Lady Rothschild's **Great Heavens (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) was supplemented for yesterday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks after showing how much she relished testing ground

when scoring with authority in the G2 Lancashire Oaks at Haydock July 7. Repaying that risk in spades with an impressive victory for the in-form John Gosden stable, the homebred full-sister to Nathaniel (Ire) went a long way towards compensating

for her stable companion's gallant and narrow second in Saturday's G1 King George S. as a result. Settled in third throughout the early stages, the 5-4 pick was tapped for acceleration at the top of the straight and then needed racing room, but when it came, she picked up in style under William Buick to cut down **Shirocco Star (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}) with 100 yards remaining and win by three lengths. "She showed a lot of class and courage," Gosden said. "I think what she did in the last furlong says a lot about her ability." **Cont. p3**

George and Lori Hall's **Bern Identity** (Bernstein) broke his maiden super-impressively with a display of break-neck early speed downstate last month, but the bay showed a new dimension in Saratoga's GII Sanford S. for 2-year-old males Sunday, rating off a torrid duel and besting pace presence

**Handsome Jack** (Bring the Heat) by 1 1/4 lengths.

**Onetwentyeight** (Discreet Cat) was third. Second when unveiled in the Belmont slop May 9, **Bern Identity** looked like a new horse when romping by 13 3/4 lengths on a dry track back at Big Sandy June 1. He earned a \$100,000 bonus from the New York Racing Association for breaking his maiden at the Belmont spring

meet and winning a graded stake at a NYRA track in 2012. "The extra \$100,000 bonus makes it all sweeter. So, thanks, NYRA!" beamed Monmouth-based Breen. "Even for his first start, without the bonus, I don't know if I would have run him in New York to begin with. Maybe with the big money here, we'll have to think about bringing some more horses here." Pilot Rosie Napravnik added, "We weren't quite as forwardly placed as I thought we might be, but the pace was extremely fast. He just hung in there down on the rail and finished strongest coming for home." **Cont. p5**

**Irish Oaks cont.**

In hindsight, Great Heavens was a stone-cold certainty receiving her 13-pound weight-for-age allowance from the older fillies and mares in the Lancashire Oaks, having scored in an 11-furlong maiden at Yarmouth May 10 and Newbury's Listed Lord Weinstock Memorial S. over a mile and a quarter June 14. At Haydock, the further the homebred went, the stronger she looked as she put the proven Pattern-race performers Shimmering Surf (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) and Set To Music (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) to the sword and, with further improvement evident on the home gallops, connections were forced to pay the fee and take their chance here in the Oaks.

Taking an ideal early tow from **Twirl (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who set the pace for **Was (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Great Heavens was pushed along after the home turn behind the Epsom Oaks winner, as Shirocco Star was unleashed on the front end by Johnny Murtagh. Given one backhander approaching the quarter pole, her stamina began to kick in, but she had to allow **Princess Highway** (Street Cry) past on her outer. As Shirocco Star veered right towards the rail and hampered the one-paced Was with a furlong remaining, the Gosden trainee produced an irresistible surge when in the clear down the outside to swamp her fellow British raider. The stewards looked at the interference caused by the runner-up to the eventual fourth Was, but let the result stand.

Connections of the winner are looking at the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 23 and the G1 Leger at Doncaster Sept. 15.

Meandre's sophomore campaign was highlighted by his win in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp last July and was completed with a sixth placing after a troubled lead-up to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe back at the premier Parisian track in October. Starting off 2012 with a fourth as favorite for the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket May 5, the homebred returned to Longchamp for the June 11 G3 La Coupe and stayed on for second there. Back to his best with a comfortable win in the June 24 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, his form had been given the ultimate boost when the fourth Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) snatched Saturday's G1 King George. Racing keenly in midfield initially as Earl of Tinsdal set a stop-start gallop in his customary position upfront, the grey received a couple of smacks from Maxime Guyon as the leader's rider Andreas Starke kicked that rival in the belly off the home turn. **Cont. p4**

Picking up that rival with a flourish approaching the furlong marker, Meandre was too strong thereafter to cap a red-letter weekend for the Rothschild family, following the exploits of Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and his full-sister Great Heavens (GB). Nick Bell, stud manager for the Rothschild Family, told the *Racing Post*, "He seems to be a summer and autumn horse, and that was a good performance. He is entered all over, but it is up to Mr. Fabre to decide where he goes next. I would imagine the [Sept. 2] G1 Grosser Preis von Baden would be a possibility and obviously the [Oct. 7] Arc, in which he was sixth last year, is a likely target."

Given no respect off his 13-1 upset of the GII King Edward S. here June 24, Riding the River overcame a world of trouble and finished with a rush to string together a \$305 parlay as rain and hail pelted the E.P. Taylor Turf Course. On the edges in the sprinter/miler ranks here last term, Riding the River's 2011 highlights included a narrow second in the GII Play the King S. and a close-up fifth in the GI Woodbine Mile. He never factored in a seven-furlong main-track optional claimer Apr. 28 in his first start of the season, and was fourth in the GII Connaught Cup May 27 before his King Edward triumph. Showing a bit more early interest in the longest race of his career here, the bay tracked from fourth. Rider Todd Kabel had a fistful of horse at the top of the stretch, but the seam he and Riding the River tried to cut through closed up with no alternate route in sight. Room opened up inside the eighth pole, however, as chalk Imagining (Giant's Causeway) checked out, and Riding the River bowled his way to the lead to beat Hotep to the line. "It was a trip of hell," trainer David Cotey said. "I warned Todd, 'At some point in time, they're going to shut off and you're going to see a six-inch hole. Point him and hold on,' and that's almost exactly what happened. He just forced his way through it, he's such a game little guy."

Bern Identity was unable to make the lead as expected as Handsome Jack and Calder shipper Brave Dave (Put It Back) took it to each other through splits of :21.60 and :44.70, but was content to rate along the rail in a joint third. Handsome Jack was still going strong at the head of the lane as Brave Dave bore out badly, but Bern Identity chipped away at the leader's advantage in the final furlong to prevail in workman like fashion. Second Choice Rose Junction (Dixie Union), racing between rivals on the turn, was unable to keep pace in the lane. "[At the sale] I think Kelly said he liked him, and he wasn't too expensive," recalled George Hall of how he and his wife acquired Bern Identity for \$75,000 as a KEESEP yearling. "That was good enough for me. We'll see how he comes out of the race and see what's between here and the Breeders' Cup; obviously, that's where we'd like to get."

Reckless Abandon gave hint of guidance issues when prevailing by two lengths in a May 19 Doncaster maiden, and those early clues were in evidence once again when he charted a wayward path to an ultimately impressive victory in the June 21 G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot last time. Gerald Mosse, who partnered Arazi to victory here in 1991, took over from regular partner Adam Kirby and, despite a minor jink in the closing stages, the bay justified hefty local support to retain his perfect tally. He joins an illustrious honor roll that includes Blushing Groom (Fr), Ma Biche, Divine Proportions and Natagora (Fr). Reckless Abandon missed a beat at the kick, but was into stride quickly and soon raced at the head of affairs. Coming under pressure as rivals loomed large passing the quarter-mile marker, he took a false step with 300 meters remaining, but was soon on an even keel along the stands' side rail and ran on strongly to best G2 Coventry S. fourth, and fellow British raider Sir Prancealot with a degree of panache. "I'm really pleased with that performance and delighted he's won for Julie Deadman and Steven Barrow," commented trainer Clive Cox. "I wouldn't go so far as to say Gerald was never in any danger of coming off, but he did jink left a bit. It's something we are not familiar with at home, but he's clearly very talented. That is the easiest race he's had, and I am over the moon. We'll probably come back to France for the [Aug. 19 G1] Prix Morny [at Deauville] next. I think he's extremely exciting--you get a knot in your stomach when he goes out on the track, and today you can see why."

She left that foe in the dust while traveling sweetly at the head of the lane, and kept finding plenty to quell a late bid from Open Water, who was also making her turf debut.

"She surprised me today," said jockey Rafael Bejarano of the winner. "She broke so good and went to the front easy. She was comfortable. I thought maybe we were going a little fast, but she was doing it so well I just let her run. She's a nice filly; there's no doubt about that. And she likes the grass. We know that now, too."



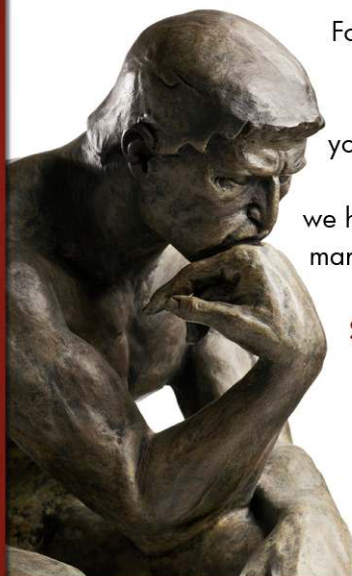

There were some tense moments, but race favorite Stars to Shine ultimately prevailed to score her second straight graded victory here and up her record over the Woodbine Polytrack to four-for-four. The dark bay spent much of her early career on the local lawn, but earned a first black-type victory in the track-and-trip Belle Mahone S. here 11 months ago. She returned to the sod to finish a solid third behind Grade I winners Never Retreat (Smart Strike) and Perfect Shirl (Perfect Soul {Ire})--and ahead four other Grade I winners--in the GII Canadian S. in September before finishing off 2011 with a fifth in Keeneland's GI Spinster S. in October. Stars to Shine returned in the Trillium S. going a sixteenth farther here June 24, and got her nose in front of favorite and defending champ Upperline (Maria's Mon), with Smart Penny (Smart Strike), Maristar (Giant's Causeway) and Rock the Moon (Malibu Moon) third, fourth and fifth, respectively. Away alertly and traveling well from the pocket as Hoo Why dictated terms, pilot Alex Solis attempted to guide Stars to Shine up the rail and inside the pacesetter on the home turn, but she appeared to spook and bounced off the rail. Hoo Why looked in midstretch like she might benefit from the favorite's misstep as she scooted away, but Stars to Shine regained her composure and flew home to grab command in the late stages. "I was trying to save as much ground as I could, and wait as long as I could," explained Solis. "Unfortunately, [Hoo Why] stayed out, and when I tried to get through, she came in and squeezed me a little bit. That's racing." Smart Penny was declared a non-starter after a disastrous beginning.

Aug. 18. "She looked great this morning and is happy," McLaughlin said from Sheikh Mohammed's Greentree Training Center in Saratoga. "Obviously, we'll look at the Alabama. It's in four weeks. I wish it was a little more time, but if she's doing this well..." Questing has been a revelation since being moved to the main track this term. A well-beaten but troubled fifth in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, she missed the board in two turf tries in 2012, but then earned a big 105 Beyer Speed Figure winning off by 3 3/4 lengths in an optional claimer on the dirt at Belmont June 24. "This filly's story is incredible," said McLaughlin. "What if she doesn't handle the dirt? Then the allowance race and whoosh! Then we said, 'Let's look at this Grade I.' We didn't even expect to win the allowance race [she was 6-1]. Now we go in with confidence." The CCA Oaks was jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr.'s first Grade I win; McLaughlin noted with pride that Ortiz joined Rajiv Maragh, Alan Garcia and Fernando Jara as jockeys who earned their first career Grade I victories riding for him. McLaughlin also gave an update on Godolphin's 2011 CCA Oaks heroine **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft), who captured the GI Ogden Phipps H. in her latest at Belmont May 28. McLaughlin bypassed Saturday's GII Delaware H. in favor of either the seven-furlong GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga Aug. 24 or the nine-furlong GI Personal Ensign H. Aug. 26. "She's undefeated at one turn, and she's kind of gotten speedier this year," McLaughlin said.

### *'Impressive,' 'Lingerie' Also Likely 'Bama Bound...*

The filly who completed the Hard Spun exacta in the GI CCA Oaks, the Darley sire's daughter **Zo Impressive**, is also expected for the GI Alabama S. Aug. 18. Tom Albertrani, who conditions the gray homebred for Live Oak Stud, gave kudos to winner Questing (GB), but also praised his own filly. "The winner was impressive," Albertrani said. "We just couldn't get by. [But] we're very happy with our filly; she's very consistent. She's first or second in all [six of] her starts." Zo Impressive, second in the GI Acorn S., came into the CCA Oaks off a win in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont June 23. "Right now, she's done as much as any 3-year-old filly has accomplished," Albertrani said.

Trainer Todd Pletcher said the CCA Oaks third **In Lingerie** (Empire Maker) will also be pointed to the Alabama, while fourth-placed **Disposable Pleasure** (Giacomo) could make her next start on the grass in the GII Woodford Reserve Lake Placid S. Aug. 19. "Both of them seem fine this morning," Pletcher said. "We didn't get much of a trip with either one of them. Both of them got away in a tangle and were last and next to last going into the first turn, and it seemed like speed was holding up pretty well. I think it was just one of those throwout races, and we'll try again."

### *On to Personal Ensign for 'Proud' Royal Delta...*

Trainer Bill Mott reports that champion **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) is none the worse for wear after Saturday's hard-fought win in the GII Delaware H. and is on track for the GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga Aug. 26. "She's proud of herself," Mott said. "She's walking around like she never ran. She's doing well. I'm hoping to run her in the Personal Ensign. That would be the plan."

### *Velazquez Back in the Saddle Wednesday...*

Jockey John Velazquez, who suffered a fractured collarbone in a scary spill on GI Stephen Foster H. night at Churchill June 16, has been named on two mounts on Wednesday, including **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) in the GII Lake George S. for 3-year-old fillies. "I am really excited to get back to the races," said the 40-year-old Velazquez, who will be inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame Aug. 10. "It's been five weeks since I last raced, and that's too long for me!" Velazquez, who was Saratoga's leading rider last year with 54 wins, currently is second all-time among jockeys in wins at Saratoga with 655 from 4,015 starts, 38 behind Jerry Bailey's 693 victories. "I'm going to take it a little slow at the start, so it might be difficult to catch Jerry this year," said Velazquez. "I'll hopefully get some nice winners, and setting the record will come whenever it comes."

### *Zagora to Diana; Banimpire Recovering...*

Martin Schwartz's **Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune) popped a split when winning the GIII Gallorette S. at Pimlico May 19, but after being freshened, is set to defend her title in Saturday's GI Diana S. at Saratoga. The Chad Brown-trained filly prepped for the nine-furlong race with a four-furlong breeze in :49.93 over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track yesterday. Brown also conditions **Banimpire (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) for Schwartz. Acquired for €2.3 million last fall at Goffs November, Banimpire finished fifth as the favorite in the GII New York S. at Belmont June 30, but reportedly had an excuse. "She has some sort of abscess in her throat that won't pop," said Brown. "She's at [Dr.] Scott Palmer's clinic in New Jersey getting evaluated. We're treating it aggressively with antibiotics. I think it was developing going into the race and she didn't have her air."



### ***Gemologist Works for Pletcher...***

WinStar's GI Wood Memorial S. hero **Gemologist** (Tiznow), unraced since exiting a 16th-place try in the GI Kentucky Derby with a foot bruise, worked yesterday over Saratoga's main track as he prepares for a tilt in either Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. at the Spa or Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth. Going out just after the renovation break in company with his Grade II-winning stablemate Dominus (Smart Strike), Gemologist zipped five furlongs in :58.40, the fastest of 43 horses at the distance. "He worked super," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "It was a very impressive work. He finished up great, galloped out well, and recovered quickly afterward. I think his conditioning is very, very good. I thought he breezed as well this morning as he's ever breezed. He's always been a good work horse, but he was exceptionally good this morning." It was the second straight bullet for Gemologist. "He hasn't run since the Derby, so we wanted to make sure we were tight," Pletcher added. "He's really had a very good, progressive work tab. Each one's been progressively stronger." Pletcher said a decision on the Jim Dandy or the Haskell would be made in the coming days. "We haven't decided yet," he said. "It's the same thing that goes into every racing decision; where you think you have the best chance to win. We are considering entering both spots, but we might make a decision prior to that."

### ***Handsome Mike Added to Haskell Line-up...***

J. Paul Reddam's **Handsome Mike** (Scat Daddy) will contest next Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park and jockey Mario Gutierrez has the mount. "Both Mario and Handsome Mike are ready and raring to go," confirmed trainer Doug O'Neill. "We are really looking forward to this race at Monmouth." A maiden winner over the Santa Anita turf last October, Handsome Mike was second in the GIII Generous S. The dark bay colt opened his sophomore campaign with a fourth-place effort in the GIII Sham S. before running third in the GIII El Camino Real Derby and he has been off since finishing fourth in the Mar. 24 GIII Spiral S.

Handsome Mike worked six furlongs in a bullet 1:11.80 at Hollywood Park Saturday. "It was a great, great work," O'Neill said. "He's fantastic. Handsome Mike is a very versatile colt. He's got speed and he's also got the ability to track if need be. I expect him to run very well."

Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer has also confirmed GIII Affirmed S. winner **Nonios** (Pleasantly Perfect) will take his place in the Haskell. The dark bay colt is coming off a runner-up effort in the GII Swaps S.

### ***Top Targets for Toronado...***

Trainer Richard Hannon is aiming high with Saturday's Listed Winkfield S. winner **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), with a tilt at a Group 1 race in the offing. Following the unbeaten colt's comfortable two-length success in Ascot's seven-furlong stepping stone, connections are looking at options in France. "Toronado is French-bred and therefore qualifies for the breeders premiums, and the Longchamp race [Oct. 7 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere] could be ideal for him," Hannon said. "Toronado has looked right up there with the best of ours since day one. He has a great turn of foot and has everything that you would look for in a good horse. I would not be keen to overdo him this season, as I think he could be our 2000 Guineas horse for next year, so one more race would probably do. If we went Group 2, the [Sept. 15] Champagne S. at Doncaster would probably be the race, but if we preferred the Group 1 route the choice would be the [Sept. 15] National S. at the Curragh, the Lagardere or the [Oct. 13] Dewhurst at Newmarket, though Hughesie thinks that he could be a Derby horse, so I suppose we could wait for the [Oct. 27] Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster. We'll sit down and talk to the owners before formulating a plan."

### ***Arc Still the Plan for Dunaden...***

Last year's G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase hero **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) remains on track for a tilt at the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe following his sixth placing in Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Over-racing near the front early in the 12-furlong feature under Craig Williams, the Pearl Bloodstock-owned 6-year-old was only beaten 3 1/2 lengths by Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and Sheikh Fahad's Racing Manager David Redvers is inclined to keep the faith. "There's no definite decision yet, as I haven't had a chance to speak to Sheikh Fahad, but my inclination would be to stick to the original target," he told *PA Sport*. "We didn't learn a great deal yesterday. He had no cover at all and was in front a long way out, which made him the rabbit for the others to aim at. He loves to come from behind and pass horses, so it was a bit of a farce. My feeling is to stick to the original plan of the Arc and he'll probably run in the G2 Prix Foy [at Longchamp 16] beforehand."

### BIG BROWN TO MISS SO HEMISPHERE SEASON

**Big Brown** (Boundary--Mien, by Nureyev), winner of the 2008 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., will not be shuttling to Vinery Australia for the 2012 Southern Hemisphere breeding season, according to a release from Three Chimneys Farm. The 7-year-old stallion suffered a laceration to a hind leg which became infected, leading to the recommendation not to shuttle. "Those who've been around Big Brown for any length of time know him to be a good-natured horse, which makes him a good patient," said Three Chimneys' president Case Clay. "While his initial injury didn't affect his ability to cover mares, looking out for his best interest, shuttling would not be conducive to his recovery." Big Brown currently has three winners from his first crop to hit the track, including Arlington maiden winner Brown Almighty and Churchill maiden winner Brown Eyes Blue. "We are very happy for those breeders who took the opportunity to send mares to Big Brown in his first two seasons [in Australia]--130 plus each year," said Vinery Australia's general manager Peter Orton. "It looks like he is going to reward their support given good early results and the promise of so much more to come. We greatly look forward to Big Brown's return to Vinery in 2013."

The bay was claimed for \$12,500 by trainer Mike Lecesse out of a runner-up effort at Finger Lakes May 14, and romped by 7 1/2 lengths last time in an allowance at that oval July 2. Obviously she wasn't beating much, but it was a visually impressive effort. The 73 Beyer Speed Figure she earned puts her close to being in contention with these, and there's reason to believe she's better on turf and may be capable of running significantly faster. The 4-year-old projects to be on or near the lead in a race with little pace, and she deserves a shot returning to the venue where her somewhat disappointing career started off promisingly. **Play:** \$30 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 7 - \$20 Win on #4 Goodtolook. **Alternate 2:** Race 5 - \$10 Win on #1 Broken Spell (Turf Only).

**SS: Yesterday** - Yuck. Think I could've outran **Irishtocat** Sunday. My pick was a mile out of it early, and never lifted a hoof at 26-1. Back to the drawing board.

**Today - Race 5 - MSW, 2yo, f, 1 1/16mT - #8 Aventurine (8-1)**

It's only a matter of time before Todd Pletcher begins to win races in bunches at the Spa, and we'll go for the longer priced of his two runners here. It's impossible to forget Big Brown's eye-catching debut win over the Saratoga lawn back in 2007, and Aventurine will attempt to emulate her promising freshman sire in this one. While her more-fancied stablemate on the morning-line Citizen Emma (4-1) clearly appears to be the quicker of the two based on the duo's quite comparable worktabs, I have no problem with my filly's slower, and hopefully stamina-building moves--which includes a trio of five-furlong breezes over the Oklahoma turf around the dogs--with this race being contested around two turns. The \$130k KEEAPR buy's multiple-stakes placed dam Julie Truly was winless in three attempts over the infield, but Aventurine does get a pedigree boost under her hard-knocking stakes-winning second dam Truly Needy, who annexed seven of 21 career attempts on the spinach and also produced MGSW Truly a Judge. Having the red-hot Ramon Dominguez signed on to ride can't be a bad thing. **Play:** \$25 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 5 - \$20 Win on #3 Citizen Emma (Turf Only). **Alternate 2:** Race 6 - \$10 Win on #2 Born Bullish.
