**NO DOUBT: FRANKEL GOES INTERNATIONAL**

Despite never having raced beyond one mile, **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) didn't give connections, nor his burgeoning fan club, a moment's worry when streaking to yet another mighty impressive triumph in Wednesday's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. Forty years after the great Brigadier Gerard (GB) met with his only career defeat on the Knavesmire, Juddmonte's world champion avoided

the same fate with a stunning seven-length victory over **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), who edged **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) by a nose, to extend his winning streak to 13, and his aggregate winning margin to 76 lengths, in the track's Ebor Festival feature. Slowest from the gate and slotting into seventh behind a fast early tempo, the 1-10 favorite cruised effortlessly to the fore on the bridle entering the final quarter mile and jockey Tom Queally's only work was to gather the reins twice for the wonder horse to scoot clear into a tunnel of rapturous

applause from the 20,000-strong crowd. He was greeted by emotional scenes in the winner's circle, too, where trainer Sir Henry Cecil was on hand--after further treatment for his ongoing illness--to welcome back his unbeaten protege. "That was great for Yorkshire, as the crowd is very supportive of racing, and they deserved to see him," whispered a visibly frail Cecil. "It makes me feel 20 years better." **Cont. p3**

**HANSEN INJURED, LIKELY RETIRED**

The leading sophomore ranks continue to thin. Dr. Kendall Hansen and Skychai Racing's champion **Hansen** (Tapit--Stormy Sunday, by Sir Cat) was removed from consideration from Saturday's G1 Travers S. at Saratoga, and his racing career is in jeopardy after a tendon problem was discovered.

"He had some inflammation in his left front leg this morning and is not running," trainer Mike Maker said in a release.

Dr. Hansen, who also bred the speedy grey, later spoke to HRTV about the colt's initial diagnosis.

"We're not sure when it happened, but there was some swelling this morning, and Mike called me at about 8 a.m.," he told HRTV. "The ultrasound showed about 25-30% tear. I'm heartbroken and barely functioning. I want to get a couple more opinions from other vets, and to do a little more research into the stem-cell and platelet technology." **Cont. p11**

Frankel's ongoing domination of Britain's miling scene had seen him equal Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill)'s European record of seven straight Group 1 scores with victory in the Aug. 1 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood last time, and he claimed that record outright with yet another imperious performance stepped up to an

extended 10 furlongs for the first time here.

Caught blinking as the gates were flung open, he was swiftly settled into seventh by Tom Queally as Ballydoyle's rabbit contingent of Robin Hood (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Windsor Palace (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) usurped usual

pacemaker and 3/4-brother Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells) for the lead, although the latter was ideally placed as a reference point in third for much of the contest. The pace was strong and it was carried through into the half-mile straight where the protagonists began to close on the waning leaders. Queally sat motionless as Frankel made a beeline for the stands' side rail while cruising onto the heels of the front rank with three furlongs remaining. **Cont. p4**

The powerful bay was still hard on the steel entering the final quarter mile and little more than a quick check of the steering gear was sufficient encouragement from the saddle for him to bound clear of toiling rivals yet again. "I suspected they would go a good gallop, so we had our plan in place," explained Queally. "[Jockey] Eddie [Ahern] did a good job on Bullet Train and it all panned out nicely. I gave them enough of a lead for the pace they were going, he won ever so well and I'm delighted to be part of it. He's certainly as good over 10 furlongs as he is over a mile, and it was a fantastic training performance by Sir Henry." The latter sentiment was echoed by Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe, who added, "That was absolutely fantastic. For Sir Henry and the team to bring Frankel to York in such great shape; it is a brilliant crowd which has appreciated him, and then for the horse to perform as he did is an absolute dream. We're all living the dream."

**Frankel an Arc Possible?**

Britain's bookmakers were quick to react to Frankel's scintillating triumph in his first try at beyond one mile, and quote turfdom's freak at a general 1-4 for the 12-furlong G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7. While that may prove to be the usual money-gathering public relations exercise, there remains a slim possibility the 4-year-old homebred could make the line-up for Europe's end-of-season championship at the Bois de Boulogne track, according to connections. "He is not entered in the Arc as [Sir] Henry [Cecil] didn't want him in the race and he'd have to be supplemented in any case," commented Teddy Grimthorpe. "There will obviously be discussion and we'll have to see. The original plan was to go for either the G1 Champion S. or G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot [Oct. 20], but we'll have to see how he comes out of this race first." Owner Prince Khalid Abdullah added, "I will discuss things with Henry, and it depends on what he wants to do. I didn't think a mile and a quarter was a problem, but further than that I'm not sure."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

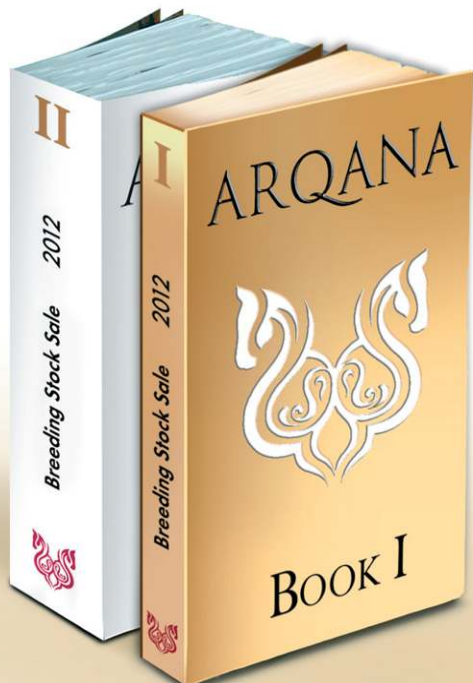
Full-brother Lucarno used this trial before claiming glory at the Town Moor track five years ago, and George Strawbridge's homebred provided ample evidence of the battling qualities which will be required there with a game front-running performance here.

Thought Worthy bagged a Newcastle maiden in his only juvenile go last October, but was caught out by the enterprisingly ridden Imperial Monarch (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in Sandown's G3 Classic Trial on sophomore return Apr. 28. He regained the winning habit, at the expense of Frankel's brother and his now-regular foe Noble Mission (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), in a thrilling renewal of the May 19 Listed Fairway S. at Newmarket, and shaped with credit, albeit no match for Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), when fourth in the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby next time. **Cont. p6**

Dundonnell hit the board in a hot maiden at Newmarket on debut July 13 and demolished the opposition by 12 lengths and more in track-record time when shedding maiden status at Lingfield last time Aug. 4. He was steadied in rear, behind all four rivals here, before cruising upside the front rank with three

furlongs remaining. In command soon after, he required a degree of urging to compensate for a tendency to wander about in front inside the final quarter mile and was comfortably on top at the line to register a first pattern-race score. "There weren't many runners and they went slow

for the first couple of furlongs," said winning rider James Doyle. "He has a lovely big stride, he covers so much ground and has a fantastic cruising speed. He is very talented and has a lot of gears, but I found myself in front too soon. He helped me out a bit there and I'm delighted with him." Trainer Roger Charlton added, "I was really impressed with that and he took a lot of pulling up. There is a lot of speed in his pedigree, so he's not a mile-and-a-half horse. There is no rush to make a plan, but he now deserves to step up in grade. A fast-ground mile will suit him, so we'll discuss matters with Prince Khalid [Abdullah] and [Racing Manager] Teddy Grimthorpe." The winner is out of an unraced full sister to Danehill, who won his maiden at second asking at York Aug. 18, 1988. Family is the dam of a yearling full-sister to Dundonnell and foaled a colt by Proud Citizen Mar. 23.

**BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS**

**THE FUGUE CHASING KNAVESMIRE GLORY**

Since it was opened to older mares in 1991, the score in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks stands at 13-8 in favor of the sophomore brigade and that advantage looks set to widen in today's renewal with **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) taking pole position. So impressive when winning the G3 Musidora S. over an extended 10-furlong trip here May 16, Lord Lloyd-Webber's homebred was an unlucky third behind **Was (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the June 1 Epsom Oaks before finishing second on rain-softened ground in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot June 21. With conditions in her favor at Glorious Goodwood, she returned to the winner's spot in the Aug. 4 G1 Nassau S. and that form received a boost on Sunday when the runner-up Timepiece (GB) (Zamindar) ran a close-up fourth in the G1 Prix Jean Romanet. "The Fugue has been in good form since the Nassau and she goes well on the track," trainer John Gosden told *PA Sport*. "She is stepping back up in trip, but she is in good order."

“Usually when you get horses of this caliber, nobody really gives them the time off they need because they're too valuable as stallions,” Hansen added. “But he's got a lot of fans--of course, I'm the biggest one--and I'd like to see him run some more. I'm going to do my homework, but it's very likely we've seen his last race.”

The Kentuckian confirmed that there are no current stud deals in place for the Eclipse Award winner.

“Over the last year we've been approached by four or five different farms, but I never took it too seriously, since I planned to run him as a 4-year-old,” Hansen continued. “I'm not really in the game to breed horses, but it changes when you have a horse like this. So I'm going to exhaust the possibilities to see if there's a chance to keep him running, but, realistically, now's the time of year to get a horse ready to be a stallion.”

Perfect in three tries at two, including a nose win over Union Rags (Dixie Union) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Hansen won the GIII Gotham S. and was runner-up in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. before finishing unplaced in the GI Kentucky Derby. He made a successful return to action by 10 lengths in the GIII Iowa Derby June 30, but was most recently fourth as the heavy favorite in the GII West Virginia Derby Aug. 4. His current bankroll is \$1,810,805.

## MOORE BREAKS WRIST

Former British champion jockey Ryan Moore faces a spell on the sidelines after breaking his left wrist in fall from **Cresta Star (GB)** (Teofilo {Ire}) in a handicap at Warwick Tuesday evening. The rider had escaped largely unscathed in two prior spills this month, from Romeo Montague (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) at Goodwood Aug. 1 and from Havana Gold (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) at Deauville Aug. 12, and immediately misses out on a host of quality bookings at this week's York Ebor Festival. "I had my third fall in as many weeks at Warwick last night and the bad news is that I have broken my left wrist," revealed Moore. "The grass was far too long and lush, and that can always cause problems. When I went into the bend [on Cresta Star] I was never balanced, it got a bit tight and she lost her back end and slipped. It was a soft fall, but I landed on my left wrist. I went to Warwick hospital to get it looked at and the staff were very efficient. They x-rayed it, put a cast on it and I was out in no time. I won't know the full extent of the problem until I see my personal doctor in Oxford, but I'll be out for a while."

## KAVANAGH TO SPEAK AT CONFERENCE

Peruvian star **Al Qasr** (Aptitude) has been withdrawn from consideration from the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 3 after developing colic while in quarantine in Miami. The 4-year-old is recovering from emergency colic surgery performed at the University of Florida veterinary clinic in Gainesville. "We are at home devastated," said owner Fahed Mitre of Stud Soribel, speaking from Lima. Al Qasr earned an automatic berth into the Turf through the Breeders' Cup Win and You're In Challenge series by capturing the G1 Gran Premio 25 de Mayo at San Isidro Racecourse in Buenos Aires. Argentine Group 1 winner **Calidoscopio (Arg)** (Luhuk) and Peruvian champion older mare **Almudena (Per)** (Silver Planet {Arg}) are on schedule to arrive at Hollywood Park Thursday following their release from quarantine. Nine-year-old Calidoscopio will be pointed towards the GII Breeders' Cup Marathon. Almudena is likely to target the GI Zenyatta S. or GI Rodeo Drive S., both part of the "Win and You're In" series, at Santa Anita Sept. 29.

We have given our two TDN crack handicappers, Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack, a mythical \$1000 bankroll and told them they can bet no more than 5% of that on any given day at Saratoga on a straight win bet. **DiDonato: Wednesday - Just for Today** was too far back and couldn't make up any real ground in the lane. Looking like I'm going to need a miracle and going to have to take some big swings in the final week.

**Thursday - Race 6 - Msw, 2yo, 5 1/2fT, #4 Kamchatka (5-1)**

I didn't love anything on this card, to be honest, so I'll take a shot with a horse who just *has* to be better than he showed in his debut. **Kamchatka** sold for \$550,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale after breezing an eighth in :10 2/5. It was a nice enough showing--he has a high action that might be good for the turf--but the breeze and his page which, again, is decent, doesn't scream \$550,000 to me. I'm going to assume someone who knows a lot more than me about that kind of thing liked the horse for good reason. Given a 9-2 chance first out on the dirt at Churchill June 17, Kamchatka basically tried to prop early, made a brief move and then stopped. It wasn't particularly promising, but he returned to work a third-fastest-of-52 five furlongs on the training turf here July 30 and could improve with the addition of blinkers. There's a little turf in his pedigree--Tale of the Cats like the lawn and his dam's a half to a GSW in France and England--and trainer Mike Maker does alright switching to grass second out. According to *DRF Formulator*, Maker maidens score at a 31% clip with a \$3.14 ROI trying the turf in their second starts--slightly higher (\$3.28) from a small sample size when reduced to just sprints. **Play:** \$20 Win (turf only). **Alternate 1:** \$20 Win on #1 Espiritu Libre. **Alternate 2:** \$15 Win on #11 Never the End (turf only).

**DiDonato Bankroll: \$740 - Record: 26-2-4-4**



A + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

**Sherack: Wednesday - Knock Rock** (took a very large win bet late to go from 10-1 to 6-1 once they sprung the latch; I swear it wasn't me) sat a perfect stalking trip behind the eventual winner, and just got tagged in the final jumps to get nailed for second.

**Thursday - Race 6 - Msw, 2yo, 5 1/2fT - #2 Central Banker (4-1)**

I, too, didn't find anything that I loved on this card, so I decided to go with a runner in Brian's race to make the day in the office slightly more interesting. **Central Banker**, a \$200,000 KEESEP yearling graduate, gained valuable racing experience in his unveiling, finishing a clear-cut distant third behind the very impressive Canadian shipper Jocosity in his Saratoga debut Aug. 3. Love Speightstowns on the grass, and this guy's dam Rhum was a steady stakes performer on the green stuff, too (16-7-2-1). Central Banker's half-brother, the very in-form sprinter Gantry, handled turf quite well earlier in his career, getting a win and also a close fifth-place finish in the GIII Jaipur. Also like that Central Banker went out for a four-furlong spin around the dogs on the training turf since the debut. Hoping to pair him up in the gimmicks with the Asmussen first at a price. **Play:** \$20 Win (Turf Only). **Alternate 1:** Race 8 - \$14 Win (Turf Only) on #2 Star Torina.
