Ballydoyle's class act brought mass appeal to Doncaster's Town Moor and the sell-out crowds left largely deflated, as Camelot tried in vain to reel in the 25-1 winner and Mickael Barzalona in the final yards.

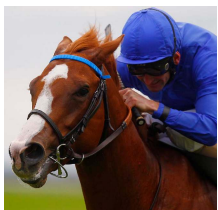

WOODBINE WISE

Morton Fink's **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) takes his game north of the border for today's C\$1-million G1 Ricoh Woodbine Mile at Woodbine, a "Win and You're In" race for the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita Nov. 3. The versatile chestnut has been firing on all cylinders this season for trainer Charles Lopresti, putting up some of the highest Beyer Speed Figures of 2012 via his 117 in the GIII Ben Ali S. on Keeneland's Polytrack and a 109 last out in the GII Fourstardave H. on the Saratoga sod Aug. 11. In between those two? He missed by a head in the G1 Stephen Foster H. on the Churchill Downs dirt June 16. Jockey John Velazquez has been his regular partner since the pair teamed up to annex the G1 Clark H. at Churchill last November, and Lopresti is leaving the race strategy up to the new Hall of Famer. "I'll let John Velazquez tell me what he wants to do," Lopresti said. "He knows him better than anybody. Johnny said to me when you get that horse covered up, he's a lot better and he relaxes. He did a good job with him the last time." Lopresti saddled last year's winner of this event Turallure (Wando). **Cont. p14**

Encke arrived at Doncaster with one of the lowest profiles of all of Godolphin's past St Leger heroes, having won a 10-furlong handicap by a half length at Sandown off an official handicap mark over 30 pounds below Camelot's only three starts ago July 6. Beaten a nose by Frankel's brother **Noble Mission (GB)** (**Galileo {Ire}**) on his belated first pattern-race appearance in the G3 **Gordon S.** over 12 furlongs at Goodwood July 31, the bay was third behind **Thought Worthy (Dynaformer)** and **Main Sequence (Aldebaran)** in a renewal of the G2 **Great Voltigeur** that was effectively a meander-and-sprint affair.

Rank here as the Gosden pacemaker **Dartford (Giant's Causeway)** failed to set the fast fractions expected, Encke appeared to be traveling as well as Camelot, who had steadily crept between rivals from rear inside the final three furlongs.

Whereas O'Brien took a moment to gather the favorite at the quarter pole, Barzalona seized the day and Camelot's rider quickly went from ice-cool to panic as his mount failed to pick up instantly. Encke was in the clear by the time Camelot found top stride and the nine slaps with O'Brien's whip were not enough to bring out the familiar pizzazz of the previously unbeaten colt.

This was a sixth St Leger victory for Godolphin, which places Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's operation joint-second on the all-time list.

"This horse would rank with the very best of our winners--it was a great effort," Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented. "Mickael rode a beautiful race and when he kicked at the two pole, he put the race to bed."

Winning trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni revealed afterwards that he had little faith in Encke's Classic bid. "He ran a good race in the Voltigeur, but I thought that was him and he was no more than that," he explained. "I thought he had no chance today and told Mickael to save him and try and be placed, but he's tough and kept going. In fairness to Mickael, he has always liked him and told me he had the class."

Crisford added, "We put a line through his run at York and Mahmood had been very happy with his work in the build-up to the Leger and Sheikh Mohammed gave the green light to run him. We weren't sure about his stamina going into the race, but he's quite stoutly bred, so we thought it wouldn't be a problem. What we loved about that race was the turn of foot he showed, which stands him in good stead for next season and he will stay in training. I would imagine it's very unlikely he'll run in the Arc, but we will see what Sheikh Mohammed wants to do. I would imagine he will have a plan geared around next summer. This is one of the great races of the British calendar and we have been very lucky to win it six times. We went into the race thinking we probably wouldn't beat the favorite, but definitely fancying a piece of the pie and Mickael gelled really well with him today as we told him to keep an eye on the pacemaker and ride accordingly."

Camelot's trainer Aidan O'Brien was dealing with the fall-out of the shock, which brought to an end the dream of the Triple Crown John Magnier had described as a "no-brainer" to chase minutes before the race. "I thought the pace was going to be strong and I should have run a pacemaker or two," O'Brien explained. "He was where I would have wanted him to be and he had to relax him going this distance, but he just tanked a bit early and had to take his time down the straight. He didn't quicken like he did in the Guineas and Derby, but that was liable to happen as he was going a bit further than his distance." As for what is next for Camelot, O'Brien added, "The thing that was going on in my head was that, if he was staying in training next year, he wouldn't run any more this season, but the lads will make that decision."

John Gosden was pleased with the effort of the third-placed Michelangelo. "Michelangelo has finished strongly to get third," Gosden told *PA Sport*. "Our pacemaker set a nice even gallop. There was no point going off like a lunatic because they know you're only rated 70-something."

Fittingly, Dawn Approach was the first winner for his sire, who achieved so much for Jim Bolger and cemented the Coolcullen maestro's great renaissance among the training ranks. Given a break following his success in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. June 19, the handsome chestnut raced in third early yesterday, tracking his stable companion Leitir Mor as Flying the Flag (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) set off in isolation. Dawn Approach was committed running to the furlong pole and, despite a minor jink away from the whip, was quickly in control as Flying the Flag was treading water on the far side. Only Designs On Rome emerged from the pack in behind, but the Godolphin blue was way beyond recall, not for the first time on a Saturday to remember for the set-up.

"He's grown 3/4 of an inch since Royal Ascot and was 12 kilos heavier today," trainer Jim Bolger said. "The agreement was that I would have him until after the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 13] and that we'd sit down and talk about it then. Obviously, I would be hoping that Sheikh Mohammed leaves him with me, but if he doesn't, I can't complain."

"It was a very important day, but he did what I thought he would do," Manning commented. "Physically, he's done very well and he's going the right way. He hasn't disappointed all year and has gone from strength to strength. Seamie [Heffernan] went very quick--five-furlong pace--in front and it made it messy because when you let a horse go that far clear, it's never ideal. You can end up chasing them and when they fall in a hole, you end up in front too soon, but it turned out well. He's been working very well and he's a very smart horse."

Cristoforo Colombo (Henrythenavigator) was reportedly injured in transit and that outcome, paired with the poor efforts of the yard's Nevis (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Flying the Flag in the race, inflicted more woe on Aidan O'Brien's team on an unusual day of consistent reversals for the operation.

Samitar, campaigned during a successful juvenile campaign by Nick and Olga Dhandsa and John and Zoe Webster, was purchased privately by Martin Schwartz prior to her 12-1 upset of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 27. The bay then finished fourth in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 22 and, in what would be her final start for trainer Mick Channon, came up a neck short when third in the GII Lake George S. on the Saratoga sod July 25. Getting Lasix in her first appearance for Chad Brown, Samitar settled in fourth as Karlovy Vary (Dynaformer) took the field through a tepid :49.74 opening half. The crowd's choice began to gear up on the far turn and took aim at new leader Ciao Bella (Giant's Causeway) as they straightened into the lane. No sooner had she taken over than Somali Lemonade came with a big run, but Samitar dug in gamely to garner her second top-level score. "She had been training great and blended into our program nicely," Brown noted. "She came to me in good shape to begin with. I was happy to see her get 1 1/8 miles. That was my one reservation, watching her train and in her races. She has the quality to do it, but I needed to see it, and I saw it today, which is great."

Transferred to Tommy Carmody after a moderate winter hurdling campaign with Jonjo O'Neill, Royal Diamond was runner-up in Europe's richest handicap, the Ebor, last time out Aug. 25. Racing a shade keenly on the outside of the second rank as favorite Fame and Glory set a merely adequate early gallop, Royal Diamond was shaken up at the top of the stretch when Jamie Spencer put the hammer down on the Ballydoyle pacesetter. A wave of challengers washed over the favorite 100 yards from the line and Royal Diamond got there in the last gasp under a drive to force a pulsating three-way photo finish. He was competing in his first group race and gave jockey Niall McCullagh his first Classic win. "I've had a long career, with a couple of slow years and a couple of dark days thrown in, and this means an awful lot," said McCullagh. "Last year was good and this season is going well, but this puts the icing on the cake." Carmody, a former top jump jockey for Michael Dickinson and others, added: "It was a good performance, absolutely fabulous and you couldn't write it. It's amazing, a 6-year-old ex-jumps horse winning a Leger."

In hindsight, Toronado's debut win over 6 1/2 furlongs at Newbury was above-average as the runner-up was the subsequently listed-placed **One Word More (Ire)** (**Thousand Words {GB}**) and the third **Ayaar (Ire)** (**Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}**) went on to capture the G3 **Zukunft-Rennen**. Hammered into 1-3 for the Listed **Winkfield S.** over this trip next time, the bay recorded an easy follow-up success in that July 21 Ascot staging post, but all the confidence seemed to be behind **Dundonnell (First Defence)** in this prestigious affair.

Allowed to stride to the front from the gates, he was able to wind up the tempo to suit and, despite the looming presence of the giant 5-6 favorite inside the final furlong, stayed in control in the drive to the line. "I've always thought he was a good horse, but I can only go on feel and today he's proved it," jockey Richard Hughes commented. "I was in a catch-22 situation as this horse needs a mile, but I wasn't going to go fast enough to set it up for the rest and at the same time not going that fast wouldn't suit me either. He has a lovely way of galloping--he has a beautiful action and it's a pleasure to be on him." Richard Hannon Jr. added, "He did it very well and we had agreed before that, if nothing went on, Hughesie would make it and he gave him a lovely ride. He wants all of this seven furlongs and they all had a chance to beat him, but he kept going. He's a lovely big horse who is not weak, but will grow into himself and be one for next year. Although we are not in a mad rush with him, I'd imagine the G1 **Racing Post Trophy** [at Doncaster Oct. 27] is the likeliest option. He is in the G1 **Dewhurst S.** [at Newmarket Oct. 13] and the G1 **Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere** [at Longchamp Oct. 7] and the French premiums are tempting in the latter, but the **Racing Post Trophy** is favorite at the moment. He's a **Guineas horse** and a **Derby horse**."

"The Breeders Cup was on [the radar] all along," said the colt's winning trainer and co-owner Troy Rankin. "His first start at Keeneland, we knew he was good. Each time he stepped up and showed us how much better he was. But we didn't think we'd go to the front and hold it all the way. 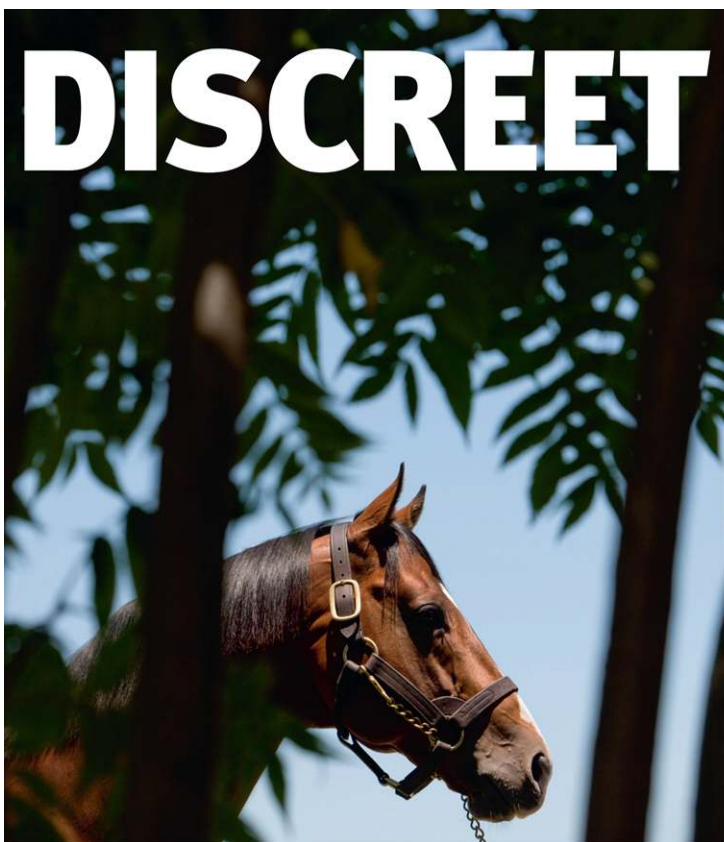

lengths. She was favored in this 14-horse affair, and her

stiffest challenge wound up coming from stablemate Spring in the Air. Jockey Patrick Husbands settled his mount in midpack as 80-1 Shenandoah Lady (Purim) showed the way early. Husbands had a handful of horse turning for home, but no way through. He bided his time 'til midstretch and got an immediate response from Spring Venture, who quickened up readily and was taken in hand late. Spring in the Air rallied down the center of the course to take second. "I was so excited," said Kathryn Sullivan, assistant to winning trainer Mark Casse. "I didn't see the other filly [Spring in the Air] coming--I was just focusing on her [Spring Venture]. That's the really best-case scenario, when you run two horses in a stake and they're first and second." It was also a good result for WinStar's first-year sire Spring At Last (Silver Deputy): the \$216,027 amassed by Spring Venture and Spring in the Air in the Natalma have vaulted the 2008 GI Donn H. winner to the top of the freshman sire list.

A first-out winner on Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 12, the Indiana-bred finished third in a Tapeta allowance at Presque Isle June 26. He handled yielding turf at Colonial Downs well enough to secure the Chenery S. July 21, and he came into this contest off a half-length second to the swift Rip Roarin Ritchie (Bring the Heat) in Monmouth's Tyro S. Stretching out beyond 5 1/2 panels for the first time, the bay colt emerged with the lead soon after the start and cut out a :47.66 opening half. We slightly undertrain her now compared to what we used to do. She got better, without a doubt, with age." Naples Bay has a 2-year-old sister by Street Sense that sold for \$200,000 last year at KESEP. Her dam was bred to Lookin At Lucky this past spring.

Maarek made the step up from competitive handicap company a winning one when contesting the G3 Chipchase S. over this trip at Newcastle on his favored testing ground June 30, but misfired on his next English raid when finishing third in the G3 Hackwood S., also over six furlongs at Newbury July 14. Off the track since then, the bay was settled in rear from the gate and was niggled along in last place at halfway. Picking up the bridle when the persuader was applied to challenge at the furlong marker, he overpowered the resurgent Starspangledbanner 100 yards from the post to win grittily. Trainer David Nagle said, "He's in the Ayr Gold Cup, but I think we'll give that a miss now. He's in [the Oct. 20 G2 British Champions Sprint] at Ascot and he's in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye [at Longchamp Oct. 7] as well, so he'll go wherever comes up softest. It would probably have to be very soft in France, so we'll look at Ascot. That was hard enough to watch--I said to Jamie [Spencer] to ride him with confidence, but I didn't mean with that much confidence." Starspangledbanner put in a flat run on his return in the Aug. 12 G3 Phoenix Sprint S. firmly behind him here. Held up early, the imposing chestnut met trouble in running, but finished off with much greater effect than last time and still shaped as if this outing will bring him closer to his peak.

He attempted to wire the field in the \$400,000 American St. Leger S. on the Arlington Million undercard Aug. 18 before ultimately finishing second to Euro invader Jakkalberry (Ire) (Storming Home {GB}). Sent off as the second choice to Rahystrada, the Illinois-bred assumed his new favorite spot on the front end, and gamboled over the Kentucky Downs hills and dales. He got away with a mile in 1:40.50, and dug in gamely when challenged by the favorite in the final furlong. Winning trainer Chris Block was quick to credit jockey Jeffrey Sanchez for Ioya Bigtime's current breakthrough. "Other jockeys couldn't handle him," Block said, "but Sanchez got him to relax. This guy turned him around."

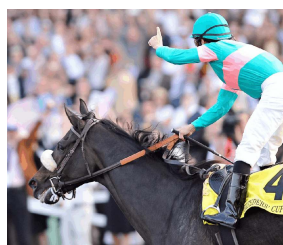

With Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) staying at home and last year's winner Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) a late withdrawal, today's G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp has lost much appeal with half of the quartet assembled being 3-year-olds without the form to feature. Fortunately, there are two 4-year-olds who can salvage the latest renewal and they are **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) and **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Both have run into the two current standard-bearers of modern flat racing in Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), respectively, and have proven their versatility over different distances at the top level. Success for Farhh here would be just reward for finishing runner-up on each of his last three starts, behind Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the July 7 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown and Frankel in the G1 Sussex S. at Goowood Aug. 1 and the G1 Juddmonte International at York three weeks later. He may have finished closer than his third placing in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. had he not been stopped in his run at a crucial stage at Royal Ascot June 20, and he seems to have overcome his earlier stalls issues. "Farhh is doing well and is ready to go," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He has run well behind Frankel on his two latest starts and it would be great to win a big race with him. The return to a mile should be no problem and I think that he will be fine racing in a small field."

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Moonlight Cloud has made her name over shorter than a mile, but was finishing with real effect after encountering traffic to be fourth on only her second try at this trip in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at her beloved Deauville last time Aug. 12. George Strawbridge's homebred had registered an impressive second consecutive win in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest over 6 1/2 furlongs at that venue a week previously, which was her first outing since giving the Australian contingent at Royal Ascot the fright of their lives in the June 23 G1 Diamond Jubilee S. "She was very unlucky last time, but I couldn't be happier with her at home--she's very well," trainer Freddy Head told *PA Sport*. "We will see what happens on Sunday and I will discuss it with her owner, George Strawbridge, to see if he wants to go to the Breeders' Cup. Otherwise she could run in the Prix de la Foret."

Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's **Galikova (Fr)** (Galileo {Ire}) has had her entire campaign planned around a second tilt at the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, in which she finished a disappointing ninth last year, and she faces opposition of the highest caliber, defending her crown, in a stellar renewal of today's G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp. The homebred bay has finished third in both goes this year, to Meandre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}) in the June 24 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and to Snow Fairy (Ire) (Intikhab) in the Aug. 19 G1 Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville, and that latest effort gained added luster when Snow Fairy annexed the G1 Irish Champion S. in track-record time at Leopardstown last week. Alain de Royer-Dupre has claimed an unequalled six renewals of this distaffers' test, and is represented by last year's third **Shareta (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) and **Sagawara (GB)** (Shamardal) this time. Shareta beat all bar Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) in last year's Arc and, a close seventh in November's G1 Japan Cup apart, she has hit the board in all starts since. Runner-up ahead of Galikova in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud in her penultimate out, she comes here off a determined score from The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the Aug. 23 G1 Yorkshire Oaks. Stablemate Sagawara hit the heights when garnering Longchamp's May 27 G1 Prix Saint-Alary and has since finished eighth in the June 17 G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly, and fourth in the July 29 G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville. Andre Fabre attempts to bridge a 19-year gap since Intrepidity (GB) won in 1993, and sends out a team of three, headed by last month's G2 Prix de la Nonette victress **Romantica (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is a daughter of the decorated Banks Hill (GB) (Danehill) stepping up to 12 furlongs for the first time.

FORTUNE TO ‘FEVRE THE BRAVE

Japanese challengers have performed with distinction in recent renewals of Longchamp's G2 Prix Foy, the older generation's trial for the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, with El Condor Pasa (Kingmambo) winning in 1999 before giving Montjeu (Ire) a mighty fright in the main event three weeks later, and Nakayama Festa (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) running second in both contests two years ago. This year heralds the arrival of last term's Japan Triple Crown hero **Orfevre (Jpn)**, another son of Stay Gold, alongside fellow Yasutoshi Ikee trainee and likely pacemaker, **Aventino (Jpn)** (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}). The pair enjoyed their last serious workout Wednesday, and connections are confident victory is within grasp today. "It's the first time back after a spell, but Orfevre seems awake and in very good condition," said rider Christophe Soumillon. "He understands what I'm asking of him and I feel like he and I have gotten to know each other well. It is easy to understand each other and I'm feeling a renewed sense of trust. I think he is on a level with Frankel." Ikee added, "I think, after Wednesday's work, Orfevre is ready. He and Soumillon seemed to be working very well together, but I was hoping the field would have more than five horses. It's his first time at Longchamp and I expect him to do well." Andre Fabre boasts a record eight triumphs in the 12-furlong test and is represented by last season's G1 Grand Prix de Paris hero **Meandre (Fr)** (Slickly {Fr}), who will line off top-level scores in the June 24 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and July 22 Grosser Preis von Berlin. The cast is completed by British-trained challengers **Fiorente (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), who annexed the July 12 G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket last time, and **Joshua Tree (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who was runner-up in that contest before garnering the Aug. 19 G2 Prix Kergolay at Deauville last time.

NIEL RIDDLE TO OFFER ARC CLUES

With seven winners going on to claim the main event since 1996, it's not often Longchamp's G2 Prix Niel, the premier sophomore prep for the Oct. 7 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, is seen as mere support on the Bois de Boulogne's famed trials card, but this year's renewal may yet serve as the reference point for Europe's Autumn Championship. His Highness The Aga Khan is the race's winningest owner, with five editions already in the bag, and his green-and-red silks will be as popular as ever if **Bayrir (Fr)** (Medicean {GB}) can maintain his near-perfect record. Beaten just once in five outings to date, he will go postward off an unorthodox route, having won both the July 22 Grand Prix de Maisons-Laffitte (Prix Eugene Adam) and Aug. 18 GI Secretariat S. at Arlington last time. His globetrotting exertions may yet take their toll, but conditioner Alain de Royer-Dupre is hopeful the homebred bay's demeanour will allay any such concerns. "Bayrir has always been a straightforward individual and is easy to handle," he explained. "He has worked in tremendous style this week although, with this being his first attempt at 12 furlongs, the race will be a stiff test." The same owner's **Kesampour (Fr)** (King's Best), who secured Saint-Cloud's May 5 G2 Prix Greffulhe before running fourth in the June 3 G1 Prix du Jockey Club for the upwardly mobile Mikel Delzangles last time, is an able wingman. Kesampour consigned Pascal Treyve's **Saonois (Fr)** (Chichicastenango {Fr}) to fourth in the Greffulhe, but the Jean-Pierre Gauvin trainee exacted revenge, and then some, with a shock victory in the Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly. He is one of four to face the starter returning from a midsummer sabbatical.

Keeneland September Yearling Sale Sept. 10-21

KEESEP MONEY ‘MAKER’

The bidding escalated rapidly for a handsome son of Empire Maker late in Saturday’s opening Book 3 session, and when the dust settled, it was bloodstock agent Mike Ryan who was signing the docket on the \$430,000 topper on behalf of a long-established client. Ryan did his bidding while standing along the wall in the pavilion. Consigned by Lane’s End as [hip 1402](#), the bay is the second foal out of the stakes-winning Pulpit mare Katerbug. Prominent breeder G. Watts Humphrey Jr. has deep ties to the session topper’s family, racing and breeding the colt’s first three dams. The third dam, Dream Deal (Sharpen Up {GB}), produced Humphrey’s MGISW Clear Mandate (Deputy Minister).

“He’s a very sweet horse--medium size,” said Ryan, who has signed for a total of 15 yearlings for a total of \$2,440,000 and an average of \$162,667 through the first five days of trade. “He had a lot of quality--oozed class. He’s a horse that has a stallion’s pedigree behind him. As far as I was concerned, he really was a smooth Empire Maker. In my mind, he was a very special horse.”

Offspring by the expatriated Empire Maker continue to be in high demand in the ring at Keeneland September this week, led by Thursday’s \$1.1-million session topper. Three others have brought more than a half million a piece.

“He measured up with all of the top Empire Makers that were in this week,” said Ryan, who also purchased an Empire Maker filly ([hip 881](#)) for \$190,000 Thursday. “I’ve tried on two or three of his others--I was underbidder on one the other day that made \$625,000 ([hip 847](#)). He’s a terrific sire and it’s a huge loss to the U.S. breeding industry. I don’t think there’s going to be any more like this guy or the one that sold Thursday for \$1.1 million. He was a very special horse. He’s a tremendous sire.”


Was Ryan expecting to pay as much as he did for yesterday’s standout?

“I told my client that we’d have to swing for the fence,” Ryan replied. “I thought he was worth somewhere in the \$450,000 to \$550,000 range and I was pretty close. The market is very selective, but man, there’s a lot of money here for the right horses. The electricity in here still is quite remarkable. There’s a tremendous appetite for good horses. I think there’s a lot of people still wanting to buy that haven’t bought yet.”

Ryan concluded, “I think it’s a fantastic sale, but it is discriminating. If you don’t have what they want, it’s not an easy road.” -*Steve Sherack*

Strong Trade Continues at KEESEP...

Following Friday’s dark day, the positive momentum built during the first two books carried over during Saturday’s opening session of Book 3 with across-the-board gains. For the session, 296 yearlings brought \$25,791,000, up 25% with last year’s same session when 280 head realized \$20,613,500. The average on the day of \$87,132 rose 18.35% from last year’s corresponding session. The median price of \$70,000 was up 37.25% from \$51,000. The buy-back rate Saturday was 21.07%--down 10.34% compared to 23.5% last year. After five days of trade, 951 yearlings have grossed \$158,644,000, good for an average of \$166,818 and a median of \$120,000. Last year through six sessions, which included two select sessions in Book 1, 1,033 yearlings brought \$165,830,000, averaging \$160,532 and posting a \$110,000 median. “The session started strong and stayed strong all the way through,” Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson commented. “Every number was right. We sold six horses for more than \$300,000 and the buyback rate was 21.07, which is lower compared to this session last year.” **Cont. p19**

Three-time Grade I winner and promising young sire Harlan's Holiday (Harlan) was a \$97,000 FTKJUL yearling. The brilliant champion Ashado (Saint Ballado), a \$170,000 KEESEP yearling, carried Starlight's blue-and-yellow silks to memorable victories in the GI Breeders' Cup

Distaff and GI Kentucky Oaks. She later resold for a staggering \$9 million as a broodmare prospect at the 2005 KEENOV sale. Purge (Pulpit), hero of the 2005 GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H., was purchased for \$180,000 as a KEESEP yearling. MGISW Take the Points (Even the Score), a \$160,000 FTKJUL yearling, earned just under seven figures. Monba (Maria's Mon), hero of the 2008 GI Blue Grass S., was a \$200,000 FTSAUG yearling.

Starlight's current stable stars were purchased in that price range as well. The unbeaten Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday), a sparkling winner of the prestigious GII Three Chimneys Hopeful S. at Saratoga earlier this month, was a \$105,000 KEESEP yearling graduate. He is being aimed at Belmont's GI Champagne S. Oct. 6. The undefeated sophomore Algorithms (Bernardini), a \$170,000 KEESEP yearling purchase, handed champion

Hansen (Tapit) a five-length defeat in the GIII Holy Bull S. in late January before being sidelined with a splint issue. The well-bred half-brother to three graded stakes winners, including former Starlight colorbearer Keyed Entry (Honour and Glory), is back in training, currently galloping at Belmont Park for trainer

Todd Pletcher.

With Frankie Brothers handling bloodstock agent duties, Starlight Racing has made its presence felt throughout the opening week of the Keeneland September Sale, purchasing seven yearlings for a total of \$1,365,000, good for an average of \$195,000. A handsome Harlan's Holiday colt led the way amongst Starlight's acquisitions, bringing \$380,000. Consigned by Select Sales as [hip 856](#), the April foal was produced by a half-sister to millionaire Crafty Shaw (Crafty Prospector). **Cont. p20**

“For our program, we reached on two horses so far this year--a Giant’s Causeway colt [for \$375,000] at Fasig August and this one here,” said Wolf, adding that Starlight also acquired [hip 26](#), a son of Tiznow--Stop the Lights from the Taylor Made draft that RNA’d for \$230,000. “They’re both sort of the same--the physicals were fantastic. Obviously we like Harlan’s Holiday. I also had a mare that raced against the second dam’s family, but that’s not why we got him. He fit Frankie’s criteria and the pedigree was in good order. Mike Ryan wanted him, too. He was the underbidder.”

Wolf’s operation has also purchased [hip 23](#), a Dixie Union--Silence Dogood filly for \$125,000; [hip 458](#), a Congrats--Weight No More colt for \$150,000; [hip 480](#), a Lemon Drop Kid--Worthy Cat filly for \$185,000; [hip 603](#), a More Than Ready--Catsuarina colt for \$225,000; [hip 618](#), a War Pass--Charmed Gift for \$175,000; and [hip 637](#), a Badge of Silver--Classy Date filly for \$125,000.

“In all of the horses that we’ve bought [at the 2012 yearling sales], I want to say that the average, even after those two, is just a little bit over \$200,000,” Wolf said. “We ended up with seven colts and six fillies [overall this buying season]. When we start out, we’re more interested in the athleticism of the horse, the walk and conformation much more than anything else.”

With Starlight’s partnerships, investors get in on the entire crop of yearling purchases, rather than just picking and choosing a select few. Wolf said that this year’s class of youngsters will be owned by a group of nine.

“We do it for a few reasons,” Wolf explained. “I think the partner has a better shot of owning a piece of 12-14 horses rather than just having one or two. We found it much better to do it this way.”

What keeps the retired hedge fund manager coming back to the well each year?

“With the partners that we have--we get along and have fun together--and all of our family and friends enjoying the experience, too, when the horse goes off winning like Shanghai Bobby, I guess that’s why we keep coming back,” replied Wolf before adding with a laugh, “Maybe we’re just action freaks?” -*Steve Sherack*

Classic winner? Check. How about a Breeders’ Cup winner? You bet. Did you see that pair of unbeaten Grade I-winning juveniles in Southern California this summer? Yes, those are his work as well.

Enter Donato Lanni.

The 43-year-old native of Montreal, Canada has been responsible for selecting all of the above at recent public auctions for various clients of Hall of Fame conditioner Bob Baffert.

Lanni, who also serves as Hill ‘n’ Dale’s Bloodstock Services Director, found two-time champion and 2010 GI Preakness S. hero Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) (\$475,000 2yo ‘09 KEEAPR) for Karl Watson, Mike Pegram and Paul Weitman. He also purchased Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Sprint hero Secret Circle (Eddington) (\$165,000 2yo ‘11 OBSMAR) on behalf of the aforementioned trio. Arnold Zetcher’s Rolling Fog (Posse) (\$62,000 2yo ‘12 OBSAPR) and Watson, Pegram and Weitman’s Executiveprivilege (First Samurai) (\$650,000 2yo ‘12 OBSAPR), both winners at the highest level at the recently concluded Del Mar meeting, and Kaleem Shah’s GI Las Virgenes S. heroine Eden’s Moon (Malibu Moon) (\$390,000 2yo ‘11 FTMMAY) were selected by Lanni as well.

In addition to his bloodstock work for the Baffert stable, Lanni is also a key member of the buying team for the prominent Glen Hill Farm, the outfit behind the talented MGSW & MGISP Marketing Mix (Medaglia d’Oro) (\$150,000 yrl ‘09 KEESEP), and the late MGSW & GISP Banned (Kitten’s Joy) (\$130,000 yrl ‘09 FTKOCT).

“What I do is a very small part of an equation of what is a complete team effort,” Lanni stressed. “Yes, buying

and selecting horses is my job, but the owners have to step up and spend the money for the horses that we want to buy. I really hate saying the word ‘I’ when talking about the horse business. We all work together. You assemble a team and everybody does their job. And if you do that

and get lucky, you might have some success in the business.”

Lanni caught the horse bug at an early age from his family, who raced Standardbreds in Canada. He began working as a groom at the tender age of 10, and hasn’t wanted to do anything outside of racing since.

Lanni packed up his car and made his move to the Bluegrass in 1996, catching his first break at Walmac Farm.

"I was at the track every summer and was always at the farm, and it was pretty much all I ever wanted to do," Lanni commented. "I was introduced to racing at a very young age. When you grow up around horses, you either gravitate toward it or run from it--it's something that's innate. The Thoroughbred capital of the world is Lexington, Kentucky, and that's where I wanted to be."

Lanni is quick to pay tribute to all that have helped show him the ropes along his journey.

"John Sikura, Johnny Jones, Bob Baffert and Tom Proctor--those four guys have been my mentors," he said. "I've learned a lot from them."

It's been business as usual for Lanni throughout the first week of the Keeneland September Sale, assisting Baffert and Glen Hill with their purchases, while also handling his duties as seller with Hill 'n' Dale. During the select session, Lanni signed for [hip 45](#), the \$1.3-million Smart Strike half-sister to Bodemeister (Empire Maker) on behalf of Sikura and Bruce Lunsford.

"It's all about the owners and the horses," Lanni concluded. "Without the owners, none of us would have a job. We're lucky enough to work for these great owners. This is a 'we' business and a team business. I'm very lucky to be involved with really good people and the horses are the reason why we're all here."

Ferguson Buys Two...

Past leading buyer John Ferguson, chief bloodstock agent for Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum, signed for just two horses for a total of \$400,000 through the first four sessions of the Keeneland September Yearling sale. Ferguson doubled that total on Saturday with two purchases for \$495,000. Ferguson, agent, purchased a Pivotal (GB) colt ([hip 1199](#)) out of Grade I winner Vacare (Lear Fan) for \$275,000 and a Raven's Pass filly ([hip 1359](#)) out of Golden Sphinx (Storm Cat) for \$220,000. Olly Tait, Darley's chief operating officer, signed the ticket for the Pivotal colt. Tait said the colt would most likely race in Europe.

"He's a very athletic colt, with a lovely shape to him," Tait said. "He's out of a lovely mare and bred by a good breeder. [Ferguson] was very keen to get him."

The Pivotal colt is the second foal out of Vacare (Lear Fan), who travelled to England to be bred to Pivotal twice. Co-breeder Helen Alexander was involved in the partnership, headed by Jon and Sarah Kelly, that bought Vacare for \$2.8 million at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November mixed sale. Three-year-old Vacare had won the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. at Keeneland a few weeks before the sale and was undefeated in four starts.

Vacare made 10 starts for her new owners, winning the Magna Distaff and a trio of Grade II grass races. Vacare retired with eight wins from 14 starts, and earnings of \$1,269,086.

"We bought her in training, and we had a lot of fun with her on the track," said Alexander, who described herself as a minority owner. "After Vacare retired, we sent her to England and bred her to Pivotal. We thought, as long as we were going to send her to England, we'd breed her to Pivotal twice. Her first foal, a Pivotal filly, foaled over there, and this colt foaled over here."

The Pivotal colt was raised at Groves' Middlebrook Farm in Lexington. Gainesway consigned the yearling.

"He was kind of an unimpressive foal, but he's grown into a nice colt," Alexander said. "He was always a good mover and well-balanced. He just wasn't one that jumped out at me as a foal. But this year, starting in May, he started to come the right way."

The Raven's Pass filly was bred in Kentucky by Iron County Farms and was consigned by Hartwell Farm. She is a half-sister to stakes placed winner High Quality (Elusive Quality). -Pete Denk

War Front Colt Brings Profit to Champion...

Ted Champion believed that the War Front colt he bought for \$72,000 at Keeneland November would be a late bloomer. He was proven correct on Saturday when the May 28 foal sold for \$250,000 to Richard Imbert's Windmill Manor Farm of Bay Shore, New York.

A native of Ireland, Champion owns Dundrum Farm in Lexington. Hunter Valley Farm, agent, consigned the colt as [hip 1049](#). He was the first horse through the ring Saturday.

"We knew there were going to be a bunch of good War Fronts this year in Book 2, so we wanted to be near the top in Book 3. We always try to place them where we'll be in the top 25% of the day," said Hunter Valley's Adrian Regan. "At the time of entry, he was still immature looking compared with the horses we were considering for book two. But from prep on, he's just been unreal. We thought he was a superstar of a horse. [Saturday morning], I never saw so much scoping inside an hour before a sale ever. He had 12 scopes."

When Champion purchased the War Front weanling, under the moniker Dingo Bloodstock, the colt, "needed a lot of improvement, typical of his foaling date," Regan said.

"That's where Ted comes in. Ted is excellent at seeing potential," Regan said. "Ted was adamant that this horse would do the job. Ted is very good. He comes from a family of horsemen back home. His father was an excellent horseman."

The colt is out of the unraced 15-year-old Septieme Ciel mare North Patterson, and was bred in Kentucky by Allan G. Lavin Jr. North Patterson has produced one winner from six foals of racing age. **Cont. p22**



War Front's published stud fee was \$10,000 in 2010 when the colt was bred. Standing at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, his fee was \$60,000 in 2012. The Danzig son's top progeny include Grade I winners The Factor and Data Plan.

"We've put a lot of War Fronts through our hands, and this was as good an athlete as we've put through the ring by the sire," said Hunter Valley's Fergus Galvin. *-Pete Denk*

Gary and Mary West Stables Buys Tapit Filly...

Bloodstock agent Ben Glass, representing Gary and Mary Wests Stables, bought a Tapit filly out of a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Zazu (Tapit) for \$340,000, highest priced filly of the session. Offered as [hip 1242](#), the Tapit filly is the first foal out of Art Princess (Officer), who was Group 2-placed in England. Gainesway, agent, consigned. Glass bought a weanling full brother to Zazu--the unraced 2-year-old Flashback--for \$260,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale. He was excited to land a similarly bred filly from the same family.

"We love the family first of all, and we love this filly. She's a fantastic looking filly in our eyes," Glass said. "(Flashback) is in training with Bob Baffert in California, and we absolutely love him. The family is getting better, and we think it's a family that's going to take off. She fit right in. We were looking for five or six fillies in this sale, and we got four now. We loved everything about this one, so we had to try and buy her."

The Tapit filly was bred by Gainesway Thoroughbreds and Michael Hernon.

"She is a really good filly that started to blossom here in the last 60 days," Gainesway's Hernon said. "She had very strong interest across the board. She was conservatively reserved, and we were delighted with the price. She'll get every chance and I'll be looking for her in top company probably on the West Coast."

Gainesway stallion Tapit accounted for four of the top seven prices on the day. West Point Thoroughbreds and St. Elias bought [hip 1340](#), a Tapit colt out of stakes-placed Free the Magic (Cryptoclearance), for \$310,000. Gainesway bred and consigned, as agent.

Green Hills Farm bought [hip 1347](#), a Tapit filly out of Game Show (Deputy Minister), for \$300,000 from Select Sales, agent. She is the first foal out of her dam, who is a half-sister to GI Kentucky Oaks winner Pike Place Dancer (Seattle Dancer) and Grade II winner and sire Petionville (Seeking the Gold).

And Gainesway hit it big again as breeder and consignor when bloodstock agent Steven W. Young went to \$275,000 for [hip 1138](#), a Tapit filly out of Shop Here (Dehere). The Tapit filly is a half-sister to graded stakes placed stakes winner Fifth Avenue (Monarchos).

The filly's second dam Shopping (Private Account) produced Grade I winner Miss Shop (Deputy Minister) and Grade II winner Trappe Shot (Tapit), whom Young as agent purchased for \$850,000 at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton Mid-Atlantic May Sale of Two-year-olds in Training.

"Tapit has had eight individual Grade I winners and they've all come from fairly modest crops at a lower stud fee," said Gainesway's Antony Beck. "This year's yearlings are the result of a \$50,000 stud fee year, and last year he bred absolutely amazing mares. One thing I can say with absolute confidence, Tapit's best years are ahead of him." *-PD*

Big Day For Gainesway Continues...

Gainesway also consigned the second and third highest priced yearlings of the day. Live Oak Plantation went to \$385,000 for a Birdstone colt out of Grand Portege (Grand Slam). The colt's second dam is Oatsee (Unbridled), dam of multiple Grade I winner Shackleford, Grade I winner Lady Joanne, and Grade III winner Baghdaria. Gainesway bred and consigned the Birdstone colt, offered as [hip 1367](#).

"He was an extremely well balanced, athletic horse who moved like a dream, and he was mentally very sound," Beck said.

Gainesway purchased Grand Portege for \$105,000 from the Bentley Smith dispersal at the 2009 Keeneland November sale.

"I was delighted to breed a really talented, fast race mare like Grand Portege to Birdstone," Beck added. "This was a filly that I particularly liked. She had a tremendous amount of talent on the racetrack, and she should have been a stakes winner. After Birdstone had that phenomenal first crop, he was bred to a bunch of really top class mares. We bred some of our other mares to him besides Grand Portege, including one called Clifton Bay, who had a yearling sell for \$150,000 today. We like to support stallions who stand at our farm."

Gainesway sold Grand Portege, in foal to Tapit, for \$300,000 at the 2012 Keeneland January sale. Xavier International Bloodstock was the buyer.

"Probably one of my biggest screw-ups, in hindsight. I liked her a lot," Beck said.

Gainesway, agent, also consigned Saturday's third highest price when Justice Family Thoroughbreds bought a Candy Ride (Arg) colt out of Maya (Capote) for \$360,000. Offered as [hip 1438](#), the colt is a half-brother to Grade II winner Al Khali (Medaglia d'Oro). Gainesway was second leading consignor by total sales with 21 sold for \$3,416,000 on Saturday. Lanes End led in total sales with 45 yearlings sold for \$3,509,000.

The Lexington-based *Thoroughbred Times* has ceased operations and is in bankruptcy. The company's 27 full-time employees were notified of their termination via FedEx letters delivered Saturday. "I obviously put a lot of blood, sweat and tears into it over the years," *Thoroughbred Times* editor Mark Simon told Lexington *Herald-Leader*. "I'm deeply saddened that we had to discontinue operations, but very proud of the job that everybody with the *Thoroughbred Times* did over the years." Simon has served as editor-in-chief of the publication since it was started in 1985. *Thoroughbred Times* was purchased by Norman Ridker's BowTie Incorporated in 1994. In July, the *Times* moved from a weekly to a twice-monthly publication.
