## FRANKELY, HE'S A CERTAINTY

It is a measure of his total dominance at a mile that **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) is set to go to post for today's G1 Queen Anne S. at even shorter odds than the 1-5 return on Ardross (Ire) when he won his second Gold Cup in 1982. Like that great stayer, Khalid Abdullah's most accomplished performer is under the care of Newmarket's legendary Sir Henry Cecil and few would argue that he is not in the very best hands as a result.

Nurtured through a reportedly difficult adolescent spell, Juddmonte's racing deity is coming of age by the day and his latest--and 10th consecutive--victory in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. a month ago served as an instant justification for the decision to keep him around in 2012. "He is growing up a lot and is switching off very well now--he is better and stronger this year," his trainer commented. "He used to pull a lot and the question mark over him early on was would he ever be a good horse? He is producing his speed at the right end of the race now." Of today's challenge, Cecil added, "He's in good order and there are no excuses. He has a great following and you don't want to let anyone down. I hope to continue where we left off and as long as he can win nicely, that would be fantastic. He has important engagements as the season goes on, so he doesn't have to be ridden out to win by more than he did last time. It doesn't matter whether it's two lengths or 10 lengths." **Cont. p3**

## BREATHTAKING

Just over half an hour after what is expected to be the Frankel show, another Juddmonte luminary sill step up to the plate in the G1 King's Stand S. in **Bated Breath (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). After three narrow misses at this level last term, the 5-year-old suggested he was ready to put that right when making an impressive winning return in the May 26 G2 Temple S. at Haydock. Smashing the track record in the process, he demonstrated his preference for a fast surface and connections hope that the ground will have dried out enough for him ahead of his test. "I imagine by tomorrow afternoon it will probably be good, so he is an intended runner," trainer Roger Charlton said. "He showed lots of speed at Haydock and he's got all the assets to be a stallion--a great pedigree, a great temperament good conformation." **Cont. p4**

## O'BRIEN HAS THE POWER

Michael Tabor's colorbearer **Power (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) bids to provide trainer Aidan O'Brien with a seventh victory in today's G1 St James's Palace S., and the **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** heads a team of two from Ballydoyle in an open renewal of the one-mile test. Last month's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner, who had previously failed to handle Newmarket's equivalent, already boasts track experience having garnered the G2 Coventry S. over the straight six furlongs on this day last year. He is joined by stablemate **Wrote (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who was a close seventh in the Curragh Classic last time. "Power ran a blinder at the Curragh and we're hoping for a good run," commented rider Joseph O'Brien. "The [easy] ground won't be ideal, but there's nothing we can do about it." **Cont. p5**

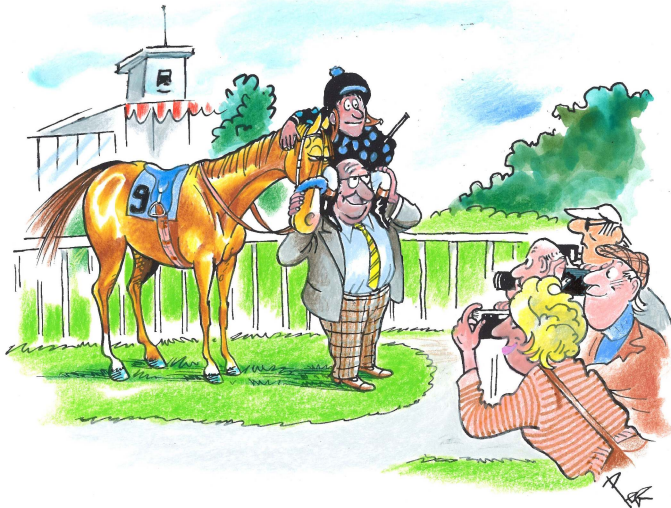

**Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) has been up against Frankel four times to no avail and it is hard to imagine a turnaround without misfortune befalling the favorite, with connections offering no excuses for his latest reversal in the Lockinge. Qatar Racing's **Strong Suit** (Rahy) at least has on his side that he has been here twice and won on both occasions, in the G2 Coventry S. at two and in last year's G3 Jersey S. Other wins in the G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood in July and G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket in October came over seven furlongs and he is yet to win at this trip. "Strong Suit is only rated two pounds behind Excelebration, but our fellow is already a dual Royal Ascot winner and he is twice the price," trainer Richard Hannon commented. "[Jockey Richard Hughes] reckoned that his last bit of work up at Everleigh was the best he has ever done and obviously, the more the ground dries out, the better our chance. Realistically, we are all chasing second spot behind Frankel, but we won't be thinking that way. We will be going out to win, though he is the only one in the race without a race this season so whatever he does here he should improve on when the summer ground eventually arrives." Godolphin's record in this race is second to none, with a record seven renewals falling their way since 1996, but it would take a leap of the imagination to see the ex-Australian **Helmet (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) better that tally. Last year's G1 Caulfield Guineas winner was a disappointing 12th in the G2 UAE Derby over an extended nine furlongs on Tapeta at Meydan last time Mar. 31 and trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni is being realistic. "Helmet is in good form and is doing everything right," he said. "This looks to be a tough introduction for Helmet. I will be very happy if he makes the frame. I hope that the surface will be fine for him and the return to a mile should suit him."

This race has attracted its usual international representation and trainer Derek Cruz is hoping that the recent rain does not dampen the prospects of Johnny Wong Chun Nam's **Joy and Fun (NZ)** (Cullen {Aus}).

The Feb. 5 G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize winner was third behind **Ortensia (Aus)** (Testa Rossa {Aus}) and **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint over this trip at Meydan Mar. 31. "My horse likes a firm track or good-to-firm, but I think he will handle ground that is yielding or just a bit on the soft side," Cruz said. "He seems to be striding out well in his work and has acclimated well to Europe." Ortensia's trainer Paul Messara is one of many keen to avoid Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) and he is hoping that will pay dividends as the mare bids to become the fifth Australian winner since the ground-breaking Choisir (Aus) in 2003. "She traveled brilliantly from Dubai and is in top order," he said. "She was the best she had been before Dubai and I feel she is coming into this race in the same sort of form. The ground is a concern-- she has mixed form on rain-affected tracks and is better on top-of-the-ground. She has a devastating turn of foot on a quick surface." Ko Kam Piu's **Little Bridge (NZ)** (Faltaat) was sixth behind Joy and Fun in the Chairman's Prize, but comes here on the back of a brace of later wins including the Apr. 29 G2 Sprint Cup on a yielding surface at Sha Tin. Trainer Danny Shum said, "It's very hard to compare the ground here with Hong Kong, where the track is usually good-to-firm. When he came sixth to Joy and Fun, I made a mistake because I put blinkers on him and he didn't like them. But after that he has run well without blinkers."

Francois Rohaut trainee **Lucayan (Fr)** (Turtle Bowl {Ire}) also represents Classic-winning form, having annexed last month's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp, and he will try to emulate the 2005 achievement of Shamardal, who was the last to win both contests. He was supplemented for this at a cost of £25,000 and the forecast good-to-soft going does not concern Rohaut, who told *Racing Post*, "Like his father he doesn't want it really heavy, but soft ground won't bother him. He is very well, he has travelled well and I think he will run well." Fellow French raider **Dragon Pulse (Ire)** (Kyllachy {GB}) will have to bounce back from running eighth at the Bois de Boulogne track, and is joined by Mikel Delzangles stablemate **Hermival (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who hit the board in the G1 2000 Guineas, but slipped to sixth as Power gained revenge at The Curragh.

Other Irish Guineas contestants to return here include runner-up **Foxtrot Romeo (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and fifth-placed **Born to Sea (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who improved on a 12th-place finish at Newmarket. "Foxtrot Romeo ran a cracker in Ireland and he seems to have stepped up from that on his homework," said trainer Bryan Smart. "We'll have to see how he backs up, but I couldn't be more pleased with him." It was always going to be an impossible task for Born to Sea to match the achievements of half-brother Sea the Stars, but connections are confident the homebred bay, who will once again race in a hood, has the class to feature at the highest level. "Born to Sea ran a bit keen at Newmarket, but he settled better last time," said rider Johnny Murtagh, who renews his association with the **"TDN Rising Star"** . "He's a horse I've always liked and I think he can step up again. We view him as a Group 1 horse and I think Ascot could be the ideal track for him. [Jockey] Pat [Smullen] had to drop him in [at The Curragh] and he finished off really well. The hood really helps him and the fizz has gone out of him. He has great energy and, after two races, he'll be much more relaxed."

**Gabrial (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) has taken an unorthodox route here, winning last month's Haydock Silver Bowl H., but owner Dr Marwan Koukash has enough faith in the Richard Fahey trainee to have stumped up a £25,000 supplementary fee. "Obviously it's a big step up, but he won well the last time and he has worked well since," commented assistant trainer Robin O'Ryan. "We do like him so we'll have to see how he gets on. It's an open race and I wouldn't be surprised if he ran well. He's on an upward curve and let's hope he keeps on improving."

## AT THE READY FOR AN EARLY DAWN

**Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) made the perfect start for his freshman sire (by Galileo {Ire}) when winning on the opening day of Ireland's turf season at The Curragh in March, and he will break new ground for the Dalham Hall Stud resident if prevailing in a competitive renewal of the G2 Coventry S. over Ascot's straight six panels today. Stepping up from that initial success, he earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status with an impressive score in a Naas conditions heat last month, and registered a hat trick back there when posting a first stakes victory in the June 4 Listed Rochestown S. last time. The chestnut lines up here instead of waiting for the Listed Chesham S. on the meet's final day.

Aidan O'Brien and Richard Hannon have won four out of the last five renewals of this event between them, scoring twice each, and the champion trainers have six against the field this time. O'Brien's Ballydoyle operation, which will bid for a record-equaling seventh victory, sends out **Cristoforo Colombo** (Henrythenavigator), whose freshman sire (by Kingmambo) won this in 2007. He impressed when taking out a May 20 Navan maiden in the Susan Magnier silks, and will be ridden by Joseph O'Brien. "Cristoforo Colombo seems a nice horse," his rider commented. "It is obviously a big step up from winning a maiden to the Coventry, but he seems to have done things right at home." Joining him is the Joe Allen colorbearer **Lines of Battle** (War Front), who earned a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ badge when registering a head success from Dawn Approach's stablemate **Leitir Mor (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who re-opposes here, in a competitive maiden at the Curragh May 27, and gets the assistance of Ryan Moore this time.

Hannon's quartet is spearheaded by **Sir Prancealot (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}), who bids to give the Wiltshire conditioner a third win in four years, and who added to an easy maiden score at Bath with a decisive win from **Top Boy (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in last month's Listed National S. at Sandown. The trainer's association with Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum has reaped instant dividends, and stablemate **The Taj** (Street Cry {Ire}) comes here off an eye-catching maiden win at Doncaster in his only out 11 days ago. Retained rider Paul Hanagan will continue in the plate. **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) debuted on the same day as The Taj, and opened up with a wide-margin success traversing Goodwood's undulations. Haydock maiden winner **Master of War (GB)** (Compton Place {GB}) completes the team. "This has been a lucky race for us and, while we have no Canford Cliffs this year, we run four very good horses," revealed Hannon. "It was a toss of coin as to whether we ran Sir Prancealot here or waited for the [G2] Norfolk [S. on Thursday], but [owner] Andrew [Tinkler] was keen to go on the first day and that is fine by me.

He has unbelievable speed, but he is by Tamayuz so we know that he is not just a whizz-bang sprinter. While we don't know yet what effect the draw will have, two off the stands rail is not a bad place to be and will hopefully enable [jockey] Richard [Hughes] to get a good early position. The others are all making a giant leap from winning their maidens, but we like all three. The Taj did a brilliant piece of work with Olympic Glory a few days before both made their debuts, so it was no surprise when they both won. I know the form of The Taj's Doncaster race has taken a few knocks, but he will have learned a lot from that and Paul Hanagan was very impressed. Olympic Glory won many over when winning at Goodwood and, while we did think about waiting a bit longer with him, [owner] Julie [Wood] loves to have runners here. He is a big, smashing Choisir colt who deserves his place in the field. Master of War won well at Haydock and we were thinking of taking him to Chepstow or Bath last week, but he then did an impressive bit of work and we immediately abandoned those plans and upgraded him to the Ascot team."

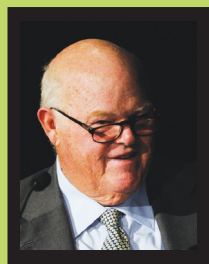

**Take a Walk on the Soft Side (of Good)...**

Dry weather, which is forecast to continue until Thursday, has enabled the track condition for the opening day to stabilize at good-to-soft, but a policy of watering should not be required at this year's Royal Ascot meet, according to Clerk of the Course Chris Stickels. "We had a drying weekend until Sunday night when, overnight and Monday morning, we had six millimeters of rain. It has made the going good-to-soft now, and I think it will just be on the easy side. It is going to dry a little bit between now and then--it is just on the easy side on the straight course and a bit easier on the round. We are forecast drier conditions before some rain again Thursday. The course has taken the rain exceptionally well, and it does dry and drain quite quickly, but we won't need to add any water. I think it's going to be completely natural this year. Thursday is quite tricky as there is a low [pressure front] threatening to push in from the Atlantic towards the end of the week. It is looking more threatening, but the timing and amount of rain it is likely to deliver is tricky. The estimate at the moment is between four and seven millimeters during the day on Thursday."

## Caviar Fails to Frighten Off Jubilee Rivals...

It appears the lure of Royal Ascot has outweighed the fear of taking on Australia's Queen of Speed, **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}), as 21 contenders remain engaged in Saturday's G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot after yesterday's confirmation and supplementary stage. The unbeaten wondermare has continued with light exercise as she builds up to her date with destiny, and the arrival of big-race partner Luke Nolen has seen the final pieces of the jigsaw fall into place. "Black Caviar looks great and has travelled over well," the rider told *Racing Post*. "She probably had a lot less to drink on the plane than I did. I know [trainer] Peter [Moody] is very happy with her. I rode her in her last gallop before she left and she was in very good nick. I'm not worried too much about the undulations [of Ascot] as she travels very well and takes a big stride. She goes great on straight tracks at home and she is the highest-rated in the race." Moody added, "Black Caviar is the fittest I've ever had her. I made sure she was pretty straight when she got on the plane and she hasn't needed to work since. Hopefully we can get her on the [Newmarket] Limekilns [gallops] Tuesday morning and give her a gallop over three furlongs or something, but nothing major."

Her task will be no straightforward affair as a host of top speedsters also stood their ground for the six-furlong dash. The James Fanshawe trainee may yet be joined by last month's G2 Temple S. victor **Bated Breath (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), whose participation in today's G1 King's Stand S. remains dependent on suitable track conditions. International spice is enhanced by the presence of last term's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest heroine **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {GB}), who was imperious when taking out Longchamp's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal on seasonal return earlier this month; and the Fawzi Nass-trained raider from Bahrain, **Krypton Factor (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}), who plundered the G1 Golden Shaheen on Meydan's World Cup card, but was undone when encountering unsuitably softened going when fifth in Kranji's G1 International Sprint last month.

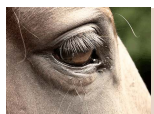

To use a rather non-PC-sounding idiom, there's more than one way to skin a cat. This is perfectly highlighted by the histories of two of today's outstandingly successful breeding operations. The two I have in mind are those developed by Prince Khalid Abdulla and HH The Aga Khan, who between them have bred five of the last 12 Arc winners.

Although these two breeders are very similar in that they rarely acquire new bloodlines at auction, their policies differ considerably. Whereas the Prince derives the greatest satisfaction from developing the families descending from mares purchased early in Juddmonte's history, such as Frankel's third dam Rockfest, the Aga Khan believes it is beneficial to occasionally introduce new families.

The latest infusion of new blood into the Aga Khan's broodmare band came in March 2005, when he completed the purchase of the bloodstock empire built by the late Jean-Luc Lagardere. Within months the Aga had started to reap rich dividends from his sizeable investment, with Vadawina, Valixir and Carlotamix all becoming Group 1 winners.

The Aga's purchase of the Lagardere bloodstock was further vindicated on that remarkable Arc weekend in 2009, when his colors were carried to victory to an astonishing total of seven group races, including five at Group 1 level. No fewer than four of the seven were produced by mares or fillies which were part of the Lagardere package, these winners being Varenar (G1 Prix de la Foret), Manighar (G2 Prix de Chaudenay), Siyouni (G1 Prix Jean-Luc lagardere) and Rosanara (G1 Prix Marcel Boussac). It therefore came as no surprise that Lagardere mares were responsible for two of the Aga's three runners in the Prix de Diane--or that both these broodmares were daughters of Linamix, the remarkable stallion who justified all the opportunities that Lagardere gave him.

Sagawara had already become a Group 1 winner, in the Prix Saint-Alary, but much less was known about Valyra, who was making her stakes debut after winning both her starts. We now know that Valyra is a highly talented filly, who may one day prove herself worthy of mention in the same breath as the imperious Zarkava, who ranks alongside Shemaka, Vereva, Zainta, Daryaba and Sarafina as one of the Aga's six previous Diane heroines.

In becoming the first to beat the excellent Beauty Parlour, Valyra also provided a valuable reminder that her sire, Azamour, deserves wider support than he has sometimes received. For example Valyra, together with the group-placed Mandistana, is one of only 32 members of Azamour's 2009 crop and he has only 43 2-year-olds this year.

Fortunately, Azamour's first crop did well, with four of its 101 members becoming group/graded winners. Their achievements restored breeders' faith in a horse who had initially earned their respect with a very solid racing record. The versatile son of Night Shift had followed up an unbeaten juvenile career with Group 1 victories over a mile (St James's Palace S.), a mile and a quarter (Irish Champion S. and Prince of Wales's S.) and a mile and a half (King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S.).

Azamour's second crop, born in 2008, has maintained his momentum. Among this crop's 52 foals were another four group winners, including the Group 2 winner Shankardeh, the Classic-placed Native Khan and this year's Group 3 winner Columbian. Altogether this crop has produced eight stakes winners, with another two being placed at group level, which amounts to a considerable achievement.

The renewed faith in Azamour resulted in a book of 132 mares in 2010 and more than 150 in 2011, so the Gilltown Stud stallion will again have numbers on his side from next year. A remarkable aspect of Azamour's record is that he has only four foals of racing age out of Linamix mares.

In addition to Valyra they include the Group 3 winner Columbian and the group-placed Mandistana. Two of the three have no inbreeding in their first five generations and Valyra's only inbreeding is a fairly routine 3x5 to Northern Dancer. I suspect this combination owes its success partly to their complementary conformation. At 16.2 hands, Azamour is a big, powerful individual capable of putting some strength into Linamix's more refined daughters. Linamix's story was an unusual one. When he retired to his breeder's stud in France he labored under the handicap of being the only high-class winner sired by Mendez during his short innings in France. Mendez was dispatched to Japan, as was Mendez's sire Bellypha, after he failed to maintain the high quality he achieved with his first few crops. Consequently Linamix wasn't popular with breeders and the onus was therefore on Lagardere to help him prove his worth. Lagardere did so by buying quite a few mares at the sales, and many of them enjoyed tremendous success with Linamix. The stallion's legacy consists of 13 winners at Group 1 level, 12 at Group 2 and 17 at Group 3, with the majority of them bred by Lagardere. His total of more than 70 stakes winners represented more than 8% of his output. Linamix's broodmare daughters now have nine Group 1 winners to their credit in the Northern Hemisphere, with Valyra following Clodovil (Poule d'Essai des Poulains), Natagora (1,000 Guineas) and Blue Bunting (1,000 Guineas and Irish Oaks) as their fourth Classic winner. Another of their Group 1 winners, Montmatre, was an impressive winner of the Grand Prix de Paris, a race considered by many to be a more accurate equivalent to the Derby than the Prix du Jockey-Club. Another Linamix mare is the dam of the 2-year-old Be Be King, winner of a Group 1 in Brazil earlier this month.

Valyra's dam Valima was good enough to win the Prix Imprudence and she has made a tremendous start as a broodmare, as Valyra is her third foal and third stakes winner. Watch out for her 2010 Nayef colt, who is in training with Alain de Royer-Dupre. Valyra's Group 2-winning half-sister Valasyra started her broodmare career in 2011 with a visit to the mighty Sea The Stars, who also covered Valima last year. Valima was by no means Linamix's first success story from a family which came into the Lagardere studs with the purchase of Valyra's fourth dam Vadsa, a Halo mare bred by E.P. Taylor. Linamix was mated to Vadsa's daughter Vadlava to produce Vadlamixa, a listed winner who became the dam of Valixir (G1 Prix d'Ispahan and G1 Queen Anne S.) and second dam of Vadawina (G1 Prix Saint-Alary). Linamix also did well with Vadsa's daughter Vadsa Honor, with their son Vahorimix going on to win the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois (both on disqualifications). This family is arguably best known, though, for Val Royal. This half-brother to Valyra's second dam Vadlawysa won the Breeders' Cup Mile before siring the dual 2,000 Guineas winner Cockney Rebel.

**OBS JUNE BEGINS TWO-DAY STAND** The OBS June Sale of Two-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age begins the first of two sessions this morning in Ocala. A total of 689 juveniles and 32 older horses have been cataloged, with hips 1-340 on offer today and hips 341-723 going through tomorrow. Both sessions begin at 10:30 a.m. Last year's June Sale was co-topped by a pair of \$300,000 2-year-olds, a Stormy Atlantic--Puff the Magic colt who went to trainer Bob Baffert and a Bernstein--Within colt who

At four, Soaring Empire won the Gill Hal's Hope S. and the Majestic Light S. and finished runner-up in Gill Gulfstream Park Sprint Championship S. and the Gill Gulfstream Park H. He retired with five wins and five placings from 16 starts and earnings of \$386,393.

"He showed so much versatility--running against the best and winning from 5 1/2 furlongs to 1 1/16 miles," said co-owner Clinton Glasscock. "He's a very exciting prospect, being by leading sire Empire Maker, who has been sold to Japan and is no longer available to American breeders yet continues to exert strong influence over our racing, with offspring such as champion Royal Delta and dual Classic runner-up Bodemeister."
