomorrow. Going to be there as a fan now, won't tell you who we are betting on. We'll take a few days to just let this play out."

O'Neill described the injury as a "freakish thing."

"I think when you have a human or an equine athlete, when you give 110% every time you step on the court or the track, you're suspect to injury," said the conditioner.

Dr. Larry Bramlage, the on-call veterinarian for the Belmont, said, "I'll Have Another's ability to lead the post parade for tomorrow's Belmont is an illustration of the character of his injury. It is absolutely of no concern for sub-maximal exercise, but would be a concern at a mile and a half at full speed. Therefore, I have no concern for his appearance on the racetrack at the head of the Belmont field."

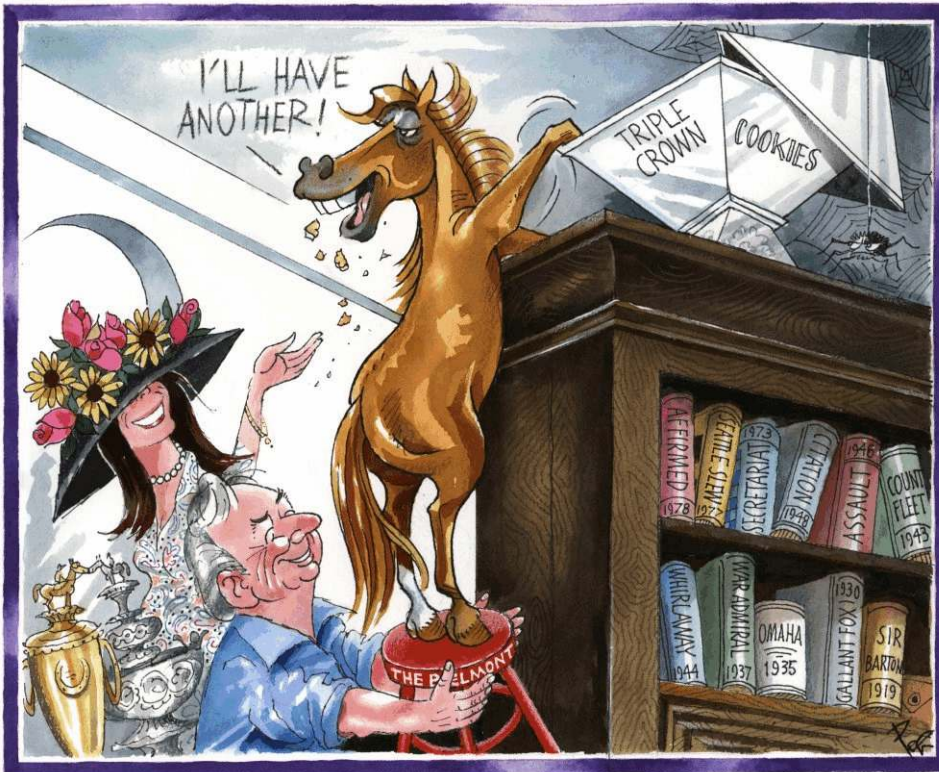

**The Show Must Go On...**

The rumors quickly began to swirl regarding I'll Have Another (Flower Alley)'s status after trainer Doug O'Neill opted to send the dual Classic winner out for a surprise 5:30 a.m. training session, but there was still plenty of other action to take in before the dreaded word was confirmed at a press conference at the stakes barn later in the afternoon.

With temperatures remaining quite pleasant in the 60s under sunny blue skies, the majority of GI Belmont S. contenders turned in their final pieces of work during the special 15-minute time allotment beginning at 8:30 a.m.

Bob Baffert, taking his usual spot for the morning activity at Belmont Park in front of the rail by the clubhouse turn gap, chatted with Olympic gold medallist skier Bode Miller and retired jockey Jerry Bailey while awaiting for the track to re-open.

Union Rags (Dixie Union) was the first to step foot on Big Sandy, prompting the Hall of Fame conditioner to joke to the aboard exercise rider, "Two laps today, right?" The striking bay looked much better on his second day of training in New York after getting very lathered on an even cooler morning the previous day. **Cont. p6**

**Making the Scene cont.**

**Paynter** (Awesome Again), an impressive allowance winner on the GI Preakness S. undercard, did more than enough to please his pilot.

"We're ready," he said to Baffert and assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes with confidence while exiting the track.

**Guyana Star Dweej** (Eddington) appeared much more comfortable training on the outside of his graded stakes winning workmate Shkspeare Shaliyah (Shakespeare) after failing to make a good impression in any of his other trips to the track earlier this week from along the fence. Still hard to believe that he will outrun his double-digit odds, though.

Ken McPeek's duo looked particularly sharp Friday morning. The lightly raced **Unstoppable U** (Exchange Rate) was on his toes as he jogged back the wrong way before exiting through the paddock. Live longshot **Atigun** (Istan) continues to give off extremely good vibes, producing another strong gallop while kept under a tight hold. Hard not to respect the barn behind 2002 monumental upsetter Sarava (Wild Again).

**Five Sixteen** (Invasor {Arg}), quoted at 30-1 on the revised morning line, may not be the most physically imposing animal in the field, but he too seems to be heading into the main event the right way, turning in a series of solid gallops with the shades on throughout the week. Wouldn't be surprised at all if he snuck in there to get a minor award for his hometown connections.

Trainer Chad Brown kept a close eye on Magnolia Racing Stable and Hidden Brook Farm's **Street Life** (Street Sense) while chatting with co-owner Jack Brothers during the blaze-faced dark bay's bath. Union Rags quickly became the main attraction during bath time, or wherever he shows up for that matter, with photographers lining up along the fence to get a good shot at the popular GI Champagne S. winner.

**Dullahan** (Even the Score), who fired a :45 4/5 four-furlong warning shot Sunday, now assumes the role of favorite following a troubled third in the Derby. Based on what the flashy chestnut has been showing in the mornings since the move, he certainly looks like the one to beat.

While it clearly lacks the drama of producing racing's next Triple Crown winner, there's still a Classic race to be run at Belmont Park today. Hope to see you all there...

**'Another' Historical TC Disappointment...**

It's been a while, but I'll Have Another isn't the first horse to be scratched from the Belmont S. after bagging the first two legs of the Triple Crown. In fact, it's happened at least twice before, with at least one of those defections also due to a tendon injury.

Back in 1932, Col. Edward R. Bradley's Burgoo King won the Kentucky Derby by a convincing five-length margin for Hall of Fame trainer "Derby Dick" Thompson. The son of Bubbling Over, who won the Derby himself in 1926, came back and added the Preakness S. and loomed a threat to sweep the newly anointed Triple Crown. But he never made it into the gate for that year's June 4th Belmont. According to Burgoo King's Wikipedia page, he either a) didn't make the race because of a paperwork issue; or b) wrenched an ankle and couldn't run. Either way, a week after the Belmont, he was reported to have bowed a tendon while training for the American Derby in Chicago and was sidelined. It would be 1934 before he'd make another start.

Just four years later, in 1936, Bold Venture sprang a 20-1 upset when he held off the 4-5 choice Brevity by a head in the 62nd Run for the Roses. Trained by the Hall of Famer Max Hirsch, Bold Venture overcame a bad start two weeks later to win the Preakness under George Wolf--apprentice rider Ira "Babe" Hanford was aboard in the Derby--but he too failed to make the Belmont. In the days leading up the race, he bowed a tendon, and was scratched. Bold Venture would get a measure of vengeance as a sire, however. While standing at King Ranch in Texas, he sired the 1946 Triple Crown winner Assault, as well as the 1950 Derby and Belmont hero Middleground. Who knows? Maybe in a few years' time we'll be rooting on a son of I'll Have Another to Triple Crown glory.

### WHAT MEMORIES ARE MADE OF

**Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}) will be a deserving favorite in today's GI Longines Just a Game S., but the grey filly will have her work cut out for her. Favored in each of her 10 career starts to date, Winter Memories concluded 2011 with a surprising fourth in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, but displayed her late burst to great effect in her seasonal opener, the GIII Beaugay S. over this course May 5. Though she is perfect in four outings at her

Belmont home, she may need to get going a bit sooner than usual in this one-mile affair. "She's coming into the race as well as can be expected," said trainer Jimmy Toner. "I think we'll be okay with the distance. We started out at a mile and a sixteenth at Belmont around 1 1/2 turns [in the Beaugay]. So basically we've been pointing to this race, the Just a Game. I know the race is a mile, and that's why we didn't want to do two turns right off the bat with her. I don't think cutting back to a mile will be a drawback." **Hungry Island** (More Than Ready) has a fine late rattle of her own, upending Winter Memories last summer in the GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga. The bay ran down Tapitsfly (Tapit) last out in the GII Distaff Turf Mile at Churchill on the Kentucky Derby undercard. Live Oak homebred **Brilliant Speed** (Dynaformer), winner of the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and third in last year's GI Belmont S., has come close in a series of Grade I events since switching to the turf last fall and will have another attempt to breakthrough against seven rivals in today's GI Woodford Reserve Manhattan H. at Belmont Park. After winning the GIII Saranac S. over the Saratoga lawn last September, the 4-year-old was second in the GI Jamaica H. and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. In two starts so far this term, he ran fifth in the Mar. 31 GIII Appleton S. and third in the May 5 GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic. "At least he's consistent," trainer Tom Albertrani said of Brilliant Speed. "This race, hopefully, they're setting a good pace for him. I think that's his best race. In the Jamaica, he ran on the lead; he could do it, but normally he likes to sit off the lead. He's always right there. Eventually, he'll have his breakout race." Shug McGaughey saddles the Phipps Stable's **Boisterous** (Distorted Humor). The 5-year-old has won four of six starts on the Belmont turf and is coming off a one-length victory in the May 5 GIII Fort Marcy S. Todd Pletcher will send out morning-line favorite **Hudson Steele** (Johannesburg), last-out winner of the May 19 GII Dixie S. After spending eight months on the sidelines, the 5-year-old gelding has won four of five starts. "He had a couple of issues and has never been able to string a campaign together," said assistant trainer Michael McCarthy. "He's a stronger, sounder horse this year. His races at Pimlico--the first race back in the Henry Clark was a great starting point, and the Dixie, a top effort there. It would have taken a very good horse to beat him that day. Obviously, this is a big step up. The mile and a quarter is uncharted waters, but the horse has trained really well."

"The plan going into the Derby was, when we made it to the quarter pole, if there was no horse left to just ease him up. If he couldn't finish 1-2-3-4, don't push it. Angus was one of a trio connected with the unbeaten mare on the flight alongside trainer Peter Moody's assistant Tony Haydon and work rider Pat Bell.

"After a journey like this they can be so tired that sometimes their eyes are dulled, but she's as bright as a button," said Angus. "She seems to have eaten and drunk on the flight and is in very good condition. She doesn't look to have lost much weight, looking over her hindquarters. The next couple of days will tell, but she seems very settled and relaxed."

Moody remains in Australia at present, but he expressed satisfaction with the news from the Northern Hemisphere. "That is what I think is the hard part of the trip out of the way," he told radio RSN. "Obviously, the next 24 hours are quite crucial also as to how she settles and everything, but she takes most things in her stride, so I'm pretty confident she's got through that part of the trip well. She was a little tucked up there last night, but nothing too bad. The vets were very happy with her feed and fluid intake on the trip. She didn't need anything intravenous, which was very pleasing. Her temperature is good and she relieved herself quickly when she got there."

Paul Messara, who is in Newmarket with his stable's G1 Al Quoz Sprint winner Ortensia (Aus) (Testa Rossa {Aus}), summed up the general feeling from Australia about her chances in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 23.

"She only needs to be 80% to win here," he said. "There is no chance she'll get beat if she arrives without problems. Zero. These guys over here are kidding themselves, it is almost a joke."

**Cecil Wants Camelot Clash...**

Sir Henry Cecil is hoping that Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) will be at York for a clash with his stable luminary **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Juddmonte International. Confirming yesterday that the Ebor meeting's Aug. 22 extended 10-furlong contest will be the unbeaten Juddmonte homebred's first race beyond a mile, he was keen to appeal to connections of Ballydoyle's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby hero to meet him there.

"Camelot is a very nice horse and by far the best of the 3-year-olds, so I'd love to see them run at York for the clash of the two generations," Frankel's conditioner said. "It will come and it will be nice to take on a different type of horse when he steps up to a mile and a quarter, which I don't want him to do any earlier than York. The [G1 Coral-Eclipse] is not in my mind for him, as we want to take it step-by-step, but the Prince will make the final decision and things could change."

Redeemed, making his first start beyond nine furlongs, laid waste to some of the best marathoners in the U.S. with this sharp score. After finishing second to Caleb's Posse (Posse) in Saratoga's 6 1/2-furlong GII Amsterdam S., he ran Wilburn (Bernardini) to 1 3/4 lengths in the Smarty Jones S. when stretched out at Parx in September, then added Remington Park's Oklahoma Derby in October. He closed out his 5-for-7 sophomore season with a win in the nine-furlong GIII Discover H. at Aqueduct Nov. 19. On return in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 11, Redeemed ran an even third to Hymn Book (Arch), then missed the frame for the first time when sixth in the GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds Apr. 1--his first and last start with trainer Paul McGee. Returned to Rick Dutrow's barn, he splashed home 9 3/4 lengths clear in the nine-furlong Milesius S. at Belmont May 3, and had the public's confidence adding three panels. Birdrun, threading his way through, made a premature move to challenge Redeemed on the backstretch, but after three-quarters in 1:12.42, both he and Kentucky Reign began to retreat. The 26-1 Eldaafer made a threatening move as they got to 1 1/4 miles in 2:02.37, but Redeemed still had plenty in the tank and simply outclassed them in the lane. "I didn't say anything to Ramon," said Dutrow of race tactics. "He knows how to ride, this horse knows how to run. This horse's best game, probably, is stalking. He angled out entering the lane, got first run on defending champion Right One and stayed on determinedly. "This horse really has deserved this from the day he walked into the barn," said Nihei. "It's been a little bit of a roller coaster with that last race. The stretch-out was a little bit too long for him. I can't say enough good things about him. That was everything we wanted it to be. We'll take a breath, come out of this race, and look for something appealing at Saratoga and look for a path that looks obvious between now and [the Breeders' Cup in] November."

## NOVEMBER SALES PUSHED BACK A DAY; RADIOGRAPHIC REPORTS ADDED

Looking to accommodate clients attending the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita in California Nov. 2-3, Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton jointly announced yesterday that their respective November sales will be pushed back a day. Fasig-Tipton will hold its November Sale on Monday, Nov. 5, with a start time of 4 p.m, while Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale will get underway the next morning at 10 a.m. and run through Friday, Nov. 16. The companies said they would keep the scheduling adjustments in place during those years when the Breeders' Cup is held in California. Keeneland President and CEO Nick Nicholson and Fasig-Tipton President and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. said in a joint statement, "We believe these changes are in order given the global significance of both the Breeders' Cup and Kentucky's fall breeding stock sales. We want to make it as easy as possible for our clients to fully participate in both important events."

The two auction houses also announced amendments to their conditions of sale, making veterinary radiographic reports part of the repository information available for each horse. Veterinary radiographic reports are descriptions or summaries offered by veterinarians of what is reflected in the radiographs of each horse cataloged in the sale. The reports will be accessible in the repository after x-rays have been reviewed. Officials said the inclusion of the reports, which are subject to a limited warranty that they are accurate, valid and authentic, further enhances the integrity of the repository and the entire sale process. The companies said if the reports are materially misleading, the buyer will have 24 hours from the end of the sale session in which the horse was sold to reject the sale. If the consignor disagrees, parties may avail themselves of the arbitration process available under the conditions of sale.
