IS SIX THE MAGIC NUMBER?

Trainer Bob Baffert will saddle Zayat Stables' **Paynter** (Awesome Again) in Sunday's \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational in hopes of his sixth winner--and third straight--of the Monmouth Park marquee event. The **"TDN Rising Star"**, coming off a tough beat in the GI Belmont S. June 9, was established as the 3-2 choice in the six-horse field. "The draw went pretty well," said Baffert. "I'm happy to have a horse who is good enough to run, and as the favorite." Paynter, who drew the three hole, made most of the running last out. "It depends on the break where he runs, but he's the kind of horse who needs to be up close," Baffert added.

The two Grade I winners in the field, Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) and WinStar Farm's **Gemologist** (Tiznow), were both listed at 3-1, and are the co-highweights at 120 pounds. Dullahan followed his third in the GI Kentucky Derby May 5 by finishing seventh as the favorite in the Belmont. Trainer Dale Romans feels the big chestnut will get a better set-up Sunday.

"In a small field, post position isn't that important, especially with my horse," said Romans.

"He'll drop back from the break and come with one run. My guys say he's doing well [at Monmouth]. I like a mile and an eighth for him. He'll get a little more pace up front and come with that one quick kick."

Wednesday's G1 QIPCO Sussex S. following yesterday's confirmation and supplementary entry stage for Glorious Goodwood's one-mile feature. Khalid Abdullah's freak will bid for a round 12 wins coming off an 11-length demolition of the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. Godolphin's progressive G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Eclipse S. placegetter **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) was the lone addition to the field, at a cost of £19,500, and will step down in trip coming back from those 10-furlong tests. "Farhh has been doing well since he ran at Sandown and I have been happy with him," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "I think that a mile at Goodwood will suit him well, but we would prefer to see some rain before Wednesday because he prefers to have a little cut in the ground. He has run very well in two Group 1 races, but taking on Frankel will be a very tough task. I am hopeful that he can put in another good performance." **Cont. p7**

Having won the G3 Anglesey S. over an extended six furlongs at The Curragh on Sunday, Grafelli had his work cut out attempting to defy a three-pound penalty and drying ground here but proved game and genuine to record a fourth renewal for Jim Bolger since 2005. Sent off the second favorite in the face of strong support for Ballydoyle's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Lines of Battle, the bay raced in second early tracking that rival's pacesetting stable companion Kingston Jamaica. Gaining the edge over the long-time leader passing the eighth pole, the homebred was joined by the favorite with 100 yards to race but dug in to assert between the Rosegreen duo. "I thought that was a good performance four days after the Curragh and Jim [Bolger] was very confident," jockey Kevin Manning explained. "He handles soft ground very well, but I would never have said he was a soft-ground horse before Sunday so he's very versatile. Each time Joseph [O'Brien] put down his challenge my lad kept pulling out a little bit and I was always confident I was going to hold him. He's improved so much from race to race and there is more in him--he's a horse that is going to fill out and do more in the future." His trainer, who has a soft spot for this race, which he used as a staging post for his champions Teofilo (Ire) and New Approach (Ire) and was winning it for the ninth time in total since 1987, added, "I've never seen a horse win on ground like that on Sunday and lose just a kilo in weight. He will stay a mile, but will have a break now and stick at this trip for the [Oct. 7] G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp."

There is little left to say about Famous Name apart from reiterating his myriad wins at this level or slightly above and below. Adding a third renewal of this contest to his already mightily impressive haul of 16 black-type races, with 11 coming at this venue where he is so difficult to upstage, the Juddmonte stalwart keeps producing despite his advancing years. Stalking early as is his want, the millionaire strode to the front on automatic passing the quarter pole and kept pulling out further distance the further he went. Connections sent him to Munich after winning this 12 months ago for a seventh attempt at the top level and he came up short again when second in the G1 Grosse Dallmayr-Preis, so he is to be kept at home this time in an attempt to win The Curragh's G2 Royal Whip Aug. 12, one of the few domestic Pattern races he has yet to plunder. "He's just an amazing horse, and when you have a horse that's been around as long as he has, you have a relationship with him," jockey Pat Smullen commented. "That was like riding a piece of work and he's so used to this track he does it himself--when he comes off the turn he picks up the bridle and quickens. He's getting older now and Group 1s are very difficult to win."

RCI Considering ‘One Strike, You’re Out’ Policy

The Board of Directors of Racing Commissioners International (RCI) is directing its committees to develop a “One Strike, You’re Out” proposal for licensees who administer substances that would endanger horses. The proposal would not only affect trainers, but also owners and veterinarians. The list of substances has not yet been compiled. The RCI Board also agreed in principle with a proposed procedure in which veterinarians believed to be overusing legal medications in inappropriate ways would be referred to those agencies with the power to review their actions and revoke their license to practice veterinary medicine.

“RCI is clearly concerned about reports of the overuse and possible abuse of legal medications and believe that this is where the hole is in the racing regulatory scheme,” said RCI President Ed Martin.

RCI has also established new restrictions on the use of extracorporeal shock wave therapy machines.

The organization also voted to accelerate review of the proposed Reform Medication Rules submitted by The Jockey Club and created a Task Force to assess the recommended thresholds and withdrawal times.

“We appreciate the proposal that The Jockey Club has made and view it as a good first step that is in need of some strengthening in certain areas,” Martin noted. “There is general agreement among the regulators to develop stronger penalties and to provide a level of deterrence to those veterinarians who may be pressured to do things they know in their heart they should not.”

Morrisson Dispersal at KEENOV

Dolphus Morrisson, breeder of 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d’Oro), will disperse his bloodstock holdings at the Keeneland November Sale. The 22-head dispersal, which consists of seven broodmares, five 2-year-olds in training, four yearlings and six weanlings, will be handled by Gainesway. Included in the group is Samantha Nicole, Rachel Alexandra’s yearling full-sister.

Other notable entries include Frankel's 3/4-brother and chaperone **Bullet Train (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), and this term's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero **Power (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}). The official going for the five-day festival is currently rated as good, and clerk of the course Seamus Buckley will maintain a program of irrigation to ensure perfect racing ground. "We started watering at six o'clock Thursday morning," he said. "There is a chance of a shower Friday afternoon, but this is not forecast to amount to anything significant. It is the only rain forecast in the next few days, so the watering will help to maintain the course in its current condition. I am very happy with the course and we are where we want to be at this stage. It is very pleasing to see such a good entry for Wednesday and we are all eagerly anticipating Frankel's return to Glorious Goodwood."

Botti Eyeing Global Targets for 'King'

Newmarket conditioner Marco Botti has nominated international targets for stable star **Crackerjack King (Ire)** (Shamardal), who backed up a win in the May 13 G1 Premio Presidente Della Repubblica at Rome with a fifth in the G1 Eclipse S. in his first start for his new stable last time July 7. Botti will point last year's G2 Derby Italiano hero at the Aug. 18 G1 Arlington Million and the Oct. 27 G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley. "Crackerjack King should run in the Arlington Million next month," Botti told *Racing Post*. "I thought his run in the Eclipse was okay, but the ground wasn't suitable and he was a little disappointing. Later on, the plan would be to go for the Cox Plate, as he has been bought for an Australian owner."

Margot Did Retired

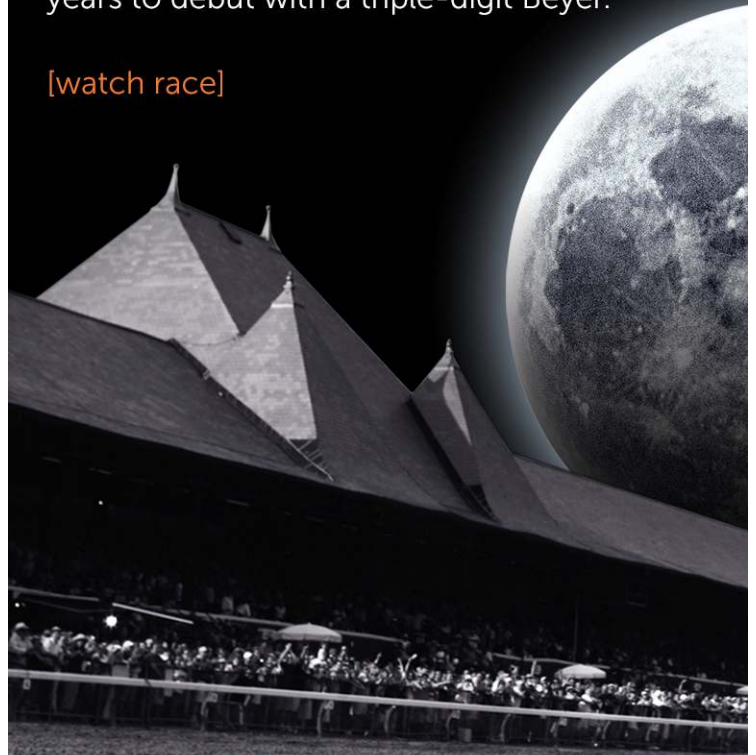
Last year's G1 Nunthorpe S. victress **Margot Did (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}--Special Dancer {GB}, by Shareef Dancer) will likely be retired, according to trainer Michael Bell. The 4-year-old has failed to fire in five starts this campaign, including a last-out 10th in the July 13 G3 Summer S. at York, and Bell feels it's time to call it quits on her 19-race career. "It's 95% certain that Margot Did will be retired," he said. "She did very well as a 2-year-old and very well as a 3-year-old. The 3-year-old season is usually the difficult one for sprinters, but she ended up winning the Nunthorpe. She came back sick after she ran in the [G1 Prix de l'] Abbaye [at Longchamp], and I just think maybe she hasn't recovered sufficiently from that. She looks fantastic and has been working well, but she's not been doing it on the racecourse." He continued, "Rather than degrade her and run her in conditions races and things, the decision has been taken that she'll be retired to stud. She'll be sold privately or she'll head to the December Sales. She's been a star for us and a star for the owners, but, almost certainly, we won't see her on the racecourse again."

Sheikh Fahad purchased the Surrey base from recently retired conditioner Peter Winkworth. Stevens, who helped with the breaking and pre-training of 2010 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon), will be fully operational by the end of the year.

"The acquisition of Robins Farm fits into the long-term strategy that Sheikh Fahad is developing for he and his brothers' involvement in the sport," Sheikh Fahad's racing manager David Redvers told *Racing Post*. "Furthermore, the location, within an hour's drive of London, will enable him to visit on a regular basis. Sheikh Fahad is a great believer in supporting young and talented individuals, and we are delighted to give Olly the opportunity to build his training career at Robins Farm. The yard will be the base to some Pearl Bloodstock horses in full training and a handful that are recovering from injury, but its primary function will be as the yard from which Olly will train for a mix of clients."

Stevens, who will be assisted by wife Hetta, added, "The decision to come home was a hard one, but the arrival of our twin girls made the decision for us. We are terrifically fortunate to have this opportunity to train at Robins Farm and we are very excited to be able to put into practice our collective experience on behalf of Sheikh Fahad and all our owners."

Pletcher May Have Whitney Pair

Trainer Todd Pletcher is considering two of his charges, **Caixa Eletronica** (Arromanches) and **Rule** (Roman Ruler) for next Saturday's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga. The historic race is part of the Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" Challenge for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Rule, third to Horse of the Year Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in last year's GI Woodward at the Spa, kicked off 2012 with a stylish win in the GII Monmouth Cup July 7.

"We thought his first race back was very good," Pletcher said. "We need him to come back and work well like he did last week. If that's the case, we'll go ahead and take a shot."

The versatile Caixa Eletronica also has the option of the six-furlong GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. Aug. 5.

"We want to survey the fields," Pletcher pointed out.

Runners committed to the Vanderbilt include Jersey Town (Speightstown) and Hamazing Destiny (Salt Lake).

'Feather' Nearing Flight

Stronach Stables' champion **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) breezed a half-mile in :48 yesterday at Saratoga. Out of action since January, the unbeaten 4-year-old may make it back to the races by Labor Day. "She's doing great," said trainer Chad Brown. "We'll see if there's a race for her at the end of the meet. I don't think we'd look at the [GI] Personal Ensign [Aug. 26] as a comeback race. But if she doesn't race here, we'll look for something at Belmont Park during the fall meet."



"With a very successful Triple Crown season behind us, it's time to turn the awareness and spotlight towards the "Second Season" of Thoroughbred racing, culminating with the Breeders' Cup World Championships Nov. 2-3 at Santa Anita," stated Jason Wilson, Vice-President of Business Development for The Jockey Club. "We are excited about the unprecedented cooperation and collaboration with these premier race tracks. We felt that building this approach shouldn't be a top down thing, but it would have a much better chance at succeeding if it was generated more in a cooperative spirit."



Woodbine's Battle For Survival; A Chat With Nick Eaves

When Woodbine Entertainment Group President and CEO Nick Eaves said last month that this year's Queen's Plate could be the last edition of the historic race, he set off alarms throughout Ontario racing. While the provincial government's decision to end the Racetrack Slots Program seemed certain to have a devastating impact on racing in Ontario, it was generally assumed that the Woodbine tracks were strong enough to survive. Are they? It's a question that Eaves has been dealing with on a daily basis and has yet to be answered. What is the future at Woodbine and Mohawk and what will it take for Thoroughbred and Standardbred racing to continue to thrive at the WEG tracks? Those were among the questions we asked Eaves.



TDN: Since you made the announcement that the Queen's Plate and the very future of racing at the Woodbine tracks is in jeopardy, has anything changed? Has your somewhat dire forecast remained the same?

NE: I wouldn't say anything has changed so far as the overall understanding of what the future can look like. The statement about there not being another Queen's Plate ties directly to our ability as a company, as a committed live horse racing operator, to continue to stay in that business. That depends on an on-going partnership that involves gaming because that's obviously the model that was built over the last 14 years. It was in fact a requirement; it was the mandate of the Racetrack Slots Program, that the revenue that was generated through the program be reinvested back into promoting and supporting live racing. We took that very seriously in terms of the investments we made in capital expenditures. We spent about \$300 million over that 14-year period both on our obligations around the slot facilities as well as about \$200 million in backstretch and frontside customer-oriented improvements to deliver a product that could support that mandate of supporting live racing. We changed our operating structure in terms of the various departments, the way we promote our business, sell our business, all with a view on being able to deliver that. So that's the reality of the model that resulted from that partnership. To be able continue on requires the same level of partnership and commitment.

TDN: Woodbine was around for a long time before anyone ever heard of racetrack slots and seemed to be just fine. The betting on your products is still reasonably healthy. Why couldn't you continue on without the benefit of slots revenue, albeit with smaller purses?

NE: Something could continue with smaller purses, but it's a matter of pretty straightforward economics. Would there be the same level of investment and participation in an industry which would contract back to where it was some number of years ago? People's costs have gone up significantly; the whole environment has changed significantly. It has to be understood that if we went there, the size of the business would decrease drastically. The other side of it is the racetracks' ability to continue operating. The genesis of the Racetrack Slots Program was to support and promote live racing and there was a contractual requirement on the part of the racetracks to invest the revenue generated from that program to deliver on that mandate. We've done exactly that.

By implementing the structure and making investments in the structure, which just can't be dismantled, that's a new operating reality. What you can't do is maintain an operating and capital structure when half the revenue that you've been accustomed to is coming in. Then the result is you'll have to dramatically downsize and restructure. Yes, that is possible. But what will be left? What sort of an industry is left if that occurs? Particularly in the face of what is unprecedented expansion on the gaming front in terms of the number of facilities, on-line expansion, etc., horse racing standing alone such as it did back in the mid-1990s and abandoning the successful model that was created isn't sustainable because it's been built on a partnership.

TDN: Other than a pledge to contribute \$50 million to the industry, which no one seems to think is at all adequate, the government hasn't shown any willingness to help racing. Are you still hopeful that there will some sort of 11th-hour miracle or offering from the government that will make the picture less bleak for the WEG track?

NE: I am hopeful that with every passing week there is a better understanding of the costs and the consequence if a good solution isn't reached. I don't know today necessarily what that's going to look like, but certainly there's a greater and greater understanding of the genuine size of the racing and breeding industries and the importance of maintaining that employment and that economic contribution. I know it's going to be different and we're not going to go back to the way it was, but we still hope the decision-makers understand the sensibility of a partnership between racing and gaming such that racing can continue to flourish and gaming revenues can be maximized. There ought to be, and I'm still hopeful there can be, a solution which will ensure that outcome. If no such solution comes, the consequences are the very ones that I and so many others have been outlining.

TDN: When you say that there may never be another Queen's Plate or that Woodbine could close, you open yourself up to charges of making idle threats or saber rattling. How would you respond to such claims?

NE: That has been said. And as I responded then, it wasn't a threat. It was more about stating a reality and I think that reality needs to be understood and if it turns out that that outcome is acceptable to decision-makers then OK. It wasn't to be dramatic, to be fear-mongering. It was just stating the case. You can't overnight go from having half the revenue that the last number of years have delivered and expect to be able to produce anything like the type of racing product that has been built over time.

TDN: When it comes to the future of the WEG tracks, do harness and thoroughbred racing fall under the same umbrella? Might one breed be in more trouble than the other?

NE: Our intention is to continue operating both businesses, both breeds. They have different economics, different operating schedules, different realities, different purses structures, all kinds of differences. In a way, we need to work through them uniquely as we're looking at the solutions, but our starting point is that we continue to operate the successful world-class Thoroughbred and Standardbred racing programs that we have built.

TDN: Understanding that it's hard to know where this is headed, but as we speak in late July, 2012, what do you believe will be the future for the WEG tracks in 2013 and beyond? We'd like to pin you down a bit here.

NE: It's just too difficult to predict. There are too many possible scenarios. Our focus and our job is to create a solution. Naturally, that needs to be in the interest of the industry and in the interest of the Woodbine Entertainment Group. It also needs to be in the interest of government. Our job is to make sure that's all understood. Part of that process has included the panel that the government struck to work with the industry to understand the industry better and to determine what a sustainable industry might look like going forward. The panel has done a lot of work in that regard. We don't know yet what they are going to recommend. You will hear from anybody that has engaged with the panel, which is many, many people in the industry, that there was a keen understanding of the issues and of the consequences and a willingness to come up with the best possible solution. Time will tell what that will look like.


TDN: Do you sense that there are political leaders and others in a position of power who understand what might happen to racing in Ontario and are determined to make sure it is not destroyed?

NE: I sense there are those who believe that it cannot be allowed to be devastated and are committed to seeing that it isn't. It's going to be hard work together, coming to an understanding as to exactly what the future should look like. I believe there is a genuine interest in trying to solve it.

TDN: What does WEG need from government to ensure that you can continue to operate racing?


NE: The foundation for Woodbine and Mohawk would be meaningful participation in the on-going gaming operations at our two racetracks. It makes all the sense in the world because we operate there already, so we have operations that can be scaled to bring efficiencies on the gaming side. There is an existing customer base, there is proven performance and a proven brand and we have the ability to grow that business with them. Because of our structure as a not-for-profit and because of our commitment to live racing there are many more benefits in that type of structure in terms of employment and local economic input than if that income share went somewhere else.

For us, the job is to really make clear that's the best option and achieve it. It's obviously not easy because we're not there yet.

TDN: But how is this different than the status quo? It sounds like you want a continuation of the Racetrack Slots Program, at least for Woodbine and Mohawk?

NE: We're not saying status quo. We're saying let's continue these very successful gaming operations at our tracks. Government has said it wants to change the operating model and wants to privatize it. We can work with them to achieve that. But as a starting point, let's commit to really trying to have an outcome whereby through a successful gaming partnership, this job-intensive economic contributing industry participates. That's a great outcome. It doesn't need to be status quo. We can be very creative in terms of new ways to generate incremental revenue that achieves that core priority of government and still enables us to deliver on our core mandate of live racing. **Cont. p11**

TDN: Is there one particular thing that you believe government is missing? What frustrates you the most? A lack of understanding? Misinformation?

NE: I think there has been a lack of understanding as to the real size, scale, contribution and reality of the racing and breeding industry in the province. I know questions weren't asked, no real level of analysis was undertaken. There were decisions that could have been avoided that were made. That would not have happened had there been a deeper understanding. As an industry we've worked hard and have made some progress in helping that understanding come alive. We still have to work to do, that's for sure.

TDN: If the 2012 Queen's Plate wasn't the last, might we see it return with a smaller purse, say \$500,000? Might the North America Cup on the harness side survive, but with a much smaller purse?

NE: Everything is possible. We are committed to a solution that will allow us to deliver on our mandate, which is to operate a vibrant, live racing business at our facilities. We have to be creative about all possible solutions. Let's try to avoid dismantling what has been so successful because there are going to be real implications in costs and job loss that goes with it.

To call **Color Blind's** 2011 dirt form 'ordinary' would be very generous, but she showed an immediate affinity for the grass first off the lay-off at Belmont May 6, blowing up the tote at 38-1 against fellow New York-breds. The turf was yielding (it may very well come up that way again here if they even stay on the turf), but everything else about her performance is pretty tough to discount. She was back off an average pace, covered a lot of ground on the turn when making her run and beat a decent enough first-level allowance field. Two also-rans came back to win, including fourth-finisher **Elusive Rumour**, whose fairly close eighth in Wednesday's **Gil Lake George S.** would make her plenty competitive here. **Color Blind** returned against open company back in **Elmont July 7**, and was simply in too tough, finishing eighth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths. Her trip certainly didn't help matters, as the dark bay was hung very wide and without cover at all points in the race. Finger Lakes-based trainer **Anthony Ferraro** scored with a 22-1 winner on the turf here last year, and he could be poised for another longshot victory if **Color Blind** runs back to her good turf race stepping back into restricted company. **Play:** \$15 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 9 - \$10 Win on #1 **Relentless Road** (Turf Only). **Alternate 2:** Race 8 - \$15 Win on #8 **Morgan's Guerrilla**.

DiDonato Bankroll: \$850 - Record: 6-0-1-1

Sherack: Thursday - Thought I hooked another live one after watching my selection **All Class** get hammered down to 7-2 from his 12-1 morning-line quote, but he failed to run to the money after setting a pressured pace and folded to finish a disappointing eighth.

Today - Race 4 - Msw, 2yo, 5f - #1 Stage Street (7-2)

Making my biggest bet of the young meeting in this one. If not for **Shane Sellers** falling asleep at the wheel on **Stage Street** in his 4 1/2-furlong **Churchill Downs** unveiling June 1, the speedy son of **Street Sense** would already be looking to take on stakes company at the Spa. The \$300k **KEEAPR** graduate flashed sharp speed after breaking from post six, looked home free while being extremely confidently handled in the stretch, but never saw the fast-closing **Malibu High** coming (yet to return to the races or worktab), and was beaten by a half-length. "Oaklawn welcomes the new point system because it rewards the prep races such as our **Rebel S.** and **Arkansas Derby** that have a longstanding tradition of producing **Triple Crown** caliber horses," said **David Longinotti**, assistant general manager of racing. "We are also excited that horses can start earning points with the **Smarty Jones S.** in January, so it was only fitting that we make this and the **Southwest** even more attractive with larger purses. Owner Barbara Banke of Stonestreet Stables felt no need to hold back her opinion.

"The answer from me is 'yes,'" Banke said with a grin.

Teen Pauline validated Banke's confidence by dueling with Gadget Girl for early supremacy, wresting command with two furlongs to travel, and needing only a few shakes of the reins from Julien Lejaroux to scoot clear to a 4 3/4-length score. My Happy Face,

the runner-up, was 10 1/2 lengths clear of third-place finisher Gadget Girl.

The final time of :56.53 was 0.01 seconds faster than the mark set by J C's Pride on July 27, 2011.

Teen Pauline is named for Barbara Banke's mother.

"We think she's 19," said Banke, explaining the "Teen" aspect of the name.

Banke hopes Teen Pauline can emulate My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike), named after the mother of George Bolton, who owns last year's champion 2-year-old filly in partnership with Stonestreet.

"As Barbara mentioned, she's good enough to be named for her mother, so I think that definitely indicates their expectations of her," said Asmussen. "She came up from Churchill, had a very easy move over at Oklahoma and two easy breezes after that, and I thought she was spot-on and the timing [of this race] would be perfect for her. We just want this to be the first step in a very successful career."

Stonestreet purchased Teen Pauline in utero when they bought her dam Effectual in foal to Tapit for \$475,000 at the 2009 Keeneland November sale. Effectual won the GIII Debutante S. at Churchill Downs as a juvenile and has one other foal of racing age, No La Hace, who has four wins in five starts, all in claiming races.

During the delegation, an increase in funding was given to the International Collating Centre (ICC), which is based at the Animal Health Trust in Newmarket and provides the service of disseminating equine disease information to IBM member countries. Delegates also gave unanimous backing to Thoroughbred Breeders Australia by reaffirming its support for Article 12 of the International Agreement, which states, "Any foal resulting from or produced by the process of artificial insemination, embryo transfer, cloning or any other form of genetic manipulation shall not be eligible for recording in a Thoroughbred Stud Book approved by the International Stud Book Committee." Kirsten Rausing, chairman of the 2012 International Breeders' Meeting and outgoing Chairman of the TBA, said, "As ever, it has been both fascinating and educational to sit around a table with like-minded individuals to discuss the many issues which affect Thoroughbred racing and breeding. Working together with members from around the world will help us to ensure that the voice of the International Thoroughbred Breeding Industry will be heard loud and clear on such matters."
