### ANNIVERSARY GIFT AT DEL MAR

It was only fitting that Arnold Zetcher's **Rolling Fog** (Posse) rounded out the 75th anniversary season at Del Mar with a victory in the oceanside oval's traditional closing day feature, the GI Del Mar Futurity.

Yesterday, Zetcher, the former chairman, president and CEO of Talbots, was also celebrating his wedding anniversary with his wife of 30 years, Ellen. Despite being trained by Bob Baffert, who had already collected the marquee test for juvenile colts on 10 prior occasions,

Rolling Fog was dismissed at generous odds of 7-1. The Florida-bred pressed **Caballo Del Cielo** (Songandaprayer) through an opening half in :45.89. When jockey Rafael Bejarano gave the colt his cue turning for home, Rolling Fog answered with no hesitation, drawing clear to score by 1 1/4 lengths over favored **Know More** (Lion Heart). **Scherer Magic** (Doneraile Court) was third. "This horse had been training so great and he ran to it," said Bejarano. "Great trip; everything worked out perfect. The distance was a bit of a question in my mind with him, but now I see he can handle it. In fact, I think he'll go longer. A really good race for him. He's a nice horse." As for the beaten favorite, Garrett Gomez explained, "We were down inside and that wasn't the place where you wanted to be. He was back behind horses for the first time and he was having a bit of a hard time figuring it out. But I got him out and we made our run. Not the right day to be doing that. All the front runners are holding up this afternoon." **Cont. p3**

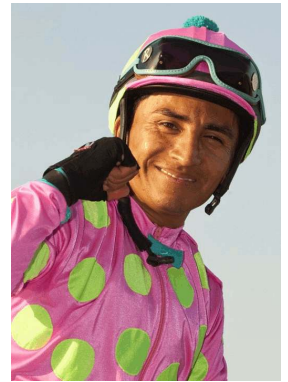
### Baffert/Bejarano Set Del Mar Records...

Trainer Bob Baffert, who came into this closing day affair after a roller coaster few weeks, recorded his 11th win in the Del Mar Futurity, eight more than his nearest pursuer, D. Wayne Lukas. Despite maintaining a stranglehold on the west coast training ranks, Baffert's unprecedented success was bittersweet after suffering serious blows, both personally and professionally, over the past month. Zayat Stables GI Haskell Invitational S. winner Paynter (Awesome Again) became ill following his impressive 3 3/4-length score in the July 29 at Monmouth Park and was later diagnosed with colitis. Earlier this week, the bay was found to be also battling laminitis. In a double stroke of bad luck for the barn, stablemate **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker), runner-up in this spring's GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., was retired because of a shoulder injury after several weeks of head scratching and diagnostic tests. However, Baffert experienced the biggest blow Monday when his father, Bill Baffert Sr., passed away at his home in Nogales, Arizona. Affectionately known as "The Chief," he was 88.

Notably absent for yesterday's win, Baffert tweeted shortly after the victory, "I think The Chief gave Rolling Fog a little push turning for home."

That, he certainly did.

Also establishing a landmark win on closing day, jockey Rafael Bejarano rounded out the 2012 season in fine style by securing a record 13th stakes victory during a single season at Del Mar. Bejarano was recording his first win in the seven-furlong contest. When asked about his success at Del Mar, Bejarano simply stated, "Sweet. Oh, so sweet."

A \$62,000 OBSAPR juvenile graduate, Rolling Fog marked his debut the right way with a 2 1/4-length score going 5 1/2 panels at Del Mar Aug. 4. But according to Jim Barnes, assistant to Bob Baffert, the progressive colt was due to kick off sooner. "This horse was ready to run when we left Santa Anita," stated Barnes. "He was one of our top horses when we left Santa Anita, but we got down here and worked him a couple of times and he was struggling with the track a bit. We entered him and he got in, then he ran a low-grade fever and we had to scratch." What seemed like a setback, appeared to be a blessing in disguise. "That was probably the best thing, because then we worked him a couple more times and won the first time out," said Barnes. "He just kept improving on this track and he really likes dirt, I know that. Look for better things from him in the future."

## DEL MAR 75TH SEASON CONCLUDES

*Horsemen's parting thoughts collected on the final morning of the 75th anniversary Del Mar meeting:*

**Richard Mandella, Hall of Fame trainer:** "I can't believe the meet is over. It seems like we just unpacked. The older I get, the faster it goes by. I love it here and it's a shame we don't get to stay longer. We had a nice meet, started some 2-year-olds and hopefully, they'll continue to pop up and have some success the rest of the year. We've had some tough beats, but we've got a lot of experience at that."

**Dr. Rick Arthur, CHRB equine medical director:** "I think it has been a very successful meeting. The trainers are happy with the track, which is unusual for any racetrack. I think overall it has gone quite well. People are happy, field sizes are up and I think it's very encouraging not just for Del Mar but for the Southern California thoroughbred circuit. "There's never a perfect meeting (regarding horse breakdowns), but I think it's better than it was before the (Polytrack) surface was put down in 2007. I think they're getting much more experience at managing the track."

"It was very exciting, as you could imagine," Mcdiarmid said. "To get beaten by a matter of feet in the biggest two races in the country--it was O.K. the first time, but the second time was rather hard to swallow!"

Mcdiarmid continued, "Bodemeister was one of the best things that's ever happened to Audley. We had a wonderful time with it. We were very kindly taken care of by his owners when we went to the Derby and they treated us quite well. Just to breed a horse like him was the goal that we've been shooting for in my 13 years at the farm."

While the Zayat and Moreno colorbearer's racing career was unfortunately cut short as he heads off to join the 2013 stallion roster at WinStar Farm, Bodemeister's yearling half-sister by leading sire Smart Strike will begin her journey to carry the torch for the family when she heads into the ring as [hip 45](#) during the select portion of the upcoming Keeneland September sale.

"She's a beautiful filly," Audley Farm's Equine Consultant Dr. Jens von Lepel D.V.M., who has advised the Liebrechts for 25 years, commented. "I think she's one of the best fillies that we've ever brought to Keeneland or Fasig-Tipton. She's a typical Smart Strike filly and has a beautiful stride. She really gets into it the more you go. She has a beautiful attitude."

McDiarmid added, "The mare definitely throws to the stallion, which is great. We're very pleased with [the Smart Strike filly]. She's a beautiful filly to have even if you didn't have Bodemeister."

Bodemeister, the second foal from the 8-year-old graded stakes

winner Untouched Talent, brought \$260,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2010. The **"TDN Rising Star"** was consigned by Brookdale Sales on behalf of Audley Farm.

"Bodemeister was a gorgeous colt, too," von Lepel said. "The only thing is Empire Maker was not that commercial yet at that time. I think it would be a different story if you sell an Empire Maker like him today, especially out of a mare like Untouched Talent. Bodemeister made it a wonderful springtime for us here at the farm, and we hope that he has a very good second career as a sire at WinStar."

The lightly raced Untouched Talent, heroine of the 2006 Gill Sorrento S. and runner-up in the GI Del Mar Debutante S., was purchased by Audley for \$1.2 million while in foal to Unbridled's Song at the 2007 KEENOV sale. She foaled a Tiznow filly in 2012 and was bred back to Unbridled's Song. Untouched Talent, produced by multiple graded stakes winner Parade Queen (A.P. Indy), will be heading to the ring in a couple of months at the Fasig-November Sale.

"It's the owner's decision [to sell]," von Lepel explained. "We will keep the Tiznow filly from this year. That way, we will still have the family; she's a beautiful filly."

The team at Audley Farm will still have plenty of business to take care of in September before saying goodbye to their prized possession later this fall. Through the Brookdale consignment, Audley will also offer a trio of yearlings in Book 2, including [hip 174](#), a Broken Vow-Pink Champagne colt; [hip 612](#), a Tapit-Cee's Irish colt; and [hip 720](#), an Empire Maker-Dundrummin' colt from the family of Proud Citizen.

"We have a small crop [for Keeneland] this year," said McDiarmid, adding that Audley is predominantly a breed-to-sell operation which currently houses 16 mares.

"We have four yearlings in the first week, so we're very happy with the positions that Keeneland gave us. We have a very good level of quality."

He continued, "We have a Tapit who is a beautiful late May foal, a Broken Vow that is a *knockout*, and an Empire Maker that looks like a little speedy race car. We have four very nice ones for the first week and we also have an Arch colt ([hip 1729](#)) for the following Sunday, and he will be a very nice horse on that day."

McDiarmid and von Lepel are both quick to recognize the deep tradition of Audley Farm--which was once operated by George Washington's family in the 1700s and legendary owners Montfort and B.B. Jones in the early 1900s--and the importance of the Virginia breeding industry. In addition to Bodemeister, Audley Farm has also bred GISW and millionaire Mandy's Gold, and graded stakes winners Eagleton, Miss Union Avenue and Night Fax.

"It's amazing here," von Lepel concluded. "In 2008 we celebrated the 30-year anniversary of the Liebrecht family's ownership at Audley by adding a statue of Sir Barton in front of the barn where he began his breeding career. We still have his barn from the 1920s--it's been completely renovated and is really wonderful. Virginia produces some nice horses. It's great horse country. Secretariat came from Virginia and Mr. Evans bred a lot of very good horses here, too."

Don't forget to add Bodemeister to that list now, too. --SS

## IN THE HORSE BUSINESS EVERY CLOUD HAS A SILVER LINING

As storm clouds of dire market forecasts for upcoming auctions swirled about them, Australian breeders have made their annual pilgrimage to Hunter Valley studs and Victoria's breeding farms to meet the new boys--the 2012 intake of shuttle and colonial-bred stallions available for their first use in the coming season.

Aware that mare numbers have halved and new foals will barely reach 15,000 this year--the lowest since 1979--Thoroughbred breeders I met again demonstrated in conversation their hardiness and ability to roll with the punches in the face of bad news. Whilst results from American and European sales bounce around the bottom, a long way from the halcyon days of 2008, forecasting here is that the traditional January--April sales will be tough on the seller with the resilient Australian economy facing the cold realities that have chilled the rest of the world for the past five years.

I talked with optimists saying that yearling sales defy the norm, that there is a cheerful bunch of buyers or the odd billionaire who appear each year, apparently unaffected by the normal business cycle. While I agree this has been true in the past, it is hard to see another white knight like Nathan Tinkler, investor of A\$300 million in bloodstock over the past five years, appearing on the horizon in the current economic climate.

In fact Tinkler's travails with his coal mining ventures and share plays feeling the backwash of China's slowing economy has focused the nation's press on his Patinack Farm's October downsizing of 350 horses as signs his status as Australia's richest man under 40 is about to unravel. The fact his horses cost him A\$500,000 a week has the nation aghast, and the serious accusation he has not paid legally required super-annuation entitlements to his racing and breeding staff since last November is stark evidence there are giant cracks in the Tinkler Thoroughbred edifice. Reading these negative headlines over recent weeks is cold comfort to the Thoroughbred world and Tinkler's unreserved sale on the Gold Coast will be a litmus test of the health of our industry and a precursor to the coming yearling sales.

Or maybe not.

Without diminishing the reverberations if Tinkler crashes, this is a resilient business. It has seen rich men come and go (often men from the mining industry like the Foyster family, huge owners in the 70s who have disappeared). It has proved time and time again that it is bigger than the individual and no one dominates it.

And that was the point made forcefully during the breeder invasion of the Hunter. Tinkler, hailed as a savior when he first emerged, was discussed, but his rise and predicted fall was not an obsessional topic. Nor was the far more important decision that is due any day, the handing down in Sydney of Justice Alan Robertson's view on the legality or otherwise of artificial breeding that has the potential to change the Thoroughbred business forever. Opposed by the breeding establishment worldwide the application to allow AI in Thoroughbreds--begun exactly one year ago--has been pursued under anti-trust/restrictive trade law by disaffected breeder, former Sydney bookmaker Bruce McHugh. McHugh's passion is driven by anger that his application some years ago to artificially inseminate horses on his own property was in his view dismissed out of hand and without discussion by the stud book and racing officials. His personally financed A\$3-million case has shaken the Australian industry, cost it A\$7-million in legal fees and rocked the large stallion farms to the core--yet as a topic of discussion it is under the radar.

What horsemen discuss when they get together is horses--and may it always be the case. While the studs, apart from Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation, noticeably cut back on the largesse in hospitality when entertaining the visiting breeders, the topic around most dinner tables or bars was what was the best value; stallions who would give the greatest return in 26 months time when the progeny is sold. Indeed, that is a discussion for the ages, but more poignant in a season where the stud's use the witty slogan 'austerity is the new extravagance!' Whether there is truth to their claim that stallion fees are now more in line with expected returns will again be told a couple of years down the track.

But while the pressure is on to make choices, the breeders are searching for immediate answers. Invariably the concept of shuttle stallions came up. While most think the shuttle business has been a failure, defenders of the faith utter one word--Danehill. While his breed-changing influence in both hemispheres is unchallenged, it is remembered that even Danehill was similar to a lot of very fine horses; at first, at least, he worked better in one hemisphere than the other. Of course, he caught up, but in his initial years his Australian race success was far greater than up north.

And in more recent times the success of More Than Ready Down Under has confounded the critics with his influence greater here than in the U.S. This son of Southern Halo further confounds the mold by being a hit here, yet he raced on dirt, seen as the downfall of most imported U.S. sires.

These discussions, particularly late at night, throw up more questions than answers, but one of the reasons given for More Than Ready's success here is that he nicks well with Danehill mares. Naturally there are more of them here than in the States, despite the suffix 'USA' appearing after Danehill's name. I suppose that makes sense. What a confusing business this is.

Still there must be some answers why Galileo is a lion in Europe and a lamb in Australia? Why U.S. giants like Unbridled's Song, Giant's Causeway and Honor and Glory were all tried here without leaving an imprint. The argument says shuttle stallions don't work here, with the result that there are markedly fewer today than in the recent past, having shrunk from 65 in 2004 to 40 this season.

Still there are always those willing to persist. Arrowfield, a pioneer shuttler which has cause to be suspicious having experienced more than a few disappointments, unveiled the impressive Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat), while Coolmore unwrapped Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), earning some admiring glances from those looking for that elusive speed influence.

And surely that is what it's about--there is no greater feeling than looking at a stallion and imagining what he will do for your mare. It's eternal, reassuring for the breeder, because as long as they make horses, there will be somebody wanting to try them--and hopefully somebody to buy them!

We desperately need more unconventional thinking, along with the funding to support it, in order to decipher an extremely complex medical puzzle; in autoimmune diseases our own defense system turns against a part of our body, like that uniformed Afghan soldier who turned around and shot the people he was supposed to defend.

In the case of Crohn's and ulcerative colitis, the two major inflammatory bowel diseases (IBDs), the defense system attacks the intestines. Until now, these remain incurable diseases. In the worst cases, the patient will lose a part or all of their intestines.

But for medical researchers, it is easier to discover a defense against a foreign invader than against negative forces from within.

Most of those who suffer from Crohn's and ulcerative colitis don't like to talk about their plight. It's not trendy to chat about long and painful hours on the toilet, bleeding and resulting anemia, Draconian diets, medication side effects, or the extreme difficulty of holding a job or sustaining social relationships.

My son is among those who suffer from ulcerative colitis.

The poet-horseplayer Charles Bukowski also warns to not overdo it, in his poem called "Don't Try." For years I have tried to promote horse racing in the mainstream culture with little success. But with this campaign against IBDs, without even trying, I have made in-roads in gaining respect for horse race handicapping.

On one website, for example, they wrote:

"Mark's two-day ride ends on both days at horse-racing tracks--appropriate for a racing journalist, but also appropriate because he has linked his theme to his chosen charity."

In not trying, I have gotten a good response about horse racing. But in trying, I have thus far not been able to generate many donations for medical research to fight IBDs.

My biking partner Alan Kennedy and I are not Lance Armstrong, whose foundation continues to receive donations in spite of the serious questions being raised, by his former teammates and anti-doping authorities about the legitimacy of his Tour de France victories. Since we are not celebrities like Armstrong, our challenge is greater. Few people have heard about the gravity of ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease, as if it were taboo.

That's only one obstacle. At age 67 (Mark) and 61 (Alan), it is more of a challenge to cycle 200 kilometers in two days than it is for Armstrong to cycle 200 kilometers in five hours.

But we now have support from a younger cyclist. Michael Ahrens, fresh from a Pick 4 score at Saratoga, is now embarking on a 300 mile ride in upstate New York to help gain donations for IBD medical research.

Yes, Bukowski says "Don't try," but I can't help it. Knowing that you have hundreds of worthy charities around you, I am still trying to convince you to make a donation to this one, because IBDs are not "popular" diseases and don't attract donations on their own.

The association we are supporting, called AFA (Association Francois Aupetit), is a non-profit that finances research. Though this is a French association, research is worldwide, and AFA is associated with the international community of medical researchers. Our son, for example, is a research subject for a product being developed by an American pharmaceutical company. There are no borders when it comes to medical knowledge.

These wagers make a symbolic connection between the uncertainty of a horse race bet and the uncertainty of the current crop of IBD medications, where the patient and his doctor must handicap the benefits and side effects of a "field" of medications and then choose the one most likely to succeed, with uncertain results.

A Kentucky Horse Racing Commission committee Wednesday recommended the full commission approve the partial sale of Ellis Park in Henderson, Kentucky, according to *Daily Racing Form*. An ownership group associated with Saratoga Harness and Casino has agreed to purchase 30% of the track for \$4 million, with provisions to purchase an additional 20% in the next two to four years, as well as a further contingent to buy the remaining equity. The commission will vote on the committee's recommendation during its Sept. 18 meeting and it is expected to approve the deal. Ellis Park is currently owned by Ron Geary, who purchased the track from Churchill Downs in 2006. Geary began searching for partners in the track earlier this year to provide additional capital for the installation of Instant Racing machines at the facility, according to *DRF*.

### LORD OAKSEY DEAD

Lord John Oaksey, founder of the Injured Jockeys Fund, died yesterday at his home in Wiltshire following a lengthy illness. The former rider, journalist and broadcaster was 83. "The Injured Jockeys Fund is probably Lord Oaksey's greatest legacy and I know that's what [his wife] Lady Oaksey always said," commented the IJF's chief executive Lisa Hancock. "He was very proud of his involvement and it is a sad day for us all. He was at [the IJF's] Oaksey House for a Diamond Jubilee celebration in June and he was on good form that day. Unfortunately, he declined over the last three months and he was with Chicky, his wife, and his family when he passed away. He started it all at the IJF and obviously he is a great loss for us and the sport. He was a fantastic man and we all feel very proud to be part of what he started and to be continuing his work in the future." The son of Geoffrey Lawrence, himself the main British Judge at the Nuremberg War Trials, Lord Oaksey was born John Lawrence in 1929 and was educated at Eton and Yale. As an amateur jockey, he won the 1958 Hennessy Gold Cup and was second in the 1963 Grand National. He also enjoyed a successful career as a journalist for the Daily Telegraph, and later as a racing broadcaster with ITV and Channel 4.

## Germany

### JACOBS IN CALL TO SAFEGUARD GERMAN RACING

Owner/breeder Andreas Jacobs has revealed his plans to safeguard the future of Germany's racing industry, according to *Racing Post*. Jacobs, who is president of Baden-Baden racetrack and owner of Newsells Park Stud, believes there are too many racecourses operating, and also proposes an overhaul of the country's degraded betting system to avert a similar crisis to that currently experienced across the border in Italy. "First of all there are too many racetracks," said Jacobs, who was speaking at Baden-Baden's Grosse Woche Festival. "We should probably have only half as many tracks and we should strengthen the strong, not subsidise those who perform less well. There are too many subsidies for the weaker tracks. I am thinking about the East German tracks, which cannot be justified, except for maybe Hoppegarten in Berlin. Our winter racing is also not an attractive product. The objective at Baden-Baden is to show the world that you can run a track professionally under commercial conditions to reach break-even point." **Cont. p8**



**Jacobs - German Racing cont.**

Jacobs added, "Baden Racing isn't supposed to be a profit machine--it is supposed to be a functioning operation--but it needs commitment from others as well. For example, we need to coordinate the dates better. Sometimes we have three tracks racing on the same Sunday, which is not very intelligent. There has been a slowdown in racing in the whole country and, because the Direktorium [fur Vollblutzucht und Rennen] has been concentrating on cost-cutting, there has been only limited innovation. We are exporting our horses--good horses are exported to western Europe and bad horses exported to eastern Europe. The home market is weak, and we must revitalise. Being a leader like Baden-Baden means not just being seen as the big one, it also means you need to innovate. You don't want to be seen as the bully all the time, but sometimes racing in Germany is run merely as a weekend hobby. We must attempt to be more commercially minded."
