WALTER HAEFNER DIES

Moyglare Stud supremo Walter Haefner has died in his native Switzerland, aged 101. A memorial service for his life and times will be held in Ireland at a later date. Born in Zurich in 1910, the renowned businessman and philanthropist, who set up the famed Irish stud farm in 1962, bred such luminaries as Refuse To Bend (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}), Trusted Partner (Affirmed) and Dress To Thrill (Ire) (Danehill). One of the pioneers of international competition, Haefner was rewarded by the victory of Go and Go (Ire) (Be My Guest) in the 1990 GI Belmont S. and by Additional Risk (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}) in the inaugural Hong Kong Bowl. Last week, the black, white and red silks were carried to success

at Royal Ascot by Princess Highway (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G2 Ribblesdale S. and are due to be sported by a leading contender in Sunday's G1 Irish Derby in Speaking of Which (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Having started out as an amateur rider, Haefner collected the Fegentri Champion Amateur Championship in 1963 and quickly established his name in breeding circles after setting up a longstanding partnership with Stan Cosgrove, who managed the County Kildare establishment beginning in 1967. In 1982, Moyglare was the breeder of a Classic winner in the Irish Derby hero Assert (Ire), which was followed a year later by the Japan Cup success of the mare Stanerra (Ire). Nineteen years later, Media Puzzle (Theatrical {Ire}) added another major overseas prize to the Maynooth-based operation's tally when capturing the G1 Melbourne Cup. **cont. p3**

HOLLYWOOD WILDCAT DEAD AT 22

Champion **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.--Miss Wildcatter, by Mr. Prospector) died at Roseglade Farms in Kentucky June 23. According to Dr. Patrick Ford, the 22-year-old mare, who was in foal to Kitten's Joy, succumbed to complications stemming from cancer. "We will all miss her terribly, as she was always a pleasure to be around," said Irving Cowan. Campaigned by Irving and his late wife Marjorie Cowan and trained by Neil Drysdale, the the dark bay won GIII Sorority S. at two before adding wins in the GI Hollywood and Del Mar Oaks the following summer. She concluded her sophomore season with a nose victory over champion Paseana in the 1993 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff which earned her a 3-year-old championship. At four, she added wins in the GI Gamely H. and GI Lady's Secret H. and retired after a sole start at five, a win in the Little Brianne S. **cont. p3**

A winner of 12 of 21 lifetime starts and \$1,432,160, Hollywood Wildcat proved herself just as valuable at stud, producing GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero and fellow millionaire War Chant (Danzig); Group 2 winner and multiple Group 1/ Grade I placed Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Daneshill) and MSW & MGSP Ministers Wild Cat (Deputy Minister); and SW & GSP Double Cat (Storm Cat). She was also responsible for Group 3-placed Shintosh (Giant's Causeway).

Also an Honorary Turf Club member in Ireland and the benefactor of organisations such as RACE and the Equine Centre, Haefner was responsible for supporting the G1 Moyglare Stud S., which will be staged for the 40th time in 2012. His daughter, Eva-Maria Bucher Haefner, recently announced the sponsorship of a series of breeders' awards for winning fillies and mares in Ireland this year called the "Moyglare 50."

Extreme Horsepower...

In 1957 Haefner became one of the first in Switzerland to import an IBM system for business use, which led to his 1964 creation of Automation Center A.G., a computer services company in Zurich. In 1976 he expanded operations to the United States and later merged his company with Russell Artzt's and Charles Wang's Computer Associates in 1987. He owned AMAG Automobil- und Motoren, a highly successful Swiss automobile dealership chain.

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Time Off For Alternation

Pin Oak Stable's **Alternation** (Distorted Humor), fifth behind Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) in his latest start in the June 16 GI Stephen Foster H., is not expected to return to competition until August, trainer Donnie Von Hemel confirmed Monday. The dark bay, who kicked off the season with four consecutive wins, including the Apr. 14 GII Oaklawn H. and GIII Pimlico Special May 18, will stay in light training at Arlington Park. According to Von Hemel, last year's winner of the GII Peter Pan S. is expected to return in Aug. 11 Governor's Cup at Remington Park. "We'll take a little bit of a breather through the summer, start back there, and then look to something in New York, maybe the [GI] Jockey Club Gold Cup [Oct. 1], to see if we're going to the Breeders' Cup [at Santa Anita Nov. 2-3] with him," Von Hemel told *Daily Racing Form*.

In related news, stablemate **Caleb's Posse** (Posse) was sent to a Kentucky farm following a narrow second-place finish behind Shackleford (Forestry) in the May 28 GI Metropolitan H. The dual Grade I winner is unlikely to return to racing action until late summer.

ROLE REVERSALS

Every time a major European Classic or race meeting comes around, we're used to reading how once again Coolmore and Ballydoyle dominate the headlines. But last week saw a welcome resurgence by Team Darley, as Sheikh Mohammed and his immediate family (wife Princess Haya, son and heir Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed) won a total of six races at Royal Ascot to lead the overall standings, with combined earnings of £673,362 (roughly \$1,050,000). By contrast, Ballydoyle won just two: the G1 Prince of Wales's S., with So You Think (High Chaparral) for the Coolmore team, and the G3 Jersey S., with the filly Ishvana (Holy Roman Emperor) for Aidan's missus, Annemarie.

Sheikh Mohammed's team was boosted by three of the five wins recorded by the week's leading trainer, John Gosden, and two of the three wins for new wunderkind sire New Approach. Gosden's three Maktoum wins were all for Princess Haya: G2 Windsor Forest S. (4yo+ fillies/mares, 1 mile) winner Joviality (Cape Cross); decisive G3 Albany S. (2-year-old fillies, 6 furlongs) winner Newfangled (New Approach); and Duke of Edinburgh H. (4yo+, 1 1/2m) winner Camborne (Doyen).

Gosden also saddled G1 Coronation S. (3-year-old fillies, 1 mile) winner Fallen For You (Dansili) for Philippa Duncan's Normandie Stud, and Wolferton H. (Listed, 4yo+, 10 furlongs) winner Gatewood (Galileo) for George Strawbridge as part of Gosden's blockbuster Friday treble kicked off by Newfangled.

Saeed bin Suroor saddled two winners for Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation: Colour Vision (Rainbow Quest) in Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup (4yo+, 2 1/2 miles)--in which they had the Exacta, as the Mahmoud al-Zarooni trained Opinion Poll (Halling) ran second--and Tha'lr (New Approach), winner of Saturday's seven-furlong Listed Chesham S.

The Mark Johnston-trained Fennell Bay (Dubawi) won the 12-furlong King George V H. (3-year-olds) for Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed. In all, Famille Sheikh Mohammed recorded six wins and another six placings at the meet. Big turnaround for their team, at the world's greatest week of racing.

Prince Khalid Abdullah was number three on the Royal Ascot owners' list, according to figures compiled by the *Racing Post* and published in their Sunday, June 24 edition, with two winners--Frankel and Sea Moon--and three seconds.

Number 10 on the leading owners' list was The Queen. There have been a lot of Diamond Jubilee events this month to mark The Queen's 60-year reign, but I'm not sure many would have given her more personal pleasure than to have a winner at Royal Ascot. On Wednesday, the 4-year-old Carlton House (Street Cry), a gift from Sheikh Mohammed, had run probably his career best race when second to So You Think in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. Then, on Friday, Her Majesty won the G3 Queen's Vase (3-year-olds, two miles) with the filly Estimate (Monsun), also trained by Sir Michael Stoute and a gift from the Aga Khan. When Prince Philip presented her the trophy, The Queen waited on the dais, beaming, and looked just as pleased as any other winning owner.

Aidan O'Brien is still the leading trainer in Great Britain by almost £1-million, but John Gosden's five Royal Ascot wins takes him over £500,000 clear among British-based trainers to this point in the season. Four trainers won with two different horses at Ascot last week, plus champion Irish Jumps trainer Willie Mullins scored a double in the long-distance handicaps with Simenon, a 5-year-old Marju gelding. The trainers with two wins by different horses were: Saeed bin Suroor for Goldolphin (Colour Vision and Tha'Ir); Aidan O'Brien (So You Think and Ishvana); and the two Sirs, Henry Cecil (Frankel and 3-year-old 12-furlong GII King Edward VII S. winner Thomas Chippendale, the second leg of Dansili's Friday double) and Michael Stoute (The Queen's Estimate and Prince Khalid Abdullah's Sea Moon, by Beat Hollow, in the G2 Hardwicke, for 4yo's+ at 12 furlongs).

Though freshman sire sensation New Approach recorded an unprecedented three wins in 2-year-old black-type races, a Friday double of G1 Coronation S. winner Fallen For You and G2 King Edward VII winner Thomas Chippendale, plus three seconds, gave Dansili the Royal Ascot sires' money championship, with Royal Ascot earnings of £359,126. Galileo also posted two wins, the mighty Frankel and Wolferton H. (L) winner Gatewood, a second and two thirds, for earnings of £292,520. Also with two wins was Germany's venerable Monsun, sire of The Queen's G3 Queen's Vase winner Estimate, as well as the German-trained G3 Tercentenary S. (3-year-olds, 10f) winner Energizer.

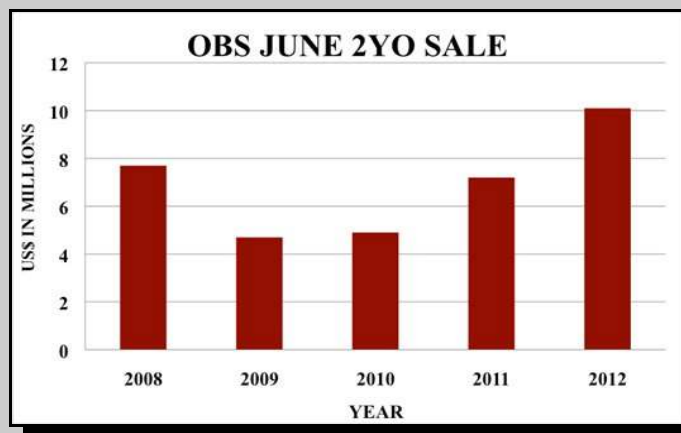
Other notable performances were by Street Cry, who had G2 Ribblesdale (3-year-old fillies, 12 furlongs) winner Princess Highway and The Queen's G1 Prince of Wales's runner-up Carlton House; and Dubawi, whose name you just see everywhere now. It's hard to believe his first foals are just 5-year-olds this year. At Ascot he had one handicap winner (Fennell Bay), two seconds and two thirds, for earnings of £165,100.

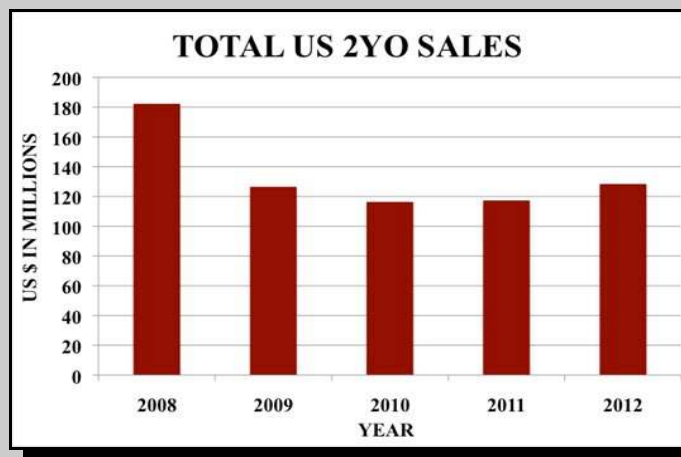

"The OBS June sale capped off what has been a successful season of 2-year-old sales – especially at OBS - for those consignors who have survived. Though the number catalogued was down another 10% from last year (and 25% since 2008), the number sold was down by seven percent (by 18% since 2008) as the clearance rates from the catalogues continues to improve. The gross for the North American 2-year-old sales was up by 10% from last year, the average by 18%. Compared to 2008, the gross is still down by 30%, though the average – for those surviving – is down by less, 14%."

I think we can consider it very significant that two Darley sires, Dubawi and Street Cry, who we really can now call World Top 12 Sires, plus a young son of Galileo, New Approach, who may just have made the fastest start in history, were so prominent at Royal Ascot. It was a huge week for Darley; maybe even a pivotal week.

Among second-crop sires, Lawman (Invincible Spirit) has indeed moved to the head of the class among European sophomore sires, thanks to Most Improved's win in the G1 St. James's Palace S. on opening day, according to statistics published by www.the-racehorse.com.

Red Clubs (Red Ransom) continues to look an unfortunate loss to the stallion ranks, as his filly Ceiling Kitty upset the G2 Queen Mary S. (2-year-old fillies, 5 furlongs). The other second-crop sire with a Royal Ascot winner was Notnowcato (Inchinor), who sired Britannia H. (3-year-olds, 1m) winner Fast Or Free. Second-crop sires with placed horses included Kendargent (Kendor), who had the 3-year-old filly Restiadargent complete an all-female Trifecta behind Black Caviar and Moonlight Cloud in the eventful G1 Diamond Jubilee, in which Black Caviar's jockey, Luke Nolan, nearly threw away the race. He apologized for it on TV afterwards, too, so he knew he'd nearly blown it.

Dutch Art (Medicean) and Dylan Thomas (Danahill) also had black-type placed horses at the meet.

New Approach (Galileo) has accomplished something I'm sure we've never seen before: three black-type winners in his first crop at Royal Ascot. Sixties Icon, the son of Galileo, who has no business being among the leading freshman sires as he won the G1 English St. Leger, now has six winners and added the second in the Chesham S. (seven furlongs), while Kentucky-based Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) had, as noted last week, the third (to Dawn Approach, by New Approach) in the G2 Coventry (six furlongs), Cristoforo Colombo. Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), who of course defeated 'Henry' in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic (on an all-weather track) at Santa Anita, had the Chesham third, Lovely Pass.

There was significant activity for first- and second-crop sires in North America last weekend, too. Darby Dan's Magna Graduate, a grandson of Danzig by Honor Grades, shot to the head of his class with the Grade III win in the five-furlong Churchill Downs Debutante S. by the filly Blueeyesintherein. Hard Spun (Danzig) consolidated his hold on second spot, behind Scat Daddy, among North American second-crop sires, with a win in the G1 Mother Goose S. by his 3-year-old filly Zo Impressive; and English Channel (Smart Strike) took another big leap forward with Strait of Dover's win in Canada's C\$1-million Queen's Plate. English Channel is now running neck-and-neck with Street Sense for third spot among North American second-crop sires.

Speaking of Churchill Downs, the reaction to their so-called new and improved Kentucky Derby points system has been underwhelming to say the least. Even Americans don't seem too enthusiastic about it, and reaction among European-based operations has ranged from deeply disappointed to livid. From the European point of view, the decision to include exactly two races from outside North America--the G2 Royal Lodge S. for 2-year-olds in England and the G2 UAE Derby in Dubai--is somewhere between insulting and terminally short-sighted.

Maybe Churchill Downs didn't notice or didn't care that 75 miles down the road their neighbors at Keeneland have generated a lot of extra business from non-domestic entities who would still like to try and win the GI Kentucky Derby, such as--I don't know, maybe Darley and Coolmore, the world's two biggest racing operations. Equally troubling is Churchill's determination that the graded and group race pattern system doesn't cut the mustard any more. Yes, it may be more evidence that a thorough review of the graded and group system is overdue, but again Churchill has taken a 100% corporate, racetrack attitude.

The graded/group race black-type designations have been the very foundation of value in the Thoroughbred industry for the last 60 years. Black-type is the single most important factor in the valuation of horses, so let's not throw out the baby with the bath water here. As far as I can tell, the only other really significant change Churchill is proposing from the old system is to weight the dates at which the horse wins a qualifying race. They could just as easily do that using the existing graded/group system without pretending to set themselves up as the arbiter of putative Classic form; or in effect telling people where to train their horses if they want to run in the Kentucky Derby.

For Europeans and other non-North Americans, that means training your Kentucky Derby contenders in North America, or don't go to the Big Dance. This is ludicrous! It's a bad idea, and presented as a fait accomplis when it should have been a proposal floated to fellow industry professionals for comment. So, Churchill Downs--are you going to be big boys and girls, swallow your massive, even bloated pride, and bring this proposal back in for reconsideration or are you going to be the Churchill Clowns? The world is watching (well, some of us are), and if you don't think it matters now, just imagine what it will be like next April when the racing media starts devoting as much space to your controversial new points system as to the race itself. I know I will be.
