JRHA SALE HAS INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR By Michele MacDonald

Ever since it was inaugurated in 1998, the Japan Racing Horse Association Select Sale has served as Japan's elite market for young stock while featuring unique bidding fireworks and sometimes world records, particularly during Sunday Silence's heyday as a super sire.

With the hammer about to bang open the 15th edition of the auction beginning at 10 a.m. July 9 with a session of yearlings at the Northern Horse Park on the island of Hokkaido, a new and more global chapter seems poised to unfold.

International buyers could become significant players, led by Australians Paul Fudge and Phil

Sly, who learned just days ago that they had won approval from the Japan Racing Association for highly coveted racing licenses in the world's most lucrative prizemoney jurisdiction. The licensing process took most of one year to complete.

American bloodstock agent David Ingordo will be advising Fudge and his Waratah Thoroughbreds operation after spending the last two weeks in Australia assessing Fudge's bloodstock holdings. Fudge, who has been listed by *Forbes* as one of the top 40 wealthiest Australians, was a major buyer at Tattersalls and Arqana in Europe last fall.

"I'm excited about it," Ingordo said during the JRHA presale welcome party on July 8 after inspecting yearlings earlier in the day with Fudge, including a filly by Special Week (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) out of a half-sister to Grade I winner Golden Ballet (Moscow Ballet), dam of GI Belmont S. and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor).

Ingordo, who said he has a variety of international clients including some Saudi Arabians, declared that he wants to "be a big game hunter" in Japan.

"I want to play to win," added Ingordo, who also will keep his eyes on other possibilities. "I'd love to find a Sunday Silence-line horse to bring home (to the United States) to stand at stud."

Inglorious, last season's Queen's Plate heroine, flattened out and had to settle for third. "We got stopped coming to the straight and she just picked it up very nicely on this turf," said winning rider Julien Leparoux. "I was happy where I was. She was relaxed, and she was just waiting for me to make a move. She wanted it, most importantly." Cont. p9

Meanwhile, Sly said the JRA license “changes a whole lot” because being able to race for the large Japanese purses validates the high prices demanded by the best yearlings and foals at the JRHA sale. Sly is the managing co-owner of four-time Australian Group 1-winning filly Mosheen (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and earlier this year sold a half-interest in the 4-year-old to leading Japanese breeder and owner Katsumi Yoshida.

Last year, in their first foray to the JRHA sale, Sly purchased a yearling filly by Fuji Kiseki (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) from Yoshida’s Northern Farm consignment; while

Fudge bought fillies by King Kamehameha (Jpn) (Kingmambo) and Storming Home (GB) (Machiavellian).

Only seven JRA licenses have been granted to foreign-based owners to date, including three to Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum, his wife, Princess Haya bint al Hussein of Jordan, and his son, Dubai Crown Prince Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed.

Some foreign-based sellers also will be involved at this year’s JRHA sale, including SF Bloodstock, which will offer the first yearling by European champion Sea The Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in any auction worldwide, a colt who is a half-brother to European juvenile champion and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). SF also will offer a colt it bred in Kentucky by A. P. Warrior out of GI Mother Goose S. winner Nonsuch Bay (Mr. Greeley), with both colts consigned through Irish native Harry Sweeney’s Paca Paca Farm.

Tom Ryan of SF Bloodstock said the JRHA market was specially chosen for the Sea The Stars colt, who is one of four yearlings by the sire owned by SF; each will be offered in a different international venue, with the others set for Tattersalls’ October sale in Newmarket, Arqana’s Deauville sale and Keeneland’s September auction.

“I don’t think anyone could fault his pedigree,” Ryan said of the JRHA-consigned colt, who in addition to Mastercraftsman is a half brother to American Grade III winner Genuine Devotion (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and to Irish Group 1-placed Famous (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

With the Japanese yen strong and a steady stream of prospective buyers inspecting horses, an upbeat mood seemed to prevail on the eve of the sale, which will conclude with a session of foals on July 10.

Among those examining yearlings was top buyer Nobutaka Tada, whose Globe Equine Management purchased, as agent, last year’s record-setting yearling, a ¥360 million (\$4,390,243) filly by Deep Impact (Jpn), as well as 2011’s highest-priced foal.

“It’s a nice catalog, as always,” said Tada. “There are some very good horses.”

Both Katsumi Yoshida and his brother, Teruya, the vice chairman of the JRHA and owner of Shadai Farm, smiled and laughed as they mingled with guests at the welcome party and expressed optimism.

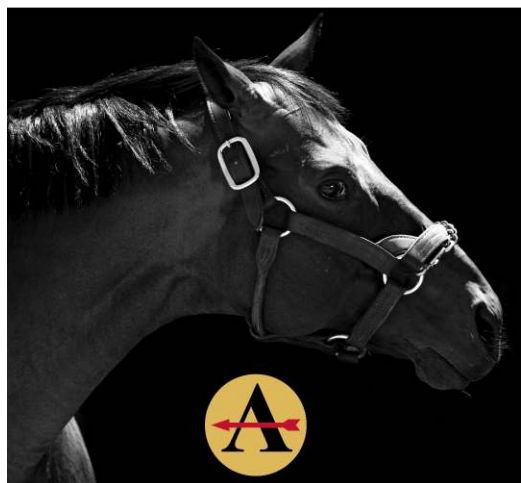
“I expect a strong market,” declared Katsumi Yoshida, whose Northern Farm leads all consignors with 71 yearlings and 70 foals catalogued for the sale and typically ranks as the leading consignor each year by gross. “I have seen lots of buyers at the sale grounds and at the farm, so we are confident.”

JRHA Select Sale--Tuesday--Foal Session

Hip 327, c, Deep Impact (Jpn)--Sky Diva, by Sky Mesa
Consigned by Northern Farm

This flashy bay is the first foal produced by 2008 G1 Frizette S. winner Sky Diva, who finished third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and is a half-sister to GISP winner Quick Little Miss (Freud). Sky Diva's granddam produced Pure Clan (Pure Prize), winner of two Grade I races and nearly \$2 million. This is also the family of champion What a Summer (What Luck). "He has good size and is bigger than the typical foal by Deep Impact," said Tomakazu Okazaki of Northern Farm. The colt enters the ring with a reserve price of ¥70 million (about \$876,292), the highest for any of Northern's 70 catalogued foals.

**Hip 349, f, War Emblem--
 Vin de Noir (Jpn), by Hector Protector**
Consigned by Northern Farm

This filly is an unusual commodity due mainly to the notoriously shy breeding habits of her dual American Classic-winning sire. Also making the bay filly special is the fact that her full sister Black Emblem (Jpn) won the 2008 G1 Shuka Sho, the last jewel of Japan's filly Triple Crown; and another full-sister, Peace Emblem, is a four-time winner. This is also the family of Group 2 winner Narita Century (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}) and Japanese Classic-placed, stakes-winning filly Nishino Nurse Call (Jpn) (Brian's Time).

Hip 356, c, Deep Impact--Pretty Carina, by Seeking the Gold
Consigned by Northern Farm

The success registered by Darley's Bernardini will be a plus for this colt, who claims that top young sire's dam, GISW winner Cara Rafaela (Quiet American), as his third dam. Produced Mar. 6 by Pretty Carina, a half-sister to American GISP stakes winner Love and Pride (A.P. Indy), the colt also has graded stakes winners Thiskyhasnolimit (Sky Mesa) and Abaginone (Devil's Bag) in his female family. Northern Farm owner Katsumi Yoshida bought Pretty Carina for \$435,000 from the Stud TNT dispersal at the 2010 Keeneland November sale and she produced a Tiznow colt last year in Japan.



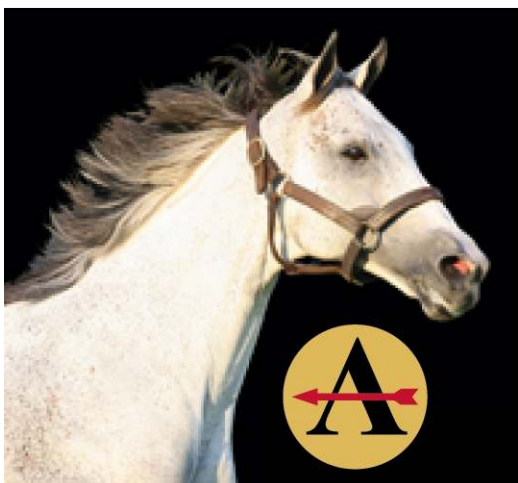

Hip 361, c, Neo Universe (Jpn)--Buy the Sport, by Devil's Bag
Consigned by Shadai Farm

Produced by the 2003 GI Gazelle H. winner who was sold by Adena Springs to Shadai for \$1.4 million at the 2007 Keeneland November sale, this colt is a half-brother to stakes winner Lord Justice (A.P. Indy) and stakes-placed Crimson Glory (Ghostzapper) as well as to Japanese winners Cream Soda (Jpn) (Unbridled's Song) and Nihonno Chikara (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}). He is a correct and stylish son of the sire of G1 Dubai World Cup winner Victoire Pisa (Jpn) and has a reserve price of ¥30 million (about \$375,553).

Hip 374, c, Kurofune--Fusaichi Airedale (Jpn), by Sunday Silence
Consigned by Northern Farm

This full-brother to 2005 Japanese champion Fusaichi Richard (Jpn) will need little introduction at the sale. The produce of his dam, a four-time stakes winner and earner of more than \$3.5 million, has been very popular in the JRHA ring, with Fusaichi Richard selling for \$837,563 as a foal in 2003; Scion (Jpn), another full-brother, selling as a yearling for \$1,133,603 in 2007; and Zenno Ruggero (Jpn), a half-brother by Symboli Kris S, bringing \$1,052,631 in 2009 as a yearling.

Hip 399, f, Empire Maker--Two Item Limit, by Twining
Consigned by Symboli Stud

One of 11 foals entered in the sale from the first Japanese crop by Empire Maker (Unbridled), this bay is out of the 2001 Illinois Horse of the Year, a Grade I winner and millionaire. She is a half-sister to GSW Arena Elvira (Ghostzapper) and to multiple Japanese winner Sir Lancelot (Jpn) (Bernardini). The filly is scheduled to come into the ring as the sixth foal in the catalog by Empire Maker, who has been very popular in Japan, setting records over the past two seasons for the number of mares covered by a stallion standing for the Japan Bloodstock Breeders Association. This season, he was bred to more than 250 mares.

Hip 410, c, Medaglia d'Oro--Roger's Sue, by Forestry
Consigned by Northern Farm

A half-brother to three-time GISW Turbulent Descent (Congrats), this dandy bay would be of great interest in

America and represents the rich female family of Broodmare of the Year Kamar (Key to the Mint) and Grade I winners Seaside Attraction (Seattle Slew), Gorgeous (Slew o' Gold), Swift Temper (Giant's Causeway) and Music Show (Noverre). The colt's dam was listed as an RNA at \$1 million during last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale, but was acquired by

Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm and sent to Hokkaido, where she delivered this colt Mar. 31.

Hip 445, filly, Deep Impact (Jpn)--Love and Bubbles, by Loup Sauvage
Consigned by Paca Paca Farm

While fillies often aren't held in as high regard as colts by buyers at this sale, this full-sister to recent G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) winner Deep Brillante (Jpn) has Classic written all over her catalog page. In addition to the Derby winner, she also is from the family of That's the Plenty (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}), winner of the Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger). Foaled Mar. 13, the filly will be the third foal out of her dam by Deep Impact to be offered at a JRHA sale, with Deep Brillante bringing \$326,315 in 2009 and the filly Hubble Bubble (Jpn), a group stakes-placed winner, fetching \$271,028 in 2008. Dr. Harry Sweeney, owner of Paca Paca, said the filly's reserve price is ¥70 million (about \$876,292). "She's very nice; there is great scope and range to her and she is very athletic," Sweeney said.

TDN's Gary King sits down with Harry Sweeney, owner of Paca Paca Farm. The farm has a strong consignment at the JRA Select Sale, including a Sea The Stars half-brother (yearling) to MG1SW Mastercraftsman, and a full-sister (foal) to recent G1 Japanese Derby winner, Deep Brillante.

It's a long way from Co. Louth, Ireland to Hokkaido, Japan. Where and when did it all begin?

HS: It began in 1990 by chance really. I was a veterinarian by profession, and got an offer out of the blue. I was newly married [to Anne] at the time, and thought it would be an adventure. A group of Japanese businessmen, staying at the newly opened five-star Westbury Hotel in Dublin, asked me to meet with them. There were very few five-star hotels in Ireland at the time, and I might never have got another chance to stay in one. Really, that was the main impetus for going to the meeting. To cut a long story short, they offered me a salary six-times greater than what I was earning, so it was an easy decision. We expected to stay a year, but 22 years later we're still here.

Your level of Japanese is very impressive. Have you struggled with any other aspects of the culture?

HS: My spoken Japanese is reasonably good, but it should be better. I don't read Japanese terribly well, and don't write it at all. I suppose the biggest thing you need to understand is that it's not possible for a foreigner to ever fully integrate into Japanese society. Foreigners will always be foreigners, and I'm comfortable with that. In many ways, there can be advantages to it. I break the rules sometimes, and proclaim that I didn't fully understand.

You were the first non-national to purchase agricultural land in Japan. Was it a difficult process?

HS: It was a relatively difficult process, as foreigners need government permission at a local municipal level.

Japan is far from self-sufficient, so agricultural land can be at a premium. I did get some advice, and had to organize the company in a way to remain culturally sensitive. We had a few Japanese directors at the time as well.

So is gets easier after the first purchase?

HS: Very easy. It's like everything else in Japan; once you're in the club, you're in it forever. The average farm size in Japan is about 25 acres, and we were lucky enough a few years back to purchase a much larger piece of land. It's about 400 acres in total with beautiful rolling hills, plenty of tree cover, and a fantastic history. As a consequence, we have been able to increase the number of boarding horses from clients in America, Europe, and the UAE.

There has been a tendency to prioritize foals at public auction in Japan. Has this shifted to yearlings over recent times?

HS: There has certainly been a shift towards buying yearlings. By virtue of Shadai [including Northern Farm], who dominate every aspect of business, telling owners and trainers that they should be buying yearlings. It's a relatively unsophisticated market, so people generally accept what Shadai say. While it's definitely easier for buyers to evaluate yearlings, it's important to realize that it's also easier for sellers. Interestingly, since the re-introduction of the yearling market there has only been one Group 1 winner sold, so the percentages are disappointing.

There have been lots of quality broodmares/stallion prospects sold to Japan recently. The industry must be booming over here?

HS: This is probably the one place in the world where the economics of racing/breeding make sense. Average prizemoney is close to \$350,000, which promotes strong foal and yearling prices. If you are unfortunate enough to have a horse that sustains an injury/breakdown at the track or training on JRA facilities, you receive compensation which can extend to \$60,000. Ultimately, it fuels the purchase of quality broodmares and stallion prospects from other jurisdictions. It's very interesting that I'll Have Another is coming to Japan [to stand at Big Red Farm], and is almost a Sunday Silence type story all over again. He was a highly successful racehorse just like Sunday Silence, but didn't really find appeal with American breeders.

Paca Paca Farm has now bred the Japanese Derby winner, Deep Brillante. What's next?

HS: The next thing is to breed another one. We had bred a Group 1 winner previously [Pink Cameo won G1 NHK Mile Cup], reared a Group 1 winner, and have had a champion 2-year-old. Paca Paca is competing against some major brands, who have numbers on their side, so it will be difficult. We are still a relatively small farm, and feel fortunate to have had 3 Group 1 winners so far.

You refer to these farms as brands. Is this something that's more prominent here than elsewhere?

HS: Absolutely. Brand power is very important in Japan, you will see it here at the sales. The horses from



Shadai [including Norther Farm] will sell for twice their worth. Fortunately, Deep Brillante's Derby success has significantly enhanced the Paca Paca brand. We have the first yearling by Sea The Stars to sell anywhere in the world at public auction. He's a lovely big strong horse, with a fantastic pedigree being a half-brother to

Mastercraftsman. Interestingly, we also sold the first Fusaichi Pegasus yearling a number of years ago.

What should the rest of the world know about the Japanese industry?

HS: Japan is open for business. It's all been done now, and it's a lot less intimidating than it used to be. Foreigners have bought farms, obtained JRA licenses, and bred Derby winners.

The more, the merrier it seems. Can Paca Paca Farm facilitate inward investment?

HS: We are very keen to do that, and have foreign partners in a number of mares. We are extremely happy to advise and encourage people to visit Japan. While we are breeders, we are also significantly involved with a racing stable. JRA licenses can be a little difficult to obtain, and a little tedious in many ways, especially for foreigners. There are a number of racing clubs in Japan, where non-registered owners can own 50% in any one horse. As you can imagine these are very popular with owners, and can simplify inward investment.

OKADA EXPECTING BIG THINGS FROM I'LL HAVE ANOTHER *By Michele MacDonald*

Big Red Farm owner Shigeyuki Okada has so much faith in his newly acquired stallion prospect,

"I am very confident as to his success as a stallion, similar to Sunday Silence," Okada said July 8 during the Japan Racing Horse Association Select Sale welcome party for consignors and buyers.

Okada said he paid \$10 million for the 3-year-old, who rose to Classic fame for former owner J. Paul Reddam following his acquisition as a juvenile for \$35,000. Reaction from other Japanese breeders has been so positive that Okada closed a 70-share syndication deal on I'll Have Another in three days while keeping 35 shares for himself and another 10 shares for his brother, Makio Okada, owner of Okada Stud. *cont.p8*

Scheduled to arrive at a Japanese quarantine facility on July 17 and at Big Red Farm on the island of Hokkaido in early August, I'll Have Another will cover a book of 120 or more mares next year, Okada said.

"I'd like to have him at the farm as early as possible. I'm looking forward to seeing him there," declared Okada, who stood 11 stallions at Big Red this season, led by G1 Dubai World Cup winner Roses in May, currently the 16th leading sire in Japan; two-time GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Conduit, whose first foals are yearlings; and international Group 1 winner Stay Gold, who ranks sixth on Japan's leading sire list.

"In this country, many mares are influenced by the blood of Sunday Silence," he noted. "So, whenever I think of stallions, I think, 'How will they work with the Sunday Silence blood?' The answer for these mares is I'll Have Another."

Okada said he studied videotapes of I'll Have Another's races and training prior to purchasing the colt and was impressed by his turn of foot and his physique.

"I loved his conformation and the fact that he has lots of quality muscle. He had good sprinting speed and power too," he said not long after a Japanese-based breeder approached him during the party and inquired about buying a share in the horse. "I said, 'No thanks. He is sold out,'" Okada related with a smile.

"Sunday Silence is the best stallion we have ever seen in this country," he added. "He was the winner of the first and second legs of the American Triple Crown. We've seen some other winners of these races, but they weren't as good. I'll Have Another was an outstanding winner of both races and he can be an outstanding stallion."

When he came back [in an optional claimer Feb. 26], Johnny [Velazquez] said they were all going a little bit earlier and he waited and got himself in trouble and finished fourth." The 4-year-old won against allowance company at Keeneland Apr. 12 before taking the Lexington oval's GII Elkhorn S. Apr. 27. "Keeneland were good races, and I just thought after I ran him back in 13 days, that I'd give him a bit of a blow here and, hopefully, have a fresh horse for the rest of the year. I think he's a true mile and three-eighths to a mile and a half kind of horse."

McGaughey also offered an update on GI Donn H. winner **Hymn Book** (Arch), second after stumbling badly at the start of Saturday's GII Suburban H. The Hall of Famer indicated the 6-year-old seemed to come back well and will target the Aug. 4 GI Whitney Invitational H. at the Spa. "I thought he ran a winning race [Sunday] and, if he comes out of it fine, I'm going to try to run him in the Whitney," said McGaughey. Explaining the trip, he added, "He kind of stumbled, and [Endorsement] sort of came out or in, I'm not sure which one it was. By the time Garcia got [Hymn Book] back together, he was out the back door somewhere. To make that kind of a long run at a horse who had kind of a perfect trip, you have to come around them all and it's difficult to catch up. I thought he ran awfully good, obviously you'd like to know if he'd been in the right decision, but we weren't and the winner was. It's disappointing to lose, but you can't be disappointed in the effort he put in. I think the winner is a nice horse. [Trainer Kathy Ritvo] has done a great job with him and I'm glad for her."

"He's not lame enough to use it as an excuse, but he was just too keen and didn't give himself a chance to run his race. We are back to the drawing board a little bit, but we will take stock, give him a break and try to get him sorted out."

Surgery for Field Commission...

Edward Seltzer and Larry Baum's **Field Commission** (Service Stripe) was expected to have surgery Sunday after sustaining a career-ending condylar fracture in his right hind leg during Saturday's GII Smile H. at Calder, reports *Daily Racing Form*. On the sidelines for 18 months following a fifth in Woodbine's GIII Kennedy Road S. in November 2010, the 2009 GII Nearctic S. winner returned to the races with a 3 1/4-length win in the Ponche H. at Calder June 9. STRAIGHT FROM THE HORSES MOUTH: A GREAT DAY IN THE COUNTRY

It has been nicknamed "racing's greatest day out" by the media, and despite the weather threatening to put a serious dent on the day's proceedings, the annual Summerhill Stud Stallion Day went off smoothly and without any hitches.

The day was held again this year at the Al Maktoum School of Excellence, the only facility of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere. The Summerhill Stallion Day has become something of a "must attend event," with people from over 20 nations in attendance, coming from far and wide to listen to and witness why Summerhill Stud has been South Africa's champion breeders for seven consecutive years.

This year witnessed the introduction of two new boys on the block to the stallion ranks; Traffic Guard, the 121 Timeform-rated son of More Than Ready and Golden Sword (GB), the G3 Chester Vase winner and son of the influential High Chaparral (Ire). CEO and owner Mick Goss regaled the assembled crowd with stories of the various stallions as they were led past by their handlers, and it is clear to see that he is a great marketer and raconteur.

The assembled crowd was then treated to a spellbinding dancing performance by the resident Summerhill Zulu dance troupe, who entertained with their enthralling and energetic routines. A three-course catered lunch followed inside a Bedouin style-tent attached to the school. This year, for the first time, the lunch was catered by well-known Hartford House celebrity chef Jackie Cameron. Jackie and her team have lead Hartford House to some impressive culinary accolades over the years, winning the 2010 Visa/House & Leisure best restaurant in KZN, as well as Eat Out top restaurant in the country for two years running in 2010 and 2011.

The Land of Legends, a collection of the top hotels and resorts around Kwa Zulu Natal then presented the Ingwazi awards to two people who have given exceptional service, not only to the tourism industry in KZN, but to the country as a whole. Past winners include: KZN Premier Dr. Zweli Mkhize, and the legendary conservationist Dr. Ian Player. This year the awards were posthumous: Francois Anthony, widow of the famed elephant whisperer Lawrence Anthony, accepted the first award on behalf of her late husband for his work in elephant conservation. The second award was accepted on behalf of the Rattray Family and its iconic head David Rattray, by famed storyteller and motivational speaker Rob Caskie.

David was known for his work not only as a tour guide of the battlefields of Isandlwana and Rorke's Drift, but for his lectures at the Royal Geographic Society in London, which attracted huge crowds. Rob was his protege and is a worthy successor to the title and mantle of storyteller.

The pace and excitement of the afternoon was kept up with an auction of stallion services and a massive bottle of L'Ormarins wine, autographed by Gaynor Rupert. Bidding was enthusiastic and steady throughout the sale, led by well-known racing commentator Graeme Hawkins. All monies raised in the stallion auction go to projects for the disadvantaged, and that knowledge certainly helped the bidding and the prices.

The day finished off with music by the well-known local musicians Afritude, who certainly managed to get the crowds dancing along to their tunes.

The Summerhill Stallion day is an event which is worthy of its billing as racing's greatest day out, and the whole team is to be congratulated for its organization and staging of a magnificent day.
