



LATE SURGE DRIVES KEENELAND OPENER

The opening session of the Keeneland September Sale enjoyed a strong closing surge last night in Lexington and concluded with expected gains in average and median. The flourish included the top-priced horse of the session, [hip 131](#), a colt by Distorted Humor out of Grade I winner Muskha (Empire Maker) who was knocked down to Shadwell Estate Company

for \$1.65 million ([video](#)). Eaton Sales consigned the Brushwood Stable-bred youngster, who is the first foal from his millionairess mother. Three hips earlier, [hip 128](#), an A.P. Indy filly out GSW Moonlight Sonata (Carson City), elicited a bid of \$1.1 million from Mandy

Pope's Whisper Hill Farm. Mill Ridge consigned. In all, seven of the top 11 horses came in the final 32 hips of the sale.

"We knew what was in the catalogue, we knew there were some good horses, and we knew we were going to end with a nice bang," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell.


Comparisons from last year are a bit tricky, as Keeneland reduced the size of Book 1 and scaled back from two sessions to one. But the numbers seemed positive.

Whether those figures are attributable to a smaller Book 1 with better quality, or to an improvement in the market, is anyone's guess. One positive that can't be argued is the increased depth at the very top of the market. Last year's Book 1 yielded three million-dollar horses, compared to five this year. Taken further, last year's Book 1 yielded 27 horses who brought \$500,000 or more, compared to 21 last evening.

"That tells me there's a good market for a nice horse," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson, who noted broad international participation during the opener. The Japanese, in particular, increased their activity from a year ago: K.K. Eishindo bought four horses for \$1,975,000, Hajime Satomi bought two horses for \$775,000, and Koji Maeda landed one for \$350,000.

Said Russell, "American-bred horses have performed very well in Japan, and given the strength of the yen [vs. the dollar], it makes American horses very popular." The one negative from Monday night was the session's high RNA rate of 34.2%, up from last year's corresponding figure of 32.5%.

Russell said the elevated figure simply reflected the level of the market. "We've always seen [higher RNA rates] at the selected sessions," he said. "People who breed these horses have the ability to go on and race these horses, and tend to have higher expectations." --LM

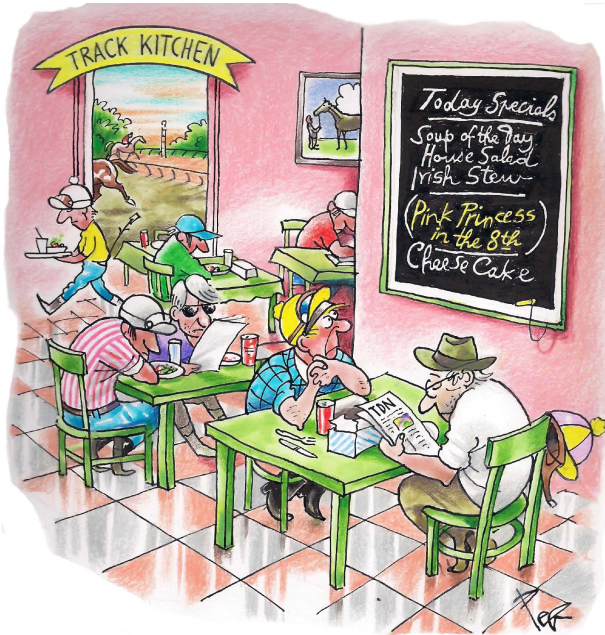

Grand Finale...

While the opening session of the Keeneland September sale appeared to take some time to get some legs under it, it did manage to gather momentum through the course of the evening. Rounding out a solid day of trade, hip 131, a colt by Distorted Humor from the Eaton Sales consignment brought the house down with a \$1.65 million final bid from Shadwell Estate Company.

“I think Sheikh Hamdan bought himself a really special kind of colt,” said Eaton Sales’ Reiley McDonald. “I think there might have been 15 people who might have tried to bid on him. He was a lovely colt and he sold very well. We were pretty sure he was going to break a million, but these days, you never know how far you can go past a million. At the end of the day, we were really pleased.”

The Apr. 14 foal was out of millionairess Mushka (Empire Maker), a granddaughter of multiple Grade I winner Lakeway (Seattle Slew).

“He had a good pedigree, nice conformation and fit well into the program,” commented Shadwell advisor Rick Nicholls.

Eaton Sales enjoyed a banner day, heading the opening session with \$5,130,000 in gross expenditures for 11 head from 13 offered.

“Physically, he was different than any other horse I have seen on the grounds,” said McDonald. “He had the profile that so many trainers look for. You saw guys like Bobby Baffert and so many of the great judges just lock into the colt.”

Bestowed with high expectations from the very beginning, Mushka realized a final bid of \$1.6 million from Zayat Stables at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling sale in 2006.

“This colt looks a whole lot like his mother, Mushka,” confirmed McDonald. “She also is tall, leggy and has a big hip and very scopey and that is what this colt is. I think what Distorted Humor gives is toughness, hardness and raw ability. Whether he will do it

or not is still to be determined, but he has all the ingredients.”

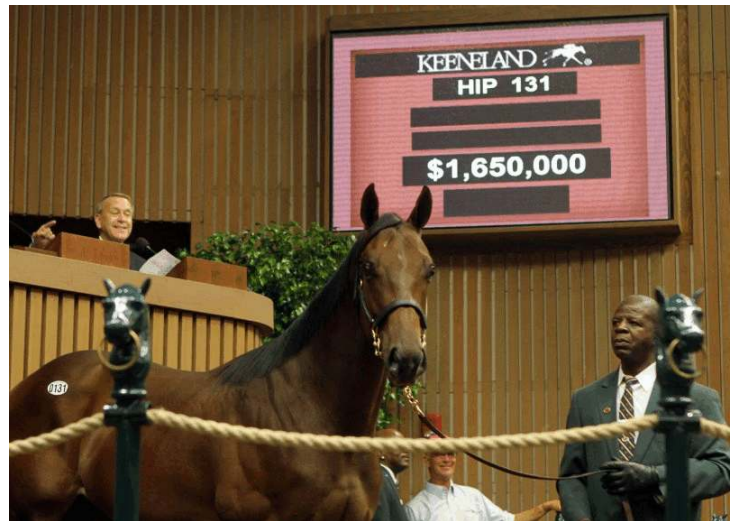

ITALY'S PREMIER YEARLING SALE IS SEPT. 21, 2012

The winner of the GII Demoiselle S. for Zayat Stables, Mushka was offered at Keeneland November in 2008, garnering a hefty \$2.4 million from Betty Moran's Brushwood Stable. Under the tutelage of Bill Mott, the mare added three more wins, including the 2009 edition of the GI Spinster S. via disqualification.

“We had a lot of fun racing her and we bred her and got this lovely colt,” said McDonald. “It all worked out very well in the end.”

Commenting on the operation's day overall, McDonald added, “I think in this market, I think that's a pretty good clearance rate. Really, in a good market, that's a good rate. It was a pretty tight sale. There were buyers for most horses, but not a lot of depth. So, it's important to peg your reserves right and to get horses sold.”-CBoss

Whisper Hill Making Plenty of Noise at KEESEP...

Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm came out swinging during Monday's select session, landing three yearlings --two fillies and one colt--for a total of \$2.25 million, good for second behind top buyer Shadwell. Leading the way for the trio was [hip 128](#), a filly from the final crop of A.P. Indy out of GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. victress Moonlight Sonata (Carson City) for \$1.1 million. The May foal is 3/4 to GII Indiana Derby winner Wilburn (Bernardini) and a half to GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. winner and GII Fountain of Youth S. third Beethoven (Sky Mesa). Peter Bance was underbidder.

"There was nothing to not like about her," said Pope after doing her bidding alongside bloodstock advisor Chris Brothers. "She was gorgeous--she was my pick of the sale. Being the last of the A.P. Indys--it's very special [to get her]. She's out of a graded stakes winning mare and she's half to two graded stakes winning horses--so the upside is great and the downside is that she'll always have great broodmare potential. She seemed to be very level headed, too."

The A.P. Indy filly will head to Pope's Florida farm to be broken.

"She'll get a lot of time; I let them tell me when they're ready," Pope continued. "I thought she should've been the high-priced filly at the sale. Keeneland did an excellent job with this group of horses. I'm hoping [the action] will remain very good on Tuesday and Wednesday because I have three horses to sell and I need them to sell for a lot of money to pay for the ones that I just bought!"

Pope also made headlines at last year's Keeneland September Sale, securing the Day 2 Unbridled's Song--Silvery Swan topper for \$1 million. Whisper Hill bred 2011 GI Whitney Invitational H. and GI Metropolitan H. hero Tizway. Funny Sunny carried Pope's colors to a close second in the GIII Hurricane Bertie S. earlier this term at Gulfstream.

Hip 128 was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales on behalf of breeder William Geist and Michael Helmbrecht's Woodbridge Bloodstock. Wilburn and Beethoven were also popular in the ring. The former sold twice--for \$75,000 at FTKOCT and \$625,000 as a KEEAPR juvenile--while Beethoven brought \$235,000 as a KEENOV weanling and \$300,000 as a KEESEP yearling.

"It was beyond our expectations," said Mill Ridge's Headley Bell after thanking Pope and Brothers for the purchase. "We weren't sure what to expect. In this select market, you just don't know. Two people happened to want her and actually more than that--there were nine scopes on her, so she was very popular." -SS

Pope Closes Late With a Flourish...

As the opening session of the September sale wound to a close, Whisper Hill remained active, landing hip 128 for \$1.1 million. However, earlier in the session, the operation offered some mighty fire power for a couple of choice offerings. Heading the duo was [hip 81](#), a filly by Divine Park out of Don't Trick Her (Mazel

Trick). Consigned by Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud, the May 2 foal is a half-sister to Grade I winners Check the Label (Stormin Fever) and Include Me Out (Include).

"Obviously, it's a lot of money for a \$10,000 stallion, but she was absolutely

gorgeous," said Whisper Hill's Mandy Pope. "Her pedigree was wonderful. It seems every horse in the family that races does really well."

Adding further luster to the page, the Airdrie homebred hails from the extended family of GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. heroine Sweet Talker (Stormin Fever) and Grade III winner Silver Medallion (Badge of Silver).

"We just loved her," said advisor Chris Brothers. "She was very balanced and she was one of our top picks."

Divine Park, who lists the GI Metropolitan H. among his chief wins, is represented by his first crop of 2-year-olds this season.

"The price was a little high, but the way the prices are going, it didn't surprise us," explained Pope. It seems everyone with a good eye will fall on the same horses, so you have a horse that has quality, pedigree, conformation and a good walk, they're going to bring more."

Coming back shortly afterward, Pope and Brothers came back to nab [Hip 100](#), a May 28 foal by Smart Strike. Offered by Hill 'n' Dale Agency, the George Krikorian bred is out of dual Grade I winner and millionaire Hollywood Story (Wild Rush).

"I thought he was the best yearling offered today," stated Pope. "He's a May foal, so he is very immature, but he's going to grow. He had such a walk to him--there was no wasted effort. Mentally, he was always very good. He didn't seem to fuss or get sour."

Added Brothers, "He is a much more refined horse than a lot of Smart Strikes, said Brothers. "Sometimes, they can be a little low in their pasterns. But he was so balanced and a real professional. He is my favorite horse I've seen so far."

Coupled with the session's second highest priced yearling, Whisper Hill was obviously in pursuit of a strong page.

"When the page matches up to the physical, it's pretty much stars and stars," said Brothers.

Pope, explaining the outfits methodology, underscored the point.

"It costs the same to train one and get it to the races, regardless of what you paid for it," she said. "So, we try to get as good quality as we can and hopefully get lucky and we'll have a lot of fun."

Switching hats to seller later this week, Whisper Hill offers three yearlings through agent Sweezy and Partners in Book 2. Leading the trio is Hip 349, a filly by Tiznow out of Storminthegarden (Stormy Atlantic), purchased in utero for \$335,000 at Keeneland January last year. On Thursday, Whisper Hill will present Hip 569, a colt by Tiznow out of Bethany (Dayjur) and Hip 598, a colt by Distorted Humor out of Capote's Crown (Capote).

"They have been very well received, so we are hopeful," said Pope. "I've looked at a lot of the horses in Book 2, and I really like my own horses." Added Brothers, "They are three top quality horses. They are all very different horses, but they fit every type of buyer."—CBoss

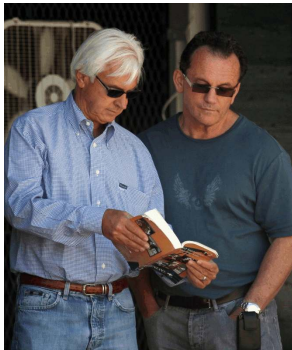

Sikura/Lunsford Strike for Bodemeister Half...

Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura and prominent owner and breeder Bruce Lunsford suffered a tough blow in June when the brilliant Grade I winner Madcap Escapade (Hennessy), whom they owned in partnership, died of colic. Mares like that aren't easily replaced, but Sikura and Lunsford hope their latest purchase, Monday's \$1.3 million Smart Strike half-sister to Bodemeister (Empire Maker), will ultimately help replace the void left in the Hill 'n' Dale breeding shed. Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni, standing out back, outlasted a group of Japanese buyers in front to land the filly from the Brookdale Sales, which consigned on behalf of the Liebrecht family's Virginia-based Audley Farm.

"I went and saw here two months ago in Virginia, and she's come a long way," said Lanni. "But she's a beauty and is a real classy filly. Bob [Baffert] will train her." Lanni said he was unsure if additional partners would be brought in.

Foaled on Jan. 17, the filly, [hip 45](#), was produced by GSW & GISP Untouched Talent (Storm Cat), whose stock soared earlier this year when her son Bodemeister, a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆, won the GI Arkansas Derby for Zayat Stables and Baffert.

Favored in the GI Kentucky Derby, he ran a bang-up second to I'll Have Another (Flower Alley) after setting a scorching pace, then ran second again to that foe in the GI Preakness S. Bodemeister was retired to WinStar in August after being diagnosed with a shoulder injury.

Sikura is plenty familiar with the filly's family. He bought her dam Untouched Talent in partnership for \$500,000 as a BESMAR juvenile in 2006, and campaigned her to a victory in the GIII Sorrento S. and a second in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. "Her career was cut short, but she was cut out to be a nice one," said Lanni.

Hill 'n' Dale purchased Untouched Talent as a broodmare prospect from its own consignment at the 2006 FTKNOV sale--presumably to dissolve the partnership--and after putting the mare in foal to Unbridled's Song, sold her to Audley Farm for \$1.2 at the 2007 KEENOV sale. Audley later sold Bodemeister to Zayat at the 2010 KEESEP sale for \$260,000.

Audley's Equine Consultant Dr. Jens von Lepel D.V.M. was on hand to watch the Smart Strike filly sell, and was all smiles in the back ring as Lanni offered his congratulations.

"We are more than pleased," he said. "It's amazing. It's the best reward for my owners and my crew--they did so well. And we really have to thank Joe Seitz from [Brookdale], they did a great job. It's a dream come true. Bodemeister made us so happy through the spring, and we knew we might have a chance with her if we put her on the market."

Von Lepel, who has managed the Virginia-based Audley Farm's horses for the past 15 years, was asked if the filly resembled her famous half-brother. "Not really," he said. "I would say she's very athletic and racy, but she's a different type. You can see the dam in her, like Bodemeister, but she's more a Smart Strike, while Bodemeister was more an Empire Maker."

Untouched Talent has a Tiznow weanling filly on the ground and is back in foal to Unbridled's Song.

There could be more sales fireworks from Audley later in the year: Untouched Talent herself has been entered in the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. However, it remains to be seen if she'll actually go through the ring. "It's the owners' decision," said Von Lepel. "It's hard for us. We'll see. She's a wonderful mare; we don't want to lose her." - *LM For Steve Sherack's preview on Audley's September draft, click [here](#).*



War Front Half to Contested Brings \$1.05 Million...

Paralleling War Front's rapid rise to stardom is the soaring value of his yearlings. Yesterday, the Danzig stallion's highest-ever priced youngster went through the ring at September, with Jane Dunn, acting on behalf of a partnership, landing [hip 94](#), a stylish dark bay, for \$1.05 million. "It's for a group of people based in Kentucky," said Dunn, who laughed a negative when asked if she was part of the group. Dunn did confirm that longtime Claiborne client and partner Adele Dilschneider would be a co-owner.

Matching the colt's price tag was a smart pedigree. Bred by Cherry Valley Farm, the breeding operation of Claiborne's Seth Hancock, he's a half-sibling to this year's star 3-year-old filly Contested (Ghostzapper), heroine of the GI Acorn S. at Belmont Park and the recent GI Test S. at Saratoga for owner/trainer Bob Baffert. Both horses were produced by the winning Gold Vault (Arch), a half-sister to dual Grade I winner and good young sire Pomeroy.

"If you want a nice horse who looks expensive, you have to get a little brave," Dunn said of the price. "But we're happy."

Dunn runs Holly Hill Training Center in South Carolina, an operation that has turned out some of Claiborne and/or Dilschneider's best runners, including the champion they co-bred and owned together, Blame, as well as Arch and Pulpit. Holly Hill has also produced standouts like Royal Delta, Madcap Escapade, First Samurai, and Mushka.

Entering September, all eight of the yearlings by War Front offered this year sold. They averaged \$250,589 off a stud fee of just \$10,000.

The colt was the lone War Front in Book 1, and Claiborne's lone offering in the book. Claiborne's Dell Hancock admitted to being so worried about the colt prior to his selling that she'd been largely oblivious to everything else around her last night.

"I've been so nervous, I've only been able to look up at the TV here and there to see what's going on," she smiled. Asked if she thought the

colt might eclipse the seven-figure mark, she offered, "Coming up here, I never think a horse is going to bring a million dollars. But when we got here, he showed so well I thought he could bring that; it's nothing I expect, but I thought, 'That's not out of the realm of possibilities.' I'm tickled to death. **Cont. p10**

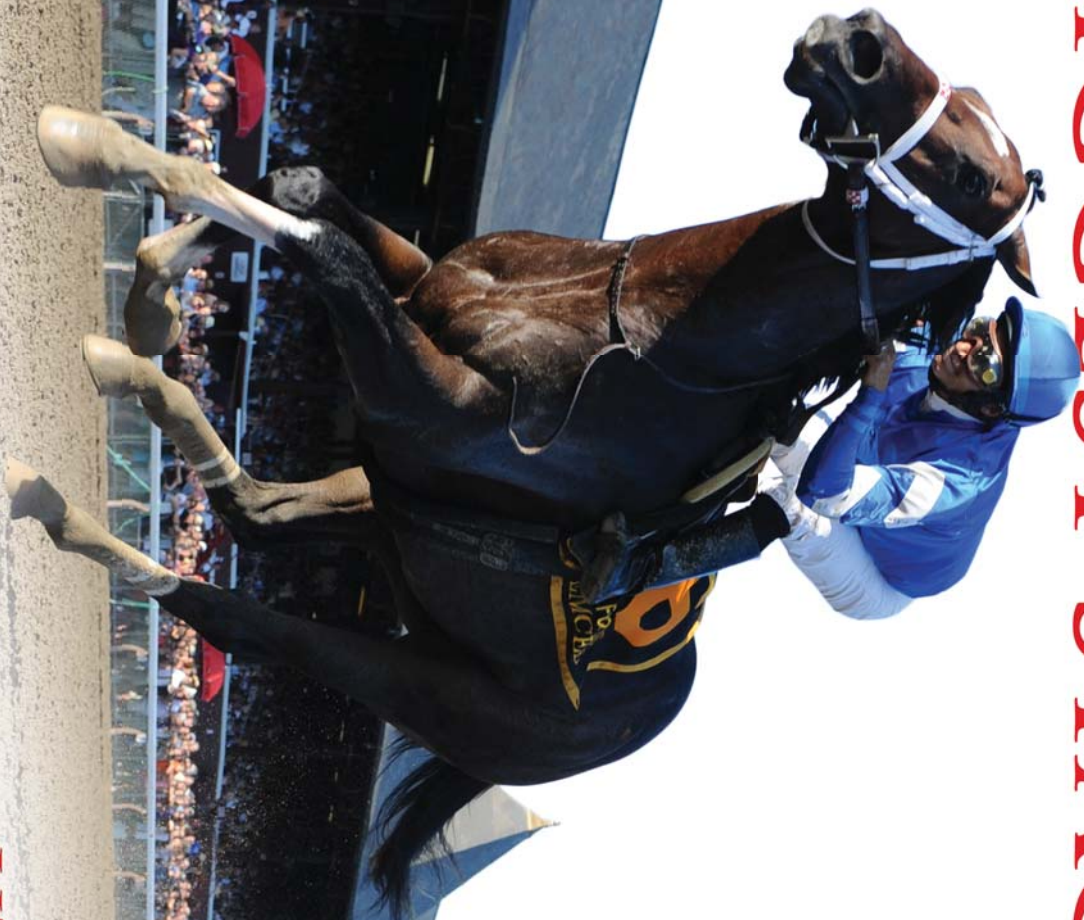

Taking Charge at Keeneland...

Charles and Maribeth Sandford apparently really enjoyed their trip to the GI Kentucky Derby courtesy of GI Florida Derby hero Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy) earlier this spring.

The Sandfords, who began buying horses as a couple in 2009, set off the first set of fireworks during Monday's select session, extending to \$1 million for a Street Cry (Ire) half-brother to GI Haskell Invitational winner and GI Belmont S. runner-up Paynter (Awesome Again). They also purchased [hip 74](#), an A.P. Indy--Coral Sea colt for \$600,000; and [hip 7](#), a Bernardini--Our Legacy colt for \$130,000.

"We liked the [Street Cry] colt--he's a nice horse and we're happy to have him," said trainer Pat Byrne, seated in the pavilion alongside Charles Sandford, after signing the ticket.

"We were underbidder on Paynter, and we had a little bit more money to play with this year. We went the extra [distance]; we're glad we got him."

Byrne continued, "He's very well-balanced; hopefully we'll have some luck with him. He's got a sire's pedigree."

Bag Makers, a leading supplier of non-woven, paper and plastic bags, was established by the Sandfords in 1980. Once a small startup company based in Illinois, Bag Makers is now a multi-million dollar corporation with more than 800 employees worldwide. The couple was recently featured in the *CNBC* show 'How I Made My Millions' in 2011.

"We had three or four that we were going to play on --and hard--and he was the first one to come up," Sandford revealed. "We went a little more than I wanted to, but if you want to play, you've got to pay. We're thrilled to get him. Hopefully, he'll be our next Derby horse; that's the plan."

Take Charge Indy, sidelined with an ankle chip following a disappointing 19th-place finish in the Derby, is back in training and aiming for Keeneland's GI Fayette S. Oct. 27.

selling her offspring since. The aforementioned Paynter brought \$325,000 from Zayat Stables as a yearling at the 2010 KEESEP sale and an unraced Awesome Again juvenile colt brought \$510,000 from Bluegrass Hall at last year's KEESEP sale. Tizso has also produced GIII Cinema Breeders' Cup H. hero Tiz West (Gone West) and Kalookan Queen H. victress Tizakitty (Distinctive Cat).

Meanwhile, in related news, owner Ahmed Zayat issued an upbeat bulletin on Paynter as he continues to fight on bravely in his battle against colitis and laminitis.

"We continue to be blessed by a special horse, he continues to defy the odds," Zayat tweeted Monday. "We have a happy horse today, no fever, and all blood work is good. He is comfortable, stable and eating well. Miracles can happen; I am very heartened and encouraged that not only Paynter will survive as a stallion, but in 10 days when his casts are off, we can be in for a surprise that we have a chance of seeing him back as a racehorse in 2013." -SS

Adding to the fireworks late in the session was [hip 124](#), a filly by A.P. Indy, that realized a healthy \$725,000 bid from J.B. McKathan. On the phone and leaning on the wall at the base of the press box, McKathan--flanked by a small group including brother Kevin--landed the bay for diamond mogul Charles Fipke. The Mar. 1 foal is out of Million Gift (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), a lightly raced daughter of multiple Grade I winner and blue hen mare Maplejinsky (Nijinsky II), who is a half-sister to English Horse of the Year Dayjur (Danzig). A former Broodmare of the Year, Maplejinsky is also the dam of champion older mare heroine Sky Beauty (Blushing Groom {Fr}). Winner of the Triple Tiara, Sky Beauty is the dam of Group 3 winner Hurricane Cat (Strom Cat). This also represents the family of GI Wood Memorial winner, Fipke's Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat).

"She is a beautiful filly from an awesome family," said McKathan, who signed for the filly.

Campaigned in Japan, 14-year-old Million Gift is already responsible for the stakes winning full-sister Million Seller.

"Mr. Fipke is into the really strong female families and of course she has one," offered McKathan. "She looks as if he's athletic enough to be a nice racehorse and then go on to his broodmare band."

This year's Keeneland September sale takes on special meaning for the 23-year-old pensioned stallion A.P. Indy, who is being represented by his final crop of yearlings to go through the ring.

"I think he was really impressed with the female family, but of course, everybody likes A.P. Indy," added McKathan.

The Lane's End resident led the opening day, weighing in at \$3.6 million for six sold from eight offered.-CBoss

THE LAST BOOK 1

With five horses bringing \$1-million plus (one each for the four sires which averaged \$500,000+ and had four or more catalogued, plus War Front), it's hard to argue yesterday's one-session Book 1 didn't deliver some top-class yearlings; and the average, albeit for just 75 horses sold (just 56% of those catalogued), did go up by 14%, to \$403,867. But, looking at the overall figures – and considering consignors were running between two barns for most of the day yesterday – it's hard to see the justification for continuing the one-day Book 1 format in the future. Of course, results over the next three days might confound that prediction, but we must hope the clearance rates--over a third of those sent through the ring were not sold--will show substantial improvement for the rest of Week 1. There will be some pretty disappointed breeders and consignors if they don't.

Of the just 91 sires represented in the entire first week, there were 13 sires which among them had 78% of the yearlings catalogued yesterday (103 of 132). The accompanying table shows that just four of those 13 sires averaged above the day's average, and all four of them averaged over \$500,000. Distorted Humor had seven sell, which averaged \$605,714, just edging out A.P. Indy, whose six sold averaged \$600,000. Street Cry had four average \$556,250, while Smart Strike had seven sell yesterday, averaging \$522,857. These four must qualify as favorites to sell especially well over the next three days, too--along with War Front, whose only yearling catalogued yesterday sold for \$1,050,000.

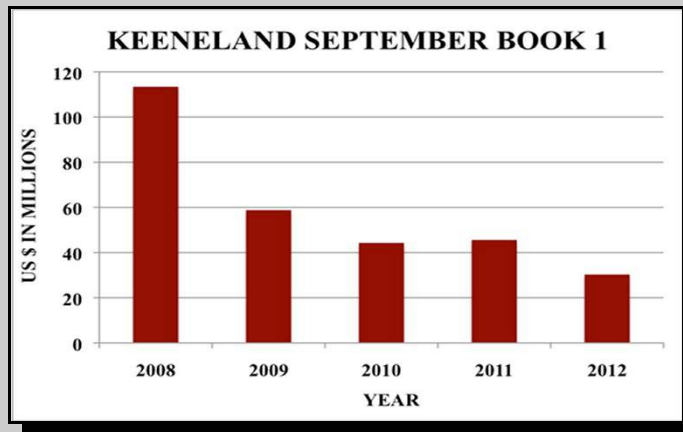

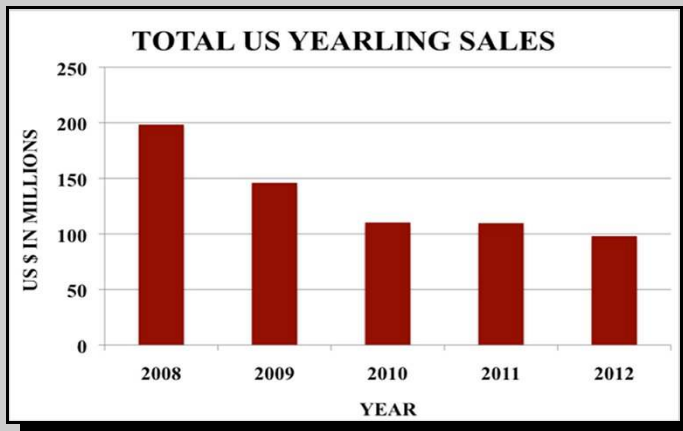

O'Brien Feels the Tension as D-Day Nears...

Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) yesterday headed the 11 entries remaining for Saturday's G1 Ladbrokes St Leger and trainer Aidan O'Brien admitted to some anxious moments ahead of the unbeaten colt's Triple Crown bid. Currently rated a 1-3 shot generally to emulate the 1970 hero Nijinsky and end the 42-year wait for the prestigious honor to be bestowed once again, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's flagbearer is firmly on target for the extended 14-furlong test and a slice of history.

"Everything has been good so far, although there are always worries," the Ballydoyle maestro told a gathering at a media day yesterday. "We are in the zone where you don't want to talk about things--you just want to keep everything smooth. None of us know what is going to happen tomorrow. Accidents never just happen, they are always caused along the line. There is always a list of circumstances which cause accidents.

“We just have to try and cover everything. It is a fickle time but we just have to stay focused.”

O'Brien admitted that the road to this point has not been straightforward, with testing ground at The Curragh almost curtailing his stop-over in the June 30 G1 Irish Derby.

“We always had it in our heads that he would have three or four runs this year. After Epsom, our grass gallop was flooded and all his work was on the woodchip. When he ran in the Irish Derby, I don't think I have ever known the ground so heavy at the Curragh. He runs very low to the ground, not rising much, so it was very touch and go whether he would run. He went through the race very easily, only racing for two furlongs--he just couldn't quicken in the same way that day. We gave him a good break and his weight started to increase which was unusual. He will be heavier for the St Leger than he has been going into any other race, but with 3-year-olds they often don't change until later in the year. His body is built more like a miler, in that he is round and strong as opposed to angular and lean. That is a little thing that would be in your mind.”

Camelot's attitude is one of his great characteristics, O'Brien explained. “After his races, he just stands there and doesn't blow which is very unusual. Most horse are bit agitated after a race. I think he must have a tremendous heart and lung capacity.

The horse is a very independent thinker. He is very sharp minded, very intelligent and very relaxed. If he was in a barn of 40 horses and some horses started messing, usually the barn would go mad but he wouldn't. When most horses walk off, they need other horses with them but he does not mind being by himself. He doesn't look for company and makes his own mind up about things. We have to prioritise--we think Camelot is like no other horse. Who knows what is going to happen--we don't take anything for granted. We will do our very best--it's all we can do. We knew that Sue [Magnier] had the name Camelot for 10 years, since the last Derby winner, and we were not going to influence her in any way.

She made her own mind up about it. It is a mystical kind of name and everything about this horse has not been normal. They have to have speed, stamina and courage--they are the three most important things when you are breeding horses. The Ladbroke's St Leger will expose the last two.

We are delighted with any pleasure that Camelot gives--his Triple Crown attempt is exciting and something to look forward to. It will be an interesting day. The Triple Crown is a dream--what has changed with the lads is originally they wanted to make stallions and got them off to stud quick. Now it is make a stallion and expose him because they have a lot of mares. I suppose things have moved on--people are not so forgiving as they were and want to see horses being tested. The lads are prepared to race on the older horses and that previously did not happen. There are an awful lot more disappointments and you do your best--sometimes it is good enough--sometimes it is not. When it is not you try and analyse why not, move on and try not to dwell on it."

Jockey Joseph O'Brien will have the weight of expectation on his shoulders as he takes the mount Saturday afternoon and he was playing down the pressure yesterday.

"He is a jockey's dream to ride as everything comes naturally to him," he said. "Camelot is an exceptional horse with a brilliant turn of foot. Whether he will stay a mile and three quarters, that's the big question and nobody knows the answer until Saturday. It may only be just over two furlongs further than he has been before but that is still a lot. Camelot is still learning and has not had as much racing as some horses of his age. The Triple Crown would be a dream come true. I have seen the videos of Nijinsky and Lester Piggott and if Camelot could emulate that it would be unbelievable."

Cityscape Expected for Woodbine Mile...

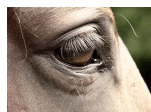
Juddmonte Farms's **Cityscape (GB)** (Selkirk) is among an expected field of nine for Sunday's GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile. The globetrotting homebred took Meydan's G1 Dubai Duty Free in March and was last seen finishing second to Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 12. "He's been very consistent," said trainer Roger Charlton of the 6-year-old.

"Excelebration's been second to [Juddmonte's undefeated star] Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) a couple of times. Frankel is about seven or eight lengths better than the rest. We're a bit behind that." The

conditioner continued, "[Cityscape] obviously ran a fantastic race at Meydan, and in many ways, Woodbine is a similarly shaped track--with a long straight and sweeping turns. He's responded well to his trips. We went into Meydan just the week before. So he'll have a week at Woodbine, too." Cityscape arrived in Canada Sunday night a number of other European invaders pointing to weekend stakes at Woodbine, including fellow Mile contenders **Dance And Dance (Ire)** (Royal Applause {GB}) and **Worthadd (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). The former was a troubled-trip sixth in this event last year, while the latter boast four Group victories at this distance. Who says today's Thoroughbreds aren't as tough as their ancestors? Try telling that to Juddmonte's wonderful old stager Famous Name, who achieved a remarkable 19th stakes victory in the G3 Solonaway S. two days ago. His career figures now stand at 37-20-8-5, which means that this tough-as-teak 7-year-old has been out of the first three on only four occasions, even though 36 of his starts have been against stakes company. And it isn't just on the racecourse that he has been busy, as his trainer Dermot Weld pointed out in yesterday's *TDN*: "He takes plenty of training and we have to work him hard to keep him fit, but his enthusiasm for being a racehorse is remarkable." The son of Dansili has now won one Group 2, 12 Group 3s and six listed races and I remain convinced that he would also have won the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club in 2008 but for being drawn 17 in a 20-horse field, which forced him to race wide. He still did very well to close to within a head of the high-class Vision d'Etat. Famous Name has won at least two stakes races in each of the last five years, his 2012 total being an impressive six. His failure to win a stakes race during his juvenile season can be forgiven on the score that he wasn't born until May 8. Despite this handicap, he was a wide-margin winner on his 2-year-old debut in July and was second at Group 3 level. **Cont. p22**

Of course, I'm not exactly unbiased here. As a member of the Juddmonte team, it was my responsibility to make the initial suggestion that his dam, Fame At Last, should visit Dansili in 2004.

The reasoning behind this suggestion was that Fame At Last is a lengthy, low-to-the-ground mare who stands little more than 15.2 hands. By the fall of 2003, we had only two foals by which to judge her. Her first foal, by the 16.3-hands Zafonic, was small and lengthy and her second, by Lomitas, was also small. These foals' lack of size no doubt owed something to their being their dam's first two produce, as all of Fame At Last's subsequent foals have been bigger. Even so, it made sense to look for a stallion who usually transmits some size, such as Dansili. Dansili also appealed on the basis that his progeny are rarely lengthy--a tendency which also applied to his sire Danehill--so he made a lot of sense from a conformation viewpoint for Fame At Last.

Another incentive was that Fame At Last's second dam, Katsura, had another granddaughter, Tugela, which had already excelled with a son of Danehill, namely Desert King. Their daughter, the legendary Australian-raced mare Makybe Diva, gained her first Melbourne Cup victory at about the time the mating plans were being formulated. By the time she retired, Makybe Diva had notched up seven Group 1 victories, in the process becoming the first horse ever to win three editions of the Melbourne Cup. She was six when she completed this outstanding hat trick, so she was as tough and durable as Famous Name.

Famous Name can surely thank Dansili for much of his toughness. Dansili's blue-hen dam Hasili raced eight times at two and a further nine times the following year. Dansili was sound enough to have raced on at five, if required, but he retired after his narrow defeat in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at four. However, his brothers Cacique and Champs Elysees both enjoyed Grade I success after the age of four, as did Famous Name's broodmare sire Quest For Fame, who added the GI Hollywood Turf H. to his win in the 1990 Derby.

The toughness of Dansili's background is one of the reasons why his progeny have earned an enviable reputation for soundness. Famous Name's latest win came a day after three of Dansili's 5-year-olds had acquitted themselves well at group level. Dandino, making his 20th start, showed admirable determination in landing the G3 September S. Then Bated Breath turned in another respectable Group 1 effort to take third in the Betfred Sprint Cup. Finally Emulous failed narrowly to repeat her victory in the G1 Matron S. These three rank among Dansili's total of a dozen 2012 group/graded winners--a total which ranks him a clear third in this respect among the Northern Hemisphere stallions, behind Galileo and Deep Impact. He ranks second behind Galileo in terms of black-type winners.

There are plenty of other tough performers among Dansili's total of 45 group/graded winners, including Proviso (four Grade I wins as a 5-year-old) and Illustrious Blue (G2 Goodwood Cup as a 7-year-old).

That said, his story is by no means one dominated by mature performers. Dansili is well capable of siring quality juveniles, too, as Famous Name's sister Big Break underlined on Saturday, when she earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status with a very eye-catching victory. Juddmonte has two other talented juvenile winners by him in Ashdan and Winsili, while other owners have the very promising Irish colt Nevis, the group-placed French filly Sara Lucille and the once-raced winner Love Magic (described as "a lovely prospect" by the *Racing Post* after her debut).

Famous Name, Big Break and hopefully Ashdan are all examples of Dansili's affinity for mares from the Blushing Groom male line. He has four stakes-winning daughters out of Rainbow Quest mares, plus Famous Name and Big Break out of a granddaughter of Rainbow Quest. Dansili also has a compelling record with mares by Blushing Groom's son Rahy. This partnership has only four foals of racing age but three of them are black-type winners. He also has a black-type winner among his two foals out of Arazi mares. Perhaps this success with the Blushing Groom line stems from the fact that Dansili's pedigree also contains this exceptional juvenile.

Fame At Last's success hasn't been limited to her Dansili progeny, as she also produced the very useful Irish filly Zaminast to Zamindar. She has a yearling from the first crop by Dansili's brother Champs Elysees and is again in foal to Dansili.

The family entered the Juddmonte stud book in 1981 with the purchase, for \$400,000, of Fame At Last's second dam, Northern Dancer's group-placed daughter Katsura. Famous Name has repaid that sum several times over. More importantly--rather like Frankel--he has surely given his owner-breeder the type of pleasure that counts for far more than money.
