

CHURCHILL ESTABLISHES "ROAD TO THE KENTUCKY DERBY"

Move over, graded stakes earnings. Officials at Churchill Downs announced Thursday that it has established a new points system for qualifying for the GI Kentucky Derby next spring. Dubbed the "Road to the Kentucky Derby," the system will be comprised of 36 races, beginning this fall. The graded stakes system of determining Derby starters had been in place since 1986. The GI Kentucky Oaks

will adopt a similar system.

"Our primary driving motive is to create new fans for horse racing," said CDI Chairman and Chief Executive Officer Bob Evans. "We're implementing a more fan-friendly, cohesive and simplified system that should create compelling drama and appeal to a wider customer base. Fans, as well as the owners and trainers of the horses, will know exactly which races are included and what races matter the most based on a sliding scale of points.

"Additionally, the new system, which gives us greater stability, represents historical relevancy and helps to ensure our long-standing mission of assembling the finest group of 3-year-olds in the starting gate for a race at the Classic distance of 1 1/4 miles on the first Saturday in May. We want to maximize the quality of the Derby field and protect the integrity of the race, while respecting the tradition and relevance of paths taken to the race by previous Kentucky Derby winners and prominent starters."

In the past, fillies could qualify for the Kentucky Derby based on graded earnings accrued by racing against their own sex, but that will no longer be the case. If a filly earns points in any of the races that are part of the Road to the Kentucky Derby, she will also be credited with them in the new "Road to the Kentucky Oaks" series.

There will be two phases in the Road to the Kentucky Derby, with points being allotted to the first four finishers in the designated races. The first phase will be known as the "Kentucky Derby Prep Season," a period between September and February that will consist of 19 races at least a mile in distance run over dirt or synthetic. The lone exception will be the G2 Royal Lodge S. on the grass at Newmarket. The first four finishers in those races will be awarded points on a 10-4-2-1 scale. **Cont. p3**

Those points will increase markedly during the second phase, known as the “Kentucky Derby Championship Series,” which will get underway in late February/early March. In the first leg of the series, 3-year-olds will be awarded points based on a 50-20-10-5 scale in the following races:

There will also be two “Wild Card” races with a points scale of 20-8-4-2, the GIII Lexington S. at Keeneland and the GIII Derby Trial S. at Churchill.

The races in the Road to the Kentucky Derby will be reviewed annually, with the schedule expected to be announced in July.

“If someone comes to us with an idea that we think is innovative and makes the ‘Road to the Kentucky Derby’ better, we’ll certainly be open to it,” said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs. “At this point and time, what we’ve assumed here is that the racetracks will run the same races under the same conditions around the same dates as last year. If not, we’ll have to adjust the schedule.”

The change in qualifying for the “Run for the Roses” came about after polls conducted demonstrated a lack of awareness in how 3-year-olds made the Derby cut.

“People understand that the Kentucky Derby is the Super Bowl of horse racing, but they don’t understand what the ‘league’ structure is and what the series is to get there,” Flanery added. “We think by simplifying this series with a point system, making it more cohesive and introducing the ‘Kentucky Derby Championship Series’ in the 10 weeks that precede the race can spark fan interest and engage the casual fan earlier. If there’s compelling drama and people have a better understanding of what it takes to get into the Derby, we think there’s a good chance they’ll become more interested in our sport.”

“We’ve left room for growth and innovation,” Flanery continued. “I can envision this as a 40-race series down the road. We plan to work with the racetracks that are part of the ‘Road to the Kentucky Derby’ to promote the series and help build business on days when their races take place. We see this new point-based series as something the serious handicapper and the casual sports fan can wrap their arms around--a clear, cohesive and understandable path to the Derby and one that will be fun to follow. It’s a powerful marketing initiative that has the ability to get thousands of new fans to pay attention to our sport in advance of the Triple Crown. It will take time, but we want to be proactive and do something.”

The Top 20 point earners will earn a spot in the starting gate for the Derby; an additional four horses can enter as also eligible. The Oaks is limited to 14 starters. If two or more horses have the same number of points, the tiebreaker to enter in either event will be earnings in non-restricted stakes.

Aidan O'Brien also left in was the Queen Anne-bound **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), while Sir Michael Stoute is likely to saddle The Queen's **Carlton House (GB)** (Street Cry {Ire}) who warmed up for this test with a win in Sandown's G3 Brigadier Gerard S. May 31. **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) could renew rivalry with So You Think, who he beat in the G1 Champion S. at this venue in October after trainer Corine Barande-Barbe hinted that she is leaning towards this contest over next Sunday's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. "I've confirmed his entry this morning," she told *PA Sport*. "We worked him today and he went very well. I'll decide over the next few days where he runs. It will probably be the weekend before a confirmed decision is made. For him, the very wet weather in England is very good, he doesn't mind the mud at all, so that is not a worry. In fact, if we look at the forecast and it says it will be sunny in France on Monday, we may prefer Ascot." Other interesting entries include the unbeaten Saeed bin Suroor-trained 4-year-old **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) and Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey's Feb. 11 GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. third **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy). Conditions at the Berkshire track have improved to good-to-soft on the straight course and good-to-soft, soft in places on the round, but further heavy rain was expected last night.

Hoof It (GB) (Monsieur Bond {Ire}) has been forced out of a meeting with **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) in Saturday's G1 Diamond Jubilee S., connections revealed yesterday. Trainer Mick Easterby is now looking at the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket July 12 with last year's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup third. "Unfortunately, Hoof It won't be running at Ascot," he told the *Racing Post*. "He is fine in himself, but he looks a little dull in his coat and he isn't scoping very well. Looking back, he might have had a slight infection when he ran [fifth in the May 16 G2 Duke of York S.] at York. All being well, we are hopeful he'll be able to take on Black Caviar in the July Cup."

Alanza rose to prominence when winning the G3 Sceptre S. over this trip at Doncaster in September, but came unstuck at the top level when subsequently sixth in the G1 Sun Chariot S. over a mile at Newmarket just 16 days later. Returning to be third to Emulous (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. at The Curragh May 26, the homebred defied a penalty here to add to her tally. Settled in fourth early while traveling strongly, the chestnut cut down the long-time leader Marvada with a furlong remaining and dug in to ward off that rival's rally in the run to the line. "She was dossing in front and she wants firmer ground than this," trainer John Oxx commented. "We'll try her in the G1 Falmouth S. [at Newmarket July 13] and give her another shot at a mile."

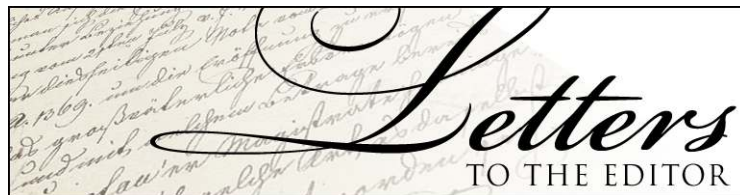

IFHA SUPPORTS KENTUCKY LASIX BAN

One day following the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's decision to phase out the use of raceday Lasix in all graded and listed races for 2-year-olds beginning in 2014, the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities pledged its support to the movement. "I am extremely glad to learn that the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has made the right decision to ban Lasix and I am convinced that this decision will surely be a historical milestone for all racing sectors in the U.S.," IFHA Chairman Louis Romanet commented.

Romanet continued, "IFHA has been taking a strong position in favor of a 'No Medication Policy for Racing' and this policy was again unanimously endorsed recently at the Executive Council convened on Apr. 2 in Paris. The 'No Medication Policy for Racing' is important from many aspects, especially from perspectives of safety of jockeys and horses, the quality of the breed and perception of the public. I am sure that our international racing community will also strongly support this bold step forward and IFHA will pledge to give its full support to further development of this policy into other racing jurisdictions in the US." The Hong Kong Jockey Club, a member of IFHA, also applauded the decision. "This is a progressive and internationally welcomed move by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission and one which the Hong Kong Jockey Club fully supports and applauds," said Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, Chief Executive Officer of the HKJC and Vice Chairman of the IFHA. "Kentucky is the heartbeat of the American breeding industry and home to the Kentucky Derby. It is, therefore, fitting that the Bluegrass State has broken ranks and pushed through this groundbreaking measure. I hope that this is the first step towards full global harmonization on the issue of raceday medication."



In Bill Oppenheim's column (*Near Miss*, 6/13/12), he raises a fundamental issue that for far too long has been ignored by the Thoroughbred breeding industry.


Since the time when the Sport of Kings was literally, the sport that kings participated in, Thoroughbred breeding has been a non-random event, based on the belief that there is something to gain from the selection of mates that could not be obtained by random selection of mares and stallions. Seeking an improvement in the process of selection and breeding in Thoroughbreds is founded on the belief that racing performance is inherited.

Heritability is a measure of the degree (0 to 100%) to which offspring resemble their parents for a specific trait, which broadly in our case is racing performance. Despite the intensity of selection carried out in the Thoroughbred, race times have not improved any further for at least the past 60 years (Hamori and Halasz, 1959; Cunningham, 1975). However, research has shown that many important traits in the horse are moderate to highly heritable (i.e. can be passed on from parents to offspring) indicating that genetic progress from selection is possible if the methods of selection themselves are based on sound principles of inheritance.

My experience has been that in European countries, breeders and their agents place very little importance on the direct speed achievements like speed figures when selecting for breeding, rather their performance relative to their peers of the year and other generations before them with the use of Timeform figures. It seems their belief in subjective measures such as Timeform is well placed as Timeform has a relatively high known heritability of race performance at 35% (Cunningham, 2002). Thank you Phil Bull.

Somewhat conversely, North American breeders use two methods that are linked to that which is known to have low heritability for selection. Earnings, which statistics like the AEI are based on, are a very poor measure of racing performance as they have low heritability (< 10%) and are not optimally distributed in that a horse running seventh in a Grade I gets no prize money while a horse running third in a claimer at Finger Lakes does even though the horse running seventh is most likely a significantly better horse.

More importantly race time has also been used as a measure of performance in Thoroughbred racehorses, but the heritability of race time has been reported as low as 9% to 16%, depending on the distance of the race (Moritsu et al., 1994, Oki et al 1995). This leads us to the crux of the problem, in the U.S in particular, that being the erroneous use of race time and race time-based handicapping figures for selection of both breeding stock and matings. Noting above that race times as a whole are generally a lowly heritable measure, and with a caveat that the heritability of any time-based speed figure is not known (itself a problem!), the use of a handicapping figure derived from race times such as Beyer numbers for breeding selection does not appear to be the most suitable method of genetic selection and could well partially explain why improvement in the North American Thoroughbred has not been made and to a certain extent why European breeders, relying on the heritable Timeform figure, have continued to breed elite racehorses despite their breeding stock being significantly depleted at times of economic downturn.

As breeders, we keep hearing year after year how each crop is getting slower in terms of the feature races such as the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont being won with lower and lower speed figures, yet we don't think for a second that selecting our stallions and mares on speed figure numbers looks to be the cause! At its core it must be understood by breeders that the fact that a stallion ran a "1 on the sheets" or a "124 Beyer" should mean nothing to them when judging him as a stallion, or a mare as a potential broodmare for that matter, as the heritability of this figure is unknown but because it is based on time, most likely to be very low. Breeders certainly aren't getting what they think they are paying for when they select a stallion or mare based on a speed figure. This leads us to what animal geneticist Dr. Bertrand Langlois stated so clearly, "Why should one pay more for this or that pedigree or high performing sire if the performance itself is not heritable?"

Despite the fact that breeding and racing of Thoroughbred horses has been a well-organized industry for well over a century now, it is a poor reflection on the industry at large that it has not yet come to an understanding of the best measure of racing performance or ability and the degree of inheritance of this racing ability. We use figures for selection that are built for handicapping, not breeding and because of this we are actually selecting on a measure with low heritability and act surprised when the breed doesn't get an faster or sounder! Breeders worldwide are effectively trying to sculpt a masterpiece by using a chainsaw, all the time not even knowing what a masterpiece actually looks like.

Creating a universal breeding value/figure as opposed to using a handicapping figure for selection is not a difficult task, nor is it expensive and it should be very easy to disseminate to breeders worldwide. We have the data (we actually have one of the most data-rich breeds in the world, why we don't use this data more constructively is a mystery) and the methods have been thoroughly proven in other livestock and plant industries to great effect. Much, much smaller breeds such as The Danish Warmblood, Irish Sport Horse, Dutch Warmblood, French Sport Horse, Swedish Warmblood, Holstein, Hanoverian, Icelandic Toelter, German Trotter and Swedish Trotter Associations all use breeding values and have shown significant increase in genetic progress since their creation and implementation.

Thoroughbred registries around the world seem to have a similar mission statement--"dedication to the improvement of Thoroughbred breeding and racing." While something like this will never make a Round Table for discussion or an expensive consultants report, and thus not get the attention it desperately deserves, actually having a scientifically sound framework of genetic merit is the essential starting point for any improvement of the Thoroughbred to happen in the first place.

On the first Saturday in May and indeed each year on Belmont S. day for the "Test of Champions," we can decry as much as we like about how we are not breeding horses to get a route of ground, but only if we actually scientifically measure and disseminate these traits, and that could include not only speed over distances, but also other traits like fertility and soundness, can we actually start to make progress. To get anywhere, you have to know where you are starting from and right now, by using speed figures for selection as a de-facto of a truly heritable measure, breeders have no idea where they are, where they are headed, and are probably doing the opposite of "improving the breed."

"This is the absolute bottom." He continued, "Over the last few days he was eating and drinking just fine, and he seemed to be doing everything right. But earlier [Thursday] we could see that

things were getting a little shaky. He couldn't put any weight on the injured leg, so he was relying on his other legs to carry his body, and that is what brought on the laminitis. And once the signs of laminitis are present, the only option is to do the right thing for the horse, so he doesn't have to suffer. This horse gave us so much, we had to do what was right for him." Giant Ryan, a \$27,000 OBSJUN purchase, went on a five-race winning streak in 2011, which also included Calder's GII Smile Sprint H. and the \$75,000 Ponche H. Bred in New York by Thomas/Lakin, Giant Ryan posted a record of 17-8-1-1 and earnings of \$686,841.

PRESIOUS PASSION RETIRED

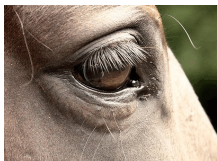
