MARK VALESKI SIDELINED

Brereton Jones's homebred **Mark Valeski** (Proud Citizen), winner of the May 12 GII Peter Pan S., will miss the remainder of his sophomore season after suffering a chip in his left knee and is scheduled to undergo surgery this morning. "[Trainer] Larry [Jones] felt that the colt wasn't galloping as strongly as he'd like last week, so we took some precautionary x-rays," explained Airdrie Stud's Bret Jones. "There is a small chip in his left knee that will be easily removed. He will need three or four months off before returning to training."

Jones is already looking to Mark Valeski's 4-year-old season. "It's certainly disappointing to miss out on some of the big summer races, but we think we're going to have a pretty special 4-year-old next season," he added.

Mark Valeski missed by just a nose to El Padrino (Pulpit) when second in the Feb. 25 GII Risen Star S. and was runner-up again in the Apr. 1 GII Louisiana Derby. He was taken out of consideration for the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby just days before the race and re-routed to the Peter Pan, where he secured a 1 1/4-length victory. On the board in five of six starts to date, Mark Valeski has won three times and earned \$430,952.

Believe You Can Works; Pointing to Mother Goose

It wasn't all bad news for Brereton Jones Monday, as his GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Believe You Can** (Proud Citizen) worked a bullet five furlongs in :59.60 at Churchill Downs yesterday.

"Everything was really good," said trainer Larry Jones. "She worked nice and galloped out really good. She came back good, so it looks like she's going to the [June 23 GI] Mother Goose [S. at Belmont Park] in good shape." Jones has high hopes for the homebred's sophomore season. "As we said with [2011 Horse of the Year

and champion older female] Havre de Grace (Saint Liam), we're going to try to give her a chance to win a championship," explained the veteran conditioner. "We want to make sure we put her out there enough that maybe she can be champion 3-year-old filly, and then we'll see what else can be added on."

FORT LARNED TUNES UP FOR FOSTER

Fort Larned (E Dubai), most recently runner-up in the May 4 GII Alysheba S., tuned up for Saturday's GI Stephen Foster H. with a five-furlong work in 1:02.20 at Churchill Downs Monday. "What's the old saying? It was just what I wanted," trainer Ian Wilkes reported. The 4-year-old, owned by Janis Whitham was a 2 1/2-length victor of the Mar. 31 GIII Skip Away S. "His last two races have been really good," Wilkes continued. "He broke the track record in the Skip Away and then last time he just got beat when Successful Dan broke the track record. The horse is running at a high level and he's improving. I don't think he's peaked yet." Others considered likely for the Foster are: **Alternation** (Distorted Humor), **Astrology** (A.P. Indy), **Nates Mineshaft** (Mineshaft), **Nehro** (Mineshaft), **Mission Impazible** (Unbridled's Song), **Rogue Romance** (Smarty Jones), **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), **Where's Sterling** (Northern Afleet), **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry).

No Risk at All registered a third black-type score in the Nov. 17 Listed Prix Tantieme at Saint-Cloud, and returned there to open this campaign with a fourth in the Mar. 10 Listed Prix Altipan. Hitting the board back there once more in the Apr. 1 G3 Prix Edmond Blanc, he was runner-up in the May 1 G2 Prix du Muguet and was a last-out fourth in the May 27 G1 Prix d'Ispahan at this venue. The eventual winner found a rail position off the pace in fifth for most of this one. Making smooth headway in the straight to assume command passing the two pole, he lengthened clear in impressive fashion to easily claim a career high. Odds-on favorite Meandre was primed for his bid once into the stretch run, but labored in the testing conditions to finish a well-beaten second.

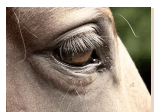

As I reviewed Union Rags's pedigree in some depth after his victory in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. in February, this week I am taking the opportunity to point out some salient pedigree features concerning several of the other horses who enjoyed stakes success last week. It's a reminder of how quickly time passes that it is already 11 years since the tremendously accomplished Nureyev died. He no longer has many major stallion sons in Europe or North America, but two of them were in form last week.

The California-based Unusual Heat was back in the spotlight thanks to the admirable Acclamation, who recorded his fifth Grade I success and his third consecutive triumph in the Charles Whittingham H. Over in Europe, Peintre Celebre enjoyed a stakes double thanks to Slight Advantage in Germany and the progressive 3-year-old Xanadou in France. *Cont. p5*

The Wildenstein family experimented with inbreeding to Nureyev quite some time ago and was principally rewarded with Peintre Celebre's high-class 1 1/2-mile filly Vallee Enchantee. She was inbred 2x3 to Nureyev, thanks to having a second dam by the former Walmac stalwart. Coincidentally, both of last week's stakes winners by Peintre Celebre are also inbred to Nureyev. The more interesting of the two is Xanadou, who is inbred 2x3. His speedy dam, Doohulla, is a daughter of Stravinsky, who staked a strong claim to being Nureyev's fastest son with his victories in the G1 Nunthorpe S. and G1 July Cup.

Daughters of Stravinsky have already produced two Group 1 winners and interestingly both of them--the excellent Australian filly Mosheen and the top-class Rip Van Winkle--were effective at up to 1 1/2 miles. Xanadou's Group 3 win last week was over a mile, but he won over 1 3/16 miles as a juvenile, so it seems that Stravinsky's daughters aren't going to prove one-dimensional speedsters as producers.

Brilliant racehorses don't always make brilliant stallions, but Frankel's legions of admirers needn't have any fears about their favorite, judging by the early results achieved by Galileo's first few stallion sons.

Last week saw New Approach confirm his standing as a stallion of rare potential. Even though this Derby winner shone over distances of a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half--as his pedigree suggested he would--he had three impressive 2-year-old winners over six furlongs last week. The most important of the three has to be the unbeaten Dawn Approach, who provided his sire with his first stakes victory, but there was also a lot to like about Tha'lr and the filly Newfangled.

Teofilo was another Galileo stallion with a much-admired 2-year-old winner last week, with Havana Gold shaping like a potential group horse in winning his debut at Newmarket. Teofilo--who, like New Approach, stands under the Darley banner--already has five stakes winners in his first crop, including four at group level. Parish Hall, of course, won last year's G1 Dewhurst S. and Light Heavy was recording his third consecutive win when he took the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial.

Two sons of Galileo which haven't enjoyed the first-rate support given to New Approach and Teofilo are Heliostatic and Sixties Icon. Heliostatic, a Group 3 middle-distance winner, had only 24 foals in his first Irish crop, but they included Crius, winner of the G3 Sommerville Tattersall S. last fall.

The royally bred Sixties Icon--the result of a mating between winners of the Derby and Oaks--was a Group 1 winner, but that Group 1 win came in the St Leger, a race widely considered a graveyard for its winners' stallion prospects.

ITALY'S PREMIER YEARLING SALE IS SEPT. 21-22, 2012

Sixties Icon covered 52 mares in his first season, at a fee of £6,000. He therefore seemed sure to face an uphill struggle, but he has been one of the stories of the British season. Far from needing time and distance, his progeny have come out ready for action (thanks partly to the no-nonsense approach of Mick Channon, a trainer who believes that racehorses are meant to race). Sixties Item has already notched up four winners and three placed horses from his first nine runners, including Chilworth Icon, winner of the Woodcote S. over six furlongs, and the listed-placed Effie B.

The next son of Galileo to have runners will be Heliostatic's superior brother Soldier of Fortune, winner of the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Coronation Cup. This French-based stallion has yearlings, whereas the highly talented Rip Van Winkle has foals.

I have to admit that there was a time when I had doubts about Gone West's prowess as a broodmare sire. It wasn't until late 2004, when his daughters already had more than 500 foals of racing age, that the then-20-year-old stallion became the broodmare sire of a Group 1 winner. However, that particular Group 1 winner was worth the wait, as he was none other than Motivator, who went on to take the 2005 G1 Derby by five lengths.

I'm pleased to say that that proved a turning point in Gone West's career. Since then his daughters' total of Group 1 winners in the Northern Hemisphere has soared to eight, thanks to Healthy Addiction, Frost Giant, Game Face, Awesome Feather, Brilliant Speed, Announce and Union Rags.

Of course Gone West had every right to succeed in this area. His sire Mr. Prospector enjoyed prolonged success as a broodmare sire, racking up numerous North American championships, and Gone West's own broodmare sire, Secretariat, was the champion broodmare sire of 1992. But who could have guessed that arguably his most important successes as a broodmare sire would come in such demanding mile-and-a-half tests as the G1 Derby and the G1 Belmont S.?

Ask European breeders to name Green Desert's best stallion sons and they are likely to nominate Oasis Dream, Invincible Spirit and Cape Cross, but another stallion worthy of inclusion is Desert Style.

When this well-bred horse retired to Corbally Stud in Ireland in 1996, his modest fee reflected the fact that he had won nothing more important than three Group 3 events in Ireland. Although technically the best 3-year-old sprinter in Europe in 1995, Desert Style was rated no higher than 120, so he was no shoo-in for stallion success.

Even so, he has built up an admirable record and he was represented by his sixth individual Grade I winner when the ex-French Desert Blanc narrowly came out on top in the Woodford Reserve Manhattan H. Desert Blanc's predecessors include such high-class performers as Bachir (winner of the G1 2000 Guineas in France and Ireland), Mandesha (a triple Group 1 winner in France) and Paco Boy (a winner of three of Europe's premier races over seven furlongs or a mile).

Now 20 years old, Desert Style is currently finishing his fourth season at Haras du Hoguenet in France, a country where four of his progeny have won at the highest level. One of his daughters was responsible for Family One, one of the fastest French 2-year-olds of 2011, and Havana Gold, the promising Teofilo colt mentioned elsewhere in these notes, is another with a Desert Style dam.

Incidentally, Desert Blanc is an example of the success that Indian Ridge mares have enjoyed with grandsons of Danzig, others being Dancing Rain, winner of last year's Oaks and German Oaks, and Excelebration, winner of last year's Prix du Moulin.

Johannesburg was by no means everyone's favorite stallion before his sale to Japan, but he may have left a worthwhile legacy in the U.S. In addition to being the sire of leading second-crop sire Scat Daddy, he was also responsible for Teufflesberg.

Teufflesberg enjoyed his finest moment in winning the GII Woody Stephens S. in 2007 and now his first-crop son Trinniberg has won the same valuable prize (despite being a \$1,500 yearling). Teufflesberg has also drawn attention to himself by siring a 2-year-old full-sister to Trinniberg who sold for \$450,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale. Unfortunately Teufflesberg doesn't have numbers on his side (49 foals in his first two crops), but I expect that might be about to change.

While the 12 of us have been fairly well-immersed in our penultimate engagement of this phase of the program (our 5-week long work placements), none of us could have missed the huge buzz of anticipation surrounding a long-awaited potential Triple Crown winner, on whom fate struck the cruellest of blows on Friday last week.

Each trainee has been placed with one of a range of people and organisations, including trainers, bloodstock agents, sales companies and veterinarians, in locations spanning from east coast to west here in the U.S.

Some had been fortunate enough (thanks to placements with New York-based operations) to experience the atmosphere and build-up at the epicentre of it all in Belmont Park, and while the announcement of I'll Have Another's late scratch was a firm reminder that nothing can be taken for granted in racing, it was still an exceptional few weeks to savour. For those working on the backside, there surely couldn't have been a more memorable opportunity. Ohio-native Tricia Calkins has been working at the New York Racing Association and spent her first few weeks alongside the NYRA executive staff, working on final preparations for Belmont day and upcoming NYRA presentations. She also had the enviable opportunity of watching the main contenders train each morning, as well as attend all the racing; one highlight she mentioned was a star turn (on the first day of her placement) in Godolphin's It's Tricky's GI Ogden Phipps win photo!

Another trainee making some win photo appearances over the last fortnight was Jim Clarke, who has been working at Belmont Park with trainer Kiaran McLaughlin and his assistant Artie Magnuson. Jim's first two weeks included the opportunity to learn about every aspect of the stable routine (including morning workouts, race selection and veterinary care) as well as escort all the trainer's runners to and from the track. Aspiring trainer Jack Davison has been working under the expert tutelage of fellow Irishman Eoin Harty at Hollywood Park, and has been busying himself with similar fundamental stable duties of hotwalking and tacking up, plus the occasional riding stint in between.

Not every Darley Flying Start trainee can lay claim to having worked in the Belmont-winning trainer's stable, and Sebastien Desmontils (whose previous incarnations include time working as an amateur jockey in France) found himself in just that fortunate position working at Michael Matz's Maryland stable. Sebastien, who has been riding five lots each day, told me: 'I've been given a unique opportunity to see how a top-class American training operation is run, with 60 high-profile horses managed by an incredible team.'

Every day working with Mr. Matz and his staff is a huge learning opportunity which is underpinned by a total passion and commitment to the sport."

Sarah has been hard at work here at the TDN offices in New Jersey, and Steve (O'Connor), Stephen (Heath), Ian, Madoka and I have been mainly based in Lexington; news of our placements will follow. All of us wish to express our sincere thanks to those who have welcomed us to their farms, offices and barns and have provided us all with such fantastic and memorable experiences so far.

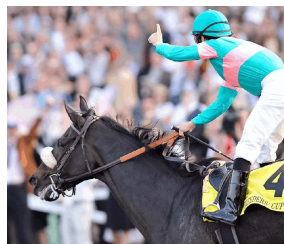
