Settled in third early by a confident Joseph O'Brien, the dark bay was joined on the front end by Carlton House passing the quarter pole, but soon shook off The Queen's colt to record an authoritative success. ## JOVIALITY ABOUNDS

Princess Haya of Jordan's **Joviality (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) stepped up from her previous form to record a neck success over **Chachamaidee (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in a pulsating finish to the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot yesterday. Sent off at 11-1 on the back of a second in the June 1 G3 Princess Elizabeth S. over nine furlongs at Epsom, the bay was sent to the front with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and, despite being headed for a stride by the eventual runner-up, refused to buckle and re-asserted in the final 150 yards. "The mile is probably a little short for her, but she's got a lot of tenacity," trainer John Gosden said. "I really respect Henry's filly, who is very fast, but I thought if we can be in the right place and she has to come to us, we might outstay her. It was a thrilling performance." **Cont. p5**

## HERE, KITTY

With black-type already in the bag prior to Wednesday's G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot, Andrew Black's homebred **Ceiling Kitty (GB)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) put her experience of battle to maximum use to win despite an errant passage. Racing among the far-side group under Richard Kingscote, the May 18 Listed Marygate Fillies' S. winner was in front of that pack with a quarter mile remaining. Drifting left from there, the 20-1 shot ended up towards the stand's side, but held on to beat **Hoyam (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) by a length and nearly break the track record in the process. "It's great for Andrew Black, who bred her as well," trainer Tom Dascombe said. "Richard Kingscote was pretty confident, as she had experience and is as hard as nails. This is what it's all about." **Cont. p6**

## Royal Ascot: Pedigree Notes...

G1 Prince of Wales's S. hero **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), a NZ\$110,000 yearling purchase by DGR Thoroughbred Services at the 2008 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Sale in Karaka, scaled the heights for trainer Bart Cummings in Australia with a pair of G1 Cox Plate victories before heading to Ballydoyle. His dam Triassic, a daughter of the Nijinsky II stallion Tights, was a Group 2 winner on the track. So You Think's exploits earned her New Zealand's Broodmare of the Year honors, but she was the subject of an ownership dispute in 2011 before ultimately visiting Medaglia d'Oro in Australia.

**Prince of Wales's S. cont.**

For a champion with over £5-million in the bank, So You Think has attracted more than his share of unfair criticism, and the sceptics were out in force after his eclipse by Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) here last year. He silenced some with an impressive defeat of Workforce (GB) (King's Best) in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown just days later, but did

not please all when making hard work of beating Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab) in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September. By the time he had his lowers colored in the vastly contrasting tests of the Arc, the Champion S., the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and Dubai World Cup, he was in danger of becoming something of a forgotten horse on the international scene, but team Ballydoyle had gone to work restoring his former prowess. Buoyed by a smooth European return when annexing the May 27 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh for the second consecutive year, connections came back to Ascot full of belief that his true talent could be unlocked. Unlike last year, when the stable pacemaker missed the break and the early stages proved a mess, this time Robin Hood (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was out fast to set the necessary fractions for his companion. So You Think was placed wide and out of trouble traveling easily behind his rabbit and the Stateside challenger Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy), and was left in pole position as that duo started to retreat at the top of the stretch. Attacked by Carlton House, who had quickened through a gap towards the inner, the favorite produced another surge to settle the result with a furlong remaining, and was stretching away as the Royal runner's stamina ebbed away.

Aidan O'Brien said, "We reviewed everything and we listened at the end--[former trainer] Bart [Cummings] was speaking from the heart, and I was probably overworking the horse here and galloping the speed out of him, instead of letting him be natural. Joseph was of the opinion that he would wait and ride him that way. Before we got him, everyone was of the opinion that he was all speed, but I started off on the wrong leg with him and tried to make him stay a mile and a half. I worked him too long and too often, but we knew we only had a few runs left--today and Sandown--to get him back, and the lads were confident it was going to come. It will be the boys' decision when he goes to stud, but [the July 7 G1 Eclipse S.] Sandown was in our head as a cut-off point. We're just delighted to get him back to where Bart had him, and all I can say is I'm sorry it took me so long to get him back to where everyone in Australia said he was. If he wasn't such a great horse, I'd have made a right mess of him." **Cont. p4**

Joseph O'Brien added, "He relaxed lovely and quickened up very well when Ryan [Moore, on Carlton House] got the split on the inside. Once he could see the other horse on his inside, he was never going to be beaten. I just wanted to get him into a rhythm and let him relax, as he has loads of class and can quicken and, when things work out, he's an exceptional horse."



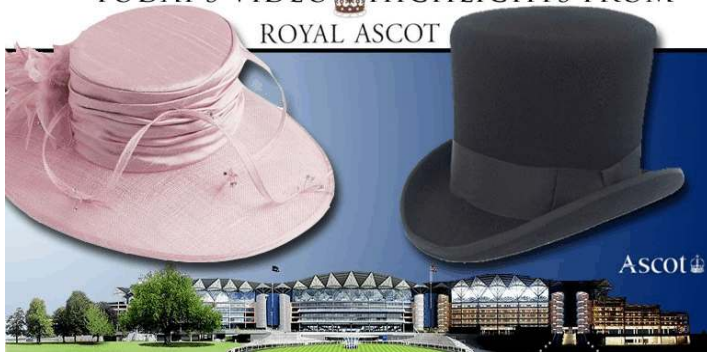

Carlton House's trainer Sir Michael Stoute told *PA Sport*, "He couldn't get enough cover as he was a

bit off the fence, but he was second best, it's as simple as that. Ryan gave him a great ride; he had every chance, but he just found one too good."

Godolphin's **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), who was just a half-length behind on his stakes debut, ran an eye-catching race as he reared in the stalls--he had been injured when doing the same in a conditions race won by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) two years ago--and lost ground before being hampered in his run in the home straight. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented, "We are delighted with him, he had been physically weak, which is why he hasn't had many runs, but he's much stronger this year and, when he won easily at Thirsk, we thought he would be up to running in Group 1 races. He has shown today he is good enough for those races between 10 and 12 furlongs. We might look at the [July 21] G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. for him."

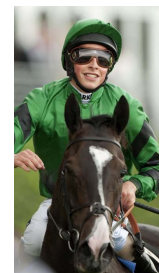

Joviality broke her maiden in the G3 Musidora S. over 10 furlongs at York last May, but was not asked to stretch her stamina beyond its limit in the Oaks, and instead took part in the G1 Coronation S. over this track and trip. Not disgraced when sixth in that contest, she improved to be fourth in a falsely run renewal of the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket's July meeting, and was put on the shelf after a seventh in the G2 Prix de la Nonette over 10 furlongs at Deauville in August. Uncomfortable on Epsom's undulations when runner-up on her belated return behind Clinical (GB) (Motivator {GB}) in the Princess Elizabeth, she entered this competitive renewal with some valid excuses for her prior reversals. Keen early racing towards the fore, she was reined back by William Buick and had four in front to provide a vital lead. Sent up to take control with more than a furlong to race, she was able to draw on her extra reserves of stamina to subdue Chachamaidee, who compromised her chance by missing several lengths at the start. "We had to wait for her to come right in June and she didn't handle Epsom," John Gosden said. "She wants a mile to a mile and a quarter, so there are some nice races for her like the G1 Nassau S. [at Goodwood Aug. 4] and the [Oct. 7] G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp, but that is the elite end."

Ceiling Kitty, introduced in a five-furlong maiden on Kempton's Polytrack Mar. 31, followed an encouraging second there with a disappointing fourth in another maiden on good-to-soft turf at Beverley Apr. 18. Veering left on that occasion, the bay returned to Kempton to open her account despite a troubled trip May 7, and there was no fluke about her subsequent convincing two-length score at 20-1 in York's Marygate S. 11 days later. As she had at Beverley, she hung across the track here, but was firmly in control this time, despite Hoyam's eye-catching late progress. Her owner/breeder Andrew Black, who was the co-founder of Betfair, was thrilled afterwards. "This is my first proper homebred--I claimed the mother for £17,000--and I knew she was good, so I put half of her up on Betfair for a year as part of a competition," he explained. "I guess when I put her up for it, I didn't know she was as good as she was, but I feel quite good about it now. We've had an amazing experience." Her jockey Richard Kingscote added, "Ceiling Kitty can't live with [fourth-placed] Upward Spiral (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}) at home, but she's race-wise and that's what counted today." The runner-up's conditioner Michael Bell told *PA Sport*, "She's a filly with a future and we'll look at the G3 Princess Margaret S. [at Ascot July 28] or the G2 Cherry Hinton S. [at Newmarket July 13]." Connections of Hairy Rocket are also considering the Cherry Hinton.

### SENATE COMMITTEE MOVES TO BLOCK H-2B RULES

The Senate Appropriations Committee recently adopted an amendment offered by Sen. Richard Shelby (R-AL) to the Fiscal Year 2013 Labor, Health and Human Services and Education and Related Agencies appropriations bill. Sen. Shelby's amendment will prevent two new controversial rules for the H-2B visa temporary guest worker program from being implemented for one year. Thoroughbred trainers use the H-2B program when American workers are not available.

A new wage rule was the first of the two new H-2B rules scheduled to go into effect this year. This rule was to start on January 1, 2012 but the Department of Labor (DOL) was forced by Congress to delay this until October 1, 2012. The new wage rule requires employers to pay H-2B workers at a much higher rate than current levels.

A new H-2B program rule was to begin in April 2012 that requires employers to follow several new procedures when utilizing the program. Before this rule took effect, a federal district court judge in Florida issued a nationwide preliminary injunction that prevented the DOL from implementing the rule that would lead to higher costs and increased administrative burdens for employers.

The appropriations legislation including Sen. Shelby's amendment now goes to the floor of the Senate.

"She won her maiden by 18 lengths and it takes a fair filly to do that," said winning conditioner David Wachman. "She's a very smart filly, she's always shown us plenty and was only toying with them today. We were going to run her in the [G1] Irish 1000 Guineas, but she'd had two quick runs, so we decided to come here instead. She has a few Group 1 entries and we'll take our time before deciding where to go next. G1 Prince of Wales's S. hero **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), a NZ\$110,000 yearling purchase by DGR Thoroughbred Services at the 2008 New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Sale in Karaka, scaled the heights for trainer Bart Cummings in Australia with a pair of G1 Cox Plate victories before heading to Ballydoyle. His dam Triassic, a daughter of the Nijinsky II stallion Tights, was a Group 2 winner on the track. So You Think's exploits earned her New Zealand's Broodmare of the Year honors, but she was the subject of an ownership dispute in 2011 before ultimately visiting Medaglia d'Oro in Australia. A High Chaparral colt out of So You Think's half-sister La Souvenir (NZ) (Nuclear Freeze) sold for NZ\$800,000 at this year's NZB Premier Sale. Triassic's yearling full-brother to So You Think was withdrawn from the Inglis Easter Sale in April. *(Click [here](#) for a TDN feature with So You Think's co-breeder Michael Moran).*

G2 Windsor Forest winner **Joviality (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) is a half-sister to this year's G2 Dante S. hero Bonfire (GB) (Manduro {Ger}), who most recently finished sixth in the G1 Investec Derby at Epsom. Joviality's granddam is Miss d'Ouilly (Fr) (Bikala {Ire}), acquired by John Warren Bloodstock for 50,000gns at TATDEC in 2000 from Jean-Luc Lagardere. She was a half-sister to Miss Satamixa (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), who captured the 1995 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois for Lagardere; and had already produced Miss Caerleona (Fr) (Caerleon). The latter was later acquired by Stonerside, became a Grade III winner in the U.S., and later established herself as a broodmare with the likes of graded winners Miss Coronado (Coronado's Quest) and Karen's Caper (War Chant). Joviality's half-brother by Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) was purchased by Demi O'Byrne for 340,000gns as a yearling at TATOCT last year; it was the highest price paid for a member of Duke of Marmalade's first crop. Joviality's dam Night Frolic (GB) (Night Shift) has a yearling Nayef filly.

**Ishvana (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who upended the boys in the G3 Jersey S., was a solid score

for breeder Anne-Marie O'Brien. Her dam Song of the Sea (GB) (Bering {GB}) was purchased by Kieran Murphy on behalf of O'Brien's father Joe Crowley for €23,000 at Goffs November in 2006 while the mare was in foal to Choisir (Aus). The resulting colt didn't make it to the races, and Ishvana failed to sell for €5,000 when offered at Goffs as a yearling. Song of the Sea has a yearling full-brother to the Jersey winner.

### Betting on Black at Royal Ascot...

Most would agree that getting to the winner's enclosure at Royal Ascot is not an easy task, but nobody seemed to have informed the four Betfair employees who hit pay dirt when **Ceiling Kitty (GB)** (Red Clubs {Ire}) crossed the wire one length on top in the G2 Queen Mary S. Wednesday.

Bred by Betfair co-founder Andrew Black, a stake in the then-unnamed filly by Red Clubs was the big prize in a fantasy competition, offered to over 2,000 Betfair employees worldwide. The handicapping contest was centered around the U.K.'s four-day Cheltenham Festival earlier this year, and each day's winner was granted a 12.5% stake in Black's homebred.

"It didn't involve real money, but you had to play as if you were betting real money in a handicapping contest," explained Betfair CEO Stephen Burn. "All the people involved are not really bettors; it's all really for the fun of it."

The overall winner of the contest, Andrew Barnes, was granted the task of naming the filly, who RNA'd for 16,000gns from last fall's Tattersalls October sale. The sole U.S.-based winner of the contest was Heather Ralston, a member of the ad sales department at TVG in Los Angeles. In addition to the other contest winners, Ralston was on hand for yesterday's victory.

"It was just a fun contest for the employees of Betfair, because we do a lot of business on horse racing and it was a way of having staff engaged with the Cheltenham festival, keeping on with what was happening there, and having a bit of fun while they were doing it," Burn added. "[Ralston] is a horse racing fan, but by no means a horse racing pundit, but she picked a 50-1 winner and another that won at 33-1. The result of doing that was giving her a share of Ceiling Kitty."

Black retained a 50% interest in the filly, while each of the four contest winners collect 12.5% of prize money, without the cost of upkeep.

"[Black]'s only just really started with his own stud, he wouldn't have had it for more than five years, so this is all very new to him," offered Burn. "Obviously, it's a dream come true to have a Royal Ascot winner."

Black will retain the filly long term. However, while the filly is competing, the contest winners get to experience the excitement of Thoroughbred ownership.

"They get to enjoy the upside, if there is an upside," said Burn. "In the beginning, the hope was that she might run in a race, and you never know, might win one somewhere. But she has exceeded everyone's expectations, incredibly."

Sent off in the Queen Mary at generous odds of 20-1 by bookmakers, the filly went off at even tastier odds of 28-1 by Betfair.

"She doesn't do a great deal on the training track, so she really hasn't ever been bet seriously when she runs in races, because she is always so much better on the track than she is at home," admitted Burn. "She seems to be getting better every time she runs."

While not always centered around horse racing, Burn indicated Betfair often conducts other contests for its employees throughout the year.

"Funny enough, we're having a contest at the moment for the European Soccer Championships," confirmed Burn. "The prize for that is not a racehorse, but a trip to Las Vegas. We do two to three contests a year, but the one on horse racing is the only one that has a horse as it's big prize."

If a wager could be placed with Betfair on a similar racing contest down the road, odds would be pretty good indeed.--Christina Bossinakis

**MORE GLORY**

Aidan O'Brien has an enviable record with favorites in British Group 1 races, and the portents look strong for the repeat bid of **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in today's G1 Gold Cup. Like former stable companion Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Dr Jim and Fitri Hay and Derrick Smith's 6-year-old is a horse who has shown he can perform on the big stage, despite some indifferent runs elsewhere. His latest effort when successful in the Listed Vintage Crop S. under a penalty at Navan May 20 suggests he was near to concert pitch and he has strong credentials. "There is a lot of confidence behind the horse and Aidan is the genius at preparing a horse for the big occasion," co-owner Dr Jim Hay said. "The folk at Ballydoyle say that he is even better this year. To win another would be a dream and, hopefully, we'll be back again next year. We are aiming to repeat what Yeats did." Last year's runner-up **Opinion Poll (Ire)** (Halling) is back again, but has been deserted by Frankie Dettori in favor of **Colour Vision (Fr)** (Rainbow Quest). Third as a 3-year-old despite a troubled trip behind Fame and Glory in the G3 British Champions Long Distance Cup over two miles here, he showed how much he had moved forward when recording an impressive success in the G3 Sagaro S. staged on Kempton's Polytrack on his seasonal bow May 2. Opinion Poll needs no introduction as the winner of five pattern races, including the G3 Henry II S. at Sandown last time May 31. Frankie has switched due to the ever-drying ground, but there is no guarantee he has made the right decision. "Colour Vision showed a good turn of foot when he won at Kempton Park and he came out of that run in good order," his trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "He had a good blow-out on Sunday, and I am looking forward to seeing how he gets on, although he wouldn't want the ground to be soft." Mahmood Al Zarooni added of Opinion Poll, "He looks better than ever. He ran two very good races at Ascot last season and returns there in very good form." Michael O'Flynn's **Saddler's Rock (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) is an intriguing contender, but was taking advantage of a sizeable weight-for-age swing in his favor when beating Opinion Poll in the G2 Doncaster Cup in September. His return second under a penalty in the Listed Saval Beg S. at Leopardstown June 8 set him up for this tilt, and jockey Johnny Murtagh is hopeful. "He'll improve for that run, as he's a bit lazy at home and didn't have a straightforward preparation for it," Murtagh commented. "He's come out of the race well and John Oxx is very happy with him. I don't think there will ever be another Yeats, but Fame and Glory is a very classy horse, even though 2 1/2 miles stretches him to the limit. He might not be a thorough stayer like Yeats and it's more his class that gets him through. He's the one to beat." **Cont. p12**

**BATED BREATH JUBILEE DOUBT**

Factors have conspired to deprive **Bated Breath (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) of optimum track conditions at Royal Ascot, with pre-meeting rainfall not drying out quickly enough to aid his cause in Tuesday's G1 King's Stand S., in which he ran second. Connections' frustrations

must have heightened as day two's winning times suggested it had in the wake of favorable weather. With further rainfall predicted in advance of Ladies' Day [Thursday], trainer Roger Charlton seems unlikely to commit to running in Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. albeit with drying conditions once again set to follow. "Although it was frustrating to finish second in yet another Group 1 race, he did run another incredibly good race," commented Charlton. "[Jockey] James [Doyle] always had him in

the right position and with a furlong to run he had every chance, but Little Bridge was always traveling as well, and we were unable to peg him back in the closing stages. The ground was changed to good after the race, but the time was still on the slow side, compared to previous King's Stands run on good ground. James was of the opinion that quicker ground would have seen him produce a better turn of foot. Bated Breath's form has been a model of consistency and confirmed his form yet again with Sole Power, as well as with the winner who had finished 1 1/4 lengths in front of us in Hong Kong in December. At this stage, it is doubtful that he will reappear in the Diamond Jubilee at the weekend, unless something should happen to Black Caviar and Ascot missed the forecast rain."

Varian is no stranger to the softly-softly method, having been under the wing of the late Michael Jarvis when Silkwood (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) took the 2007 edition off three low-key starts. "Pink Damsel has worked nicely all year and, ideally, I'd have liked to have run her once or twice more than I have done," the Kremlin House conditioner explained. "I had to wait three weeks longer than I wanted to get a first run into her because I was reluctant to race her on heavy ground. We are rather jumping in at the deep end, as she's only a maiden winner. Her official rating is just 86, so she's got a huge amount to make up on some of her principals. With there being an extra week between Epsom and [Royal] Ascot this year, some of those Oaks fillies are turning up, and I think it looks an above-average renewal. She is a filly I like very much, she has a lovely attitude and is very relaxed. She has done plenty of work, and works nicely, so I'm hopeful that she'll acquit herself very well at this level."

The June 1 Epsom Oaks provides six exhibits for scrutiny with the second, third and fourth among those making their return. **Shirocco Star (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}) fared best with her neck second to Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), despite becoming agitated beforehand, and Hughie Morrison is wishing a repeat is not on the cards during the preliminaries here. "Hopefully, she doesn't boil over and if we can keep the lid on her I think she'll run her race," Morrison said. "If so, she won't be far away and I'm not worried about the ground. It's there to be proven, but I'll be disappointed if she can't handle some ground."

"It may look a stiff ask on paper, with others proven in Group 1 races, but her form is solid and as good as any of them, and we are hoping for a very big run," offered trainer Michael Bell. "As she's so lightly raced, I wouldn't be sure what ground she prefers, but I doubt anyone can use it as an excuse at the moment."

**FROM THE BAHAMAS TO BERKSHIRE, GREEN MEANS GO!**

Mick Channon had not bagged a Classic until this year, and has yet to win the G2 Norfolk S., but he is represented a live contender, **Cay Verde (GB)** (Bahamian Bounty {GB}), to break that hoodoo in a hot renewal of the five-furlong dash. Having easily disposed of Tuesday's Listed Windsor Castle S. victor Hototo (GB) (Sleeping Indian {GB}) in a course-and-distance maiden May 12, he upped his game two weeks later to comfortably register a first black-type score in the Listed Marble Hill S., besting Windsor Castle third Dylanbaru (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) at The Curragh last time. That win came in the black-and-white colors of Box41, but he will carry Qatar Racing Ltd's silks here, as will the David Barron trainee **Ahern (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}), who steps up from a June 2 win at Musselburgh, and whose sire won this contest in 2006.

Richard Hannon will join the list of winningest trainers on four if either **Annunciation (GB)** (Proclamation {GB}) or **Mister Marc (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) prevails. Annunciation, the choice of stable number one Richard Hughes, ran second to Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in a May 19 Doncaster maiden before shedding his winless tag in explosive style, annexing a three-runner Windsor affair by six lengths nine days later. Mister Marc debuted with a May 26 Goodwood maiden win, and forced Tuesday's G2 Coventry S. hero Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) to work for a 2 3/4-length score when second in the June 4 Listed Rochestown S. at Naas last time.

Aidan O'Brien's sole success was provided by Johannesburg in 2001, and he relies on a lone representative this time. **Gale Force Ten (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who was the £280,000 sale topper at last year's Doncaster Premier Yearlings, failed to make a dent when a May 18 debut third at Dundalk, but rebounded to break through at The Curragh 11 days ago. The Michael Tabor colorbearer showed a willing attitude to see off G2 Coventry S. seventh Leitir Mor (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) by 3/4 of a length in that six-furlong test, and will require more of the same dropping down to this furious five.

**RECORDS SHATTERED AT OBS JUNE**

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's 2012 June Sale proved to be a record-setting two-day auction, with the topper arriving late in the day Wednesday when hip 653, a son of Elusive Quality, sold for a record \$350,000 to Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock, as agent. Consigned by Niall Brennan, the dark bay is out of Gypsy Hollow (Dixieland Band), who has already produced stakes winners Gipson Dessert (Orientate) and Dixie Emperor (Purge). He breezed a quarter in :21 1/5 Sunday ([video](#)). The topper was making his second trip through a sales pavilion, having been bought back on a bid of \$185,000 when offered as a yearling at last year's Keeneland September Sale. The previous OBS June record was established when a colt by Double Honor brought \$310,000 in 2004.

The Elusive Quality colt surpassed the day's early standard of \$320,000 set by hip 408, a filly from the first crop of Spring At Last (Silver Deputy). The chestnut is out of Zahwah (Rahy), who finished third in the 2000 Gill Arlington-Washington Lassie. She was consigned by Eisaman Equine. The highest-priced filly, who zipped through a quarter in a bullet :20 4/5, was purchased by Justin Casse, agent. In the name of his Stoneway Farm, Jim Stone acquired Zahwah in foal to Forestry for \$160,000 at Keeneland November in 2006. He offered the mare with this foal in utero at the 2010 Keeneland January Sale, but took her home after bidding stalled out at \$27,000.

For the entire sale, 395 juveniles registered a June Sale record of \$10,249,100. In 2011, 344 2-year-olds grossed \$7,141,700. The previous record gross of \$7,720,700 was set in 2008. The cumulative average was a sale record as well, reaching \$25,947, up 25% from 2011, and the median of \$15,000 was up 57.9%. Fifteen horses sold for \$100,000 or more compared with 11 last year.
