



**O'BERN: COOLMORE LANDS SESSION TOPPER**

Coolmore representative Demi O'Byrne purchased the top two lots of during the third session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale and lively bidding throughout propelled the session to solid gains. O'Byrne struck early for [hip 469](#), a colt by Bernardini who went

for \$1.55 million--the second-highest price thus far of the auction and its sixth seven-figure horse. The colt, consigned by Catherine Parke's Valkyre Stud for breeders Bill and Betty Currin, counts as his siblings Grade I winner Stormello (Stormy Atlantic) and recent GII Del Mar Derby winner My Best

Brother (Stormy Atlantic). "He's nice--he's got a nice walk," said O'Byrne. "He's what I like. We haven't decided [if he'll stay here or go to Europe to race]."

Asked about the price, Parke smiled and said, "It was way higher than we expected. We're not greedy people, and we don't expect anything like that."

O'Byrne also signed for a Big Brown half-brother to GII Illinois Derby winner Recapturetheglory (Cherokee Run) for \$850,000. Warrendale Sales, agent for Whitechurch Bloodstock, consigned the colt as [hip 645](#). Earlier this year, O'Byrne went to a sale-topping \$1.3 million for a son of Big Brown's first crop at FTFFEB. The colt hasn't started as yet.


When comparing day two of Book 2 this year with the same session last year, session numbers again were up. The average of \$176,393 was up 15.6%, while the median of \$145,000 was up 11.5%. That helped push the cumulative average further into the black--it currently stands up 4% to \$212,479, though the cumulative median of \$150,000 remains down 11.8%. The RNA rate has begun to come down from earlier in the week. The session RNA rate was 26.6%.

"It was a good horse sale," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson. "It was fun at the top--we sold the Bernardini very well today, and also some other horses very well."

The Coolmore partners have been active at September, purchasing no fewer than eight yearlings for a total of \$4,555,000 and an average of \$569,375. O'Byrne is the second-leading buyer at September.

Leading that list is Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company, Ltd., which has acquired 16 head for \$7,850,000, an average of \$490,625. Shadwell's top-priced acquisition yesterday was [hip 654](#), a Tapit half-sister to Canadian champion Ginger Brew (Milwaukee Brew) and multiple graded winner Bourbon Bay (Sligo Bay {Ire}) who sold for \$525,000. That was the top price paid for a filly Wednesday. Vinery bred the daughter of the Conquistador Cielo mare Coral Necklace under its Grapestock banner and sold her as [hip 654](#). - *Lucas Marquardt*

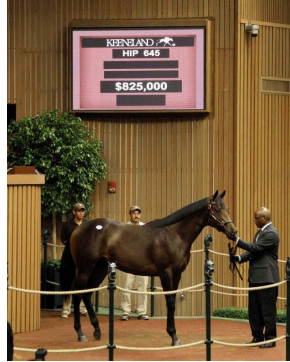

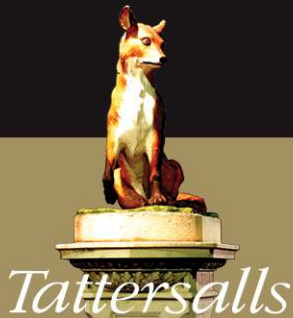

**Bernardini Colt Soars at KEESEP...**

"It's kind of a beautiful experience to have something positive happen to someone who's been so very good to you for so many years," Valkyre Stud's Catherine Parke, fighting back tears, said just after selling yesterday's session topper at Keeneland September. Parke had just sent a Bernardini half-brother to GI Hollywood Futurity winner Stormello (Stormy Atlantic) and recent GII Del Mar Derby hero My Best Brother (Stormy Atlantic) through the ring, and watched as the colt touched off a bidding duel that ending with Demi O'Byrne's \$1.55-million proffer. The Coolmore rep outlasted Live Oak's Charlotte Weber, whose farm manager Bruce Hill shook off the bidspotter at \$1.45 million, belatedly reconsidered and launched a last-ditch \$1.5 million offer, then smiled and shook his head again at O'Byrne's quick reply. The colt, a son of the Carson City mare Wilshewed, sold as [hip 469](#) and was the lone seven-figure horse to sell Wednesday.

Parke's emotions stemmed from the fact that she was selling the horse for her friend and longtime client Bill Currin, who along with his wife Betty bred the colt. A longtime trainer in Southern California, Bill Currin has battled heart issues over the past few years and turned over many of his horses to Julio Canani. But the Currins still maintain a small broodmare band of three at the Georgetown, Kentucky-based Valkyre.

"They have been clients since I started my farm 32 years ago," said Parke. "They always came to Keeneland and buy yearlings. This is the first yearling they've ever sold, because of Bill's health.

The Currins were on hand at Keeneland to watch the colt sell, just as they were on hand last week at Del Mar to watch the gutsy My Best Brother wire the field in the Del Mar Derby.

"It's been amazing to have My Best Brother run so well and win a Grade II stakes, we so enjoyed that," said Parke of the timely update. "It's been a wonderful thing for someone who's been so good to our industry."

Currin himself trained the hard-trying Stormello to a win in the 2006 GI Hollywood Futurity. Stormello stood at Vinery in Kentucky before dying of colic in 2011.

Parke said the Bernardini colt had some of his big brother's temperament. "He never broke a sweat here; he'd just prick his ears and never get upset," she said.

"Stormello was like that--he was very classy. That's important when people look at them back there [at the barns]."

Parke said the similarities didn't stop there. "This horse is a bay Stormello [who was chestnut] with more substance and more bone," she

offered. "At the same points in their lives, this horse has more substance than Stormello did. Stormello got that later. My Best Brother is a different horse; he's a big, strapping, long, grass-looking horse."

Currin, along with partner Alvin Eisman, purchased dam Wilshewed at the 2001 FTFEB juveniles-in-training sale, paying \$125,000 for the Carson City filly. She showed a bit of ability, racing all but once in maiden special company in Southern California, but was never able to seal the deal and was retired winless in 10 starts. Currin and Eisman decided to breed out of Wilshewed, however, and she proved much more adept at her new job. Stormello was her first foal, and he earned just over \$700,000 with his wins also including the GII Norfolk Breeders' Cup S. Wilshewed was sent to Stormy Atlantic three more times, with the last visit producing the 3-year-old My Best Brother. Wilshewed didn't produce a foal in 2010, but her mating to Bernardini that spring produced yesterday's topper.

"It was Mr. Currin's decision," said Parke. "He loved Bernardini, and it was his mating. And it was a very good one. [The yearling] is an unbelievable looking animal, and he has the pedigree. People kept coming back to look at him again and again--they never looked just one time, and when they came back they brought more people, veterinarians and advisors. There just weren't any holes in him."

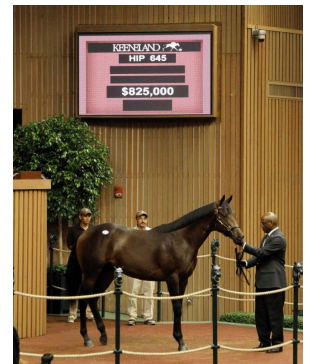
Wilshewed has a weanling filly by Giant's Causeway and is back in foal to that Coolmore stallion.

Yesterday's transaction was the best-ever result for Parke and Valkyre, whose previous top price came last September with another offspring of Bernardini, a filly out of Silk n' Sapphire who went to Besilu Stable for \$1.2 million. Parke also sold a Bernardini--Ava Knowsthecode colt last year to John Ferguson for \$625,000. -Lucas Marquardt

**'Big' Payday for Whitechurch...**

David and Ann Hanley's Whitechurch Bloodstock knocked one out of the park for \$825,000 courtesy of a son of dual Classic winner and Three Chimneys freshman sire Big Brown during Wednesday's session of the Keeneland September Sale. Demi O'Byrne made the purchase.

Consigned as [hip 645](#) by Warrendale Sales, Hanley plucked out the half-brother to GII Illinois Derby hero Recapturetheglory (Cherokee Run) for \$140,000 as a Keeneland November weanling in 2011. Out of the 16-year-old stakes-placed Dehere mare Cold Awakening, the dark bay was bred in Kentucky by IEAH Stables and Resolute Group Stables. Cont. p7

“He’s a *really* beautiful colt,” David Hanley, who co-bred and once trained champion Golden Apples (Ire), commented. “He was a lovely horse when I bought him. He was a May foal and had a lot of improvements to make, but he just improved and improved and turned into the most gorgeous colt. It worked out really well. He’s got great class, head and disposition. He’s just a real impressive colt.”

The Hanleys purchased roughly 15 weanlings in 2011 to re-sell as yearlings. The couple also turned a profit on a More Than Ready filly ([hip 560](#))--a \$155,000 KEENOV weanling who netted \$200,000 Wednesday. The Hanleys raise their own horses at their Whitechurch Farm in Lexington, Kentucky.

Did Hanley ever imagine that the Big Brown colt would bring that much in the ring?

“No, of course I didn’t,” he replied with a slight laugh. “Not at all. I thought it would be great if he made \$250,000-\$300,000. I knew he had a lot of action and had the serious guys on him. You just hope that they were there when he went into the ring. It’s wonderful.”

O’Byrne also purchased a juvenile son of Big Brown for \$1.3 million at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale in March. He is expected to make the races within the next month, according to O’Byrne.

“He’s a great mover--a very stylish horse I thought,” O’Byrne said of yesterday’s acquisition, adding that he’d probably end up in the Todd Pletcher stable. -SS

**Medaglia d’Oro Colt Headed to Japan...**

Japanese interests continue to remain quite active through the first three days of trade at the Keeneland September Sale. J.S. Company Ltd kept the momentum rolling for the Far East, making some early noise at

Wednesday’s session, going to \$600,000 to secure a well-bred son of Medaglia d’Oro. He will be trained by Yoshito Yahagi, conditioner of G1 Japanese Derby hero Deep Brillante (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Consigned by Lane’s End on behalf of breeder WinStar Farm as [hip 457](#), the bay is the second foal out of Weekend Whim (Distorted Humor), an unraced full sister to GI Haskell Invitational hero and Darley stallion Any Given Saturday.

“He had a very nice conformation,” J.S. Company’s Keisuke Onishi said after signing the ticket out back. “[Yahagi] is very interested in this horse. He thinks this colt is a good fit for Japanese racing. Mr. Yahagi trains another [unraced] 2-year-old colt by Any Given Saturday [\$220,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida purchase].”

The 6-year-old mare’s first foal is the promising juvenile filly Coconut Shrimp (Giant’s Causeway), broke her maiden at first asking over the Saratoga lawn for Todd Pletcher Aug. 13. The GI Natalma S.-bound Repole Stable colorbearer brought \$170,000 at last year’s Keeneland September auction. Weekend Whim was barren in 2012.

“He’s a *really* nice horse and [Weekend Whim] is a very nice young mare for us,” WinStar Farm President and CEO Elliott Walden commented. “We’re real excited about the prospects.”

Walden concluded, “He was really popular. I hope the owners do real well with him.” -Steve Sherack

**‘TAP’ It’s Treasures...**

Uncharacteristically absent from the final summary after Monday’s opening session of the Keeneland September sale, Todd Pletcher made up for it through the first two sessions of Book 2. The East Coast-based trainer rounded the third day as the third leading buyer with five head purchased for gross expenditures of \$1,630,000. Heading his purchases was [hip 549](#), a colt by Empire Maker. A member of the Taylor Made Sales’ Wednesday consignment, the Siena Farm-bred colt is out of the unraced mare Back Bay Dixie (Dixieland Band). The 8-year-old mare is a daughter of Copano Bay (Seattle Slew), a full-sister to four-time Grade I winner Lakeway, who in turn is the granddam of Grade I winner Mushka (Empire Maker). Mushka’s colt by Distorted Humor brought a sale-topping \$1.65-million final bid during Monday’s Book 1 evening session. The Apr. 13 foal was secured on behalf of Bill and Terry Mathis’ Mathis Stables LLC. The Oklahoma-based couple, who returned to racing following a 20-year hiatus only last year, are in the furniture business.

“He’s a beautiful colt and a good mover,” said Pletcher. “We know Empire Maker is capable of giving a Classic-type horse, and we thought he was the complete package.”

And Pletcher should have a feel for the Classic-winning sires’ progeny, being the trainer of In Lingerie (Empire Maker), victorious in this season’s GII Black-Eyed Susan S. and GIII Bourbonette Oaks and runner-up in the GI Alabama S.

“I thought he was a little more refined than some of them,” explained Pletcher. “He’s a little typier, because some of them can be a little big and gangly and he was a medium sized horse with a nice walk. He’s my kind of horse.”

Also for Mathis Stables, Pletcher secured [hip 467](#), a Glennwood Farm offered filly by Unbridled's Song for \$260,000; and [hip 525](#), a filly by Stormy Atlantic--consigned by Lane's End--for \$140,000. The former is out of stakes winner and MGSP Wildwood Flower (Langfuhr), a half-sister to MGSW and Grade I-placed Eye of the Tiger (American Chance). The latter is out of stakes winner Angel Trumpet (Cape Canaveral).

Midway through yesterday's session, Pletcher went up to \$500,000 for [hip 627](#), a colt by the 'now' sire Tapit. Consigned by Gainseway, the colt was purchased on behalf of Bryan Sullivan and Kevin Scatuorchio's Let's Go Stable. A half-brother to GI Futurity winner Cuvee (Carson City) and Grade II scorer Will He Shine (Silver Deputy), the colt is out of Christmas Star (Star de Naskra), a half-sister to Grade I winner Olympio (Naskra) and graded victress Call Now (Wild Again).

"Tapit is very hot right now," said Pletcher of the Gainesway stallion. "I thought this colt was very typical of the sire. He's not a really big colt, but he has a very good walk. He comes from a very good family and we expect him to be a 2-year-old. He looks like a precocious sort."

During Tuesday's session, Pletcher went to \$200,000 to collect Select Sales' [hip 236](#), a colt by Broken Vow, for Let's Go Stable. Out of Rejoicing (Forestry), the Mar. 16 foal is out of Pennant Champion (Mr. Prospector), a full-sister to GI winner Miner's Mark. This represents the family of the undefeated champion Phipps mare Personal Ensign (Private Account).

"He from the family of Interactif," said Pletcher, who also trained that graded-stakes winning son of Broken Vow. We've had luck with Broken Vow between Cotton Blossom and Unbridled Belle, as well as Interactif, so he's been a good sire for me."

Rounding out Pletcher's purchases Wednesday was [hip 591](#), a son of Dixie Union, bringing \$180,000. The Apr. 2 foal was produced by the winning mare But For Money (Not For Love), a half-sister to multiple stakes winner Somethinaboutbetty (Forestry) and stakes winner Petunia (Lil E. Tee). Consigned by Taylor Made sales, the dark bay was purchased on behalf of Green Hills Farm, who has enjoyed recent success with Love and Pride (A.P. Indy), victorious in the Aug. 26 GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga.

Of his purchases thus far, Pletcher remarked, "It's typical of the market that we have seen here in the last year or two. It's rebounding even though it's very competitive for good horses, but there is still a seam here where you can find some value."--Christina Bossinakis

**Brody Scores With NY-Bred Tapit Colt..**

Marlene Brody and her late husband Jerome built New York's Gallagher's Stud into a serious player in the Empire State. But if you think Gallagher's can be pegged as just a regional operation, think again. The farm has rung up a series of commercial successes in recent years, the latest of which came yesterday at

Keeneland September. Through Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud, Gallagher's sold [hip 501](#), a New York-bred Tapit half-brother to stakes winner and GI Preakness S. Icabad Crane (Jump Start), for \$450,000. Spendthrift Farm purchased the chestnut, who was produced by the 15-year-old mare

Adorahy (Rahy). The mare also produced stakes winner Our Golden Dream (Medaglia d'Oro), the \$265,000 sale topper at the 2007 FTNAUG sale. **Cont. p10**

The Brodys have a long history in New York, and not just in horse racing. Jerome was a famed restaurateur who, according to his obituary in the *New York Times* in 2001, “transformed the restaurant culture of New York as operator of a series of glittering restaurants like the Four Seasons, the Rainbow Room, Gallagher’s Steak House and the Oyster Bar in Grand Central Terminal.”

Today, Gallagher’s Steak House is still a favorite of race fans in New York, and has locations in Las Vegas, Denver, Atlantic City and Tampa.

The Brodys purchased the land on which Gallagher’s Stud sits in 1976, and two years later began acquiring Thoroughbred stock to populate the upstate New York property, which is about 70 miles southeast of Saratoga. In the early days, the farm also raised cattle, but by the mid-1980s they decided to focus solely on horses. Today, the farm keeps between 10 and 12 mares.

“We generally keep the fillies and sell the colts, but we’ll race a colt here or there if we can’t get him sold,” said Brody.

Erudite and with a clever sense of humor, Brody has an impressive recall of her horses, their personalities, and their race and produce records. Mallory Mort, who has been with the farm since 1979, has a similar knowledge of Gallagher’s history and honor roll, and the two can easily outline the development of the Tapit colt’s family.

It started back in 1982, when the Brodys purchased the mare Turn To Me (Cyane), third dam of yesterday’s Tapit colt, for \$105,000 at Keeneland November. She was carrying the Riverman filly Adorable Micol (Riverman) at the time, and that one went on to become one of the first homebred stakes winners for Gallagher’s. She won a stakes in France and, after being repatriated, rallied to win the GIII Countess Fager H. at Golden Gate in 1987.

“That was an exciting race,” remembered Brody during a break in the action yesterday. “She came from way, way, way back. We had sent her to Ron McAnally, and she won for him.”

Adorable Micol was a fine producer for the Brodys, too. Her first foal Adoryphar (Alydar), sold as a yearling for \$110,000 in 1990, was graded placed, and went on to become the dam of Ruthian (Rahy) and granddam of Grade I winner Rutherienne (Pulpit). Adorable Micol also produced Grade I placed Adorydar (Alydar) and multiple graded winner Adcat (Storm Cat).

Adorable Micol also was the dam of Adorahy, who has proven a similarly effective producer as the dam of Icabad Crane, Our Golden Dream and yesterday’s Tapit colt.

“He is a very muscular horse--very strong,” Brody said of the Tapit. “And he has such a personality.”

Added farm manager Mallory Mort, “He’s more like Icabad Crane than Our Golden Dream. Neither of them are huge, but they’re both very well put together. She was a bigger filly.” **Cont. p11**

Over the years, Gallagher's has bred and/or raced 12 graded stakes winners and another 20 or so black-type winners. In recent years, it has been represented by homebred Grade II winner Rahy's Appeal (Rahy), multiple graded winner Straight Story (Giant's Causeway) and Lemon Splendor (Lemon Drop Kid). Notable sales transactions include the \$925,000 Eventail (Lear Fan), a half to millionaire Take Charge Lady (Dehere) who was sold to Japanese interests at the 2006 KEENOV sale; the \$900,000 Statement, sold as a yearling at the 1999 KEEJUL sale; and the \$500,000 Summerfree, sold as a yearling last year to John Ferguson at FTSAUG.

Expectations might not be quite that high for Gallagher's next offering, a Broken Vow filly who sells Saturday through Denali as [hip 1413](#), but Brody and Mort are quietly confident in the chances of the daughter of SP Leonor Fini (Ire) (Peintre Celebre).

"She's a big, attractive filly with a lot of quality and a great walk," said Mort.

Gallagher's previously sold a Lemon Drop Kid filly out of Leonor Fini for \$80,000 at KEESEP two years ago.

Named Red Lemon, the filly was shipped to Russia, where she won six of her first seven starts, including the South of Russia Grand Prix, considered a Group 1 in that country.

One horse Gallagher's didn't get sold was [hip 66](#), a colt by Medaglia d'Oro out of graded winner Cellars Shiraz

who RNA'd for \$200,000 during Monday's opener. But the horse might still have a new home. "During the bidding, Christophe Clement came over and sat down and said how much he liked the horse, and how he'd like to train him," said Brody.

Asked if she was going to grant Clement his request, Brody smiled wryly. "I'm going to keep him guessing for a while." -Lucas Marquardt

Out of the stakes-placed Tempting Note (Editor's Note), the colt is from a cross that has already proven successful with multiple graded stakes placed Tempted to Tapit. The colt is also a full-sibling to a 3-year-old filly named Dance Card, who brought \$750,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale last year.

"Tempted to Tapit has been successful, so Bruce wanted to give it a go and this is the result," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "He was a beautiful horse and everyone was on him. He's progressed the whole time. The colt looks like he can be any kind."

In the moments leading up to the Tapit colt's entering the ring, agent John Moynihan stood in the back ring looking intently at the grey strut his stuff. As soon as the Apr. 14 foal entered the main pavilion, it quickly became apparent Stonestreet Stables' main man was not going to back down easily. And he didn't. After a quick tussle with several other bidding factions, including California horseman John Sadler, Moynihan landed the day's choice offering.

"He was a great Tapit," said Moynihan. "He was a really pretty horse and showed himself great. The mare has been bred to Tapit twice and has produced two stakes horses. It's a lot of money, but we'll take our shot. We'll keep our finger crossed."

According to McMillin, his son Luke was instrumental in raising Tuesday's topper.

"We raised him and my son Luke worked with him since he was a foal and he came along good," he recalled. "We never had any trouble out of him."

Despite having high hopes for his star colt, McMillin said he was cautiously optimistic heading into Tuesday's session.

"There seemed to be plenty of people on him," McMillin said. "He looks like he has raw talent, is long and looks like he will go fast. Everything worked out good."

The McMillin family has already tasted success in conjunction with Gainesway, having bred Afleet Express (Afleet Alex), winner of the 2010 GI Travers S. At the time Afleet Express was conceived, brothers Robert, Pat, and Bruce McMillin owned McMillin Brothers Farm near Georgetown, Kentucky. Robert McMillin died in October 2006. **Cont. p14**

“Bruce’s brother, Bob, was a friend of mine,” revealed Herson. “I talked him into breeding a mare and he wanted to breed to Afleet Alex. He bred his mare named Expense (Lemon Drop Kid) and she produced a colt named Afleet Express, who won the Travers for Gainesway. So, this is a great follow up to that story and it just shows that the small man can put a lot of money in his pocket. It’s a terrific story.”

**Small Operation; Big Results...**

McMillin’s entry into the breeding game was assured by the generosity of a family friend.

“When I was very young, a friend had a Thoroughbred mare and he let us have her, and we bred her and sold the yearling at the sale,” he explained. “The yearling brought \$2,000, that was a lot of money back then. That’s how I got started.”

McMillin, who also makes his living as a crop farmer, has been in the horse business for over five decades. He formerly operated McMillin Farm with his brothers Bob and Pat until Bob’s death in 2006. At that point, a decision needed to be made as to the farm’s future.

“My son, Luke, wanted to stay in the business, so we decided to run it together now,” said McMillin. “We just have a small operation, we keep only 4-5 mares.”

In addition to Afleet Express and Tempted to Tapit, the small broodmare band has produced Dance Card, the winner of her last two starts, including a nine-furlong test at Saratoga Aug. 17.

“She was differently made, a slighter filly,” McMillin said of the filly. “[Tuesday’s topper] has a little more quality and is bigger.”

A \$50,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February purchase in 2006, McMillin purchased Tempting Note privately from a friend looking to sell in 2008.

“We had a client in Las Vegas who needed to sell her,” he explained. “I bought the mare and her Tapit weanling [Tempted to Tapit] as a package.”

Following the success of Tempted to Tapit, McMillin decided to go back to the well for another try.

“I liked that foal and she turned out to be good, which is why I went back to Tapit,” offered McMillin.

Earlier this year, Tempting Note produced a Scat Daddy filly, and McMillin indicated no decision has been made as to whom she will be bred back to.

“She’s in good shape,” McMillin said. “She foaled late, so we decided to give her some time off.”

When asked to comment on the small farm’s big recent scores, McMillin’s response was understated and modest.

“I guess we’re just small time,” offered McMillin. It appears small time just hit big time.—CBoss

## WILD TIMES

Known as the "Fillies' St Leger", today's G2 Park Hill S. takes place over the same track and trip as Saturday's main event, and this renewal could be one for the older generation if **Wild Coco (Ger)** (Shirocco {Ger}) builds on her impressive display at Glorious Goodwood. Long held in high esteem by Sir Henry Cecil, Gestut Rottgen's homebred 4-year-old shook off any rustiness on her seasonal bow when registering a 2 3/4-length success in the Aug. 2 G3 Lillie Langtry S. over 14 furlongs. The Queen's June 22 G3 Queen's Vase heroine **Estimate (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) was only third on that occasion and, while there is no obvious reason why she should be able to reverse the form here, connections are hopeful she can narrow the gap. "With 3-year-old fillies that mature like Estimate has been doing, you are always hopeful that there is a few pounds of improvement in them as they progress to each race," John Warren, The Queen's bloodstock and racing advisor, told *PA Sport*. "She is bred to improve, and fillies like her tend to do so at this time of year, so I would say there is every chance she will go forwards as opposed to backwards." Another sophomore promising to take the next step up the ladder is Abdullah Saeed Belhab's **Ambivalent (Ire)** (Authorized {Ire}), who beat last year's Park Hill runner-up Set to Music (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) fair and square in the Listed Chalice S. over 12 furlongs at Newbury last time Aug. 5. Bruce Raymond, racing manager to the owner, commented, "Ambivalent is in top form, so we are hopeful. She won nicely at Newbury last time. She is improving all the time and she enjoyed the faster ground because she didn't like it soft at Newmarket the time before that. We are confident she will stay the trip."

and Stacelita (Fr), has been euthanized at the age of 22. Having suffered from blindness in recent years, the Gestut Schlenderhan resident was found to have a neurological disorder. As the sire of 51 group/graded winners worldwide and 14 at the highest level, the former winner of two renewals

of the G1 Europa Preis and one G1 Aral-Pokal has become a leading influence at stud.

Gestut Schlenderhan's Stud Manager Gebhard Apelt said, "We are still in shock, as this marks the end of an era, and his death is a major loss for the entire Thoroughbred industry worldwide. We haven't been able to make any future plans as yet, we still need some time to digest the fact that Monsun is no longer there."

Bred by Gestut Isarland, Monsun carried the famed silks of Baron Georg von Ullmann during his racing career and was a leading representative of the outstanding crop of 1990, which also included Group 1 winners Lando (Ger), Sternkönig (Ire) and Kornado (GB). At three, he was second to Lando in the G1 Deutsches Derby, and was voted "Horse of the Year" in 1993 as a result of his subsequent wins in the Aral-Pokal and Europa-Preis. The following term, he came up short against Lando again in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden before taking a second edition of the Europa-Preis, and returned in 1995 to take the G2 Gerling Preis and G2 Hansa Preis.

Monsun's leading earner to date is Shirocco, who bankrolled over \$2.5 million while capturing the 2004 G1 Deutsches Derby, the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup and the 2006 G1 Coronation Cup. Stacelita earned upwards of \$2.3 million. She notched four Group 1 wins in France and was honored with an Eclipse Award following her wins last season in the GI Beverly D. S. and GI Flower Bowl S. Manduro enjoyed a banner year in 2007 with victories in the G1 Prince of Wales's S., G1 Prix d'Isphahan and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, and retired with earnings approaching \$2 million.

His reputation as a sire of sires is growing, with Manduro responsible for the G2 Dante S. winner Bonfire (GB) and last year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud scorer Mandaeon (GB), and Shirocco producing the 2011 G1 St Leger runner-up Brown Panther (GB). This year's Royal Ascot also showcased his prowess as a broodmare sire of note after Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) captured the G1 Gold Cup, while two of his other daughters have thrown this year's G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis hero Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) and the high-class Night Magic (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}).

Just this January, Monsun was awarded the celebrated title of "chef-de-race" ([click here for more detail](#)). Including this year's juveniles, he still has four more crops to represent him.

## RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### *Trinniberg Returns to Tab...*

**Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg), a disappointing ninth in the GI Foxwoods King's Bishop S. in his most recent appearance Aug. 25, returned to the worktab at his Calder base Wednesday morning, breezing a half-mile in a bullet :47 flat over a surface rated wet-fast. "I'm very happy with the way he worked this morning," owner and trainer Shivananda Parbhoo said. "And he came back good; he dove right into his feed tub and within 10 minutes it was gone." Trinniberg went into the King's Bishop as the pro-tem leader of the 3-year-old sprinters, with wins this year in the GIII Swale S., GIII Bay Shore S. and GII Woody Stephens S. He stubbed his toe a bit when runner-up in the GIII Carry Back S. July 7, but faltered in the King's Bishop after setting relatively easy fractions. "I'm still confused about what happened that day," Parbhoo said. "I know that in this game you are going to lose races, but it's frustrating because it happened in one of the bigger races we had pointed for and it doesn't appear that anything was wrong with him. I had him checked out over and over again, and nothing was wrong. Even today, after the breeze, we had the vet look him over completely, and he appears to be as good as ever." Despite the below-par effort at Saratoga, Trinniberg is still a candidate for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 3. "That's still the plan," Parbhoo said of Trinniberg's expected autumn trip to California. "He'll have one more race before then, but I haven't put much thought into which one it will be. He's going to have to show me that he's ready for California. And when he does, we'll definitely be going."

### *Frankel to Gallop at Newmarket...*

Crowds on Newmarket's Rowley Mile on the day of the Cambridgeshire H. Sept. 29 will get the chance to see **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) enjoy a racecourse gallop, trainer Sir Henry Cecil revealed. Bridging the time gap between the G1 Juddmonte International at York and his finale in the G1 Qipco Champion S. at Ascot Oct. 20, Khalid Abdullah's world-leader will exercise up the same strip used on 2000 Guineas day prior to his return in the G1 Lockinge S. "All going well, Frankel will have a racecourse gallop at Newmarket at the Rowley Mile racecourse an hour before racing on Sept. 29," Cecil said on his website. "I am very happy with Frankel's work at this stage."

### *Siyouma Aimed at Sun Chariot...*

Robert Jeffcock's **Siyouma (Ire)** (Medicean {GB}) is being targeted at a return to Newmarket for the G1 Kingdom of Bahrain Sun Chariot S., trainer Francois Doumen announced yesterday. Third on the July Course in the G1 Falmouth S. there July 13, the lightly raced 4-year-old will be at the Rowley Mile for the Sept. 29 mile contest, for which 23 fillies and mares remained at the latest forfeit stage. "The race is the target for her," her conditioner commented. "We remembered how well she ran in the Falmouth S. over a mile, so we are going to try our luck again at Newmarket. The pace of British racing obviously suits her better than French racing. She is versatile in regards to ground--I have never seen it bother her. She has never finished further than two lengths behind the very best, so I think she is top-class. She is only starting to reach her best now, and I think she could be even better next year."

### *Arc Unlikely for 'Risk'...*

Jean-Paul Gallorini's **No Risk At All (Fr)** (My Risk {Fr}) looks an uncertain starter in the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe after suffering a setback. Successful in the G3 La Coupe at Longchamp June 11 and July 18 G3 Grand Prix de Vichy on his last two starts, the 5-year-old faces a race against time to make the autumn feature. "It's just a small problem behind the knee on his right foreleg," Gallorini told *Racing Post*. "I would say the chances of him running in the Arc are not great. We must wait and see, but the history of the race tells you that you need a clear run, and it would be difficult without a prep run."

## RACE AGAINST IBD DISEASES: STAGE ONE

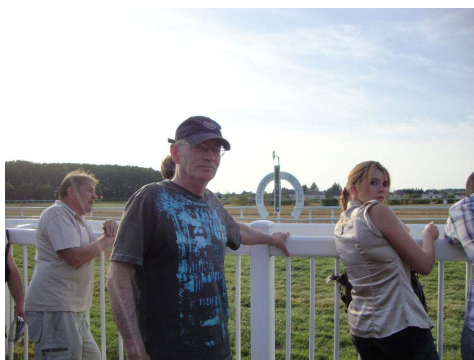
Our goal, in two stages: cycle 200 kilometers (125 miles), arriving at racecourses each time, where we make a "thematic" wager. The bet symbolizes the dilemma of many who suffer from inflammatory bowel diseases (Crohn's and ulcerative colitis) who must "handicap" from a "field" of medications, with only approximate probabilities of success.

There is no cure, as yet, for this painful and disabling autoimmune disease but a good "pick" of medication can offer relief and sometimes remission. Our bicycle voyage is raising money through donations to support research for a cure. (See previous blogs [here](#) and [here](#).)

Let's start with the ending of Stage One: bottom-level country track of Tours (Loire region). Yes, we got there, but not without some daunting challenges during the 149 kilometers.

At the track, Alan Kennedy and I confronted a type of racing we were unaccustomed to betting. The Tours track is remote from the main circuits, with only five race cards per year. Five of today's races were for trotters (on grass!) and four were thoroughbred races. The small grandstand (cement benches) was packed, the crowd spilling out into grassy areas. In 88-degree heat, the best seat was on a bench under a tree.

The track is near a big-box suburb, but the grounds themselves are seductively green, with wooded background.

Our bet for the charity came in the 8th race, the last Tbred event. Remember the rule. We make the wager, and if we win (big "if"), the winnings go to the charity. The race was for amateur riders, adding wagering insecurity. We wanted to make a lot with a moderate bet; we staggered the combinations so that there could be a "saver" payoff. What we really wanted was a cure, which would happen if our picks finished one-two-three in the 11-horse field.

We played the 1, Air Chris (low-percentage rider Madmoiselle Artu had won on this horse). We chose the 4, Aux Quatre Saisons, because he had once won at this same track, but that was on a heavy rain-drenched surface (today's surface was parched-firm from the lack of rain). Our third horse, the 8, Sleuth, showed a promising win at a lower-level track we had never heard of, only his second career try.

Metaphorically, our handicapping paralleled making an iffy choice of medications for IBD disease.

Our result turned out like the results of a typical IBD medication. We lost the race because the 5 horse won. However, our 1-horse was second and our 4-horse third (the 8 finishing fourth). Since two of our horses were in the money, we won \$20 in a consolation payoff. That will be added to the pool of donations.

In summary, we won a bit of relief without winning the long-term remission.

And our trip? I planned it for a season when the average temperature is 70 F. But we were hit with as much as 18 degrees higher. Whenever Alan and I take a cycling trip, the temperatures zoom up uncomfortably the day of our departure, and then plunge back to normal just after we return.

We departed in the fresh morning, the moon remaining starkly visible in the daylight sky, from a town just south of Orleans. I, the pessimist, griped about the imminent spike in temperatures. Alan, the optimist, rejoiced that his no-rain dance had worked.

**The Loire.** Our ride was mostly along the Loire, the last wild river in Europe. The river itself has fought off ship transport and tourist cruises by forming hundreds of evolving island obstacles. This moody river is sometimes Zen, sometimes raging, and occasionally both these personalities swirl simultaneously in a danse macabre. Beaches are here and there, but wading can be dangerous, the locals say, because of unexpected spots of quicksand. On the chaste islands, heron eggs are protected from the foxes ashore.

**Bicycling the Loire.** They call it Loire a Velo: 500 miles of sign-posted bike paths along the river and numerous other well-kept cycling routes nearby, often through pungent forests. Certain bike-path itineraries take you from one castle to another.

These facilities include cycling paths (protected), country roads with virtually zero car traffic where bicycles have the right of way, and packed dirt-bike paths. Bicyclers of all ages populate the network, making frequent and long stops. Alan and I had to make first post and painfully, we let this beauty flow by too quickly.

**Our trip.** The itinerary took us through the grainy castle-fortress towns of Meung-sur-Loire and Beaugency. The halfway point was the city of Blois, with its stone bridges crossing a wider portion of the Loire and its castle with double-spiral staircases.

Following our riverbank picnic, the sun hammered down, but the bike paths remained soothingly cool. The castle in Chaumont is perched on a cliff, built into limestone. We stopped for a drink at an outdoor café. Our goal was the city of Amboise, with a medieval fortress castle forged into the cliff.

Our bed-and-breakfast reservation came with a promised garden picnic table next to a weeping willow and a pear tree. The owner told us we needed to arrive before six because she closes down after that. Her excuse: her breakfasts are home-made, including the breads, and she wakes up with the roosters to prepare them.

For us, this meant a change from the usual riding strategy. At 4:30 pm, when the sun was strongest, we emerged from the protective bike paths and faced the final 11 kilometers of energy-sapping heat. Normally we would stop under tree cover, where I'd dump my backpack as a pillow in the grass, for a glorious siesta.

But the B&B schedule forced us to bear on. I felt the onset of heat stroke, even as I drank water continuously. You're supposed to halt strenuous exercise in such situations, but we had our deadline. I doused my head with water and rolled on. When we arrived at the B&B, I cooled down for an hour and was ready for a gourmet picnic that Alan had gone and picked out from a green grocer: shrimp, artichoke hearts, ripe cheese, garden tomatoes, crusty, grainy bread.

Day 2 seemed easier. Tours was a straight shot along the river. We passed the troglodyte town of Montlouis-sur-Loire, admiring cave dwellings and wine cellars with their façades pointing out from the limestone cliff.

At Tours we stopped to see the Gothic cathedral, resting in the shady garden of an art museum. Tours is located between two rivers, the Loire and the Cher. To get to the race course, we crossed the Cher. At the last few yards of a tree-lined bike path, I stopped to ask a pedestrian how to get to the hippodrome.

"Just go straight ahead!" She took a long look and me: "But it's a brutally steep hill and you may not make it." You could see real fright in her eyes. We had to navigate through a dangerous cloverleaf, with no respite from the sun: my second opportunity to get heatstroke.

Eventually, we got to the top. It was like Jack and the Beanstalk: a very different place up there, but now the ogres were big box stores, furniture, clothing, home improvement, sports equipment, office supplies; the only break in the treeless parking-lot landscape was a McDonalds and KFC. This place was a crime against humanity, "the shopping lot of Tours," according to locals.

We turned off the strip, following the sign for hippodrome, things got greener. For the first time in 10 hours of cycling, we found cookie-cutter housing clusters. Beyond, the race course was our oasis.

Distance traveled: 92km from south of Orléans to Amboise and 57 km from Amboise to the race track (this count includes the round-trip between my apartment to the Paris train station).

The California Horse Racing Board has filed a pair of complaints against trainer Carla Gaines after the Maddy Laboratory at the University of California at Davis determined that two horses under her care, A Little Luckier (Lucky J. H.) and Winding Way (Malibu Moon) contained levels of testosterone in excess of permissible levels. It is a Class 3 violation in California. A Little Luckier was second in a July 14 maiden at Betfair Hollywood Park, while Winding Way won a Del Mar allowance July 21 and has since added the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. Aug. 19. Hearings for Gaines, the disqualifications of the two horses and redistributions of the purses are pending.

## WRITERS UP

### A MILLION DOLLAR HEART

When Michael Beychok won the \$1 million first prize in the National Handicapping Championship he never forgot about the filly who made it all possible. The horse that put him over the top is named Glorious Dancer, who came through for Beychok in an \$8,000 maiden claimer at Golden Gate Fields. But for all the determination she showed that day to win the race by a nose, she would always be a cheap horse and cheap horses often wind up on someone's dinner table.

So Beychok vowed that no harm would ever come to this horse.

"I watch that race and she absolutely didn't have to win," he said. "She shouldn't have won that race, but you can just tell that she wanted to so bad. I figured I owed her

something. I owed it to her that she had a good life. After all, I have a better life because of her."

Two starts after Glorious Dancer gave Beychok his big score, the new millionaire, along with brother and a friend, claimed Glorious Dancer for \$6,250. He had no reason to believe that her former owners would ever send her off to slaughter, but he didn't want to take any chances.

"I figured this was a great opportunity to do what I thought was the right thing and make sure, regardless of how she finishes her career, that she would be around for as long as she could be," he said.

Beychok ran the filly, who was turned over to trainer Steve Sherman, three times and she performed well. She gave Beychok a win, a second and a third, but after she was the runner-up in a June 14 race, Sherman told him the filly was sore.

"Steve, who I have nothing but great things to say about, said she wasn't completely 100 percent sound," Beychok recalled. "He said, 'We can give her some drugs, all legal, or a shot, help her along and then race her again. But I know what your situation with this filly is and I want you to know there's a chance something could go wrong.'"

That's all Beychok needed to hear. Glorious Dancer was taken out of training and shipped to his native Louisiana for some rest, relaxation and recuperation. If she thrives, he may run her again, but he's more inclined to pull the plug on her career. He could breed her, donate her to a program for handicapped children or just let her spend the rest of her life enjoying herself in a big paddock somewhere.

Beychok started to develop his interest in horse retirement after reading about Ferdinand's grisly death in a Japanese slaughterhouse. The 1986 Kentucky Derby winner was one of his favorite horses and he proudly recalls cashing a bet on him that day at Churchill Downs.

"I read the article about Ferdinand and thought, 'you have to be freaking kidding me, this can't be true, this must be a mistake,'" he said. "How in the world could that have happened to a horse like that? Not enough attention is brought to this problem. It 's definitely swept under the rug."

He was also influenced by a cousin, Trina Bellak, who was involved in horse rescue before dying of breast cancer. Bellak was the founder of American Horse Defense Fund.

He hopes that his story will influence others. Not too many people win \$1 million playing the horses, either in a contest or at the betting windows, but plenty of people cash big tickets, maybe a Pick Six or a superfecta. You don't have to spend \$6,250 claiming a horse that gave you the big payday, but why not donate \$20 to a horse rescue group in the honor of the horse who ran his eyeballs out for you?

"I think we take for granted what these horses do for us," Beychok said. "Even for the people in the business, in the industry, these horses give everything they've got because they don't know any better. When they're running they're running their hearts out. After we've cashed a bet on them and have enjoyed watching them and cheering for them, we probably don't do enough as bettors. I hope this is an example, will influence others and in a small way it will save another horse."

The problem of what to do with cheap and infirm horses after they can no longer perform on the racetrack is a difficult one. Saving every last one of them may never be possible or economically feasible. But a lot more can be done. It just takes more people deciding to do the right thing.

Michael Beychok did it. You can too.
