WILLIAMS BOOKED FOR DUNADEN RIDE

Craig Williams has been named as the jockey for Pearl Bloodstock's **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) in Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Last year's G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase hero

was one of a dozen remaining in the 12-furlong feature at the six-day stage and the Australian rider will replace Christophe-Patrice Lemaire. "Sheikh Fahad decided that whoever was to ride the horse in the Arc was to

ride him in all his races between now and then, which almost definitely ruled out Christophe," Racing Manager David Redvers explained yesterday. "Craig has won his only two starts on the horse and knows him well. He was prepared to make the sacrifice and commitment to come all the way from Australia to ride the horse whenever he ran. He knows the tracks here well, is an extraordinary jockey and incredibly thorough--there is no more thorough a jockey at walking courses." Dunaden was last seen finishing runner-up after a troubled trip in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot June 23, and connections are expecting a bold show from the Mikel Delzangles-trained 6-year-old. "He's the horse of a lifetime--he tries his guts out and he desperately wants to win," he added.

Among Dunaden's rivals will be his Hardwicke conqueror **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}), who represents the Khalid Abdullah-Sir Michael Stoute combination, and Derrick Smith's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who had that rival behind when annexing the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. Aidan O'Brien also has the pacemakers **Robin Hood (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Windsor Palace (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) engaged.

ACCLAMATION PRIMED FOR EDDIE READ

Acclamation (Unusual Heat), victorious in his seasonal debut in the June 9 G1 Charles Whittingham H. at Hollywood, worked six panels in 1:14 2/5 over Del Mar's turf course Monday morning in preparation for his title defense of Saturday's G1 Eddie Read H. The 6-year-old, who also won last term's G1 Pacific Classic at the seaside oval, recorded internal splits of :14, :26 2/5, :38 2/5 and :51 flat with the 'dogs' up. The bay completed the final quarter in :23 2/5. "It was a very good work, he looked wonderful out there and finished strong," said trainer Donald Warren. "He wasn't blowing very hard when he came off the track, and now that he's back at the barn he's cooling out well. We're very pleased." Campaigned by Bud and Judy Johnston's Old English Rancho and Peter and Mary Hilvers, the California-bred arrived at Del Mar last Wednesday. "The goal was to run him six times this year," Bud Johnston said. "We missed one, over what turned out to be nothing. But he's all right, and we'd love to repeat in both races here." Acclamation went wire-to-wire winning last season's Eddie Read by 3 1/4 lengths before another wiring a field that included Twirling Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the Pacific Classic, thus becoming the first ever to sweep Del Mar's premier turf and main track races. "It might be a tougher race this year," Johnston admitted. "Although I thought Twirling Candy might have been the best horse in the country when we beat him last year."

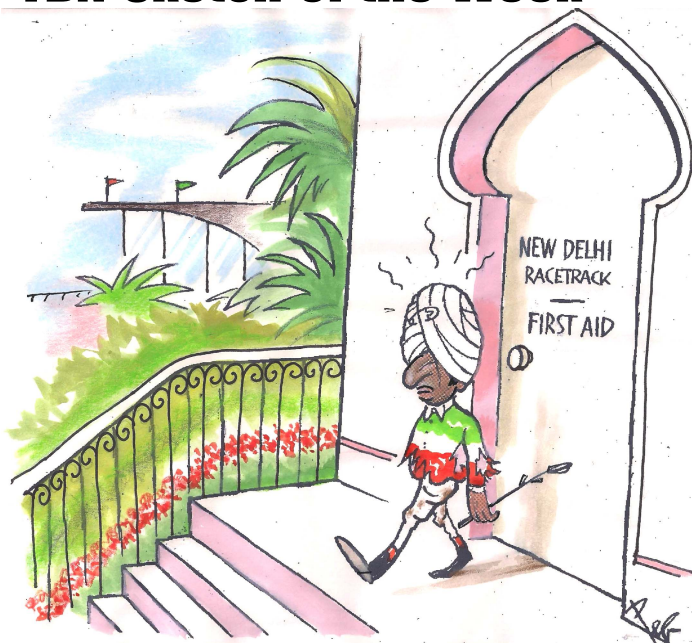

Last year's King George winner **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) could be joined by **Masked Marvel (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) from the John Gosden stable if he is given the green light following his exertions when winning the G1 Eclipse at Sandown last Saturday. Only four are British-trained, with Japan and Germany as well as France and Ireland set to be represented. Sunday Racing's May 27 G1 Tokyo Yushun winner **Deep Brillante (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) is the sole 3-year-old in the line-up and is currently based at Newmarket trainer Clive Brittain's yard. Last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) is also set to have her first start in Britain after trainer Peter Schiergen confirmed her attendance yesterday. "We are coming over to Ascot for Saturday," he told *PA Sport*. "Soft ground would not bother her at all, she handles it very well indeed, so if it was very soft that would not change anything."

SHADWELL TURF MILE RISES TO \$750K

Keeneland's GI Shadwell Turf Mile, scheduled for Oct. 6, has been increased to \$750,000, up from \$600,000 in 2011. The event highlights Keeneland's fall race meeting, which runs from Oct. 5 through 27 and features 17 stakes with purse money totaling \$4.5 million. The other Grade I tests offered through the meet are the Darley Alcibiades S., Dixiana Breeders' Futurity S., First Lady S., Juddmonte Spinster S. and Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S.

"We are very excited, in partnership with Keeneland, to further enhance the status of the Shadwell Turf Mile, and to secure its position as one of the country's most prestigious grass races," said Rick Nichols, vice president and general manager of Shadwell Farm, which has sponsored the race since 1999. Following the increase in purse, the Shadwell Turf Mile will rank alongside the spring meeting's \$750,000 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. as Keeneland's most valuable stakes in terms of prize money.

"Shadwell Farm is an invaluable member of the Keeneland family, and we greatly appreciate their strong commitment to Thoroughbred racing," said Keeneland Vice President of Racing W. B. Rogers Beasley. "The Shadwell Turf Mile is a centerpiece of FallStars Weekend, and this purse increase assures it will continue to attract the nation's top turf horses." Nine graded stakes worth more than \$3 million highlight Keeneland's opening FallStars Weekend, including the GIII Woodford S. and the GIII Bourbon S., both increased to \$150,000 this term.

Seven FallStars stakes make up part of the Breeders' Cup Challenge series of automatic qualifying races for the Breeders' Cup World Championships to be held Nov. 2-3 at Santa Anita. This fall's roster expands to include the Bourbon (GI Juvenile Turf); GI Darley Alcibiades S. (GI Juvenile Fillies); GIII Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix S. (GI Sprint) Oct. 5; GI Shadwell Turf Mile (GI Mile), Dixiana Breeders' Futurity (GI Juvenile); GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. (GI Filly & Mare Sprint) Oct. 6; GI Juddmonte Spinster S. (GI Ladies' Classic) Oct. 7; GIII JPMorgan Chase Jessamine S. (GI Juvenile Fillies Turf) Oct. 11.

Record Million Preview Day at Arlington

Edited Press Release

The total handle on Arlington Park's 12-race Million Preview Day last Saturday generated \$7,616,325, the highest Million Preview Day handle since the event was launched in 2001. In addition, the 2012 figure was more than 48% higher than the \$5,141,447 wagered on the 2011 Million Preview Day program of 11 races. The 2012 per-race average handle of \$634,694 was nearly 36% higher than the 2011 per-race average of \$467,404. "This demonstrates that there is a strong public interest in seeing the stars perform and wagering on quality racing," said Arlington Park General Manager Tony Petrillo. "Because of tremendous support from owners and trainers who chose to race their horses at Arlington on Million Preview Day, we were able to put on a great show and racing fans around the country responded. This makes us even more excited for what is to come the rest of our season--especially Arlington Million Day, when we'll have stars from around country and from all over the world." This year's Million Preview Day card featured four Grade III turf races--the Arlington H.; the Modesty H.; the American Derby and the Stars and Stripes S., all of which serve as preparatory races for the Aug. 18 International Festival of Racing, including the GI Arlington Million, GI Beverly D. S., GI Secretariat S. and the newly created American St. Leger S.

Hannon Plots Juvenile Campaigns

Trainer Richard Hannon was yesterday making plans for the stable's 2-year-olds who made an impact at Newmarket's July festival. Julie Wood's Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus})--who was second in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19--defied the testing ground when winning Saturday's G2 Superlative S. and is set to stay at that seven-furlong trip to take in the G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood Aug. 1. "The Coventry form is rock-solid and this is a good horse," Hannon said. "Olympic Glory bounced back from the Royal meeting and not all horses recover in time for Newmarket. We knew he would get the seven furlongs and he put the race to bed quickly and then got tired. That was not surprising as he had a bit of a hiccup at the start of last week and missed a few days and, consequently, he blew up in the last 100 yards. Obviously, it might take him time to get over such a gruelling race here, but the plan would certainly be to go to Goodwood with Olympic Glory if he comes out of it okay. He could well be a Dewhurst horse come the autumn." On Friday, Ahmad Alkhalafi's Maureen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) suffered a troubled trip en route to a neck second to Sendmylovetrose (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. and she is set for a step up in class. "I don't think there is any doubt that Maureen was the best filly in the race," her conditioner said. "She had no luck in running and should have won, but we know that she goes in soft ground so we will definitely have a look at the G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 19]." Hannon also had news of Qatar Racing's Strong Suit (Rahy), who was eighth in Saturday's G1 July Cup. "Sheikh Fahad took the decision to run and Hughesie was really pleased how well Strong Suit ran in the circumstances," Hannon added. "He is a horse with plenty of speed and the six and a half furlongs of the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville Aug. 5] will suit him perfectly, so that will be the next port of call."

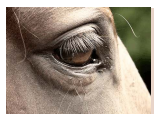

Several American stallions hit hot streaks last week, including Proud Citizen, with four individual stakes winners, and First Samurai, who had a pair of 2-year-olds among his three stakes winners. None, though, could compete with the much-missed Dynaformer, who completed an eye-catching graded stakes turf treble in the space of a few hours, thanks to Point of Entry (GI Man O' War S.), Starformer (GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial S.) and Ioya Bigtime (GIII Stars and Stripes S.).

By the time of his death at the age of 27 in April, the Three Chimneys veteran had earned the respect of top breeders in North America and Europe. It had, though, been a different story at the start of his career, when he plied his trade at a fee of \$5,000 at Wafare Farm. His first graded winner, the Grade III-winning filly Rabiadella, was the eighth foal of a minor winner who had never previously produced a black-type performer. Another fine advertisement from his first crop was the GI Kentucky Derby third Blumin Affair, whose dam earned only \$5,122. Then there was Old Chapel, a Grade III winner from a third crop of only 27 foals, who was out of an unraced mare by the moderate stallion Monteverdi. The backgrounds of Dynaformer's latest graded winners make more impressive reading. Point of Entry is quite closely related to a runner-up for an Eclipse Award, Pine Island (Arch), their dam being a sister to a winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Starformer is out of Etoile Montante, a G1 Prix de la Foret winner whose dam is a sister to the dam of the excellent Sightseek. And Ioya Bigtime is out of Ioya Two, a Grade III winner of over \$460,000 by the remarkable stallion Lord At War.

It comes as no surprise that two of these three are out of grand daughters of Mr. Prospector. Point of Entry's dam is by Seeking the Gold, whereas Starformer's is by the similarly bred Miswaki (with both Seeking the Gold and Miswaki representing the Mr. Prospector/Buckpasser cross, together with Woodman and Mining).

Of course it was another grand daughter of Mr. Prospector--Carson City's daughter La Ville Rouge--who provided Dynaformer with his finest hour, when Barbaro ran away with the Kentucky Derby in 2006. That stunning victory was always likely to precipitate a slew of similarly bred winners and Dynaformer hasn't let us down. Sure enough his 71-strong 2008 crop has so far produced five graded winners out of grand daughters of Mr. Prospector. In addition to Point of Entry and Starformer, they are White Moonstone, winner of the G1 Fillies' Mile; Brilliant Speed, winner of the GI Blue Grass S.; and Casino Host, this year's winner of the GII Mervin H. Muniz Jr Memorial. Brilliant Speed is out of a Gone West mare, but White Moonstone, Casino Host and Point of Entry are all out of daughters of Seeking the Gold.

Dynaformer has 33 foals aged three or over out of mares by the 1988 GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up. They include five graded winners, the others being that fine turf filly Riskaverse, who scored three times at the Grade I level, and Point of Entry's brother-in-blood Vacation, winner of a Grade III on all-weather.

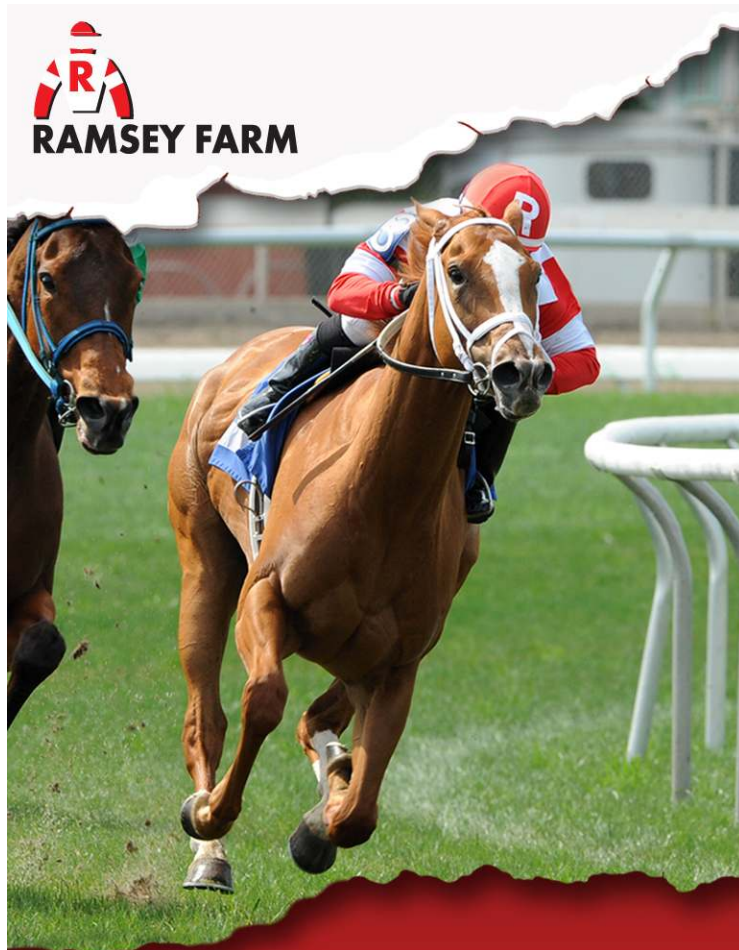


Others that are similarly bred include graded-placed performers Cable, Cognashene, Ea, Pick Six and Rescue Squad, in addition to stakes winner Tend, which adds up to an impressive collection. Seeking the Gold is therefore matching the success that Dynaformer enjoyed with mares by Mr. Prospector and that stallion's son Kingmambo. His team out of Mr. Prospector's daughters included the Grade I winner Film Maker, while the Grade I winners Gozzip Girl and Wiener Walzer head his first 13 foals out of Kingmambo mares. A feature of Seeking the Gold's own record as a stallion was the success that he enjoyed with mares with Nijinsky blood, fine examples being Heavenly Prize, the champion 3-year-old filly of 1994, and her Grade I-winning sister Oh What A Windfall. This was incentive enough for Dinny Phipps to make Seeking the Gold the default setting for the Pleasant Colony mare Our Country Place, whose dam was Nijinsky's top-class daughter Maplejinsky.

Our Country Place was also an ideal match for Seeking the Gold on the basis that Pleasant Colony was the broodmare sire of his top daughter Cash Run. The partnership between Seeking the Gold and Our Country Place produced five foals, four of them fillies and all four of the fillies made their mark in one sphere or another, mainly for the Phipps operation. Country Hideaway was twice a winner of the GII First Flight H. over seven furlongs and Pleasant Home did even better, taking the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in 2005. Their sister Matlacha Pass didn't prove nearly so durable, managing only three starts. However, she won two of them and now has strong claims to being the most successful broodmare of the three sisters, even though Country Hideaway numbers the graded winners Boca Grande and Vacation among her progeny.

Point of Entry is Matlacha Pass's second Grade I winner following that highly talented but ill-fated filly Pine Island. By the time Pine Island suffered fatal injuries in the 2006 Breeders' Cup Distaff, she had won the GI Alabama S.--a race also won by her third dam Maplejinsky and by Maplejinsky's champion daughter Sky Beauty--and the Gazelle S. Pine Island, like Point of Entry, was by a Roberto-line stallion, her sire being Kris S.'s son Arch. The fourth sister, Home Sweet Home, was sold for \$100,000 in 2004 and exported to Japan. Interestingly, she became a regular visitor to the Florida Derby winner Brian's Time--like Dynaformer a son of Roberto. Their best result so far has been the colt Birdie Birdie, who was Japan's top-ranked 3-year-old colt on dirt in 2010.

One reason why Matlacha Pass has done so well with Dynaformer could be the fact that she is inbred 2x4 to Mr. Prospector, her third dam being his champion sprinter Gold Beauty (who produced Dayjur to Danzig). Incidentally, Point of Entry's May 10 birthday helps explain why he is proving so progressive. I forgot to mention in last week's notes on Mucho Macho Man that he has an extremely late birthdate--June 15--which again goes some way towards explaining why he is doing so well as a now-mature 4-year-old.

Jose Ortiz Released/Update:

Jockey John Velazquez, who was sidelined with a fractured collarbone since a spill at Churchill Downs June 16, was back in the saddle when working a 2-year-old for the Todd Pletcher barn at Saratoga Monday morning, reports the *Daily Racing Form*. Breezed over the Oklahoma training track, Archwarrior (Arch) covered four panels in :48.92 while in company with another Pletcher juvenile. Velazquez indicated he was a little tired following the work. "You're supposed to be..I'll probably be sore tomorrow," he told *DRF*. Velazquez indicated he hopes to return to the races the weekend of July 28-29. "It really depends how I feel the next few days," Velazquez said about his return.
