A CRY IN THE SPA

The majority of Monday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale was already in the books before bloodstock agent John Ferguson, bidding behind the sales pavilion alongside Sheikh Mohammed, knocked the auction out of its doldrums with a sale-topping bid of \$1.2 million for a son of Darley stallion Street Cry (Ire) out of Canadian champion Serenading (A.P.Indy).

The colt was one of two seven-figure sales during a session that was described as "sticky" by more than one participant. At the close of business, the session's gross was down 16% from a year ago, while the average was down 21% and the median was down 30%. The buy-back rate was 33.3%.

Ferguson, a major presence at last year's Saratoga sale, signed the ticket on four yearlings Monday, compared to six during the opening session of the sale in 2011.

"Obviously Street Cry has done great things for us," Ferguson said after signing the ticket on the session

topper. "This is a horse with a seriously good pedigree. He is a very athletic horse--it made sense. Obviously we have a lot of homebreds to race over here next year, but it is nice to pick up a horse like that that can add to the program."

Of the price tag, Ferguson added, "I felt he would be strong. At the end of the day, he is a good-looking horse with a great pedigree."

John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale co-bred and consigned the

yearling. Hill 'n' Dale also co-bred Serenading, as well as her dam Daijin (Deputy Minister). Racing for the Sikuras, Serenading was named Canada's champion older female in 2009, the same year she won the Gil Falls City H. The Street Cry yearling was her first foal. She has a weanling colt by Smart Strike.

"I'm very proud of the horse; I thought he was a special horse," Sikura said. "The family goes way back for us, and his dam was a magnificent and wonderful racemare. He is a beautiful representative of his sire. When you're in the horse business and you top the sale, you're happy with that, and you wish everybody the best of luck with their purchase." **Cont. p4**

Day 1 Down, One to Go...

With gross falling to \$13,590,000, average down to \$261,346 and median dipping to \$200,000 following the first session of the Saratoga sale, Fasig-Tipton officials might have felt down, but not out ahead of Tuesday's second session.

"Yes, I would have hoped for stronger statistical numbers," admitted Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "You are always disappointed when you see a reduction in average and median price from one year to the next."

Considering whether day 2 might bring about stronger final numbers than day 1, Browning offered, "I will caution myself, and others, that it is only half way through the sale. The horses are arranged alphabetically, so the quality may shift from year to year. Last year, the first night was stronger than the second night. Hopefully, in 2012, the second night will be stronger than the first."

Looking ahead to today's second and final session, Browning remained positive.

"Hopefully, we'll build some momentum in the auction arena as a result of having some good horses sell late," he said. "Energy is contagious and hopefully we'll have more of that [Tuesday] night. I'm optimistic it will be good."

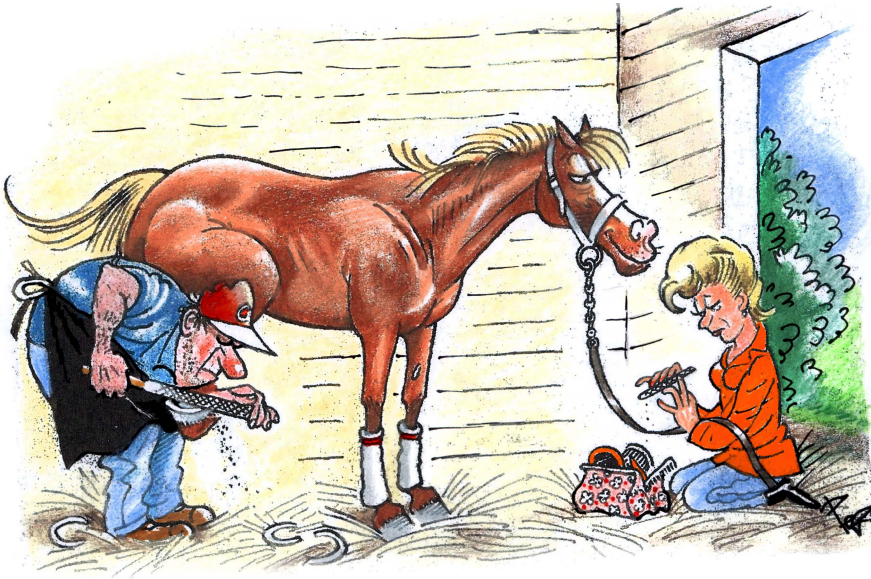

Sikura admitted he expected the colt's seven-figure price tag. "I think he was a million-dollar horse, up or down," he said. "If it had been one less bid or twice more, neither would have surprised me. We had 10 scopes on the horse. He's a wonderful, smooth, great-walking Classic horse. I don't think you could fault the horse. You never know if they will run, but certainly everything you could hope for in a horse you saw in him."

Stonestreet and Bolton Firing Late at the Spa

With the session nearing its end, John Moynihan, bidding on behalf of Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stable and George Bolton, fired the final shot of \$1.1 million to secure [hip 91](#), a colt by Empire Maker. The main competition during the fast and furious duel came from a pair of Japanese clients of John McCormick who were seated near the back of the pavilion. Consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud, the Mar. 19 foal is out of stakes winner Sluice (Seeking the Gold), a daughter of triple Grade I winner Lakeway (Seattle Slew). The 14-year-old mare, who is a half-sister to GI Kentucky Oaks third-place finisher Flying Spur (Giant's Causeway), is already the dam of this colt's full sister, GI Spinster S. winner Mushka.

"He is a beautiful horse and he is by a great stallion," said Moynihan. "He is a full-brother to a really good horse. The matings worked. He is just really nice and he looks like he could be fast and go far. And if he does those things, he certainly has a lot of stallion potential. Especially with Bodemiester [Empire Maker] just selling [privately] the way he did."

Despite Monday's subdued final statistics, Craig Bandoroff felt rewarded for a good horse.

"It's a lot of a money, so how can you not be happy?" asked Bandoroff. "He's a beautiful horse and he's getting a good home, so we are thrilled. I would have been disappointed with anything less for that kind of horse. It was past the reserve, but those animals are really hard to come by and when you get one like that, it is certainly in the ballpark that you are hoping for."

And how did the buying team feel about spending the session's second highest price for the youngster?

"When John says that this is the best one, we listen," admitted Banke. "I think a lot of people might just wait

for [Keeneland] September, but if you see a really good one here, you buy it. This colt was nice enough that the people we love [Denali] said we couldn't wait for Keeneland, because there weren't going to be that many that are that good at Keeneland, so it is fun that we got him."

In partnership, Bolton and Stonestreet have campaigned Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike), GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' heroine My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike), Grade III winner Astrology (A.P. Indy) and GII Dwyer S. hero Dominus (Smart Strike), winner of a Saratoga allowance for trainer Todd Pletcher Aug. 4.

"We've had so much fun and have had some good luck together," said Bolton of the Stonestreet/Bolton partnership. "With the colts, it's always smart to split them up a bit. I'd rather own a half a horse with Barbara as opposed to owning the whole horse by myself, for all the reasons. I've done better with Barbara than apart. So it's all good."

Banke echoed the sentiment.

"I really enjoy having partners, because it spreads the risk and you get twice the horses out of the partnership," said Banke.

Stonestreet has enjoyed overflowing success with its juvenile division, with the likes of 🌟 **"TDN Rising Stars"** 🌟 Kauai Katie (Malibu Moon), Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy) and Teen Pauline (Tapit).

"You don't really have to go to far out of that division to see that Stonestreet is dominating," offered Bolton. Despite its excess of homegrown talent, Banke pointed out the decision to go to visit the sales' arena.

"We like to bring in other bloodlines and good stallion pedigrees," explained Banke. "I have some stallion pedigrees that I bred, but this is one I don't have. This is a really good one. This is really a live pedigree, on both the stallion's and mare's side. This is a stallion pedigree with a great physical to go with it."

Diane and Guy Snowden raced Sluice, herself a \$1.5-million Keeneland July yearling, and were pleased with the mare's produce.

"He was a beautiful colt and beautifully prepared and we are very pleased with that," stated Diane Snowden. "That was about the range we were looking at, judging by the family and the wonderful record of Mushka, we thought he would be around there."

To date, Sluice has only produced a single filly, Mushka; however, the Snowden's indicated they might keep one in the future.

"I've been waiting and waiting [for a filly] because normally we sell the colts and keep the fillies," explained Snowden. "We sold Mushka [a sale-topping \$1.6 million FTSAUG buy by Zayat Stables in 2006], because she was the first foal and we wanted to make some sense out of buying the mare."

The Empire Maker was one of the talking horses at the sale all weekend, and Bandoroff summed up his overall experience on opening day of the sale.

"He's not only one of the best horses I've had this year, he is one of the nicest horses I've ever had my hands on," admitted Bandoroff. "I would put him up there with Royal Academy, Harlington and Grand Reward. Those types of horses are hard to come by and they're special. With John Moynihan buying him, I'd be very surprised if we don't read about him in a couple of years." --CBoss

Irish Lass to Maryland...

Merriefield Farm had a very busy day in Saratoga Monday. The Maryland farm kicked off the day with a nifty a \$30 payoff with Paris Vegas (Maria's Mon) in the ninth race. Wheeling back some of those new-found winnings, Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services' Peter Bance, acting on behalf of John Moores and Charles Noell's Moncton operation, went to \$450,000 to secure [hip 41](#), a filly by Galileo (Ire). The Irish-bred filly is out of Group 3-placed Nell Gwyn (Danehill), a full-sister to star miler Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), European Horse of the Year and highweighted colt in England, France and Ireland. Among the Coolmore runner's biggest victories are the G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas and the G1 Grand Criterium. He also was runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

"[Moores] likes Coolmore and he likes the stallions that they have," said Bance. "This is some blood that we don't have too much of here. He bought this filly to one day join his broodmare band."

Noell, who co-founded JMI Equity in 1992, is based in Baltimore, Maryland. He is currently a Director of Authentify Inc., Axeda Corporation, JME Software LLC and NEON Enterprise Software Inc. Since late 1991, Noell has been the president of the family investment company of John J. Moores, the founder and former Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of BMC Software Inc.

Merriefield, led by a small steeplechase division, was responsible for such standouts as Bon Caddo (Bon Point {GB}), winner of last year's Virginia Gold Cup. Along with the jumping team, the farm has a handful of Thoroughbred broodmares in addition to a sprinkling of flat horses, including a filly by Tapit who is currently in training with Midlantic conditioner Tom Voss. Under the guidance of Voss, Merriefield has tasted success with Always First (GB) (Barathea {Ire}), victorious in the 2008 GIII Sycamore S. winner at Keeneland. According to Bance, Moores and Noell hope to develop a small, but select broodmare band and team of select fillies to race.

"He wants to go high-quality," said Bance.

To that end, Merrifield secured three mares at Keeneland November in 2010, including Great Plains Lady (Peaks and Valleys), who is the dam of hip 188, a filly by Speightstown that will be offered during today's second session of the Saratoga sale.

"He is just putting his foot in the water at the moment and being smart about it," said Bance. "He recognizes that it is a tough game and wants to be judicious about it and careful." --CBoss

Tapit Filly to Live Oak

Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation secured the highest-priced filly at Monday's Saratoga sale, going to \$500,000 to bring home a daughter of Tapit out of Saintlike (Saint Ballado).

"That was right where we thought we would be," confirmed Live Oak General Manager Bruce Hill. "She is such a nice filly. We're just pleased with her; she is big and scopey, good-walking, and with a lot of class. We looked at her late in the afternoon and she was still walking good."

The gray filly is a half-sister to stakes-winner Heart of a King (Lion Heart).

Hill said the Live Oak team was making its first bidding foray of the auction, but likely not its last. "She was probably our first- or second-choice filly--there might be another one that we might like better," he said.

Bred by James Miller, the yearling was consigned to the Saratoga sale by Mill Ridge Sales, and Mill Ridge's Headley Bell said he was pleased with the result. "I really thought the price was fair," Bell commented. "She was a lovely filly. She was out all the time and everybody had a chance to see how elegant she really was. She got a great home, she'll get a great trainer and she will have every chance--that's what makes us most happy."

Of the overall market, Bell added, "I think it is very sticky. It continues to be selective. You better know your market, know your horses and just navigate accordingly."

Brennan Hopes Medaglia Buy Is Pretty Smart

Ocala pinhooker Niall Brennan went to \$490,000 to secure a son of Medaglia d'Oro Monday at Fasig-Tipton, but it remains to be seen if the yearling will be returned to the sales ring.

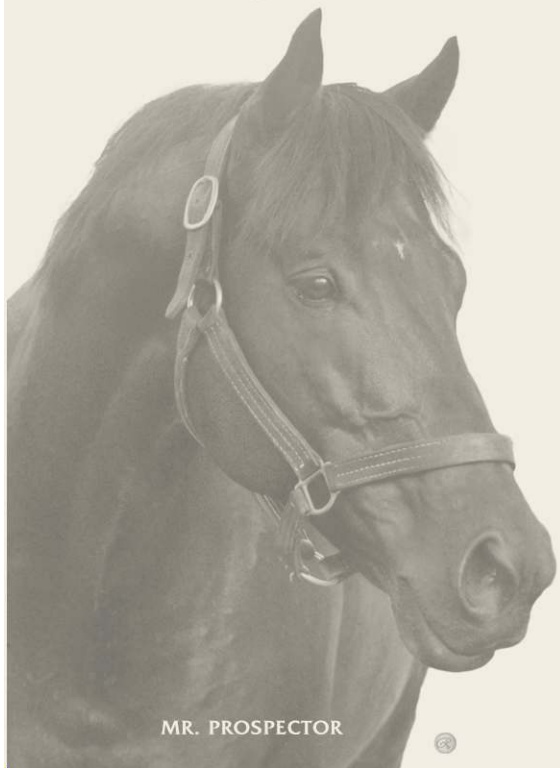
"The colt is for a new client and they wanted to buy a very nice horse, so that's what we did," Brennan explained. "The decision to pinhook hasn't been made--they are open to either or going forward."

The yearling is out of graded stakes placed Pretty 'n Smart (Beau Genius) and is a half-brother to graded stakes winners Heart Ashley (Lion Heart) and Ashley's Kitty (Tale of the Cat). **Cont. p8**

Of the price tag, Brennan added, "I thought he was an exceptional individual and that's what it takes for the very good ones. You don't know what they are going to cost. You have to appraise the good ones in this kind of a market."

Brennan admitted action during Monday's session of the two-day auction was hit or miss. "It seemed like it was a little sticky in places," the Irishman said. "It just seemed like it was tough there for a while, it seemed to lack momentum. In the boutique marketplace, it seems like it is all or nothing, and we've seen that before. When you've got smaller numbers, people do a lot of work and they can be sitting on their hands for a little while intimidated, wondering what they are going to cost. It seems like recently this year, the sales with larger numbers attract more buyers and they are still good sales because the buyers are all present, but they are not as prone to come to the smaller select sales."

Still, Brennan felt there were definite bargains to be made. "Obviously there were some very nice horses and I thought there were some very nice buys," he said. "I saw some horses selling in the \$250,000 range that I thought would have brought more. But people are trying to evaluate how they appraise horses now. The market is trying to find itself a little bit."

Roman Ruler Colt a Family Score

A son of Roman Ruler provided one of the early highlights of Monday's session of the Saratoga sale when selling for \$435,000 to the bid of Virginia horseman Robert Burke. The result was a pinhooking coup for the father-son duo of Bill and Brian Graves, who purchased the youngster for \$135,000 out of last year's Keeneland November sale.

"My dad and I owned him together," confirmed Brian Graves. "My dad loved him as a weanling. He thought we should buy him and so we did. He turned into a beautiful horse. He was a good horse and a smart guy knew it."

The colt, out of a half to graded stakes winner Kays and Jays (Macho Uno), was consigned by Gainesway, where Brian Graves serves as director of public sales. Gainesway opened the sale with hip number 1, a son of Bernardini, who was led out unsold at \$525,000.

"We stubbed our toe on hip number one, but I think horses are selling fairly," Graves explained. "The trick is just putting the reserve low and letting [people] buy them."

"This is a free-running horse," said handler Ian Wilkes after his 4-year-old Fort Larned had achieved a career high in the historic GI Whitney H.

The colt's free-running propensity is hardly surprising in view of his immediate pedigree. He is a son of E Dubai, whose style was to ask his rivals to try to catch him, and his second dam is the great Bayakoa, who repeatedly galloped her rivals into submission.

During E Dubai's early years as a member of the Darley stallion team at Jonabell he was billed as Mr. Prospector's fastest son, which is one heck of a claim. Among Mr. Prospector's numerous outstanding achievements was to sire multiple winners of such speed-oriented contests as the Breeders' Cup Sprint (Eillo and Gulch) and the Metropolitan H. (Fappiano, Conquistador Cielo, the dual winner Gulch and Aldebaran).

The basis for Darley's claims was that "no son of Mr. Prospector has run a faster six furlongs (1:07.9), mile (1:33.54), mile and a sixteenth (1:40.38), or one and a quarter miles (2:00.95) than Suburban winner E Dubai."

E Dubai clocked that 1:07.9 and 1:33.54 in wiring the field in the GI Dwyer S. at three, while his 2:00.95 came when he led nearly all the way to defeat Lido Palace in the GI Suburban H. on his final appearance.

E Dubai also found only one too good for him in the GI Travers S. and GI Super Derby, so he clearly stayed a mile and a quarter well for a horse with such speed. Perhaps the source of this versatility was his broodmare sire Lord At War, a champion miler from Argentina who shone at up to a mile and a quarter in California. At five he led virtually every step of the way in the GI San Antonio H. over a mile and an eighth and then rallied from second to take the GI Santa Anita H. over an extra 220 yards. **Cont. p13**

To many people's surprise, this South American horse with old-fashioned European bloodlines proved tremendously effective at stud. From fewer than 400 foals, he sired 44 black-type winners, including the sisters Words of War and Ascutney. These two played a leading role in Lord At War's success as a sire of broodmares. Ascutney is now the dam of the Breeders' Cup Classic winner Raven's Pass, whereas Words of War is the dam of the Grade I winner No Matter What and E Dubai. Other broodmare daughters of Lord At War have produced such as War Emblem, Pioneer of the Nile and Purim.

With his combination of pedigree and performance, E Dubai always struck me as an interesting prospect at his initial fee of \$15,000. My enthusiasm for him grew when his first crop, which numbered only 45 named foals, yielded the very encouraging total of four graded stakes winners--High Heels (GII Fantasy S.), Buy The Barrel (GII Allaire DuPont Distaff S.), Desert Code (a multiple Grade III winner and hero of the inaugural Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint) and Dubious Miss (GIII Ben Ali S.). The broodmare sires of this quartet were Gilded Time, Drouilly, Lost Code and Mountain Cat. Not the most fashionable collection, you'll probably agree.

E Dubai came up with another two Grade II winners from a second crop of 98 and his smaller third crop--68 named foals--added two more group/graded winners to his tally. One of them, Skysurfers, won the valuable G2 Godolphin Mile at Meydan. E Dubai was therefore building up a solid record, without getting the "big horse" that every stallion needs, As a result he began to struggle for support in 2010, when his current crop of 31 yearlings was conceived, and Darley sold him in the fall, to stand in Pennsylvania, where he attracted 69 mares in 2011.

I suspect Pennsylvania's breeders should be thankful. There was always a good chance that E Dubai's 2008 and 2009 crops would throw up some good winners, as they were conceived after the promising start made by his early runners.

Sure enough, the 2008 crop contains his first Grade I winner, in the shape of the progressive Fort Larned, and his current 3-year-olds include the smart turf filly My Gi Gi, winner of the GII Honeymoon H. prior to finishing second in the GI American Oaks.

Moving on to the bottom half of Fort Larned's pedigree, it brings back plenty of memories--some wonderful, some painful--of his second dam Bayakoa. When Bayakoa was inducted into the Hall of Fame, she was designated the Amazon from Argentina. Jay Hovdey recalled in *The Blood-Horse* how Laffit Pincay Jr insisted that Bayakoa was the best filly he ever rode.

"Head high and nostrils up, with her tongue lolling out the side of her parrot mouth as she raced fearlessly on the lead, Bayakoa cut a memorable figure through two remarkable seasons," Hovdey vividly reminded us. "Racing year-round, from early 1989 to late-1990, she won 15 major races while ranging far and wide from California to New York, Kentucky, Florida and Arkansas."

Two of her victories came in the Breeders' Cup Distaff. In the second of them she was engaged in a tremendous stretch battle with Go For Wand, when Go For Wand snapped a leg. Bayakoa was to suffer her own tragedy at the age of 13, when she foundered several weeks after giving birth to her fourth foal, a filly by Broad Brush.

Very few horses manage to win two Breeders' Cup races, Bayakoa being one of only five fillies or mares to have gained that distinction (the others being Miesque, Ouija Board, Zenyatta and Goldikova).

Miesque translated her brilliance into an exceptional record as a broodmare, with two Classic winners among her foals. Sadly, it was a very different story for Bayakoa. Only two of her four foals made it to the races, and only one of them won, namely the Broad Brush filly Arlucea, who managed one win from seven starts.

This must have been a great disappointment for Mrs Janis Whitham, but Mrs. Whitham has since had the great joy of seeing two of Bayakoa's daughters produce Grade I winners. The first to do so was her unraced Strawberry Road filly Trinity Place, whose first foal was that fine racemare Affluent. This daughter of Affirmed handled dirt and turf very well, ending with a total of four Grade I victories.

Now Arlucea has come to the fore as the dam of Fort Larned. With three graded victories under his belt this year, Fort Larned is clearly on the upgrade, and he wouldn't be out of place if he takes up his automatic place in the Breeders' Cup Classic--22 years after Bayakoa's second Distaff triumph.

Cheveley Park Purchase Majority Share in Mayson

Cheveley Park Stud announced yesterday it has purchased a majority share in this season's leading sprinter **Mayson (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}--Mayleaf {GB}, by Pivotal {GB}), winner of the G1 Darley July Cup, and will stand him beginning in 2013. The 4-year-old colt will continue to race in the colors of his breeder, David Armstrong, and will also continue to be trained by Richard Fahey. His next likely start may be the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Consideration is also being given to the G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S. Cheveley Park Stud Managing Director, Chris Richardson, offered, "Mr. and Mrs. Thompson are delighted to secure the future of Mayson for British breeders; he complements Cheveley Park Stud's highly proven and commercial portfolio of stallions in every way. Mayson is currently the highest rated, foremost sprinter of 2012, following his impressive win in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket." David Armstrong added, "I could not be more delighted that Mayson's future as a stallion will be at Cheveley Park Stud, an operation with whom my wife, Emma, and I have enjoyed doing business over the years, and we look forward to this continuing for many years to come."

"He ate everything up last night, and he was even tough to walk," said Virginia Reid, wife of trainer Robert "Butch" Reid Jr. "This morning he went to graze, and I couldn't get him back inside." She added, "So many people have stopped by to congratulate us. When we got back to the barn [shared with trainer Tony Dutrow], Kim Dutrow had traced 'Yes!' in the dirt outside his stall. It was so sweet." The 4-year-old colt will remain at the Spa while his connections ponder his next start; the options include the seven-furlong GI Forego S. Sept. 1. "He might go in the Forego," Reid said. "We're a little hesitant because he likes three-quarters [of a mile]."

A consistent group-level stakes performer in her native Ireland, Kissable spent her first two years of competition running with the best of her generation in that country. "After talking to the assistant trainer, they thought that she actually was going to benefit from the distance and the way the ground was softer today," said Velazquez. "It just worked out perfect. I saved the best ground I could around the first two turns. When we got to the backstretch and everyone moved out, I said 'I'm going to go for the best ground.' When I put her out, she felt more comfortable on the better ground, and that was the key right there." Of winning for fellow Hall of Fame inductee Attfield, Velazquez added, "What a great guy and a great person to be around, and what a great trainer as well! It's well-deserved, and I'm glad to be part of it. He's been great to me for a long time now. He's given me a lot of good chances on his horses." 

The California Horse Racing Board has issued a clarification of its claiming rule following the euthanization of Elivette. The filly, who broke down near the finish of last Friday's eighth race at Del Mar, was put down after being vanned back to the barn area. She had been claimed for \$12,500.

The recent incident at Del Mar involving the injury and claim of Elivette involves two separate issues that warrant clarification. The first is whether Elivette should have been euthanized on the track.

Dr. Rick Arthur, equine medical director for the California Horse Racing Board, said, "The answer is clearly no. Euthanasia is an irreversible decision. For that reason the American Association of Equine Practitioners recommends that when it can be done safely and humanely, all horses should be taken off the track, so they can be properly evaluated by the attending veterinarian (s). All major racetracks in California have followed that approach for many years. Horses survive injuries today and lead productive lives, some even returning to racing. On-track euthanasia is warranted only when there is no reasonable alternative, and these situations do happen, but in the case of Elivette, Del Mar's track veterinarian, Dr. Dana Stead, determined Elivette could be safely transported off the track. This allowed her veterinarians to evaluate the extent of her injuries and make the appropriate decision after consulting with the owners and trainer. A Kimsey brace-an injury stabilization device developed at southern California tracks was placed on her injured leg and Elivette was transported the short distance to the trainer's barn. Her veterinarians were notified she was on her way before she was off the track, so they could attend to her quickly."

The second issue is changes to the claiming rule, which allows claims to be voided. Dr. Arthur explained, "The first Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit in 2006 made over 30 recommendations to make racing safer for horses and riders. One of the recommendations sought to protect claiming horses by allowing for the voiding of claims of horses that are injured or do not finish. No change is easy in racing and the question of voiding claims on injured horses has been debated for years. After considerable discussion and input from the industry, the CHRB adopted a revised version that limited the conditions under which a claim would be voided. The limitations of the rule were thoroughly discussed and officially described in public documents. Whether to purchase claiming insurance or not, as with all insurance, is a business decision based on risks and vulnerabilities. Only a handful of claims under unusual circumstances have been voided under this rule. Regardless, the effort to void claims was never a claim insurance issue. It is a horse welfare issue."

The voiding of claims for severely injured horses has been scheduled for some time to be addressed either at the August 23 meeting of the CHRB or the August 24 meeting of the CHRB Medication and Track Safety Committee.
