Classic winner **Shackleford** (Forestry) will contest the Aug. 5 GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga, trainer Dale Romans confirmed yesterday. Romans indicated the winner of last year's GI Preakness S. will arrive in New York on a flight from Kentucky this week. "The

only thing that would change our plans is if we don't like the way he is handling the track after he arrives at Saratoga," he said. Campaigned by Bill Cubbedge, Michael Lauffer and Phillips Racing Partnership, Shackleford kicked off the season with a seventh in the nine-furlong GI Donn H. Feb. 11 and a third in the Apr.

7 GI Carter H. Recently, the robust chestnut took the seven-panel GII Churchill Downs S. May 5 before annexing Belmont's one-mile GI Metropolitan H. May 28. Initial plans called for the 4-year-old to contest the Sept. 1 GI Forego S. at seven furlongs. The Vanderbilt will mark the chestnut's first attempt at six furlongs.

"He's starting to come out of his shell and I don't think it will be as taxing on him as the 1 1/8-mile [distance] of [Saturday's GI] Whitney," said Romans. "He's a horse that likes to run, and if nothing else, it would be a good prep. He only has three or four more races left in his career, so we might as well get them."

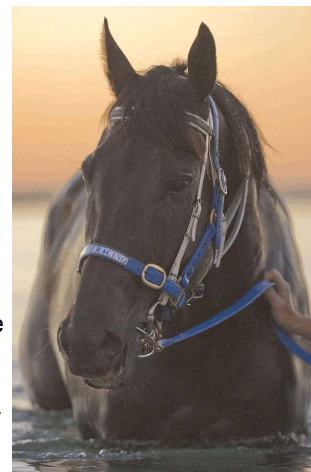

**BLACK CAVIAR TO MISS THE CARNIVAL**

**Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) will miss the upcoming Melbourne spring carnival, trainer Peter Moody announced yesterday. Set for a break after her exploits at Royal Ascot when

extending her unbeaten run to 22 in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S., her future will be decided later in the year. "We have two options. If we retire her after that meeting she's still got plenty of time to go to stud. Otherwise, we will give her a decent spell and bring her back for the autumn," Moody told the *Herald Sun*. "She's just needed time to get over her trip to England. She's had a really busy time in the past year or so and just needs a break to get over it. She's fine in herself and she's recovered from her injuries, but it would be asking a lot of her to have only a couple of weeks off and then be ready for the spring." Black Caviar, who has won the carnival's G2 Schillaci S., G2 Schweppes S. and G1 Patinack Farm Classic for the past two years, will also sidestep the G1 Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin in December.

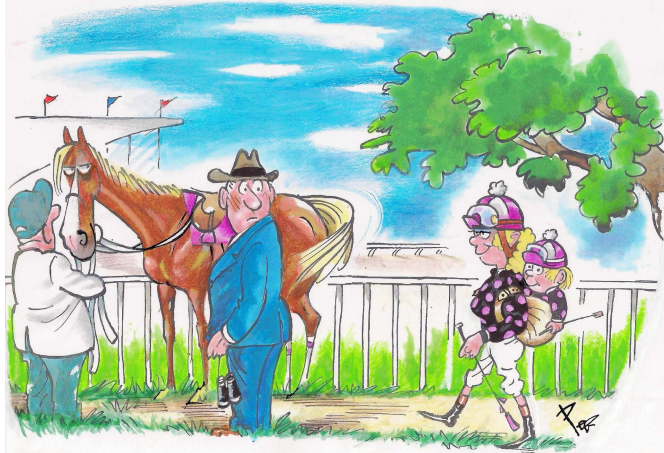

Saturday's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga. Conditioned by Eoin Harty, Endorsement posted an easy five-furlong drill over the main track in 1:04.52 following the renovation break.

"It wasn't nearly as fast as last week," said Harty, referring to a five-panel bullet in :58.96 July 23.

"I didn't want him to go nearly as fast as last week...He did it very easily and came back very well. I don't think his fitness is in question."

Endorsement, who finished third in the May 18 GIII Pimlico Special, was a well-beaten seventh in his most recent start in Belmont's GII Suburban H. July 7.

As for his position in Saturday's nine-furlong test, Harty added, "I don't know what's in there, but I envision myself being on the lead as long as possible. Hopefully, that's long enough."

Also working toward the Whitney, Fort Larned worked alongside stablemate Cape Glory (Cape Town), posting five panels in a snappy :58.69. The move was the second-fastest work at the distance Monday.

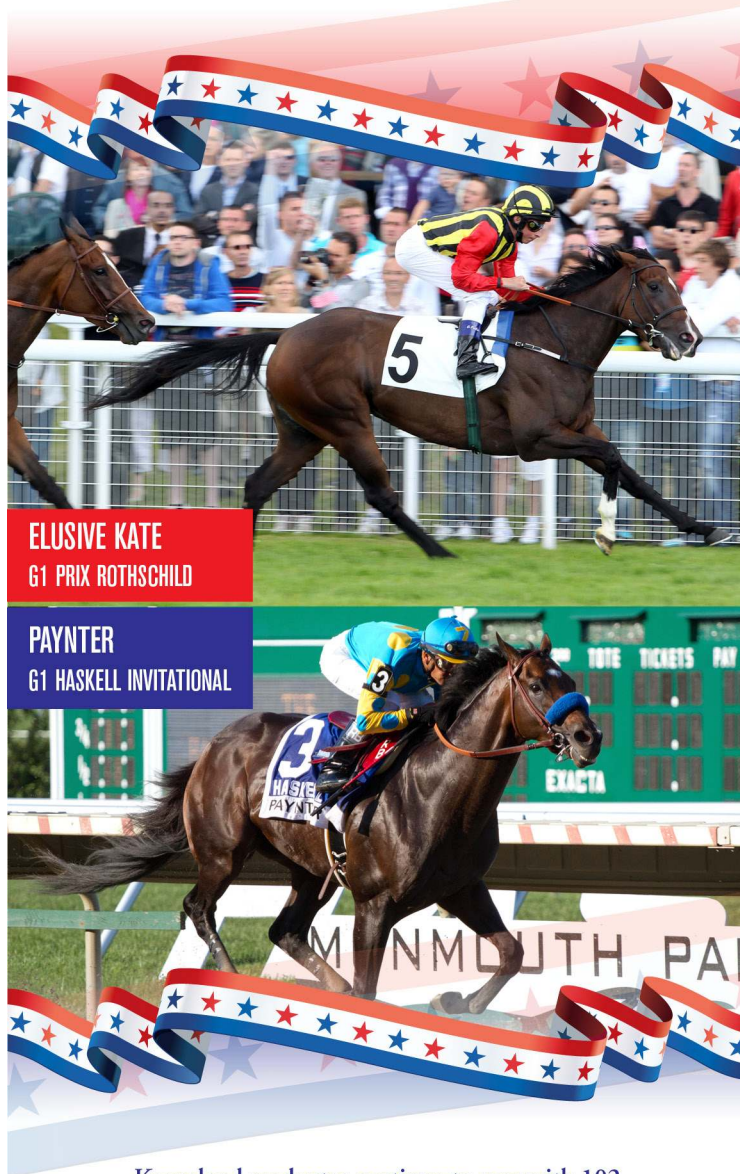
"It probably made us work a little faster, having to run through the hole, but everything is fine," said trainer Ian Wilkes, who was commenting on a close encounter with another horse galloping close to the rail near the half-mile pole.

Fort Larned, victorious in the GII Alysheba S. at Churchill Downs May 4, took his latest start in the June 30 GIII Cornhusker H.

"I don't have to do the running, so I'm not nervous, but it's always exciting when you have a horse good enough to compete in a Grade I at Saratoga," said Wilkes.

The 4-year-old will be accompanied by jockey Brian Hernandez Saturday.

# RACETRACK ROUND-UP

## Emma's Encore Readies for Prioress

Brenda Mercer and Peter Berglar's **Emma's Encore** (Congrats), victorious in the July 7 GIII Victory Ride S. at Belmont, breezed four furlongs over Saratoga's main track Monday in preparation for Saturday's GI Prioress S. The 3-year-old filly completed the task in :47.53.

"She did about as good as you can hope," said trainer Allen Jerkens. "She felt pretty good. I don't think the track is lightning fast. Anyway, that's it. We wanted her to work good."

Sent off at 39-1 odds in the Victory Ride, the dark bay defeated Jamaican Smoke (Latent Heat), Tu Endie Wei (Johar) and the highly regarded 1-5 choice that day, Agave Kiss (Lion Heart), who finished fifth.

"[Emma's Encore] will have to do even better if she's going to get this one," said Jerkens. "If she runs in this one, we won't run in the [GI] Test [S. Aug. 25]. You never know how the track is going to play, if it's going to be playing to speed. That's why they don't win them all, but you got to take a chance. If she could do it, it'd be some feather in her cap, a Grade I."

## HOT TO TROT?

Today's G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood has an open feel to it and **Foxtrot Romeo (Ire)** (Danhill Dancer {Ire}) may not need to reach the standard of some of this race's recent winners to prevail for the Classic generation. Surprising many when a length second to Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26, Andrew Tinkler's colt looked a dubious stayer at a mile when fading late to be sixth in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 19.

"I've been absolutely over the moon with him this season," trainer Bryan Smart told *PA Sport*. "He's been in fantastic form since Ascot and I'm really looking forward to the race."

Of the older brigade, **Libranno (GB)** (Librettist) is as hard as they come and he has proven track form, having annexed the 2010 G2 Richmond S. and 2011 G3 Supreme S. here and finished fourth in this 12 months ago. He beat the re-opposing pair **Edinburgh Knight (Ire)** (Selkirk) and **Majestic Myles (Ire)** (Majestic Missile {Ire}) in the G3 Criterion S. at Newmarket last time June 30 "We might have higher-rated horses in the yard than Libranno, but I doubt if we have any tougher," trainer Richard Hannon commented. "He was only beaten two lengths by Strong Suit in this race last year and he went back there in the autumn and won the Supreme Stakes. He seems better than ever this season and you could not fail to have been impressed with the way he won both the Cathedral S. at Salisbury and the Criterion at Newmarket. He goes on any ground and I know he won't let us down."

**Chachamaidee (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) warrants maximum respect as the winner of the G3 Oak Tree S. over this track and trip 12 months ago, but ruined her chance with a slow start when second in Royal Ascot's G2 Windsor Forest S. last time June 20 and will need to break more on terms here.

**MISSION POSSIBLE**

Aside from being Frankel's full-brother, Khalid Abdullah's **Noble Mission (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) has smart form in his own right and bids for an inevitable first Pattern-race success in today's G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood. So close to that goal when runner-up to stable companion Thomas Chippendale (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII S. over this trip last time June 22, he sets the standard on that form.

"It's a very competitive race, but he has progressed well since Ascot," the owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "He's been running consistently well throughout the year and, hopefully, he can now step up to winning a group race."

John Gosden has a strong hand in middle-distance 3-year-olds and Bjorn Nielsen's **Michelangelo (GB)** (Galileo (Ire) is on the up after wins in the Listed Cocked Hat S. over 11 furlongs here May 25 and Newmarket's £150,000 Tattersalls Millions 3-Y-O Cup over a penel shorter June 30.

Godolphin's **Encke** (Kingmambo) was prominent in the betting for the G1 Racing Post Trophy in October before a late setback ruled him out of that Doncaster feature and he is considered better than his subsequent win in a 10-furlong Sandown handicap July 6. "Encke is really nicely bred and, the other day at Sandown, he was a little bit short of work and ran very green," Racing Manager Simon Crisford explained. "He could be a [Sept. 15 G1] St Leger type of horse, but he has got to prove himself."

From Germany's strong crop of sophomores is Gestut Ebbesloh's **Girolamo (Ger)** (Dai Jin {GB}), who was third in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg July 1 and was made to look even better on Sunday when the winner Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) followed up in the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis.

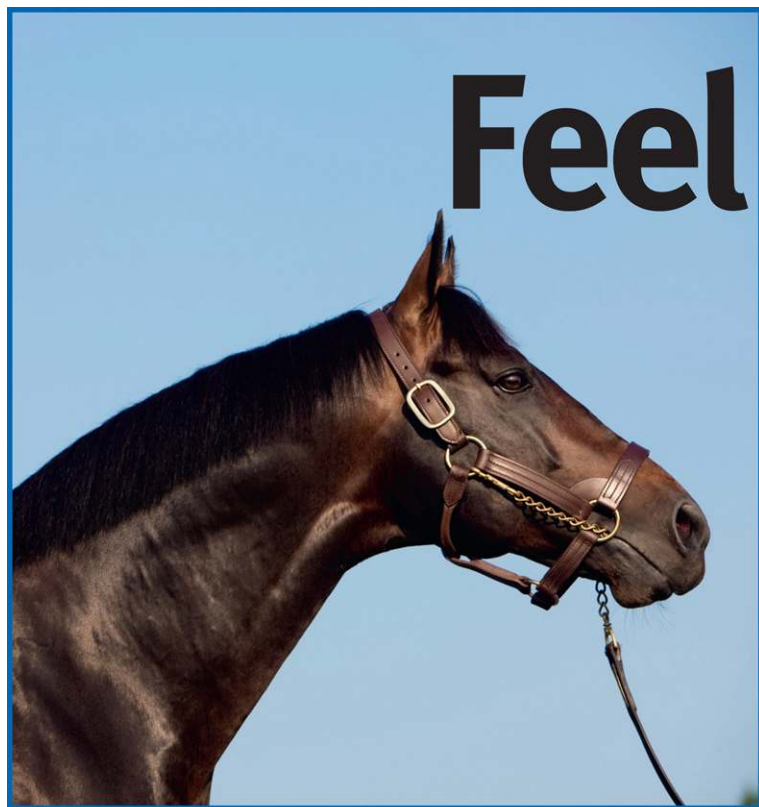

Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Morawij (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) has shaped as a progressive colt so far and is likely to start favorite for today's G3 Molecomb S. at Goodwood, which is the next in line of Britain's speed tests for the juveniles. Fourth behind the high-class Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in the G2 Norfolk S. over this trip at Royal Ascot June 21, he scored with authority in Sandown's Listed Dragon S. July 6. "Morawij has done nothing wrong so far and has been training nicely at home," trainer Roger Varian commented. "On paper, he looks to have a decent chance and we are hopeful of a good performance from him." Morawij meets a fast filly in Danethorpe Racing's **Jadanna (Ire)** (Mujadil), who was third behind Sendmylovetorose (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) and the subsequent G3 Princess Margaret S. winner Maureen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. over six furlongs at Newmarket last time July 13. Also in opposition is Kenneth MacPherson's June 19 Listed Windsor Forest S. scorer **Hototo (GB)** (Sleeping Indian {GB}), who was sixth in the Weatherbys Super Sprint over an extended five-furlong trip on heavy ground at Newbury July 14.

Forecast to start at 1-20, Khalid Abdullah's brilliant 4-year-old will be watched on television by trainer Sir Henry Cecil, who explained yesterday, "Unfortunately, I won't be at Goodwood on Wednesday as I have been undergoing some treatment. Although I am able to train my horses, I'm not quite fit to go racing yet, but I hope to be fully recovered in the near future. Everything has gone as we could have wished with Frankel since the G1 Queen Anne S. We gave him an easy time immediately after Royal Ascot before bringing him back into fast work. He has pleased us with his work and is going to the Sussex S. in good shape. We are taking one race at a time with him and are hoping that he can extend his unbeaten record."

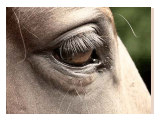

I've no idea whether Ahmed Zayat and Bob Baffert are devotees of Frank Sinatra, but they should certainly be singing along to these lines made famous by Ol' Blue Eyes:

*"Out of the tree of life, I just picked me a plum  
You came along and everything starting to hum  
Still it's a real good bet, the best is yet to come."*

For "tree of life" substitute Keeneland's 2010 September Sales, where Zayat Stables picked out a plum at a cost of "only" \$325,000 on the opening day, when the average stood at nearly \$350,000. The plum, of course, is Paynter, the impressive G1 Haskell Invitational winner whose bloodlines give every encouragement for thinking that the best is indeed yet to come.

In triumphing in the Monmouth Grade I, Paynter followed in the footsteps of Point Given, War Emblem, Roman Ruler, Lookin' At Lucky and Coil to give Baffert his sixth victory in the Haskell. Three of the Awesome Again colt's predecessors had enjoyed Triple Crown success, but the less precocious Paynter didn't even contest the first two legs, having made his debut on Feb. 18. After improving his record to two wins from four starts, he was ready to take on the big boys in the G1 Belmont S. and he very nearly covered himself in glory, failing by only a neck to hold off Union Rags after attempting to lead throughout. Stamina is clearly no problem for this progressive colt, and neither is speed, as he showed when dropping back to a mile and an eighth.

Understandably, in view of the fact that he also trains Game On Dude and Bodemeister, Baffert made no mention of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic after Paynter's

Haskell victory. However, if Paynter can maintain his upward curve, he could easily become a contender for the Classic, a race which figures very prominently in his pedigree. His sire Awesome Again took the 1998 Classic and his dam Tizso is a lightly-raced sister to Tiznow, who

repelled top-equid European challengers in the 2000 and 2001 editions. Awesome Again already has a Classic winner to his credit, thanks to Ghostzapper in 2004.

It is well worth pointing out that Awesome Again was dynamite, but with a slow-burning fuse. Like Paynter, he was unraced at two and he didn't draw attention to himself until he won the Queen's Plate at the end of June. His next step up the ladder came on the same day as the 1997 Haskell, when he won the GII Jim Dandy S. By the end of his 3-year-old campaign, Awesome Again had earned an International Classification of 117, but he boosted this to 130 at four.

It was a very similar story with Ghostzapper. He also achieved a figure of 130 when he topped the World Rankings as a 4-year-old, having achieved an International Classification figure of 116 at three. Ghostzapper is relevant to Paynter, as he is out of a mare by Relaunch, the stallion who appears in Paynter's pedigree as the grandsire of his dam, the Cee's Tizzy mare Tizso.

Although Tizso's brother Tiznow won the Breeders' Cup Classic as a 3-year-old, he wasn't exactly precocious. He hadn't made his debut until Apr. 22, little more than six months before the Classic, and he didn't win until May 31. Although he gained his first graded victory in July, in the GIII Affirmed H., he didn't show his true worth until the fall, when he reeled off victories in the Super Derby, Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. and then the Classic.

So Awesome Again, Tiznow and Paynter have all needed a bit of time, despite all three being March foals. If Paynter can match the progress displayed by his forebears, he has every chance of challenging for the title of champion 3-year-old, especially now that I'll Have Another and Union Rags are no longer around to add to their achievements.

With the Awesome Again--Relaunch alliance having produced Ghostzapper, breeders were bound to try the Adena Springs stallion with mares by Relaunch's son Cee's Tizzy.

There are now 11 foals of racing age representing this cross, including Paynter's 2-year-old brother who sold for \$510,000 last September. The cross's seven starters also include the group-placed stakes winner Awesome Patriot, who is out of a sister to Tizso.

Tizso is the fourth of the nine foals that Cee's Tizzy sired from Cee's Song. The second, Budroyale, retired with a bankroll of \$2,840,810; the fifth was Tiznow, earner of \$6,427,830; the seventh was the Grade II-placed stakes winner Tizbud; and the eighth was Tizdubai, winner of the GII Sorrento S. at two. Most of this success came after Tizso started her broodmare career at the age of three with a visit to the unraced Distinctive Cat in California, followed by successful visits to Western Fame and Distinctive Cat again. However, the enormous rise in the family fortunes earned Tizso a transfer to Kentucky. She was sold for \$625,000 when in foal to Hennessy in 2002 and has justified that sort of price-tag by producing Tiz West, a Gone West colt who landed the GIII Cinema H. over a mile and an eighth on turf, and now Paynter.

Tizso's sister Tizdubai sold for \$950,000 as a weanling in 2001, with another sister, Tizamazing, reaching the magic million-dollar mark as a yearling in 2003, but Tizso so far ranks as the most successful producer among the six sisters.

Tiznow's status as one of America's most effective stallions can only help Paynter when the time eventually comes for the Haskell winner to retire. The revival in Ghostzapper's fortunes, with six group/graded winners in 2012, will also help. Ghostzapper is one of three sons of Awesome Again to have sired graded winners this year, another being Awesome Feather's sire Awesome of Course.

Awesome Again himself is having a fine year, currently holding 11th place on the sires' table, two places below Tiznow. With Paynter and Game On Dude among his flagbearers, chances are that he'll be higher still by the end of the year.

Spendthrift Farm's young broodmare More Than Pretty (More Than Ready) enjoyed a banner few days last week with a pair of impressive fillies earning ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ status with dominant performances at Del Mar and Saratoga.

**Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon) started things off at Saratoga July 20, debuting with a wire-to-wire 12-length laughter over 5 1/2 furlongs. The 2-year-old was sold by Spendthrift for \$90,000 as a Keeneland September yearling and blossomed into a \$490,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida juvenile purchase by Stonestreet Stables.

"I didn't know a lot about Kauai Katie, other than that she had breezed really well and sold really well in Florida," recalled Spendthrift General Manager Ned Toffey. "Other than that, I hadn't heard a lot about her. So I didn't know what to expect, but after the way her sister broke her maiden--she won by five and probably could have won by 10--it didn't surprise me that this filly ran well. But to say that I expected her to win by 12 at Saratoga and get a 100 Beyer would be a stretch."

A day later at Del Mar, Kauai Katie's year older sister Winding Way, racing for her breeder, made it a perfect two-for-two in her career with an easy 7 1/4-length victory in a 6.5-furlong optional claimer. The Spendthrift homebred began her career with a 4 3/4-length victory at Hollywood June 10.

"The thing that was so impressive about Winding Way was the ease with which she did it," Toffey said. "She looks almost bored out there loping along on the lead."

B. Wayne Hughes' Spendthrift Farm acquired More Than Pretty for \$330,000 out of the 2007 Keeneland January Sale. Then four, the filly was a stakes winner on the track and a half-sister to another stakes winner in Ingrid the Gambier (Johannesburg).

"We liked the fact that she had demonstrated some ability," Toffey said of More Than Pretty. "She had some speed on the track and, even though she was not a major stakes winner, she was a listed stakes winner, and was a sister to a stakes winner as well. We liked that there was ability and there was a little bit of family."

While More Than Pretty was bred to Malibu Moon her first three seasons, Toffey said the filly wasn't specifically purchased for that Spendthrift stallion.

"At that time, we were in the process of trying to buy those types of fillies," he said. "We were looking for fillies to breed to a number of our stallions, but as we began to firm up the decision to bid on her, it was pretty clear that we would breed her to Malibu Moon."

More Than Pretty's first foal is Malibu Cougar, a \$210,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky yearling, who went on to sell for \$350,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale in 2010.

Winding Way was her second foal, but never found her way to the sales ring.

"Winding Way we actually kept because she had some minor issues that our farm veterinarian felt might compromise what we could sell her for," explained Toffey. "But at the same time, our vet was not afraid of the issue at all. We liked Winding Way quite a bit--she was always one of the nicer fillies in our yearling crop that year. So we decided, rather than take her to sale and risk being penalized there for what we felt were pretty minor issues, we just decided to keep her and go on with her ourselves."

Spendthrift Farm currently has a broodmare band of approximately 85 head and breeds to sell, with a few exceptions. **Cont. p2**

“Basically the intention is that everything goes to sale, but if we have some issues that we think are going to compromise one and we are not going to get what we want for it, but we believe there is something there, we will keep them,” Toffey said. “Like Malibu Pier. We raced the mother, Blue Moon (Fr) (Lomitas {GB}), and Big Moon was not a big impressive mare herself. She was a little bit bow legged and Malibu Pier was very much the same way, undersized and bow legged and we thought, ‘Why get punished at sale with something like that?’ She was a nice filly, just not real big, not an obvious sales type filly. Winding Way was very much the same kind of thing. Those are two that we just decided to go on with. And it has worked out well for us--we got lucky.”

Winding Way still has some way to go to match up with Malibu Pier, who was a three-time graded stakes winner for Spendthrift and earned \$466,200.

More Than Pretty’s third foal is Kauai Katie and Toffey admits he was impressed with the filly from the start.

“I remember when she was born, she was a beautifully made foal,” he said. “As she grew up, she was not real big, but she was always very well put together. She rotated out a little bit on one front leg, so I think her overall size and her one leg rotating out just a bit is maybe what slowed people down on her as a yearling. And we felt like we had the mother and a full-sister that we really liked, so we sold her as a yearling for \$90,000.”

While More Than Pretty was barren in 2011, she is still expecting another Malibu Moon foal.

“She was barren on Northern Hemisphere season in 2011 and we decided to breed her on the Southern Hemisphere, again to Malibu Moon, and she actually is in Australia right now,” Toffey said. “The plan is that she will foal the Malibu Moon down there on Southern Hemisphere time, then she will actually be bred back to Redoute’s Choice (Aus) on Northern Hemisphere time and come back up here and hopefully will have a very nice Redoute’s Choice foal on Northern Hemisphere time.”

In the meantime, the Spendthrift team has Winding Way to look forward to, although the speedy filly’s next start is still up in the air.

“We’ve got a couple of different directions to go with her and we’re still trying to make that decision,” Toffey commented. “She is so talented, we could probably just jump up and feel pretty strong, or we could try to bring her around a little more slowly. We are looking at those options right now.” *-Jessica Martini*
