"This race will get you ready to ship," Hollendorfer's assistant trainer Dan Ward told *Daily Racing Form*. "There are three races within a week--the [GII] Jim Dandy [at Saratoga July 28] for \$600,000, the [GI] Haskell [at Monmouth July 29] for \$1 million, and the [GII] West Virginia Derby [at Mountaineer

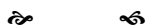

There were two class acts among the colts in this line-up, but in the end it was the tough and consistent mare Ovambo Queen who upstaged the boys with a typically game display. Not out of the frame since her debut, the dark bay had only been kept out of the exacta on two occasions and boasted Pattern-race wins in the G3 Walther J Jacobs-Stutenpreis at Bremen in August 2010 and G3 Scandinavian Open Championship at Klampenborg a year later. Succumbing only to Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) when 3/4-of-a-length second to the Arc winner on her seasonal bow in the G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmer over 11 furlongs at Baden-Baden last time May 20, she stalked the early pace in second here before tackling Waldpark inside the final quarter. Engaging in a battle to the post with last year's G1 Deutsches Derby hero, it was Ovambo Queen who held the upper hand after one decisive thrust in the dying yards. "It has paid off that we gave her time at three and four," trainer Dr. Andreas Bolte commented. "Now she could go for the G1 Deutschland-Preis [at Hoppegarten July 22]--we haven't discussed any further options yet and she might even stay in training another year."

May 5.

FIRST YEARLINGS

Sale time. Japan sells yearlings next Monday and foals next Tuesday; Tattersalls holds their three-day July sale during the Newmarket race meet later next week; and Fasig-Tipton kicks off the North American yearling sale season with Fasig July next Tuesday. Fasig has catalogued 338 yearlings, up 12% from last year, when 191 sold (63%) of 303 catalogued, grossing \$13,349,000, and averaging \$69,890. This is traditionally a great sale for pinhookers, so a lot will depend on whether the Ocala pinhookers had a good enough 2-year-old sales season to embolden them next week. Averages do a lot of times depend on sire power, and this sale has traditionally favored the individual over the pedigree, so it's going to be just as important to gauge the intangibles--the pace of the sale, the vibe--as to assess whether the final figures are up or down.

Though they don't do the 'new-sire showcase' any more, naturally sires with their first yearlings constitute a healthy proportion of the catalogue (71 yearlings by 14 first-year sires, or 21%, this year) and generate a lot of interest. There was one superstar retired at the end of the 2009 season, but that was Sea The Stars. He'll light up the tote boards in Europe later this year (13 foals from his first crop averaged \$531,258 at last year's foal sales, per Instatistics, which also includes 'short' yearlings), but he was very much the exception to the rule. No other F2011 stallion, retired in 2010 and with their first yearlings selling this year, averaged over \$100,000, in North America or in Europe.

In fact, the end of 2009 was not a good time to be retiring a stallion. In the lists my organization (yes, that's Brienne) keeps, we counted 88 stallions which retired in North America and Europe for the 2009 season--first foals 2010, first 2-year-olds now. We try to find every stallion at 5,000 or more (whichever currency), some under, and any horse with an APEX rating. But by the end of 2009, the Crash was having its full impact on the horse business, and the number of stallion retirements we counted dropped 26% from 88 to 65 (see attached graph p7). Moreover, the collapse was almost exclusively in North America. The number we counted in Europe actually rose, from 32 to 35. But the number of F2011 stallions in North America dropped 46% to 30 from 56; and, in Kentucky, the number dropped by 63% from 30 to just 11 (who still stand there).

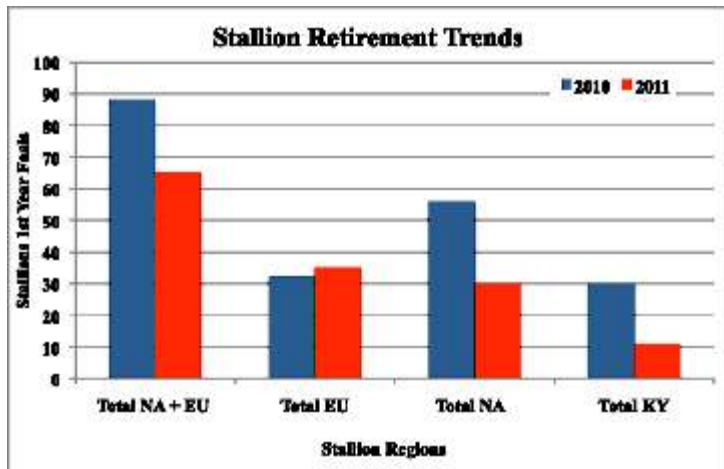






However you do the counts, there was a dramatic fall in stallion retirements in Kentucky, and a dramatic drop in entering stud fees as well. **Zensational** at \$25,000 (Hill 'n' Dale) and **Pioneerof The Nile** at \$20,000 (Vinery) were the highest-priced retirements in Kentucky and, interestingly, are among four leading contenders among this group from the Unbridled (Fappiano branch of Mr. Prospector) sire line. Both were owned by Zayat Stables. Pioneerof The Nile, by Empire Maker, was a \$290,000 yearling buy and was originally trained by Bill Mott, but stayed in California with Bob Baffert after running fifth to Midshipman in the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita. He promptly won four Grade I/II races for Baffert on the California synthetics: the GI CashCall Futurity in his final start at two, then the GI Robert Lewis, the GI San Felipe, and the GI Santa Anita Derby leading into the GI Kentucky Derby. He turned in a valiant effort there as the 6-1 third favorite on the sloppy track, briefly looking like the winner at the top of the stretch before Calvin 'Bo-rail' slipped through the inside and rocketed away on Mine That Bird. He never ran again after being eased in the GI Preakness, won by Rachel Alexandra. He has five yearlings catalogued at Fasig July and one at Saratoga.

Zensational, by Unbridled's Song, brought \$700,000 as a 2-year-old purchase. He went off the favorite in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint on the synthetic track at Santa Anita having won all five of his starts at six and seven furlongs on California synthetic tracks that year, including three Grade I wins, including the Triple Bend at Hollywood Park (Beyer 105), and the Bing Crosby (110) and Pat O'Brien (101) at Del Mar. He was only fifth at Santa Anita, having had a rough trip, but had still done enough to command the highest retiring Kentucky stud fee in 2010. He has seven catalogued in Kentucky, one at Saratoga.

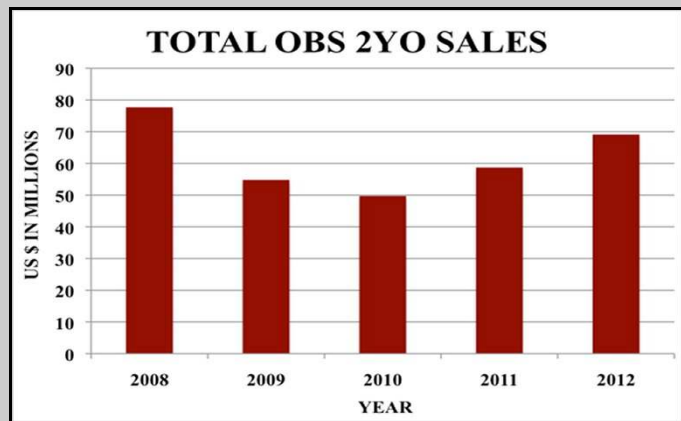
Two other sons of Unbridled's Song, Ashford's **Dunkirk** and Taylor Made's **Old Fashioned**, have the highest number of yearlings by first-year sires at Fasig July, with 18 and 11, respectively. **Cont. p8**



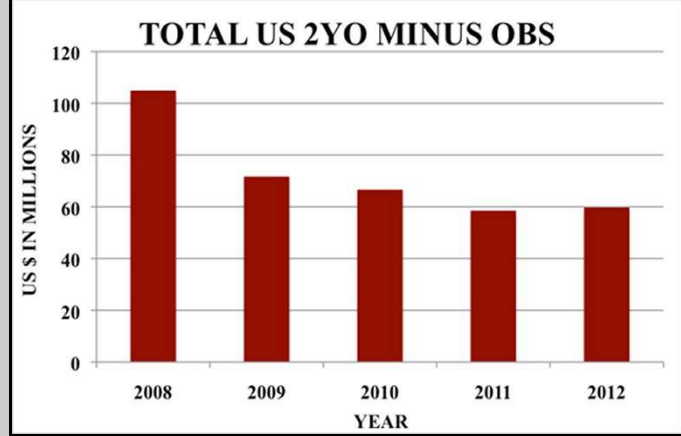
Weekly Sales Ticker

“Look at OBS vs. the rest of US 2-year-old sales 2009-2012. The gross at OBS has increased 26%, from \$54.7-million to \$69-million, while the other (including ‘boutique’) sales have declined 17%, from \$71.6-million to \$59.7-million. OBS 2-year-old sales have gone from a 43% market share in 2009 to 54% in 2012 – a gain of almost a quarter. Breeding in Ocala is in desperate shape, we are told, and almost everything is for sale. It may be small consolation to Florida breeders, but since the installation of Safetrack OBS increasingly defines the US 2-year-old market. Ocala pinhookers could help next week’s Fasig July yearling sale.”

Old Fashioned also has one catalogued at Saratoga. Dunkirk, you'll recall, was the sale-topping \$3.7-million Keeneland September yearling in 2007. He ran a Beyer 108 when second to Quality Road (who missed the Classics) in the GI Florida Derby, then ran second again to Summer Bird in the GI Belmont, but was subsequently injured and did not make it back to the races.

Old Fashioned, who had himself been an \$800,000 yearling for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm, won his first four starts, including the GII Remsen at two (by seven lengths, Beyer 100, in a blistering performance) and the GIII Southwest S., at Oaklawn Park at three. He was second in the GII Rebel and then again in the GI Arkansas Derby, but was himself injured and had to be retired.

It is WinStar Farm, though, which stands the two horses who topped the Instatistics table for North American F2011 sires at the 2011 and early 2012 mixed sales. **Colonel John**, a WinStar homebred by Tiznow, is a seriously good-looking horse himself, and his first crop weanlings and short yearlings wowed the buyers with 19 sold (of 24 offered) for an average of \$78,421. But, even more impressively, with a median of \$75,000--five times his entering (and still) \$15,000 stud fee. That is a deeply impressive statistic. Winner of the 2008 GI Santa Anita Derby (synthetic) and the GI Travers (dirt, Beyer 106) among his six wins and earnings of over \$1.7 million, Colonel John has five yearlings catalogued at Fasig and five at Saratoga--the only first-year sire with more than one there. On the basis of his reception at the sales so far, Colonel John goes into the sales season a heavy favorite to top North American F2011 sires by yearling average.

As long as they sell as well as yearlings, relatively speaking, as they did as foals, it means any other sire who gets close to him in 2012 yearling average or median will be worth a second look, too.

The number two North American sire by sale average so far is also a WinStar stallion, the Danzig horse **US Ranger**, who came to WinStar in the Paul's Mill package with Bellamy Road, Summer Bird, and Artie Schiller. A Joe Allen homebred (like another son of Danzig, War Front), US Ranger went three-for-three in France for provincial training wizard Jean-Claude Rouget as a 2-year-old. Coolmore took him over as a 3-year-old; he won the Prix Djebel (Listed), and was second in the G3 Jersey S. at Ascot, for Rouget, then was transferred to Aidan O'Brien. His first start for O'Brien was a win in the Waterford Testimonial S. (Listed, RPR 122), but he never actually won again, although he ran second in the G1 July Cup (RPR 121) and third in the G1 Prix de la Foret, over six and seven furlongs, respectively. Himself out of a three-quarter sister to Dynaformer, his first foals were very popular, with 15 (of 17 offered) averaging \$57,326. He has five catalogued at Fasig-Tipton.

Just three other stallions with their first yearlings have three or more catalogued at Fasig. **Cowboy Cal** (Giant's Causeway), who was bred and raced by Stonerside principals Robert and Janice McNair, won three Grade II races on the synthetics and turf at eight and nine furlongs, and was also first or second in another six more Grade I or Grade II's. He retired to Pin Oak Farm. Ron Winchell, who raced Tapit, and his manager, David Fiske, were so impressed by what they saw (and bought) at the foal sales that they bought into the stallion. **Cont. p9**

Cowboy Cal has six catalogued at Fasig, so likely they weren't the only ones who were impressed.

Kodiak Kowboy is by Posse (also sire of Caleb's Posse), and possesses very impressive credentials: he won the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga as a 2-year-old, and at three and four ran Beyers of 106-108 six different times, including when winning the GI Vosburgh H. and the GI Cigar Mile. He also won the GI Carter as a 4-year-old (so Grade I wins at six, seven, and eight furlongs), and the GII Amsterdam at three. He has four catalogued at Fasig-Tipton.

Then there's the real sleeper of the group, Claiborne's **Parading**, who has three at Fasig. Bred and raced by the Phipps Stable and trained by Shug McGaughey, he didn't break his maiden until he was a 4-year-old, and his two graded race wins, the GIII Ben Ali (synthetic) and the GII Dixie (turf) came at six. Never mind all that: he's by Pulpit out of a Storm Cat daughter of My Flag, third dam Personal Ensign. This is the next Pure Prize; the pros love him. This may be the first time you've heard his name this year, but I guarantee you, it won't be the last.

SARATOGA LIMITS JUVENILE FIELDS

The New York Racing Association Board of Directors' Racing Committee has announced that field sizes for juvenile maiden races at the upcoming Saratoga meeting will have a limited number of entries. Sprint maiden races will be limited to eight starters, while two-turn events will be limited to 10 starters.

"The catalyst behind limiting the field sizes in the maiden races for juveniles was two-fold," explained NYRA Vice President and Director of Racing P. J. Campo. "The smaller fields are expected to produce more cleanly run events, while also creating the opportunity to showcase more high-quality races during the meet and beyond. We expect this change will strengthen NYRA's juvenile stakes and allowance programs by helping horses gain the experience they need to compete successfully at higher levels."

Trainer Rick Violette, Jr., president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and NYRA Board member, added, "Larger fields of inexperienced young horses often result in roughly run races. This approach will offer a kinder, gentler and, perhaps, wiser introduction to racing for young horses, and could, in fact, extend their careers. Owners will have a better opportunity to fairly evaluate the performances of their horses in manageable fields. This also will increase the chance that young horses will improve mentally and physically from their first races, rather than having to recover from them."

The Saratoga meeting runs from July 20 through Sept. 3 with racing six days a week.

EASTERN U.S.

Big Victory for Pennsylvanian Racing:

Pennsylvania's 2012-13 fiscal budget was approved by the Legislature and signed by Governor Tom Corbett June 30 with the Race Horse Development Fund being spared the dreaded \$72-million cut as originally proposed. The approved budget will allocate a combined \$5 million from the Racing Fund for two other horse-related programs--\$3 million for the Pennsylvania State Farm Products Show Fund and \$2 million for the Pennsylvania Fairs Fund. "We thank the legislature for maintaining its commitment to the horse racing and breeding industry in Pennsylvania by properly funding for the Race Horse Development Fund," said Pete Peterson, spokesperson for the Pennsylvania Equine Coalition, a statewide group representing more than 10,000 trainers, owners and breeders of the horse racing industry in Pennsylvania. "Competitive purses and breeding incentives have created tens of thousands of jobs in Pennsylvania and spurred significant investment in the state's economy. Maintaining the funding levels that the state committed to through Act 71 is vital to the long-term success of the horse racing and equine breeding industries, as well as the overall agriculture sector in Pennsylvania."
