FULL RECOVERY EXPECTED FOR RAGS

Chadds Ford Stable's **Union Rags** (Dixie Union), last-out winner of the GI Belmont S., is expected to make a full recovery from what has been deemed a "small lesion of his high suspensory." According to a release from Dr. Kathleen Anderson, an ultrasound conducted July 10 suggested that the injury was brand new and most likely occurred in a July 6 workout at his Fair Hill base [five furlongs in a bullet 1:00.60]. "The prognosis for full return to racing is excellent, and he is scheduled to undergo treatment and therapy immediately with the goal of keeping his options open for 2013," Dr.

Anderson's statement continued. "Needless to

say, his owners, trainer and all connections are extremely disappointed with this turn of events, but we believe that this early diagnosis and treatment combined with rest will ultimately favor his full recovery and future success." Winner of the GI Champagne S. and a tough-luck second to Hansen (Tapit) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Union Rags found more trouble when seventh in the GI Kentucky Derby May 5 ahead of his Belmont victory.

A GIFTED OPPORTUNITY

Today's G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket can act as a consolation prize for those who have just missed out on success at the highest level over middle distances, and one who fits that bill is **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). Ronnie Arculli's improved 6-year-old, who was just a nose away from a memorable victory in the latest renewal of the G1 Melbourne Cup, has adapted into a 12-furlong runner with great credit after taking the May 18 G2 Yorkshire Cup. Finishing runner-up to two of the sport's leading flagbearers over that trip St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}), respectively, in the June 2 G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom and June 23 G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot, he meets far lesser rivals today. "We have a three-pound penalty to contend with for his Yorkshire Cup win, but he's in good form and the ground is suitable for him, so we'll give it a go," Dunlop told *PA Sport*. "Our form is rock solid and he has obviously improved enormously this year. This will probably be his last run for a while, before we start thinking about Australia again, but we'll see." **Cont. p3**

Marco Botti saddles a duo capable of getting in the mix in **Jakkalberry** and **Joshua Tree**, whose best form lie overseas. The former, who took the 2010 G1 Gran Premio di Milano and last year's G3 Premio Carlo d'Alessio, was third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan Mar. 31 before a latest fifth in the Hardwicke.

"Jakkalberry has come out of Royal Ascot in good order," his conditioner confirmed. "I think that he has definitely come on for his run in the Hardwicke. We gave him a break after he came back from Dubai and that race will have brought him on. His run in the Dubai Sheema Classic, when he had ideal conditions, was probably his best run to date. We are aiming him at the Melbourne Cup this year, and there are a couple of options before then. He could head to Chicago in August [Aug. 18 G1 Arlington Million] or the Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury."

The 2010 Canadian International hero and 2011 runner-up Joshua Tree has recorded only one win in the interim and looks exposed at this point with a latest fourth in the June 10 G1 Gran Premio di Milano below this standard. "He is a solid old horse and he ran some nice races out in Dubai at the start of the year," Botti added. "We are keen to get a run into him, because we want to keep him fit for the new race on the Arlington Million card over a mile, and 5 1/2 furlongs. He's a horse who takes a lot of work, so we need to run him to keep him fit."

THE JULY CLASS

With the momentum about to swing toward the later-developing juveniles, today's G2 July S. at Newmarket affords the precocious types one of their last chances to shine and **Sir Prancealot (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}) is in pole position. Impressive when registering an initial black-type success in Sandown's Listed National S. over five furlongs May 31, the Richard Hannon trainee was the subject of heavy support when fourth as the 3-1 favorite for the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot last time June 19. Hannon also saddles Sheikh Hamdan bin Al Maktoum's Listed Windsor Castle S. runner-up **Alhebayeb (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}). "We have two solid chances," said Hannon. "Sir Prancealot was very impressive when overcoming traffic problems to win the National S. at Sandown, but the cards did not fall his way in the Coventry at Royal Ascot, though he still finished a creditable fourth. Our initial reaction was to drop back to five furlongs, but he won going away at Sandown, where there is a stiff uphill climb at the finish, so it is worth trying six again. Alhebayeb was doing all his best work at the end when runner-up in the Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot, so looks one who will definitely appreciate going in trip."

Aidan O'Brien sends across Michael Tabor's **Gale Force Ten (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who lost out by just 3/4 of a length when second to Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in Royal Ascot's G2 Norfolk S. in five furlongs when last seen June 21. That race, in which the re-opposing **Ahern (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) was fifth, has already received a boost as the fourth Morawij (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) was the impressive winner of a listed race last week. Anthony Hogarth's **Birdman (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) is an unexposed type who takes a leap forward after easy wins in minor contest at Brighton June 1 and Chepstow a fortnight later.

Fifth in the May 26 G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. at The Curragh, Marvada improved to run second--behind tomorrow's G1 Falmouth S. contender Alanza (Ire) (Dubai Destination)--in the June 14 G3 Ballycorus S. at Leopardstown last time, and continued on the upgrade in this rescheduled distaffers' event. Settled second, but allowing Caprella a clear lead by halfway, she came under pressure to close with three furlongs remaining and kept on resolutely under a final-quarter drive to prevail in the dying strides to claim her first black-type score. "Marvada is like a blue-collar worker, who has worked her way up and has done it the hard way," trainer Ken Condon told [irishracing.com](#). "She wasn't mad about the ground, but she's nothing if not genuine and honest, and showed a will to win in the last 50 yards. She has turned up in all the races and deserved that. We knew she would get one eventually as she is not afraid of hard graft and hard work. We'll look at the [Aug. 23 G3] Fairy Bridge S. [at Tipperary] and races like that. She'll get an entry for the [Sept. 8 G1] Matron S. [at Leopardstown] and she might take her chance if there's just seven or eight runners. It's only up the road and she likes Leopardstown."

QUIET START NOT HELPED BY WITHDRAWALS

Following a subdued broodmare session, it took a 5-year-old gelding to top day one of Tattersalls' July sale when the 99-rated **Rodrigo De Torres (GB)** (Bahamian Bounty {GB}--Leonica {GB}, by Lion Cavern)

was knocked down for 75,000gns, significantly below last year's top price for the equivalent day's trade of 175,000gns. The aggregate fell by 39% to 1,371,300gns, with the average also down to 9,329gns from last year's figure of 13,804gns. A positive from the day, however, was the improvement in clearance

rate to 81% from 78%. Bought by sprint king David 'Dandy' Nicholls from his fellow Yorkshire trainer Elaine Burke, Rodrigo De Torres could well be bound for next year's Dubai International Racing Carnival.

"There are one or two people in the pipeline to own him," said Nicholls. "I'll have a chat with Karl [Burke, husband of Elaine] first, but I'd like to take him somewhere like Dubai. He's a nice horse and a sound horse, but we'll take things day by day." Nicholls has a well-earned reputation as a trainer who excels with second-hand horses, with notable successes being his dual Group 1 winner Regal Parade (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), a 430,000gns yearling whom he bought for 16,000gns as a 3-year-old, and G1 Darley July Cup winner Continent (GB) (Lake Coniston {Ire}), a 40,000gns purchase.

Qatar's champion trainer Jassim Al Ghazali is a regular buyer at Tattersalls, and he swooped late in the day to secure 2-year-old **Botanic Garden (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB})--who won a five-furlong Chester maiden in June for trainer David Brown--for 45,000gns. Despite signing for five horses on the day, Al Ghazali expressed regret at the high number of withdrawals in the sale, with 79 scratched on the first day alone.

"I wish Tattersalls could change the rules so that horses are withdrawn no later than a week before the sale," he said. "It's a shame when we come all this way that there are lots of horses not here."

Al Ghazali's previous purchases at Tattersalls include Ladyanne (Ire) (Redback {GB}), who cost 30,000gns as a juvenile and went on to win the Qatar Derby, while Flying Destination (GB) (Dubai Destination), bought at the same October Horses-In-Training Sale in 2010 for an identical amount, won the Qatar International Cup.

For much of the day, it looked as though there would be a four-way tie for top billing with the fillies **Moment Juste (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), **Life is Golden** (Giant's Causeway), **Sonning Rose (Ire)** (Hawk Wing) and **Trail Of Tears (Ire)** (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) each selling for 42,000gns. The well-related 4-year-old Moment Juste, a half-sister to Imperial Stride (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and High Pitched (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) from the good Cliveden Stud family which includes Indian Haven (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), Daggers Drawn (Diesis {GB}) and Kite Wood (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), held sway early in the proceedings after selling to Hubie de Burgh on behalf of an unnamed Australian breeder. Life is Golden had made \$190,000 when sold as a yearling at Keeneland September, but--offered unraced from David Wachman's stable--the 3-year-old could recoup only part of that sum when knocked down to agent Johnny McKeever. Out of Ruthless S. winner Lizzy Cool (Saint Ballado), she is a half-sister to the listed-winning and Grade II-placed Cool Bullet (Red Bullet).

Mick Channon's West Ilsley Stables consigned the Chesham S. runner-up Sonning Rose (Ire) (Hawk Wing), who was bought by Anthony Stroud and was the third filly to reach the 42,000gns mark, and the quartet was completed by a member of the Darley draft, Trail of Tears (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who was signed for by Cormac McCormack on behalf of an Irish client.

Betfair founder Andrew 'Bert' Black, who co-owns Tom Dascombe's Manor House Stables and tasted success as an owner/breeder at Royal Ascot with the G2 Queen Mary S. winner Ceiling Kitty (GB) (Red Clubs {Ire}), added another to his burgeoning broodmare band following his purchase of Moonlight Red (Ire) (Kheleyf) for 40,000gns through Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock. Sold in foal to Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), Moonlight Red was offered by The Castlebridge Consignment on behalf of Tinnakill House Stud. her future foal will be inbred 3x3 to Green Desert. Though leaving the ring unsold, the Barathea (Ire) mare Dress Code (Ire), in foal to Dutch Art (GB) (Medicean {GB}), has found her way to Whitsbury Manor Stud after being bought privately by Ed Harper for 35,000gns. **Cont. p9**

“It’s a family we know well, because a client of ours boarded [Dress Code’s dam] Petite Epaulette (GB) (Night Shift) with us for a long time,” said Harper. “She became a real favourite and she produced gorgeous foals. I’ve always been looking to get into the family, and with Dutch Art’s rise I thought I couldn’t go too far wrong there. Plus, Barathea and Petite Epaulette’s sire Night Shift are two of my favourite broodmare sires.”

Among the many international visitors in attendance at Park Paddocks, a new name on the buyers’ list was the Mongolian Jockey Club, who are being assisted in starting a broodmare band by James Wigan. They signed for four lots, including the winning 4-year-old filly Izzy the Ozzy (Ire) (Encosta De Lago {Aus}) for 4,500gns; and Reside (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who sold in foal to Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) for 6,000gns.

CHANGES TO THE FRENCH PREMIUMS EXPLAINED
by *Claude Beniada*

Recently, it was announced that there will be changes to the distribution of premiums to French-bred horses in open races (not races restricted to French-breds). These have two goals:

1) to give more opportunities to moderate horses to cover their training fees with higher allocations earlier in their career (presently an owner recovers about 50% on average) and to reach a coverage level of 70%. For this, two measures have been decided: the premiums for 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds and 4-year-olds will be at 64% (it used to be 75% for 2-year-olds, 63% for 3-year-olds and 48% for 4-year-olds and up). Premiums for 5-year-olds and up go from 48% to 43%. This will be effective in 2013.

2) to try to have breeders use more French-based stallions. Therefore, the premiums to breeders have been changed. These used to be 14% for all horses considered French-bred, but will now be 10% for all horses assimilated French-breds and 15% for those conceived in France. This will be effective for the crop born in 2014.

The conditions to be assimilated French-bred are stricter than before. To be considered a French-bred, a foal must have stayed at least seven months in France with his dam with the possibility for the dam to leave the country only between Jan. 15-July 15. France Galop’s President Belinguier explained, “More and more mares go abroad to be bred, and the French-bred concept was less and less acceptable to some breeders. There was a strong demand to favour the French breeding industry, but we also had it in mind not to go towards protectionism, as we live in an open world even if some countries have a better program for breeders and owners. With this new rule on French-breds, we want to avoid the scenario that some mares spend only 15 days in France so that the foal can be considered a French-bred.” Of the creation of a France Galop fund to help breeders with loans in order to buy or rent a stallion, he added, “France Galop has no intention to become a stallion owner, and that is not its duty. We have created this fund to facilitate the buying or renting of top stallions. They will be temporary loans to breeders who need to act quickly.”

Some of France’s top breeders have reacted to these new measures by leaving the French Breeders’ Syndicate. One was His Highness The Aga Khan’s Studs and the Racing Manager Georges Rimaud. “We have resigned from the French Breeders’ Syndicate because we feel that we are no longer represented in the Syndicate decisions, as the measure voted for by the Board of France Galop was unanimous,” explained Rimaud. “This means that it has been voted by the French Breeders’ representative on the board. As we feel that we are no longer represented by the Syndicate, we preferred to resign. I do not want to appear as the leader of a dissident group. The subject today is not about creating a new syndicate. The subject is that the measure that has been voted upon leads toward destroying a model that is functioning perfectly well economically. To change the system without good economic reason seems totally improper.”

In a piece published this Tuesday in *Jour de Galop*, the French Breeders’ Syndicate states that it has 2,200 active members and that 80% of them approve of the new measures. The place of birth or the country where the mare was bred has no impact on the owners’ premiums whatsoever. Compared to the ancient 14% premium to the breeders, it will be only 1% more for those using stallions standing in France and 28% less for those using stallions abroad.

NUTELLO LOOKING SWEET FOR GRAND PRIX

Following yesterday's forfeit and supplementary stage for Saturday's €600,000 G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris, three were added to the field--at a cost of €36,000 each--and a maximum nine sophomore colts will go postward for the 12-furlong Longchamp feature. **Nutello** (Lemon Drop Kid) was one length away from success when third in the June 3 G1 Prix du Jockey Club, and will seek revenge on Godolphin France's **Saint Baudolino (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}), who finished one place better at Chantilly. "Nutello worked well on Sunday," trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias told *Racing Post*. "It looks an open race, with no overwhelming favorite, and the horse has recovered well from his last run [in the French Derby]." Joining him on the additions list is Joerg Vasicek's Jockey Club fifth **Top Trip (GB)** (Dubai Destination), and His Highness The Aga Khan's **Lidari (Fr)** (Acclamation {GB}), who has bagged the May 26 Listed Derby du Midi and the June 15 Listed Derby du Languedoc in his two latest starts. The Niarchos Family's G1 Epsom Derby runner-up **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran), and Ballydoyle's late G1 Irish Derby scratching **Imperial Monarch (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) are the only overseas contenders that remain.

UPTICK

I remember writing once last year, “this was a good sale for about six horses...” Fasig-Tipton’s season-opening July Yearling Sale on Tuesday was a lot better than that: it was a good sale for around 52 horses, because that’s the number that sold for \$100,000 or more--of which 15 sold for \$200,000 or more. The 52 was nearly 28% of the 189 yearlings sold, and about 18% of the 283 which were sent through the ring; in a recovering market, that’s a high percentage. With just two fewer horses sold than last year, the gross was up by a little over \$2 million, or 15%, and the average was up 16%, to \$81,291, from \$69,890 last year. However, fully a third of the horses sent through the ring were not-solds, meaning the clearance rate from the catalogue dropped from 63% last year to just 56% this year; also reinforcing the “chicken or feathers” theme was that the median did not advance, remaining static at \$60,000. At least more people got chicken, not feathers, this year.

Fasig July has long been known as a ‘conformation’ sale--and, by the way, the view of the ‘judges’ was that once again Fasig had done a very good job of selecting the individuals. In a sale with 338 horses catalogued representing well over 100 different sires, you’d think we wouldn’t get much reliable data on which to make assessments, but, actually, I think we did. The attached table (p15-16) breaks all sires that had one or more sell into their sire groups by age of oldest foals, and I think we learned plenty.

Fourteen stallions had yearlings from their first crops catalogued, and all 14 had at least one yearling sell. As predicted by many, WinStar’s **Colonel John** (Tiznow), who had been the leading first-year sire at the weanling/short yearling sales last year and early this year, led the way on average, with four selling from four offered, averaging \$140,000. Taylor Made’s **Old Fashioned**, one of three sires by Unbridled’s Song with first yearlings selling, ran a strong second, with six sold (from 10 offered) averaging \$112,000. Vinery’s **Pioneer of The Nile** (Empire Maker) was third, with three sold from three offered, averaging \$86,667. Others with three or more sold, in order of the average achieved, were: WinStar’s **U S Ranger** (Danzig), three of five, average \$76,000; Hill ‘n’ Dale’s **Zensational** (Unbridled’s Song), five-for-five, average \$66,600; Ashford’s **Dunkirk** (Unbridled’s Song), eight of 13, averaging \$40,125; and Pin Oak’s **Cowboy Cal** (Giant’s Causeway), four of six, average \$38,000. The whole group of 14 had 40 sell from 59 offered (68%--just about the sale average); these 40 sold for an average of \$72,950.

Often sires with their first 2-year-olds are not so well represented, but this year 13 different stallions in that category had yearlings sell, of which seven had two or more sell. **Big Brown** (Boundary) had two of three sell, **Curlin** (Smart Strike) went two-for-two; Big Brown's two averaged \$135,000; Curlin's two averaged \$102,500. They were one-two on average, followed by two young Spendthrift sires, **Notional** (In Excess), also two-for-two, averaging \$83,000; and **Tiz Wonderful**, another by potential budding sire-of-sires Tiznow, had three average \$80,000, but of seven offered. Airdrie's **Brother Derek** (Benchmark) went two-for-two, averaging \$79,000; while Darley's popular **Street Boss** (Street Cry) had six sell of six offered, for an average of \$69,167. Hill 'n' Dale's **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet) had three sell, from five offered, for an average of \$52,667. Altogether the 13 sires with their first 2-year-olds had 26 of 35 sell--74%--for an average of \$72,615, nearly the same as the sires with their first yearlings. This group of sires was supported more strongly by the market than is often the case with sires whose first crops are now racing.

Ten sires with their first 3-year-olds had yearlings sell, but had only 13 sold among the ten, from 19 offered (68%); the 13 averaged \$67,692. Darley's **Hard Spun** (Danzig) had just one sell, for \$170,000; Ashford's **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg) went two-for-two, averaging \$115,000. **Discreet Cat** (Forestry), another Darley sire, also had two sell, averaging \$73,500, but that was from six offered. Another 13 sires with their first 4-year-olds made the scoresheet, with 29 selling from 37 offered--a high 78%. Darley's **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) had just one catalogued, which sold for \$250,000, while Claiborne's **War Front** (Danzig) had two catalogued and sold, averaging \$212,500. WinStar's **Artie Schiller** (El Pardo) went one-for-two, but the one sold for \$190,000. Another WinStar sire, **Bellamy Road** (Concerto), had three sell from four offered, averaging \$116,667. I'll Have Another's sire, Three Chimneys' **Flower Alley** (Distorted Humor), had four offered and four sold, for an average of \$71,250; Vinery's **Congrats** (A.P. Indy) had three sell from six offered, averaging \$64,000; and **Bluegrass Cat** (Storm Cat), now a combined WinStar/Vinery stallion in New York, had five sell from five offered, averaging \$52,000. Overall, the 29 yearlings by sires with their first 4-year-olds averaged \$78,827.

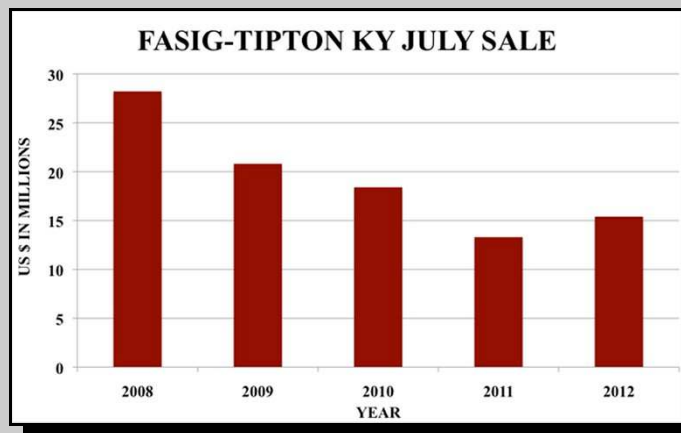
Just seven sires with their first 5-year-olds had yearlings sell, combining for 12 sold from 22 offered (55%), and averaging \$70,833. Only two sires in this group had more than one sell: Gainesway's **Afleet Alex** (Afleet), three sold of six offered, for an average of \$103,667; and Hill 'n' Dale's **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus), who had four sell of six offered, averaging \$81,000. As you can see, plenty of young sires were well supported, though not in great numbers.

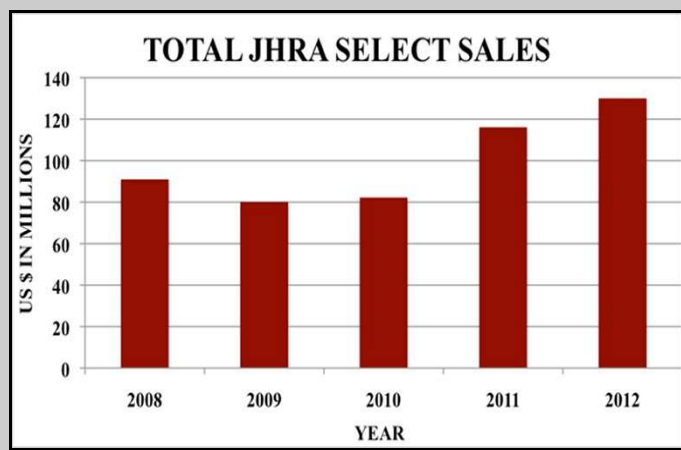

"As mentioned in the column, the Fasig July sale posted solid gains, of 15% in gross and 16% in average, though the not-sold rate of one in three, and the 56% clearance rate from the catalogue, show the market is still highly selective; at least breeders and consignors are getting paid when they do offer the right horse. Meanwhile, the two-day combined yearling and foal sale in Japan gained 12% in gross (to almost \$130-million!) and 11% in average. That sale has jumped by 58% in gross and 38% in average in the last two years."

The older sires really ruled the roost: 40 sires with oldest foals now 6yos and up had 69 yearlings sell, of 94 offered, a ratio of 73%; 13 of the 40 had sales or averages of \$100,000 or higher, and the 69 averaged \$94,812--the one group above (and well above) the sale's average. The only yearling catalogued by Gainesway's **Tapit** (Pulpit) brought \$280,000; Vinery's **More Than Ready** (Southern Halo) also had just one catalogued; it made \$205,000. Arguably the sale's top sire, though, was Spendthrift's **Malibu Moon** (A.P. Indy), who had five sell, of six offered, which averaged \$211,000, including the \$375,000 saletopper. The one yearling catalogued by Ashford's **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat) brought \$160,000; Taylor Made's **Forestry** (Storm Cat) had two sell, from two offered, for an average of \$150,000; and Three Chimneys' **Sky Mesa** (Pulpit) was perhaps the surprise success story of the sale. He had five sell, from six offered, for an average of \$139,400. He's always been a considerably better sire than the market has recognized; maybe he's catching up a little bit now.

CHRIS CHRISTIE'S BIGGEST MISTAKE

When Chris Christie became the 55th Governor of the State of New Jersey, he was faced with many problems and forced to make immediate decisions that could either help get his state back on track during difficult times or further its trouble. Few situations would test Christie's foresight and his ability to make tough, but correct calls than that of the state's complex and struggling gambling industries, which needed fixing.

As is the case with everything Christie, he was never subtle, never conciliatory. He had a plan and didn't care what anyone else thought. The problem was, his plan was certain to fail. And it has.


Faced with overwhelming competition in neighboring states, the Atlantic City casinos, which once had a monopoly in the Northeast, were in the midst of a steep decline. New Jersey's two major racetracks, Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands, were also experiencing tough times and losing money, a particular problem for Christie since the state owned both.

They, too, had been hurt by casinos in neighboring states. Tracks in Pennsylvania, Delaware, New York and West Virginia were able to improve the quality of racing by raising purses thanks to the windfall profits from racetrack slot machines. That led to an exodus of horses from the New Jersey tracks and a poorer quality of racing that turned off gamblers.

The solution to these problems seemed obvious. The easiest way for Christie to revive casino gambling in New Jersey was to expand it outside the narrow world of Atlantic City. And in the Meadowlands, he had a perfect place to build a casino, one that could be a partnership among the state, the racing industries and one or more Atlantic City casinos. Located just a few miles from Manhattan and in one of the most densely populated areas in the U.S., a Meadowlands casino would likely be among the most successful in the country. It would also be in a location that would keep New Jersey gamblers in New Jersey, rather than them having to trek to Pennsylvania and New York.


It was the type of solution that had something for everyone and everybody--the state, horse racing and, even, the casino industry. **Cont. p14**

Christie wanted no part of it. He threatened to close the racetracks, eventually leased them to outside parties, saw to it that a subsidy they had been receiving from Atlantic City was cut off and was unwavering in his assertion that horse racing would get no help from him or anyone else.

While turning his back on horse racing, he embraced the Atlantic City casinos. There was nothing he wouldn't do for AC. He put his state's money where he was mouth is when he served up \$261 million in state tax reimbursements to kick start the stalled Revel casino project. With Christie's help, the Revel, which cost \$2.4 billion, was built and opened this spring.

Just prior to the opening, Christie appeared in Atlantic City and all but promised that the Revel was going to save the place.

"The folks who will start coming here next week will understand exactly why the state of New Jersey decided this was a project worth investing in," he said. "You look around and this is one of the most spectacular resorts I have ever seen. People are going to want to come to Atlantic City to come here and experience this. Atlantic City absolutely has a strong and bright future if we're all willing to work together."

He added: "We're sending a signal to not only the region but the entire country that Atlantic City is back."

Who knows why Christie did what he did. The cynic in me believes it had nothing to do with what was good for the state or the people of the state and everything to do with the fact that rich, powerful people run the Atlantic City casinos, and ambitious politicians like Christie need rich, powerful people behind them. Either that or Christie is about the only person on Earth who couldn't figure out that Atlantic City is a lost cause.

People were never going to come to the Revel. It's in a poor location in a town that is only convenient to people in the southern part of New Jersey. And the Revel was never going to save Atlantic City. When it comes to casino customers, they only go to two places--the nearest casino or to Atlantic City. Revel was sure to be one more troubled casino in a troubled town.

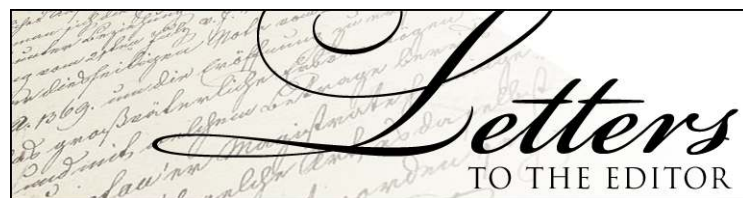
If anything, the Revel has done worse than anyone expected. In each of its first three months in existence, the Revel has come in eighth out of the 12 Atlantic City casinos. It made \$14.9 million in gaming revenue in June, \$38 million behind the leader, the Borgata. And the Revel doesn't appear to be bringing any new faces to Atlantic City. For the year, the casinos there are down 7%.

Perhaps the Revel deserves more than three months before being declared a complete disaster, but it's very hard to imagine it turning a corner. If it keeps taking in only \$14.9 million a month in gaming revenue the casino that Christie said would save Atlantic City won't be around for long.

The talk around New Jersey's tracks is that Christie has said he will give Atlantic City five years to turn itself around and if it doesn't he will look to expand gaming in the state in 2017. The Meadowlands would likely get a casino. Monmouth probably wouldn't, but Thoroughbred interests believe they would get a piece of the pie.

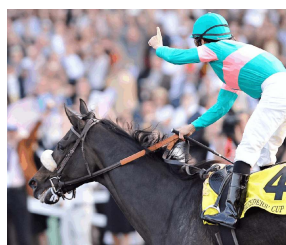
The problem is New Jersey can't afford to wait five years. For Monmouth and the Meadowlands to get from here to there means five years of tough times that will only further weaken those tracks. Atlantic City can't wait, either. The casino owners there need to start cutting their losses and work with the horse racing industry and the state in a joint effort toward expanding casino gaming outside the one New Jersey town.

Christie must admit his mistake and rectify it, even if it means making some enemies in Atlantic City. He can't wait until 2017. He needs to prove that he can say no to the big corporations and the mega-wealthy and do the right thing for his state. If he is a real leader, if he's worthy of consideration for national office, that's exactly what he will do.

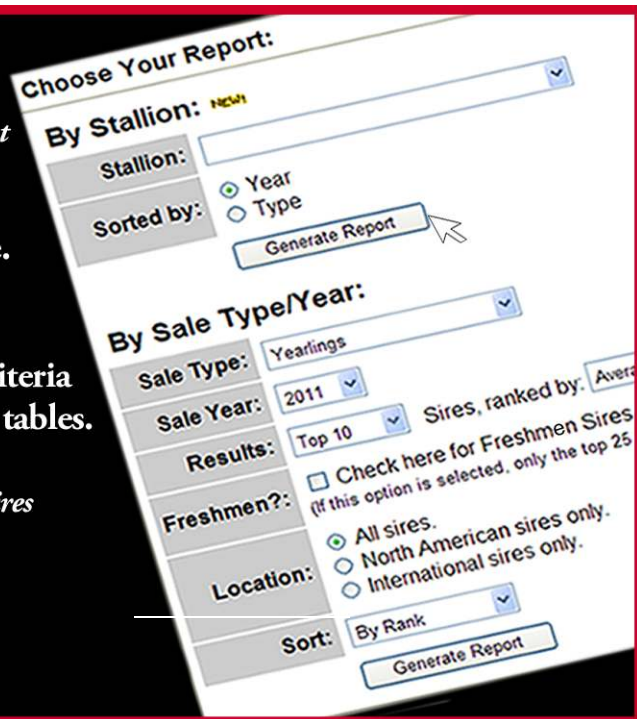

Lopez Named Del Mar Starter:

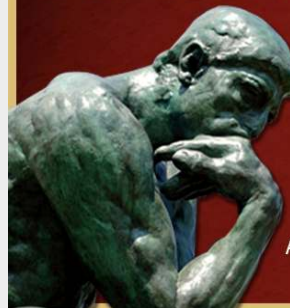

"But when it came down to it, my sick father [former trainer Ross Brinson] needed me and my family always comes first," he stated. "I'll miss Del Mar dearly, but I'm needed elsewhere. And they promised me I'd have my job back next year."

CHILEAN SALE A SUCCESS

The inaugural Thoroughbred Breeders of Chile "Selected" Sale was held Sunday, July 8, at the sale pavilion at the Club Hipico of Santiago. Regarded as successful by breeders and buyers alike, the sale introduced 75 yearlings gathered from 20 different farms--a first for breeders there.

Of the 76 accepted for the sale, 75 horses went through the ring. The total gross was US\$2,104,518 and the average was US\$33,944. Thirteen horses failed to meet their reserves.

The sale's top price of US\$116,172 was paid for a colt from the first Chilean-bred crop of Scat Daddy. Out of Kossanova (Fly So Free), hip 9 is a half-brother to 2006 Chilean champion turf horse Kossimo (Chi) (Gracioso). He was bred by Pedro and Constanza Hurtado's Paso Nevado Stud.

The buying bench for the sale included bidders from Chile, Argentina and Peru. "The sale was very strong and the selection was excellent," commented Argentinian-based bloodstock agent John Fulton. "Bidding, in particular for those by Scat Daddy, was intense. I was able to buy one, which will stay in Chile with trainers Patricio and son Juan Pablo Baeza. For their first "selected" sale, I was impressed with the way the Chilean Breeders' Sale was conducted and the condition in which the horses were presented."

A total of eight yearlings by Scat Daddy sold at the sale for an average of US\$61,081.
