KEENELAND MARKET BUSTLES

As the Keeneland September Yearling Sale settled into its second week, a conglomerate of buyers eager for horses pushed the clearance rate to an unprecedented 87.5% on Monday.

While only one horse eclipsed the \$200,000 mark, there was competitive bidding across the board. The median price of \$37,000 was 48% from the sale's corresponding session in 2011.

"It was absolutely terrific," said Keeneland's Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson. "Anytime the buyback rate is under 20%, it's exceptional, and we were at 12.5%. I remember being elated last year when we were at 17%. The bottom line is there are lots of buyers wanting horses at this level."

At Monday's session, 309 horses sold for \$13,893,500, up 13.6% from the corresponding session last year. Only 44 horses were bought back. The average price increased 12.5% to \$44,963.

"The crowd here was fantastic," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We have built on last week and gathered more. We had a lot of people who came in over the weekend. We have Russians, Koreans, South Americans, Puerto Ricans, Panamanians, and American pinhookers and end-users. It was a strong mixture."

"Reserves were being blown by, and consignors were achieving full clearance rates or one off from what they sent through," Russell continued. "There were several very happy consignors."

Through seven sessions, 1,541 horses have sold for \$194,162,500, an average of \$125,998, and a median of \$80,000. The cumulative buyback rate is 23.5%.

JUVENILE CHAMPION HANSEN RETIRED

Dr. Kendall Hansen and Skychai Racing's Hansen (Tapit--Stormy Sunday, by Sir Cat) has been officially retired as the result of a tendon injury discovered late August. Last year's Eclipse champion 2-year-old, Hansen was training for an intended tilt at the

GI Travers S. Aug. 25 when inflammation was discovered in his left front leg. While considered unlikely to return to the races following his withdrawal from the Travers, Dr. Hansen confirmed his retirement yesterday. "It was a dream of a lifetime," said Dr. Hansen of his experience campaigning the three-time graded stakes winner.

"I never thought I'd have a champion and be able to run a horse in the [GI Kentucky] Derby." Dr. Hansen noted that the 3-year-old has received two injections of stem cell treatments at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky, including one yesterday morning, but that it was ultimately decided that retirement was in the colt's best interest. Hansen will remain with trainer Mike Maker at Churchill Downs' Trackside Training Center until a stud deal is finalized. "He's still getting traffic of people coming to look at him, so I'm going to keep him there on the track as long as people keep coming to see him," said Dr. Hansen. **Cont. p3**

Hansen Retired (cont. from p1)

Hansen began his career on Turfway Park's Polytrack last September, romping by 12 1/4 lengths in his debut before taking the Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. by 13 1/4 lengths. The near-white grey was sent off at 7-1 for his dirt debut in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs, and went wire-to-wire to best subsequent GI Belmont S. winner Union Rags (Dixie Union) by a head ([video](#)) in an effort which earned him Eclipse Award honors as the nation's best juvenile. Hansen suffered his first loss in his 3-year-old debut in the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park Jan. 29, but rebounded four weeks later to take the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. Second to three-time Grade I winner Dullahan (Even the Score) in his final Kentucky Derby prep in the GI Toyota Bluegrass S. Apr. 14, Hansen tired to finish ninth in the Derby after stalking the pace. Given a short rest after that effort, Hansen returned to action in the June 30 GIII Iowa Derby at Prairie Meadows, romping by 10 lengths. In what turned out to be his final career start, Hansen faded to fourth after setting the pace in the GII West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer Aug. 4.

"It was like Christmas morning with this horse for about a year every morning," Dr. Hansen said. "Every morning you'd wake up with an extra bounce in your step. You kind of get into a rut when you're middle aged, and it made me feel like a kid again. It's been a lot of fun." Dr. Hansen noted that Hansen's 2-year-old three-quarter brother Gunderson (Corinthian) could make his career debut at Keeneland Oct. 6. GRADE I WINNER GET STORMY RETIRED

Mary Sullivan's multiple Grade I-winning homebred **Get Stormy** (Stormy Atlantic--Foolish Gal, by Kiri's Clown), has been retired and will go to stud in 2013, trainer Tom Bush confirmed yesterday. "Everything's great with the horse, we just decided the time was now," Bush explained. "He only had one race left anyway, and we ran out of time to prepare him. So we're concentrating on stud plans now." The 6-year-old made 31 starts during his five-year racing career, all on the turf. He accounted for 11 wins, three Grade I victories, and earnings of \$1,606,812. The blaze-faced bay's first stakes win

came in the Lure S. at Saratoga in August 2009, and later that year he went on to take the Gill Bryan Station S. at Keeneland and the Gill Commonwealth Turf S. at Churchill. He earned his first Grade I victory last April at Keeneland in the Maker's Mark Mile, and added the GI Turf Classic S. at Churchill in his next start. Get Stormy opened his 2012 campaign with a win in the GI Gulfstream Park H. Feb. 11, but he failed to win in four subsequent tries. His last effort was a third-place finish in the Aug. 11 Gill Fourstardave H. at Saratoga behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) Aug. 11. Bush noted that there has already been interest in Get Stormy as a stallion prospect. RACETRACK ROUND-UP

BAFFERT RUNNERS TUNE UP

Multiple Grade I winner **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again), prepping for the Sept. 29 GI Awesome Again S., worked five furlongs at Santa Anita Monday in 1:00.80. "He went nice," commented trainer Bob Baffert after the move. Game on Dude is coming off a runner-up effort in the GI TVG Pacific Classic. Also working Monday for Baffert, GII Pat O'Brien S. winner **Capital Account** (Closing Argument) went four furlongs in :48.40. He is one of nine Baffert runners nominated to the Sept. 29 GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship. Also nominated to that race, **Fed Biz** (Giant's Causeway) drilled a bullet five furlongs in 1:00 Sunday. One of the nine definitely not aiming for the race is **The Factor** (War Front), according to Baffert.

CARACORTADO STILL POSSIBLE FOR CUP

Multiple graded stakes winner **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams), sidelined since winning the Jan. 8 GIII Daytona S., may still make the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, according to trainer Mike Machowsky. The 5-year-old suffered a burn on the frog of his right front hoof which has taken longer than expected to heal. "He won't make the [Sept. 29] Eddie D, but I hope to make the Breeders' Cup," Machowsky said. "I'm waiting for the frog to fill in completely."

WIGMORE HAS DUBAI AIM

Sunday's GI Northern Dancer Turf S. hero **Wigmore Hall (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) is being targeted at the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic next March. Following his repeat success in the Woodbine contest, Mark Hawtin's 5-year-old is likely to enjoy a rest in preparation for the 12-furlong Meydan turf feature of World Cup night. "He's deserved to win another nice race and it looks now like he's better suited going a bit further," trainer Michael Bell told *PA Sport*. "I think we'll campaign him around the Sheema Classic this time. If we don't give him a break, he might go to Milan for their Group 1 [the Gran Premio del Jockey Club] in mid-October."

FABRE PESSIMISTIC ABOUT ARC CHANCES

Andre Fabre was in realistic mood yesterday as he reflected on the performances of his Arc hopefuls in Sunday's trials at Longchamp, with **Meandre (Fr)** (Slickly {Fr}) looking to be the chief contender for the trainer who holds the record of seven wins. Runner-up to Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) in the older horses' course-and-distance prep, the G2 Prix Foy, the Rothschild Family's 4-year-old will not carry maximum stable confidence into the showpiece event. "It was an awful race to watch, they went no pace at all," Fabre told *PA Sport*. "The result made sense, though. The horses probably finished in the correct order. I wouldn't be sure about turning the form around in the Arc. In slow races, the best horse usually wins as they have to show a turn of foot. Everyone can make excuses for horses after slow races but the best horse usually wins. I've always thought Meandre was good enough to be placed in the Arc, but maybe not quite good enough to win." Fabre will not run Khalid Abdullah's **Last Train (GB)** (Rail Link {GB}) after his third behind the G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero Saonois (Fr) (Chichicastenango {Fr}) in the G2 Prix Niel. "Last Train ran well, but he has no change of pace," he explained. "He was beaten by two Group 1 winners, so there was no disgrace in that, but I was very impressed by the winner. When he won the Prix du Jockey Club, he showed he had a fantastic turn of foot, but people did not believe it. It is a tribute to the Jockey Club which everybody said was a bad race this year. The winner is a very good horse. Last Train will not go for the Arc, we'll let him mature and find a better race for him and he'll make a nice 4-year-old."

Regarding Teruya Yoshida's 4-year-old filly **Pirika (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), who was runner-up in the G1 Prix Vermeille, he said, "Pirika has a good turn of foot and she had excuses for her previous race. You have to respect the form, Shareta (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) looked the best horse before the race and proved it, so we learnt nothing new."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **▲** will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a **+** will indicate first-time starters, an **(S)** will be used for state-bred races, a **(C)** will be used for maiden-claiming races and an **(R)** will be used for other restricted races.

IMPROVEMENT EXPECTED OF ORFEVRE

Trainer Yasutoshi Ikee yesterday issued a positive bulletin about the Japanese Horse of the Year and leading G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe contender **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) following his success in Sunday's G2 Prix Foy. Having comfortably beat Meandre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}) by a length in the course-and-distance trial, Sunday Racing's 4-year-old will be geared towards proving his country with an elusive first success in the major event. "His footwork has changed bit by bit," Ikee told www.japanracing.jp. "He's running in a way better suited to the going and I think he'll get even better. He won for us, but I could feel just how high the wall of international competition is. You're never allowed to win too easily. He had a bit of trouble settling in the first half of the race, but in the latter half, when the pace picked up, he ran very nicely. In work, Soumillon had done well working together with him and said he found the horse easy to handle, but I think now he'll realize that that is not always the case. The difficulties they experienced in the first half will be good experience for not only the horse, but the jockey as well, as we head toward the big race. All the staff together will be doing their best and I think we'll be able to have him in even better shape for the race."

Pell buys Unbridled's Song Filly for \$280,000

The session topper at Monday's seventh session of the Keeneland September sale was an Unbridled's Song filly who sold for \$280,000 to Richard C. Pell's Pelican LLC. Pell owns Fast Falcon, who finished third in the Aug. 25 GI Travers S. He also campaigned 2010 GI Dwyer S. winner Fly Down (Mineshaft).

The Unbridled's Song filly ([hip 2006](#)) is the first foal out of Grade II winner Tizfiz (Tiznow). She was consigned by Baccari Bloodstock, agent for Anne and Chester Prince, partners in Vision Racing and Sales, which bred the filly in Kentucky.

"The mare was a graded stakes filly, and I put this filly in Book 4 because I thought she was going to be a big standout in here," said consignor Chris Baccari. "She is very elegant, very correct and a real big walker. She looked like she could take training."

The Princes own Prince Farm in Palmetto, Florida. After meeting in the Quarter Horse world and marrying, the Princes now primarily are involved with halter horses, in addition to their Thoroughbred investments.

A Ghostzapper at Ascot?

The second-highest price of the day was \$180,000 for [hip 2276](#), a Ghostzapper filly out of stakes winner More for Me (More Than Ready). Sallusto and Albina, agents, bought the filly from Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for breeder Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings.

"We thought she was an exceptional individual, and when we see that type, we are willing to pay a little more than the next guy," said Hanzly Albina. "Nick [Sallusto] and I always say, 'When you find the right horse, just buy it.' We couldn't be more pleased to have her. We think she's a top horse."

Trainer Wesley Ward was the underbidder.

"Wesley came up to me afterward and said he'd love to train her. He said she could win at Ascot next year," Albina said. "I was happy to hear that."

Taylor Made was the leading consignor by total sales during Monday's session, with 33 yearlings sold for \$1,863,000. -Pete Denk

23-year-old Bright Feather Produces Top Colt

Ferran Robinson of Winter Quarter Farm had watched his father Don succeed with older, stakes-producing mares, so when the 20-year-old Bright Feather (Fappiano), dam of Grade I winner Albert the Great (Go for Gin), was offered as part of the historic Overbrook Farm dispersal at the 2009 Keeneland November breeding stock sale, he took a shot.

That move paid off on Monday at Keeneland when bloodstock agent Jun Park went to \$150,000 for [hip 2081](#), Bright Feather's yearling son by Cowboy Cal. The price tied for the session's top-priced colt.

"He has a lot of quality, and I think he looks more like a distance horse, like his brother," said Park, who added the purchase was for an undisclosed client. "He has a lovely pedigree, and Cowboy Cal is a young stallion who I think he is getting nice progeny. I don't mind to buy from an old mare if they have already produced a good horse."

Bright Feather was empty when Robinson bought her for \$30,000, but she previously had produced Albert the Great, winner of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, as well as stakes winners Watch the Bird (Rahy) and Sheer Bliss (Relaunch), Grade II placed Crimson Hero (Capote), and stakes-placed Antrim County (Giant's Causeway).

Bred by Sam-Son Farms in Ontario, Bright Feather finished second in the 1992 Canadian Oaks.

"Growing up I watched my dad have success with this mare, and of course with Bright Feather, there was a stellar Grade I winner in her production record, as well as several other stakes winners and stakes-placed horses," Robinson said. "We figured the price might be a little high for a 20-year-old empty mare, but it was reasonable."

"My father let me pick the stallion, all up to me," Robinson continued. "I liked following Cowboy Cal as a racehorse, and I just fell in love with him when I saw him at Pin Oak."

It took a few tries to get Bright Feather in foal. She didn't catch until late May of 2010.

"It was pretty typical of an old mare," Don Robinson said. "You just have to be patient with them, and don't rush them. Let them take their time."

Don Robinson said he likes buying older, proven mares because the pedigree page will always be there.

"It's a weird dichotomy. The market wants to give up on old mares, but the page always looks tremendous and if you get a good individual with that page, it will sell well," Robinson explained. "This colt is light, elegant and very racey looking. He's not a big strong animal, but a very athletic colt that moved really easily."

Bright Feather is carrying a full-brother to the Cowboy Cal yearling.

"She looks fantastic for a 23-year-old girl," Ferran Robinson said. "As long as she looks the part and is ready to keep trying, we'll breed her again. We're praying for a filly."

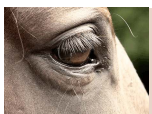

So 2012 wasn't to be the year for Triple Crown winners. Unlike I'll Have Another (Flower Alley), Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) at least had the chance to chase everlasting glory but his acceleration deserted him when it mattered most. In the circumstances it would be all too easy to overlook the deserving winner Encke, whose victory paid yet another tribute to his high-achieving sire, Kingmambo.

The career of the Lane's End stallion was severely compromised by health issues during its latter years. Consequently, Encke is one of only 11 foals sired by Kingmambo from the 19 mares he covered in 2008. I believe there is only one 2-year-old in the stallion's final crop, so the story is nearing its end. Encke, though, is clearly a very progressive individual, so there may be several more chapters still to be added.

In winning the St Leger, Encke has cemented Kingmambo's position as one of the most prolific sires of Classic winners in Britain this millennium. As a Classic-winning miler with a miler's pedigree, it was no surprise to see him exert a strong influence on the Guineas races. **Cont. p10**

Kingmambo took the 2,000 Guineas with King's Best in 2000 and followed up with Henrythenavigator in 2008, and he also landed two editions of the 1,000 Guineas, with Russian Rhythm in 2003 and Virginia Waters two years later.

However, the son of Mr. Prospector and the magnificent Miesque also succeeded in siring a winner of the Oaks, thanks to Light Shift in 2007, and two of the St Leger, Encke's predecessor being another Godolphin colt, Rule of Law, in 2004. The Derby may have escaped Kingmambo's grasp, but the 2010 Epsom Classic saw King's Best's son Workforce win most impressively and this year's dominant winner--none other than Camelot--is out of a Kingmambo mare.

This adds up to a very rich legacy, to which can be added further classic successes in the U.S. (Lemon Drop Kid in the Belmont S.), Ireland, France (including with Divine Proportions, who proved herself something special) and Japan (the Derby-winning King Kamehameha).

Clearly Encke wasn't a 25-1 shot on pedigree. In addition to being by such an influential stallion, he is out of a classic-winning dam, Shawanda, whose sequence of five victories in 2005 featured a five-length triumph in the Irish Oaks and a second Group 1 success in the Prix Vermeille. She started as short as 3-1 for the Arc, even though the opposition included colts of the caliber of Hurricane Run, Motivator, Bago, Scorpion, Shirocco and Westerner.

It almost goes without saying that Kingmambo usually--but not always--needed a bit of help from his mares when he sired group winners over a mile and a half or more. You'll find these group winners' broodmare sires include the likes of Seattle Slew, Shirley Heights, Sadler's Wells, Niniski and Caerleon. Encke is no exception, as his first three dams are daughters of Sinndar, Darshaan and Nijinsky--all three winners of the Derby in England or France.

As you might guess from Sinndar's current fee of €7,500, this son of Grand Lodge hasn't been a runaway success as a stallion. In the circumstances, it is easy to forget just how good Sinndar was. In fact, he was beaten only once in eight starts, and he was giving seven pounds to the narrow winner on the only occasion he tasted defeat. He was chased home by Sakhee and Beat Hollow when he won the Derby, he took the Irish Derby by nine lengths and he had Montjeu back in fourth place when he won the Arc.

While he hasn't been as effective as a stallion, Sinndar has certainly had his moments. It is possible to argue that he transmits too much stamina to be commercially popular, but that hasn't stopped him siring some excellent middle-distance horses. Apart from Shawanda, his best efforts included Youmzain, who had the unfortunate record of having finished runner-up in the Arc on three occasions. **Cont. p11**

Sinndar's daughter Shareta was also runner-up in the Arc. Another trait which may not have helped Sinndar is that he has enjoyed more success with his fillies than his colts. Three of his four Group 1 winners are fillies, as are eight of his 11 Group winners.

Mention of Shareta brings us back to Encke, as Shareta is a three-parts-sister to his dam Shawanda.

Of course both, Shareta and Shawanda were bred and raced by the Aga Khan, who sold Shawanda to Sheikh Mohammed at the end of her racing career. The mare has done well for her new owner, as her previous son by Kingmambo was Genius Beast, a Group 3 winner over 1 1/4 miles who contested the 2011 St Leger.

The Aga has never been afraid to sell a top performer in order to help finance his extensive racing and breeding operations. This approach reflects his confidence that his long-established female lines have sufficient strength in depth to produce suitable replacements. There can be few better examples of this than the emergence of Shareta, who has now won the G1 Prix Vermeille seven years after her close relation did so. Shareta has also recently won the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, and this progressive May foal looks poised to add another bold showing in the Arc to Sinndar's record.

Shawanda's sale came a year after the Aga had also sold her dam, the Darshaan mare Shamawna, for only €32,000 at Goffs.

The explanation is that this group-placed mare was 15 years old and hadn't produced a foal in three recent seasons. The Aga already had a replacement for her in her daughter Shawara, a listed winner by Barathea, and it is Shawara who now figures as the dam of Shareta.

Enckehas no inbreeding in his first four generations, but his dam Shawanda is inbred 4x4 to Mill Reef and 5x4 to both Abdos and Northern Dancer. Combining Mill Reef with Abdos yielded some rich rewards, with Abdos mares producing the Prix du Jockey-Club winners Acamas and Darshaan to Mill Reef and his son Shirley Heights, respectively. The Group 1-winning Erdelistan was by Mill Reef's son Lashkariout of another Abdos mare.

Shawanda's third dam, Shanizadeh, produced three group-winning daughters in Sharaya (yet another winner of the G1 Prix Vermeille), Sharaniya (G2 Grand Prix d'Evry) and Shannkara (GIII Nijana S.). However, this trio bred nothing special. It is Shanizadeh's unraced Nijinsky filly Shamsana who ranks as the second dam of Shawanda.

The female line traces back to Black Ray, through her daughter Eclair. Eclair's branch of the family produced Blushing Groom, whereas the branch descending from Eclair's sister Infra Red produced the great Mill Reef. The Eclair branch has enjoyed previous success with Kingmambo, producing King Kamehameha--now one of Japan's leading sires.

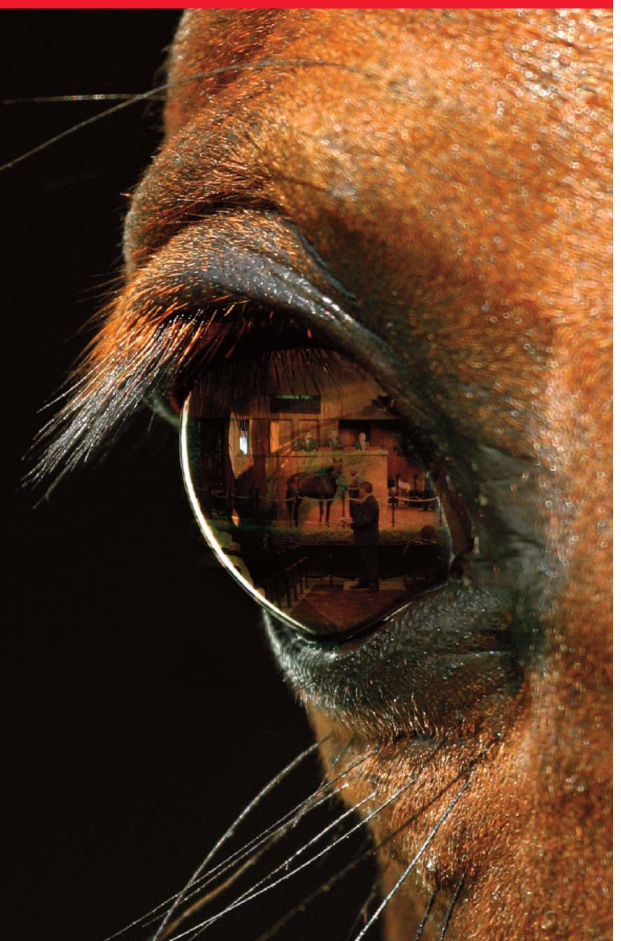

FOCUS ON EQUINE WELFARE AT CONFERENCE

Issues surrounding equine welfare took center stage Monday at the 2012 Biennial International Conference of Racing Analysts and Veterinarians (ICRAV) in Philadelphia, PA. The conference, which runs through Friday, is conducted by the Association of Official Racing Chemists and the International Group of Specialist Racing Veterinarians, two non-profit organizations that provide scientific information to the racing industry.

The conference attracted approximately 200 attendees representing more than 25 countries throughout the world. The attendees are a mix of scientists, veterinarians, administrators, regulators and exhibitors.

The theme for this year's conference is Marching Integrity of Racing into the Future.

"We're proud to be hosting an event that focuses on and advances the integrity of the racing business, bringing together veterinary experts in equine care and welfare, and equine forensic chemistry and biology, from around globe," said Dr. Lawrence R. Soma, Professor of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center and chairman of the organizing committee. "We thought it was important to devote the entire first day of the conference to equine welfare because we, as an industry, need to have a unified focus."

Dr. Tom Lenz, a past president of the American Association of Equine Practitioners, in a segment entitled "Equine Welfare: Where Emotion and Science Collide," pointed out that "our choices are conditioned by our life experiences" and echoed the comment of a veterinarian colleague who called animal welfare "the major challenge of the veterinarian industry." Lenz said, "We, as an industry, must become the focal point for discussion. We can't stay away as we have in the past. We have to continue to work to improve the use and the well-being of the horse."

James A. Serpell, Ph.D., one of several representatives of the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine participating in the conference, discussed "Current Thinking on Ethical Treatment of Animals." He suggested that the industry convene an independent review body to identify and prioritize the main animal welfare concerns within the industry, develop guidelines and rules to eliminate banned practices and then persuade parties to adopt them.

Freelance writer Bill Finley, who has covered and/or written about Thoroughbred racing for numerous publications, including *The New York Times* and *Espn.com*, delivered a presentation on the "Public View of Animal Welfare and Racing." Finley said that maintaining proper care and treatment of horses is the responsibility "of everyone who makes his or her living in horse racing" and cautioned that, without change, horse racing could face the gradual decline that dog racing has faced.

"There used to be 49 dog tracks in 15 states," Finley explained. "Now there are 22 tracks in seven states and Massachusetts and New Hampshire have banned dog racing." He also strongly urged the sport to ban those who repeatedly violate drug rules. "It's not three strikes and you're out [in horse racing]," he said. "It's 172 strikes and maybe you're out. And your assistant trainers can train your horses. Racetracks have the right to exclude people. More of them should do that."

Peter Symons, a Western Australian scientist and author, reminded the audience that many of the issues being discussed today are issues that were identified in a 1991 study in Australia: use of the whip, medication, 2-year-old racing, breakdowns and equine retirement. Regarding use of the whip, he said, "Banning the whip is the way to go." Symons also suggested international strategic alliances to ensure best practices.

The afternoon program featured a Veterinary Session and a Drug Analysis Session.

The veterinary session included presentations by Tim Morris of the British Horseracing Authority (on the IFHA's Equine Welfare Committee); Matt Iuliano of The Jockey Club (on The Jockey Club's various equine welfare initiatives); and Barbara Luna on the "Turning For Home" retirement program in Pennsylvania.

That session concluded with presentations by Alan Foreman of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association providing the horsemen's perspective on welfare and Frank Petramalo, Jr. providing an owner's perspective on therapeutic medication, veterinarians and the North American regulatory environment.

The conference continues Tuesday and concludes Friday with sessions scheduled on the following topics, among others: Injuries: Update and Prevention; Detection of New Drugs; Natural Substances and Hormones; TCO2 Testing & Accreditation; Track Surface, Pathology, Musculoskeletal; and Pre-Race Veterinary Inspections. New York state Supreme Court Justice Anil Singh has rejected a motion to dismiss a lawsuit filed against the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation by New York Attorney General Eric Schneiderman in a ruling announced Monday. Scheiderman filed a suit in May alleging the charity, which cares for retired racehorses, has been mismanaged. In his ruling yesterday, Singh stated the TRF had failed to show that the attorney general did not have cause of action to bring the lawsuit against the organization, instead calling into question the credibility of the state's witnesses. The judge has ordered both sides to meet for a conference Nov. 7.
