## ELLIS SENDS OUT BIG 3 THIS WEEKEND

Conditioner Ron Ellis will send out three of his barn's top horses, **Rail Trip** (Jump Start), **Include Me Out** (Include) and **Casino Host** (Dynaformer), in stakes races

Saturday at Santa Anita. Rail Trip, who has already secured a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile with his win in the GI San Diego H. July 28, will make a start in the GI Awesome Again S., a "Win and You're In" for the Breeders' Cup Classic. "We're not really sure if he's better at a mile or better at a mile and a quarter," said Ellis.

"Most big purses that we've gone after have been at a mile and a quarter, so we've never really focused on him being a miler. When he broke his maiden, he ran 1:07 and change and he always seemed like he'd be a good miler. We're going to run in the Awesome Again and decide what the next move is off of that."

Sheikh Joann bin Hamad Al Thani in a private deal. The 2-year-old bay, who also ran second to subsequent G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. hero Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. June 19, will continue under the wing of veteran conditioner

Richard Hannon and will point to Oct. 7 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere. "Olympic Glory has been bought to stay in the yard, and he will run in his new owner's colors in the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp on Sunday week," said Hannon. "Hopefully, he will make up into a [G1 2000] Guineas horse for next year." Former owner Julie Wood added, "Olympic Glory has given us enormous pleasure and we sincerely hope that he proves equally successful for his new owners, and that they have as much fun with him as we did."

## MARCHAND D'OR RETIRED

Carla Giral's veteran speedster **Marchand d'Or** (Fr) (Marchand de Sable--Fedora {Fr}, by Kendor {Fr}), Europe's champion sprinter of 2008, has been retired. The 9-year-old homebred gelding, who registered a unique treble in Deauville's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest between 2006 and 2008 whilst under the care of Freddy Head, will join his dam Fedora at Gilles Deroubaix's Haras de Sou. Starting off his career under Aurelien Malenfant in a juvenile claimer at Chantilly in 2005, his only freshman start, he quickly rose through the ranks and, after bagging Longchamp's Listed Prix du Pont Neuf in 2006, raced exclusively in pattern-race company since, winning 10 such events. His banner year of 2008 also included victories in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket and the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp. Injury curtailed his 2009 campaign, but he came back the following term to register a win in Longchamp's G3 Prix de Saint-Georges for new trainer Mikel Delzangles. He also hit the board in last year's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest, his fourth appearance in Deauville's 6 1/2-furlong test, and followed that effort by winning the G3 Prix de Meautry, his final triumph, also at the Normandy track. This semester has been Marchand d'Or's swansong and, after running eighth in yet another try at the Maurice de Gheest last month, brought the curtain down with a fifth in the Sept. 16 G3 Prix du Petit Couvert at Longchamp. He was ridden by Davy Bonilla in all but one of his 40 starts and retires with a career record of 40-12-2-4, and earnings of €1,462,500.

## Churchill Files Suit in Texas

Churchill Downs Inc. filed suit against the Texas Racing Commission and its executive director, Chuck Trout, in an Austin, Texas court Sept. 21. The suit states that the existing legislation that permits patrons to only bet in person on track or at a simulcast venue, therefore disallowing online and telephone wagering, is unconstitutional. Internet and phone wagering has been ongoing in the state, despite a 1986 law that stipulated that Texans could only wager in person.

## MOTT BARN SENDS OUT SLEW OF BREEDERS' CUP HOPEFULS

Things are starting to heat up for the Bill Mott stable, which will send out four horses in three "Win and You're In" contests at Belmont Saturday. "I get excited and I get a little anxious," said Mott. "It's a very important day for us because you want to see the horses run well and come out of the race good and be able to go to the big day at Santa Anita."

The Hall of Fame conditioner will send out **Ron The Greek** (Full Mandate) and **Flat Out** (Flatter) in Belmont's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Both horses last ran in Saratoga's GI Whitney Invitational H. Aug. 4, finishing second and third, respectively, behind Fort Larned (E Dubai).

"He's doing very well," Mott said of Flat Out. "I'm happy with the works that he's put in, happy with the way he's going. It seems like he feels good and is ready to run. He's had a fair amount of time to get over the Whitney. We had a nice training schedule since then, and obviously he's run well on the track before. That's got to be a bonus anytime you've got one running on any particular track if they've already been a dual winner there." Flat Out won last year's Jockey Club Gold Cup and GII Suburban H. over the Belmont oval.

As for his other entrant, Mott noted, "Ron continues to do well. He's just one of those horses that maintains his condition. He looks good, he's moving well, his works are consistent with what we saw earlier in the year. He's not a really flashy work horse. His works are more or less workmanlike, but he's really doing well. He's a beautiful horse with a great constitution."

With the expected fast Belmont main track, the conditioner figures that Flat Out will be able to "lay in a stalking position. Ron the Greek is one that has always generally been a deep closer, unless he's in a race devoid of early speed, but with any sort of an honest pace in the race Ron the Greek comes from out of it."

As for Flat Out, "the normal pace scenario you would get going a mile and a quarter should put him a little closer in the race."

GI Woodward winner **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) will start in the GII Kelso H. Saturday. "He's coming off a good, hard race in the Woodward," commented Mott.

"I was wondering if coming back in four weeks would be too much for him and, at the end of the day, we'll find that out, but he seems as though he's doing very well and we've taken the option to enter him and plan to run."

As for his Breeders' Cup plans for **To Honor and Serve**, Mott said, "I think we're probably leaning in the direction of the Classic and I think the connections would like to give that a chance, so right now that's what we're planning to do."

**Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) is scheduled for her first start since a runner-up effort in the GI Personal Ensign H. at Saratoga Aug. 26 in Saturday's GI Beldame Invitational. "She seems to be doing well," said Mott. "We got beat last time and we have to try to come back. We'll run in the Beldame and hopefully that puts us in good position for the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic. I think she's been good and I just hope she stays as good as she's shown us in the past. If

she gets better, that would be great, but I don't expect her to. I'm trying to keep her in the same form she's been in for the last three or four races."

Royal Delta will face GI Personal Ensign third-place finisher **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) in the Beldame. As for a rematch with that Kiaran McLaughlin trainee It's Tricky, Mott said, "I have to be quite impressed with It's Tricky and the remarkable race she ran last time [in the Personal Ensign], after stumbling at the start. It was one of those stumbles that could have kept her from being in the race at all, but she kept on and finished well and she's obviously a good competitor. On her game, she's one to be reckoned with. They probably have intentions of laying up close and they're going to make us try to catch her. Tactically, it's probably a little bit different than a two-turn race. The speed is carrying very well at Belmont. Our filly has run well enough there before, but it certainly could play into the speed bias of the track if it comes up the way it was the past weekend. It may favor a speed horse."

Although the 7-year-old Rail Trip will face younger competition, Ellis believes he is still a top competitor. "To tell you the truth, in my opinion he was a better horse at four and five years old, but that doesn't mean he still can't get it done. I thought he was the best horse in the country when he was a 5-year-old and lost that [GI Hollywood] Gold Cup race. I don't know if I can say that now. We're hoping that he'll get back to that. So far it's been a little bit slower getting him in peak form."

Include Me Out will start in the GI Zenyatta S. Saturday in hopes of solidifying her spot as one of the nation's top fillies. The 4-year-old is already a two-time Grade I winner this year, with victories in the GI Santa Margarita Inv. and GI Clement L. Hirsch S. "To tell you the truth, I've been a little bit insulted by the lack of respect my filly has gotten," said Ellis. "She's proven she's the best filly on the West Coast. I understand the East Coast bias, and the press building up those other fillies, but my filly loves that racetrack, she's done everything that we've asked of her this year, she should be unbeaten. If you throw out that Hollywood [allowance] ride [Nov. 25] where our rider opened up by six and the filly pulled herself up and went to sleep, she should be unbeaten around two turns. I mostly chalk it up to the press building those horses up. Usually when they hook our California horses, reality sets in. It's been a little disturbing that we're not getting much credit."

Since coming to the United States, **Suggestive Boy (Arg)** (Easing Along) was runner-up in the GI Shoemaker Mile S. at Betfair Hollywood Park June 30 and won the

Wickerr S. July 25, both on the grass. Most recently, he finished fifth on the Polytrack in Del Mar's GI TVG Pacific Classic Aug. 26. at Del Mar. He will attempt dirt for the first time in Santa Anita's GI Awesome Again S. this Saturday.

"He seems to handle the dirt all right," said trainer Ron McAnally.

"We worked him on the grass a couple of days ago only because the new dirt track at Santa Anita seemed to be a little cuppy, but I think it's getting better now and he should handle it okay. The Argentine horses seem to handle most anything. They handle the mud, the grass, the dirt, the Polytrack, that's the way I find them. They're very durable." This weekend's contest will give the Argentinian colt's connections an idea of where they will take him from there. "Hopefully he runs well on the dirt, if he does we'll continue on," added McAnally. "If he doesn't, then we'll switch back to the grass."

**THE DUDE'S GOT GAME**

Bernie Schiappa, Joe Torre's Diamond Pride LLC and the Lanni Family Trust's **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) looks to maintain his perfect record at Santa Anita when he lines up for the inaugural running of Saturday's GI Awesome Again S. (formerly the Goodwood S.). In preparation for this weekend's nine-furlong feature, the 5-year-old worked six furlongs on Santa Anita's main track Sunday in 1:13.20 under rider Rafael Bejarano. Bejarano, who partnered the gelding for a victory in January, 2011, takes over from Chantal Sutherland, who has accompanied Game On Dude in his last nine starts. "He went nice," Baffert said of Sunday's workout on a refreshingly cooler morning Tuesday than Southern California has experienced in the past six weeks. "He worked really well." An earner of over \$2.8 million, Game On Dude won last season's Goodwood and the GI Santa Anita H. This term, the bay added the Feb. 5 GI San Antonio S., the GI Californian S. and the GI Hollywood Gold Cup. In his latest start, he was a nose back in second behind Dullahan (Even the Score) in the Aug. 26 GI TVG Pacific Classic. "We gave a lot of money for a gelding," said Baffert. "This year, he's really filled out. He's a stronger horse."

### EUROPEAN YEARLING SALES

Following the Keeneland September marathon (we can still call 11 days of selling from a catalogue of over 3,600 yearlings a marathon, can't we?), the yearling market moves to Europe for a few weeks, until Fasig October and Arqana's October Sale at Deauville go head-to-head, each for a three-day run, October 22-24. There have already been yearling sales in Deauville and at Osarus in France; two sales at Doncaster in England; Baden-Baden, in Germany; and Milan, in Italy; and today is the second day of Tattersalls Ireland's sale at Fairyhouse. But they're just getting started: next week is Goffs' two-day Orby and one-day Sportsman's sales; then, after the Arc, is the heavily previewed October 1 sale at Newmarket (three days), with October 2 (four days) and 3 (one day) the following week; then Arqana's October Sale, the same days as Fasig October. We calculate that some 2,975 yearlings are catalogued for these six sales, representing 194 stallions, including 28 which stand or stood in America, though of these only Henrythenavigator (8) has more than four catalogued. Of the 194 stallions, represented, 24 of them have 40 or more yearlings catalogued over the next few weeks, and it's noteworthy than all but two of them--the superstar half-brothers Galileo and Sea The Stars--have double-digit representation in Tattersalls Oct. 2 sale, which has 1,042 yearlings catalogued over a four-day run, Oct. 15-18. We'll come back to that in a moment, because 'quality in quantity' is the hallmark of Tattersalls' October Book 1, with 577 yearlings catalogued over three days: Tuesday, Oct. 9 (the 'Arc' is Sunday the 7th) through Thursday, Oct. 11. Oct. 1 has 13% more yearlings catalogued than last year's edition, which, as we alluded to in last Sunday's column, grossed \$87.7 million and averaged over \$240,000. To say 'fireworks are expected' this year is like saying a popgun sounds like a cannon: the fireworks display in Newmarket Oct. 9-11 is going to be Mardi Gras, the Fourth of July, and New Year's all rolled into one--metaphorically speaking, of course.

Of the 577 yearlings catalogued for October 1, about one in eight--72 of them--are either by World Number One, Galileo (42), or his half-brother Sea The Stars (30), who was considered the best horse seen in Europe for 30 years until Frankel came along. Sea The Stars barbecued everything that stood in his path with six Group 1 wins from six starts as a 3-year-old in 2009, running *Racing Post Ratings* (RPR's) up to 138. He did something all G1 Epsom Derby winners seem to aspire to these days--dropping back to 10 furlongs. Between the Derby and the 'Arc' he ran in three 10-furlong Group 1 races, and won all three.

Besides A.P. Indy, the two half-brothers Galileo and Sea The Stars are the only two sires to have averaged over \$400,000 at the yearling sales so far this year (click [here](#) to see the current Instatistics table of leading yearling sires). If those two don't ignite some big fireworks in Newmarket all by themselves, I don't know what will. One other sire has more than 30 catalogued in October 1, and that is Invincible Spirit (36), who ranks third by 2012 progeny earnings on the European Sire List, according to the Bloodstock section of [www.racingpost.com](http://www.racingpost.com), and is definitely having his best year yet. Dubawi has 27 catalogued; there are 25 by leading European freshman sire, New Approach; Oasis Dream 21; Montjeu 13; and Dansili 11--not that many in the latter two cases, but still more than are in any other sale. That's 205 yearlings--over a third of the catalogue--by eight stallions who should all average, as they say these days, 'north' of \$200,000. Smokin'.

It's a good thing Invincible Spirit is having a good year because, besides what's already been through the sales by him, he has 73 more yearlings catalogued in the next month; as nearly half (36) of those are in October 1, he would be a safe bet to average highest of the eight stallions, would you believe, with 60 or more yearlings catalogued. Three of the top four are Coolmore sires, headed by So You Think's sire, High Chaparral, with no fewer than 87 yearlings catalogued in the next month.

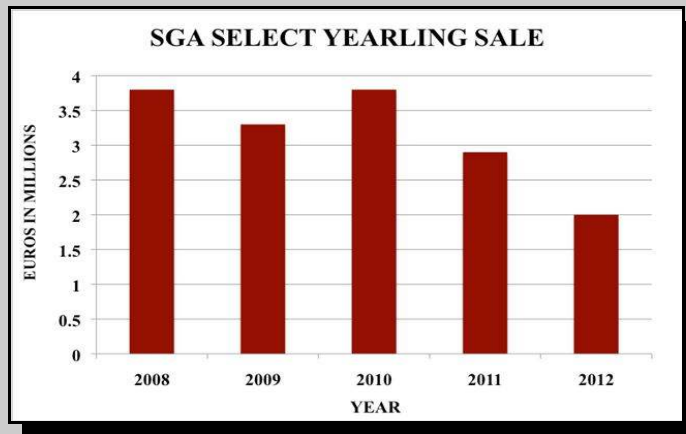

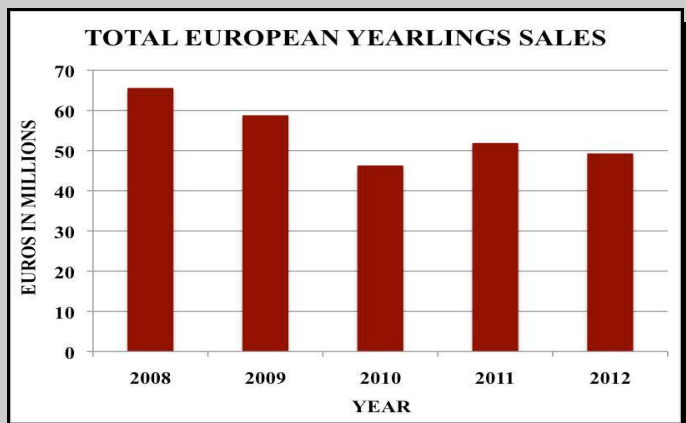

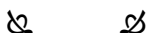

Fortunately, he has this many because he's been successful, and provides owners a mid-range entry into the Sadler's Wells line for those who can't afford the Galileos and Montjeus. He works well with Danzig, too, which cheers a lot of people up, so all in all there should be a good market for them. As you can see from the chart, he has 20 catalogued at Goffs Orby, 15 in October 1, and 37 in October 2.

Danehill Dancer has already proven a successful sire of sires, albeit in a minor way, and he gets maybe his best shot yet with Coolmore's Mastercraftsman, who won the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and St. James's Palace S., and was placed twice behind Sea The Stars at 10 furlongs, in the G1 Juddmonte International and Irish Champion S. He has 66 catalogued, one more than the same firm's Duke of Marmalade, whose first 2-year-olds are racing this year. Darley's Teofilo (first 3-year-olds 2012) and Royal Applause have 64 catalogued each (Royal Applause has 43 in October 2, making him the workingman's sire this year). Darley's Cape Cross, sire of Sea The Stars, has 61 catalogued; while the popular Bushranger, a grandson of Danehill Dancer, by Danetime, and who stands at the O'Callaghan family's Tally-Ho Stud in Ireland, has another 60 in the sales. There was a really good vibe at Keeneland once the sale got going, with extraordinarily high clearance rates for the \$40,000 horses (that will be tougher over here, except probably in France), though, as I discussed the other day, there really were not enough people to buy \$200,000 horses. To a certain extent, you need sportsmen, not businessmen, to achieve that. That's what we're likely to see more of in Europe over the next few weeks.

By sprinting sire Piccolo out of the Group 3 winner Secret Melody, PEARL FLUTE was the impressive debutant winner of the coveted Prix Yacowlef (L.), finishing ahead of the talented Style Vendôme. Blessed with a great turn of foot, the protégée of Francis-Henri Graffard was third in the Prix de Cabourg (Gr.3) on his next start before finishing third again in the Prix La Rochette (Gr.3) just a neck away from second placed Avantage, both horses finishing behind the highly promising What A Name. Last Saturday, he opened his Group account when landing the Prix des Chênes (Gr.3) over a mile at Longchamp.

A very attractive, lightly raced filly with a faultless race record, she has only had five runs and is an exciting racing prospect as well as broodmare prospect.

Trained by Fabrice Vermeulen, FORCES OF DARKNESS won a B race at two before successfully making the transition to Group level this year. A very close third in the Prix Saint-Alary (Gr.1) at Longchamp, just two short necks away from the winner Sagawara, she then finished fourth in the Prix de Diane behind Valyra and Beauty Parlour. She bagged her first Group race in the Prix Minerve (Gr.3) over 2500 metres at Deauville. A tough and very consistent filly, this daughter of Lawman has all the qualities necessary to keep making her mark at Group level over middle distances and is a very interesting broodmare prospect.

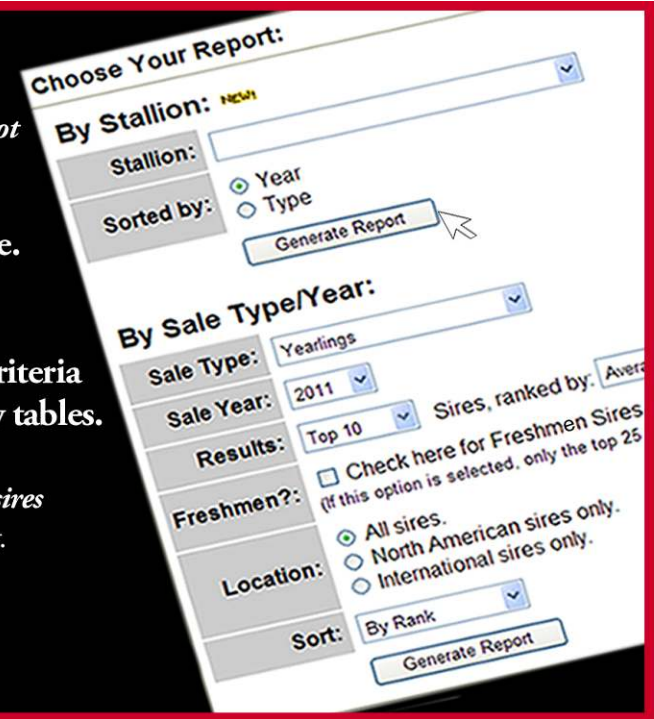

## CDI FILES SUIT AGAINST TEXAS RACING COMMISSION

Churchill Downs Inc. filed suit against the Texas Racing Commission and its executive director, Chuck Trout, in an Austin, Texas court Sept. 21. The suit states that the existing legislation that permits patrons to only bet in person on track or at a simulcast venue, therefore disallowing online and telephone wagering, is unconstitutional. Internet and phone wagering has been ongoing in the state, despite a 1986 law that stipulated that Texans could only wager in person.

Following last year's revision to the law--explicitly banning online and phone wagering--the Texas Racing Commission has renewed its effort to enforce the ban. According to the suit, the racing commission failed to enforce the ban until the 2011 revision of the law in an effort to direct business to in-state facilities. Churchill Downs, which operates Twinspires.com, was given until Tuesday to file suit, curtail taking online wagers from Texans or comply with a subpoena to reveal information pertaining to wagers issued in the state.

"A state cannot impose an 'in person' transaction requirement on the purchase of shoes or books, for no reason than to favor local businesses at the expense of out-of-state entities like Zappos.com or Amazon.com," issued in Churchill's suit. "Such a law would surely violate the Commerce Clause. The same principal applies here. Indeed, this case is even more extreme. The federal commerce clause prohibits states from placing restrictions on out-of-state businesses that do not exist for in-state businesses."

Currently under the in-person requirement, Texas residents are allowed to bet only at seven locations in the state.

### PASTORAL PURSUITS COLT TOPS SEPTEMBER OPENER

A half-brother to the 2010 G3 Molecomb S. third Choose Wisely (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}), hip **189** was consigned by Cooneen Stud. "He's a lovely, lovely horse," Butler commented. "I thought he was the nicest horse here today. He's cost plenty, but he is a proper horse. He is for a Middle Eastern gentleman and to start with will probably race either in Ireland or the UK." For much of the day, a son of Dutch Art (GB) led the way after selling to Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock for €57,000. Sold by the Premier Consignment, hip **67** is already named Lindart (Ity) and is out of a sister to the top Argentinian performer The Lord (Arg) (Southern Halo). The sole offering by his popular sire in the catalogue will join the Richard Hannon stable. "He's been bought on spec and will go back to Richard's," Ross Doyle said. "He's a lovely colt and is definitely a 2-year-old type. He is by a very good sire and he is just a lovely horse." Moments later, Armando Duarte paid €55,000 for Ballylinch Stud's son of one of this year's stars among the freshman sires Tamayuz (GB). Hip **78** is a half-brother to two smart performers in the Marco Botti-trained G3 Dee S. third Kingsdesire (Ire) (King's Best) and Lucky Beggar (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}), who has been fourth at listed level this term for the Charlie Hills stable. The dam is out of the multiple pattern-race winner Special Kaldoun (Ire) (Alzao). "I don't have an owner for him, he has been bought on spec," Duarte explained. "I know the family very well and this horse looks very much like his half-brother. The stallion is doing well and this horse looks a real 2-year-old type, so let's hope he's one for Royal Ascot." The first yearlings of the Irish National Stud's 2009 G1 Golden Jubilee S. hero Art Connoisseur (Ire) are under the hammer now and one who captured the imagination yesterday was hip **81** from the draft of Mount Coote Stud. Out of the listed-placed Madame Boulangere (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), the February-foaled bay filly was secured by Ed Sackville of SackvilleDonald, who was buying for trainer Tom Dascombe, for €43,000. That agency also snapped up a son of Bahamian Bounty (GB) from the consignment of Brendan and Vanessa Holland's Grove Stud. Hip **68** is a half-sister to Ballydoyle's 2005 G1 Phoenix S. runner-up Amadeus Mozart (Ire) (Mozart {Ire}) and sold for €42,000. At the end of the first session, the average of €12,498 represented an increase of 9% on its 2011 equivalent, while the median of €10,000 was up by 22%. 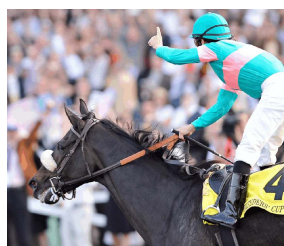
