SENSE OF ABANDON

Despite not charting an entirely straight course when winning Royal Ascot's G2 Norfolk S. over five furlongs June 21 and the G2 Prix Robert Papin over a half-furlong further at Maisons-Laffitte last time July 22, the ability of **Reckless Abandon (GB)** (Exchange Rate) was not open to question entering yesterday's G1 Prix Morny at Deauville.

Sent to the lead from the outset and gradually across to the stand's side rail by Gerald Mosse, the 7-5 favorite had all rivals off the bridle at the quarter pole and stayed straight and true as he was pushed out to score by 3/4 of a length from **George Vancouver** (Henrythenavigator). "Reckless Abandon is a very talented horse who hasn't stopped improving since we've had him," commented trainer Clive Cox. "He has put on 17 kilograms since his first race, we have been going step-by-step with him and he is now an undefeated Group 1 winner."

THERE'S SNOW STOPPING HER

Despite meeting top-class opposition off a nine-month break, Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) showed all her familiar sparkle to regain the winning thread in yesterday's G1 Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville. Badly injured after the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup at Kyoto in November, the homebred had been given some days away in preparation for her comeback, but trainer Ed Dunlop had expected her to need this reappearance. Settled towards the rear by Ryan Moore early, the 4-1 shot battled to the front with 75 meters remaining and held on to score by 3/4 of a length from **Izzi Top (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}).

"She had a serious tendon injury in Japan and I never thought she'd make it back, so this was amazing," her conditioner said. "She only came back to my yard two months ago and Ryan has been very helpful in getting her ready. I think this is the highlight of my career, to win this today with a 5-year-old I thought was finished."

THE STARS ARE OUT AT DEAUVILLE

Fresh from topping day one's sheets at Argana's August Yearling Sale, consignors Ecurie des Monceaux were front and center once again yesterday as hip [120](#), the last of seven offerings by Sea the Stars (Ire) in the catalogue, led the way at €1.2 million. Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International Agency signed the docket for the February-foaled colt, who is the first foal out of the 2009 G1 Prix Jean Romanet victress Alpine Rose (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}). The dam captured that contest in race-record time and is herself a full-sister to Jean-Luc Lagardere's proven Pattern-race performers Fragrant Mix (Ire) and Fracassant (Ire). The sale of the grey yearling, whose extended family includes the 2006 G1 Queensland Oaks winner Allow (Aus) (Rahy) and the high-class Spring Oak (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}), was further justification of the decision by Charles Henri de Moussac, Lady Chryss O'Reilly and Lucien Urano to buy Alpine Rose out of His Highness the Aga Khan's prized draft at this venue's 2008 December Breeding Stock Sale for €550,000. "We really wanted this colt," commented de Watrigant after outlasting David Redvers, John Ferguson and Angus Gold for the star turn bought for Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad bin Khalifa Al-Thani. "He is an exceptional-looking horse who combines the quality of his sire and dam and who will be top-class. He has the pedigree to be a potential sire and passed all the examinations." **Cont. p13**

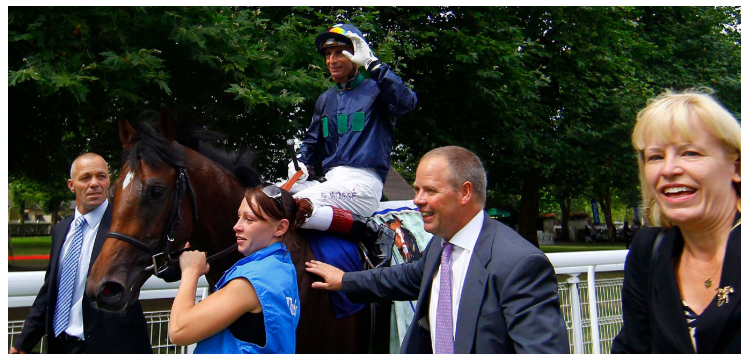

Reckless Abandon's debut over five furlongs at Doncaster May 19 was characterized by a show of authority despite a wayward path in the closing stages and that quirk was more exaggerated at the end of the June 21 G2 Norfolk S. Despite hanging left in that Royal Ascot contest, the bay never looked like relinquishing his advantage and his drifting had become just a minor jink when in control of the G2 Prix Robert Papin last time July 22.

Showing early dash to lead from the outset, he was skillfully guided to the rail by Gerald Mosse to avoid a repeat of his tendency to veer left and was kept honest by the speedy Penny's Picnic (Ire) (Kheleyf) on his outer. Shrugging off that rival passing halfway, he surged to a clear advantage inside the final quarter and by the time the Ballydoyle duo appeared on his outer he had inflicted the damage. "He started off at five furlongs, then went to 5 1/2 furlongs for the Prix Robert Papin and today was his first try at six," trainer Clive Cox explained. "Gerald Mosse told me the horse won by virtue of his class, but will be even better over further, so I was delighted to hear that appraisal. His next race will probably be over seven furlongs in the [Oct. 13] G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. We have had a tremendous run of success over the last two weeks, including the win in Saturday's [G2 Hungerford with Lethal Force (Ire)], so I am very happy for my owners and the whole team back at home." George Vancouver and Parliament Square (Ire) stayed on from off the pace to complete the trifecta and their trainer Aidan O'Brien said, "I'm delighted with my two horses, although the winner looks a really nice horse. They probably still lack a bit of experience and are still a little babyish. They will probably want to go further in the future."

Snow Fairy lacked the early pizzazz of the former Ed Dunlop legend Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), but her Epsom Oaks success on her eighth start proved just the beginning of her own success story. Following up by eight lengths in the Irish equivalent, she rounded off her sophomore campaign with purse-busting wins in two of the Far East's boutique contests, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup and G1 Hong Kong Cup. While it took her three runs to click back into place last term, she shook up So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) when a half-length second in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at Leopardstown and followed that with third placings in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and Ascot's G1 Champion S. before returning to win again at Kyoto. This cast was made up of four opposing Group 1 winners of serious merit and all had a race-fitness advantage over her, but none could match Snow Fairy's extra final gear, which has proven so decisive on her travels throughout the last two years.

"We'll take her back home now and see how she is, but she is in the [Sept. 8 G1] Irish Champion and it was always in our minds to go back there if we could, as she was second last year," Dunlop said. "That is probably the plan at the moment, but we'll have to assess her." John Gosden said of the runner-up Izzi Top, who attempted to match the winner's acceleration from behind, but who lacked the final surge to make more of a battle of it, "She's run a great race and the other is a top-class filly whose stamina told in the end. The plan is to freshen her up for a tilt at the [Oct. 7] G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp." Galikova (Fr) (Anabaa) appeared to have the run of the race tracking her pacemaker Tempura (Ger) (Cape Cross {Ire}), but was one-paced from the top of the home straight and plugged on into third late on having looked likely to drop back.

Despite being trained at Ballydoyle at three, Joshua Tree did not race in Ireland and proved he relished traveling overseas when annexing the 2010 GI Canadian International. After a spell in Doha early last year, he returned to Europe to be third in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in September and second in the latest renewal of the Woodbine feature. Back in the Middle East for Meydan's carnival, the bay gave a strong signal with a late charge when second in the two-mile G3 Dubai Gold Cup on World Cup night that he was ready for a stiffer stamina test now. Making little impact under hold-up tactics on his next two starts, he benefitted from positive tactics when ploughing a lone furrow before succumbing only to Fiorente (Ire) (Monsoon {Ger}) in the G2 Princess of Wales's S. over 12 furlongs at Newmarket last time July 12. Allowed to bowl along again here by Ryan Moore, he traveled with enthusiasm and was well-placed as the inevitable challenges came at the top of the straight in a finish typical of these French staying contests. Hanging tough out in front as Brigantin and Shahwardi attacked on either side, he hit the line strong as the field bunched in his wake. "He's so consistent and amazingly tough," trainer Marco Botti commented during a weekend when his stable's Jakkalberry (Ity) (Storming Home {GB}) had won the American St. Leger. "He's been everywhere around the world and still enjoys his racing. Ryan said he loves dictating the pace like that and every time they came he would pick up. He's got lots of options, but the trip to Melbourne is too far for him really so we might well take him back to Canada." American (Dynaformer) ran out of puff late on in sixth on his first start back for the Alain de Royer-Dupre stable, but his trainer is still set on returning to Flemington for a third run in the Nov. 6 G1 Melbourne Cup in which he was fourth when defending his title 12 months ago. "I am very happy with that, as the race came two weeks too soon," he explained. "He came back to me late, with his winter coat so he needed more time to be ready and blew up. He'll be prepared for quarantine now."

Forte dei Marmi, still looking for the first stakes victory of his career, took a Keeneland turf allowance in April before running third in the May 19 GII Dixie S. at Pimlico and was coming off a sixth-place effort in the June 16 Colonial Turf Cup. The bay gelding angled to the rail and settled near the back of the pack, trailing the field through pedestrian splits and was still last after a mile in 1:39.37. Fanned widest at midstretch, Forte dei Marmi unleashed a furious late rally to get up in the final strides to defeat pacesetting Stormy Lord. "He's a horse that likes to take his time, but he was very relaxed back there," said winning rider Alex Solis. "At the top of the stretch, I thought it was time to go. I got him out and he did his thing. The way he was moving, I thought I had a good chance to get him."

Stephanie's Kitten won last year's GI Darley Alcibiades S. over Keeneland's Polytrack before ending her juvenile campaign with a victory in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. She opened her sophomore campaign with a third-place effort in the Apr. 7 GI Ashland S. and returned to the winner's circle with a win in the May 4 Edgewood S. over the Churchill lawn. The bay filly lacked running room in the final furlong when fourth, beaten only a half-length, in the July 25 GII Lake George S. Stephanie's Kitten let the early pace go and saved ground along the rail while racing in mid-pack and inched closer through three-quarters in 1:13.25. She was once again forced to wait for running room in deep stretch, but this time was able to find a seam between foes and surged to the lead in the final strides. "I was on the rail the whole way," commented winning rider John Velazquez. "That's where I broke, and we planned to stay there to save the best ground we could, and I stayed there until the three-sixteenths pole and worked my way out until I finally got out at the eighth pole. When I asked, she responded right away. It was a great effort by her and an incredible last eighth."

"I know she has it in her, and as soon as I pulled her out and hit her with the whip, she responded right away, so I was very impressed at the way she did it." As for what is next for Stephanie's Kitten, winning trainer Wayne Catalano said, "I think [we'll go] to the [Oct. 13 GI] Queen Elizabeth II and the Breeders' Cup. I'll talk to Mr. [Ken] Ramsey. We mapped out a little plan; hopefully it all works out."

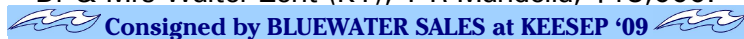

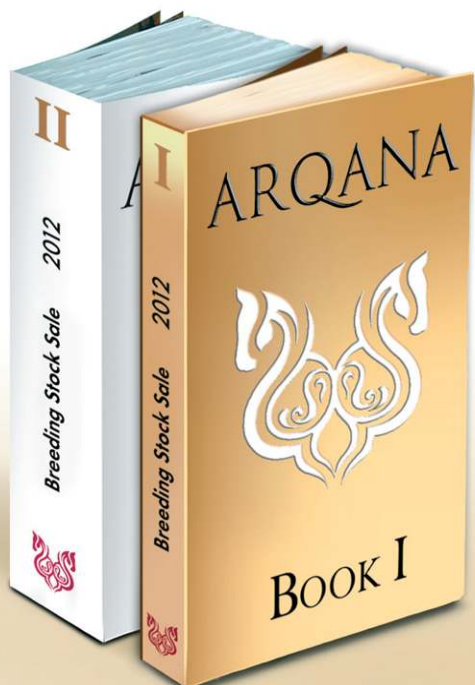

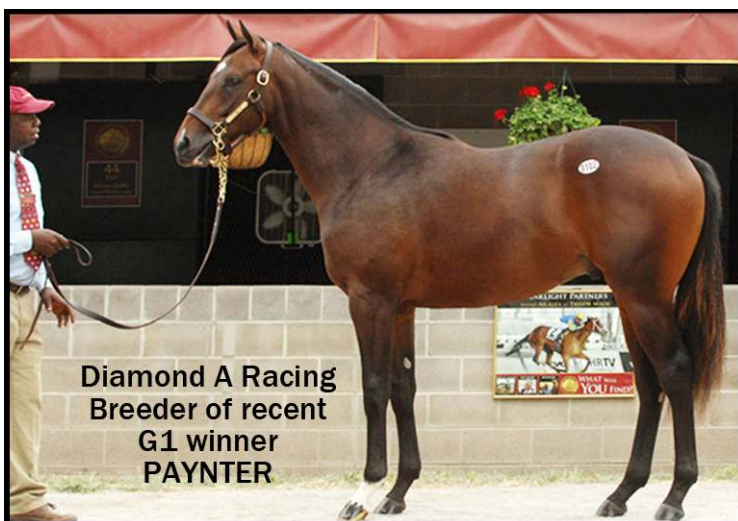

"I was a little worried he went off a little fast, but for the most part it was a very good work. It looks like he's cooling out happy."

Stealcas (Lawyer Ron), third in the Haskell, worked five furlongs in 1:00.74. "He looked really slow," admitted Norm Casse, son and assistant to trainer Mark Casse. "Then we saw the time and how well he went, and that's usually a good indication that they worked really well. He looked like he was just going easy, and that was the plan."

Richard's Kid Sold, Transferred to O'Neill...

Two-time GI Pacific Classic winner **Richard's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid) has been sold privately and has been transferred from the barn of trainer Bob Baffert to Doug O'Neill. The new ownership group is led by Paul Sr., Paul Jr., and Christopher Boghossian's Triple B Farms and also consists of Mark Verge of Westside Rentals, Dave Kenny, Steve Keh and Danny Kramer. Richard's Kid won the 2009 Pacific Classic for Arnold Zetcher and the 2010 renewal for Zabeel Racing International before being campaigned in Dubai last season. In three starts since returning to the Baffert barn, the 7-year-old won the June 8 Prove It S., was second in the July 7 GI Hollywood Gold Cup and won the July 27 Gill Cougar II H. "The plan is to run him in the [Aug. 26] Pacific Classic, then look at our options concerning the Breeders' Cup," explained Leandro Mora, deputizing for the suspended O'Neill. "We'll have to see what happens with possibilities and there could be several ways to go with this horse. Then, if we can keep him sound and happy, we'd look at running in the G1 Dubai World Cup."

Surgery for Zo Impressive...

Zo Impressive (Hard Spun), who suffered a condylar fracture in her right front leg while running fourth in Saturday's GI Alabama S., will be sent to Rood and Riddle Equine Center in Lexington sometime this week to undergo surgery. "She's actually getting around the stall pretty good," trainer Tom Albertrani said of the GI Mother Goose S. winner. "She's just in a pressure bandage right now. It's amazing. She had a good night. She's standing square in her stall and she's got her head out. She doesn't seem stressed out at all about it. We'll ship her to Kentucky in the next couple of days. She's got a condylar fracture, but fortunately it didn't go spiraling up the leg. It kind of just displaced right off the bottom. We'll see how surgery goes and go from there."

Letters TO THE EDITOR

Jocelyn de Moubray's Op-Ed in Friday's *TDN* ([click here](#)) was a refreshingly objective take on the U.S. Thoroughbred breeding industry. It's interesting that it took a European bloodstock expert to bring some much-needed perspective to counter the unreasoned and unfounded arguments against American-bred horses that American breeders have been surprisingly reluctant to refute.

I would like to expand just a little on the facts included in de Moubray's Op-Ed. While he points out that exports to Europe declined 40% between 2001 and 2011, I think it is notable that there was a significant spike in European exports during the decade, before the global economy crisis hit. According to The Jockey Club statistics, exports dropped 21.6% between 2001 and 2003, but then took a decided upswing, rising 54.3% between 2003 and 2007 to a decade high of 1,679. Then there was a worldwide financial meltdown, and our export market took a corresponding hit, declining 51.7% between 2007 and 2011.

Let's hope the U.S. breeding industry, and the world's economy, rebounds in the next decade.

“He also seems to have a lovely temperament and we saw him at the stud a month and a half ago, and three or four times after, and liked him a little bit more every time,” Nicolas de Watrigant continued. “We thought he'd go for around a million, so we had to play it by ear and we finally got him, and we're absolutely delighted.”

Consignor Henri Bozo added, “This colt was offered by a partnership between Charles Henri de Moussac, Lady Chrissy O'Reilly and Lucien Urano, who bought the dam here at the December Sale. We decided on Sea the Stars and he has produced a lovely colt with an exceptional temperament.”

De Moussac, who also sold three fillies for a combined price of €800,000, was on hand to give his own verdict. “The market is really very selective and they are either selling well or we are having to buy back,” he said. “You need horses with a good physique, a perfect vet file, and if they have a pedigree on top, they sell well. The top of the market is very good and all the major buyers are concentrated on this, so it makes it difficult for the rest.”

Montjeu Magic...

The mass appeal of Montjeu (Ire) will be felt for a while after his untimely death, and yesterday's action saw two of his sons comes to the fore in late afternoon. The first, from the quality-rich Monceaux draft, was consigned as hip [142](#) and is the first foal out of a half-sister to one of the States' top turf performers of recent times in English Channel (Smart Strike).

Descending from Committed, his page includes the fellow turf specialist Hap and the 1996 GI Santa Ana H. heroine Pharma (Theatrical {Ire}). Demi O'Byrne paid €650,000 for the March-foaled bay and was back later for Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu's hip [166](#), a full-brother to his previous

€750,000 purchase Recital (Fr). While that Aidan O'Brien-trained colt never quite matched the potential he flaunted when winning the

G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud at two, he nevertheless added the G2 Derrinstown Sud Derby Trial to his tally at three. Another of his full-siblings was the gelded 2006 G1 Prix Ganay winner Corre Caminos (Fr), while he is a half to four-times Pattern-race scorer

Racinger (Fr) (Spectrum {Ire}). The dark grey was the subject of a protracted bidding battle, but O'Byrne prevailed at €520,000. Consignor Alette Forien was expecting the outcome.

“He is a very nice colt, this is a good sale and he is a full-brother to two Group 1 winners, so it was not a surprise,” she commented. “The market has highs and lows and I feel that people are ready to spend money when a horse has everything.”

During the session, O'Byrne had led an almost one-man domination of the high-end of the market when accounting for four of the top seven yearling purchases. They included the €380,000 purchase from the Haras du Mezeray draft. Hip [162](#), the top-priced filly of the day by Fastnet Rock (Aus), is out of the 1993 G1 Fillies' Mile runner-up Dance To the Top (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and is therefore a half-sister to the dual group scorer and 2010 G1 Dubai Duty Free runner-up Bankable (Ire) (Medicean {GB}) and Group 3 winner Cheshire (GB) (Warning {GB}). Also on his list was hip [146](#), a daughter of Galileo (Ire) from the draft of Haras des Capucines. The March-foaled bay is a half-sister to Diabolical (Artax), whose wins came in the 2007 GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. and GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup Sprint and following year's G3 Mahab Al Shimaal. Also placed four times at the highest level, he shares his second dam--the multiple graded-stakes scorer Plenty of Grace (Roberto)--with this March-foaled bay who was secured for €260,000. O'Byrne also paid €220,000 for another daughter of Galileo consigned by Mezeray. Hip [157](#) is out of the graded-stakes scorer Chiming (Ire) (Danehill) and represents the potent cross of Frankel (GB) and last year's champion 2-year-old filly Maybe (Ire).

A Graceful Exit...

As the curtain prepared to close on the day's trading, the very last lot through the ring was one destined to keep the right people in attendance in Haras de la Perelle's daughter of the 2003 G3 Prestige S. scorer Gracefully (Ire) (Orpen). Already the dam of last month's G1 Falmouth S. winner Giofra (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who was only sixth in yesterday's G1 Prix Jean Romanet, her April-foaled bay by Shamardal consigned as hip [186](#)

is named Graciously (GB) and it was Agence FIPS who had the final say with a bid of €280,000. That sale came swiftly after another high-profile yearling to go under the hammer in Haras d'Etreham's hip [180](#), a daughter of New Approach (Ire) from the immediate family of the sires Showcasing (GB) and Camacho (GB). John Ferguson signed the docket for the March-foaled bay, who was one of a trio that he managed to secure during the evening. **Cont. p14**

Al-Thani Extends His Influence...

Anna and Etienne Drion's Coulonces Consignment was the day's first to break through the €200,000 barrier and did so within the first hour when hip [107](#), a Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt, was knocked down to Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Thani's Al Shahania Stud for €220,000. Making a significant leap on the 50,000gns he cost Cormac McCormack at last term's Tattersalls December Sale, the March-foaled chestnut's page received timely recent boosts when his full-brother Probably (Ire) annexed the G2 Railway S. at the Curragh in June. Another close relation in Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) also added a second G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest to her burgeoning portfolio two weeks ago. "He is just a great-looking colt with a great back and is a good walker," commented Thierry Delege, who did the bidding on Al-Thani's behalf. "He also has a good update, and I think he'll stay in France to be trained." No sooner had their hip 107 raised the mood, the same draft was again on the mark when hip [109](#), a Teofilo (Ire) colt offered on behalf of Team Hogdala, sold to trainer Urs Suter for €260,000. The Coulonces-Hogdala axis has prior form at this fixture, having sold the subsequent G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains runner-up and G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre) to Jean-Claude Rouget for €100,000 at the 2007 renewal. Suter said of his purchase, "He has been bought for Mrs Statelmann, a long-time client of ours who is also Swiss and I'm delighted we got him. He has a great look and attitude and I will train him in Chantilly."

More From Mandore...

Not content with stealing the show when securing the day's session topper, Nicolas de Watrigant also bagged a pair of fillies through his Mandore International Agency for €200,000 apiece. The first of those was hip [136](#), a Shamardal filly offered by Haras d'Etreham on behalf of Haras du Berlais. She is out of the 2007 G3 Prix Andre Baboin victress Bal de la Rose (Ire) (Cadeux Genereux {GB}), herself a half-sister to the 2010 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club victor Lope de Vega (Ire), also by Shamardal. He was on the mark again immediately when snapping up Haras du Mezeray's hip [137](#), a February-foaled Zamindar filly whose dam is the 2008 Listed Prix la Fleche runner-up Bargouzine (Stravinsky). The bay hails from a Grade I-laden Argentinian family which includes the juvenile champion Batallosa (Arg) (Southern Halo). "That is a nice price for such nice fillies, especially great-looking ones with great pedigrees like them. The relative of Lope de Vega has been bought for Mrs. Tsui and will be trained by John Oxx, so hopefully she'll be a good filly on the track before being bred to Sea the Stars. The Zamindar has been bought for Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad bin Khalifa Al-Thani and she is just a gorgeous-looking filly who is the first foal out of a precocious dam. She looks like she'll be an early type and she will be trained in France."

St Lawrence Leaves No Gap...

Agent Oliver St Lawrence was to the fore during the first day's trading when picking up a Mount Nelson (GB) colt for €140,000 and he was on the mark again yesterday when winning the battle for hip [110](#), a Cape Cross (Ire) colt, with a bid of €230,000. Offered by Eric Puerari and Michel Zerolo's Haras des Capucines, the February-foaled bay is a half-brother to last term's GI Diana S. victress Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) and was purchased for Fawzi Nass. Penny's Picnic (Ire) (Kheleyf) has been the standard-bearer for his sire this term, winning June's Listed Prix La Fleche at Maisons-Laffitte and running fourth behind Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) in last month's G2 Prix Robert Papin back at that same track. Unable to make an impression when 10th behind that hitherto unbeaten rival in yesterday's G1 Prix Morny at the local track, his half-sister offered by Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu as hip [112](#) made a mark of her own when selling to British agent Hugo Lascelles for €190,000. The February-foaled dark bay is a direct descendant of the 1979 British champion juvenile filly and the following season's G1 Prix de Diane victress Mrs. Penny (Great Nephew {GB}). "I loved this filly," Lascelles said. "She is very racy and walked extremely well. She looks very speedy and precocious and that's what I look for at this sale--early-type 2-year-olds to go to England to be trained." The Select Session 1 ended with an average of €157,565, which was up by 8% on 2011, while the median of €110,000 fell by 4% on its equivalent. Off a bit awkwardly, the Florida invader was strangled back off a pace that never really developed (maybe because he was supposed to be involved in it?). He tried to pull himself closer on the turn, but was instead strangled back and buried in between horses. Dropped all the way out of it to last at the head of the lane, Miami Cat flew home on the far outside to be beaten a length and a neck in fourth.

Monday - Race 1 - Msw, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m - #3 After the Bell (8-1)
The top four favorites (two are coupled) in this six-betting-interest affair have a combined record of 39-0-12-9. Yuck. **After the Bell**, however, still has plenty of upside. The Darley homebred was devoid of speed when unveiled going seven panels at Belmont May 19, dropping far out of it after a slow break before showing some late interest to cut his losing margin to 12 1/2 lengths while checking in seventh. It seemed visually like more than just a clunk-up--he was doing some actual running--and three horses from that heat, including two who finished behind him, returned to break their maidens next out. More distance certainly helps After the Bell, as his pedigree is exceptional for 1 1/8 miles. By excellent stamina influence Empire Maker, the dark bay is out of GI Ashland S. winner and GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up Rings a Chime (Metfield), making him a full-brother to MGISW router Country Star. If that's not a nine-furlong pedigree, I don't know what is. I'm still a bit concerned that After the Bell may find himself too far out of it, as the works since his debut are incredibly slow, but that's how all Tom Albertrani horses work, and I'd think that After the Bell would be adding blinkers here if his lack of speed was that much of an issue. **Play:** \$25 Win. **Alternate 1:** Race 8 - \$40 Win on #8 Geisha Gal (Turf Only). **Alternate 2:** Race 2 - \$10 Win on #7 Good Law.

DiDonato Bankroll: \$800 - Record: 24-2-4-4

Sherack: Sunday - Better Lucky sat the trip in fourth and had every chance in the stretch, but was simply not good enough when the real running began in the Lake Placid.

Monday - Race 8 - Msw, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8mT - #3 Opalite (15-1)
Opalite caught my attention with a strong third at 12-1 going 1 3/16 miles last out at the Spa July 29, and can make some noise at a big price in this one. Hard held in eighth that day through a half mile in :48.56 and six furlongs in 1:13.90, Opalite hit the gas with a good four-wide move on the turn for home and kept on coming in the stretch to finish within 3 1/4 lengths of the impressive winner Riolama. The bay has continued to improve since receiving a freshening in the spring and switching to turf in her last two, and should save all the ground with an inside draw here. Deep closer should have more than enough pace to run at to make an impact and cutting back to 1 1/8 miles should be right in her wheelhouse. **Play:** \$14 Win (Turf Only).
