EXCELEBRATE GOOD TIMES!

Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) had been beaten so many times by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) that he was beginning to look ordinary, but he proved in yesterday's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois at Deauville that he's far from that as he enjoyed a rare day in the sun away from his other-worldly nemesis. Partnered by Christophe Soumillon after Ryan Moore's fall earlier on the card, the 11-5 favorite was sent past the long-time leader **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality) and **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk) passing the furlong pole en route to a 1 1/4-length success from the latter. "This horse deserves to win another Group 1, as he's been chasing Frankel on so many occasions and is a good horse in his own right,"

commented Tom Goff, representing Coolmore. The race is a Breeders' Cup "Win And You're In" event for the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile, and Excelebration is thus guaranteed a berth in the starting gate at Santa Anita in November if his connections choose that route. **Cont. p3**

ANOTHER PHOENIX FOR O'BRIEN

While expected headliner **Cristoforo Colombo** (Henrythenavigator) went down after clipping heels in The Curragh's G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. Sunday, stablemate **Pedro the Great** (Henrythenavigator) picked up the flag and ran with it to score a 2 3/4-length success from **Leitir Mor (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) for the Coolmore contingent. It was the first stakes win for Pedro the Great's freshman sire (by Kingmambo), and a record 12th Phoenix title for Aidan O'Brien. The fallen favorite reportedly escaped with only minor injuries. **Cont. p4**

'SPURIOUS' SURVIVES FURIOUS PACE

Klaravich Stables and William H. Lawrence's **Spurious Precision** (High Cotton) shook off all challengers after posting eye-popping splits of :21.35 and :44.02 to annex yesterday's GII Saratoga Special S. in impressive fashion. Longshot **He's So Fine** (Purge) was five lengths back in second, while **In Harms' Way** (Hook and Ladder) rounded out the trifecta. "He's the real deal," trainer Rick Violette Jr. said of the winner. "He put [rider] Alan [Garcia] in an impossible spot--he beat the latch. He broke so good, it's not like you can take back at that point. There was serious pressure every jump of the way. Just watching horses come at him--and they did--he had a lot left." **Cont. p6**

Excelebration's sole top-level success prior to yesterday had also come in France, when taking a brief respite from the repeated Frankel-bashings he was receiving on home soil to garner the Prix du Moulin de Longchamp in September. Switched to Ballydoyle at the end of his 3-year-old campaign with Marco Botti, he returned to win the G3 Gladness S. over seven furlongs on soft ground at The Curragh Apr. 22 and was prepared for another tilt at the monster of Warren Place in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. Five lengths second in that May 19 contest, that margin became 11 in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot a month later, but with Frankel taking a step up to a mile and a quarter now, the path is clear for the admirably consistent Excelebration to reap the benefits. With Ryan Moore stood down by the racecourse doctors after taking a fall from Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) in the Listed Francois Boutin, it was left to Soumillon to do the steering, and he was beginning to work as Frankie Dettori pushed Elusive Kate's buttons approaching the final quarter mile. That filly had all rivals on the stretch with the acceleration that had won her the G1 Prix Rothschild here two weeks ago, but the prominently ridden Excelebration and Cityscape managed to usurp her with a furlong to race, and it was the former's extra measure of speed that told from there. **Cont. p4**

Last week's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest winner Moonlight Cloud (GB) (invincible Spirit {Ire}) ran with real credit on only her second try at a mile, finishing with a late flourish having been held up in rear and meeting traffic on the way through, while the true disappointment of the race was Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}). Keen throughout the first half of the race, the G1 St James's Palace S. scorer was eased down to finish tailed off. Cityscape's trainer Roger Charlton was on hand to pay tribute to the reliable runner-up and said, "He ran an excellent race again, and the ground and track were perfect for him. He's been such a consistent horse from his 2-year-old days, and so I can't complain."

"I've had plenty of good rides in this race and been placed before, plus I should have won on Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) last year," Heffernan said. "He picked up well from one and a half down and got to the line well. They blamed the ground last time, but I think I rode him wrong, as I made too much use of him and he tied up with me. I was following Joseph, but was going a bit better than him, and so I switched out and he didn't have the luck. We have a few Henrythenavigators, but are still learning about them. He should stay seven furlongs and a mile on pedigree." O'Brien, who was bettering Paddy Prendergast's tally of 11 wins in this race, revealed that a return to Kildare for the Sept. 15 G1 Vincent O'Brien S. is on the agenda for the winner. Pedro the Great was making amends in this race for the aforementioned Power, Coolmore's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas hero who was produced by Pedro the Great's half-sister Frappe (Ire) (Inchiner {GB}). His half-brother Footstepsinthesand (GB) (Giant's Causeway) himself secured Guineas glory for Coolmore, in the English version, in 2005.

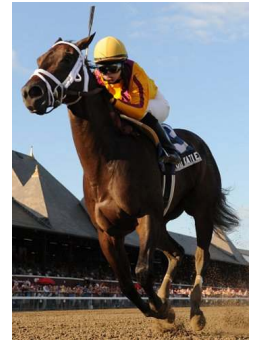

Robsham, we decided to play it conservatively. She was a terrific filly for us, a top-level performer at two, three, and four. We were very fortunate to have had the opportunity to train her. We'll miss her. She's a lovely mare from Mrs.

Robsham's foundation broodmare. I would expect her to be as good of a broodmare as she was on the racetrack." The grey won the Gil Matron S. and came a close second in the GI Frizette S. as a juvenile while trained by Stan Hough, and only finished off the board once in 12 tries for Pletcher from age two to five. She took last year's GI Ogden Phipps H., and was coming off a third-place run in the Gil Delaware H. July 21. Awesome Maria retires with a record of 16-9-3-3 and earnings of \$1,114,875. She is out of an unraced daughter of GISW Pretty Discreet (Private Account), who is also responsible for Grade I winners Discreet Cat (Forestry) and Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft) and MGISP Pretty Wild (Wild Again).

SUSPENSION COULD FORCE SUTHERLAND OFF PAC CLASSIC MOUNT

Rider Chantal Sutherland may be forced to miss her mount on Game on Dude (Awesome Again) in Del Mar's GI TVG Pacific Classic Aug. 26 after being penalized by stewards at Ascot for violation of British whipping rules while riding in the Shergar Cup international jockey competition Saturday. Sutherland's four-day suspension would be served Aug. 25-28. Several other foreign riders received similar rulings. "It's sad, really," British captain Kieran Fallon told *The National*. "All Chantal was doing was giving a couple of little taps. Riders tap the horses to encourage them. It is not as if they are hurting the horses. It should have been overlooked for today. They are foreign riders who are not used to our [rules]." Tommy Ball, Sutherland's agent, was confident that the ruling would not be upheld for the Classic. "I don't know the details, but she will ride the Classic, don't worry about that," he said. The Del Mar stewards, however, and senior steward Tom Warned acknowledged that there was a possibility that Sutherland would not be allowed to ride Aug. 26.

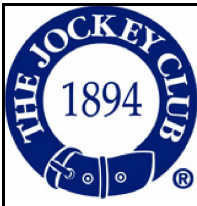
Out-of-Town Alabama Hopefuls Breeze...

Grace Hall (Empire Maker) and **Via Villagio** (Bernardini), one-two last time in the GII Delaware Oaks July 14, both worked out of town yesterday in preparation for Saturday's GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. The former, who could go favored, breezed four panels in :49 2/5 at Delaware--the 10th-fastest clocking of 26 at the distance. "She had a really good workout in company eight days ago, and she came into today's workout very well; she was the same Grace Hall," said trainer Tony Dutrow of last year's winner of the local GI Spinaway S. "She worked by herself, from the 4 1/2 [furlong pole], with a strong gallop out, and went from the half-mile pole to the wire in :49 2/5. We're feeling very good about her. She seemed to come back to the barn and cool out in excellent shape." The Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables and The Elkhorn Group colorbearer was expected to arrive at the Spa this morning. "We've chosen this path because we had her experience being at Saratoga the whole meet last year," Dutrow explained. "We're happy with how she's prepared for the Alabama and the choices we've made. I don't feel like we're swimming in uncharted waters."

Steve Beneto's **Via Villagio** worked an easy five furlongs in 1:03.60 over the Del Mar Polytrack yesterday. "We're definitely coming [for the Alabama]," said Hall of Fame conditioner Jerry Hollendorfer. "It was a very nice work, nice and easy. Our rider, Corey Nakatani, worked her and we're all ready to go." The GIII Railbird S. winner will arrive in New York tomorrow.



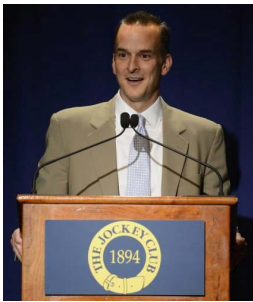

USADA HEAD CALLS FOR OLYMPIC-LIKE MEASURES by Mike Kane

On the final day of the Summer Games in London Sunday, there was an Olympic theme to the The Jockey Club's 60th annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

In his keynote speech, "Preserving Your Rights and the Integrity of Competition," Travis T. Tygart, CEO of the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency, told the 350 attendees at the Gideon Putnam Resort that pervasive cheating with performance enhancing drugs was threatening to ruin the Olympics and other major international sports. The doping scandal at the 1998 Tour de France led to the formation of the World Anti-Doping Agency with its strict rules and severe penalties.

"Unfortunately, this perfect storm of bad rules, lack of uniformity, confusion for sports fans, rights that were being violated, had a scandal then attached," Tygart said. "As soon as that scandal attached, it forced something to be done, not unlike what happened in baseball in the mid-2000s."

WADA became the global authority that handles rules, criteria, testing and enforcement. "We had the perfect storm. The scandal, however, is what put it over the top for us in in the Olympic movement. We took dramatic and definitive measures," Tygart said. "We put a stake in the ground in 1999 to say clean athletes were going to have a chance to win. Even if it has a short-term negative impact on our business, the long-term value for our business is too important." **Cont. p14**

Tygart said that to be successful, racing must use a similar approach of strong regulation.

Uniform rules, testing and integrity were major topics at the Round Table Conference. Stuart S. Janney III, chairman of the Thoroughbred Safety Committee, presented the report, "Clean and Safe Horse Racing."

Janney announced that a third edition of the Reformed Racing Medication Rules had been published and was available at The Jockey Club [website](#).

There are two notable changes. Clenbuterol may not be administered less than 21 days before a race. The previous recommendation was a 10-day withdrawal.

The Jockey Club, which advocates against race-day use of furosemide, usually referred to as Lasix, recommended guidance and best practices for its race-day administration.

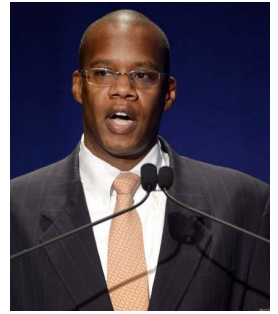
Janney said the committee recommends that racing regulators and the Association of Racing Commissioners International develop a rule calling for an investigation and a report by stewards on racing fatalities. A second recommendation from the committee is that a rule be developed to void claims on horses that fail to return to the designated unsaddling areas due to injury.

Matt Iuliano, executive vice president and executive of The Jockey Club, made a presentation on strengthening penalties for violators of medication rules. The proposed measures would include increasing fines and loss of purse money.

Janney stressed the importance of the proposed changes, which include revisions in the categorization of medications and the increases in penalties.

"We have to agree on a goal of ensuring that our sport is as safe as possible and that our athletes are properly cared for," Janney said. "We must also reassure public observers and our fans that we compare favorably to other sports and the international racing community."

Jason Wilson, The Jockey Club's vice president of business development, delivered a report on the progress made in the fan development project. In response to a study done by the McKinsey & Company that showed racing was losing fans at an alarming rate, The Jockey Club announced last year that it was funding a multi-million dollar marketing and publicity program.

Wilson showed examples of television programming, a new website and fan education initiatives.

Michael Lamb of McKinsey & Company said racing has had mixed success with the recommendations made in the report last year. Lamb applauded the work done with putting racing back on national television, but said that no progress had been made in making advance deposit wagering experience better for patrons. He noted that his company's report called for less but higher-quality racing, but that the number of race days was up 2% this year. With declining foal crops, he said that will pose a chronic problem for the sport.

Lamb said that marketing departments from the major tracks were meeting to share ideas and content.

And he pointed to the success in growing handle that resulted when the New York Racing Association and Gulfstream Park worked together to avoid conflicts with post times.

"We are encouraged by the signs of progress in racing over the past year," he said, "and we believe that the industry is making the right investments and attracting the right talent to execute the next-phase growth. The road may be long, but the steps taken over the past 12 months have laid the foundation for a more sustainable future."

As racing in New York is in full Saratoga swing, change is coming to NYRA. Governor Cuomo is on the verge of appointing new board members and managers to solve NYRA's most basic operational problems. What remains to be seen is if the Governor has the vision and conviction to bring in real change agents to the NYRA Board and executive suite.

By just about every measure (handle, attendance, TV ratings, zeitgeist), horse racing has struggled over the last 40 years. Two significant cultural forces--losing the gambling monopoly and the massive expansion of entertainment options--have pummeled horse racing. In New York, a combination of ineffectual management and suffocating regulation compounded these problems.

Yet, with the influx of VLT revenue, New York has a rare, once-in-a-generation opportunity, to establish a truly special horse racing program. A correctly done makeover would serve as a model for a re-tooled racing industry in the United States. Moreover, it would showcase the transformative benefit of effective state intervention while spurring economic activity and job growth throughout New York.

NYRA clearly needs to get its operation in order and a dramatic re-structuring is long overdue. However, mere fixes of well publicized, but small-bore problems, such as regulatory compliance and accounting, are necessary but not sufficient for success. NYRA needs a deep-rooted institutional makeover, including significant changes to culture, outlook, personnel and scope of operations.

NYRA still retains real assets--Saratoga, the Belmont Stakes, facilities with great locations, over 100 graded stakes races, and \$2.5 billion in handle. The significant VLT revenue must be used to leverage these assets into a well-run, internationally competitive horse racing venue. In order to accomplish this, our goals must be to A) re-establishing trust with the public; B) create a more compelling product when racing leaves Saratoga; and C) solve its long tortured relationship with State government. **Cont. p16**

The Way Forward: Consolidate and Innovate

1) **Simplify Oversight** -- NYRA is overseen by too many state entities, hampering its ability to innovate, and making it unclear which regulators are responsible for oversight. While legislation is already in place that will move in the right direction, it is not enough. Operators need the freedom to innovate and make significant changes. State oversight should be focused on animal and human safety, gambling integrity and accounting. These are jobs that regulators do well. The state should not be involved in business decisions like pricing, takeout, personnel and racing dates. The state is likely to be ineffective in this role and will only hamper needed innovation.

2) **Consolidate Downstate OTBs with NYRA's Tote/ Re-establish Presence in NYC** -- Horseracing's business model is broken. While providing little added value, bet takers (ADWs and OTBs) receive an outsized share of the wagering dollar, depriving operators and horsemen of needed dollars. With the financial difficulties of the OTBs in New York City, Nassau and Suffolk Counties, it is an opportune time to combine the tote of all these entities. The counties would be relieved of an ongoing economic burden, yet still receive licensing fees, and NYRA would be on a more stable financial foundation, with more money flowing to operations and the purse structure.

3) **Re-affirm New York's commitment to VLT Funding** -- Some people do not believe that horse racing is entitled to money from VLTs or casino operations. They are wrong. Horseracing has no moral right to the money, but VLT money is rent for using a facility (Aqueduct). Lawmakers and casino developers were able to bypass potentially crippling and costly zoning battles by placing casinos at racetracks, facilities that already host gambling. There is a cost for that, and quite frankly, it is fairly minimal. Think of the fight that went on to place a basketball arena in downtown Brooklyn. Now, imagine if that had been a casino.

4) **Innovate in the Tote** -- Horse racing has used pari-mutual wagering as its basis for close to 100 years. Yet declines in real handle over the last 40 years have been staggering. Why are we wed to this model? NYRA should test a number of new wagering and pricing models, looking for those that most resonate with the modern gambler. For example, exchange wagering has been a wild consumer success overseas. Testing it in New York would be low risk, as the exchanges would augment the win and place pools that were long ago surpassed by the exotic wagering pools. Changes to state law will be necessary, but in June we saw how quickly the state can make legislative changes.

5) **Prune the Racing Season** -- A significant consolidation is already under way throughout the industry. Foal crops have fallen precipitously the last five years and the future fight for horses will be brutal. NYRA will not be immune. It is imperative that the industry works to re-size itself to a level consistent with its fan interest and owner participation. Tightening up the schedule should be viewed as an opportunity in New York, one that would refocus NYRA on producing the strongest racing in the country both in Saratoga and downstate.

NYRA doesn't need to be all things to all horsemen. Running a \$20,000 conditioned claimer immediately after the GI Belmont S. is a prime example of confusing the public and distorting your brand. NYRA should move quickly to replace the conditioned claiming races that form the bulk of its program with more allowance racing.

6) **Create a best-in-class testing program** -- Horse racing is a dangerous and competitive sport, not unlike Nascar or professional football. We owe it to our athletes (equine and human) and our to fans that the racing they see on the track is as safe as possible and has competitive integrity. Too often our industry is behind the curve in engaging the public on the issue of medication in sport. Thoroughbreds are professional athletes and, as such, require treatment and care to compete at the highest level. However, modern pharmacology and the competitive desires have blurred the lines between treatment and enhancement. NYRA and its regulators needs to create a comprehensive medication policy that creates clear policies for race-day treatment, as well as for the period between races.

7) **Integrate Horse Rescue** -- The horses are the stars of our show. After their careers are over: Where do they go? How are they cared for? More difficult questions should be asked: Does every horse have the right to a home? How will it be paid for? Can we adopt an ASPCA-style system? There is a potpourri of organizations that have taken up this cause, but to the average horsemen, confusion reigns when it comes time to retire a horse. There is no standard for retirement, nor any systematic approach. As an owner it is frustrating to be left on one's own to figure out what to do. NYRA should put in place a comprehensive retirement program that makes it easy for the owners to do the right thing.

8) **Invest in Digital Presentation** - Horse racing is the ideal sport for the information age. The tools of the trade (past performances, pedigrees, videos) are easily digitized and readily available. Races are being watched and wagered on through a multitude of websites. This is a massive advantage in the domestic sports/gambling markets. NYRA should seek to extend in support this trend by investing in a massive upgrade of its presentation and digital tools. Quality video, date and wagering opportunities must be extended as broadly as possible. Basic upgrades like broadcasting in HD are a start, but to compete with the sport, entertainment and wagering options that proliferate on the internet, much more is needed.

9) **Consolidate and Upgrade Aqueduct and Belmont** -- The physical footprint of the downstate tracks is overwhelming, and it no longer meets the needs of the fan base. Empty stands abound, depressing the customers. The facilities are poorly maintained and provide few of the amenities that are available at Yankee Stadium, Met Life Stadium or even Madison Square Garden.

Especially at Belmont, NYRA should consolidate operations in a smaller footprint where it could properly serve the customers. With a smattering of fans spread out all over the facility, it is an impossible task to serve them all well. The 5,000-10,000 daily fans could all fit easily in the clubhouse with plenty of room to spare. Then they could be provided with appropriate food and beverage, decent televisions and a P.A. system that one can actually hear.

And we must ask ourselves about the efficacy of maintaining Aqueduct: Should the downstate racing be consolidated to Belmont? Should we race on the inner track anymore? Does the moving from track to track hamper the ability to invest and develop a single, more enjoyable facility?

10) **Practice Transparency** -- For too long, NYRA has seemed like a sphinx, afraid to communicate with the public about its own operations, industry issues or horse conditions. Showing the public, both betting and not, the accounting, meetings and decision-making process would go a long way to re-establishing trust. It's not just what the decisions are made, but the why and the how. We live in the age of Facebook and Twitter, where all information is eventually exposed. If you act like you have something to hide, most people assume that you do.

A re-constituted NYRA has a great opportunity to create a special horse racing program. Hopefully, New York's elected leaders will not waste the opportunity that other states have squandered by making superficial changes while continuing to operate as if there are no structural problems to confront. With VLT revenues available, difficult choices can finally be made and NYRA can focus on providing the essentials for a compelling horse racing program: the highest quality racing possible and a truly enjoyable customer experience at all its venues and in the digital realm.

Quick Flip is by good turf sprint sire Speightstown and is a half to MSW turf sprinter Stormin' Lyon.
Play: \$26 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 6 - \$21 Win on #8 Double Mint.

DiDonato Bankroll: \$931 - Record: 18-2-3

Sherack: Sunday - Canadian invader **Dan the Tin Man** chased a very hot early pace and never factored in the Saratoga Special.

The Scott Schwartz colorbearer clearly loves the lawn at the Spa, and his overdue wire-to-wire July 25 win came back with a very legit 74 Beyer. TAPIT COLT TOPS AT STRONG FASIG FINALE

With the backdrop of purses infused with slots revenues in the Empire State creating a competitive bidding environment, figures were up across the board as the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearling Sale concluded its two-day run in Saratoga last night. In all, 138 yearlings sold for \$8,632,000--up 28% from a year ago, when 124 horses grossed \$6,725,500. The average of \$62,551 was up 15%, while the median of \$50,000 jumped 43%. The RNA rate rose to 38% from 32%.

"Obviously there is significant demand for quality New York-breds, but not for every New York-bred, which is consistent with every other marketplace in which we do business and every other Thoroughbred marketplace in the world," commented Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "There is demand for quality, but there is not demand for every horse that is being offered in any type of sale. But obviously we are very pleased with the momentum that continued forward. It is pretty impressive if you chart the statistics from 2010 to 2012 and see what has happened in the state of New York in a two-year period of time. It is truly remarkable and is indicative of the effect that the racino slots income has had on the sales marketplace."

A total of six horses topped the \$200,000 plateau at the two-day auction, compared to just one to reach that level in 2011.

A striking gray colt by Tapit topped the sale when attracting a final bid of \$330,000 from Mandy Pope of Whisper Hill Farm. "He is just beautiful," enthused Pope, who did her bidding while sitting alongside advisor Chris Brothers. "He is very much an athlete. He is a perfect size for Tapits--he has a little bit more size than some of them have and a little more length to his hip. He looks like he is going to be a racehorse. His attitude was very good, which we also liked."

Consigned by Winter Quarter Farm on behalf of John Meriwether's Waterville Lake Stable, the yearling is out of Derriane (Cozzene), a multiple graded stakes-placed campaigner for Waterville Lake.

Pope acknowledged the price was higher than she had expected, but said that her team had been finding the New York market very competitive.

"The ones that we have selected, so has everyone else," Pope said. "It has been impossible for us to get the other ones that we wanted, but we really liked him." F-T coverage cont. p2

Exchange Rate Colt Brings \$320k

A colt by Exchange Rate brought \$320,000 to the bid of Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation during yesterday's final session in Saratoga. While Weber politely declined to comment on the purchase, Meg Levy, whose Bluewater Sales consigned the yearling on behalf of breeder Cam Casby, was thrilled with the result for her longtime client. "Cam Casby was my very first client and she stuck with me all these years," an emotional Levy said. "Normally we are discussing the bad news, so I was so excited to have good news for her."

Levy was confident the colt, a son of Zambezi Belle (Lord at War {Arg}), would attract plenty of interest in the sales ring Sunday.

"I didn't want to jinx myself, but when I saw the horse on the farm I said, 'Cam, I think you might have the sale topper,'" Levy explained. "That is pretty strong when you are trying to advise a client—but you know when you see a horse that has that special something. It is hard to explain, when they have it, it is the balance, the length, the presence, the swing of the walk. This horse never stopped walking and he was scoped ump-teen times. Everybody did all kinds of vetwork on him and all kind of inspections and he never changed one iota. He never changed expression, he took it all in stride, he did everything to show what a good horse he is."

Casby was more than happy with the result of the sale. Reached by phone at her Minnesota home, the 61-year-old said, "I am thrilled this one went to another woman who will know what to do with it. Let me tell you, I've never seen him—I didn't want to get attached. They told me from the beginning how outstanding he was, so we hoped he would sell really well."

Casby, who traces her love of racing back to watching Secretariat's Kentucky Derby victory while she was in college, has a broodmare band of 10 head. She races at Canterbury Park and also has horses in training in New York with Mark Hennig.

Casby races the yearling's half-brother multiple stakes winner Law Enforcement (Posse).

"We bought Law Enforcement back twice," Levy said. "We took him to the sales as a foal and she asked me what to do. I said I wouldn't sell him for anything less than this because he is a really nice horse. He had a little vet issue [and RNA'd for \$70,000 at the 2005 Keeneland November sale], then he went on to the yearling sale and the same thing happened [RNA'ing for \$42,000 at Keeneland September]. He didn't pass muster at the sale, but she has raced him on and on and on through colic surgery and on. She is just a cool lady and racing needs more like her."

Majestic Warrior Colt Gives Gregory a Career High

Seth Gregory, who has been breeding horses for a dozen years, recorded his biggest score in the sales ring Saturday night at the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale in Saratoga when a son of Majestic Warrior--Road to Mandalay topped the session with a final bid of \$220,000.

"Going in, I kind of had a number in my head of \$175,000," Gregory admitted. "We were expecting him to sell well, but that was a little better than what we were expecting. But we had had plenty of vetting and he had gotten a lot of attention at the barn, so we knew we were walking in with a hot horse."

Gregory spent 10 years working as an assistant trainer in New York, first with trainer Bill Mott and later with Mark Hennig. He got into breeding almost accidentally when he acquired the mare Won Perfect Rose (Air Forbes Won).

"When I was an assistant to Mark Hennig, there was a mare who was in dire straits," Gregory recalled. "The owner gave her to me. I took her home and she pulled through. I bred her and she had her first foal in 2000. She went on to produce Gold and Roses (Gold Token). So she was the start of it all."

While Won Perfect Rose's first foal was the stakes-placed Won Dozen Roses and her second was unraced, the mare's third foal was multiple stakes winner Gold and Roses, who earned \$877,966 on the racetrack. That gelding's success paved the way for Gregory to increase his bloodstock holdings.

"Some of the money Gold and Roses won on the racetrack was put into buying Road to Mandalay, so it all has grown organically from that."

Road to Mandalay (Sea of Secrets), in foal to Aptitude, was acquired by Gregory for \$25,000 out of the 2005 Keeneland November sale. Her Aptitude filly sold for \$50,000 at the 2007 New York sale and went on to become stakes winner La Concerto. She also had an A. P. Warrior colt bring \$85,000 at the New York sale in 2010. Last year, the mare's Majestic Warrior filly, the as-yet-unraced China Gold, sold for \$95,000 in Saratoga before blossoming into a \$230,000 juvenile at this year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale.

Her Majestic Warrior yearling proved almost as popular at the Humphrey Finney Pavilion Saturday night when selling to pinhooker Nick De Meric.

"He is a big scopey, attractive colt," Gregory said of the yearling. "He is very correct and stood over a lot of ground."

Gregory currently has a broodmare band of four based at his family farm Juliacres in Garrattsville, New York.

"At this point, we are breeding primarily to sell," Gregory, who also works as a sales representative for a wine distribution company, said. "We are looking to breed individuals who sell well and go on to success on the racecourse. We are looking to sell, but if we don't get it done, we will race. So we are looking to create a racehorse either way."

Majestic Warrior cont.

Gregory's goal is to eventually have eight broodmares with an eye towards selling five or six through the sales ring each year.

Asked to compare the thrill of selling a session topper versus the excitement of his years on the racetrack, Gregory admitted, "Plenty of people were asking me last night how fun and exciting it was and I said, 'It is, but it isn't as exciting as walking one over for a big race.'"

Still, Gregory expects to continue on his present course.

"I am inclined to continue selling, my goal is to find a bigger farm in the Saratoga area," he said.

And how did he celebrate Saturday's big sale?

"We went back to the barn and popped a cork on a bottle of champagne," Gregory said. "Then we went to the Fasig bar for a couple of rounds."

Brogden Scores Pinhooking Hat Trick

Carrie Brogden of Machmer Hall Farm has developed a reputation as a pinhooker with a sharp eye. The Kentucky-based horsewoman further cemented that reputation Saturday night at the opening session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale in Saratoga Springs, New York, when three horses she had previously purchased turned solid profits.

All three horses were consigned by Select Sales, in which Brogden is also a partner. The first, [Hip 214](#), came shortly after the start of the sale. A lanky son of Offlee Wild--Galashy, by Gulch, the colt was purchased for just \$3,000 at this year's Keeneland January mixed sale by Brogden and partner Michelle Redding. He brought a smart return of \$40,000 last night when purchased by Kim Valerio.

"Kim has had tremendous luck," said Brogden. "She bought a horse off us that ran seventh in the [2009 GI Kentucky] Derby named Join in the Dance [Sky Mesa], and the other horse she wanted to buy off us, but was the under bidder on, is a Rock Hard Ten colt who went on to become one of the OBS April toppers. So she's had really good luck with us. I told her [Hip 214] was a sound, uncomplicated colt."

Despite his lean price last year as a weanling, Brogden said the bay caught her eye at Keeneland.

"I loved his walk, and loved his long, thin neck and shoulder," she explained.

The other two Brogden home runs came out consecutively as [Hip 231](#) and [Hip 232](#). Hip 231, a gray son of Cosmonaut--Idle Gossip, by Western Expression, realized \$62,000 from SGV Thoroughbreds--a significant mark-up from his \$17,000 purchase price at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale in Timonium, Maryland, by Brogden and Martin Keogh from the dispersal of Flying Zee Stable.

"I bought two Cosmonauts out of the dispersal," Brogden explained. "Martin Keogh and I basically split them, so he was my partner in that horse." **Cont. p4**

When asked what she liked about Hip 231 as a weanling, Brogden said, "He was big, and he had a pretty walk. The dispersal horses weren't really sales prepped. They were very natural looking horses, so he was just a big, framey horse and I thought he was just lovely."

It was in the same sale that Brogden discovered Hip 232, now named Lonely Cowboy, a dark bay son of Freud--I'm a Real Cowgirl, by Western Expression. Brogden, in partnership with Deann Baer and Dr. Ruel Cowles, picked him up privately for \$11,000 that day, and turned him around for \$60,000 last night.

"I bought him with OCD's in his stifle, and he outgrew them," she explained. "He vetted perfectly [for last night's sale]. If he hadn't vetted perfectly, we wouldn't have brought him."

In selecting pinhooking prospects, Brogden said she looks for "athletes at values," and she also noted that numbers and a little luck play an important role in pinhooking success.

"This year, I've pinhooked parts of over 70 yearlings," said Brogden. "You're seeing the ones that have all gone the right way. Pinhooking is a numbers game. There's horses that go the right way, and horses that go the wrong way. I bought a filly earlier this year for \$42,000 and she's gone crooked as a snake, and I couldn't do anything to stop it. It's a numbers game, and these are the horses that have stepped up to the plate and done really well. We do a lot of partnerships, and I'm very lucky to have the partners I do."

Brogden's good fortune continued Sunday night during the sale's second session when a colt she owned a piece of proved a solid pinhook. [Hip 393](#), a son of Tiago--Wing's of Glory, by Ghostzapper, an \$11,000 Keeneland November weanling purchase last year, brought \$70,000 as part of the Four Star Sales consignment for Glencrest Farm.

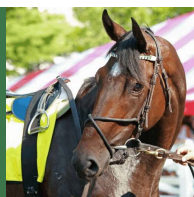
