BACK-TO-BACK BAFFERT EXACTAS

Game On Dude (Awesome Again) lost a tough one to stablemate **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) in last year's renewal of the G1 Hollywood Gold Cup H., but it was his turn to head this year's Bob Baffert exacta as the five-year-old handed fast-closing **Richard's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid) a 1 1/2-length defeat and earned an automatic berth into the Nov. 3 G1 Breeders' Cup Classic.

Kettle Corn (Candy Ride {Arg}) was third. "I could actually hear [jockey Rafael Bejarano on Richard's Kid] yell 'I'm coming Chantal' at the quarter pole," said jockey Chantal Sutherland, who became the first female rider to win the Gold Cup. "We're friends, and it was just like 'I'm coming to get you,' like a game of tag. [Game On Dude] wanted to go after that other horse (**Spud Spivens** {Tizbud}) early and kept fighting and fighting, but then he kind of chilled out a little bit. When he started getting a little pushy about it, I had to let him do his thing. Down the lane, I didn't want to hit him or push on him, but I was getting a little nervous." **Cont. p5**

MACHO MAN FLEXES MUSCLES IN SUBURBAN

Reeves Thoroughbred Racing's **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) reclaimed his spot among the top older males in the U.S. with a powerful 2 1/2-length stalking score over G1 Donn H. hero **Hymn Book** (Arch) in Belmont's GII Suburban H. yesterday. Pacesetter **Trickmeister** (Proud Citizen) held on for third, while 7-5 favorite **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) had no apparent excuse as he checked in fourth. "It was an awesome job by [jockey] Mike Smith, [trainer] Kathy [Ritvo], and everyone involved," said owner Dean Reeves. "I'm so happy for my horse. He ran a good race, a solid race. This is really an extraordinary horse. He beat a great field of horses today." **Cont. p10**

PLENTY OF STYLE

Just an hour after his full-sister **Great Heavens** (GB) captured the G2 Lancashire Oaks, **Lady Rothschild's Nathaniel** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) made it a red-letter day for his already accomplished dam **Magnificent Style** (Silver Hawk) when winning a thrilling renewal of the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown. Capping a remarkable run of form for his owner--who also captured the feature handicap on this card as well as the Lancashire Oaks--last year's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. hero was able to employ his ample stamina reserves on rain-softened ground and hold off the 11-4 pick **Farhh** (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) for a half-length success. Acquired as a stallion prospect earlier this year by Newsells Park Stud, where he will stand alongside another former Eclipse hero in **Mount Nelson** (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) at the end of the current season, the 7-2 second choice had no hiding place after being committed by William Buick three furlongs from home, and defied a lengthy absence since finishing fifth in the G1 Champion S. at Ascot in October. His rider hailed the achievement of the bay's conditioner afterwards. "This was a fantastic training performance by John Gosden, and all credit to him for getting him here in this shape," Buick said. "He's got real quality and showed today what a good horse he is." **Cont. p3**

Nathaniel's debut has become the stuff of legend now, as he lined up in the Newmarket mile maiden won by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in August 2010 and managed to beat all without achieving the impossible there. By the time he got to the G3 Chester Vase last May, he was beginning to blossom into another of the smart middle-distance performers his prolific producer is famed for, but he came up short against the eventual Irish Derby hero Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) there. Missing the Epsom Derby due to fast ground, he was sent to a rain-soaked Royal Ascot for the G2 King Edward VII S. and, despite running freely for the most part, stamped his authority on affairs. With the ground unexpectedly shifting back to soft ahead of the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at the end of July, connections rolled the dice by supplementing him, and that decision paid handsome dividends as he outmaneuvered Workforce (GB) (King's Best) and St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) to win a tactical renewal. After the wet summer, the autumn proved dry and the opportunities barren as a result, and an Arc challenge went by the wayside before he was chanced in the feature of Champions' Day. **Cont. p4**

Drawn wide and forced to race up with the pace throughout on that occasion, Nathaniel was far from disgraced when beaten just over three lengths by Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}), and proved deserving of another crack at 10 furlongs. Out of sorts in the spring, he was deemed to be running here with a view to prepping for a repeat tilt at the King George in a fortnight, and was traveling with his usual gusto in second tracking Godolphin's pace-setting City Style (City Zip). Any fitness issues would have been exposed in the straight, but he was able to see off the smooth-traveling **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk) and then Farhh in a display of relentless galloping. "He was reasonably fit, but we weren't sure whether he was 100% race-fit, and his quality got him home," William Buick commented. "His running style is prominent, and he hits the front a long way from home, so is there to be shot at, but from the two to the one he really quickened well. I could see Frankie coming out of the corner of my eye, and when Nathaniel saw him, he went again and was firmly on top at the line. He's got a really big stride and is a beautiful

mover, so I let him use it, as it's no good holding him up. I have always had a lot of faith in this horse, and things didn't go his way in the Champion S., as he was racing a long way out. Today he showed his versatility-- So You Think (NZ) didn't run, but there was still a lot of strength in depth in this field, and this is one of the best races over this distance. He beat top-class mile-and-a-quarter horses here and, all being well, he'll go for the King George again as that was the plan beforehand. The boss will make that decision after he's seen how he is." Gosden may have other ideas for the 4-year-old, with the King George coming up quickly. "He's a super horse, but it has been very difficult to get him right as he has had a respiratory problem," he told *PA Sport*. "It's two weeks to the King George, and that's not great. He's put in a massive effort here, so we will just have to have a good think about whether we run again. It will be fun to take on Frankel once more, as there was only half a length between them in a maiden a long time ago. The [Aug. 22] G1 Juddmonte International would be an option, as would the G1 Champion S. [at Ascot Oct. 20]." **Cont. p5**

So Near, Yet So Farhh...

Frankie Dettori looked set to land a third renewal and first since Refuse To Bend (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in 2004, but after Farhh loomed alongside Nathaniel with a furlong remaining, he ran out of gas. Godolphin's fast-improving 4-year-old received plenty of praise from his rider afterwards. "He did brilliantly and beat a great field, but Nathaniel pulled out all the stops," Dettori said. "I got to him and thought I had him, but his stamina kicked in and he outstayed me in the end. He proved to be very tough horse to beat today with the ground being on the slow side over this stiff mile and a quarter." Farhh has always had trouble with the stalls and gave away ground in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. last time, but was on his best behavior this time. Connections of the 2010 winner **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory), who did not get the clearest of runs late on before finishing 2 3/4 lengths away in third, were delighted with the effort of the 7-year-old. "He had been freshened up and has run a blinder," Juddmonte's Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "We were very pleased." He also revealed that Cityscape may be dropped back to a mile for the G1 Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 12.

Back-to-Back Baffert Exactas cont...

Purchased privately in 2010 before winning the GIII Lone Star Derby and finishing fourth in the GI Belmont S., Game On Dude flourished last year at four, earning a first Grade I success in the Santa Anita H. in March. He did all the dirty work when First Dude beat him by a nose in last year's running of this event, and took the top spot among Baffert's older runners when that stablemate was forced to retire. Subsequently fourth in Del Mar's GI Pacific Classic in August, Game On Dude set torrid splits but held on to score in Santa Anita's GI Goodwood S. Oct. 1. He nearly repeated that performance in the Breeders' Cup Classic under the Twin Spires Nov. 5, but succumbed to Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor)'s advances late to be beaten 1 1/2 lengths in second. The easiest of winners when resurfacing in the GII San Antonio S. in Arcadia Feb. 5, Game On Dude made no impact when 12th in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 31. He proved no worse for wear back in Southern California, however, and earned a career-top 115 Beyer Speed Figure for a 7 1/4-length tour de force in the GII Californian S. here last time June 2.

Forced to rate outside of Spud Spivens when it became apparent early that that foe wasn't ceding command, Game On Dude stalked splits of :24.18 and :47.17 while well-clear of the rest of the field. The speedster grew a bit anxious down the backside, and Sutherland was forced to give him his head as he grabbed a narrow advantage from the two path. The favorite left his company in the dust entering the far turn, but Richard's Kid emerged from far back and looked like he might make a race of it. Richard's Kid slowly chipped away at Game On Dude's lead down to the wire, but was just never getting to the game winner.

The runner-up, also a private purchase who went on to post significant accomplishments after Baffert took over, including back-to-back Pacific Classics in 2009 and 2010, was making his second start back in the states for Zabeel Racing after two winless years in Dubai. He was a 7 1/4-length winner of the June 8 Prove It S. here last time.

"They had to run one-two," said Baffert. "They're two really good horses. That longshot (Spud Spivens) made them go pretty brisk. Game On Dude was getting a little tired, but he needs the competition. It looked like Richard's Kid was going to come up to him, but he dug in there at the end. I'm glad they both ran their races and I'm happy for Chantal because I sort of got goose bumps when [track announcer Vic Stauffer] said she was trying to become the first woman to win this." He noted, "We'll take [Game On Dude] to Del Mar to see if he likes the track. Last year, he really didn't train well there. If he trains well, I'll run him in the Pacific Classic Aug. 26. If he doesn't, I'll just freshen him up and wait for the fall. He loves Santa Anita and the Breeders' Cup [Nov. 3] has been our goal.

Turbo Compressor, a two-time stakes winner over the main track last year, romped home by a front-running 5 1/2 lengths in his turf debut in a Mar. 18 optional claimer at Gulfstream Park. Eighth in the May 5 GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill Downs, the bay went wire-to-wire to best Air Support by 1 1/4 lengths in the June 16 Colonial Turf Cup last time out. Loose on the front end, Turbo Compressor was allowed to set pedestrian fractions of :25.14 and :49.97 in the early going. Joe Bravo nursed him through three quarters in an uncontested 1:15.08, and from there it was just a sprint to the wire, with Turbo Compressor easily holding off Air Support. "I was just a passenger today," admitted Bravo. "This horse just keeps getting stronger as he gets older. He was a good dirt horse and now he's a great turf horse. Pace makes the race and we were able to get out there and control it on our terms. He was nice and relaxed the whole way and really kicked on in the lane when I called on him."

Trainer Todd Pletcher was impressed with his charge's effort. "He really flew home," Pletcher said. "He was able to lay down the fractions and that was just what we were looking for. He still came home in :22 and change [:22.22] and that's hard to do at a mile and three eighths." As for what is next for Turbo Compressor, Pletcher added, "We'll take him to Saratoga and see what our options are. This horse is versatile; he's won from one mile to a mile and three eighths, so we have a lot of options for him." The United Nations is a Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' event for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and co-owner Joe Appelbaum sounds like he might be in. "Everyone likes a free trip to Los Angeles," Appelbaum said. Trainer Bill Kaplan was admitted into a Miami-area hospital Saturday morning after a bout of dehydration, but was feeling fine by the afternoon after saddling a pair of graded winners on Calder's card, including this Summit of Speed centerpiece with stable star Musical Romance. A heartbreaking neck second to the rallying Sassy Image (Broken Vow) in the Princess Rooney a year ago, the hard-knocking miss earned herself champion female sprinter honors after winning the GII Presque Isle Masters S. in September and, after a second in the GII TCA S. at Keeneland Oct. 8, prevailing at 20-1 in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint at Churchill. The 2012 season has largely been hit or miss for the now 5-year-old. She ran a troubled fourth in the Sunshine Millions F/M Sprint at Gulfstream Jan. 28, but rebounded with a win in the GII Inside Information S. there Mar. 17. Favored in the G1 Vinery Madison S. over Keeneland's Poly Apr. 12, she came home a tired fourth to Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band), and had to settle for second to that streaking foe in the G1 Humana Distaff May 5. **Cont. p9**

If Musical Romance hopes to repeat as division champ in 2012, she'll need a couple big performances in the second half of the season, and she showed her mettle here to record a second career Grade I. Not far off the fast pace of Golden Mystery (Awesome Again) while saving ground, she angled out for running room in upper stretch and, after hitting the front at the furlong grounds, gamely turned back the challenge of Nicole H. "That was a really painful loss, missing by a head last year," jockey Juan Leyva recalled. "It stuck with me all

this time because I know she should have won, and because we lost the race here at Calder, on our home track. So it feels so great right now, to win this race today. This was sweet

redemption." He added, "This filly loves being inside; she thrives on that kind of stuff. You don't get a lot of horses that want to be in there like that, and no matter where you put her, she's going to run." Kaplan, who also sent out Another Romance (Saint Anddan) to victory in the Gill Azalea S. earlier in the card, said last year's loss in the Princess Rooney didn't sting him like it did Leyva. "I think that's because he was on the horse, he did everything right, and he just got beat," said Kaplan. "But after the race, I told Juan to forget about it; she ran a great race that day, and had she seen Sassy Image, she would have dug in and did like she did today when holding that other horse off. So there was no vindication for me today. It was just a great race, and we were able to keep her on the road to the Breeders' Cup." Kaplan indicated that Musical Romance's path to this year's Breeders' Cup could include a start in the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga Aug. 24 and/or a defense of the Presque Isle Masters Sept. 8.

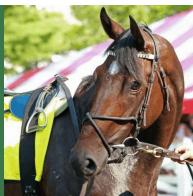

"I knew the inside horse [Artefacto] was going for the lead, so I wanted to keep my horse very close because this track can sometimes be difficult for horses that ship in to run," explained winning rider Richard Eramia. "It can be tricky, and I didn't want him to have a lot of work to do late. He broke very good, and I put him in the race early. I know that my horse finishes really well, and when I asked, he just took off. Three-quarters is the perfect distance for him." Ron Faucheux admitted Gantry has exceeded expectations and the trainer is already looking ahead to November after Gantry earned an automatic berth into the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint with his Smile victory. "We originally bought him to run in the Thanksgiving Day H., but it looks like we're going to get to run him in the Breeders' Cup." Field Commission (Service Stripe) was pulled up near the three-eighths pole.

Sunshine Millions Classic runner-up Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) took the GI Santa Anita H. next out and the GI Stephen Foster H. most recently, while third-place finisher Turbo Compressor (Halo's Image) became a Grade I winner in his own right with a front-running tally in Saturday's United Nations S. at the Jersey Shore. Mucho Macho Man also took the GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 10, finishing two slots in front of next-out GI Carter H. hero Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil), but disappointed when a well-beaten third as the favorite in Churchill's GII Alysheba S. last time May 4. Partnering with Hall of Famer Mike Smith for the first time as Ramon Dominguez opted for Trickmeister, Mucho Macho Man broke on top, but was kept well out in the track by Smith as Trickmeister glided up to take over. To Honor and Serve tracked that pair from a wider third through posted splits of :23.06, :45.68 and 1:09.53. Mucho Macho Man put a head in front in upper stretch while confidently ridden by Smith, and was gone at the eighth pole as he cruised home a convincing victor. Hymn Book, who was far out of it early after a bad break but caught announcer Tom Durkin's eye when he produced his run, settled for a clear-cut second.

"That was fabulous! What a great day!," beamed Ritvo. "He likes to be here, likes the racetrack here, and we're really happy to be here. He ran a great race. We're so excited. We're going to take it slow and see what happens. We'll make sure he comes back great and we'll look again [at what's next]."

Trainer Shug McGaughey offered of the runner-up, "I thought he ran great. It's just a shame we gave up that much at the break. He stumbled leaving there, and by the time [jockey Alan Garcia] had him gathered up they were going pretty fast. He just got too far out of it to try to make up that much ground against that kind of horses. He passed all of them but one. I'm disappointed because I think if he could have been in a good position then he would have had a chance, but I'm pleased with the way he ran."

Dropped back a furlong for Newbury's Listed Lord Weinstock Memorial S. last time June 14, the homebred full-sister to Nathaniel (Ire) showed a professional attitude as well as confirming her liking for easy ground when making all there. Repeating the dose stepped up in class and taking on her elders on highly favorable weight-for-age terms in this prestigious affair, the bay had little difficulty in emulating her three-parts sister Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)--later a record-setting \$10.5-million broodmare--who took this for the Gosden stable in 2006. Asked to extend by Robert Havlin as the pace pressure Shimmering Surf began to challenge more seriously in early stretch, she kept pulling out more to lengthen the gap and was geared down late for an impressive success. **Cont. p13**

"She went a good gallop and I gave her a squeeze early enough, as she stays well and was getting a lot of weight for the older fillies, so we decided to make that count," Havlin explained. She likes to gallop along and is a no-nonsense filly who is resilient and very tough, but she is definitely a filly who has some class. She doesn't have to make the running and, although at home she is full of herself and bounces around like Nathaniel, when she gets to the races she is professional."

The bettors saw this event as merely a foregone conclusion for GII Woody Stephens S. winner Trinniberg, but Fort Loudon took it to the favorite early and often to post the minor upset. The latter swept last season's Florida Stallion Series, but checked in seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile to complete his 2-year-old campaign. He found Gulfstream's 3-year-old program a bit too tough, finishing fourth in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 29; fifth in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 26; and sixth in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 31. Turned back in distance and returned to Calder, Fort Loudon regained his best form, posting convincing successes in the May 12 In Summation S. and June 9 Unbridled S. leading up to this.

The overwhelming top two choices immediately hooked up, with Fort Loudon glued to Trinniberg's right flank through splits of :22 flat and :44 3/5. Trinniberg appeared to be going the better of the two at the head of the lane, but Fort Loudon re-engaged under a busy ride from Fernando Jara to wear down the favorite and pull somewhat clear in the waning stages. "We were pretty confident coming into this race, and we thought we had chance regardless of who was running; we just wanted to run our race," said Jara. "The only thing [trainer] Stanley [Gold] told me was to make sure that I didn't let [Trinniberg] go by himself, and I didn't. And my horse ran great like I knew he would. I've got a great horse." Willie Martinez, who was on the runner-up, offered, "That's horse racing, and nothing is guaranteed. The horse that beat us is a nice horse, and Fernando rode a great race. He kept the pressure on me and he wasn't going to let me loose."

Third in a Gulfstream \$50,000 maiden claimer Feb. 2 in her first try for Jerkens after an inauspicious three-race juvenile campaign in the Midwest, Emma's Encore graduated against fellow Florida-breds next out Feb. 24 before taking a starter optional claimer Mar. 14. She never factored when a well-beaten eighth of eight in the Mar. 31 GII Gulfstream Park Oaks, and was second last time going seven panels in an optional seller here May 16. The dark bay fired a four-furlong warning shot in :47 flat here July 3, but few heard it and she was dismissed as a decided outsider. Emma's Encore broke with the leaders, but couldn't keep up with the speed of Agave Kiss and Jamaican Smoke as that pair zipped off together through impossible splits of :21.46 and :44 flat. Jamaican Smoke put away the favorite at the head of the lane, but looked like she would face a tough test from Tu Endie Wei as Emma's Encore ran on an unassuming fourth. Jamaican Smoke dug deep to gamely keep Tu Endie Wei at bay past the eighth pole, but Emma's Encore flew home like a blur on the far outside to win going away in an absolute shocker. "I saw her break [on the television monitor], and then I couldn't find her because I didn't have the energy to walk out here," quipped Jerkens on the incredibly hot afternoon. I finally made it. I thought I was going to pull a Walter Brennan. Remember that movie ["Kentucky," released in 1938]? He died when he got to the winner's circle."

Jerkens continued, "[Agave Kiss] just went so fast. It's not speed favoring today, is it? A couple of times this meet, for some reason, jockeys go head and head and I don't know what it is. It's so nice to be back and win one. [Owner Brenda Mercer] sent her to me, I never knew the lady before, and then after she won she sold a half interest to Mr.

Berglar. I guess he's pretty happy now, too. I know I am."

While Jerkens admitted that his decision to enter

Emma's Encore in this spot was a bit ambitious, he said he will now consider the GI Prioress S. and/or the GI Test S. at Saratoga Aug. 4 and Aug. 25, respectively. Of the beaten favorite, pilot Ramon Dominguez offered, "We made the lead but got pressed a lot harder than I wanted, but turning for home she just seemed like she wasn't herself today. She was pretty energetic, even galloping out, but I'm sure the fractions weren't helpful at all."

With Pomodoro and Smanjemanje thrusting toward the line, an upset was assured in this highlight of the South African calendar, and it was the former who won the war of the pixels to provide owner Chris van Niekerk and trainer Sean Tarry with a first renewal. The winner's inflated odds were partly due to a latest flop when only fifth in this venue's G1 Daily News 2000 June 2, but on his previous start Pomodoro had dead-heated with Royal Bencher (SAf) (Greys Inn) in the G1 SA Derby at Turffontein Apr. 28. There was certainly no doubting his courageous nature, as he had been short-headed by Slumdogmillionaire (SAf) (Strike Smartly) in that track's G1 SA Classic the time before Mar. 31, and that inherent bravery was always going to count in the heat of this test. Nursed throughout the early stages by Piere Strydom, he was able to overcome the disadvantage of the widest draw to race in a prominent third after the first three furlongs. Committed on the front end with a quarter mile remaining, the bay was headed before the furlong pole, but kept battling to subdue Smanjemanje in the final stride. In a race dominated by big-priced outsiders, there was a feeling of anti-climax for supporters of the 9-5 favorite Jackson (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}). The G1 Cape Derby and G1 Daily News 2000 winner looked to be positioned ideally after getting across from his wide draw, but never threatened and beat only three rivals.

HOLY BULL PENSIONED

A veteran of the Darley at Jonabell stallion roster stole the show during the farm's annual stallion parade last night in Lexington. The Darley team sent 1994 Horse of the Year **Holy Bull** (Great Above--Sharon Brown, by Al Hattab) off to retirement in style with a video recapping the gray champion's celebrated racing career. "He was truly a world-class champion,"

Jonabell Farm's president Jimmy Bell said. "He was a rugged, throwback of a racehorse who captured the public's imagination. He was an old-time street fighter and what he loved more than anything was to run. He was a genuine champion. And we were so fortunate to have him standing at Jonabell. He was a tremendous anchor to our stallion roster."

Owned and trained by Hall of Famer Jimmy Croll, Holy Bull won the 1994 GI Florida Derby and GI Blue Grass S., but was a dull 12th as the favorite in that year's GI Kentucky Derby. He more than made up for that loss in the second half of his sophomore season, besting his elders in the GI Metropolitan H. and GI Woodward S. and beating up on his own generation with wins in the GI Haskell Invitational H. and GI Travers S. His eight

graded stakes wins that season earned him Eclipse statues as champion 3-year-old and Horse of the Year. Holy Bull retired with 13 wins from 16 starts and earnings of \$2,481,760.

At stud, Holy Bull sired 2005 Kentucky Derby winner Giacomo, as well as 2000 champion juvenile Macho Uno. He is also the sire of 2007 GI Stephen Foster H. winner Flashy Bull and 1998 GI Frizette S. winner Confessional. He is also the sire of Grade I winners Bishop Court Hill and Pohave. From 15 crops to race, Holy Bull has sired the earners of over \$45 million.

Holy Bull will live out his retirement at Jonabell.

JRHA SELECT SALE STARTS MONDAY

It's never easy to follow a smashing show. Whether on Broadway or at a horse sale, the expectations elevated by exceptional performances--such as the 2011 Japan Racing Horse Association Select Sale of yearlings and foals that generated turnover up 41.2% from the previous year and the highest gross since 2007--often prove difficult to match, much less exceed.

Consignors to this year's JRHA sale that begins with the yearling session on Monday know this fact of life well and are trying to keep their hopes in check. Yet they can't help sharing a swell of optimism that has been created as buyers have been knocking against farm doors in waves for nearly a month, eager to acquire promising young stock.

"There are many, many lookers around--maybe double the number of last year," said JRHA Vice Chairman Teruya Yoshida, owner of Shadai Farm, one of the perennial leading consignors. "We can feel there is a good demand. Some buyers have been inspecting the horses every week for a month. Last Monday, we had 18 groups come to the farm.

"They are welcome," he added with a smile that spread across his face and turned into a chuckle of delight.

A total of 250 yearlings and 226 foals have been catalogued for the two-day sale at the Northern Horse Park on the island of Hokkaido, with pedigrees that virtually span the globe. **Cont. p20**

In addition to the 14 yearlings and 16 foals in the catalog by Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who has risen to be the world's current leading sire by progeny earnings this year even though his oldest offspring are just four, other sires represented include: European champion Sea The Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), ranked the world's best racehorse of 2009, who will have his first yearling worldwide offered for auction, a colt who is a half-brother to European champion juvenile Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}); Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}), the world's best runner of 2010, who has 21 foals from his first crop catalogued, including a filly out of a half-sister to two-time leading Japanese sire King Kamehameha (Jpn) (Kingmambo) bred and consigned by Runnymede Farm of Paris, Kentucky, and partner, Peter Callahan; Empire Maker (Unbridled), currently North America's second leading sire, who has 11 members of his initial crop of Japanese foals in the catalog, and Sunday Silence's now pensioned champion son Fuji Kiseki (Jpn), Japan's and the world's fifth leading sire of 2012, who has 13 yearlings from his final crop in the catalog.

With Japanese bloodlines gaining more acceptance worldwide as Japanese-bred runners continue to win major stakes around the globe, about 10 international buyers have registered for the JRHA sale from Australia, Hong Kong, Singapore and other areas. They have come even though prices will be at a premium since they are partly based on the fact that Japanese racing features the world's best prize money structure.

New domestic buyers also are expected to jump into the bidding.

"Luckily, we have many buyers coming in and many new clients will come," said Shunsuke Yoshida of perennial leading consignor Northern Farm, which is owned by his father, Katsumi Yoshida, the younger brother of Teruya Yoshida.

"Northern Farm has everything for buyers," he added, noting the farm's range of horses that will enter the sale ring, from those with no reserve up to those with reserve prices of ¥70 million (about \$876,292).

"It's really difficult to predict," Yoshida said when asked how the sale would unfold. "We never expected that [huge upswing] last year, so to keep to that same level is difficult. A little dip would be acceptable."

Northern Farm, which began showing yearlings on the sale grounds on July 7, leads all consignors with a total of 141 horses, or about 30% of the catalog. Shadai Farm is next with 86 total, with the other farms owned by members of the Yoshida family, Oiwake and Shiraoi, adding 10 and 16 more, respectively. Altogether, the Yoshidas' powerful Shadai Group, which controls as many quality mares as any breeding operation in the world, has consigned 53.2% of the horses in the sale.

The Yoshidas' dominance of the market traditionally has overshadowed and indeed at times overwhelmed smaller breeders and consignors. But this year at least one of those smaller breeders is anticipating a boost.

Irish-born veterinarian Harry Sweeney, who runs Paca Paca Farm, is hopeful that since he sold this year's G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) winner Deep Brillante (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) as a foal at this venue in 2009, buyers will be more receptive than ever to his horses.

"I think it will make a difference. We've had loads and loads of people come to the farm to look at the horses," said Sweeney, who has seven yearlings and eight foals in the catalog under the Paca Paca name. "While I don't know what the sale will be like, I see no reason it will be bad. There is more optimism in Japan now after years of a bad economy. I think people are starting to think, 'If we have money now, why wait? Let's enjoy it and spend it.'"

Among the Paca Paca horses is the Sea The Stars colt, who was bred in Ireland by S.F. Bloodstock, and a filly foal who is a full-sister to Deep Brillante.

"She's been very well received on the farm," Sweeney said of the filly, adding that the son of Sea The Stars "is a big strong colt."

A few keys to the sale could be that the overall economy in Japan is improving and the yen remains very strong. Additionally, several 2-year-old in training sales yielded robust returns earlier this year, noted Naohiro Goda, an international sales and racing consultant to the JRHA who helps coordinate foreign buyers and media.

Yet Goda cautioned against too much optimism.

"The market was so strong last year that it will be difficult to maintain that level," he said. **Cont. p21**

Her dam, Mandela, was Classic-placed in Germany and also placed in graded/group stakes in the United States and France, and she is a half-sister to Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), who was rated 2007's best runner on the World Thoroughbred Rankings. Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm acquired Mandela for \$1.4 million at the 2007 Keeneland November sale from the Three Chimneys Farm consignment. "She's a gorgeous filly with a good temperament," said Shunsuke Yoshida of Northern Farm. Her reserve is set at ¥60 million (about US\$751,107).

The Kadina dinner had been organized for weeks and was planned around the routine business visit of Inglis auctioneer and bloodstock agent Simon Vivian.

However, with the death of the Toole family's much-loved stallion only days before, the get together suddenly had much more meaning. As the tears fell, Vivian implored the Tooles not to be embarrassed, to allow the grieving process and as horsemen to share the loss of a good mate.

In doing this, the men celebrated one of racing's great charms--its ability to remember its past and hail its greats, and to balance what happens at the height of the contest with the fierce competitiveness of the toughest game of all: breeding and racing.

This kind of memory has its own profound beauty, its own symmetry. It happened for Blevic Saturday--and for the saddened Tooles, whose faces were suddenly wreathed in the smiles that come with winning.

Seven days on it was one of the Tooles' and Blevic's better days.

In Adelaide, Blevic's 2-year-old daughter Little Less Lip (Aus) (\$3.30), owned by the Tooles, thrilled them with a fast-finishing win at her first try. An hour or so later, son Glaneuse (Aus) (\$31) lit up wintry Flemington with a bold rush to take out the main race of the day, the Winter Championship, a listed race over 1600 meters.

Glaneuse (Aus)'s win gave us more symmetry--he won the same race 12 months ago for his bush trainer Mick O'Leary, a local of southeast South Australia with the face and manner of County Kildare that only reminds us of the importance of the Irish heritage in Australian racing.

The Irish would say this Blevic double was probably always meant to be. Racing law is logical even if two and two often make five. The progeny of a recently deceased stallion will always win soon after his death.

Like a race in Sydney half an hour later. Stout Hearted, by the recently deceased Dynaformer, came into a 1400-meter event as another imported stayer resuming in a probably unsuitable race. Australian racing is becoming blasé about foreign-bred horses because of the endless shuttle stallion foals and the rush of our buyers to European and American-tryed horse sales looking for a staying horse that can win a Melbourne Cup. Stout Hearted fits that category, and began at an overnight price of (\$15) for Sydney's premier trainer Chris Waller. Before the race there wasn't any fuss about him. But he came down the outside at Rosehill like a true, fast stayer, and all that will change as we build towards the Spring Cups. And if the 4-year-old gelding--who ran at Royal Ascot just over a year ago--goes farther, like winning his next start, he will be all the rage. Dynaformer, incidentally, was celebrated here as the sire of 2010 G1 Melbourne Cup winner and top sort Americain.

If Stout Hearted can repeat Americain's performance for Dynaformer, then he will become a legendary sire here, as well as in the U.S.

Now that's balance; that's symmetry after death.

SYMMETRY IS NOT JUST A GREAT NAME FOR A RACEHORSE

At a dinner in the South Australian outback this week, soft tears were shed by hard men, embarrassed by their grieving as they toasted one of Australia's good bush sires, Blevic (Aus) (Scenic Ire), who had died just days before aged 20.

The Toole family of Kambula Stud near Kadina, a town resting on the remote coast of Yorke Peninsula, more famous for its wheat and sheep than Thoroughbred horse flesh, had stood the Robert Sangster Victoria Derby winner without much fanfare since he went to stud in 1996.

They had stretched their bank balance to buy 50% of him, watched his fashionableness rise and fall, welcomed breeders who had battled the dusty roads in their ute's and trailers to bring their favorite mares to the A\$5,000 court of the grandson of Sadler's Wells, who repaid the faithful by generating the winners of A\$20 million, starring 25 stakes horses. That kind of record is not easy given the vast distances and the unfashionable territory, let alone the bush mares who made up the greater part of his harem.

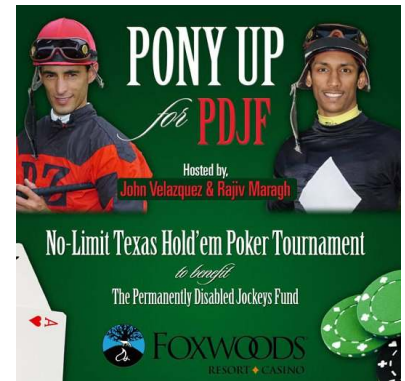

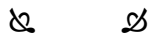

IT'S A KINDA MAGIC

KZN racing and breeding has been riding an unprecedented wave of euphoria and success this past week. The Bloodstock South Africa Suncoast KZN Yearling Sale, which concluded its two-day run Friday, has blown all the gloomy economic predications out of the water. The overall sales aggregate for the sale was R13,020,000 (*US\$1,579,041*), compared to R7,762,000 in 2011, while the average jumped a whopping 52% from R45,392 last year to R68,889 (*US\$8,354*). The last time results like that were seen was in 2008, when the overall aggregate for the sale reached a staggering R18,264,500.

The two-day sale was topped by a son of Trippi, who attracted a sales-record final bid of R1.1 million (*US\$133,406*) from L J Erasmus. Consigned by Highlands Farms, [hip 231](#) is out of the unraced mare Fragrant Filly (SAf) (Model Man {Saf}), a daughter of champion Scented Royal (Saf) (Royal Prerogative {GB}). Erasmus was also the top purchaser at the sale, buying 11 lots for an average of R141,858.

Two KZN-based sires topped the sales averages. King of Kings (Ire), this year's leading 2-year-old sire, was the sale's leading sire with 20 lots averaging R71,000. America's 2006 turf champion Miesque's Approval was next on the list, with 15 lots averaging R85,667.

What was extremely encouraging to many KZN breeders is that several of the top buyers were prominent Cape-based trainers. Vaughan Marshall purchased two lots for R225,000 each and Dean Kannemeyer bought three lots for R100,000.

Bloodstock South Africa's Tom Callaghan was delighted at the results of the sale. "It has been a resounding success," Callaghan said. "We were almost R5 million up from last year, we reached an average of R68,000 and the median will be a lot higher than last year, obviously, with the sales topper of R1.1 million which is unreal." **Cont. p8**

Callaghan also paid tribute to the team at KZN Breeders, adding that he believed the Triple Million was a huge incentive for buyers. Callaghan said that he believed the added incentive of horses that passed through the yearling sales, and whose dams are registered in the province under the Breeders Premium scheme, being able to compete for potentially R3 million in earnings over the next few years is a massive draw card for breeders and potential owners.
