## Keeneland September Yearling Sale Sept. 10-21

### BAUMS AWAY

six, the Baums' operation has developed a reputation for breeding young, progressive mares with a solid page to many of the industry's most commercial stallions.

Underscoring that fact, the New

York-based couple have four yearlings catalogued--all in Book 1--in this year's Keeneland September Sale.

Heading the group is the first yearling through the ring for the couple, [Hip 84](#), a colt by Galileo (Ire). The Feb. 1 foal is out of Egyptian Queen (Storm Cat), who brought \$3.8 million at this sale in 2005. A daughter of the English and Irish highweighted sprint filly Warrior Queen (Quiet American), the 8-year-old mare is a half-sister to dual Grade II winner A.P. Warrior (A.P. Indy). Carrying this foal in utero, the mare returned to Keeneland in November of 2010 and was secured by the Baums at the reduced price of \$390,000.

"This year, we have a really special horse that I really hope will do well," enthused Michael Baum. "He's probably the best-looking yearling I've ever seen. He seems to be perfect in every way."

Regarding the colt's sire, who is responsible for European superstar Frankel (GB), Baum said, "He's by the best stallion in the world. His offspring generally run in Europe, so I haven't seen many of them first hand, but I can't really imagine that there would be that many nicer than this one out there."

With a pedigree which would surely have brought fireworks at any European venue, the Baums decided to send the colt to an American sale instead.

"We considered selling him in Europe, but we decided to sell him here because we are based here and we wanted to enjoy it," explained Baum. "I think if you have the right horse, then he'll do well no matter where we sell him."

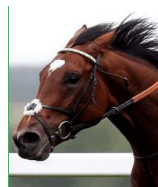

In addition to the Galileo colt, Man O War Farm also offers [Hip 86](#), a filly by Unbridled's Song out of Emmalee (Smart Strike). The 5-year-old mare is out of Lassie Connection (Seattle Slew), a half-sister to Group 1 winner Wolfhound and Broodmare of the Year Weekend Surprise. The very next horse through the ring, who is also bred by the Baums, is a colt by Distorted Humor out of Etta Lee (Forestry). Offered as [Hip 87](#), the Jan. 19 foal is from the family of multiple graded stakes winner Mambo Slew (Kingmambo) and the extended family of Argentine champion Mat-Boy (Arg). The final member of the quartet is [Hip 112](#), a filly by Unbridled's Song. The dark bay is out of the unraced mare Lady's Quest (Rainbow Quest), a half-sister to dual Grade I-winning turf horse Grand Couturier (GB) (Grand Lodge).

November sale in 1999 when securing a daughter of Seeking the Gold out of three-time Grade I winner Classy Cathy (Private Account). Purchased for \$475,000, Mimi's Golden Girl was subsequently bred

to Giant's Causeway and the mare made good on the gamble when her first foal, Noble Causeway, brought \$1.15 million at the Keeneland September sale in 2003. Secured by My Meadowview Farm, the colt finished runner-up in the GI Florida Derby and third in the GIII Ben Ali S. before retiring with \$360,010 in earnings.

"Whenever I buy a mare, it's usually more than I have," quipped Baum, regarding Mimi's Golden Girl's purchase price. "But she definitely turned out to be worth it."

Baum, originally from Brooklyn, currently resides in Manhattan, but spends plenty of time at the couple's farm in Lexington. An artist who heads a successful framing business in New York, Baum became involved with horses as a young man, frequenting many of New York's Thoroughbred tracks.

"I really liked horses, and when I could afford to buy one, I did," he said. "I always liked horses, but didn't get involved with owning and breeding them until later. It's been about 30 years now, but I have been selling through my own farm for the last eight years."

After many years of employing outside operations to prep and sell his youngtsers at auction, Baum took the plunge in January of 2001 with the purchase 112-acre Man O War Farm. Originally part of Samuel Riddle and Walter Jeffords' Faraway Farm, the historic tract of land was named after the iconic champion of the same name who was foaled on the property.

Retiring with 20 wins from 21 career starts, including scores in the Preakness S., Belmont S., Travers S. and Jockey Club Gold Cup, the mighty Man o' War stood at the farm until his death at age 30 in 1947. He was buried at the farm before being reinterred at the Kentucky Horse Park in the 1970's.

These days, Baum breeds exclusively to sell at the fall yearling sales, offering the occasional mare at the breeding stock sales in an effort to keep upgrading his small band. The yearlings which fail to sell in the ring join Baum's racing team, which currently consists of four in training with Lexington-based Desmond Fogarty.

"Over the last few years, we've had some sell well, selling between \$200,000 and \$450,000," offered Baum. "But the last couple of years were difficult because of the market."

Despite the downturn in the market, Baum has continued to breed to the best sires the industry has to offer.

"The stallions that I bred to three years ago were \$300,000 and now you can breed to them for \$75,000, so you just try to move with the market," explained Baum. "It all depends on where you are and where the market is at the time you have to breed those mares. The better pedigree you've got, hopefully, the better you are going to do."

According to Baum, the small operation sticks to the principal plan it launched several years ago.

"We are always looking for better mares, so for the moment, we buy what we can afford," offered Baum. "So, I try to buy younger mares from good families as opposed to better mares that I couldn't afford. Our plan is to have between five and 10 mares over the next few years, but hopefully, keep improving the quality we have."

Can we expect to see the Baums return to Keeneland in November to add to their broodmare band?

"I hope so," said Baum. "It depends what we do Monday." --Christina Bossinakis

# TDN Q&A

## KEENELAND'S GEOFFREY RUSSELL

On Monday at 4 p.m., the 2012 renewal of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale begins in Lexington, Kentucky. Some 3,604 yearlings have been catalogued over the course of 11 sessions, and officials are hoping the sale can build from last year, when, after 13 sessions of selling, average was up 11% to \$76,511, and the median remained unchanged at \$30,000.

There have been some changes for 2012. Keeneland has revamped its website, and the sale itself has a slightly new look, too. Last year, Book 1 was held over two evening sessions and began on a Sunday. This year, Keeneland pushed the opener back a day and has set a late-afternoon start time of 4 p.m. Like last year, however, Book 2 will be held over three sessions, from Tuesday through Thursday, with a dark day on Friday, Sept. 14.

The format isn't the only change. For the first time in 13 years, Keeneland will be without Nick Nicholson at the helm. Nicholson retired from his position as president and CEO on his 65th birthday Sept. 1, handing the reins to former Vice President and Chief Financial Officer Bill Thomason.

On Wednesday, Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell took some time out of his busy schedule to speak with the *TDN's* Lucas Marquardt about the changes at Keeneland September, the success of its graduates and the marketplace in general.

### The format for September has been tweaked once again for 2012. What was the reasoning behind the changes?

Russell: The feedback we got from both buyers and sellers over the past couple of years is that they would prefer to not have nighttime sessions. From a consignor's point of view, to have two night sessions followed by three days of selling meant, for some, five straight days of selling without a break. It was difficult for them and their help. Buyers had concerns, too. By the time they got out of a nighttime session it was late, and then to get fed and go home, it was tiring. So we made the change.

**Any new technological changes?**

Russell: Well, we introduced the new website, and that's going over well, and we're in the second year of the iPad [sales catalogue application], and that's been very popular. Our downloads are up 30% from last year, which is encouraging.

**The September Sale is enjoying another strong year, having turned out, among others, GI Kentucky Derby winner I'll Have Another, a \$11,000 yearling in 2010.**

Russell: September grads have actually won five of the last Triple Crown races, four of the last five Horses of the Year came out of September, and on the road to the Triple Crown this year, our grads were performing at the highest levels. This summer, it's just continued on, with the likes of Paynter, Executiveprivilege, and To Honor and Serve last weekend. We've had a great year.

**In light of a few yearling sales that have already been held thus far in 2012, what are you expecting for September?**

Russell: The September Sale is known industry-wide as the barometer of the industry because of its size and the different levels of the market it represents, so it's difficult to compare it to anything else. But going into it, we've heard positive comments from the sales that have already taken place, both domestic and international, so we're hoping to build off that. I'd be happy if it was a good, stable market.

**We're in the midst of a contentious election cycle. Have you ever observed any trends in buyer behavior in election years?**

Russell: I honestly don't know the answer to that question. My initial reaction would be that I haven't seen any changes.

**Supply--or oversupply--and demand has been a key issue in the Thoroughbred business in recent years. Do you think the current succession of smaller foal crops is helping match supply with demand?**

Russell: Since September of 2008, when the whole world changed, breeders and consignors have done a very good job in evaluating their horses; a) which mares should be bred; and b) which mares are commercial, and if their foals should be offered at public market. I think they've done a very good job responding to what's happening in the marketplace. With production costs going down, hopefully they'll be more profitable in 2012.

**SANS FRONTIERES RETIRED**

Sir Robert Ogden's 2010 G1 Irish St Leger hero **Sans Frontieres (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Llia {GB}, by Shirley Heights {GB}) has been retired after suffering a recurrence of his tendon injury, connections announced yesterday. Not seen since his career-best success in the Curragh contest, the Jeremy Nosedo-trained 6-year-old was also winner of that year's G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket and the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury. "We have unfortunately had to retire Sans Frontieres," the owner's Racing Manager Barry Simpson told *PA Sport*. "We got him very near to a run and he has been in tremendous form recently and working very well, but sadly he has damaged his tendon again. The good thing is that he is still a colt. He is a triple group winner and hopefully he will have some future as a potential stallion. He is wonderfully bred, by Galileo out of a Shirley Heights mare, so he may well appeal to one or two of the studs. He was 120-rated and never fulfilled his potential. It was only when he won three consecutive group races that he started to show his ability and sadly we have not been able to capitalise on that. Nevertheless he has been a terrific horse and a great flagbearer for Sir Robert. He was very lightly raced, but he had tendon trouble following the Irish St Leger before he was due to go to America for the Breeders' Cup."

Simpson continued, "We have brought him back twice and got near to running both times, but sadly this morning he damaged his tendon again and therefore we have no other alternative but to retire him. He has got a future ahead of him, hopefully." In total, the chestnut, who was initially a 450,000gns purchase at Tattersalls, won four of his nine starts and just over £250,000 in prize money.

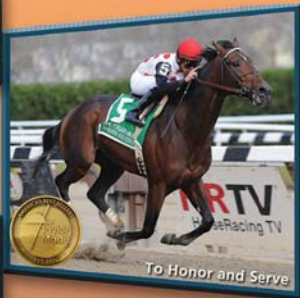
