## IT'S DEEP AT DEAUVILLE

If proof were needed that Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) rules the miling roost, today's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois at Deauville contains a total of nine top-level scorers who avoided the Goodwood visit of Juddmonte's dignitary.

Intriguingly, ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) is the only one to have gained her Group 1 at less than a mile, but like her

past stable companion Goldikova (Fr) (Anabaa), loves this circuit and bids to follow in the steps of Whipper (Miesque's Son) who scored in 2005 having won the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest a year earlier. George Strawbridge's homebred filly has to do both in the space

of one week, so the task is stern, but trainer Freddy Head is happy to let her take a shot at history. "She's taken the race very well, but has done nothing since as we're keeping her fresh for Sunday," he told *PA Sport*. "It's going to be a tough race, it's a top-class Group 1 and I'm not worried about the trip. She's changed a lot since last year, she doesn't pull as much as she used to and I think she will get the distance." Traditionally, 3-year-old colts fare well in this contest but there is a sole challenger this time in the shape of Iraj Parvizi's **Most Improved (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}). Delivering on early promise and hype when taking a weak-looking renewal of the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last time June 19, the Brian Meehan trainee has to step up on that form to shake up the big guns. *Cont. p9-10*

Victorious in the grassy GII Firecracker H. last summer, Wise Dan closed the season with a 3 3/4-length score in the GI Clark H. on the Churchill main track Nov. 25. The chestnut resumed with one of the freakish performances in recent memory, taking the Apr. 22 Gill Ben Ali S. by 10 1/2 lengths (Beyer 117) and was exiting a near-miss second in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 16. Wise Dan hopped in the air just as the gates flew and took up a ground-saving position in third as Get Stormy, front-running winner of this event in 2010, set the pace and got an opening half-mile in :48.64 on the yielding ground. Get Stormy still held the call as they reached the head of the stretch, at which point the plot began to thicken. Corporate Jungle got first run on the leaders--as well as Wise Dan--and came charging with a full head of steam which took him past Get Stormy at the eighth pole. He would have had his backers confident of a victory as he set sail for the wire, but Wise Dan finally got the running room he was crying out for at the fence and produced a sensational burst of speed en route to a handy score.

Without a black-type win prior to this test but close enough last time when second in the Listed Prix de la Pepiniere over 10 furlongs at Maisons-Laffitte July 22, La Pomme d'Amour took the leap forward that many Andre Fabre trainees are capable of to bag a Pattern-race success. Off the mark by five lengths in a 10-furlong conditions event at Chantilly last June, the chestnut was back in the winner's spot two runs later after an event for young jockeys and apprentices over 1 5/16 miles at Saint-Cloud May 25. Adding another conditions race to her tally over an extended nine-furlong trip at Longchamp June 30, she was favored by Maxime Guyon here despite finishing a half-length second to her stable companion Pirika (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) in the Pepiniere. Settled in fourth and close to the early tempo set by the British raider and habitual front-runner Shimmering Surf proved to be the right place, as the closers failed to make up ground in behind and the prominently-ridden Dalkala failed to pick up as expected. Seizing the advantage with a furlong remaining, she quickly asserted for a decisive score. "She was a bit unlucky last time and is a very straightforward filly who is easy to ride," Guyon said. "She has improved with every race and we knew she had a great chance today. I had the perfect trip today, as I was well covered behind a decent pace--I had intended to go on in front if it was slow, as she can do anything."

Old Time Hockey graduated in his turf debut at Gulfstream Park Mar. 10, but failed to reproduce the same form and was seventh in a grassy Keeneland allowance Apr. 13. The homebred led late, but was overhauled in the waning strides by subsequent SW Midnight Crooner (War Chant) in a May 6 allowance at BHP before clearing that hurdle with a front-running effort at the Inglewood oval June 1. That effort earned him a spot in the same division of the opening-day Oceanside S. July 18 as My Best Brother, where the full-brother to GISW Stormello set a searching pace and was able to just last, as Old Time Hockey rounded out the trifecta. My Best Brother was gunned away from there by Martin Garcia and took a hard hold of the bit, wanting to overrace, as Chips All In, a three-deep Old Time Hockey and ground-saving Blingo settled in behind. Garcia tried to rein in his mount down the backstretch, allowing the trailing trio to take closer order, but let it out a notch entering the turn. Still going reasonably well at the quarter pole, My Best Brother turned in front, but was unable to put any appreciable distance between him and his foes. Chips All In took first crack and led briefly from between horses, but Old Time Hockey worked home best of all and was up in the final few strides.

Aidan O'Brien showed that he is more than capable of resurrecting a racing career from a failed spell at stud with George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) and today's G3 Phoenix Sprint S. at The Curragh sees the comeback of another past luminary in **Starspangledbanner (Aus)** (Choisir {Aus}). Packed off to Coolmore Australia after adding the G1 Golden Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup to his G1 Caulfield Guineas and G1 Oakleigh Plate wins two years ago, the chestnut has suffered from fertility issues so it pitched back into competitive action. Jockey Joseph O'Brien is not expecting anything bold from the 6-year-old. "He seems okay at home, but we haven't done a whole lot with him yet," he told *PA Sport*. "He's coming back from a long time off and he's obviously going to be a bit rung-rusty on Sunday. It would be good if he can run a nice race and I'm sure he'll come on a lot for it. After being off for so long, you don't really know what they can do until you get them back on the track again so we'll see." His chief rival may prove to be another in the Tabor silks in **Fire Lily (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), who beat the re-opposing **After (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G3 Ballyogan S. over this trip at Leopardstown last time June 14. It was that filly that she also had back in second in the G3 Anglesey S. over an extended six furlongs here last July and she was unsuited by testing ground on her latest start when seventh in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 14.

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### Dullahan Fires Bullet for Pacific Classic...

Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) worked a bullet five-eighths in 1:00.20 at Churchill Downs Saturday morning and is soon to depart for the West Coast to finish his preparations for the GI TVG Pacific Classic Aug. 26. The 1 1/4-mile centerpiece of the meeting will mark Dullahan's first race on Polytrack since his victory in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. in April. "He obviously likes the Polytrack, and this [Pacific Classic] was our best opportunity to get him back on it in a big race," trainer Dale Romans told the Del Mar press office by telephone from Saratoga. Joel Rosario, who has recently shifted his tack to the New York circuit, has the call for the Classic.

### Godolphin Fillies Breeze for Stakes Tries...

The Kieran McLaughlin-trained duo of **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun) and **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) turned in workouts Saturday morning over the all-weather track at the Greentree Training Center in Saratoga as they prepare for Grade I tests over the coming weeks. Questing, the winner of two straight starts on the dirt, including the GI TVG CCA Oaks last time out July 21, went a half-mile in a strong :47 2/5 ([video](#)) and will stretch out to 10 furlongs for the first time in Saturday's GI TVG Alabama S. It's Tricky's destination is yet-to-be determined, and she went five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 in the company of the unraced 3-year-old maiden Villanesca (Distorted Humor--Balletto {UAE}) ([video](#)). She will make her next start either in the GI Ballerina S. over seven-eighths of a mile Aug. 24 or the GII Personal Ensign S. at a mile and an eighth Aug. 26. It's Tricky is unbeaten in three starts this term, including a 3/4-length success in the GI Ogden Phipps H. May 28. "Questing went very well and is on schedule for the Alabama," said McLaughlin. "It's Tricky went in company with Villanesca, and wound up four or five lengths ahead of her. She continues to train very well for the 24th or the 26th; we'll let [Godolphin racing manager] Simon Crisford help me out on that decision. "Which way we go depends on how many are going, and who's going," added McLaughlin. "We know Royal Delta (Empire Maker) is going in the Personal Ensign, and we have a lot of respect for her. We might feel like that's our best distance, too. We're not sure about that. We're leaning towards the 1 1/8 miles on the 26th, but if the other race falls apart we can do that, and we don't have to adjust our schedule of training."

## THE NEW ORDER IS MORE OF THE OLD

Early August with its new foals, new grass and new hopes, rejuvenates even the most jaded racing soul. Yesterday, in the cutely named The Rosebud--a Listed 1200 meter preamble to the \$1 million Group 1 Golden Rose on September 15--a new generation of three year olds, in the end only five started, fought for the new order in their new grown up world.

In the end, the new order imitates the old because it was a daughter of dominant Australian sire Fastnet Rock (Danehill), a mere slip of a girl called She's A Fox (Forest Native, by Forest Wildcat) who confirmed her odds on pre post price (3-10) by striding away with the first serious three year old race of the early Spring. By winning her third race from four starts the full-sister to Group I winning new season stallion Foxwedge, proved just how wise the investment of \$600,000 by Anthony Cummings, son of Bart, was at the 2011 Sydney Easter sales.

While it may be a slight stretch to describe August 11 as 'early Spring' it is no exaggeration to see Saturday's result as a reminder of the maxim 'the more things change the more they remain the same.' Here we have the first of the three year old black type races being won by yet another daughter of Fastnet Rock, now a constant source of fillies of merit.

Just fresh from providing the dominant young ladies of last year's classic season, Atlantic Jewell, Mosheen and Sea Siren, here he goes again with the Fox. However, I would hate to think any of those venturing to upcoming European yearling sales with an itch to buy a son or daughter of Fastnet Rock--a total of 50 on offer--would shy away from buying a colt. He get's both sexes of equal quality and don't worry if the fillies are on the lighter side. All his good ones, that I've seen, fit that bill. Beautifully balanced, athletic yes, but not overly big--just like some of those good track girls in Olympic London!

This contrasts with the first and second crops of the emerging sire of sires. They were mainly big and plainish like their dad who failed in his yearling year, 2003, to make the \$300,000 reserve Coolmore reckoned he was worth. The cognoscenti agreed the lumpy son of Danehill did not pass muster in the beauty parade and sat firmly on their hands as he strode unsold around the Inglis sales ring.

Taking him back to their Hunter Valley spread the chastened Coolmore boys decided to race him and split the unsold colt between themselves and a couple of confidantes. As they say the rest is history. Dual Group 1 sprinting wins gave way to a breeding phenomena at a service fee today of \$220,000 and now on his way to creating a dynasty internationally while flattering comparisons to Danehill's early shuttle years are not far fetched.

Which brings us back to the Fox. How good is she? Her effortless win Saturday shows she is very good but a win in early Spring is a bit like the first swallow seen in summer, just because there's one doesn't mean it's hot. The Fox has a lot to do before there is any comparisons with Fastnet's cream of the crop. But at least she is on her way, the other budding members of the new order still have to take that first step.

While the day's racing reinforced Fastnet Rock's worthiness, in Sydney the champion stallion of 2010/11 Lonhro was also away to a good start getting his first stakes winner of the new season when seven year old gelded son Pinwheel, (Quilt by Danehill), careered away in the weight for age Group 3 Missile Stakes over 1200 meters at Warwick Farm. Again this win reignited the theme, 'the more things change...' with Pinwheel owned by Sheikh Mohammed, now a piece of the furniture, a familiar and fearsome force on our racetracks.

And to take that new order is old theme to a final stanza, the victory of Shanghai Warrior (Emily Blue by Rory's Jester) down the famed Flemington straight in the time honored Group 3 Aurie's Star handicap is another example of the vagaries of the breeding barn, this time the very opposite of the fashionistas and highly spruiked influence of a Fastnet Rock.

Whilst Shanghai Warrior was not an unexpected winner having won five of his nine starts, the four year old entire is a son of the very out of fashion sire but champion racehorse Elvstroem. A Group 1 winner in both the northern and southern hemispheres having won four classics in Melbourne before beating all in the Dubai Duty Free Stakes, poor Elvstroem, a beautifully bred son of Danehill out of champion Oaks heroine Circles Of Gold (Marsday), was always burdened by expectation.

Wishful thinking and a little greed had him syndicated for millions in 2005 and the path to his door at Blue Gum farm in central Victoria was a beat taken by the very best of our female thoroughbreds. When the two year old champions didn't arrive in the immediate and proceeding years, Elvstroem's name was mud and the retreat was on in earnest as his service fee plummeted to just \$4000.

This last season Elvstroem actually hit back, finishing around 35th in the top 50 sires and ahead of many stallions standing at five times his fee and far more top of mind amongst the trend setters. But it seems this thoroughbred breeding world neither looks, listens nor learns.

Now Elstroem has Shanghai Warrior, his seventh stakes winner, to polish his name, but this will not change either the sale markets jaundiced view of him or his offspring because that is set in concrete. As I said at the outset not much changes, the new merely echoes the old...

Zito is 4-for-12 with a \$6.76 ROI over the past year with maidens adding blinkers for the first time (stat courtesy DRF Formulator) and he could pad those stats if Distortion has learned from her debut. **Play:** \$20 Win. **Alternate 1:** Race 7 - \$20 Win on #3 Atlantic Dream (turf only). **Alternate 2:** Race 11 - \$20 Win on #5 Dan the Tin Man.

Drawn on the rail for the second straight time while adding blinkers in a 5 1/2-furlong Woodbine maiden special weight July 8, Dan the Tin Man raced in tight quarters early, took over when ready, and dropped the hammer in the stretch to score by five impressive lengths, good for a very respectable 77 Beyer. Trainer Ricky Griffith is quickly becoming one of the best young trainers in the game with his 2-year-olds, and Dan the Tin Man can be any kind. If his five-furlong move in :59 4/5 over the Woodbine training track in late July is any indication, the Debmar Stables colorbearer should handle dirt just fine. ### NEW YORK-BREDS ATTRACT A CROWD

The Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale had already proven to be a popular affair even before the first horse walked into the sales ring at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion Saturday night in Saratoga. The advent of slots in New York have shot purses in the state through the stratosphere and shoppers were out in force in the barns Saturday morning and in the pavilion later in the day. Among a slew of trainers at the Fasig sales grounds yesterday were Bill Mott, Christophe Clement, Dale Romans, Barclay Tagg, James Bond, Gary Contessa, Mark Hennig, Rick Violette, Chad Brown and Linda Rice. Pinhookers were also out in force, with Niall Brennan, Eddie Woods, David Scanlon, Barry Eisaman and Ciaran Dunne all in attendance.

Before signing one of the first tickets of the evening, bloodstock agent Hanzly Albina acknowledged the uber purses in the Empire State were good for business.

"I am sure when we get through with the sale, we are going to see a significant increase—New York is one of the brighter spots in the industry with its incentive programs," Albina said. "I think New York has horse racing ingrained in its culture and they needed what they got—more incentives for the owners and owners are jumping at the chance. There are a lot of very excited people from the city and surrounding parts that have made the yearly pilgrimage out here, that have always wanted to be owners and now that the financial side of it is more in their favor, they are stepping up. I certainly have more of my older and some new buyers that are focused on New York-breds." **Cont. p2**



Albina continued, "It just makes sense when you can compete for such substantial purses to choose from this pool. Then again, there is nothing stopping them from competing in open company. A good New York-bred can run anywhere."

Consignor Mark Toothaker called last year's edition of the New York-bred sale "as good a horse sale as there was in the country," and he looks for things to only get better going forward.

"A lot of last year was the anticipation [of slots] and now we are seeing it and it has been just as busy [at the barns]," Toothaker said. "I hope the results are the same with the expanded catalogue, but I really look for next year to be unbelievable. I know the type of mares that we recruited to come up to Sequel out of Kentucky--there is going to be just tons more sire power."

Many of the stallions in the Fasig catalogue are standing in Kentucky, with mares bred in the Blue Grass and foaling in New York. Toothaker thinks breeders in the Empire State are going to need to adapt to succeed.

"It is going to be one of those things in New York that the breeders are going to have to get on board and step up their program or they are going to get left behind, because the train is going to leave the station," he said. "[New York breeder] Chester Broman always plays at the top level, with Bernardinis and A.P. Indys and like that, but you have so many more people that are breeding to the top echelon stallions in Kentucky that are now foaling them here. Govenor [Brereton] Jones sent a few mares up here this year, Twin Creeks has gotten active here. So you've got some of the top Kentucky breeders deciding to spread some of their risk around and get involved in the New York program.

Taylor Made Sales Agency and Select Sales are two consignors making their debuts at the New York sale.

"We decided to come here just because of what is going on with New York racing and the money that is coming in up here," confirmed Taylor Made's Mark Taylor.

Taylor Made has established an infrastructure to help their clients make the most of their New York investments.

"We actually have a program in place at Taylor Made that we send a representative up every month and we have mares at four different farms in New York," Taylor explained. "The mares are bred in Kentucky and come up here before they've even hit the 90-day in foal, so they are eligible to be resident mares, and the plan is to foal the mares out here and then bring them back to Kentucky and breed them again next year in Kentucky. So we put a plan in place this year where we have one of our representatives coming up here every month and he takes photos and videos on all the horses and reports back."

"We're trying to get our customers' confidence that they can come to New York and that we are going to help them keep an eye on their horses and get everything done the right way, make sure the transportation and everything is handled--so we probably have 20 mares in New York for clients that we are managing."

Taylor Made has consigned just six horses to the sale and Taylor said the small consignment was by design.

"We just wanted to be here and take part in the sale for the first time and reach out to the local people try to make relationships," Taylor explained. "It's a very exciting time in New York and we just wanted to be part of it."

Andrew Cary of Select Sales has been impressed by the activity at the barns leading up to the auction.

"I am really excited--we've probably been about twice as busy as we were for the big [select] sale," Cary said as bidding got underway last night. "There are a lot of pinhookers, a lot of trainers, a lot of faces we don't see in Kentucky, which is why we came here. This is our first year selling here, but we decided to come here because of all the new stuff with the purses and publicity and increased exposure for New York horses. And the venue is great. You get to reach so many more people that you don't get to reach that might not come down to Kentucky, that might not know when to come to Kentucky to shop for a New York-bred. Here they are right in front of them and there are a variety of sires to choose from--there are plenty of Kentucky sires to choose from."

### ***Majestic Warrior Colt for De Meric...***

The dominance of pinhookers on the top-priced list was completed Saturday night at the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Sale in Saratoga when Nick de Meric went to a session-topping \$220,000 for a handsome colt by Majestic Warrior.

"We are excited to have this horse," de Meric said. "For us, he was the complete package. The female family is there and he is by an exciting young stallion in Majestic Warrior that we think is destined for great things. We most of all loved the physical specimen; we loved his balance, his athleticism and the fact that he looks like the type that will improve with age and maturity."

Consigned by Thorndale Farm on behalf of breeder Seth Gregory, the yearling is out of stakes winner Road to Mandalay (Sea of Secrets) and is a half-brother to La Concerto (Aptitude) and stakes placed Game Token (Gold Token).

Of the session-topping price tag, De Meric said, "It was about where we appraised him. We didn't want to give a lot more for him, but we wouldn't have complained if we had gotten him for a little less."

While acknowledging that he may have had to pay more for the yearling because he was a New York-bred, De Meric added, "I think he would have significant appeal in any market. I would say we were buying the individual most of all, but the pedigree was all there for us."

**Tale of the Cat Colt Tops Early Returns...**

A son of Tale of the Cat led early returns at the opening session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred sale in Saratoga Saturday night when selling to Ocala-based pinhooker David Scanlon for \$200,000. Scanlon was acting on behalf of Rob LaPenta's Gotham Boys pinhooking partnership. LaPenta is the son of long-time owner Bob LaPenta. Consigned by Paramount Sales and bred by MDS Farms and Tale of the Cat Syndicate, the yearling is out of Grace's Valentine (Rahy), a daughter of Grade I stakes winner Plenty of Grace (Roberto). "We liked his family," Scanlon explained after signing the ticket on the yearling. "He was a real racy looking colt--that's what we are looking for. We've had a lot of luck with Tale of the Cat and we loved the female family and we loved the individual." Scanlon acknowledged the increased focus on New York-breds meant he would have to pay a premium for the yearling, but he said the state wasn't the reason he bid on the colt. "We knew there would be more competition for New York-breds, but we earmarked him as one of the best horses here," Scanlon said. "We thought he was one of the best individuals here, so we decided to be strong on him. We liked the individual and the New York-bred was a bonus, but we liked the individual more than anything."

**Crupi Stays Busy...**

Pinhooker Jim Crupi struck early and often during Saturday's opening session of the New York sale, signing the ticket on three yearlings during the first half of the session. "We're not done, though, we've got a big list," Crupi laughed after signing the ticket on his most expensive acquisition in the early going, a son of First Samurai who sold for \$170,000.

The yearling, consigned by Avandell Farm, is out of multiple stakes placed Miss Thermal Tech (Distinctive Pro) and is a half-brother to stakes winner Feeling Fancy (Sky Mesa).

"Everything," Crupi said when asked what he liked about the colt. "I am not crazy about First Samurai, but this was just a beautiful, athletic horse with a good pedigree."

Crupi has one eye on the sky-high purses in New York and the other squarely on the political uncertainty in the state as he looks ahead to pinhooking the yearlings.

"I am hoping that the purses stay the way they are and they will sell very good," he said. "[The purses in New York] are why they are selling so good, we just hope they don't take the money away from them."

Asked if he was finding the bidding competitive, Crupi added, "I am paying more than any other year."

**More Drama for Parcels' Saratoga Snacks:**

When **Saratoga Snacks** (Tale of the Cat) took an abrupt right turn when leading in the stretch of Friday's eighth race at the Spa, it caused legendary football coach Bill Parcels and trainer Gary Sciacca a few anxious moments. The New York-bred was well clear approaching the final furlong when jockey Ramon Dominguez dropped the left rein and lost his balance. But horse and jockey recovered and went on to score by 2 3/4 lengths ([video](#)). "You don't see that happen too much," said Sciacca. "[Dominguez] said [Saratoga Snacks] was drifting out a little bit, so he went to grab [the reins] and, when he went to grab them, he missed. He lost his balance. He grabbed the right side and pulled him out. It was kind of scary at the eighth pole." Sciacca said Parcels, a two-time Super Bowl winner, handled it with levity. "Bill said, 'He was coming over to the grandstand to visit,'" stated Sciacca. Connections also had a bit of a scare leading up to the race. "He got loose four days before the race and jumped on a pony," said Sciacca. "He's a good-feeling horse, and he jumped on a pony, knocked the pony down, and got loose. The day he was running, we were walking him over to the track, he reared up and lost his front shoe. So, we had to call [Joe] Campbell, the blacksmith, and take him back to the barn. We came late into the paddock."

**The Jockey Club Projects 2013 Foal Crop at 24,700; Estimates for '10 and '11 Crops Revised Downward;**  
*Edited Press Release*

The Jockey Club is projecting a 2013 North American registered Thoroughbred foal crop of 24,700, the same number that was projected for the 2012 crop one year ago, it was announced today by Matt Iuliano, the organization's executive vice president and executive director.

The foal crop projection, traditionally announced in mid-August, is computed by using Reports of Mares Bred (RMBs) received to date for the 2012 breeding season. RMBs are to be filed by Aug. 1 of each breeding season.

Like the 2012 foal crop projection, the 2013 is the smallest foal crop since 1971, when 24,301 foals were registered.

Iuliano also announced Saturday that foal crop projections for 2010 and 2011 have been revised.

"We have revised downward the estimates for the foal crops of 2010 and 2011 by 1,500 foals each," Iuliano said. "The rate of registered foals produced from the number of mares bred has not met historical rates for these two foal crops."

The projected foal crop for 2010 is now 28,500 and the estimate for 2011 is now 25,500.

Stallion owners who have not returned their RMBs for the 2012 breeding season are encouraged to do so as soon as possible. Submission of RMBs can be accomplished through Interactive Registration™, the online service that enables registered users to perform virtually all registration-related activities over the Internet. 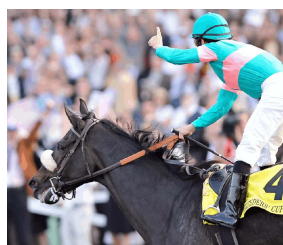
