CLASH OF TITANS AT DELAWARE

If things go as planned, Saturday's GII Delaware H., a Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' event, is likely to provide a significant piece to the puzzle for this year's championship race for the older filly and mare division. Reigning champion 3-year-old filly **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), who was purchased by Besilu Stables for a mind-boggling \$8.5 million at Keeneland last November, enters Delaware's marquee event off a stellar eight-length victory with jockey Mike Smith aboard in the GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs.

"She relaxed really well for me and, when I asked her to pick it up, she just jumped into the bridle and just drew away rather impressive," explained Smith, who will be back in the saddle Saturday.

Earlier this season, the daughter of multiple graded winner Delta Princess (A.P. Indy) was a distant second in the Feb. 25 GIII Sabin S. at Gulfstream before giving an uncharacteristically poor showing when ninth in the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan.

In any other year, the Bill Mott trainee's reputation would tower over her rivals, but this season, she appears to have a worthy adversary in the form of **Awesome Maria** (Maria's Mon). Beginning with Gulfstream's GIII Sabin S. in February of 2011, the E. Paul Robsham Stables runner reeled off six consecutive victories, including last season's GI Ogden Phipps H., GII Shuvee H. and GIII Rampart S. This term, she successfully defended her title in both the Mar. 31 Rampart and the aforementioned Sabin, where she gave Royal Delta an eight-length spanking. While backed down to 3-5 for her latest challenge, the Todd Pletcher trainee tasted defeat for the first time in over a year and a half when third behind It's Tricky (Mineshaft) and Cash for Clunkers (Tiznow) in the May 28 GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont. **Cont. p3**

75TH ANNIVERSARY SEASON BEGINS AT DMR

Anchored by seven Grade I events, led by the prestigious \$1-million TVG Pacific Classic Aug. 16, Del Mar kicks off its 75th season with a 37-day stand today. The opening-day 10-race card features a split-division of the restricted \$100,000 Oceanside S. for 3-year-olds going a mile on grass (*see ATW for fields*). In an effort to increase field sizes, Del Mar's "Ship and Win" program returns for the second straight season, offering a \$1,000 bonus for all shippers, plus an increased 25% purse bonus, excluding stakes races. The seaside track will conduct racing on a Wednesday-through-Sunday schedule with an additional day of action slated for Labor Day Monday. "We are projecting good things for this anniversary summer, especially on our high end," Del Mar's Racing Secretary Tom Robbins commented. "If you've got good horses, we've got good places to go with them." A record 46,588 packed the house for last year's opening day.

"Awesome Maria was able to beat Royal Delta in Florida, so when she is on top of her game, she is as good as any filly in the country," affirmed Pletcher. "If there was a quality race to stay at Saratoga, but unfortunately, the stakes schedule has been shifted around and there is really not a meaningful graded stakes race at Saratoga at the moment, and that's why the Delaware H. became attractive for her."

Awesome Maria, who has been stabled at Saratoga since last month, posted a bullet five-panel work over the main track in 1:00 1/5 July 9 before completing the same task in 1:00 flat July 15. The latter was the fifth fastest out of 27 moves that day.

"She has trained really well since the Ogden Phipps," confirmed Pletcher. "This time, everything has gone according to plan. We haven't had to juggle our work schedule around the rain and such, and we were able to do exactly what we wanted to do. Her last two breezes were exceptional and she's telling us that she's ready to perform to her capabilities, which she would certainly need to do with the quality of a filly like Royal Delta in there."

Smith is equally respectful of her chief competition Saturday.

"She is a very nice filly in her own right and she's already shown that," said Smith of Awesome Maria. "I don't believe Royal Delta ran her best race [in the Sabin], but she will have to bring her 'A' game to outrun that filly."

While Awesome Maria has yet to attempt the 10-furlong distance, Royal Delta has already earned her stripes over the trip, having won Saratoga's marquee event for fillies, the Alabama.

"I think the mile and a quarter is right up her alley," confirmed Smith. "She will be forwardly placed and she usually puts herself into the race. As long as I get her to relax and get into her rhythm early on, the mile and a quarter shouldn't be a problem."

Pletcher, an eight-time leading trainer at Saratoga, indicated he will also enter **Love and Pride** (A.P. Indy).

"We've been blessed with high-quality fillies that have been able to handle the 1 1/4-mile distance and the Delaware surface," said Pletcher, who has already won the Del 'Cap four times. "It's been a good race to us over the years."

Campaigned by Green Hills Farm, Love and Pride won the nine-furlong GIII Obeah S. over the track June 16.

"The Obeah is a prep that we've used successfully for this race in the past," Pletcher noted. "Fleet Indian and Unbridled Belle and Irving's Baby all used the Obeah as a prep for the Del 'Cap. She had some success at that venue last year and seems to like the surface [an eight-length allowance winner last July]. The real key will be if she can handle the added furlong. But the fact that she's been good at Delaware before gives us a reason for optimism that she will be able to handle the added distance."--CBoss

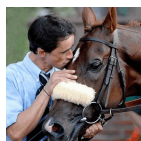

PRINCESS SET FOR OAKS DATE

Trainer Dermot Weld has issued an upbeat bulletin on Moyglare Stud's **Princess Highway** (Street Cry {Ire}) ahead of Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks. Having booked her ticket to the Curragh Classic with a six-length success in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot June 21, the homebred will face a maximum of 10 rivals after the latest forfeit stage. "Princess Highway is in great form," Weld commented. "We would prefer a dry week and better ground, but she is a definite runner and is all set. We'd like the weather to pick up, because she's a filly with a lot of pace, but she did handle that [good-to-soft] ground at Ascot, and she's very adaptable." Among her potential rivals are six from Ballydoyle headed by Derrick Smith's June 1 G1 Epsom Oaks heroine **Was (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Lady Rothschild's July 7 G2 Lancashire Oaks winner **Great Heavens (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) and Meon Valley's Epsom Oaks runner-up and Ribblesdale third **Shirocco Star (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}).

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

'BEAUTY' LOOKING TO BREEDERS' CUP

Trainer Sir Henry Cecil is looking at the Breeders' Cup for his new arrival **Beauty Parlour (GB)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), *Racing Post* revealed. Ecurie Wildenstein's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ was transferred from Elie Lellouche's barn last week, and the Warren Place conditioner is looking at a mile program for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine and G1 Prix de Diane runner-up. "She's a very smart filly and I would see her as a miler, with perhaps the [Oct. 20] G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot being an autumn target," Cecil told the trade daily. "Before that, we could look at something like the [Oct. 7] G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp, although I haven't got that far yet. Beyond that, we would be looking at the Breeders' Cup [Nov. 2-3] at Santa Anita, but it's early days."

NATHANIEL GETS THE GREEN LIGHT

Connections of **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) have given the go-ahead for the 4-year-old to attempt back-to-back successes in Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. Despite initial doubts that Ascot's 12-furlong feature might come too soon after his win in last Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown, Lady Rothschild's homebred--now part-owned by Newsells Park Stud--gave all the right signals in a spin yesterday. "He's a runner," trainer John Gosden said. "William [Buick] breezed him this morning and I think it went really well, so I think it would be wimpish not to run." His rider added, "He came back from the Eclipse really good and that was probably his best performance to date. He needed the run and still got the job done, really battling on well for me and answering every call. The boss is very happy with the way he's come out of the race, but it's a tough ask just two weeks on from a race like that. All signs are good, but you don't really know until the day. It looks a good King George this year, and St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) looks a better horse than last year and Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) and Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) are there, too, so he has it to prove again. He was a late-maturing horse, both mentally and physically, and we always felt that whatever he did last year he was going to be better this year and it all points towards that now. As the season progresses, I think he will get better."

FARHH TO FACE FRANKEL

Godolphin's **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) will be supplemented for the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, Racing Manager Simon Crisford announced yesterday. Following the 4-year-old's third in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 20 and second in last Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown, connections have opted to drop back to a mile and take on **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}). "The timing of the race is perfect, three weeks and a few days after his excellent second in the Coral-Eclipse," Crisford explained. "I asked Sheikh Mohammed what his preferred option was, the Sussex S., in which he could come second to Frankel if not win, or the Jacques le Marois at Deauville. He said 'I want to go to Goodwood.' Farhh is in great form and doing really well--let's hope he runs up to his best." Speaking via the telephone to the Glorious Goodwood press conference, Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Lord Grimthorpe responded to the news by saying, "Frankel is definitely going to be the horse to beat--there is no doubt about that--but he still has to put his best foot forward. It's good news that Godolphin will supplement Farhh. We respect him, as he was unlucky at Royal Ascot and ran a super race at Sandown in the Eclipse, so he is a very legitimate horse."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races.

GODOLPHIN BUY ENERGIZER

Godolphin announced yesterday that they have purchased recent G3 Tercentenary S. winner **Energizer (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}). Gestut Schlenderhan's homebred colt was trained by Jens Hirschberger to capture the 10-furlong contest at Royal Ascot June 21, having already finished runner-up in the G3 Dr Busch Memorial at Krefeld Apr. 22 and fourth in the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas) at Cologne May 28. His first target for the boys in blue will be the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York Aug. 22. "We will possibly aim Energizer at the Great Voltigeur over 12 furlongs, but he is very much a horse for next year," racing manager Simon Crisford said. "It will be exciting to see him race in the Godolphin colours."

WENT THE DAY WELL SIDELINED

Team Valor International and Mark Ford's **Went The Day Well** (Proud Citizen), hero of the GIII Vinery Racing Spiral S. at Turfway Park and fourth-place finisher in the G1 Kentucky Derby, has developed bone bruising in his front ankles and will miss the remainder of 2012. The New York-bred reported home a well-beaten 10th in the G1 Preakness S. most recently May 19. He will be turned out for 60 days at Denali Stud. "He probably was suffering from this issue when he ran so poorly in the Preakness S., but it did not manifest itself for a diagnosis until he went back into hard work," Team Valor principal Barry Irwin commented. "We will look to bring him back to the races in January at Gulfstream."

ASIAN RACING CONFERENCE STARTS

The 34th Asian Racing Conference opened in Istanbul, Turkey, Tuesday with a gala dinner and an impassioned

call for the elimination of drugs in racing worldwide. Mehmet Mehdi Eker, Turkey's minister of food, agriculture and livestock, the agency that oversees horse racing in the country straddling Europe and Asia, told the about 1,000 delegates from 38 nations, including a small

contingent from the United States, that rules across the world "should be harmonized."

Focusing his comments on banning drugs in racing, Eker noted the "very important place" in Turkish history that horses hold and how they have "similar characteristics to mankind," including the ability to express a range of reactions.

"No racehorse should run under the effect of drugs," Eker declared. "We do not find that right and I want to emphasize this particularly. As a veterinarian and a horse lover, I am particularly sensitive to this issue.

"If a horse is sick and being treated--regardless of whether the medication has a doping effect--this horse should not run due to the principles of animal welfare."

Eker pointed out that while the global economic crisis has depressed racing in many areas, the sport is growing in Turkey. Revenue from racing increased by 23% last year, and the Jockey Club of Turkey plans to open two new racetracks by 2013 to increase the number of tracks in the country to 10.

Omer Faruk Girgin, president of the Jockey Club of Turkey, also spoke briefly and told delegates he has confidence they will address major issues facing the sport during the conference, which extends through the remainder of this week.

Sessions set for July 18 are titled "Reform and the rules of racing in the 21st century" and "The race for the digitally empowered consumer."

'Twas Then; Tiznow

In the constant worldwide search for 'outcross lines'-- meaning, usually, not Northern Dancer or Mr. Prospector--three names stand out: Sunday Silence (Hail to Reason line) in Japan; A.P. Indy (Seattle Slew/Bold Ruler) in North America; and Monsun (the non-Phalaris Blandford line) in Germany. Sunday Silence, of course, rules Japan, and when you realize that his son Deep Impact has just 4-year-olds and is already being talked about as his sire's best son, there's no doubt that line will be flourishing for some time to come. A.P. Indy is all over American pedigrees, though Monsun's longer-term influence is open to debate. I would say the Fappiano line, which includes Unbridled, has well and truly branched off from Mr. Prospector and is an American line of its own. The best hope of a non-Phalaris outcross line in the U.S. now is probably not Ribot or Princequillo--both great influences of yesteryear--but Tiznow, a California-bred grandson of Relaunch (himself by In Reality) by the obscure Cee's Tizzy out of a Seattle Song mare, Cee's Song, both evidently named after Tiznow's breeder, the late Cecelia Straub Rubens.

It's actually kind of ironic to refer to Tiznow as an In Reality-line sire. Relaunch was himself an untypical In Reality, who characteristically sired a smaller, speedier type, which wouldn't describe Tiznow at all--quite the opposite, in fact. Tiznow measures 16.3 hands and sires big and scopey, like himself--that big, American dirt type. A top young sire who for me actually throws more like In Reality is Tapit, who is by A.P. Indy's son Pulpit, but whose third dam, Moon Glitter, was by In Reality and was, coincidentally, a full-sister to Relaunch. Maybe it's the class coming through, though in different shapes and by different paths. Moreover, Tiznow himself is actually inbred 4x4 to none other than Northern Dancer through his sire Cee's Tizzy's damsire Lyphard and his second dam Lonely Dancer, who was by an early Canadian-bred son of Northern Dancer named Nice Dancer. None of these details are preventing Tiznow from working as a sire with America's most prevalent lines, anyway: over two-thirds (29) of his 42 'unique' (counted once) A Runners through the end of 2011 were out of either Native Dancer or Northern Dancer-line mares. He also seems to work just fine with another cross of Seattle Slew.

Trained by Jay Robbins for the Cees Stable, Tiznow made 15 starts at three and four--nine as a 3-year-old in 2000 and six as a 4-year-old in 2001. He was out of the first three only once in his first and only start under a mile, a six-furlong maiden race at Santa Anita.

He broke his maiden in his third start over 1 1/16 miles at Hollywood Park, and immediately stepped into graded stakes company, edging out Dixie Union by a neck at 10-1 odds in the GIII Affirmed H. at 1 1/16 miles. He was then second to Captain Steve in the GI Swaps (Tiznow's Beyer 107), and second against older horses, to Skimming, in the GI Pacific Classic (Tiznow's Beyer 115) the first time he was ridden by Chris McCarron, who rode him for the rest of his career.

The Breeders' Cup was at Churchill Downs in 2000. Tiznow came into the race riding a two-race win streak. Robbins had taken him out of town after the Pacific Classic, and he won the GI Super Derby (Beyer 114) in his next start at odds of 4-5. He had his final Breeders' Cup prep in the then GII Goodwood H. back at Santa Anita, where he went off at 6-5 and ran a Beyer 119 to defeat Captain Steve by a half length. Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus went off as the 6-5 favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but really never figured, and Tiznow, at 9-1, ran a Beyer 116 to defeat Giant's Causeway, who came into the race having his five-race Group 1 win skein brought to a halt by Observatory in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. in his previous start. Giant's Causeway was a 13-2 chance in his first and only career start on dirt. Captain Steve was third, followed by Albert the Great and Lemon Drop Kid, with Fusaichi Pegasus checking in sixth.

Tiznow returned to defend his title at Belmont Park in 2001, having recorded a 2-2-1 record in five Grade I/Grade II races that year, his best effort coming when he won the GI Santa Anita H. with a Beyer 117. He was fourth choice in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic this time, behind 9-4 favorite Aptitude, a certain Galileo (making his first and only start on dirt) at 3-1, and Sakhee, fresh from a six-length win in a little race called the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in Paris, and the 9-2 third choice. Tiznow (Beyer 117) rallied to defeat Sakhee by a nose becoming the first (and still only) horse to win the Breeders' Cup Classic twice. Galileo was only sixth in his final career start before going on to be (a few years later) the world's number one sire. Tiznow retired to WinStar Farm, which bought into him along with Taylor Made Farm, for the 2002 season. Tiznow was a winner of eight of 15 career starts, in the money in all 14 of his races at more than a mile, earned over \$6.4 million, and registered six Beyers between 114-119. We'd like to have a few more with those kinds of Beyers retiring today!

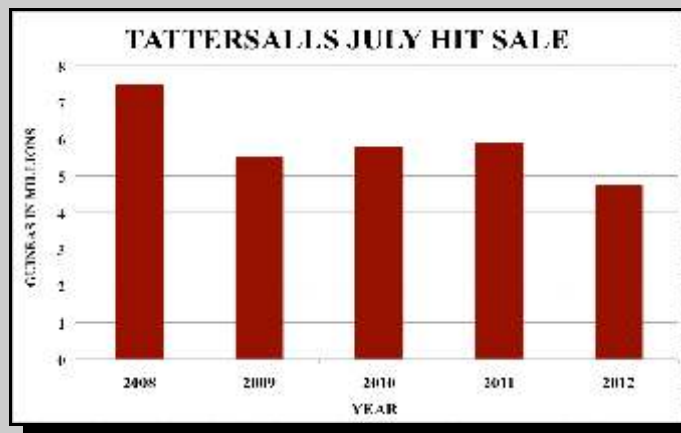
Tiznow's first crop was foaled in 2003 and raced in 2005. He was leading freshman sire by progeny earnings in 2005 (bloodhorse.com), with 11 winners and just one black-type winner, but that was GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner and Eclipse champion Folklore, who accounted for nearly three-quarters of her sire's \$1.27-million in progeny earnings. El Corredor, City Zip, and Songandaprayer also had freshman sire progeny earnings over \$1 million that year.

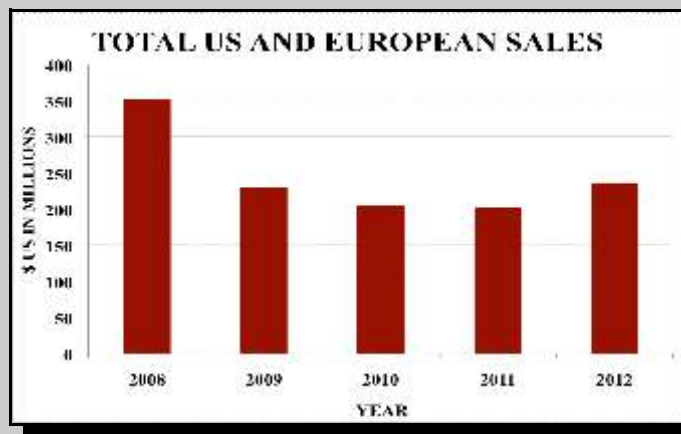
"Though Tattersalls' July sale was down this year, that is a mixed sale with a lot of racehorses. The number sold so far at the North American and European 2012 sales we cover is down three percent, but the gross is up by 21% from last year, to \$236.8-million, and the average is up 17%, to \$44,918. Both figures are the highest in the last four years; since 2008 – before the Crash – the number catalogued is down 30%, the number sold down 28%, the gross is down by exactly one-third, and the average is down by 20%."

Folklore didn't train on, though, and Tiznow's only black-type winner in 2006 was a second-crop 2-year-old, GI Kentucky Jockey Club winner Tiz Wonderful. Tiznow only ranked 15th on the 2006 second-crop sire list, which incidentally was topped that year by Aptitude. But then things picked up. Tiznow had six stakes winners in 2007, ranked second to Broken Vow on the third-crop sire list, and 29th on the North American General Sire List with 2007 progeny earnings of \$4.95 million.

Then he got good. In 2008, Colonel John won the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Travers, and Da' Tara sprang a massive upset in the GI Belmont. Tiznow ended 2008 with 13 stakes winners on the year, seven of them graded, and progeny earnings of over \$8.7 million, good for third on the general sire list. The world economic meltdown led to his stud fee going up to just \$75,000 (otherwise it would have been \$100K-plus for sure), where it has remained since. In 2009 Well Armed won the G1 Dubai World Cup and Bullsbay became the first of his two GI Whitney winners (so far). Tiznow had 11 stakes winners on the year, again seven of them graded, and progeny earnings of \$9.2 million, good for fourth on the general sire list. In 2010 he had another seven graded stakes winners, including Morning Line, who was also second in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile; and in 2011, five graded stakes winners, including the GI Met Mile and GI Whitney winner Tizway. This year he has five graded stakes winners so far, including GI Wood Memorial hero Gemologist, and ranks among the Top 10 on the North American general sire list.

I believe I'm right in saying all nine of Tiznow's Grade I winners are on dirt or all-weather tracks (on which he has a high 1.93 AW AEI, with 14 AW stakes winners, second only to Giant's Causeway's 18). He does, however, have three Grade II winners on turf. Nonetheless, Tiznow shows every evidence of being an all-American sire in the A.P. Indy-Fappiano-Unbridled mold. Through the end of 2011 he'd had 33 year-starters in Europe, for no A Runners, no B Runners, and no C Runners, and he'd had 43 year-starters in Japan, for one C Runner.

But what is potentially most exciting about Tiznow is the whiff we get that he could be a sire of sires. His first significant son at stud is Spendthrift's Tiz Wonderful, whose first foals made a big impression at the 2010 Keeneland November Sale: eight different foals from Tiz Wonderful's first crop sold for \$45,000 or more (his entering stud fee was \$12,500), including a \$200,000 colt to Mercedes Stable. He had 67 yearlings sell last year (of 88 offered!), which averaged \$43,728--almost exactly 3.5 times his entering stud fee, including seven yearlings which brought \$100,000 or more, and another seven which brought between \$80,000-\$100,000. They liked them, all right, although now, of course, it comes down to, can they run? So far Tiz Wonderful has had one winner, the filly Scammony (an \$85,000 yearling) at Churchill Downs, from five starters.

Next up was Colonel John, who stands alongside his sire at WinStar Farm. Colonel John was hands down the star of the show among North American freshman sires at the 2011 mixed sales, finishing up (short yearlings included) a clear number one with the buyers among North American stallions with first foals of 2011. He had 19 sell (of 24 offered) for an average of \$78,421, but, more impressively, a \$75,000 median, off his \$15,000 entering stud fee. And, of course, he was top first-year sire at Fasig July, with four sold for an average of \$140,000--plus he has five in at Saratoga. These horses aren't generating rave reviews by the market because some tip line or theoretician has decided Tiznow is the Next Big Thing as a sire of sires. It's happening because these are really good-looking horses who are throwing same.

Are they shooting stars, or the tip of the iceberg? Tiznow's only other son with a five-figure stud fee right now is Tizway, last year's GI Met Mile and Whitney winner who went to stud this year at Spendthrift for a \$25,000 fee--tops among all the Tiznow sons so far. Standing for \$5,000 are multiple Grade II turf winner Tizdejavu (KY, Crestwood) and 2009 Whitney winner Bullsbay (MD, Northview), both of whom have their first foals in 2012. Darby Dan has, at the same price, 2010 GIII Illinois Derby winner American Lion, who stood his first season this year. Grade I-placed Slew's Tiznow (Rancho San Miguel) and Grade II winner Informed (Ridgeley Farm) both stand in California, each for \$2,500 in their respective debut seasons in 2012, while Belmont winner Da' Tara and Grade II winner Slew's Tizzy have gone on to Venezuela. Still to come are 2011 GI Carter H. winner and 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile second Morning Line, who will go to Lane's End; and this year's GI Wood Memorial winner, Gemologist, though hopefully he will be racing on.

A foal of 1997, Tiznow is 15 years old, and his last four crops have been sired at a \$75,000 stud fee. With nine Grade I winners, and another 10 Grade II winners from his first seven crops, Tiznow's reputation looks more likely to grow than diminish. If they continue to run like they look, and if the progeny of his sons do, too, the possibility exists that in time Tiznow will come to be regarded as a major North American sire line, alongside those of Seattle Slew/A.P. Indy and Fappiano/Unbridled. He could revive the In Reality sire line, too--though his runners maybe look more like those in Tapit's close-up pedigree (A.P. Indy [through Pulpit]/Unbridled), while the Tapits look more like In Reality. But that is a different movie.

Laurel Park Fall Schedule Announced:

The Maryland Jockey Club announced the 2012 Laurel Park fall schedule Tuesday. The 69-day fall meeting, which begins Wednesday, Sept. 5 and concludes Monday, Dec. 31 includes 32 stakes races, five more than a year ago. Average daily purses will increase to \$240,000 from \$210,000. Racing will take place four days a week on a Wednesday-through-Saturday schedule, except for holidays.
