PLETCHER WILL WAIT A LITTLE MORE

After a noticeably more upbeat second session, the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling Sale concluded with figures stronger in a session-to-session comparison with 2011, but with cumulative figures still down from

a year ago. The cumulative gross was down 3%, while the average was down 6% and the median fell 10%. The buy-back rate, 32% in 2011, was 34% in 2012.

Trainer Todd Pletcher signed

the ticket on the sale's top-priced lot, bidding to \$1,575,000 for a filly by Medaglia d'Oro out of champion Wait a While, to give the auction its third seven-figure price tag.

Pletcher trained Arindel Farm's Wait a While to a sophomore filly championship in 2006.

"We were stretching our limit," Pletcher, who declined to say who he was bidding for, admitted of the final price tag. "Obviously we know the mare really well, she is one of the best we've ever had. This was a beautiful filly and reminded us a lot of Wait a While, and we are really happy to get her. She is one that, regardless of what she does on the racetrack, she is worth a lot as a broodmare."

The gray filly was consigned to the sale by Three Chimneys Sales on behalf of her breeder, Alan Cohen's Ocala-based Arindel Farm.

"You'd have to be happy with that price," commented Three Chimneys' Guinness McFadden. "We had a ton of activity at the barn, she was a really nice filly. We're ecstatic. We thank Todd for the purchase."

The Medaglia d'Oro yearling is Wait a While's second foal. The mare's Distorted Humor colt was scratched from the Saratoga sale last year. After a paddock accident in Florida just prior to shipping, the yearling filly came to Saratoga with a few bumps.

"She had a scar on her knee and a little ding on her hock," McFadden explained. "It definitely drew attention and questions, but the vets said it was ok, so no harm, no foul."

"She was a really racey type, she had a great walk and good hind leg," McFadden continued. "She was just a nice type, a good shoulder--she looked like a racehorse to me, and the pedigree speaks for itself."

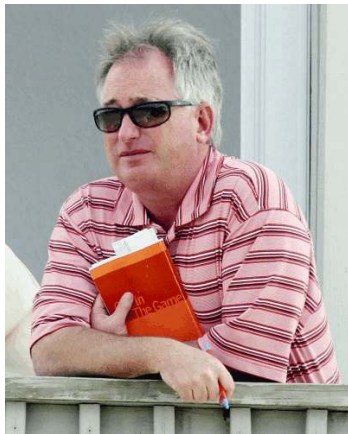

What a Difference a Day Makes...

In sharp contrast to a lean opening session, the second day of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale staged somewhat of a reversal of form Tuesday.

“All in all we managed a furious comeback in the second half,” said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. “Statistically, we didn’t quite manage to catch up to last year. We certainly had a more energetic and vibrant sales session tonight. Overall, we had better quality horses from the top 25 horses overall in the sale, just from how the catalog fell into place. Buyers seemed to have more confidence and bid more aggressively.”

While Sheikh Mohammed, John Ferguson and several other notable Darley members were prominent

during Monday’s session, many of them were conspicuously absent Tuesday.

“I think more significant than Sheikh Mohammed not being here was that buyers may have had some concern about some dominance in the market place,” said Browning. “Those fears were unfounded last night, and that led them to bid tonight. I don’t think people walk around thinking ‘Where is Sheikh Mohammed? I will go and bid because he is not here.’ I think it became clear last night that there were buying opportunities for a wide number of buyers.”

Despite Darley’s absence, a representative of John Ferguson signed the agent’s name to three yearlings during the second session.

“I think he is a significant influence in whatever market he participates in, and this is no different than any other market place,” said Browning. “Every consignor I know is happy to see Sheikh Mohammed on the sales’ grounds, and every buyer I know of, whether at Saratoga or September, hopes he doesn’t show up. I think that’s how the world works in terms of competition.”

Comparing last year’s sales figures to this season, Browning added, “I have very few scientific answers, but this is not a scientific game. I think the yearling market is very similar to last year. There continues to be restraint in the upper end of the marketplace.”

As for the overall view on the activity over the last two days, Browning concluded, “There is certainly a lot of activity, but people are selective and they do stop bidding when they reach the levels that they have reached on their evaluation of horses. That’s just the world we live in. It’s healthy, it’s not exuberant and the market is not in any distress.”

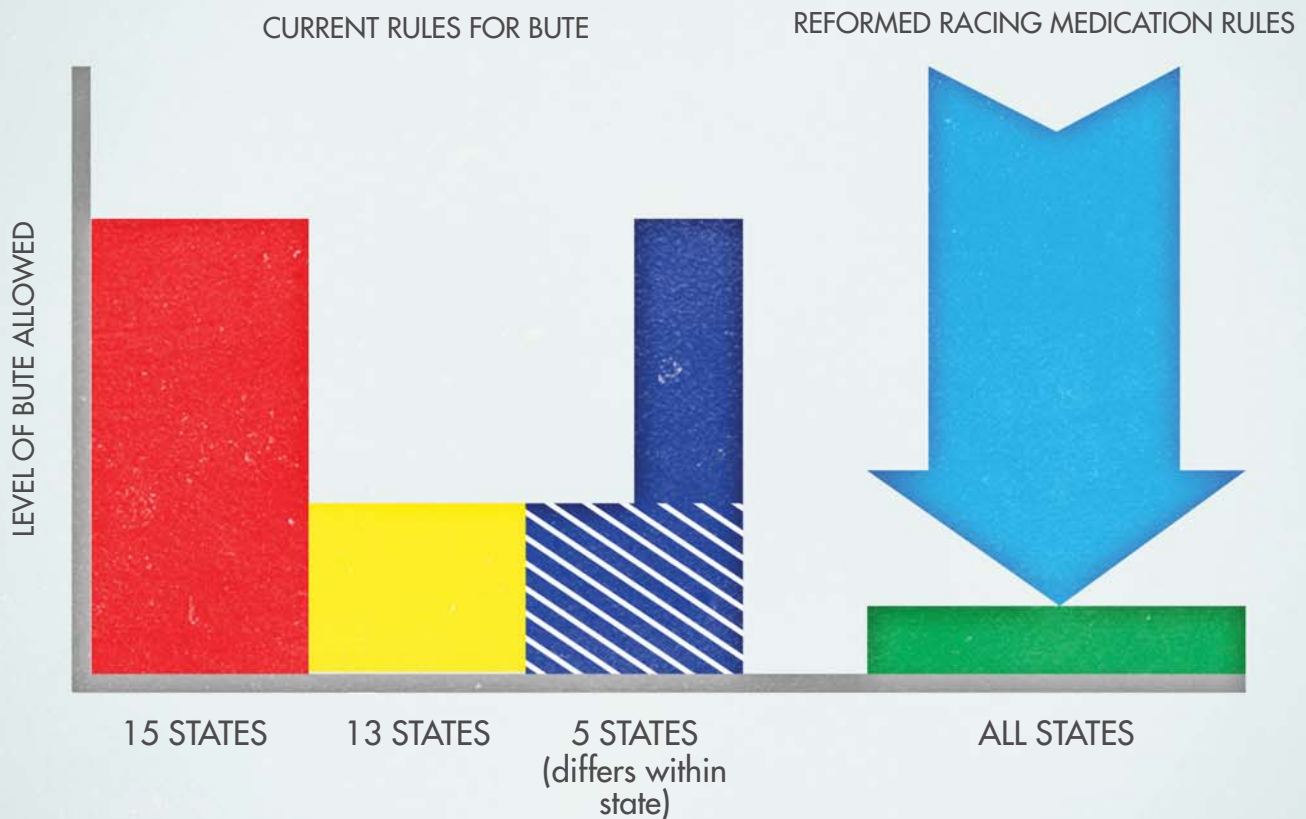

Ingordo Swoops in for Two Early...

In stark contrast to Monday's opening session of the Saratoga sale, Tuesday's action got rolling quickly. Armed and ready to shoot straight off the bench, agent David Ingordo landed his first blow with [Hip 102](#), a filly by Dynaformer. Involved in the protracted bidding duel was Live Oak's Charlotte Weber, seated inside the pavilion, and trainer Michael Matz, situated out back under the bidspotters' podium. Action slowed and stalled momentarily at \$860,000 as Matz, who was on the phone, animatedly confirmed his final bid. Despite his assertions, Ingordo, seated on the second floor in the Fasig-Tipton official box, used a simple circular motion of his hand to up the ante to an even \$900,000 and close down his competition once and for all. The filly was secured for Australian Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds.

"I told [Fudge] she was a standout and he just had to have her," stated Ingordo. "She cost money, but she's well worth it. This is another cornerstone piece, a Dynaformer filly that can be a stakes horse that can ultimately retire to the Waratah broodmare band."

Consigned by Paramount Sales, the bay filly is out of the Grade III-winning and Grade I-placed Super Freaky (Smart Strike). Secured for \$140,000 by Pablo Suarez at Keeneland September in 2005, Super Freaky won the GIII Providencia S. and finished third in the GI Del Mar Oaks before selling to Shane Ryan's Castleton Lyons for \$950,000 at the Fasig-Tipton November sale in 2007. The Apr. 15 foal was bred by Castleton Lyons and Kilboy Estate in Kentucky.

"She is a very nice Dynaformer, a lot of quality for that sire," said Castleton Lyons's Gabriel Duignan. "She is the full package--it's a good cross, her mother was a very good racemare and just a pretty filly. She has a good mind; she has been so busy all week and she took it all so well."

While not shocked, Duignan appeared pleasantly surprised immediately after the sale.

"That's a little more than we expected," admitted Duignan. "We knew she was going to sell really well. We knew the people on her were serious buyers, so we were confident she would bring what she was worth."

Following a tough go on Monday, Paramount Sales's Pat Costello was admittedly pleased with yesterday's result.

"She is a beautifully filly and did so well all week," said Costello. "She did as well today as she did five days ago. She did everything beautifully and wowed everybody. People absolutely loved her."

Ingordo also secured Super Freaky's dam, Elrose (Deputy Minister), for \$145,000 on behalf of Suarez Racing at Keeneland November in 2006 before reselling her for a healthy \$1.25 million to Stonestreet at the same venue the following year.

"We have a long history with the filly's pedigree," explained Ingordo. "I also bought [Super Freaky]'s yearling filly [\$140,000 at KEESEP in 2011], who is out in California and can really run. Paul has a team of people that do pedigree research, led by Ken McLean, that gave us a list of pedigrees, and this filly is a superstar in physical that also has the pedigree. They're not making any more Dynaformers, so she was special."

And Ingordo admits he has a sense of what a good Dynaformer should look like.

"My stepfather [trainer] John Shireffs had Harmonious, Starrer, and Star Billing, and those are all Grade I winners, and she is the image of what I know good Dynaformers to look like. She's a beautiful filly. Horses like that need to stand out wherever they go, and she will, wherever Mr. Fudge decides for her to go. When she walks into the paddock, people will look over at her and think, 'Uh oh.'"

While the filly has the physical attributes and pedigree to succeed on the racetrack, Costello added that she has a little extra something in her pocket. In the days leading up to the sale, the filly was stabled in stall 15 of Barn 1 on the Fasig-Tipton grounds, and according to Costello, it is the same slot that housed GI Belmont S. winners Da' Tara (Tiznow) (2008) and Union Rags (2012) when they sold at the same venue during their yearling years.

"Two Belmont S. winners and a Kentucky Oaks winner," quipped Duignan when informed of the fact. He added with a smile, "Oh hell, why not a Kentucky Derby winner?"

Remaining seated in the house box following the purchase of the day's second top price, Ingordo went to \$600,000 to secure [Hip 107](#), a colt by Street Cry (Ire) out of millionairess Sweet Talker (Stormin Fever). Ingordo is also well-known for advising on another offspring by that sire in Zenyatta, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and Horse of the Year in 2010. Victorious in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S., the 10-year-old mare, who is a half-sister to GSW Silver Medallion (Badge of Silver), is already responsible for multiple graded stakes-placed Perregaux (Distorted Humor). The Jan. 29 foal, who is from the extended family of Grade I heroine Include Me Out (Include), was consigned by Lane's End.

Bernardini Colt to Fox Hill...

With the top three prices Tuesday coming for fillies, a son of Bernardini won top-billing for a colt when selling for \$700,000 to the bid of Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm.

"I told [advisor] Tom [McGreevy] that he would bring \$750,000, so I think we got a \$50,000 discount," Porter joked after buying the bay colt. "He was our top colt in the sale, and I knew he was going to bring a lot of money, but as long as the Sheikh wasn't in, I thought we might have a

chance of buying him."

While Team Godolphin didn't seem to be bidding on the youngster, Porter did have to see off a challenge from Coolmore to secure the son of Dawn Chorus (Unbridled's Song). But Porter wasn't watching the competition. "I was just watching the bid spotters, I don't worry about who is bidding, because it doesn't matter. At the end, either you are going to get him or you are not going to get him, but that was about as far as we were going to go. We love the colt and we are happy to have him."

Four Star Sales consigned the yearling on behalf of Ben Sangster.

"We are very pleased with the price," said Four Star's Kerry Cauthen. "It was very fair, but in all truth he was an incredible-walking horse. He is a horse that is just so much on the rise. He looks like the sire. Every single time he walked out of the stall, he was the same. He walked great, he had a great attitude. I am very pleased with the sale, and I wish them the best. I think he will run like lightning."

Echoing the sentiments of just about everyone, Cauthen added the market had picked up markedly during day two of the auction.

"Tonight seemed so much livelier overall than last night, probably there was a bit better horses, especially early, but there is just a bit more of a vibe tonight," he said.

Cauthen did admit Saratoga can be a difficult place to sell.

"Saratoga has always been a spot where, when you bring the goods, they are here for you," he said. "It is sometimes a little hit and miss. When you get the money, you get a lot of it. There are a lot of people who want the same horses, and sometimes it doesn't work and you go on forward. It is a great sale to sell a good horse, but it can be a little tough sometimes."

**Fasig-Tipton Saratoga cont.
Coolmore One and Done...**

Coolmore wasn't particularly active over the two sessions of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, but when the Irish juggernaut finally got involved late in the second session, it certainly made its presence felt. Camped near the back of the main pavilion, Demi O'Byrne, flanked by several associates including Clem Murphy, M.V. Magnier and Paul Shanahan, landed the winning bid of \$675,000 for [Hip 164](#), a colt by War Front.

"I was expected he would make a lot of money and he did, but I am pleased to have gotten him," said O'Byrne of the purchase price.

The West Virginia-bred colt is out of Dancing Trieste (Old Trieste), a daughter of Group 1-placed La Promenade (Arg) (Southern Halo). Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Agency, the Feb. 25 foal is from the family of Argentine champion filly La Galerie (Arg) (Southern Halo) and Group 1 winner Gouache (Arg) (Southern Halo). Bred by Charles A Woodson Jr., the colt was a \$190,000 Keeneland November buy for Kingsbury Stables.

According to O'Byrne, the son of War Front is the first offspring of the sire purchased at public auction by Coolmore.

"I thought he was a very exceptional-looking horse," said O'Byrne. "Very good looking and very lovely quality."

As for whether the colt might remain in America or race in Europe, O'Byrne said, "We haven't decided whether he will stay here or go to Europe."--CBoss

Giant's Causeway Colt Gets Sale Off to Fast Start...

The second session of the Saratoga sale quickly put its pedestrian opening day in the rearview mirror, with a son of Giant's Causeway leading early returns when selling for \$650,000 to Robert LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables. The chestnut yearling is out of multiple Grade I winner Spain (Thunder Gulch). Trainer Nick Zito handled bidding duties from behind the sales pavilion with LaPenta encouraging him on over the phone. Trainer John Kimmel was the underbidder.

"Obviously Mr. LaPenta loves the breeding," Zito said after signing the ticket. "Spain was one of his favorite mares, so he asked me to go look at him. I was a little upset that Kimmel wouldn't stop, but Bob was on the phone and he said to 'Go.' To be honest with you, I wanted to stop, but the boss said he wanted to go, so that was good enough."

Of the yearling, Zito added, "You can't fault the horse. He is a beautiful animal, he has so much potential. That is what it is about. We are trying to make stallions and we are trying to get to the big races. He is one of the best horses in the sale."

The youngster was consigned and bred by Dromoland Farm and is a half-brother to graded stakes winner Plan (Storm Cat) and a full to Group 1-placed Dreamtheimpossible (Giant's Causeway).



**WHAT THEY'RE SAYING
...AT THE SALES**

Mark Taylor, Taylor Made Sales:

"I think it was real good in spots, but if you have a horse that doesn't quite fit here, there is no one to come in and pick up the pieces. I don't think Saratoga is any predictor of September at all, because you have a lot of horses in this sale, which, while I think are good-looking horses, they are more like Book 2 horses. And if you look at who the big buyers are in Book 2, there are a bunch of them that aren't even here. So you've got Sheikh Mohammed and his affiliates and you've got a bunch of other people, but Gary and Mary West, Zayat, Repole—that is just three, but there are probably 20 like that—they drive Book 2 and they are not here. Everybody up here is just looking for the perfect horse, in Book 2 they are just looking for a racehorse."

Case Clay, Three Chimneys:

"The September sale is the true gauge of the market. This is a boutique sale, and there are some very nice horses that come here, but there really aren't enough to try to tell where the market is right now. If tonight ends up being unbelievable gangbusters, we're still not going to feel good. It is not a big enough sample size."

Michael Heron, Gainesway:

"What a difference one night can make. Tonight the average zoomed up to \$370,000, the median has changed from \$200,000 to \$292,000 for 46 sold, and it just feels like a different sale. Why is that? There are better horses today, there is no question about that. It is catalogued alphabetically by dam, so it is not a placement issue directly, it is just the way the horses have fallen. I think we got a better market tonight, and possibly buyers felt that it was time to step in—we're running out of horses here in Saratoga and we need to buy one or go home with no horse. The fact that Sheikh Mohammed is not here, apparently reflected by the figures, would encourage one to think that maybe they would have a better chance to buy. And the figures exemplify that."

Stage Stop's second foal, Mylute (Midnight Lute), brought \$150,000 last year at KEESEP, and since the catalogue finished second in the Prairie Gold Juvenile S. This filly continued Rutherford's success with offspring from the mare when Robert and Lawana Low went to \$200,000 for her, that off an advertised fee of \$20,000 for Street Boss.

Grunwald sent her to Unbridled's Song upon retirement and sold that first foal, the unraced 3-year-old Prime the Pump (Unbridled's Song), for \$275,000 at KEESEP. That one appears close to a debut, having worked a bullet four furlongs in :48 flat from the gate at Fair Hill Aug. 4. It's taken a bit, but Grunwald finally got back on the positive side of the ledger with this huge transaction, care of a first-crop sire who stood for \$12,500 in his first season at stud.

Dr. Umberto Pianca, president of the Italian sales company Societa Gestione Aste (SGA), was in Saratoga Springs for the races and the Fasig-Tipton August Sale. The TDN caught up with him yesterday to get his thoughts on the upstate atmosphere, as well as the status back home. His grandson Kevin served as an interpreter.

How have you enjoyed your first trip to Saratoga?

Saratoga is a very nice tourist town with people who are very kind, and there is so much important racing. There are so many Grade I races here. I saw over 50,000 people watching and enjoying the races. I totally love the friendship that the people here show and their kindness towards us. The equine culture is really deep here.

What was your impression of first session of the sale?

I was shocked by how many horses didn't reach their reserves and didn't sell--33%. There were many, many people at the sale, but not as many to buy the horses. There was not enough money to buy. But I did like very much the Street Cry (Ire) colt [hip 80, who topped Monday's session for \$1.2 million].

Are you looking to buy at Saratoga?

I am waiting to see if the government comes up through with the regulations or not [laughing]. But possibly, because sometimes it is good to bring new blood into our pedigrees.

Racing was forced to stop in Italy for over a month at the start of 2012. What are some of the changes in government funding, and what are your hopes going forward?

At the beginning of the government's fundraising of €35 million, there was a technical problem, with debts and unbalanced credit. But now the situation is unblocked and the budget is available. The government will send €35 million to Italian Hipic to support it and to support its reorganization of older regulations. We are really optimistic that the money will come, because I spoke to the Minister of Agriculture and he told me that the money would be available by the end of August.

Is racing in Italy a social event?

There is an increasing base of young people that are getting to know racing better, but I think that if the [Italian Prime Minister Mario] Monti government is not going to take regulations seriously as soon as possible, there is going to be a lack of regulation that will keep the young people away and keep the older equine movement further from the center.

As the president of SGA, I really think what is missing is the regulation and the planning of projects. We are asking for rules and planning, serious rules and planning for investments for the future. We aren't asking for privileges, but just for regulations to do immediately what will strengthen the industry. Because of the economic situation, not only for horse racing, but for the whole country. Not just for Italy, but for many countries. Spain, Portugal, Ireland, because of the banking.

What are some of the most pressing regulations that you think should be implemented?

The most important thing is to establish a public institution to manage the races and to have stability for breed development. Developing the breeding is very difficult because we have to wait 11 months before the foal is born, and then another two years before they can run. If the situation changes for other reasons, we have to wait three years to race.

The other important thing is to ensure the security of the races, anti-doping and such. I would be interested in developing a very strong anti-doping policy. For our broodmares, it is very important to not have treatments during the races. It is the same problem, not just for Italy, but worldwide. And it is not just a problem for horse racing, but also for Olympic competitions...for all sports, but in Italy, we are really strict about doping and we banish people who do it. I really care about the horses, even after they retire.

Something else I would like to see is to improve the fan base of the [racecourse], not just to watch the races, but to create a complete organization around it, with restaurants and everything, all the services that will support the fans and to grow up the fan movement. Not just the races, but a complete organization--like Saratoga. That is what I would like to create. It is possible to see the races, it is possible to eat, it is possible to do other activities, not only races.

Have you had any horses that raced in the U.S.?

I bred and sold Noll Wallop (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) [€22,000 yearling at the 2008 Italian September Sale]. He won the [G3 Leopardstown] 2000 Guineas Trial in Ireland [in 2010]. He won his first race at Delaware [for trainer Tom Voss], and now he is in Saratoga. I am really happy about his racing career.

PRIVILEGE'S RACE TO WIN OR LOSE

Tonight's GIII Sorrento S. at Del Mar should be all about ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai), who looks to win for the third time in 41 days as she lines up for her graded-stakes debut. The \$650,000 topper from this year's OBS April sale, the bay has won her two starts to date by a combined 7 3/4 lengths, including a very professional victory over **Speeintruthcity** (City Zip) in the July 14 Landaluce S. at Betfair Hollywood Park. Executiveprivilege is strictly the one to beat and give trainer Bob Baffert a sixth Sorrento, but the opposition isn't sure they've got the ammo to take her down. "Executiveprivilege might be the best 2-year-old--boys or girls--that we've seen," trainer Peter Miller told *Daily Racing Form*. In addition to Speedintruthcity, Miller will also saddle **Bares Tripper** (Sky Mesa), who debuted a winner for an \$80,000 tag, but posting a very competitive Beyer. Trainer Patrick Biancone wheels back fellow ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Switch to the Lead** (Songandaprayer) on 10 days' rest, having graduated by 1 1/2 lengths July 29.

TAKE CHARGE INDY TO WINSTAR Chuck and Maribeth Sandford's GI Florida Derby hero **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy--Take Charge Lady, by Dehere) will stand at Kenny Troutt's WinStar Farm upon completion of his racing career, it was announced Tuesday. "When I looked at him I saw A.P. Indy, who is obviously one of the greatest sires of sires in the industry today," said Elliott Walden, WinStar President & CEO. "Stallion credentials don't get much stronger than being a Grade 1 winner, by a multiple Grade 1 winner like A.P. Indy, and out of a multiple Grade 1 winner. We're excited about Take Charge Indy's chances of successfully carrying out the A.P. Indy line at stud." Take Charge Indy was a debut winner last summer before finishing second in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity and a close fourth in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity. He was runner-up to subsequent GSW El Padrino (Pulpit) in a salty Gulfstream allowance ahead of his Florida Derby score, in which he defeated favored Union Rags (Dixie Union). Take Charge Indy was unplaced in the GI Kentucky Derby and was sidelined with an ankle injury and subsequent minor surgery. He has recently resumed training with Patrick Byrne with an eye on the second half of the season. "Take Charge Indy is by far the best horse I've ever trained when you combine depth of pedigree and magnitude of talent," said Byrne, who has also trained champions Favorite Trick and Awesome Again. "At the end of the day, I believe he will be the best horse I've ever had, period. He looks absolutely fantastic right now, and we're thrilled to have him back at the barn," he added. "Physically, he has filled out in all the right spots, and even Calvin [Borel] was amazed when he saw him. We're optimistic Take Charge Indy will have a strong end of the year."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Wise Dan Back to Turf for Fourstardave...

Morton Fink homebred **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) has put together an impressive resume in his three years on the racetrack. The now 5-year-old gelding has won more than half of his 16 starts, including five graded stakes on dirt, turf, and synthetic surfaces from six furlongs to 1 1/8 miles, headed by a score in last year's GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs. The chestnut opened his 2012 campaign with a 10-length, wire-to-wire domination of the GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland Apr. 22 that didn't go unnoticed: Great Britain's *Timeform* rated him the best horse in America at 130, a mark he now shares with GI Kentucky Derby winner I'll Have Another (Flower Alley).

In his most recent effort, Wise Dan missed winning the GI Stephen Foster at Churchill Downs June 16 by a head to Ron the Greek (Full Mandate), and he returns to action Saturday in the GII Fourstardave H. over a mile on the turf at Saratoga Race Course.

"He just likes to run," said trainer Charles Lopresti when asked about his charge's versatility. "I think that's the biggest thing about him, he enjoys running and I don't think it matters surface wise."

Lopresti noted that no plans have been set for the horse beyond Saturday's race, but Wise Dan's affinity for multiple surfaces gives him many options.

"If he should really excel on the grass again there's the [GI] Woodbine Mile [at Woodbine Sept. 16], but he's training really good on the dirt up here now, so maybe we would be looking at the [GI] Woodward [at Saratoga Sept. 1] after this just to prove he's really a good horse on any surface. If he could win the Fourstardave then come back and win the Woodward, that would really open up a lot of options. I know it's crazy to change surfaces back and forth on a horse and you don't like to do it, but this horse has shown before that he can do whatever."

Lopresti also reflected on Wise Dan's elder half-brother, Successful Dan (Successful Appeal), a Grade I winner who was being pointed for last Saturday's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga before being knocked out by recurring soft-tissue injuries.

"Successful Dan has been plagued by suspensory injuries," Lopresti explained. "He's had three different injuries in that suspensory ligament. He was not a bit lame on the track, but he had some filling in his pastern when he came here to Saratoga, so I said we'd better scan this thing just to make sure. Thank God we did, because he had a strained XYZ and there was some disruption of fibres there. Dr. Bramlage said he should be fine given time."

Lopresti also issued an update on his GI Woodbine Mile hero Turallue (Wando), who has failed to win in 2012 after nearly upsetting last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

"We took him to Rood and Riddle and I told Dr. Bramlage, 'Something's holding this horse back, he's not the same horse and I can't put my finger on it.' So we did a bone scan and we found he had bruising in the cannon bones. He's turned out at my farm, and the first of September he will get reevaluated and hopefully that bruising will be healed and we can start back."

In the meantime, Lopresti is anticipating this weekend's Fourstardave, and hoping Wise Dan can add to his already impressive line of tallies.

Napravnik Set for Weekend Stakes...

Jockey Rosie Napravnik could have hardly started the Saratoga meet better: after winning the first race of the meet's opening card July 20, Napravnik found herself in the Spa winner's circle two days later aboard George and Lori Hall's Bern Identity (Bernstein) after winning the GII Sanford S.


That race was just the beginning of a string of 2-year-old successes the young rider has enjoyed at the Spa. She is also the regular pilot of ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ and impressive first-out maiden winner **Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon), and **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday) who is two-for-two including a stakes score in the Track Barron S. at Belmont Park June 27. Both horses are trained by Todd Pletcher, and Napravnik will partner them both once again Sunday in the GII Saratoga Special S. (Shanghai Bobby) and the GII Adirondack S. (Kauai Katie). **Cont. p14**

"Having arrived early, many are unwilling to stay late. The requirement of stamina is not necessarily considered a part of the racing experience at the Spa and an 11 race card will have approximately 300 minutes -- five hours -- of dead time between races that are over in a matter of minutes."

"I've been really lucky to get on some really nice 2-year-olds in the late spring and summer and it's extremely exciting," said Napravnik.

The jockey noted she is grateful to ride for Pletcher, whom she has had success with in the past.

"I rode for Todd quite a bit at Delaware back in 2009, and I also rode two winners for him at Aqueduct, so we had worked together before, won a lot of races together before, and he does a lot of work with my agent," Napravnik explained. "It's a great outfit, one of the best outfits to have, and I've gotten really lucky to get on some of his nice 2-year-olds."

Both Kauai Katie and Shanghai Bobby have given Napravnik reason to be excited for the future, particularly Sunday's races.

"Kauai Katie has only had one race, and I'm sure she's going to move forward off that," she said. "She did it so easily, with her ears pricked, she just waited on my cue and powered down the lane and galloped out really well. She breezed excellent yesterday; she feels fantastic. She's a straight-forward filly and she's very professional."

Shanghai Bobby's improvement from race to race has given Napravnik confidence that the colt has a lot more left to show.

"Shanghai Bobby really matured from his first race to his second," she said. "In his last race, he had a ton left in the tank, he was out there kind of lingering by himself until the end of the race. He really hasn't figured out exactly what he's doing and that's part of the reason why I'm really excited about him, because I think there's a lot more to come from him."

With so many talented 2-year-olds in her arsenal, it is possible that Napravnik may have to choose between her mounts in the later season juvenile races. For now, however, she is enjoying the ride.

"We're focused on winning, and we'll do whatever we have to do to get that done," she said.

Cambina Could Reverse Fortunes in Mabee...

Four-year-old filly **Cambina (Ire)** (Hawk Wing) has been a useful commodity for the Jeff Bonde stable since arriving in Southern California from her native Ireland in 2011. In her first four months on American soil she recorded three victories, including the GIII La Habra S. and the GII Providencia S., both on the turf at Santa Anita. Three months later she broke through at the highest level, taking the GI American Oaks at Hollywood Park in a dead heat with Nereid (Rock Hard Ten). She is winless since, but her most recent effort was a second-place finish, beaten a nose, in the GIII Beverly Hills H. at Betfair Hollywood Park June 24. Cambina will run in Sunday's GII John C. Mabee H. over 1 1/8 miles on the turf at Del Mar, and Bonde said his filly could turn her fortunes around on that surface.

"This filly has worked over the track brilliantly, so it should suit her really well," said Bonde in reference to a bullet five-furlong work on the turf at Del Mar in :59.04 Aug. 5. "She seems to be at her apex. Hollywood Park is a much firmer, quicker course, and this is more a fair-playing turf course, a little softer than Hollywood. She seems to be getting to her best right now I think."

In her only prior start at Del Mar, Cambina was fourth, beaten two lengths, in the GI Del Mar Oaks last summer behind the dynamic duo of Summer Soiree (War Front), Star Billing (Dynaformer) and Nereid.

Bonde noted that Cambina would benefit from a strong pace in the Mabee.

"She's got a history of walking into paceless fields, but she has overcome that on an occasion or two," he said. "She's a typical European horse that likes to be covered up and take one shot."

Bonde also said that he has not uncovered an excuse for the performance of Willard L. Proctor Memorial S. winner Amarish (Scat Daddy) in Sunday's GII Best Pal S., where the gelding finished a lackluster sixth.

"We've done a bunch of tests, and we can't come up with anything medically," he said. "I think we're just going to space his races further next time."

Sequence Voltigeur Bound...

Conditioner David Lanigan may point G1 Epsom Derby runner-up **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran) at York's Aug. 22 G2 Great Voltigeur S., and is also considering the Sept. 15 G1 St Leger S. at Doncaster for the Niarchos Family's homebred. The chestnut, who also holds an entry in the Sept. 8 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, was an unlucky fourth in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp last time. "Main Sequence has been fine since France and did his first proper piece of work on Saturday, which went well," Lanigan told *Racing Post*. "He scoped clean Sunday and has one or two options. He may go to York for the Great Voltigeur and the Leger is also in our thoughts, but nothing is set in stone. You never know if they will get that sort of [1 13/16-mile] trip, but he relaxes well and would give himself every chance. All he did in France last time was stay."

Jean-Claude-Alain Dupouy and Xavier Niel's **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) will miss York's Aug. 22 G1 Juddmonte International S. at York, according to trainer Corine Barande-Barbe. This term's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and G1 Prix Ganay hero was a last-out second to Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the May 27

G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp. He has been on the shelf since, owing to minor setbacks which have escalated, missing engagements in the June 24 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and

July 21 G1 King George S. & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. "I've talked to the owners and it's just not going to be possible [to make York]," Barande-Barbe told *Racing Post*. "It would have been something of a comeback and, against Frankel, there would be no point if he wasn't really ready. The horse is very well, but it will come too soon. Leopardstown is still a possibility [for the Sept. 8 G1 Irish Champion S.] and we'll have to see how his training goes. Wherever he runs will be like a [seasonal] reappearance."

With the best horse in the world in Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), the Juddmonte team is riding high. What's it like to be behind such a marvelous Thoroughbred and is there even a smidgen of a chance that Frankel will come to the U.S. for the Breeders' Cup? The TDN sat down with Juddmonte's racing manager, Lord Teddy Grimthorpe, and asked those very questions.

TDN: Considering the horse is unbeaten and has such a reputation and following, how much pressure is there every time he runs?

TG: We try not to think about that at this stage. Henry (Cecil) has been very keen to have the horse as tip top as he can for every race, so he's going in on top, in really good form and really well prepared. Then there's his incredible ability and his great stride and that does the rest for us. His ability and his stride, it's extraordinary.

TDN: Henry Cecil, undergoing cancer treatments, was not able to attend Frankel's last race, a win in the Sussex S. How is he doing?

TG: I spoke to with him (Friday) night. He's in very good form. All the vibes are good and he's tremendously positive. He has to go through this treatment, which really knocks him sideways. He's really concentrating on two things--his health, quite rightly, and he's staying home and concentrating on the horses, as well. The only thing that's not happening is him going racing. Other than that, he's very on top of everything.

TDN: It's apparent that the Breeders' Cup will not be on Frankel's schedule. Is the door even open a crack? Any chance the Juddmonte team will change its mind?

TG: If they laid down some Polytrack at Santa Anita, that would open a little bit of a crack. I am sure in Prince Khalid's mind he would have liked to bring the horse to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup Classic, but the moment the dirt got put back in, his main objective was rather taken away from us. With that and the rise of the Champions Day at Ascot, which, in terms of prominence, has become very important in Europe, the Breeders' Cup is very doubtful. At the moment, Henry would be looking to end his career there, at Ascot, in the Champion S.

TDN: But why not the Breeders' Cup Mile on the grass?

TG: The Breeders' Cup Mile is a really an important race. It wouldn't totally be impossible. But having gone the mile and a quarter, I think that Henry would want to look at the Champion S. You never say no; certainly lots of different things happen in racing. I know we would have loved to bring Frankel to Bobby (Frankel)'s home track. That would have been something else, but it doesn't look in the stars at the moment.

TDN: Frankel has never run beyond a mile, but he is now being prepared for mile-and-a-quarter races, starting with the Juddmonte International. Are there any worries about the change in distances?

TG: It's certainly an unknown. Looking at him now as a 4-year-old, he's much more mature, mentally and physically, which is the most important thing. In the early stages of his career, he wouldn't settle that well or he would take a pretty strong hold. Now, he's much more malleable and relaxed in the early stages of his races. He gets into a good stride. I think from that point of view, we're very confident that he can handle the mile and a quarter.

TDN: He's remarkable to watch. What separates him from horses who are merely good?

TG: A lot of good horses will quicken. But if you look at him at Ascot in the Queen Anne in June, he kicked from about three out and he was really just getting into stride when he hit the line. That's extraordinary.

TDN: You must have known Bobby Frankel very well. What are some of your memories of him?

TG: I met Bobby years and years ago in Florida at the 2-year-old sales and got to know him much better when I joined Juddmonte. He trained for Prince Khalid for nearly 20 years and he was really responsible for the tremendous success that Juddmonte had, especially in the West Coast and throughout the USA. He was an integral part of Juddmonte. Everyone that knew him well said he was incredibly tough on the outside but incredibly soft on the inside. I don't think anyone cared for his horses or his help more than he did.

TDN: Perhaps this is an exercise in futility, but we Americans really want to see Frankel in the Breeders' Cup. Any chance we can change your minds?

TG: (Laughs) We love the Breeders' Cup and the interest from American fans has been phenomenal and it has not gone unnoticed by anyone at Juddmonte. But we have always said we have to try to do the very best for the horses. With Frankel, whatever that may be is what we will do.



I'm responding to William Koester's challenge to me, in your Aug. 6 Letters To The Editor section, that I forward him a list of stallions and mares that are bleeders so he can avoid them in the future.

For the most part that challenge is easy to meet. According to medical research, including the South African study to which Mr. Koester makes indirect reference, at least 80% of all racehorses bleed at some time in their career. Using random selection four out of five times Mr. Koester will hit on a bleeder.

Mr. Koester might better direct his inquiry to TOBA, one of the organizations calling for a ban on Lasix, with a request that it ask its breeder members to identify mares and stallions who are not bleeders. Better yet, how about requiring the bleeding history of all mares and stallions be disclosed in sales catalogues? After all, racing programs notify the betting public which horses are running on Lasix; shouldn't the buying public be entitled to similar information?

We have given our two TDN crack handicappers, Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack, a mythical \$1000 bankroll and told them they can bet no more than 5% of that on any given day at Saratoga on a straight win bet. The winner, at the end of the meet, gets \$100 in a TVG betting account, along with bragging rights until next July.

DiDonato: Monday - Over the Counter was 1st at 5-1 in the fifth. Oh ya! In your face, Sherack! What? I'm still down \$580? Oh. Ok then... Had another top-pick scratch (number seven) with **Bluegrass Summer** in the second and, of course, Steve scratched into the nose winner of that one. But got a surprisingly generous 5-1 on Pompay/Klarman/Lawrence firster Over the Counter--out of a French Deputy mare to boot--and came through with an elusive first winner of the meet. Ms. Pompay has an \$8.41 ROI with 2-year-old firsters over the past two years now. I'm coming for you, Stevie. Better get out the whip.

Today - Race 8 - Mandy's Gold S. - #4 Ageless (15-1)
I have nothing but respect for My Miss Aurelia's 2-year-old form, but would anyone really be surprised if she didn't return the same horse at three? We've seen the phenomenon time and time again with the brilliant/precocious types, so while I wouldn't be shocked at all if she dusted this field en route to bigger and better things, I'm certain she'll be a decided underlay in this spot and is well worth taking a shot against. It feels like several of these runners pose a problem for each other on the front end, so I'll try the turning back **Ageless** from off the pace. The bay began her career with a pair of sprint romps before being forced to chase loose-on-the-lead Agave Kiss (when that one was still in top form) in the May 18 Miss Preakness S. She still earned a career-best 84 Beyer Speed Figure for her third-place run while clearly being taken out of her game (she has always been close in her races, but she rates kindly and wasn't suited to trying to keep up with a speedster like Agave Kiss). Ageless pressed the pace in the extended-mile Go For Wand S. at Delaware June 9, finishing third, and chased wide last time in Monmouth's July 15 Serena's Song S. at the same trip before fading to fifth. Turnbacks remain one of the best value angles in racing, both because horses making such a move have a fitness edge and because most horses at this point are better suited to going shorter. I expect a big performance from Ageless returning to what she's best at. I'd think she's well-poised to run a new figure top--something around a 90--which should win this given the pace dynamics unless My Miss Aurelia has trained on. **Play:** \$20 Win. **Alternate 1:** Race 1 - \$15 Win on #8 Sweet Sway. **Alternate 2:** Race 3 - \$10 Win on #6 Southside Molly.

DiDonato Bankroll: \$880 - Record: 15-1-2-3

Sherack: Monday - Well...well...well. Look who finally decided to come out and play on the 16th day of the meeting. Was actually glad to see DiDonato cash a ticket for a change, though; maybe now he'll stop whining about all of his picks getting scratched!

As for my selection Monday, scratched into another winner when the game **Hangover Kid** (\$8.40) hung on to deliver by a nose in the second race. Only had \$14 to win, but love seeing that batting average approach Ted Williams category.

Today - Race 7 - Msw, (S), 3/up, 1 1/16mT - #4 Why Not Whiskey (6-1)

Why Not Whiskey looked like a new horse returning from a November layoff and switching to grass with a very eventful third, beaten 6 1/4 lengths, in his sophomore debut going a mile at Belmont July 4. Not given much of a chance at 36-1, the Chalk Racing colorbearer was a handful for jockey Jose Lezcano from the git-go, and lost valuable positioning after getting checked repeatedly down the backstretch. Why Not Whiskey finally settled while last of 11 through a half mile in :47 4/5, and began to build momentum as they turned for home. He really came alive entering the stretch and slammed into a tiring rival like a fullback when angled out for his run. Seemingly undeterred by the aggressive move, Why Not Whiskey came flying down the center of the course to finish third, only a half-length behind second-place finisher **Alarmed Ndangerous** (7-2 second choice here), clocking his final quarter in a very sharp :22.25. The chestnut seems to have exited that performance in good form, firing an eye-catching four-furlong warning shot in :46.84 around the dogs over the Oklahoma turf July 16 (move matches up with Bruce Brown stablemate Subtle, who earned :46.44 bullet that day and graduated in style in a 5 1/2-furlong grassy maiden here July 28). Blinkers come off for this and Lezcano returns to ride. Any chance he goes off at 6-1? **Play:** \$40 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 4 - \$25 Win (Turf Only) on #4 Big Red Talent. **Alternate 2:** Race 10 - \$20 Win (Turf Only) on #10 Four Reds.

Sherack Bankroll: \$1,470.80 - Record: 16-6-1-1

LARKIN SUPPORTS NYTHA REFORMS State Senator Bill Larkin (R-C, Cornwall-on-Hudson) called on the New York State Racing and Wagering Board Tuesday, asking that they consider the five-point medication reform policy created by the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association instead of banning Lasix in the state. "Banning the use of Lasix as a raceday medication could have dangerous results for horses and for the entire industry," said Larkin. "Common sense, and decency, dictates that we should never put any horse in more danger--but that is exactly what banning Lasix would do. I urge the Racing and Wagering Board to shelf permanently any thoughts of banning Lasix." Senator Larkin's plan proposes a set threshold of 2mcg of Bute in all post-race testing, a third-party administration of raceday Lasix, a ban on "adjunct" raceday medication, a 15-day withdrawal for Depo-Medrol and a seven-day withdrawal for clenbuterol. "As a result of smart policies enacted by the Legislature in recent years, New York racing is getting stronger every day, producing more jobs and opportunity than we have seen in years," noted Larkin. "We must protect this growing industry and the thousands of jobs it produces by making sure the health and welfare of the racehorse is our first and foremost in our minds and actions."



PETE PEDERSEN DIES Pete Pedersen, a longtime racing official and Eclipse Award of Merit winner, died Sunday at Huntington Memorial Hospital in Pasadena, California. He was 92. Pedersen had been hospitalized after collapsing near his home in Arcadia two weeks ago. Born in Seattle, Pedersen served in the Navy Air Corps during World War II. He wrote for several publications and earned his first post as a racing official at Longacres in 1948. He was a steward in California for 50 years, and officiated at every Breeders' Cup held in the Golden State through his retirement in 2005. He received the Eclipse Award of Merit in 2002, and was also honored with the Laffit

Pincay Jr. Award in 2008. He is survived by partner Marlene Crain and sons Michael and Craig. Funeral services will be private. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to charities that benefit horses or cats, Pedersen's favorite animals.
