MILLIONREASONSWHY DIES IN ACCIDENT

Sagamore Racing's **Millionreasonswhy** (Grand Slam--Secure, by A.P. Indy) died shortly following a training accident at Sagamore Farm Sunday morning. Taken out for a routine workout, the 3-year-old filly crashed through a rail on the 3/4-mile training track and died instantly of internal injuries. Trained by Ignacio Correas IV, Millionreasonswhy hit the board in all six lifetime starts, including a win in Belmont's GII Matron S. last July and the Mar. 3 Wide Country S. at Laurel. Most recently, she was runner-up in the Miss Preakness S. May 18. Millionreasonswhy won three times and finished second twice for earnings of \$223,340.

"This is a very emotional day for our team," said Sagamore Racing General Manager Tom Mullikin. "Millionreasonswhy was a classy and tough filly that had not yet reached her full potential. She was also a very sweet horse that was always a pleasure to be around. I want to thank Ignacio, [agent] Bob Feld and our entire team who cared for Millionreasonswhy. We also want to thank Millionreasonswhy's fans and supporters of Sagamore Racing. We will miss her dearly." Millionreasonswhy, who will be buried whole with her blanket, halter and a basket of treats, will join Hall of Fame horses Native Dancer, Discovery and Bed O' Roses in the Sagamore Farm cemetery.

POSITIVE TEST FOR CIRRUS

MG1SW **Cirrus des Aigles** (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}), the European champion older horse in 2011, is set to lose his most recent second-place finish in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan after testing positive for an anti-inflammatory medication. Beaten 3/4 of a length by Golden Lilac (Galileo {Ire}) in the May 27 Longchamp feature, the 6-year-old was reportedly found to have a high dose of a prohibited substance in his system. Trainer Corine Barande-Barbe issued a statement to *Racing Post* that read, "We have learned from France Galop that after his second place in the Prix d'Ispahan on May 27 this year, Cirrus des Aigles tested positive for a dose of an anti-inflammatory described as 'massive.' Having not administered any prohibited substance to him ourselves, we are convinced it can only be a case of malevolence, or else an error was made with the sample. We have therefore filed a complaint. The owners and myself await the results of the inquiry led by France Galop and of a judicial inquiry." The third and fourth across the line in the Prix d'Ispahan were Planteur (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) and No Risk at All (Fr) (My Risk {Fr}).

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

FARHH ADDED TO ECLIPSE FIELD

Godolphin's **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) has been supplemented for Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown, for which a total of 15 entries stood their ground at the six-day stage. Third behind **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 20, he will attempt to deny that Ballydoyle representative a second consecutive win in the 10-furlong contest. "He's still learning," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He's come back happy from his race and is very fresh, he didn't have a very hard race." Also from Godolphin are the Mahmood Al Zarooni-trained Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup hero **Monterosso (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **City Style** (City Zip), who was sixth in the Prince of Wales's. So You Think could be joined by three stable companions, including the Mar. 31 G2 UAE Derby winner **Daddy Long Legs** (Scat Daddy). That colt was one of a trio of 3-year-olds alongside Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's May 17 G2 Dante S. hero **Bonfire (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) and Reddam Racing's May 31 Listed Heron S. winner **Cogito** (Giant's Causeway), who need to rebound from unplaced efforts in the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby and June 19 G1 St James's Palace S., respectively. Trainer Roger Charlton is set to run Khalid Abdullah's Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Duty Free hero **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk), while John Gosden will re-introduce Lady Rothschild's 2011 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. victor **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Another notable entry is Scuderia Effeve and Australian Thoroughbred Bloodstock's May 13 G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica winner **Crackerjack King (Ire)** (Shamardal) who will be running for the Marco Botti barn for the first time. The Queen's **Carlton House** (Street Cry {Ire}) was the most significant withdrawal.

THE GREEN SHOOTS OF RECOVERY

Since his success in the G1 Deutsches Derby 12 months ago, Gestut Ravensberg's **Waldpark (Ger)** (Dubawi {Ire}) has failed to build on that achievement, and is on a recovery mission as he heads to post for today's G2 Hansa-Preis at Hamburg. His comprehensive defeat of the dual Group 1 winner Earl of Tinsdal (Ger) (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}) in the Classic over this track and trip promised much, but the homebred remains winless since, and comes here on the back of a sixth in the Capannelle's G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica over 10 furlongs May 13. Gestut Schlenderhan's homebred **Atempo (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) remains unexposed and enters this test after a career-best length success over **Silvaner (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) in the G2 Gerling-Preis over this trip at Cologne Apr. 29.

DUELLING LEGENDS *by Anne Wilson*

It's been dubbed Africa's greatest horseracing event. The unique flavour and history of the race makes it unlike anything else on offer in the world. Where else could you witness the 'throwing of the bones' by a Zulu sangoma and witness the primal savagery of Zulu warriors re-enacting some of their greatest triumphs. Some of the greatest horses in South African racing have either won or been placed in this famous race, which stands alone in its uniqueness and character, and is considered to be the premier horse race on the South African racing calendar.

From its humble beginnings back in 1897 when it was first run over 1600m, to its present day running over 2200 meters, the Vodacom Durban July is the epitome of glamour and, of course, fine horse racing. In its earlier incarnation, the race was known as the Durban Winter H. before undergoing several name changes to its present one, the Vodacom Durban July, sponsored by cellphone colossus Vodacom. Prize money for the 1897 running was 500 sovereigns, in those days a princely sum for many. Over the years, thanks to the increased visibility and popularity of the race, and Gold Circle's continued support, the sponsorship has skyrocketed to the present sum of R3 million which is up for grabs in 2012.

Greyville recourse has its own lengthy and varied history. It has hosted kings and queens, seen legends born and hearts broken, and it is one of the more difficult courses in the country for horses to race on, as it contains several varying gradient levels, which test a horse to the ultimate degree. The Greyville course is also famous for another innovation in South African racing: it was the first course in 1996 to install floodlights and open its doors to mid-week night racing, something which has taken the rest of the country a while to catch onto.

The Durban July is famous for something that few other horse races have, and that is two equine duels that created two South African equine legends. Equine duels have been described as a combination of formal combat and a struggle for domination--whoever is the winner is the victor, but if they cannot be decided, then both are declared joint winners, and that is exactly what happened in the Durban July, 41 years apart.

The first of these equine duels came about in the most dramatic manner in 1966 at Blue Lagoon, just outside of Durban. The favourite for that year's running, Sea Cottage, was shot at during his morning training session.

Thankfully, the shooter, Johnny Nel, a down-on-his-luck punter, found that his aim, like his punting skills, was non-existent, otherwise we would never have been able to witness the magic that Sea Cottage would weave initially at the July and then on tracks around the country. Despite the shooting, Sea Cottage made a full recovery, and many thought he was desperately unlucky not to win the 1966 version, having been bumped in the final straight, in spite of this, he managed a heroic fourth-place finish.

Sea Cottage was not done yet; and 1967 was to produce the first of two greatest duels in the history of the race, when he dead-heated with Jollify for first place. What was quite remarkable was that Sea Cottage had given Jollify a massive 13.5 kgs in the race--a huge concession in weight--and his guts and determination in the face of what could have been a life-threatening injury ensured that he became an instant equine celebrity. Sea Cottage the racing legend was born.

In what was the first twist that this race produced, both the winners were bred by the legendary Birch Brothers (or Vogelvlei Stud, as it's commonly known in South Africa), but only one of them would go on to achieve the sort of immortality and fame that is the privilege and domain of so few: the second and perhaps more ironic twist was that both winners were never to achieve the sort of breeding success their pedigrees promised.

It would be another 41 years until the judges were unable to call an outright winner again. July 2008 saw the second of the duels, when South African champion Pocket Power dead-heated with the grey filly Dancer's Daughter for line honours. As they came down the final straight, neither would give an inch, and as they lunged for the line, the capacity crowd held its collective breath. Not even the intervention of modern technology could separate the pair, and in the end, a dead heat was declared, the second in the race's 111 years of existence.

Will this year's running produce another iconic duel? Saturday's renewal is likely

to have some of the most mouthwatering prospects lining up. Jackson, heralded as one of the most promising 3-year-olds to run for many years, will take his place against the older, more experienced vanguard of Pierre Jourdan, Tales of Bravery and Castlethorpe. However, the men will not have it all their way, as several of the country's best fillies will be aiming to emulate Igugu by making it a girls race. Two of them in particular could present stiff competition. Beach Beauty, the seven-time winning daughter of the champion sire Dynasty; and Ilha Bela, out of the legendary mare Ilha Da Vitoria, who blew the field away in the 2005 Summer Cup.

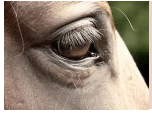

Some female lines enjoy only fleeting importance, but I am relieved to say that there are other families which can be relied upon to produce generation after generation of top performers. Several of last week's Group 1 and Group 2 events in Europe fell to horses in the latter category, as you will see if you visit the *TDN* 'Stakes Winning Pedigrees' section of the *TDN* site to study the pedigrees of Aesop's Fables, Probably and Izzi Top.

The G1 Prix Jean Prat fell to Distorted Humor's son Aesop's Fables, whose fourth dam, Royal Statute, now has the magnificent total of 15 Northern Hemisphere Group 1 winners among her descendants, including the classic winners Snow Bride, Lammtarra, Hector Protector, Bosra Sham, Shanghai and Pour Moi.

Aesop's Fables follows the 2010 National S. winner Pathfork as the second European Group 1 winner sired by Distorted Humor. It probably isn't mere coincidence that both figure among a sample of only 10 foals of racing age sired by the WinStar stalwart from daughters of Sadler's Wells. It is also a Sadler's Wells mare who figures as the second dam of another of Distorted Humor's Grade I winners--Travers S. winner Flower Alley, who came so close to Triple Crown glory with I'll Have Another. For good measure, Distorted Humor's first three runners out of mares by Sadler's Wells's son El Prado are all stakes winners, including the Grade I winner Bit of Whimsy. In other words, just about everything about Aesop's Fables' pedigree suggests that he is well qualified to build on his first Group 1 success.

Sadler's Wells also fills the position of broodmare sire in the pedigree of Probably, who followed in the footsteps of several future Group 1 winners, such as King of Kings, George Washington, Holy Roman Emperor, Mastercraftsman and Alfred Nobel, in winning the G2 Railway S. Two of these--Mastercraftsman and Alfred Nobel--share the same sire, Danehill Dancer, as Probably.

Probably's fourth dam is Margarethen, another whose total of Group 1-winning descendants runs well into double figures. An impressive bunch they are, too. Among them are the likes of the Arc second Trillion, the extraordinary Triptych, the Derby and Irish Derby winner Generous, the dual Classic winner Imagine and the very fast French filly Moonlight Cloud, who gave Black Caviar such a scare at Royal Ascot.

Interestingly, several are by Danzig line stallions, including Landseer, a Danehill colt who won the French 2,000 Guineas and Keeneland Turf Mile, and Horatio Nelson, another Danehill colt who took the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere.

Pivotal's daughter Izzi Top, a stylish winner of the Pretty Polly S., adds yet another chapter to the familiar Reprocolor story. This none-too-fashionably-bred daughter of Jimmy Reppin was bought for 25,000gns as a yearling, in the hope of her becoming a foundation mare for Meon Valley Stud. She went on to display plenty of talent and courage in a career which included a fourth in the Oaks.

Whereas Margarethen was born 50 years ago and Royal Statute as long ago as 1969, Reprocolor is the youngest of the group, with a 1976 birth date. Consequently her total of Group 1-winning descendants isn't quite so impressive, Izzi Top being the ninth to win at the top level. Nonetheless, the flow of stakes winners from the Reprocolor family is impressive, and there is already a stakes-winning 2012 2-year-old in the shape of the Chesham S. winner Tha'ir.

Izzi Top is one of several good 2008 foals from this family, others being the French 2,000 Guineas runner-up Havane Smoker and the French Group 3 winner Esperita. The 2009 batch features Lyric of Light, who accounted for the future Group 1 winners Fallen For You and Samitar in gaining her group victories at two; Caspar Netscher, who was winning his third Group 2 when he took the German 2,000 Guineas; and Shirocco Star, who failed by only a neck to land the Oaks last month.

In becoming a Group 1 winner, Izzi Top followed in the footsteps of her first two dams, so she must be an extremely valuable broodmare prospect (even more so because her pedigree contains no Sadler's Wells or Danzig blood). Her dam, the Zafonic filly Zee Zee Top, won the Prix de l'Opera as a 4-year-old to become the third Group 1 scorer produced by Reprecolor's Irish Oaks winner Colorspin. The others were the top-class Sadler's Wells colts Opera House, whose wins included the Coronation Cup, Eclipse and King George, and the stamina-packed Kayf Tara, a dual winner of both the Gold Cup and Irish St Leger. Colorspin's daughter Spinning The Yarn--a three-parts-sister to Opera House and Kayf Tara--became the dam of the precocious Darshaan filly Necklace, winner of the G1 Moyglare Stud S.

The family wasn't nearly so successful prior to Reprecolor's emergence, but Izzi Top's fourth dam, Blue Queen, was a half-sister to the champion sprinter Sandford Lad.

Although Reprecolor obviously deserves some of the credit for Izzi Top's talent, we mustn't overlook Pivotal's role.

You'll hardly need me to remind you that this specialist sprinter spent his first five years at Cheveley Park Stud at fees of £6,000 or £5,000. He did so well that he eventually became the highest-priced stallion based in England, his fee being £85,000 when Izzi Top was conceived.

Considering that Pivotal had to work his way up the pecking order, he has done extremely well to sire at least one Group 1 winner in all but one of his first 11 crops. In fact those crops produced 17 Group 1 winners. Pivotal has never shuttled, but his coverings to Southern Hemisphere time have also yielded Group 1 winners in Australia and South Africa.

He could have another Group 1 winner in the pipeline in the shape of the lightly-raced Farhh, whose luckless third in the Prince of Wales's S. has encouraged Godolphin to supplement him to Saturday's Eclipse S. As yet there is no Group 1 winner among Pivotal's 3-year-olds from his 12th crop but his French son Saint Baudolino did well to finish a close second in a very messy Prix du Jockey-Club, after being baulked early in the stretch.

Pivotal will be 20 years old next year, so it is time to expect some good results from his stallion sons. Kyllachy currently holds 14th place on the Anglo-Irish leading sires' table, nine places below Pivotal. Kyllachy has the leading sprinters Sole Power and Krypton Factor among his 2012 representatives, plus Group 2-winning miler Penitent, the French Group 3 winner Dragon Pulse and Italian Group 3 winner Noble Hachy.

Pivotal's latest Group 1 win came on the same day that his 2008 French 2,000 Guineas winner Falco was represented by his first group winner from his first crop. This was Snowday, winner of the G3 Prix du Bois over five furlongs. As a Group 3 winner Snowday doesn't have his catalogue-style pedigree on the TDN site, but I can assure you that his female line is another example of a top-class family which remains very effective. His fourth dam South Ocean--best known as the dam of Storm Bird--is also the fourth dam of Sunday's G3 Grangecon Stud S. winner Sendmylovetorse

Pivotal's broodmare daughters are also getting into the act. One of them, Beauty Is Truth, came up with a very promising winner when The United States, her grandly-named son by Galileo, shaped like a future group winner in making a successful debut two days ago. Beauty Is Truth is also the dam of the fast Dansili filly Fire Lily. Other Pivotal mares have produced this year's good sprinter Mayson and the Derby second Main Sequence, so there are encouraging signs that Pivotal's broodmare daughters are making amends for what has been a rather slow start.

TRAINER LOYD GENTRY JR. DIES AT 87

Renowned trainer Loyd Gentry Jr. died of heart failure Monday in Lexington, Kentucky. He was 87. Competing mainly at race tracks in New York, South Florida, Kentucky and Illinois, Gentry Jr. was best known for

conditioning 1967 Kentucky Derby winner Proud Clarion and Graustark, a leading Triple Crown prospect and dual stakes winner in 1966. Graustark won seven consecutive races before being forced to the sidelines because of injury after a close-up second in the Blue Grass S. The nephew of renowned horseman Olin Gentry, who managed Col. E.R. Bradley's Idle Hour Farm, Gentry Jr. also trained Kauai King during his 2-year-old season before turning the future

Kentucky Derby winner over to Henry Forrest after deciding to train privately for Darby Dan's John W. Galbreath. Gentry also won the Kentucky Oaks on two occasions--with Lalun in 1955 and Hail to Patsy in 1969. Through six decades, Gentry Jr. trained for many of the era's leading operations, including Capt. Harry F. Guggenheim's Cain Hoy Stable, John. A Bell III, Leslie Comb II, John Haynes, Louis L. Haggin II, and John D. Hertz.

Born Aug. 29, 1925 in Covington, Kentucky, he was the son of jockey and trainer, Loyd Gentry Sr., who trained for the prominent Canadian horseman Harry C. Hatch and for whom he conditioned the winner of the 1941 King's Plate.

Gentry was preceded in death by his first wife, Katherine Clark Gentry, as well as his son, Loyd III. His survivors include his wife, Diane M. Curry, cousins Tom Gentry, Olin Gentry, Kathleen Spears, Daniel Eberhardt, and Anne Eberhardt Keogh.

Deadline for BC horses of Racing Age Noms July 15:
Edited Press Release

Owners of horses of racing age currently not nominated to the Breeders' Cup can nominate runners at discounted rates prior to 11:59 p.m. (ET) July 15. This year's Breeders' Cup World Championships will be contested at Santa Anita Park Nov. 2-3. New this year, 2-year-olds by a nominated Breeders' Cup stallion can join the program for US\$12,000; this one-time nomination fee make the racehorse eligible for its entire racing career to the Breeders' Cup. Three year olds and up that were foaled in the Northern Hemisphere will receive a 50% discount off normal racehorse nomination fees and 3-year-olds and older born in the Southern Hemisphere can nominate for 25% of their regular nomination fee. All nominated racehorses are eligible for the Breeders' Cup World Championships and any other racing program of the Breeders' Cup for as long as they race. Following the July 15 deadline, the price for non-nominated runners reverts back to the standard racehorse nomination fee of US\$100,000 or more until Oct. 22, when all runners must be pre-entered for the Breeders' Cup World Championships races.

Owners of horses or racing age by non-nominated stallions can also take advantage of discounted prices before July 15. All 2-year-olds by non nominated stallions can join the program for US\$18,000; Northern Hemisphere 3-year-olds and older for US\$100,000 and Southern Hemisphere 3-year-olds and older for US\$50,000. Owners may nominate their horses of racing age online at www.members.breederscup.com.





First-crop starters to watch: Tuesday, July 3
