**SMELLS LIKE 'TEEN' UPSET**

Yesterday's GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga was viewed by many to be no more than a procession for **"TDN Rising Star" Teen Pauline** (Tapit), but Maggi Moss's GIII Schuylerville S. heroine **So Many Ways** (Sightseeing) had other ideas. The 7-2 third choice stalked the odds-on favorite from third, ranged up ominously at the head of the lane and wore down her more-heralded foe at the eighth pole en route to a 2 1/2-length victory.

**Mae** (Broken Vow) ran on to grab second from the favorite, while fellow 'Rising Star' **Seasoned Warrior** (Majestic Warrior) found herself too far back and could only muster a fourth-place finish. "I love my filly," said winning pilot Javier Castellano. "She's been training phenomenal, and the last time I rode her, she was very impressive. I think she's going to be really good. She's got a long, beautiful stride. I can't wait to stretch her out a little bit. I think she can go farther, and I have a lot of confidence with her." **Cont. p3**

**THE DREAM LIVES ON**

Fresh from her success in the July 21 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot, Gestut Burg Eberstein and Teruya Yoshida's **Danedream** (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) annexed the G1 Longines Grosser Preis von Baden for the second year in succession after a fight for the spoils. So impressive in this event 12 months ago, the 7-10 favorite was made to work this time by **Ovambo Queen** (Ger) (Kalatos {Ger}) and **Pastorius** (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}), but kept digging in for Andrasch Starke to add a fifth top-level success. Kept close to the tepid early pace set by **Next Vision** (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), the bay struck for home at the top of the stretch and had the stand's rail to help as she first warded off the 3-year-old Pastorius and then Ovambo Queen to score by a half length. "The pace wasn't really fast enough, so the margins weren't that large, but she always gave me a good feel and she really has the will to win--she is absolutely determined," her rider Andrasch Starke said. Trainer Peter Schiergen added, "That wasn't a real pacemaker, but Andrasch soon realised that and kept her at it. Once she hits the front, there is no stopping her." **Cont. p4**

**BERN IDENTITY FACES FRESH FOES IN HOPEFUL**

George and Lori Hall's GII Sanford S. hero **Bern Identity** (Bernstein) faces a new set of promising 2-year-olds in today's GII Three Chimneys Hopeful S. at Saratoga, a "Win and You're In" event for the Nov. 3 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The bay followed up a 13 3/4-length diploma-earning romp at Belmont June 1 by showing a new dimension to come from off a hot pace in the July 22 Sanford, but may need to take another step forward to handle the unexposed types here. Among the challengers is Godolphin's **Fortify** (Distorted Humor), a 4 1/2-length debut winner Aug. 4 who garnered the **"TDN Rising Star"** distinction for that unveiling. "He's been our best, for sure," red-hot conditioner Kieran McLaughlin said of the bay, who posted a :46 flat bullet four-furlong work over the strip Aug. 27. "Experience and success give a horse like Bern Identity a big edge, but any of these could be anything. You never know. We could just be plain old better. That's exactly why the Hopeful is properly named." He added, "You're hoping you go forward from here to bigger and better things. We're looking forward to seeing him step up to the next group." **Cont. p11**

So Many Ways entered the Schuylerville with what seemed on paper like a somewhat unassuming six-length debut score at Parx June 9, but she was bet like she couldn't lose that day down to 5-2 favoritism. And she didn't, flying home with an impressive late rally to score by 1 1/2 lengths with a 79 Beyer Speed Figure. She was somewhat overshadowed on that card by Stonestreet's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ and subsequent GII Adirondack S. heroine **Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon), who recorded a 100 Beyer for her 12-length debut romp, but grabbed the spotlight back from another member of that outfit's powerful 2-year-old filly arsenal here. **Dreaming of Julia** (A.P. Indy), another promising Stonestreet runner who was coupled with **Teen Pauline**, was scratched.

**Corail** (Indian Charlie) kept the prohibitive favorite honest early, but proved no match for that foe and dropped back on the far turn. So Many Ways wasn't far behind to pick up the baton, however, and was confidently handled by Castellano, only receiving right-handed reminders once she was clearly in front while perhaps trying to bear out slightly.

"This filly came to Saratoga an infant and just as the weeks went by you could see her turning, putting on weight, growing, maturing," said winning trainer Tony Dutrow, who took last year's Spinaway with **Grace Hall** (Empire Maker). "I didn't know where we would finish today, but I was thinking we'd run better than we did in the Schuylerville." He continued, "I was really feeling very strongly that she would improve off of that today. I didn't know if that was going to be good enough, because I didn't know how good and talented [Teen Pauline] was. I knew she was talented, but I didn't know how good. I'm not surprised, but I sure am happy. She came out of there with running on her mind. Todd [Pletcher's **Corail**] pushed [Teen Pauline], and our filly picked up the pieces. I think I said in the paper that our filly would finish up. We've won it two years in a row now, and I can't believe where I'm standing."

Teen Pauline was flattered Friday when the runner-up from her July 25 unveiling **My Happy Face** (Tiz Wonderful) came back to win by 21 1/4 lengths, but she left her connections scratching their heads with a decided regression here. "I think how heavy the track played today [was a factor]," postulated trainer Steve Asmussen. "They closed like crazy. It was a completely different track than the one she broke her maiden on." Rider **Julien Leparoux** offered, "She put me in the race nicely. She showed me the same speed as before. She was doing it pretty easily, but she couldn't finish today."

Danedream, who first entered the scene with a victory in the G2 Oaks d'Italia last May, scaled the heights in dramatic fashion last term by taking Hoppegarten's G1 Grosser Preis Von Berlin by five lengths in July, this contest--by six lengths from the top-class mare Night Magic (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire})--and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Any doubters as to the merit of her five-length success in the latter race have since been dispelled, with the runner-up Shareta (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) winning the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and the third, fourth, fifth and sixth Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab), So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}), St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Meandre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}) all successful at Group 1 level subsequently. Question marks had appeared over her after two off-the-board efforts and only a workmanlike 3/4-of-a-length verdict over Ovambo Queen in the May 20 G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmer here in the interim period, but she answered them in her indomitable style at Ascot last time. This performance may have been below her battling display against Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), but she kept herself firmly in the picture for another tilt at the Arc at Longchamp Oct. 7.

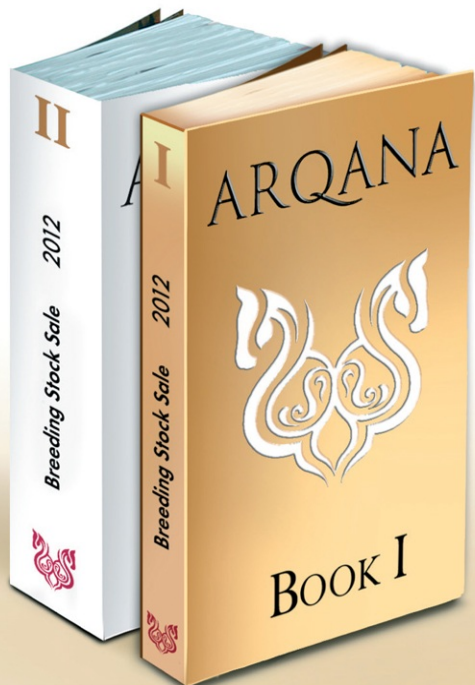

**Shanghai Bobby** is the only other runner in the Hopeful with a stakes victory--he took Belmont's June 27 Track Barron S. with a field's-best 90 Beyer Speed Figure. The two-for-two Starlight Racing representative was scratched from the Aug. 12 GII Saratoga Special after developing a fever, but has posted a pair of local drills in the interim. He's coupled with fellow Todd Pletcher trainee **Lawn Man** (Flatter), who was let go at a surprising 10-1 in his July 28 unveiling, but nonetheless streaked home a 4 1/2-length victor. That event's third-place finisher returned to flatter the form with a graduation tally of his own. Pletcher three-pronged attack is completed with **Overanalyze**, who will carry the colors of leading owner Repole Stable. The \$380,000 KEESEP yearling justified 3-5 odds with a 1 1/4-length 85 Beyer-earning success Aug. 9. Both he and Lawn Man were scratched from yesterday's GIII Sapling S. at Monmouth in favor of this spot. Well-stocked Pletcher is no stranger to having more than one major contender in a graded stakes race, and he explained the logic behind running them against each other. "Maybe some horses will show a little more in the morning than others, but occasionally the dynamics of the race will unfold and perhaps the one you think has a little better chance doesn't perform as well as another one," he said. "In this situation, you take them all over there and hope it works out for well for all of them and that one of them can get lucky and win it."

**Turf Monster cont.**

The 6-year-old, owned by Black Swan Stable and trained by Allen Iwinski, has been off the board just once in 10 starts, and is 10-1 on the morning line. Sean Avery has indicated his readiness with four bullet works at Monmouth since July 2, and he most recently went five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 Aug. 26. Lining up outside the Grade I winner in post 11 will be **Chamberlain Bridge** (War Chant), the 2010 GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint champion who took back-to-back editions of this race in 2009 and 2010. He comes into today's race off a win in the My Frenchman S. at Monmouth Aug. 4 and has been given odds of 8-1. The longshot winner of that race, **Kyma** (Belong to Me), will attempt to make it three straight wins here for owner Thomas G. McClay.

July 28 at Saratoga. Darley homebred **Not a Given** (Any Given Saturday) looks for his fourth-straight win after running away with an optional claimer by 7 1/4 lengths over this distance at Monmouth Aug. 4. **Prospective** (Malibu Moon) looks for his third graded win. He took the GII Tampa Bay Derby and GIII Ohio Derby earlier this year. John Trippi and William A Thayer's **Traffic Light** (Peace Rules) warrants respect off back-to-back wins over this strip. He took the Crowd Pleaser S. by six lengths July 28, and most recently won at optional claimer at this distance to earn a 96 Beyer Speed Figure, the co-highest in the field. **Brimstone Island** (Tiznow) also reached that figure when running second to Grade I winner Paynter (Awesome Again) in a May 19 allowance at Pimlico.

**'Honor' Well; Classic Most Likely Destination...**

Saturday's GI Woodward S. hero **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) exited the race in good order, trainer Bill Mott reported yesterday. "He looks great," said Mott. "It was nice to see him come back." With his gutsy victory over **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) in the nine-furlong Woodward, the Live Oak homebred added a second top-level victory to his resume after beating older horses at three last year in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile. Connections now have a choice to make--to either return to a flat mile and target the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, or stretch out to 1 1/4 miles for the GI Classic. "I think the connections, obviously, if at all possible and if we had a chance, would like to run in the Classic," trainer Bill Mott said yesterday, adding that he's considering a race for To Honor and Serve, who retires to stud at Gainesway next year, before then. "Looking at the Belmont schedule for him, maybe we'd have a look at the GII Kelso H. [going one mile Sept. 29], although it's going back from a Grade 1 to a Grade 2, and it's a handicap, so we'd have to see what happens with the weights," said Mott. "It's on the list of things to think about." The Hall of Fame conditioner added, "There's nothing wrong with having a little momentum, a regular schedule [going into the Breeders' Cup]. I mean, Cigar ran in the Woodward, the Jockey Club Gold Cup, and the Breeders' Cup Classic, and it wasn't too much for him. But there aren't many Cigars, I suppose." The mention of Cigar brought to Mott's mind another of his many champions, Theatrical (Ire), who died Friday at the age of 30. A winner of \$2.9 million and 10 of his 22 career starts, including six Grade 1s, Theatrical went on to sire 81 stakes winners. "He was probably one of the best horses I ever trained, or ever will train," said Mott. "He was my first champion, my first Breeders' Cup [1987 Turf] winner. He won six Grade 1 stakes my first year in New York, and I trained a ton of stakes winners by him. He bought my first home in New York, single-handedly. He was probably the most life-changing horse I ever had."

**RACETRACK ROUND-UP**

**McLaughlin Mulls BC Spot for Emcee...**

Just as connections of To Honor and Serve have a Breeders' Cup decision to make, so to do the connections of Saturday's GI Forego S. winner **Emcee** (Unbridled's Song). Kieran McLaughlin, who trains the 4-year-old Godolphin homebred, said the six-furlong GI Breeders' Cup Sprint was the probable target, though the GI Dirt Mile is also under consideration. "Most likely [we would look at the Sprint]," McLaughlin said. "I just sent an email to Simon [Crisford, Godolphin racing manager] that we have to discuss. The difference is that the mile is two turns at Santa Anita. If it was one turn, like at Belmont, we'd be talking more about it, but thinking about two turns, it changes a lot. We're probably better sprinting. It's just that [in the Mile] we'd probably be on the lead, and is that where we want to be?" McLaughlin said the colt exited the Forego in fine fettle and could have one more start before the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita Nov. 3, possibly in the GI Vosburgh Invitational at Belmont Sept. 29. "The Vosburgh is a question mark," McLaughlin said. "That's another thing I'm going to talk to Simon about. Because he did run back in four weeks here, and he had a little gap before that, but we could do either. He'll stay here, [to train at] Greentree." McLaughlin also provided updates for Godolphin's other stakes runners. GI Travers S. dead-heater **Alpha** (Bernardini) was confirmed for the GII Pennsylvania Derby at Parx Sept. 22. **Questing (GB)** (Hard Spun), who annexed the GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks and GI Alabama S., also goes to Parx on the same day for the GI Cotillion H. **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft), meanwhile, will join Emcee at Belmont on Super Saturday for a start in the GI Beldame Invitational.

It's the 19th century and the place to be is Europe's summer capital, the spa town of Baden-Baden. Here, the aristocracy, the rich and the famous come to while away the hot summer days. Bathing in the thermal springs like the Romans of old and gambling away their fortunes in the casino at night. Here you will find Queen Victoria, Napoleon III and Wilhelm I. And while Brahms and Berlioz compose masterpieces,

Dostoevsky loses his shirt and writes *The Gambler*. Presiding over the casino is an enigmatic Frenchman, Edouard Benazet. A man who understands the desires of the rich and famous. He decorates the stately rooms along the lines of the French palaces, using only the very best that Paris has to offer. He gathers musicians and actors to entertain his clientele and as another form of entertainment, he builds the Iffezheim racecourse. In the autumn of 1858, on Sept. 5th, the first Grosser Preis takes place and a French filly, La Maladetta returns victorious to the delight of the crowd. Fast forward 154 years give or take a couple of days and it is almost as if the ghost of Benazet, still presides over his beloved Baden-Baden as the casino and the racing world, come together once more.

In the sumptuous rooms, where the white ball still rolls every night, there is again a gathering of the rich and the famous, as owners, trainers and invited guests arrive for the Grand Prix Ball. Held on the eve of the Grosser Preis von Baden and in honour of the great filly, Danedream, it is heralded as the social event of the year.

A 100 meters of red carpet, stretching up the casino's imposing staircase, greet the guests as they make their grand entrance, premiere style, while the town's residents crowd the velvet ropes, cameras in hand.

One is transported back in time to the great salons of Europe as the Philharmonic

Orchestra of Baden-Baden opens the evening's entertainment with a Viennese waltz. The casino's ballroom is instantly transformed into a swirling kaleidoscope of colour as couples in stately ball gowns, dinner jackets and the odd tailcoat take to the floor.

During a brief interlude when the first of many courses is served, Andreas Jacobs, President of Baden Racing and the Lord Mayor of Baden-Baden, Wolfgang Gerstner, welcome the assembled guests. The summer capital of Europe has a long history of providing only the very best and it is therefore no surprise that the evening's cuisine is created by Martin Hermann, a two-star Michelin chef.

In a moving ceremony, Danedream is recognised as the Racehorse of the Year and owner Heiko Volz recounts his feelings when he saw her heading for the line in solitary splendour in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and then dig down deep to win the G1 King George. There is a tremor in his voice, that is perfectly understood by all assembled, as he pays tribute to this once in a lifetime filly.

But there is more dancing to be done. The orchestra leads the guests from the quick step to the cha cha, back to the waltz and then onwards to the tango and the foxtrot after a brief flirtation with the rumba. When weary feet need a rest, the casino's balcony offers a welcome respite, as a fireworks display, accompanied by music, lights up the night sky. And just when you think that this magical evening can surely deliver no more, the lights are dimmed and out of the darkness, surrounded by a sea of sparks, waiters appear, carrying in the fourth and final course.

All too soon, a new day dawns, the coach has turned back into a pumpkin and the fairytale is over. In a few hours, the 2012 Grosser Preis von Baden will be run, with a new champion waiting to be crowned. But for now as the orchestra plays on in my head, I am left with memories of an extraordinary night, a magical night, where the past blended into the future and once again, Baden-Baden was the only place to be.

## *They Dared to Dream...*

"I have a dream, a fantasy  
To help me through reality  
And my destination makes it worth the while" --ABBA

Sunday was no ordinary race day in Baden-Baden, in fact, it was a rather extraordinary day in many ways, for two sets of people, who both had something in common and whose paths were destined to be closely intertwined. It is simple really, they dared to dream. They dared to dream, to go beyond reality as ABBA so aptly put it, as the final destination makes it all worthwhile.

Two years ago in 2010, the Baden-Baden racecourse at Iffezheim was bankrupt, the dream was over, the creditors took what they could and short of breaking down the buildings, they took pretty much everything. It seemed the end of an era, a sad ending for Germany's well known racetrack. Yet one man dared to dream. He refused to accept the inevitable, instead he held fast to the belief that with careful planning and management, the Baden-Baden racetrack could be saved. Dr. Andreas Jacobs gathered some friends with the appropriate business skills and together they took over the running of the racetrack under the auspices of Baden Racing. Being a very astute businessman, Jacobs was certainly not just following his heart. He had a firm belief that if run on good business principles, the track should be able to break even. In order to achieve this, he put together the best team possible to get the track back on its feet.

Two years down the road, the Great Festival Week culminated in the running of the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. In glorious sunshine, the crowds thronged to the Iffezheim track, causing a traffic jam all the way to the highway. Gone were the empty gutted stands, instead, more than 16000 people soaked up the sun and the vibrant, carnival atmosphere. From hat vendors, to champagne stands, places for children to play and elegant ladies parading with their fashionable pouches or shouting for their favourite, the race track offered it all. From the high rollers to the novices, everybody was catered for and the throngs around the parade ring were reminiscent of Royal Ascot with Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) running.



**Danedream**

The team at Baden-Baden has certainly got it right. With the fashions both period and contemporary, the day somehow managed to evoke a carnival atmosphere that was thoroughly enjoyable and yet the racing was deadly serious and of the highest order. A day that should certainly feature on the calendars of racegoers across the world.

Two years ago, in 2010, a man bought a filly at a breeze-up sale in Baden-Baden for a mere €9000, dreaming as all buyers do, that perhaps this one would be the ugly duckling that turns into a swan. She was neither big nor particularly well bred, despite being by champion sire Lomitas, who ironically in this twisted tale, belongs to Jacobs. Two people saw something in the slight filly, her future trainer, Peter Schiergen and her buyer Heiko Volz. Neither may have dreamt of the heights that the filly would take them to, but they had a dream and they looked beyond the reality to a possible destination. That filly was Danedream, Germany's newest Horse of the Year and, on this extraordinary race day, she was attempting to win her second Grosser Preis von Baden against some stiff opposition. Danedream followed her victory in last year's Grosser Preis, with a total domination of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe before she taught Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) a lesson in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth. Now she was up against Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}), the G1 German Derby winner as well as the runner-up, Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}). Yet despite a slow run race, Danedream toyed with her younger opposition, before flicking her tail at them and winning comfortably for the second year in a row. The Arc beckons next, can she do the unthinkable, can she win an Arc double? Only time will tell, but in the words of her part owner Heiko Volz, win or lose, it is already an incredible story. A story of a slight filly, a filly with the heart of a lion, a filly who simply refuses to be beaten and men who dared to dream.

Today was no ordinary race day, two sets of people each had a dream, they dreamt of something beyond the reality of their respective situations, of a destination that would make it all worthwhile and today both achieved that dream.

We have given our two TDN crack handicappers, Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack, a mythical \$1000 bankroll and told them they can bet no more than 5% of that on any given day at Saratoga on a straight win bet. The winner, at the end of the meet, gets \$100 in a TVG betting account, along with bragging rights until next July.

**DiDonato: Sunday** - Another lead change! How exciting has this been? Well-backed **Cue the Moon** overcame tons of adversity to score first out at a well-bet 4-1. Anybody want to give me odds on her for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies? She might be the real deal going longer. So it all comes down to this... Steve and I have been discussing our picks and bet sizes beforehand every day mostly so there's no overlap, but for today, we're doing it blind to keep things fair. It would be a lot easier for me to know what I should do to try to protect my small lead if I knew who he was picking, but that's no fun. Hopefully I don't do something stupid. Good luck, Steve. Either way, this has been really fun and I'm proud of how well we've both done.

**Monday - Race 1 - Msw, 2yo, 1 1/16mT - #5 Draw Two (7-2)**

**Draw Two** was supposed to be the horse I took my big stand with when he was entered in a similar spot Aug. 11, but Steve and I were at the track that weekend, so rain inevitably forced things off the grass. I've been waiting to bet him back ever since, and this would be a fitting spot to do it. Here's my [analysis](#) from last time--nothing has changed on that front obviously. What's probably more important today is the logic behind the size of my bet and expected price of my pick--there's some interesting game theory at work here. First off, obviously the correct amount to bet is the most possible without losing the lead if Steve scratches through all his picks somehow. He's never going to bet a small enough amount or pick a short enough price that I'd be able to protect my lead by just betting \$2 if he hits. My first inclination was that I needed to pick a bomb to protect against the possibility of Steve going for a big price, but he usually goes for horses in the 2-1 to 5-1 range, so I don't really see him going for a double-digit runner this time--especially when it's a must-win situation. I think Draw Two will go off at about 3-1 (I think he's more like 2-1 or even 3-2 to win), so if he wins the first I'll go up about \$165. If Steve makes a max bet, he'll need to hit a little higher than a 2.6-1 shot to take the lead. That's at the lower end of his range, but I'd rather protect against the more likely winners. **Play:** \$42 Win.

**Alternate 1:** Race 8 - \$42 Win on #4 Imperial Pippin (Turf Only).

**Alternate 2:** Race 9 - \$42 Win on #5 Majestic Hussar.

**DiDonato Bankroll: \$1,298.90 - Record: 36-5-4-6**

**Sherack: Sunday** - **Twigazuri Strait** finally got a hot pace to run into, but still never fired at an underlayed 5-1 and finished sixth. Wish I had stayed loyal to a pair of my previous winners in this contest--**Unbridled Command** (\$22.60) and **So Many Ways** (\$9.80)--who both followed up in style with a graded stakes rolling double (\$133). DiDonato's pick somehow overcame a nightmare trip to get him back into the lead heading into the final day. It's normal for a 33-year-old to be experiencing chest pains, right?

**Monday - Race 6 - Msw, 2yo, 5 1/2f - #1 Stage Street (5-2)**

Of all the tough beats that I've experienced this summer, **Stage Street** getting reeled in to finish second is one of a handful that has really stuck with me, even if he was only even-money. The Mike McCarty colorbearer took a hard bump at the start after exiting from the one hole that day, and Leparoux did a remarkable job just to stay aboard. Stage Street recovered nicely to chase a hot pace in third over a sloppy track, looked like he was home free after shooting through a huge opening along the inside at the top of the stretch, but just couldn't fend off the Pletcher/Starlight firster Park City and came up a length short. Stage Street has been unfortunately drawn on the rail again, but has a *huge* experience edge on his rivals here, composed of all first-time starters (not including the AEs). With a clean break this time, Stage Street will be long gone. **Play:** \$62 Win (All In). **Alternate 1:** Race 1 - \$62 Win (Turf Only) on #1 Noble Tune. **Alternate 2:** Race 2 - \$62 Win (Turf Only) on #5 Carson Hall.

**Sherack Bankroll: \$1,256.30 - Record: 39-9-4-4**

**CTHS ONTARIO-BRED SALE BEGINS TONIGHT**

The Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society's annual Ontario-bred yearling sale will kick off tonight at 7 p.m. at the Woodbine Sales Pavilion at Woodbine Racetrack, with the first 70 of 230 hips for the select session going under the hammer. The select session will continue Tuesday at 1 p.m., and an open session consisting of 156 yearlings will take place Saturday, beginning at 3 p.m. At last year's select session, 219 yearlings sold for a gross of \$4,803,500, with an average of \$32,456 and a median of \$25,000. This year's catalogue features yearlings by prominent sires like Awesome Again, Corinthian, English Channel, Ghostzapper, Kitten's Joy, Stormy Atlantic and Tiz Wonderful, as well as leading Ontario-based sires Bold Executive, Milwaukee Brew, Old Forester, Where's the Ring, Trajectory, and the recently exported Philanthropist. A colt by Giant Gizmo--Uproar, by Hail the Ruckus, a half-brother to 2011 Queen's Plate winner Pender Harbour (Philanthropist), will sell as [Hip 118](#). Partnered with Ramon Dominguez, the bay miss broke from the rail draw and tucked in behind in fourth as favored Liquid Lunch (Street Sense) and Lucky Friend (Friends Lake) led the way. At the 3/16ths pole, Cue the Moon attempted to split rivals, but was shut off abruptly and forced to angle wide as fellow firster Emollient (Empire Maker) drove to the front. Cue the Moon quickly caught up with and passed that foe before cruising under the wire a half-length in front. The winner is a half to three stakes horses, including Red Hot Buddha (Buddha), MSW, \$230,022. Her winning dam is a half to MGSW Hurricane Bertie (Storm Boot) and MGSW Allamerican Bertie (Quiet American), with graded winners Sun King (Charismatic) and Ocean Drive (Belong to Me) falling under the third dam. Doubled, one of the most experienced members of the field with three previous starts, finished third on debut in a 4 1/2-furlong dash at Parx July 3, then came back to win by a nose in a similar test July 24. Moved to the grass for the local Colleen S., she ran an even third, and was looking to prove the public's 15-1 quote a disrespectful price in this return to the main track. The gray was outsprinted early--along with everyone else--as rank outsider Back to Class (Montbrook) bowled along through :21 2/5 and :44 2/5 splits while maintaining a big lead. As that one began to tire, l'mclassyandsassy looked like she'd race on by to victory on the outside, but a rail-skimming Doubled scooted on through leaving the furlong grounds and outfinished the chalk to win going away. On Sept. 3 and 4, the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society's annual Ontario-bred Select Yearling Sale will take place at the Woodbine Sales Pavilion at Woodbine Racetrack near Toronto, with an Open session to follow Sept. 8.

Ontario horse racing has been hit this year with the provincial government's shock cancellation of the Slots at Racetracks program, a successful partnership with the province's racinos that has helped fund purses and breeders awards for almost 15 years. The *TDN* caught up with CTHS President Glenn Sikura, who also owns and runs the Canadian division of Hill N' Dale Farm, to discuss how the current instabilities in the province will affect the Ontario-bred yearling sales.

**TDN: With everything that's going on in Ontario at the moment, what are your expectations leading into the sales?**

**GS:** Extreme caution, obviously. We're getting messages from government, and I guess depending on whether you're optimistic or not, you could take the messages in a different way. There's been a panel that was appointed by the provincial government [the horse industry transition panel] that had three former agricultural ministers on it, and they came up with several recommendations [in an interim report released Aug. 17. [Click to read report](#)]. The most important things they noted were, first and foremost, that the public good is the first thing they have to be able to satisfy, and they came to the conclusion that horse racing was in the public good. The next statement of importance was that racetracks could not survive without income above and beyond parimutuel wagering. So I think if you put the two of those things together, [horse racing is] for the public good and can't survive on just parimutuel, it would lead you to think that maybe there's some room to work out an acceptable deal, some other form of gaming at the racetrack that would be able to sustain us. So it's come a long way from the original mandate of this panel, which was merely to transition us from where we are now to other vocations, to actually coming up with a sustainable model for the industry. I'm absolutely convinced that the people that were making these decisions had no idea of the impacts of what they were doing.

So it's been a real educational process and I think they're catching on somewhat at this point in time. Obviously for the sale, we still would have liked to have heard any number of reassurances that we've yet to hear, but what we have heard is that they're fully prepared to work with us and come up with something where we can have a sustainable industry.

**TDN: Do you think the positive reinforcements that were in the interim report released by the panel will help give buyers more confidence than they may have had a few weeks ago?**

**GS:** I hope everybody takes some time and gives [the interim report] a significant looking over. Again, they're not concrete recommendations at this point, but they're recommendations, and the government doesn't have to adopt them. So I think it depends on your level of cynicism or your level of optimism. That's going to have an affect on your purchasing habits.

**TDN: Is there a fear that sales prices will be significantly down this year?**

**GS:** I think we're all frightened. Obviously we still hope that it won't be, but there's definitely a fear that things aren't going to be as good as they should be. We're hopeful that the negative, which is the uncertainty currently locally, could potentially inspire some opportunism, particularly for out-of-town buyers. We have an inward buyers program, so if someone were to come up here and spend at least \$20,000 on a horse, they would get their hotel and whatnot reimbursed. We remain hopeful that some pinhookers and others might see this as an opportunity to come up here and catch a great day or two of racing and potentially, if there is a depressed market, it's an opportunity for them [to buy yearlings at value].

**TDN: Has the CTHS been doing anything to market the additional benefits of Ontario-breds aside from the opportunity to collect significant breeders awards competing in Ontario? Ontario-breds like Marketing Mix, who was second in the GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 18, have shown these horses can compete on an international stage.**

**GS:** That was really meant to be the focus of our advertising this year, because even though we've got more answers now than we did six weeks ago, it was felt that what we needed to show people was not that we sell good horses for Woodbine, but that we sell good horses full stop. The horses we sell here can go elsewhere and compete, so that was meant to be the focus of advertising campaigns this year. I said to one of the girls in the office, go and get absolutely every graded stake that a sales graduate has finished first, second or third, and advertise that. There's not a lot of reasons for [Ontario-breds] to go elsewhere because the purses have always been so good here, at least for the last several years, so why would you bother competing out of the province? *Cont. p14*



One of the quandaries we're going to have [at the sales] is with the Ontario-sires program. That program has really gotten strong over the years. The catalogue does have a lot of Ontario sire produce, so some people that don't compete up here won't be as familiar with those horses. My consignment would be leaning more towards Kentucky-based stallions because that's how I've always done business in the past, but I think the trend overall has been that a lot of breeders up here have moved towards the Ontario sires program. And part of that has led to some better stallions coming here, like Philanthropist and Old Forester. Horses like that previously wouldn't have been horses to stand here, but the program has gotten strong enough over the past few years to sustain them. Philanthropist bred, I think, 107 mares [last year], so why bother moving him? He has subsequently been sold to South Africa.

The catalogue does have a lot of Ontario-sired products. We're hopeful that will stir up some local presence at the sale, and that the foreigners that do buy will buy with the intention of racing at Woodbine. The panel has affirmed that the Ontario sires program and the Thoroughbred Improvement Program are of the utmost importance to the health of the industry, but that's about as far as they can really go. They can't tell you numbers, they can't tell you exactly what the purses are going to be. If you're prepared to take a leap, you can have some assurance that the panel that's making the recommendations is going to push very hard to do what they can to keep the purses at the highest possible level.

**TDN: How has that ad campaign worked out?**

**GS:** I think it's been okay. You're always concerned with advertising whether you really get bang for your buck or not. How effective it has been, I guess we won't know until Monday night or Tuesday at the sale. We have a great office staff, they've been very aggressive in calling owners and trainers in the States and encouraging them to come to the sale. Being right before Keeneland is not the best timing for us, that's 4000 to chose from down there and 250 here. It's a tough sell sometimes.

**TDN: How have the breeding and sales consignment industries already been affected by the government's decisions so far this year?**

**GS:** We know they have been, and maybe Philanthropist has been an example, or maybe not. There's a horse that presumably could have had a long career in Ontario, but with the uncertainty and the fact that somebody had ready cash, they moved him along. There were a lot of people that didn't breed back mares this year. There were people that decided not to breed to Ontario sires, but to breed to sires in the States, thinking there would be a larger market if they had to sell the foal down the road. Things have taken a nose dive up here. There's definitely been an impact. Some boarders on my farm, either from the States or out of province that have registered Ontario-bred foals, haven't brought their mares back here.

One of my longest clients foaled his mares here, he does every year, and he took them to Kentucky to have them re-bred. When I asked him about bringing them back here, he said, 'Why would I do that?' So that cost me six stalls.

**TDN: Is the number of horses catalogued down for this year's sales?**

**GS:** The select sale is the same, but we have a cap of 240 to 250 horses, so it's the best 240 or 250. The open yearling sale is down about 20%, so there may well be some people that were worried that the market wouldn't be strong enough and decided to hold onto their horses, or maybe they've been able to [sell] them pre-sale. Or perhaps they're just not prepared to go through and spend the couple thousand dollars required to make it through the sale ring, from the halter and the shipping to the day rate and commissions and everything else. They're either going to keep them or find another home for them.

**TDN: Is there anything else you would like to tell the readers about what's happening in Ontario?**

**GS:** There was a rally today [of Ontario horse racing participants outside the provincial government offices in Toronto]. One of the opposition parties, the Progressive-Conservative Party, has a [member of parliament] that has put a motion through, and it has called the auditor general to go through the whole cancellation issue and see if the economics support the cancellation of the program [that motion has subsequently been passed].

Very interestingly, two of the three [political] parties were supportive, so there were members from both the New Democrats Party and the PC Parties that got together on this issue. The Liberals [the governing party that has implemented the cancellations] would be Left Wing, the [PC party] would be very Republican in nature, and the NDPs would be someone left of the Democrats, but they had the most left leaning and the most right leaning political parties standing on a podium together, clenching hands and saying, 'We're not going to let this go down without a fight.' It was inspiring today.

I don't see how, with the mathematics of this, it can be anything but a grave error to cancel the program. That's not to say there shouldn't be some accountability and bench marking. It's such good value for [the government], and there's no way they can replace the program in short order. How on earth are you going to replace \$1.1 billion in income by next March? That's their cut from it. How they think in four or five months that they could have another program in place to replace that income, that's just fiscally insane.
