A 'PRIVILEGE' TO WATCH

Pegram, Watson and Weitman's **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai) stayed perfect in her third career attempt, reporting home a 1 1/4-length victress over **Speedinthruthecity** (City Zip) in the GIII Sorrento S. at Del Mar. The \$650,000 OBSAPR graduate, a sharp debut victress at Betfair Hollywood Park June 28 and equally impressive next out winner of that track's Landaluce S. July 14, was never too far from the front in third through fractions of :22.58 and :46.01 here. With Rafael Bejarano aboard, the bay filly took over with a three-wide move entering the stretch, and held off the determined rail rally of Speedinthruthecity to deliver her first graded stakes tally. "She's really talented--just a really good filly," trainer Bob Baffert offered. "I knew coming in here she was special and [Bejarano] rides her with a lot of confidence." Baffert continued, "It was a nice race for her. We've been going easy with her down here. She got a lot out of it, so it will set her up for the [G1] Debutante [S. at Del Mar Sept. 1]." Bejarano has been aboard in all three of Executiveprivilege's career attempts. "When I asked her to run, she ran," Bejarano commented. "She's very good. We wanted to let her run late today. [Baffert] is wanting to get her ready for longer races. And I think she'll be fine with that. She can run." **Cont. p4**

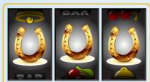


CLOUD TO REIGN AGAIN?

George Strawbridge's homebred **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who successfully defended her title in Sunday's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville, is in line for a swift reappearance in this weekend's one-mile G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois at the Normandy track, according to trainer Freddy Head. "Moonlight Cloud came out of her [Maurice de Gheest] race well and the lights are green to run in the Jacques le Marois," he told *Racing Post*. The field for the €600,000 event was reduced from 24 to 16 at yesterday's forfeit stage, with notable omissions including Group 1 performers **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), **Giofra (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), **Foxtrot Romeo (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Maybe (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}).

Coming in the opposite direction from Moonlight Cloud is Khalid Abdullah's G1 Dubai Duty Free hero **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk), who will step down in trip after failing to fully see out the 10 furlongs of the July 7 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown last time. "Cityscape is an intended runner in the Prix Jacques le Marois on Sunday, and we should have a better idea what is running after the [€36,000] supplementary stage [Thursday]," commented trainer Roger Charlton. "With Frankel frightening off most of the runners in the Sussex S., Sunday's race is likely to be very competitive."

Britain's challenge is strengthened further by the presence of the John Gosden-trained pair **Fallen For You (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality), winners of the G1 Coronation S. and G1 Prix Rothschild, respectively, in their most recent outs. Stable rider William Buick indicated the former is the likely stable number one in the wake of the latter's triumph. Gestut Ammerland's Rothschild runner-up **Golden Lilac (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) heads a list of other notable contenders which also includes Royal Ascot's G1 St James's Palace S. hero **Most Improved (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}), the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas victor **Power (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), last term's G1 Prix du Moulin winner and Frankel's bridesmaid **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), and last year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains scorer **Tin Horse (Ire)** (Sakhee). Deauville's straight one-mile strip is currently rated very soft by clerk of the course Olivier Louit, but, with dry weather forecast for the remainder of the week, it is expected to improve significantly before post time.

Penny Chenery to be Honored by TCA

The Thoroughbred Club of America announced Wednesday that Penny Chenery, best known as the owner of 1973 Triple Crown winner Secretariat, has been selected by the TCA Board of Directors as the

honor guest for the organization's 81st annual Testimonial Dinner, to be held at Keeneland Race Course in Lexington, Kentucky, Sept. 30.

Chenery, the daughter of Virginia Thoroughbred breeder Christopher T. Chenery, took over her father's Thoroughbred operations, Meadow Stud and Meadow Stable, when his health began to deteriorate in the late 1960s. In 1972, Chenery campaigned Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. winner Riva Ridge. Later

that year, Secretariat emerged as a 2-year-old to win five stakes races, clinching both divisional honors and Horse of the Year. The famed chestnut returned the following year to capture nine stakes, including his Triple Crown sweep, and set four new track records and two world records on his way to a second Horse of the Year title. Earlier that year, Chenery employed Claiborne Farm's Seth Hancock to syndicate the horse for a then-record \$6 million.

In addition to her accomplishments as an owner/breeder, Chenery has held many important roles in the racing industry, and is highly regarded as one of its most iconic figures. She served as the president of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association from 1976-1984, president of the Grayson Foundation supporting equine research from 1985-1986, and was elected to membership in The Jockey Club in 1983. She has been a leading advocate for equine welfare and racehorse aftercare, and was instrumental in the formation of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation. In 2005, she received the Eclipse Award of Merit.

"In selecting Mrs. Chenery, I believe our directors have made an exemplary addition to the highest ideals of the Testimonial Dinner," said Julie Cauthen, president of the TCA. "Through all of these years, Penny Chenery has remained the epitome of a grand lady of racing, always representing the highest ambitions and standards of those to whom the Thoroughbred is an important part of life."

Turfway Eliminates Stakes From Fall Meet


Officials at Turfway Park announced Wednesday that the Florence, Kentucky, racetrack will host no stakes during its 16-day fall schedule, which begins Sept. 6. In order to maintain daily purses, the track has eliminated all stakes for its 54th fall meet, including the five races of the Kentucky Cup Day of Champions. The track's share of funding for the series will be shifted to the overnight purse account. Daily purses are expected to average \$110,000, including \$18,000 from the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund. Pending approval by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, the track will also introduce a later post time for Thursday and Friday night racing, which will now begin at 6:00 p.m. Post time on Saturdays and Sundays will be 1:10 p.m. The meet will conclude Sept. 30.

Increased Security Protocols Set for Travers


The New York State Racing and Wagering Board announced Wednesday a series of enhanced security protocols for horses participating in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 25. The new security measures for the \$1-million race will require Travers runners to be on the Saratoga grounds Aug. 22, with out-of-competition blood testing taking place the same day. A full daily veterinary record on each horse will be required for submission to the Racing and Wagering Board each day leading up to the race beginning Aug. 22. The Racing and Wagering Board will post these records on its website daily. The New York Racing Association will cover costs associated with the new protocols. "The Travers S. is the highest profile race of the world-class Saratoga meet and will be conducted with integrity and high standards for equine safety," said Racing and Wagering Board Chairman John D. Sabini. "These protocols, which will help ensure that horses are kept safe and secure prior to the race, were put in place in consultation with equine safety experts, prominent trainers and track management." The new measures are similar to those implemented in late May at Belmont Park for the GI Belmont S. However, at Saratoga the horses will remain in their current stalls rather than moving to a detention barn, which will be monitored at all times by additional security personnel.

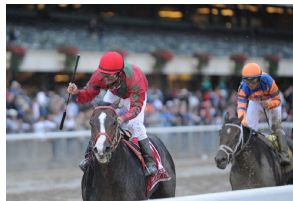

NYRA Announces Fall Stakes Schedules

The New York Racing Association announced Wednesday the stakes schedules for the Belmont Park and Aqueduct Racetrack 2012 fall meets. The Belmont schedule will be highlighted by a Sept. 29 card

featuring five Grade I races, including the \$1-million TVG Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational for older males over 1 1/4 miles on the main track. Additional Grade I races on the day will be the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational, the Flower Bowl Invitational, the Beldame Invitational, and the Vosburgh Invitational. The track's key 2-

year-old fixtures, the GI Foxwoods Champagne S. and the GI Frizette S. will take place Oct. 6. The GII Futurity S. and the GII Matron S., previously run during the 2011 Belmont spring meet, will be contested Sept. 30. New York-breds will take center stage Oct. 20 on New York Showcase Day, with seven state-bred stakes for purses totaling \$1.15 million. Eleven graded stakes during the Belmont fall meet are Breeders' Cup Challenge events, with the winner receiving a guaranteed starting position in the corresponding Breeders' Cup race as well as entry fees and travel allowances. The Aqueduct meet will feature 11 graded stakes, highlighted by the \$350,000 GI Cigar Mile Nov. 24. That card will also include the GI Gazelle S., the GII Remsen S., and the GII Demoiselle S. The Aqueduct fall meet will also include the GII Nashua S. and the GIII Tempted S. Nov. 4. Those two races were contested last year during the Belmont fall meet.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner.

LIGHT HEAVY TO PUNCH BACK

Light Heavy (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) was unbeaten in his first three starts of this year, which included wins in the G3 Ballysax and G2 Derby Trial S. at Leopardstown, and he returns to the Foxrock track for a competitive renewal of the G3 Ballyroan S. this evening. Jim Bolger's homebred was compromised by The Curragh's deep mud when trailing home third, 11 lengths behind Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), in the June 30 G1 Irish Derby last time, and he can bounce back on a better surface. Leading the older generation is last term's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Secretariat S. victor **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who returns off a fifth in the July 14 G1 Man o'War S. at Belmont. Anamoine Ltd's **Bible Belt (Ire)** (Big Bad Bob {Ire}) comes back from a fourth in the May 27 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh, and last season's G3 Dance Design S. victress will be joined by her stablemate and full-brother **Bob Le Beau (Ire)**.

He's got a great mind, knows what he's supposed to do and gets it done." Know More's half-length victory had jockey Garrett Gomez enthused about the 2-year-old's future. "It takes a special kind of horse to do what he did," said Gomez. "We just have to be hopeful that he's all that we think he is." O'Neill is looking forward to debuting more of his promising young juveniles in the near future. "We've got about 10 2-year-olds that are hard to separate," he said. "You don't know if they're going to take what they're doing in the morning to the afternoon, but we're excited about all of them."

VICHY SUCCESS SWEET FOR PALMER

Hugo Palmer knew from a fairly tender age that training horses was his calling. It hasn't always been an easy road for the 31-year-old, one of the youngest trainers in Newmarket at the historic Kremlin Cottage Stables, but he is slowly making a name for himself in the business and is hopeful that a filly named Making Eyes (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), who he discovered almost by accident, can take him to places bigger and better.

Palmer's formative years were spent under the tutelage of the Queen's private trainer Lord Huntington at West Ilsley, and also a time at Cheveley Park Stud. While on holiday from the University of Newcastle, Palmer went to work for John Warren, during which time the noted bloodstock agent selected a Montjeu (Ire) colt, who won his maiden impressively the following summer while racing for Highclere. An infrequent bettor by his own admission, Palmer got 40-1 on the horse for the G1 Epsom Derby, and a decade after Lammtarra cemented Palmer's love for the game in the Derby, Motivator followed suit--and filled his pockets.

Eager to branch out following his valuable and educational stint with Warren, Palmer took a job for two years as assistant to trainer Patrick Chamings before moving on to the yard of Hughie Morrison, where he had his hands on the likes of Royal Ascot winner Baltic King and Group 1-winning sprinter Sakhee's Secret.

These handful of years spent as underling provided Palmer with the necessary foundation to consider going out on his own, but along came an offer from Down Under to work for Gai Waterhouse.

"I suddenly had that sinking feeling that I'd never worked abroad and that if I didn't go, I'd never go," the affable Palmer explained. "In hindsight, it was actually quite scary to watch people come out of there, because some of them didn't actually last very long. It wasn't until I was out there that I realized that I'd given up a great job. But luckily Gai and I got along really well."

Less an assistant than an apprentice to the legendary Australian conditioner, Palmer relished and made the most of the opportunity, even if he was sometimes as green as the grass of the Hunter Valley.

"I'm far too big to be a track rider," Palmer explained. "I said to Gai, 'Who's going to ride these horses?' And she said to me, 'Well, if you haven't got any initiative, you're not going to be much of a trainer.'"

The highlight of Palmer's tenure in Australia was the 12 weeks he spent with some of the stable's most powerful and classy animals at the Melbourne Carnival. The experience was overwhelming, and the lessons learned from Waterhouse have seeped into Palmer's own training philosophy.

"Her overriding principle is that her horses are fit," Palmer explained. "She never takes a chance on her horses' fitness. She believes, and I agree, that you're far less likely to hurt your horses if they're fit. If they're properly fit, they can take the work and they can take the racing schedule that you program for them. So I've always tried here to make sure that my horses are properly fit and take no chances. Her attention to detail is remarkable, she doesn't miss anything and literally never forgets anything." He adds with a laugh, "Sadly, I can't claim to say the same for me!"

Following the expiration of his work visa, it was back home for Palmer, though the immediate future remained unclear. And then, as fate would have it, a filly by Dansili intervened.

"I wasn't quite sure what I was going to do when I came back from Australia," he admitted. "It was one of those very rare weeks in England. There wasn't a cloud in the sky, it was warm--it was the week before the Guineas. I came to see friends, and the Guineas breeze-up was on. Before I knew where I was, I found a horse that I liked and I bought the horse for 25,000gns and that more or less made my decision for me. I said, 'Alright, I bought a racehorse, now what? I better get a yard and get a license and get my ass in gear.' In hindsight--and I think a lot of trainers might say the same thing--I might not have done it had I known how hard it was going to be."

But he persevered nonetheless. Palmer had recruited four friends and Amanda Skiffington had done the same, each offering to take one-tenth of the horse for which they bid 25,000gns. The filly was ultimately led out of the ring unsold, and Palmer struck a private deal thereafter. The filly was named Making Eyes, and the ownership group became known as the Starter for Ten Partnership.

Unplaced in a pair of appearances at two, Making Eyes won her first two outings in 2011, but went off form in three starts thereafter. Given a six-month freshening into 2012, Palmer set his sights high for a filly he'd always had lofty goals for.

"I originally wanted to try to win the Hunt Cup at the Royal meeting, and I knew she had to win twice to get into the Hunt Cup," he stated. "Her first race at Ascot was canceled, and she won the second one [May 12]. Then it was a bit of a rush to find another race for her to win before the Hunt Cup to get in. We went to Doncaster [June 8] and things didn't go her way. She hit the front and I think she thought she'd won her race. She faced a headwind the whole mile, and I think she got tired and finished third."

With the Hunt Cup now likely out of the question, it was on Palmer to come up with a creative alternative.

"I'd always believed she was a stakes horse and fate meant that I couldn't use her ability to win a big handicap, so I thought it was time to stop messing around and get black-type in the bag. The original plan was to go to Pontefract for the Pipalong S., but that was abandoned, and the reason we went to Vichy [for the Listed Prix Jacques de Bremond July 20] was because it's the last race going a mile for 4-year-olds and up in Europe. We could have gone to Ascot, but she was only rated 90 and she'd have ended up giving weight to 100-rated 3-year-olds."

Some 600 miles away from home across the English Channel, Making Eyes wasn't given much of a chance by the punters and was let go at odds of 27-1. What ensued in the span of the next 100 seconds was sheer exhilaration for Palmer and his partners.

"During the race, it all went so perfectly," he explained. "She got the widest stall, but she had great gate speed and got across. [Jockey] Ioritz [Mendizabal] did a great job of settling her--you have to have her in the race, but she must get cover, particularly early on or she doesn't settle. He did that perfectly. She traveled all the way into the straight and she just never looked like she was getting beaten ([Equidia video](#)). She was the last one off the bridle and she found plenty and never looked back. You have to win a race to understand that feeling--I've been pinching myself ever since. It was amazing."

Back home at Kremlin Cottage, Palmer has 25 horses under his care, a too-manageable number in his estimation.

"We are definitely looking to expand, as it's not a number that's economically viable," he remarked. "You can run that number and not lose money, but I can't pay myself a wage out of that. Hopefully by winning a stakes race and showing you can do it once, people will believe it can happen again. Hopefully we'll have more horses next year."

And Palmer is hoping Making Eyes can be a recruiter of sorts. He says that the filly took the overseas trip in her stride and is fine, though she hasn't returned to her normal ornery self just yet.

"When she's right, she's biting and is just mean," Palmer said. "I'm just back from having a cuddle with her, so she's not quite there yet." But he doesn't expect that it will be too long before Making Eyes is back, as he is eyeing a return trip to France or Group 3 events at The Curragh or Sandown over the coming weeks.

"Who knows? If she won one of those, maybe we could even think about America?" he said, less than jokingly.

Palmer added that there have been a couple of inquiries into a private purchase, and he admits that for the right offer, the partnership would be duty bound to take money off the table. That said, he isn't exactly chomping at the bit to part company with her.

"I'd adore to keep her in training, as she's improved from three to four and I think she'll fill out some more and be better at five," he stated.

DEEP IMPACT DETHRONES A.P. INDY AS TOP APEX SIRE

It's been a long time coming, but now we are starting to see sires of what we call 'the big-book era' (1996-present) come to the fore, as the superstars of yesteryear have retired or died. Now, with the publication of these mid-year 2012 APEX sire rating statistics (racing from 1-1-2006 through August 1, 2012), we can really see it in print for the first time. Part of it is seeing who's not in print: one of the parameters of APEX ratings is that sires must have had 10 or more 3-year-olds of the last year covered (in this case, 2012, that's foals of 2009). Sadler's Wells, Storm Cat, Seeking the Gold, and Rainbow Quest are among those who did not have 10 foals of 2009, so, in APEX terms, they're done.

That opens up some space at the top of the table, and for the first time ever, I'm sure, 15 of the top 20 sires by the signature APEX A Runner Index (among 630 sires with 200+ year-starters 2006-2012) had their first foals in 2000 or later and, most importantly, the Japanese sire Deep Impact (4.69), whose first foals are only 4-year-olds this year (but who has already had 533 year-starters and 50 A Runners), has seized the top spot from eight-time champion APEX sire A.P. Indy (4.11).

To briefly review, APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings Index) ratings measure the frequency with which a stallion sires runners which reach the upper ranges of earnings in any specified jurisdiction. In English--we take five separate jurisdictions: North America (US & Canada); Britain/Ireland (combined); France; Germany; and Japan. We calculate, from all the starters in each place each year, the top two percent of earners; these are called 'A Runners'. The next two percent are 'B Runners'; the next four percent are 'C Runners'; and the top eight percent, combined, are called 'ABC Runners'. We then simply add together the results from each jurisdiction and do an overall calculation, which, if nothing else, deals with the fact that Japanese earnings are about four times everybody else's. We restrict the calculations to a seven-year band (now 2006-2012) so that once-great sires which have now tailed off aren't rated on past glories. There are 17 ratings in all, both regional and by age ratings (how do they rate as sires of 2-year-old ABC Runners, etc.?). These figures have been calculated for us since 1987 by The Jockey Club Information Systems (TJCIS), and a special tip of the hat to Mark Adkins, who's been there about that long, and who does a great job translating what people like me come up with into the finished product--and he does that for a lot of different people, by the way.

But I digress. Japan is in many ways a world of its own--an extraordinarily high percentage of prize money goes to older horses, for one thing--but since the arrival of Sunday Silence, there's no doubt its racing is world-class, as Deep Impact himself proved this year when the Wildenstein Stable's filly Beauty Parlour, by Deep Impact, won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches - French 1000 Guineas. So, though we don't cross paths that often, recognizing Deep Impact as the Northern Hemisphere's number one sire by APEX A Runner Index is the truth. When the time came for A.P. Indy's reign as the top sire by A Runner Index to come to an end, it is a Japanese sire which has done it. Since 2.00% A Runners from year-starters equals a 1.00 A Runner Index, Deep Impact's A Runner Index of 4.69 means 9.38% of his year-starters rank among the top two percent of earners. For any sire, their percentage of A Runners from year-starters is their A Runner index times two.

But the striking thing about this list is the transition, seemingly all of a sudden, from the old guard to contemporary sires of the modern era--which includes now-veteran sires like Smart Strike (1992) and Distorted Humor (1993). As mentioned 15 of the top 20 by A Runner Index (200+ year-starters 2006-2012) had their first foals in 2000 or later, and 10 of the top 20 have come from three recent sire crops, those with first foals 2006-2008. The three F2008 sires, which have just their first 4-year-olds this year, are: number one Deep Impact (4.69); number seven, Bernardini (3.36); and number eight, War Front (3.32). The sole top 20 representative of F2007 sires, with their first 5-year-olds 2012, is number three, Dubawi (3.94), who has edged ahead of Galileo (3.85) for the number one ranking in Europe--though it must also be noted that Galileo has had three times as many year-starters (1,415) as has Dubawi (470).

We've raved a lot over the past few seasons about the F2006 sire crop, which includes Kentucky's 'fearsome foursome'--all among the top twenty - of Speightstown (ranked 6th, 3.41); Candy Ride (10th, 3.15); Medaglia d'Oro (11th, 3.10); and Tapit (17th, 2.96). But two others from this sire crop also figure among the top 20: Japan's number two sire now, King Kamehameha (13th, 3.07); and continuing surprise package Pleasantly Perfect (18th, 2.93), who ranks just inches behind Tapit and must really be about the best \$10,000 sire on the planet.

Besides F2003 Galileo, the other four sires in the top 20 from F2000-F2004 sire groups all came from another vintage year, F2002 sires Dansili (14th, 3.04); Montjeu (15th, 3.03); Giant's Causeway (16th, 2.97); and Lemon Drop Kid (20th, 2.91). Three F2005 sires figure among the next ten, by the way: Mineshaft (23rd, 2.82); Empire Maker (26th, 2.76); and Oasis Dream (27th, 2.72).

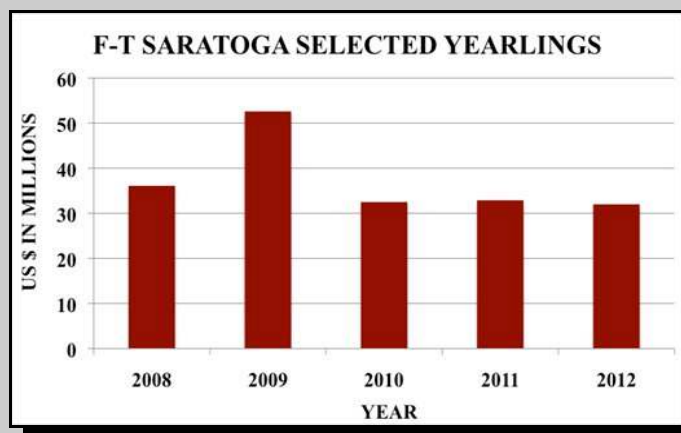

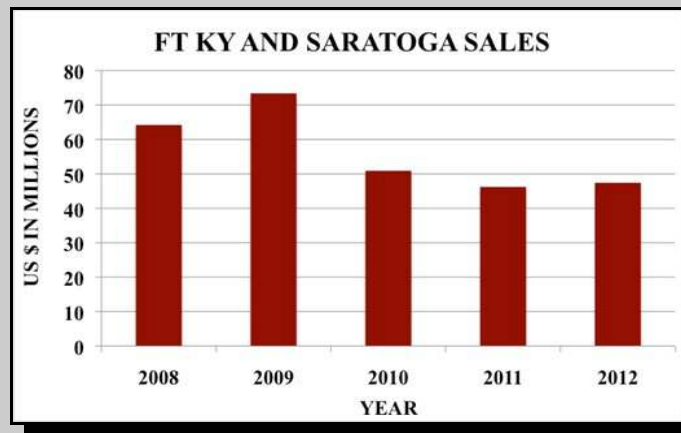

Besides A.P. Indy, the four other pre-F2000 sires still in the top 20 are: number five, Monsun (3.74); an obscure New Mexico son of Fappiano, Desert God (9th, 3.16, which tells you something about how purses have improved in New Mexico); Unusual Heat (12th, 3.09), from California; and the veteran English sire, Selkirk (19th, 2.92).

AMERICAN SIRES TOP F2009 LIST

These mid-year statistics also feature the first appearance by sires which have their first 3-year-olds, and the top five (with 50+ year-starters 2011-2012), at this point, are all North American sires. Darley's Hard Spun (2.91) tops the list both by A Index and by number of A Runners (11), though he is just inches ahead of Lawyer Ron (2.87), a son of Langfuhr (by Danzig, like Hard Spun) who stood at the now-defunct Stonewall Kentucky farm, but died after siring just two crops. There is an unusual three-way tie for third (all 2.80) among Ashford's Scat Daddy, Darley's Street Sense, and Lane's End's English Channel. It's really interesting when you look at their respective age indices, too: Scat Daddy is 2.20 for 2-year-old ABC Runners, 1.89 for his first 3-year-old crop; Street Sense, on the other hand, is 0.40 for 2-year-olds and 2.65 for his first 3-year-olds; and English Channel, similarly, is 0.46 for 2-year-olds, 1.88 for his first 3-year-old crop.

One quirk of running mid-year statistics is that the program has to calculate the percentages based on the earnings to that point in the season, and it does sometimes happen that horses which are A Runners in mid-year runs end up as B Runners at the end of the season, if their earnings don't increase. For example: the threshold for A Runners in Britain/Ireland in 2011 were the equivalents (in sterling and Euros) of \$74,070 (dramatically down, by the way, from a top of \$96,887 in 2008). Through July 31 this year, the threshold for top-two percent earners in Britain/Ireland was the equivalent of \$53,387.

This is relevant because the current leader among European F2009 sires with 50+ year-starters is a big surprise: Stanley House Stud's Notnowcato, a son of Inchinor trained by Sir Michael Stoute for the Rothschild family (notice what kind of year they're having? So this could happen) to win three 10-furlong Group 1 races at four and five. Considering he ranks only 15th on the European second-crop sire list by progeny earnings (www.the-racehorse.com) and has no black-type winners, it really is a surprise that he has three A Runners and an A Runner Index of 2.59.

All three are 3-year-olds which are showing good form in handicap company around one mile, though two of them, Custom Cut (in Ireland, RPR 107) and Chil the Kite (in England, RPR 101) have 2012 earnings of \$58,257 and \$55,303 respectively, so in theory could end up B Runners at the end of the year. The third, Royal Ascot's Britannia H. winner Fast and Free, has earnings of over \$116,000, so he's almost certain to be an A Runner at the end of the year. There's another one, a filly named Miss Cato, lurking in the woodwork, too: she was bought by Three Chimneys Racing after running second to a filly called Great Heavens (owned by the Rotshchilds and subsequently the winner of the G2 Lancashire Oaks and G1 Irish Oaks) in a Listed race at Newbury, and ran fourth in the G1 American Oaks at Betfair Hollywood Park (formerly Hollywood Park) in her first American start. I'm always saying one of the good things about APEX ratings is that it often pinpoints up-and-coming sires before the markets catch on, so let's see how Notnowcato progresses from now through the end of the season.

A total of 1,031 sires in North America, Europe, and Japan with first foals 2009 and earlier received midyear 2012 APEX ratings; in the next few days we'll do some more sorting, get the details posted on the TDN website, and see what other gems we might be able to mine from the numbers. But one thing we can say for sure: as great as he was, Sunday Silence was never the top sire in the Northern Hemisphere by A Runner Index; Deep Impact, maybe his best son on the racetrack and maybe his best sire son, now is.

We've told you where to eat in town when the races are over, but what about those long days at the track? Are you doomed to consume typical concession-stand food?

Not at Saratoga, says horse owner and foodie Bobby Flay, who shared his racecourse Best Bets with the TDN.

“Over the last two or three years, Saratoga has done a much better job serving better, real food in the backyard of the racetrack. Four years ago, I talked to Gavin Landry, then the Vice President of Marketing at Saratoga. I told him that back in the '70s and the '80s, they had local restaurants and people from Saratoga cooking their Saratoga specialties at the track, but that had all gone away, and the big conglomerates had come in and taken over. Gavin kind of took the lead and changed all that. Now, I think some of the better offerings at the track are:

HATTIE'S AT THE TRACK

Hattie's Chicken Shack has a fried chicken stand under the Carousel which is really good. They sell four pieces of fried chicken—just about half a chicken—for 10 bucks and it's perfectly fried. They also have a fried chicken sandwich. Now, it's fried...so it's not the healthiest food in the world, but it's not fried chicken that was frozen and then defrosted. It's really good, fresh, and really tasty.

PIES ON WHEELS

David Britton used to own the Springwater Inn right across the street from the track. Now, he has a truck with a wood-burning oven which he brings into the track and makes pizzas to order. You order your pie however you like it, they roll out the dough, and three minutes later, you have this amazing wood-burning oven fresh pizza.”

Bobby's honorable mentions:

Carolina Barbecue

Ben and Jerry's Ice Cream. “People think of Ben and Jerry's as this big company, but it started out with two guys in a renovated gas station in Vermont making homemade ice cream. They opened up a store in Saratoga 20 years ago, and now they're at the track as well. My favorite flavor: cookies and cream.”

Brian DiDonato Steve Sherack




We have given our two TDN crack handicappers, Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack, a mythical \$1000 bankroll and told them they can bet no more than 5% of that on any given day at Saratoga on a straight win bet. The winner, at the end of the meet, gets \$100 in a TVG betting account, along with bragging rights until next July.

DiDonato: Wednesday - How weird is this getting? Top-pick scratch number eight with **Ageless**. Is Sherack bribing trainers and stewards or something? Alternate **Sweet Sway** (14-1) (my second alternate also scratched) broke a bit slowly, rushed up from the outside to press and eventually faded to fifth.

Today - Today - Race 2 - Mdn \$35K, 2yo, 5 1/2f - #4 Nubin Ridge (8-1)
I'm against a number of horses in here for various reasons, and **Nubin Ridge** feels like he might be live. I just don't know what to make of the Pletcher/Starlight runner All Keyed Up--his connections have been super live with firsters this meet, but it's pretty obvious that they don't think much of this horse. He's been based at Delaware and is a half to the good Canadian sprinter Atlantic Hurricane, so you'd think if he could run at all he'd be spotted differently. He doesn't need to be a monster to win this and might just prove realistically placed, but he's definitely not going to be worth whatever short price he'll be. The Rodriguez and Ward firsters both seem likely to want turf and/or more ground; the other Ward horse is being ridden by a 10-pound bug who I just can't trust; and Persaud and Zito's stats in the relevant categories leave much to be desired. Nubin Ridge, on the other hand, has a sneaky second-fastest-of-68 breeze over the training track July 22 and a pedigree top and bottom that is slanted towards sprinting/winning early. His dam was a second-out winner, and a half-brother (by Speightstown), was a decisive debut winner. Trainer Merrill Scherer doesn't win often with his firsters, but when he does, they're big prices. He scored at 27-1 last meet with a 2-year-old going long on the turf, and might pull off something similar here. **Play:** \$20 Win. **Alternate 1:** Race 5 - \$15 Win on #9 Sarjinsky (Turf Only).

DiDonato Bankroll: \$865 - Record: 16-1-2-3

Sherack: Wednesday - Why Not Whiskey looked like he was launched out of a cannon after finally finding racing room on the far outside in deep stretch, but just fell short by a neck to finish a painful second at a well-backed 3-1. Think I'd rather see DiDonato listed to ride next time instead of Lezcano.

Today - Race 5 - Msw, 2yo, 5 1/2f - #6 Endorphins Fly (15-1)

Granted, Hall of Famer Bill Mott doesn't have the best numbers out there with his debut runners, but that doesn't mean that the blue-blooded **Endorphins Fly** can't run a big one at first asking here. The son of the very solid debut sire Distorted Humor is the second foal from the lawnmower My Typhoon, who registered a career high over the Saratoga turf in the 2007 GI Diana S. My Typhoon, out of the bluehen mare Urban Sea, was also precocious enough to win her Saratoga debut at two, rolling to a 5 1/4-length decision going two turns on the grass. Think it's a good sign that Mott decides to launch this youngster's career going short, and there doesn't appear to be anything else entered that immediately scares you here (ok, maybe the Graham Motion firster with six Fair Hill bullets scares me a little bit). Mott firster Apex outran his 31-1 odds to place a decent second to Palace Malice in a baby race Saturday. Hoping that's a sign of better things to come. **Play:** \$25 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 8 - \$14 Win on #1 Papa Tom.

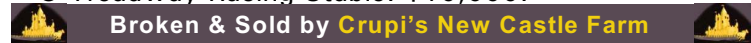
