KY COMMITTEE REJECTS LASIX RULES

A Kentucky legislative committee Monday rejected companion regulations to the state's upcoming and controversial Lasix ban. By a vote of 19-1, the Interim Joint Committee on Licensing and Occupations ruled the regulations, which would have banned adjunct bleeding medications and required drugs be administered by a state veterinarian, were deficient. Four lawmakers abstained from the vote.

The issue was not on the committee's agenda and came as a surprise to Damon Thayer, the lone supporter of the regulation.

"The medication regulation wasn't even posted to the agenda, so I felt like it was an effort to blindside the Racing Commission," Thayer said Monday afternoon. "I feel like it was really a red herring by the HBPA to try to muddy the waters on the Lasix regulation that is forthcoming."

Governor Steve Beshear now has the option to override the committee's vote and implement the regulation.

"The regulation has been found deficient by a legislative committee, but Governor Beshear and the Racing Commission can elect to move the regulation forward and implement it," Thayer explained. "I have encouraged Governor Beshear to implement the legislation, but that ultimately will be a decision that he and the Racing Commission will have to make. For those of us who are seeking meaningful medication reform, I hope it is a temporary setback because the regulation today is part of the model rules recommended by the RMTC [Racing Medication and Testing Consortium] that have been agreed to and supported by numerous national racing organizations. I would like to see Kentucky continue to be a leader on medication reform, so I hope this is just a temporary setback."

Kentucky's Lasix ban is currently expected to go into effect with stakes races beginning in 2014, but Monday's vote could signal trouble for the ban's future.

"I don't think they're going to get it to go anywhere," Rick Hiles, President of the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association told *Louisville Courier-Journal*. "...If we got this stopped today, the Lasix issue ban is probably dead."

ALL OPTIONS OPEN FOR DULLAHAN

Trainer Dale Romans is leaving all options open for Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) after the sophomore's victory in Sunday's GI TVG Pacific Classic at Del Mar. "I don't know if we'll run in the [GI Breeders' Cup] Classic," Romans said. "If it's [my decision], I'll try him on the turf [at Belmont] next, and decide if he wants to go a mile and a half. Either the [Sept. 29 GI] Joe Hirsch or the [Oct. 6 GI] Jamaica would be good, but if we want to get the mile and a half, the Joe Hirsch would be the one." All of Dullahan's three lifetime wins have come in Grade I events on synthetic tracks and he is winless in five dirt starts, but Romans won't rule out a return to the surface. "I'm not going to give up on the dirt; I've got to get him a big win on the dirt somewhere," Romans said. "Maybe at Churchill because he likes that track." Before thinking of the future too much, Romans is still savoring Dullahan's Pacific Classic victory. "Anytime a plan comes together, it's good," he said. "We do a lot of things that don't work out, so you've got to relish the ones that do. That was a little risky, going against older horses, but he does love synthetic. If you're going to go there, you might as well go for a big pot and a place where you can run on synthetic."

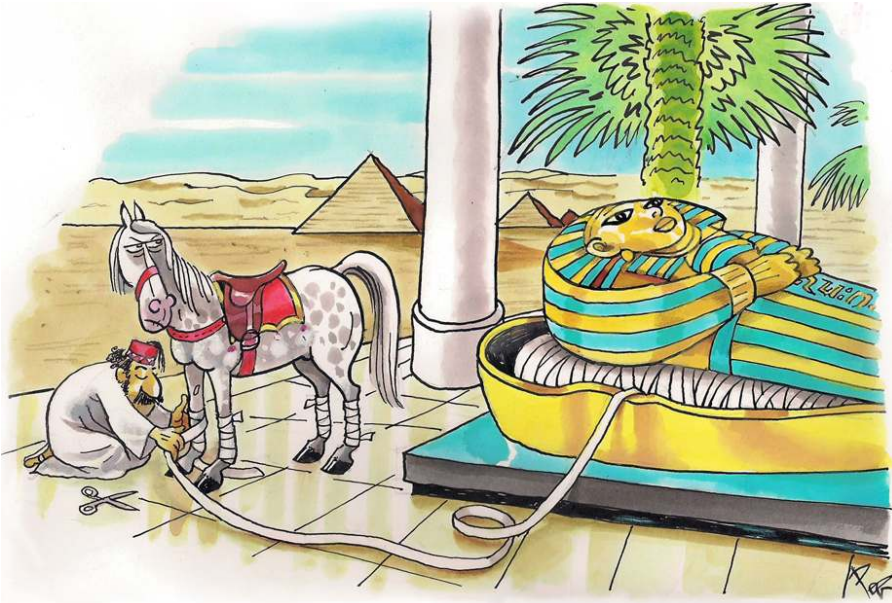

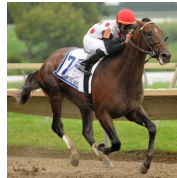

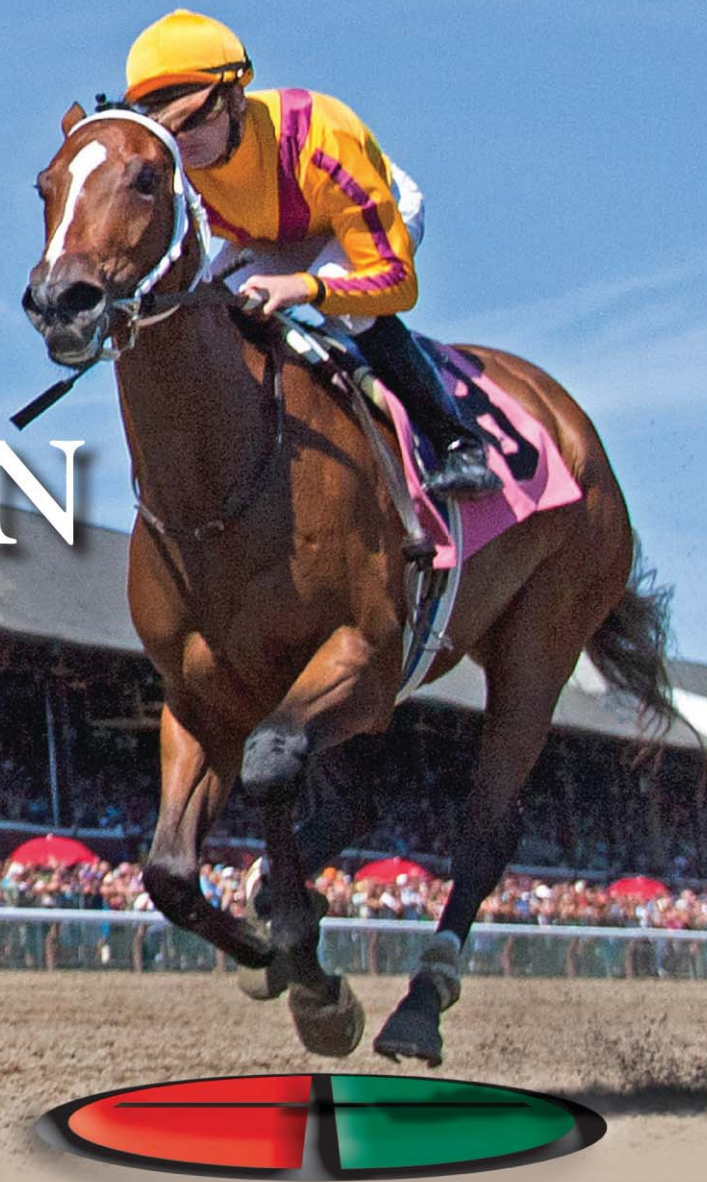

WOODWARD HOPEFULS TUNE UP

Live Oak's **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) breezed four furlongs in :49.83 over the Oklahoma training track Monday in preparation for Saturday's GI Woodward S. "He worked easy over a fairly deep track," trainer Bill Mott reported after the drill. The 4-year-old is looking to rebound from a fourth-place effort in the July 7 GII Suburban H. "We're disappointed in his race in the Suburban, but given my excuse of the heat [and] the weather, I think he'll run better if we get a decent day," Mott commented.

Also working towards the Woodward, Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm's **Cease** (War Chant) breezed a half-mile over the main track at Saratoga yesterday in :49.04. "He went an easy half-mile by himself--:49 flat, last eighth of a mile in :11 4/5," commented trainer Al Stall. "We didn't need to do much with him. He had a hard work over the track last week in company." Cease, who will be making his Grade I debut Saturday, is coming off an optional claiming victory at Saratoga July 25. He is unbeaten in three career attempts at the Spa. "We know we're stepping up, but he acts like it's his home track," Stall added. "This is where his best numbers and races are."

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

IT'S TRICKY FINE AFTER ENSIGN ADVENTURE

Godolphin's **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) suffered superficial cuts when she stumbled badly at the start of Sunday's GI Personal Ensign S., but was in otherwise fine shape after her gutsy third-place effort, according to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "She kind of scraped the front of her ankles with the way she broke," McLaughlin said. "On the positive side, [jockey Eddie Castro] stayed on her. I think she earned a lot of respect running the way she did and we will point for the [Sept. 29 GI] Beldame-one turn, a mile and an eighth at Belmont where she's undefeated."

The Beldame could also be the target for the Personal Ensign's 10-1 upset winner **Love and Pride** (A.P. Indy).

BUICK PLACES FAITH IN NATHANIEL

William Buick yesterday pointed to **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) as the main rival to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Qipco Champion S. at Ascot Oct. 20. Following the scintillating performance of Khalid Abdullah's world highweight in Wednesday's G1 Juddmonte International at York, Buick is looking forward to taking him on with Lady Rothschild's 2011 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. and 2012 G1 Eclipse winner. "I think Frankel is probably unbeatable, but we've got a horse in Nathaniel who will probably at some stage have a go," he said. "If Ascot came up testing and stamina came into it, he will definitely give him a run for his money and I think he is the horse to get nearest to him. If stamina comes into it, I would be putting emphasis on that and try to find any chinks that Frankel does have, but he probably doesn't. You have to give it a go." Buick continued, "It's a pleasure to be riding in races with Frankel--I've never seen a horse who can accelerate like him, he just leaves everything standing. He's the best horse I've seen and he's probably the best horse there's ever been, so being around when he's around is a pleasure."

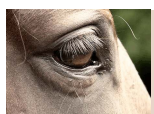

Last week undoubtedly belonged to the extraordinary Galileo, with the unique Frankel heading his massive squad of six group winners and four listed winners. The 14-year-old Coolmore stallion sets standards well beyond the capabilities of most stallions, as was illustrated by Bill Oppenheim's APEX figures published in last Wednesday's *TDN*.

Those APEX figures, along with those published Aug. 15, also highlighted the achievements of two American stallions, namely Speightstown, who ranks second to Galileo on the table of Leading Sires by Number of 2012 ABC Runners, and Bernardini, who holds second place behind the Japanese sensation Deep Impact among the third-crop sires, in order of their APEX A Runner Index.

Of course it was these two Kentucky stallions who supplied the joint winners of the GI Travers S. three days ago, when the judge couldn't separate Bernardini's son Alpha and Speightstown's Golden Ticket. *Cont. p6*

When I looked at Bernardini's career in my column on his son Algorithms on Jan. 31 this year, I commented that, "Alpha took the Count Fleet S. in the style of a colt who is going to flourish over longer routes." Sure enough, by winning the Travers, he has now followed in the footsteps of Bernardini and Bernardini's first-crop son Stay Thirsty.

I doubt, though, that I would ever have made a similar prediction about Golden Ticket.

Whereas Alpha is by a top mile-and-a-quarter winner and has daughters of Nijinsky and Alydar as his first two dams, Golden Ticket is by a champion sprinter who made his name entirely over six and seven furlongs. Then there's the fact that, of the 12 previous graded/group winners by Speightstown, 11 had gained their important victories over distances of a mile or less. Among them were such fast horses as Poseidon's Warrior, Munnings, Mona de Momma, Essence Hit Man, Bridgetown and Island Bound.

I suspect that when Eugene Melnyk bid \$2 million for Speightstown as a yearling, he wasn't expecting a sprinter. He was surely hoping that the son of Gone West would shine at the remunerative distances around a mile and an eighth. Gone West, after all, had won the GI Dwyer S. over that distance, and the colt's dam, Silken Cat, had won the GI Mazarine S. over 1 1/16 miles as a juvenile. There was also some reassurance to be found in the colt's 3x4 inbreeding to Secretariat.

With this background, there is bound to be the occasional exception to the Speightstown speed rule. The first was Haynesfield, now a member of the Airdrie stallion team. With two lines of Secretariat and three of Northern Dancer, Haynesfield gained five of his stakes victories over a mile and an eighth or more, with his finest moment coming when he wired the field in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup over a mile and a quarter.

Golden Ticket is clearly another who is suited by a mile and a quarter. So where has the extra stamina come from? The prime suspect must be his dam Business Plan, although this \$800,000 yearling didn't show enough ability during her brief career to determine her optimum distance. She is a sister to Dubai World, who showed useful form at up to 1 3/8 miles in the UAE.

Business Plan is by no means the first daughter of Deputy Minister to produce a Grade I winner. The American Racing Manual credits him with four broodmare sire championships, thanks to the likes of Curlin, Rags To Riches, Halfbridled, Jazil, Sarava and To Honor And Serve. Deputy Minister's daughters also shone on the track, with Go For Wand and Open Mind leading the way. Another of Deputy Minister's Grade I-winning daughters, the Ashland S. heroine Well Chosen, is a three-parts-sister to Business Plan, as both are out of daughters of Mine Only. The daughter of Mine Only who figures as Golden Ticket's second dam is Good Mood, winner of the GIII Miss Grillo S. over 1 1/16 miles as a juvenile.

Golden Ticket cost no more than \$100,000 as a 2-year-old at Keeneland, but his family has produced some high-priced yearlings. The previously mentioned Dubai World cost \$1.4 million and Mine Only's stakes-winning daughter Statuette produced a \$2.5-million colt to Seattle Slew. This colt, Tomahawk, went on to finish second in two of Britain's top juvenile prizes, the Middle Park S. and Dewhurst S.

Golden Ticket's fifth dam, Sin Igual, had the distinction of being a sister to Assault, the Triple Crown winner of 1946, and to Equal Venture, a broodmare whose fairly recent Grade I-winning descendants include Stay Thirsty, Crisp and Whywhywhy.

This family's past glories have helped some of its colts to become stallions, despite the lack of a Grade I victory. Golden Ticket's third dam, Mine Only, was a sister to Rare Performer, a non-graded-winning sprinter who sired 26 black-type winners. Mine Only herself produced Academy Award, a Grade II scorer who sired a Grade I winner. She is also the third dam of Magical Feeling, winner this year of the GII Barbara Fritchie H. over seven furlongs.

Mine Only is a daughter of Mr. Prospector, which means that Golden Ticket is inbred 3x4 to that great stallion. As Speightstown's grandsires are those ubiquitous stallions Mr. Prospector and Storm Cat, there had to be some worries that his options within the broodmare population would be somewhat restricted. However, this clearly hasn't proved a problem. Although most of his graded winners don't have duplications to one or other of these stallions, his son Bridgetown is inbred 3x3 to Storm Cat and his total of black-type performers with two lines of Mr. Prospector stands in double figures.

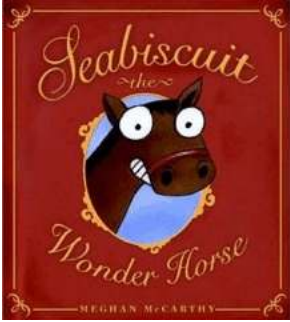

TALES TO BE TOLD

With the first day of the new school year just around the corner, thousands of first- and fourth-graders in Kentucky will be able to tuck away new copies of horse-themed books into their backpacks. The first-graders begin with "Seabiscuit the Wonder Horse" by Meghan



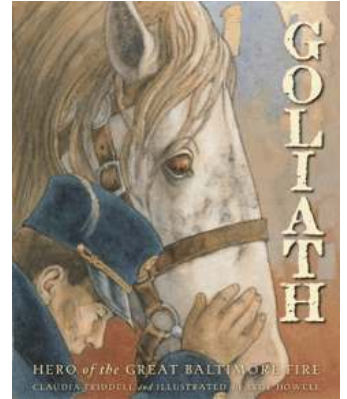
McCarthy, while the fourth-graders will delve into Michael Morpurgo's "War Horse," a book published in 1982 that became a theatrical hit before making its way successfully to the silver screen. The books are part of the Kentucky Horse Park's Literacy Program, which, in addition to distributing the books, has developed hands-on horse experiences, equine productions

and a teacher's curriculum.

"On average, the first graders are learning to read, and the fourth graders are reading to learn," explained Mollie Jameson, the program's volunteer director.

The program grew out of the Black Stallion Literacy Program, which had been established in part by the heirs of the late Walter Farley, whose "Black Stallion" series captured the imagination of so many children and young adults. The International Museum of the Horse was preparing the exhibit "A Gift From the Desert," and that is how Jameson came to be involved.

"It was about the Arabian horse, I and volunteered as a liaison with it," she added. "In doing so, I came across the Black Stallion Literacy Program out of Orlando, Florida, so we brought that up for a couple of years, and it worked beautifully. We're so unique being in the horse capital of the world that we wanted to embrace it. That's now incorporated into the Kentucky Horse Park Literacy Program."



Approximately 17,000 students in 11 of Kentucky's counties--Bourbon, Clay, Clark, Fayette, Gallatin, Grant, Madison, Mercer, Montgomery, Scott, and Woodford--have benefitted since the program's launch in 2010.

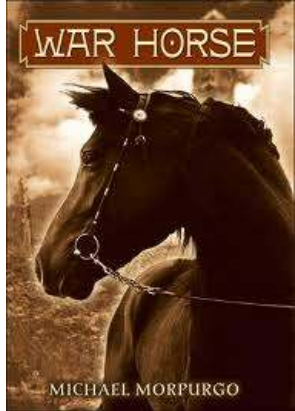

The Kentucky Horse Park Foundation's Executive Director, Laura Klumb, underscored its basic tenets.

"We work with the school systems in all of the counties that participate in the program and it's a two-pronged approach," Klumb explained. "For some of these kids, this is the first book they've ever owned of their own, so it's really important to give them a book and help them start their own personal library. Then, we work with the teachers devising a curriculum--obviously it's up to them to *teach* the reading.



"There's a need for literacy nationwide, and Kentucky is certainly one of the states that needs it as much, if not more, than any of the others," Klumb added. "We have some very impoverished counties in Kentucky with very low literacy rates, so we really try to get books into the hands of children to instill that love of reading."

Getting new books into the hands of over 1,000 first-graders and nearly 5,000 fourth-graders

per annum isn't the easiest task.

"We do all our own fundraising through sponsors and donors, so we're 100% supported by philanthropic donations," Jameson pointed out. "We do work with publishers, and sometimes there are special programs that provide discounts."

The program's sponsors this year include Kentucky Bank, Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky, UKHealthCare Kentucky Children's Hospital, Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, PNC Bank, The Little Foundation, and Kentucky Horse Park Foundation.

"Fundraising is a year-round, ongoing process, as you can imagine," Klumb added. "We're always looking for new sponsors, and we have a wonderful rate of renewal--our sponsors love this program--so we hope they stay on board, and we always try to reach out to new ones."

A third book, "Goliath, Hero of the Great Baltimore Fire" by Claudia Friddell has met with the approval of both those running the program and the students.

"I think Mollie has done a great job in choosing these books," added Ashton Moynihan, who volunteers for the program. "Each tells a story about a specific horse--Seabiscuit was historic, a real horse; Goliath is also a real story.

"I think that's a unique perspective that also helps the kids learn a little bit about history," Moynihan added.

Standards of the literary canon such as "Black Beauty," along with the "Black Stallion" series, were initially considered for the program, but, ultimately, newer books were chosen.

"We thought about 'The Black Stallion' because it's such a classic, but, in reviewing what we wanted for the kids, 'War Horse' came to mind because of [Steven] Spielberg [s movie]," Jameson explained. "We tested it with the students, and it just worked. We also liked having something that was a little more contemporary--all three of these authors are still living. The author of 'Goliath' [Claudia Friddell] came in to do a reading with the students, and we've invited the others. You know how influential the books you read were, and I think these authors coming in gives these students one more reason to read and to learn."

There is a possibility that the program could expand to additional grades within the school systems.

"Long term, that would be a great goal for the program," Klumb confirmed. "We do want to reach as many kids as we can--this year, that will mean the current first and fourth graders, possibly third grade if we can. Then we'll take a look at funding and staff resources as they become available each year to see how we can reach more and more kids at all age levels."

Kentucky's public libraries are an additional resource for the program.

"We have a good public library system here and they have been a supporter," said Jameson. "I'd love to see every student in every grade in Kentucky with a horse book, but it's all a matter of funding. Last year we tested 'Goliath,' our third book, and we're hoping to roll that out to students this year, but that's dependent on raising money from private quarters."

The Kentucky Horse Park Literacy Program isn't just about the books, however.

"The first grade book is delivered to the schools with a live horse," Moynihan explained. "They meet the horse first, then they're given their book. Again, some of these kids have never had their own hardcover book, which was a shock to several of us. They write their name in their book. Then we have several Thoroughbred activities for them to participate in." **Cont. p10**

Farms and owners donated racing silks and goggles for the children, and racing photographs were blown up so that the children could put their faces as the jockey. Approximately 900 first-grade students, along with their teachers and chaperones, later attended a live performance at the Kentucky Horse Park that featured a reenactment of the fabled Seabiscuit/War Admiral match race, and was accompanied by participants in period dress, as well as some of the hit music of the time.

“Chris McCarron was one of the jockeys and he got to ride Seabiscuit this time,” said Jameson. “Pimlico very kindly sent us the original race footage, and we were able to play that for them before the reenactment. It was a wonderful atmosphere.”

The fourth graders didn’t have a special production in receiving their books, which were shipped directly to the schools, but they had an exciting field trip to the Horse Park this past spring.

“They came to the Alltech Arena at the Kentucky Horse Park that holds about 5,500 people, and we had it filled to capacity with fourth-grade students from around Kentucky with their teachers and chaperones,” Klumb recalled. “We had a program that was written and performed by the KHP Education and Equine Department called ‘The Book Report.’ In it, two teachers are discussing a wonderful book report they got and, while they’re narrating it, the book is coming to life with scenes--live horses, period costume, WWI ambulances--before their very eyes.

“But they're also getting to hear the importance of writing a book report, of using what they've learned and turning it into words, and how it can impact your life, not just reading it,” Klumb continued. “We all got so many hand-written notes from those fourth graders saying it was the best field trip they'd ever been on. We know we're touching lives.”
