SUMMER HEADING OUT WITH A BLAST

Labor Day weekend marks the final stand at Saratoga, and the historic oval will conduct no fewer than seven graded stakes over the next three days, including the \$750,000 GI Woodward S., \$500,000 GI Forego S. and \$250,000 GII Bernard Baruch H. this afternoon. **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) was freshened up following his dazzling score in the GII Suburban H. at Belmont July 7, and deserves his 8-5 morning-line favoritism. "He's training very good," said trainer Kathy Ritvo. "We're ready to go. This will be our first Grade I if we're blessed with that."

Out on the Pacific Coast, the GI Del Mar Debutante will be the featured race Saturday evening, and ♣ **"TDN Rising Star" ♣ Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai) will look to build on her three-race winning streak. Beshear Implementing Rule Changes

Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear Thursday overrode Monday's 19-1 decision by the Interim Joint Committee of Licensing and Occupations not to implement proposed medication regulation changes in the state. The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) said Friday that two of the regulations, a ban on adjunct bleeder medications and a reduction of the allowed level of the painkiller Phenylbutazone, will take effect Sept. 4. 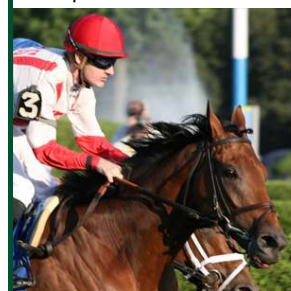

Stay Thirsty, My Friends

Among the highly regarded runners Mucho Macho Man handled with ease in the Suburban were **Trickmeister** (Proud Citizen), **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini) and **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini), who were third, fourth and fifth, respectively. Stay Thirsty returns to the site of his career-best performances; the Repole colorbearer is three-for-four at the Spa, including last year's GI Travers S. and Gil Jim Dandy S. His sole loss on this surface was a second in the 2010 GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. "He is rounding back into his best form," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "Since [the Suburban], by design, he's had a freshening pointing him toward a late-summer and fall campaign. Unfortunately, the Suburban fell on a very hot day [that] he and a number of horses didn't really respond very favorably to. So, we've regrouped and freshened for this, and I like the way everything's coming together. I think Stay Thirsty is one of, if not *the* horse to beat, based on his form here at Saratoga and the way he is training currently."

Claiborne/Dilschneider homebred **Cease** (War Chant) extended his perfect Saratoga record to three last out in capturing an optional claimer at the Woodward distance July 25. The 5-year-old has come up short in his stakes engagements elsewhere, but finally gets a crack at one up here. "We know we're stepping up, but he acts like its home track," said trainer Al Stall Jr. This is where his best numbers and races are. If you take out the one marquee name--Mucho Macho Man this year--we'll try to take advantage of a short field."

SHACK LOOKS TO GET BACK ON TRACK

Michael Lauffer, Bill Cubbedge and Phillips Racing Partnership's **Shackleford** (Forestry) will look to bounce back from an uncharacteristically dull eighth-place finish in the Aug. 5 GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. in today's GI Forego S. at Saratoga. Victorious in the May 5 GII Churchill Downs and Belmont's GI Metropolitan H. May 28 in his two previous efforts, the versatile Classic winner simply never looked like himself when hard-riden to no avail in the six-furlong Vanderbilt, the shortest Shackleford had ever run in his 17-race career. Trainer Dale Romans believes the muddy surface could explain his charge's lackluster performance. "He seems to be doing to be doing well," said red-hot Romans, who took the GI Arlington Million two weeks ago and the GI Pacific Classic S. last week. "He's fast enough to do anything. He'll do whatever we ask him to do." Joining Shackleford in the early mix will be Dennis Narlinger's **Pacific Ocean** (Ghostzapper), who controlled the pace in the opening day GIII James Marvin S. en route to a 1 3/4-length track-and-trip success; and lightly raced Godolphin representative **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song), who was game to hold on for a close third in the Vanderbilt after setting quick splits. The latter must navigate an extra furlong here, but boasts a 3-2-0-0 record at the distance. "We don't think the extra furlong will be a problem," said the equally en fuego Kiaran McLaughlin.

"He's probably best with a target," McLaughlin added. "Last time, we didn't have much choice because we were so far inside. We had the two hole and Shackleford was in the one hole, and we thought [Shackleford] was going to try to go and we kind of committed to going. We're hoping to run at something [in the Forego]." Robert LaPenta and Fred Brei's **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil) escaped relatively unscathed after colliding with another horse while galloping on the Oklahoma track Aug. 18. A winner of the GI Carter H. ahead of Shackleford in April, Jackson Bend's only loss at seven panels came last time when he settled for fourth with a wide trip in the Marvin. Trainer Nick Zito had expressed caution about running his charge in the Forego, but ultimately gave the green light.

EXECUTIVEPRIVILEGE SEEKS GRADE I

Pegram, Watson and Weitman's undefeated **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai) looms an imposing presence in today's GI Del Mar Debutante, but she'll face eight capable opponents. The \$650,000 OBSAPR purchase earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ distinction for a 4 1/2-length rallying victory when unveiled at Betfair Hollywood Park June 28, and found little resistance from **Speedinthruthcity** (City Zip) when besting that foe in both the Landaluce S. back in Inglewood July 14 and the GIII Sorrento S. here Aug. 8. Peter Miller, conditioner of the aforementioned Speedinthruthcity, brings in reinforcements in the form of **Heir Kitty** (Wildcat Heir) and **Miss Empire** (Empire Maker), second and third against the boys in the Aug. 5 GII Best Pal S. The latter, who Miller told *DRF* is "getting better every week," was also third in the Landaluce. "We have to let our fillies run their races and move forward and hope that [Executiveprivilege] doesn't," he noted. There is a chance Speedinthruthcity will be scratched in favor of the \$100,000 Oak Tree Juvenile Fillies Turf on Labor Day. Executiveprivilege's main weakness may be her 84 Beyer Speed Figure top, but Doubledown Stables Inc.'s **Mechaya** (City Zip) earned a 93 for her two-length debut score Aug. 10.

The runner-up that day, a fellow John Sadler trainee, was 8 1/4 lengths clear of the third-place finisher. Sadler won the Debutante two years ago with Tell a Kelly (Tapit). **Wasted At Midnight** (Midnight Lute) is an intriguing longshot without a diploma. She made up for a disastrous start here Aug. 5 with a furious rally to finish fifth, beaten 1 3/4 lengths and now gets blinkers from trainer Alexis Barba with an upbeat worktab in the interim.

CAN DOMINUS DOMINATE ON FRONT END?

George Bolton, Stonestreet Stables and Spendthrift Farm's **Dominus** (Smart Strike) makes his turf debut in today's GII Bernard Baruch H. at The Spa, and a potential pace advantage could aid in a smooth transition. A front-running winner of last year's GII Dwyer S., the 4-year-old was transferred from trainer Steve Asmussen to Todd Pletcher for his 2012 campaign, and enters off a 4 1/2-length allowance tally at seven panels here Aug. 4. He appears to have this field at his mercy if ridden aggressively. "He's got a bit of turf pedigree and apparently had breezed on the turf at Ocala and acted like he liked it," Pletcher said of the decision to try Dominus on the lawn. "We're just sort of exploring some options. We worked him on the turf here on Monday [four furlongs in :47.00] and liked the way he breezed." Dominus is out of multiple stakes-winning and multiple graded stakes-placed turfer Cuando (Lord at War {Arg}), a half-sister to MGISW turfer Honey Ryder (Lasting Approval), who Pletcher trained. Stuart S. Janney III homebred and expected favorite **Data Link** (War Front) will have to hope Dominus goes too fast early or doesn't handle the turf. The fast-closing bay took Keeneland's GI Maker's 46 Mile at Keeneland in April and was last seen annexing the nine-furlong June 10 Monmouth S.. He was scratched from the one-mile GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 11 to avoid boggy conditions. "The distance probably doesn't matter with him," said Hall of Fame trainer Shug McGaughey. "I think anywhere from a mile to 1 1/8 miles is his best." **Guys Reward** (Grand Reward) snapped a three-race win streak when he found himself much farther back in the Fourstardave. He could sit a good trip here if allowed to take closer order.

Veteran conditioner Richard Hannon will bid to bridge an 11-year gap since Redback (GB) annexed Sandown's 2001 G3 Solario S., and saddles **Master of War (GB)** (Compton Place {GB}) in this year's renewal of a juvenile test which helped launch the careers of To-Agori-Mou (Ire), Silver Hawk, Oh So Sharp (Ire), Raven's Pass, et al. The chestnut has already prevailed at stakes level, having annexed Newbury's July 13 Listed Rose Bowl S., and he steps up to seven furlongs for the first time coming off a second in the Aug. 2 G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood. "He probably found Goodwood's fast six furlongs a bit sharp on quickish ground in the Richmond at the Glorious meeting," said Hannon. "He still ran a cracker to split Heavy Metal and Cay Verde, who have since chased home Blaine (GB) (Avonbridge {GB}) in the [G2] Gimcrack S. at York. Our fellow will be better suited by this extra furlong." Godolphin's **Tha'ir (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) set the seal on a record-breaking Royal Ascot for his freshman sire (by Galileo {Ire}) when garnering the June 23 Listed Chesham S. at the Berkshire track, and returns to action following a fourth in Glorious Goodwood's G2 Vintage S. at the beginning of this month. "Tha'ir has shown a good level of form this season and has been working well at home," commented trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "He is now ready to run again, and this looks to be the right race. Sandown will suit him and we are looking for a good result." Jeremy Nosedo, who won this contest with Talwar (Ire) last year, is represented by Saheed Suhail's Newmarket maiden winner **Fantastic Moon (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) this time. The chestnut is considered worthy enough of entries in the Sept. 15 G1 Vincent O'Brien S. and Oct. 27 G1 Racing Post Trophy, and is pitched straight into pattern company in an attempt to justify those lofty ambitions. "Jeremy was struggling to find a novice race for him, so the programme book has twisted his arm to go in this direction," explained Suhail's racing manager Bruce Raymond. "We are hoping he will prove good enough, and we think he could be that sort of horse, but whether he is quite up to it yet we don't know. We think he's a nice horse and this will tell us where we go." The Esher track is officially rated as 'good', and is likely to remain so with dry weather conditions forecast.

BESHEAR OVERRULES MED DECISION

Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear Thursday overrode Monday's 19-1 decision by the Interim Joint Committee of Licensing and Occupations not to implement proposed medication regulation changes in the state. The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) said Friday that two of the regulations, a ban on adjunct bleeder medications and a reduction of the allowed level of the painkiller Phenylbutazone, will take effect Sept. 4. The rule that Lasix may only be administered by state veterinarians will begin to be enforced Oct. 5, the first day of Keeneland's fall meet.

Beshear explained in a letter to the Legislative Research Commission that the proposed regulations came about after more than a year of discussion and research by the KHRC. "All of the regulations were approved unanimously by the relevant KHRC committees, and by the KHRC itself," explained Beshear. "The regulations were heard by the Administrative Regulation and Review Subcommittee without objection from any member of the committee."

He added, "The interest of the industry demands that these well-developed and fully vetted regulations go into effect as promulgated."

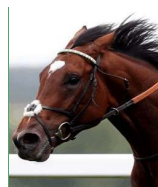
Kentucky State Senator Damon Thayer, the only member of the Licensing and Occupations Committee who voted to support the new regulations in Monday's vote, praised Beshear's actions Friday.

"I am delighted that Governor Beshear has shown tremendous leadership in moving forward to implement the new rules," said Thayer. "It was a bold decision by a governor who cares about the safety of the horse, and the integrity of Kentucky's on-track product. Under his leadership, the racing commission has worked in an open and transparent manner for nearly a year and a half on these new national model rules, and I'm pleased that Kentucky has joined numerous other states in implementing them."

He continued, "The week is certainly ending on a much better note than it began after the sad events that happened in the committee meeting on Monday when the racing commission was ambushed and members of the committee were misinformed. I encouraged Governor Beshear publicly and privately to implement the new rules and I heard from him personally Thursday right before he assigned the letter moving the regulations forward. I will continue to work in a bi-partisan fashion with Governor Beshear to do the right thing for Kentucky's horse industry."

FRANKEL GETS CHAMPION FEELING

Khalid Abdullah's unbeaten ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) will target the Oct. 20 G1 Qipco Champion S. for his next race, according to a brief statement released yesterday by the owner's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe. Speculation that a late change of plan, and an attempt at Longchamp's Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe might be considered by connections, was effectively nullified, and the world's highest-rated horse remains on course for the £1.3-million Ascot feature, his possible swansong. "Following discussions with Sir Henry Cecil, Prince Khalid has decided that Frankel's next race will be the Champion S. at Ascot on October 20," said Grimthorpe.

KRIS KIN DEAD

Kris Kin (Kris S.--Angel In My Heart {Fr}, by Rainbow Quest), hero of the 2003 G1 Epsom Derby in the blue-and-yellow silks of Saheed Suhail, died after breaking his neck in a freak paddock accident at the Al Shaab Stud near Tripoli in Libya, where he had only recently arrived, according to *Racing Post*. The 12-year-old, who initially stood at Derrinstown Stud, attempted to jump a gate and died instantly of his injury. Bruce Raymond, racing manager to former owner Suhail, told the trade daily, "It's sad news and it's sad for Mr. Suhail, who has photographs of him everywhere and even named a hotel after him in Dubai. He wasn't the best Derby winner, but I remember Kieren Fallon telling us he would win the Derby two weeks before he won." Trainer Sir Michael Stoute added, "We certainly enjoyed him. I thought Kieren gave him a great ride on Derby day, but he also had to respond to it. We were delighted to have come across him and I am sorry that he died so young."

Her half-brother, the champion Kamsin (Ger) (Samum {Ger}), was successful in the G1 Deutsches Derby, G1 Rheinland-Pokal and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden four years ago and is now resident at Gestut Rottgen. He was bought for South Africa's Markus Jooste, whose racing manager Derek Brugman was also in attendance.

While this filly looks set to join the Andre Fabre stable, two other Jooste purchases are likely to join Andreas Wohler. Offered back-to-back by Gestut Fahrhof as [lot 67](#) and [lot 68](#), the first was a son of Teofilo (Ire) out of the listed winner Sarabia (Ger) (One Cool Cat) who fetched €100,000, while the next yearling in the ring was a colt from the first crop of the 2009 G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero and Haras de la Cauviniere resident Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre). He is a half-brother to the smart Sanjii Danon (Ger) (Big Shuffle), a winner at listed level and four times Group-placed and he was secured by the Brugman-Doyle axis for €110,000.

Now that he is sadly gone, opportunities to secure the precious progeny of Montjeu (Ire) will become fewer and far between, and Jean-Pierre Deroubaix was not for letting his colt from Jamie Railton's draft slip by. [Lot 202](#) is a 3/4-brother to last year's Listed Grosser Bavaria-Preis runner-up Lysio (Ger) (Motivator {GB}) from the extended family of the sire Bellypha (Ire), and he sold to Deroubaix's FBA for €240,000. Further international flavor was added to the auction by the presence of Darley's representative Franziska Schaertlin Coffey, who paid €210,000 on behalf of John Ferguson Bloodstock for a well-connected daughter of Dansili (GB). [Lot 197](#) is out of a half-sister to Lomitas (GB), a champion sire and now the producer of an Arc winner in Danedream (Ger).

Darley's sire-in-demand New Approach (Ire) featured prominently at Deauville and Doncaster this month, and it was the same story at Iffezheim yesterday, when his colt from the consignment of Gestut Fahrhof was knocked down to Manfred Hofer on behalf of owner Klaus Allofs for €180,000. [Lot 57](#) is a half-brother to the dual group-placed and listed-winning Paraisa (GB) (Red Ransom), whose dam is a half to the champion Paita (GB) (Intikhab). The Hong Kong Jockey Club were also on hand to secure [lot 102](#), a son of Soldier Hollow (GB) who is responsible for this year's G1 Deutsches Derby hero Pastorius (Ger). The sire's previous mating with the SW Desabina (Ger) (Big Shuffle) produced the listed winner and group-placed Dessau (Ger) and this February foal hails from the extended family of Animal Kingdom. The HKJC's Executive Director Mark Richards was assisted by Crispin de Moubray and it took them a bid of €140,000 to prevail over Andrew Balding.

Two others of note were Ronald Rauscher's [lot 55](#), a daughter of Dalakhani (Ire) and the dual group heroine Peace Royale (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}) who sold to Mirec Rulec for €130,000; and a filly from the first crop of the former Ballydoyle celebrity and current Haras du Logis Saint Germain resident Soldier of Fortune (Ire). [Lot 79](#) is an April-foaled half-sister to the top stayer Askar Tau (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) who was bought for €125,000 by Peter Doyle on behalf of Norwegian trainer Wido Neuroth.

MADE IN GERMANY: BEHIND THE SCENES AT BBAG SALE by Liesl King

The inside of a sales ring the world over is pretty much uniform. The ingredients are simple and unchangeable, a horse to be sold, an audience made up of buyers, sellers, onlookers and an auctioneer, desperate to get the most out of their tight pockets. Yet the setting in which the sales ring is located, often adds the color, the drama and the difference. And so it is in Baden-Baden or to be geographically correct, Iffezheim, a tiny village 15 km outside Baden-Baden, where BBAG's annual yearling sale is actually held. A first-time visitor to the sale can be forgiven for thinking that surely some mischief must be involved with the signboards, as you wind your way through the endless, narrow, cobbled streets of Iffezheim. And just when you are about to turn the car around, the road opens up and you find yourself in the countryside, next to the Iffezheim racecourse.

The sales complex and the racecourse are cousins, with the complex backing onto the racecourse around the 450-meter mark. It is both exhilarating and confusing to be watching a yearling parade, while the field in the sixth thunders past.

In true German style it is spacious and colourful, with neat yellow and white barns, gravel and rubber walkways and flowers everywhere. From the hanging baskets outside the stables, to beds of roses and lavender, all adding color to the immaculately manicured lawns.

The German Thoroughbred industry has suffered during the recession, much like the rest of the world, with a slump from a top price of €710,000 for a Monsun colt in 2007, compared to 2011 when the top price was a mere €220,000. The 2012 sale offered only 261 horses and yet, with a German-bred filly called Danedream taking the world by storm, there was a decidedly international flavor to be found at the sale.

Thursday night heralded the start of the sale, with an informal barbeque where the band had to compete with a veritable United Nations as buyers from as far afield as France, England, Ireland, Russia, Italy, Spain and South Africa, mingled with the locals over some excellent bratwurst and ample quantities of beer. The serious business of buying yearlings was left for the Friday, where prices rose and fell, depending on the whims of the buyers as they tried to find the next champion. In the end it was an Irish-bred filly out of an American mare, sold in Germany, that topped the sale at €320,000, the highest price paid since 2008.

Yes, sales are pretty much the same the world over. But if you are looking for something different, want to have some fun along with excellent bratwurst and the amber liquid called beer, then pencil in the BBAG sale next August.

GERMAN ENGINEERING

For those of us on the Thoroughbred sales circuit, Baden-Baden is the German version of Deauville, without the sea. It's a beautiful town, with generally good weather (occasional showers the last couple of days, but hey, compared to the UK and Ireland, you barely even need your windshield wipers), a great atmosphere, and a generally good feeling about your state, if not the state of the world. So the setting is world-class. The sale, held at the BBAG sales facility just next to the Baden-Baden racecourse in the small village of Iffzheim, had a very positive vibe about it going in, with lots of international faces, and of course with the huge positive of being the place to find German-breds, the toast of the international racing circuit, especially since Danedream won last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and a horse called Lucas Cranach ran third in last year's G1 Melbourne Cup, triggering even more of a run on German-breds from the Australians.

In the event, like many sales, yesterday's Baden-Baden yearling sale was a bit schizophrenic. The gross and average were marginally up on last year, like most sales so far this season, but Baden-Baden got there by a combination of professionally prepared yearlings by top-class international sires--many out of German families--with a liberal dash of yearlings with very local pedigrees and which sometimes appeared to have received, shall we say, a very 'casual' preparation. Five yearlings sold for €180,000 or more, including two fillies by Dubawi and one by Dansili, and colts by Montjeu and New Approach.

Surprisingly, in spite of these good, positive figures and a very strong international presence, the picture is a long way from rosy in the German Thoroughbred industry, and, specifically, German racing.

The prize money is terrible--it's like Britain, but without the public support which makes horse racing a major sport there--and so, increasingly, Germany owners are forced to race outside Germany and/or to sell their most desirable products to the waiting world. Just as it needs to step up production to satisfy the rising demand for the brand 'German-bred,' the foal crop is shrinking; estimates are that the 2012 German foal crop will number under 1,000, far fewer than states like Louisiana, Pennsylvania, California, and New York, none of which are in the habit of producing Arc winners or the equivalent. Only slowly are some German breeders becoming commercial on an international scale, and there is a real danger that they will miss the opportunity to cash in on their current revered status, because pretty soon there just won't be enough of them. And the most significant reason for this development is that the lack of racing opportunities for viable prize money means there is virtually no domestic market of any real value for horses to race inside Germany. Fortunately there is real promise in that several of the major racetracks are now run by younger people who understand the problem and are beginning to think about taking positive steps together to try and fix it. Let's hope they do, because there are few enough places about which 'outside' people are so unhesitatingly positive and supportive. Germany has proven it can produce world-class horses--which is a lot more than can be said for most jurisdictions with a foal crop under 1,000--but now it must transform that international good will into recreating a domestic industry that can support the numbers necessary to keep producing top-class international horses.

Parbhoo Tests Trinniberg After Spa Loss

Multiple graded stakes winner **Trinniberg** (Teufflesberg)'s uncharacteristic ninth-place finish in last weekend's GI King Bishop S. at the Spa has left owner Shivananda Parbhoo puzzled. His colt led the field into the stretch, but inexplicably faded fast with an eighth of a mile left. "After the race, I felt there had to be a reason my horse didn't run like he usually does," said Parbhoo. "So I had the vet look him over again and again, I had him x-rayed, and I had all the bloodwork done on him, and everything came back clean. We even scoped him twice. Once after the race, which came back good, but I still wasn't convinced, so I called the vet and asked him to come back to the barn and we scoped him again; and it was still good." Trinniberg lost both hind shoes during the race, which Parbhoo thinks may have affected his performance. "He did lose both of his back shoes during the race," Parbhoo continued. "And he was shod a little different than usual, so maybe that's the reason. But we have to just put that race behind us and move forward." Parbhoo is unsure of when his colt will run next, but has shipped him back to Calder and is still aiming for the Breeders' Cup in November.

Fire On Ice Ready For Return

🔴 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🔴 **Fire On Ice** (Unbridled Song), who sustained a condylar fracture in his right hind leg during training last fall, looks ready for his comeback. In his lone start, the grey aired at Saratoga last year with an authoritative 10 1/2-length victory for owners Eli Gindi and John Kimmel. Frank Stronach later purchased a majority interest in the colt. He returned to training at Belmont in June, and posted a 1:00.58 five-panel work on Wednesday. "I was very pleased with the way he went," said Kimmel, who also trains the colt. "I've been trying to breeze him in company, but no one can keep up with him. He's been doing very, very well." Kimmel plans for the colt to make his next start early in the Belmont meet.

Palace Malice Sidelined With Shins

Dogwood Stable announced that **Palace Malice** (Curlin) will not run in Monday's GII Three Chimney's Hopeful S. The colt, who broke his maiden impressively at the Spa Aug. 4, came out of a Monday workout with bucked shins. "He is a May foal, so it's not a complete shock that he has bucked," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "But it is a blow, because we thought he would be salty to accomplish Dogwood's third win in the Hopeful. But now he ships this weekend to Dr. Bob Copelan in Kentucky and will be treated for the shin problem. He will then rehab in Aiken for a 3-year-old campaign in Florida."

Closing into a below-average early pace, Cease circled the field and powered home in the lane to a somewhat workmanlike, but decisive victory. He only earned a 95 Beyer last time, but since he's run faster before, it's not much of a concern and can only help his price. **Play:** \$25 Win. **Alternate 1:** Race 8 - \$25 Win on #4 Dominus. **Alternate 2:** Race 9 - \$15 Win on #3 Isn't He Perfect.

I've been on the **Emcee** train the entire season, and it's only a matter of time before he gets his paws on one of these. The lightly raced 4-year-old showed his class while making his third career start, dueling with the fleet Royal Courier throughout and collecting third in game fashion behind inner track specialist Calibrachoa and the classy Caleb's Posse in the GIII Tom Fool H. over the Big A's winterized surface Mar. 3. I was banking on the GI Carter H. to be Emcee's shining moment, but it clearly wasn't meant to be after he lost all chance when badly missing the break en route to a disappointing fourth-place finish. Wisely given a shot to regain his composure in his next try at Belmont May 5, the son of Unbridled's Song did exactly what he was supposed to do as the 1-2 chalk in a \$50k optional claimer, stalking on the outside in third and pouncing in the stretch to post a smart 4 1/2-length victory at this distance, good for a gaudy 107 Beyer. Freshened following that score, he was drawn on the inside and forced to duel early through :21.99 and :44.61 in the six-furlong GI A.G. Vanderbilt Aug. 5, and ran his heart out to be a close third after doing all of the heavy lifting over a tiring and harrowed muddy strip.
