## ALABAMA SLAMMER

Leading lady honors are on the line in today's GI Alabama S. at the Spa, headed by Grade I winners **Grace Hall** (Empire Maker) and **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun). The former, campaigned in partnership by Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables and the Elkstone Group, captured last term's GI Spinaway S. over this course and later added a strong runner-up effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs. Third as the 5-2 favorite in the GI Kentucky Oaks, the GII Gulfstream Oaks heroine enters off a career-best 105 Beyer in a sparkling performance over **Via Villaggio** (Bernardini) in the GII Delaware Oaks July 14 ([video](#)). "[The 3-year-old filly division is] a wide open door right now," trainer Tony Dutrow commented.

"There are a half-dozen of fillies out there who have their name on the ballot right now, and with this field in the Alabama, the winner will have a bold statement toward that 3-year-old filly championship." Dutrow continued, "[Grace Hall]'s been a machine; you just wind her up, and she ticks right along." Godolphin's Questing, a well-beaten fifth in the Juvenile Fillies while under the care of John Gosden, has looked like a new filly on dirt this term after a pair of off-the-board finishes on grass. A dominating victress over the promising Book Review (Giant's Causeway) going a mile in an optional claimer at Belmont June 24, the bay rolled to an eye-catching 4 1/4-length tally while drifting out badly through the stretch over **Zo Impressive** (Hard Spun) and **In Lingerie** (Empire Maker) in the GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks July 21 ([video](#)). "She has been doing great since the Coaching Club," trainer Kieran McLaughlin said of Questing. "She's training well and is happy".

He faces 10 rivals, including 4-1 morning-line favorite **Boisterous** (Distorted Humor). Sophomores will be on display in the Secretariat, led by the streaking **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver) and GIII Hill Prince S. hero **Summer Front** (War Front), who is unbeaten in five starts on the green stuff. **Boisterous**, hero of the Gill Fort Marcy S. at the Big A May 5, finished a rallying third in the GI Manhattan H. June 9, then reported home a neck short of **Rahystrada** in the Gill Arlington H. July 14. **Willcox Inn** boasts three wins over this turf course, including a decisive four-length tally in last term's GII American Derby and a victory in an \$80,000 optional claimer going a mile while making his seasonal bow July 22. There are plenty of European invaders in with a big chance here, including the aforementioned **Treasure Beach (GB)**; G2 York S. runner-up **Afsare (GB)**; Italian Group 1 winner **Crackerjack King (Ire)**; and **Wigmore Hall (Ire)**, who shipped over to finish fourth in this race last year. "I still believe that last year we would have been second in the Million if we hadn't gotten knocked around a bit during the running," said Gillian Dolman, assistant to Wigmore Hall's trainer Michael Bell.

**TOP FILLIES AND MARES 'MIX' IT UP**

Today's GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Park has lured a well-matched field of fillies and mares, with strong representation from both America and Europe. Favored on the morning line at 3-1 is Glen Hill Farm's **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro), who looks

to record her third straight graded stakes win, and her first Grade I. Purchased from the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale for \$150,000, the 4-year-old has more than earned her keep, bankrolling just over \$1 million. Her seven wins include four graded stakes, and she comes into this race off back-to-back Grade II scores at Woodbine in the June 2 Nassau S., and the July 8 Dance

Smartly S. Next on the line at 7-2 is **Aruna** (Mr. Greeley). The Flaxman Holdings homebred recorded a career high last year when she won the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. over Keeneland's Polytrack. The 5-year-old has made three starts in 2012--she won the GII Sheepshead Bay S. at Belmont Park May 26 at this distance. Third that day was **Mystical Star** (Ghostzapper), who turned the tables on Aruna next out in the GII New York S. June 30. The Christophe Clement charge has been improving on the basis of her Beyer Speed Figures this year, and she recorded a 95 in the New York. Leading the European contingent is **Joviality (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}). Victorious two starts ago at Royal Ascot in the G2 Windsor Forest S. on June 20, she was well-beaten last out in the July 13 G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket. That loss could be attributed to the soft ground, which the 4-year-old John Gosden trainee has typically not enjoyed. The Coolmore colors will be carried by **Up (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who looks for her first win since breaking her maiden over the all-weather surface at Dundalk last September. Up crossed the Atlantic in October to contest the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, finishing fourth behind Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy). The Aidan O'Brien runner finished second in the G1 Poule D'Essai Des Pouliches at Longchamp on May 13, and was third last out in the G3 Kilboy Estate S. July 22 at the Curragh. As the only 3-year-old in the field, Up receives a six-pound weight allowance. The David Simcock-trained **I'm a Dreamer (Ire)** (Noverre) is winless this year, but has been contending with the best of her generation in England. She traveled well last year to miss by a head in the GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine.

### DANCE OFF AT THE SPA

The streaking duo of **Turbo Compressor** (Halo's Image) and **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) headline today's co-featured GI Sword Dancer Invitational at Saratoga. P & G Stable and Off the Hook's Turbo Compressor seeks his third straight tally off the heels of wire-to-wire victories in the \$500,000 Colonial Turf Cup S. June 16 and the GI United Nations S. at Monmouth July 7. "It simply depends on the pace scenario, but he continues to handle the increase in distances we've been offering, and he appreciates being on the lead," trainer Todd Pletcher commented. "[Against Turbo Compressor], some people are reluctant to take their horse out of their natural running style. It's a balancing act, jeopardizing your own horse to ensure faster fractions. It's not only his ability to show speed, but he relaxes once he's there." Phipps homebred Point of Entry boasts a three-race winning streak of his own, including Keeneland's GII Elkhorn S. Apr. 27 and Belmont's GI Man o' War S. July 14.

Today's \$500,000 GI Secretariat S. at Arlington has drawn a competitive group of eight, with three of them hailing from the barn of Dale Romans. Favored at 9-5 on the morning line is **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver), who flaunted his front-running ways to his sixth straight success in the GII Virginia Derby at Colonial Downs July 21. Just a little over a length behind him in third that evening was stablemate **Finnegans Wake** (Powerscourt {GB}). The trio is rounded out by **Cozzetti** (Cozzene), who bravely made his way through to triumph in the local prep for this

event, the GIII American Derby July 14. "Each owner deserves a right to try to win this race," said Romans. "[Cozzetti and Finnegans Wake] are both accomplished horses who deserve a chance. If Silver Max stubs his toe, either one could win." There are a pair of shippers from Europe in the race as well. Flying the flag for The Aga Khan is **Bayrir (Fr)** (Medicean {GB}), who is coming off a win in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte July 22 for trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. Aidan O'Brien, who successfully shipped Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) to secure last year's Secretariat, fields **Daddy Long Legs** (Scat Daddy) this time. The chestnut captured the G2 UAE Derby on Meydan's Tapeta in his 2012 bow, but was eased in the GI Kentucky Derby on the dirt at Churchill. He has not faced the starter since finishing fourth in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26.

My Gi Gi has run well in three attempts since transferring to the Peter Eurton barn, hitting the board in all three starts. "You never look forward to battling horses like Lady of Shamrock, but it's always fun," Eurton said. "She's not the only one we have to worry about, there's nine other ones. There's Eden's Moon, she's a very talented filly and several other good ones." The Baffert trained **"TDN Rising Star"** **Eden's Moon** (Malibu Moon) proved that in her most recent contest, the GII San Clemente H. over the Del Mar turf July 22, that she can be just as dominant over the sod as she has been on the main track. **Best Present Ever** (Unusual Heat), **Open Water** (Include) and **Stormy Lucy** (Stormy Atlantic) will be aiming for their first graded stakes victories since hitting the board in recent graded attempts.

**IN HIS ELEMENT**

**Strong Suit** (Rahy) returns to the seven-furlong trip over which he has established his reputation in recent months when looking to reverse a barren spell in today's G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury. On his last three starts at the distance, Qatar Racing's acquisition has outclassed smart rivals in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot last June, the G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood a month later and the G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket in October. On the latter occasion, he served notice of his abundant ability when handing this race's late scratching Chachamaidee (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) five pounds and an emphatic 4 1/2-length beating and all subsequent off-the-board efforts over six furlongs or a mile could be blamed on either the draw or unsuitable ground. Richard Hannon also saddles the ultra-tough fellow seven-furlong specialist **Libranno (GB)** (Librettist), who was 1 1/2 lengths second behind Chachamaidee in the latest renewal of the Lennox at Goodwood July 31 and he said, "The owners are obviously very keen to win a Group 1 with Strong Suit, but the weather has continually messed things up which has been frustrating. Strong Suit floats along over fast ground and, while we all have fingers crossed that he might yet get a place at the top table later on, this is a valuable Group 2 which looks tailor-made for him. Unless the heavens open, he should get close to good ground which will be okay. He put Chachamaidee in her place in the Challenge Stakes over this trip at Newmarket last back-end and on that form he would be the one they all have to beat. However, don't rule out Libranno. He is less ground-dependent than Strong Suit, and, though he is officially rated 13 pounds inferior, he has proved himself a solid G2 horse over the last three seasons and his last run at Goodwood suggests that he is as good as ever." Godolphin's **Soul (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}) has winning form over this trip in Australia and looked in need of it when putting in a strong staying performance on testing ground as he took the G3 Hackwood S. by four lengths over six furlongs here July 14. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented, "I think that Soul will be fine racing over seven furlongs and he has been in very good form this year. He has run well on all types of ground and he has the class to run a big race in a Group 2 contest."

**THE RETURN OF THE MASKED MARVEL?**

Since his impressive success in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September, Bjorn Nielsen's **Masked Marvel (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) has yet to show anything approaching that form and today's G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury offers a chance to restore his reputation. In the Doncaster Classic, he had **Brown Panther (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}) three lengths behind in second, but bar a third in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 2 has been out of the frame in three other starts in the interim including when behind that rival in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot last time July 21. Brown Panther, who was runner-up in this 12 months ago, was only beaten four lengths into seventh in the King George and that form may be enough to prevail here. "I've been really happy with him since the King George--he actually came out of that race better than he did his previous race," trainer Tom Dascombe told *PA Sport*.

"He came out of Ascot bouncing and fresh and didn't lose much weight. It's an interesting little race. Our horse was second in it as a three-year-old and it would be nice if he could go one place better. He's not a horse you have to worry about too much regarding ground. He ran very well in the Leger on very fast ground and handled very soft ground in Germany. It should be genuine good ground this weekend and that should be perfect." Since switching to Luca Cumani's stable, Dr Marwan Koukash's **Mount Athos (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) has looked a different proposition to the handicapper struggling with his mark last term and defied top weight in the competitive Listed Silver Cup over 14 furlongs at York last time July 14. Cumani has an eye on the G1 Melbourne Cup at Flemington Nov. 6. "I've been told his weight would not be high enough to get into the Melbourne Cup field, because there are so many horses going from Europe that are rated a bit higher than him," he explained. "In order to make sure we get in, we need something more but at the same time, we don't want to do too much and end up with too much weight so it's a fine balancing act. He seems to be in excellent form and I think he's a horse who doesn't want to be over-raced. His two runs came after a long lay-off and he seems to be nice and fresh again now. I think if he's in the first three, he will have sufficient weight to get into the field but we will have to see what the handicapper has to say."

We have left her in the Yorkshire Oaks just in case it pours down all weekend. She's in the G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 8], the G1 Champion S. [at Newmarket Oct. 20] and the [Oct. 7] Arc and there is also the Breeders' Cup, so there are lots of options and this is very much the starting point."

**Olivier Deloye, General Manager of Arqana:**

"We are reasonably confident that the Sale will go well. Even if the present economic situation is not great, there are signs that give us hope and lead us to be optimistic. Firstly, the catalogue is good with a very homogenous collection of horses and we have the feeling that the selection has been well made. Secondly, we have buyers coming from all over the world--with most of them here already on Thursday--from the Middle East, Australia, Asia, Eastern Europe, South Africa, Japan, Hong Kong, UK and of course all of continental Europe. The third important point is that there has been a lot of visits and activities in major farms and with major consignors in the weeks preceding this sale. Fourth, it is important to mention the trust of buyers in the quality of horses sold in Deauville. So many Group 1 winners have come out of this sale in the past years and the results on the racecourse of horses sold in Deauville speak for themselves. People have great confidence in this sale. Last of all, people have found their way around the new sales complex, major improvements have been brought in from last year and all the signs are there for a good sale. We don't see the results in Saratoga as a problem. Even for the Americans, Saratoga doesn't reflect the reality of the American market, so we have no reason to be pessimistic. The last factor is the currency exchange rate. The euro is weaker and that will certainly give more buying power to some of our potential clients."

**Eric Puerari, Haras des Capucines:**

"As early as Thursday morning, we have seen a lot of people from England and Ireland and they have taken real good time to inspect most of our horses. Crossing our fingers, there is not a setback to report yet. To see major professionals so early on the ground certainly boosts your confidence. We have 42 yearlings to sell, nice individuals with a lot of presence and good physical strength, real athletes. Of course, some will sell better than others and, as always in a sale you can have a disappointment, but overall we are hopeful that the final result will be good."

**Aliette Forien, Haras de la Reboursière et de Montaigu:**

"As has been the case in the last few years, the catalogue is of very good quality and Arqana is lucky to have the first yearlings by Sea the Stars going to public auction. That will certainly help the sale and we have to be optimistic that this will be a good one. We have about 30 to sell but less in the first part of the sale, over the first two days, than in previous years. But we can't really complain about that, it is the gross result that will be important and from that point of view I think that we have what we need to achieve a satisfactory result."

"We have been very active from Thursday morning and Arqana is expecting a lot of potential buyers so it should be an interesting sale, very selective probably as usual with hopefully good density in the middle market as I have no fear that the top market and the best horses will sell well. We have 30 yearlings in our consignment this year and we have cut the numbers from previous years, as we wished to be more selective on what we bring to the sales each year. Our lot is very consistent and hopefully the result will be good."

In a high-spirited party on the eve of Arqana's Deauville yearling sale, about 600 buyers, consignors and others participants in French and international racing were treated to champagne, foie gras and lobster while watching premier show horseman Frederic Pignon and his famous stallions perform stunning maneuvers at the Pole International du Cheval equestrian center.

But perhaps the real highlight of the evening was the presentation of a lifetime achievement award in the form of a gold whip to Alec Head, former master of Haras du Quesnay and former outstanding jockey and trainer.

"Magnifique, magnifique!" Head exclaimed after posing for photographers while crouched as if riding a racehorse and slashing the gold whip through the air. "This is wonderful, especially to have my family here with me and all the French breeders."

Among those in attendance were Head's son, former champion jockey and current trainer Freddy Head, who conditioned multiple international champion and three-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), and Head's daughter, top French trainer Crique Head-Maarek. Head turned over management of Quesnay to his children, including his other daughters Martine and Patricia, in 2010.

"I am very proud of him," Freddy Head said. "He has always been a model for us to follow. And apart from what he has done in his professional life, he's a great father--and that's the most important thing."

Alec Head previously was feted in Kentucky as an honor guest of the Thoroughbred Club of America, and he pointed out that he is the only Frenchman to receive that distinction.

Pignon dazzled the presale crowd with his feats both on and off six stallions, and he was joined by his wife, Magali Delgado, for a riding duet early in the evening. Both previously performed with Cavalia, for which Pignon was equestrian director.

Using only some light rope and often just his hands and voice, Pignon ran, danced and twirled in circles with his stallions, who reared and bowed on command. At one point, he had two stand on portable steps and he climbed on their bare backs.


The party was a joint project between Arqana and France Galop. Bertrand Belinguier, who was elected president of France Galop at the end of last year, presented the award to Head along with Arqana President Eric Hoyeau.

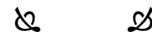

## FRANCE AND CHINA JOIN FORCES

French racing and breeding officials planned to announce Aug. 18 that they have reached agreement to help China educate and train professionals to develop a Thoroughbred industry in the world's largest nation.

A media conference was set to take place at Deauville racecourse in the morning and details were mostly kept hush-hush, but some attendees at a festive party Friday to celebrate the Arqana Deauville yearling sale shared key details. Several Chinese guests also attended the party.

"We're not investing money, we're investing in the people," said prominent French bloodstock agent Jean-Pierre Deroubaix, when asked about France's role with China. Deroubaix helped obtain the Qatar sponsorship for the GI Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe weekend and is well known for his role in helping develop racing and breeding in countries such as Oman, Russia and Turkey.

Since the Chinese government is very sensitive about wagering, the French will emphasize other aspects of racing.

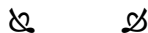
"What we do will not be seen by the Chinese government as a betting operation but as an agricultural operation that creates jobs," Deroubaix said.

"It's a big project," he added. "They asked for our help and we agreed. If we don't do it, it doesn't help France."

China initiated the massive Tianjin Horse City project, which was to encompass educational facilities as well as organized racing and breeding, in conjunction with Dubai's Meydan in 2010. Earlier this year, Irish officials and Coolmore announced they would also be helping with that still developing project by supplying bloodstock.

Deroubaix said some Chinese riders already have come to France to practice race-riding skills in Chantilly, and some trainers also will be invited to learn from French professionals while serving as assistants. French breeders and others also will travel to China and share insights there, he said.

Although breeders and wagering operators from around the world have been eyeing China as the last great frontier, there has been very little organized racing because pari-mutuel wagering has not been allowed.

# RACETRACK ROUND-UP

## No Rain for Thursday...

**Dancing Rain (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) was yesterday missing from the list of six-day entries unveiled for Thursday's G1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks and may not be seen until the autumn. Trainer William Haggas's wife Maureen revealed that last year's G1 Epsom Oaks, G1 Preis der Diana and G2 British Champions Fillies' and Mares' S. heroine was not firing ahead of her scheduled re-introduction. "She worked last Saturday and I think she's probably pulled a muscle as she was stiff after the work," she explained. "She hasn't come out of it and you have to come into these races 100% ready, so she'll have a bit longer which will do her no harm at all. Wherever she goes first time, she'll be ring-rusty and this is a hiccup we could have done without." Of those remaining in the 12-furlong contest, Lord Lloyd-Webber's G1 Nassau S. winner **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) is set to renew rivalry with the June 1 G1 Epsom Oaks scorer **Was (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who was third at Goodwood. Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) has been left in, but is expected to run in tomorrow's G1 Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville.

## Alpha, Fast Falcon Turn in Final Travers Works...

Godolphin Stable's **Alpha** (Bernardini), winner of the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga July 28, turned in his final workout for the Aug. 25 GI Travers S. Friday over the main track, covering four furlongs in :48.91. "He worked well," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "I had him galloping out in 1:01 4/5. Officially I think they said 1:02 1/5, but he went great and all systems are go. Saturday is normally the day we work, but last week we worked Thursday because of the weather, and there's a chance of rain again today. The track had some moisture in it, but he handled it well." Trainer Nick Zito also sent out Travers contender **Fast Falcon** (Awesome Again) for a five-furlong work in 1:00.54. Second in the GII Dwyer S. at Belmont Park June 30, the Richard Pell-owned colt was seventh last out in the Jim Dandy. Zito said after the work that Fast Falcon would very likely be entered in the Travers. "He worked super and galloped out strong," Zito said. "I just want to call Richard Pell and make sure we're on the same page, but I'm fine with it. He's going to be a longshot, which I like." Zito said the colt could have excuses for his dismal performance in the Jim Dandy. "It was a slow pace, and I don't think he liked it," the trainer explained. "He wasn't himself." Jockey Junior Alvarado was aboard for the work, and will ride Fast Falcon in the Travers, Zito confirmed.





## WRITERS UP

### *Proctor in the Spotlight at Del Mar...*

Each summer, California's premier boutique meet at Del Mar Racetrack provides those participating in racing an opportunity to show their true worth at the highest level of competition. The spotlight is on the leader board, and the numbers don't lie; when it comes to consistency of success, no trainer has had a better meeting so far this year at Del Mar than Tom Proctor.

Among the top 10 trainers by earnings at the current meet, Proctor ranks as the leader by win percentage (38% as of Aug. 17) and in the money percentage (63%, tied with Peter Miller). From 16 starts, his stable has recorded six wins, one second-place finish and three thirds, for earnings of over \$360,000--good enough for seventh in the standings.

From his satellite at Arlington Park, Proctor will start Glen Hill Farm's Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro) in today's GI Beverly D. S. The 4-year-old filly has won seven of her 13 races under Proctor's

care, including three graded stakes wins. She goes into the Beverly D. on the merit of back-to-back wins in the June 2 GII Nassau S. and July 8 GII Dance Smartly S., both at Woodbine Racetrack.

Proctor's excellent strike rate would appear to be the result of an intricately laid plan. The 56-year-old veteran trainer insists, however, that is not the case.

"I prepare horses, and when horses are ready, they're ready," Proctor explained. "Rather than focusing on one race, I focus on a career. It's just that they all came together at this meet."

"Maybe with experience I kind of understand what can compete where," he added. "It's nice to have a little success, and we've had some nice surprises. We've won six races by a total of a length and a half, so luck's played a big part in it."

Experience, luck and sheer talent have played key roles in shaping an admirable career for Proctor. The son of the late great trainer Willard L. Proctor, the younger Proctor immersed himself in the horse business at a young age. He grew up working on his family's farm in Gilman, Texas, and spent summers at the racetrack with his father. Proctor knew he wanted to train Thoroughbreds at a young age, and he took out his trainer's license in 1978. Success was almost immediate. Later that year, he recorded his first stakes win, incidentally, at Del Mar, with the 2-year-old I'm Smokin in the Graduation S.

It would be impossible to become too immersed in the Tom Proctor story without stumbling across Leonard Lavin and his grandson Craig Bernick of Glen Hill Farm in Ocala, Florida. The relationship between the Lavins and the Proctors dates back to 1967, when Willard Proctor began to train for Lavin after he acquired his first racehorses. The relationship evolved into a full blown family affair when Willard's brother Alan began managing Glen Hill's breeding operation. Today, Tom's brother "Hap" holds that role.

In the mid 80s, Proctor took a four-year hiatus from training in California to work at Glen Hill Farm, and it proved to be a move that shaped the rest of his career, including his relationship with Bernick, who is now the primary face of Glen Hill.

"I went down there to run the farm, but my uncle never would retire," Proctor mused. "Craig was a young boy then and I always took time to explain things to Craig and have fun with him. We've always had a good relationship, he's always been respectful of me and my brother and vice versa. It's been a good relationship. I don't think anyone's strong handed at any time. I think everybody has mostly the same philosophy about racing and horses."

That shared philosophy has resulted in the successful campaigns of horses like One Dreamer (Relaunch), winner of the 1994 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff; and Banned (Kitten's Joy), a multiple graded stakes winner on the turf in 2011, who sadly was euthanized after sustaining a fatal injury in training later that year.

"It's nice because I go back six or seven generations with some of these horses," Proctor said. "I think you get to know what the family can do, you have to have an open mind. There's always dissections to everything. Look how handsome I am, then you have my brother," he laughed.

Proctor noted that one of his key training philosophies involves patience and treating his horses as naturally as possible. Strong relationships with owner/breeders like Glen Hill and Barbara Hunter, owner of multiple graded stakes winning half-sisters Keertana (Johar) and Snow Top Mountain (Najran), have helped him maintain that approach.

"It's all about listening to the horse and doing what's right for the horse," he explained. "I'm not knocking how people run their businesses, I'm only doing what I do, and that's taking care of a horse. I'm not very good at medicating or using one of any kind of veterinary practices to get horses to races. I'm better off, and I'm lucky to be in this situation, that we can give them time and try to do the best we can that way. My brother is very key in the operation at Glen Hill, and also some other horses I send down there to him. If we have a horse with an injury we're not going to tape him up, we're going to send him home and let him get better."



Proctor, who today trains around 80 horses between Kentucky, Chicago and California, was quick to note that he has taken after his father in terms of horsemanship, but as for the way he runs his business, he has written his own story.

“A lot of things my dad did as a trainer were spot on,” he remarked. “I have actually come back more to that in training, but I’ve tried to be a little more open-minded in the way I run my business. My dad would never do what I’m doing, as far as having horses in two or three places. Everybody says your dad would be proud of you, I say he’d probably cuss at me. He wouldn’t like that, and there are some down sides to it. I think you have to work especially hard at trying to stay in touch with the horses. In some ways, it helps because you get away from the horse for a week and when you come back, you see how they’ve changed or how they’re progressing. I’m not saying it’s great, but that’s the good part about it. I try to hire the best assistants I can, and I have four really good assistants. I think if you’re going to run an 80-100 horse stable, you better have good people with you.”

After almost 34 years of training, and a lifetime in racing, Proctor says the thrill of winning is just as great today as it was back then. He has enjoyed graded

stakes success in recent years with horses like Banned, who won the GII American Turf S., the GII Jefferson Cup S. and the GII Del Mar Derby; Keertana, who in addition to winning five graded races is also a millionaire and placed in the 2010 GI Breeders’ Cup Filly & Mare Turf; and Marketing Mix, who is regarded as one of the top turf females in America. The

conditioner is also well-aware that the industry that has brought him so much enjoyment is facing significant trouble.

“What worries me about racing is that some of the people like Jimmy Kilroe, Kenny Noe, Tommy Trotter, and Bobby Umphrey, those guys we’re never going to replace, and they were great people,” he explained. “Some of our executives now seem to be distanced from racing.”

While Proctor is “anti-medication as much as anybody,” he has his own ideas about how medications could be managed in racing.

“I think they ought to weight medication,” he suggested. “They ought to have some kind of deal of three pounds for anti-inflammatories and three pounds for Lasix. If you don’t need them, you don’t run on them, and the cream will rise to the top. It would be the closest thing to making everyone happy. Let me tell you, if I’m running in a Grade I and I’ve got a horse that doesn’t bleed, and he doesn’t need any bute or any anti-inflammatories, I wouldn’t run him on it. I’d take the six pounds. Now the poor guy down the street who’s struggling, he’s got a five-horse stable and all five bleed, we’re not putting him out of business, either. I haven’t heard any of our people say anything like that, but I’m all for discussion, and I’ve been wrong as much as anybody. I believe there are people that make mistakes. I don’t want to punish people that make mistakes, I want to punish the cheaters. I think everybody agrees with that.”

Everyone would also agree that this summer, Proctor has written a memorable chapter into the story of his training career. The next step, he hopes, will be Grade I glory with Marketing Mix.

“[The Beverly D.] kind of fits in with her plan, where she ran the couple races in Canada and then we could ship back to our base [at Arlington] and run for a lot of money in a race that seems to fit her,” Proctor explained. “There’s a lot of good horses going in there, though. I doubt she’ll be running in the same company she’s run in her last few races. She’ll have to step up.”

If Marketing Mix runs to the form her stable has been achieving as of late, she could be stepping right into the winner’s circle. *-Kelsey Riley*

We have given our two TDN crack handicappers, Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack, a mythical \$1000 bankroll and told them they can bet no more than 5% of that on any given day at Saratoga on a straight win bet. **DiDonato: Friday - Leaping Lady** chased the pace before fading badly in the ninth. One race earlier, alternate Crafty Push scored at 6-1. For once, I was rooting for a late off-the-turf announcement.

**Saturday - Race 2 - Msw, 2yo, 1 1/16mT - #5 Elmutahid (8-1)**

Shadwell homebred **Elmutahid** was unveiled by trainer Kieran McLaughlin going seven panels over the Belmont sod July 15, but was sandwiched at the start and dropped back. He got a bit headstrong down the backstretch and into the turn, and faded to seventh after pulling himself into contention. [Lot 216](#), the multiple stakes-winning 5-year-old mare Ravenous Lass (Aus) (Stratum {Aus}), was scooped up by J Leek; while unraced Swoosh (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) ([lot 223](#)) went to Danny O'Brien Racing. "A very satisfying two days for us and our vendors with an increase in gross of over A\$540,000 on Friday compared with the same day last year and an overall clearance rate of 90% for the entire sale," said Inglis Melbourne Director Peter Heagney.
