STARS COME OUT FOR SUPER SATURDAY

An action-packed card has been assembled for Belmont Park's Super Saturday, which features six Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' events. Handicap runners take center stage in the \$1-million GI TVG Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational, headed by Grade I winners **Fort Larned** (E Dubai), **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) and **Hymn Book** (Arch). **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) and **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) renew their rivalry in the GI Beldame Invitational S. after finishing two-three in Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign H. Aug. 26,

respectively. The streaking multiple Grade I winner **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) takes on GI Arlington Million hero **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) and the globe-trotting **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. A field of nine sprinters will line up for the GI Vosburgh Invitational S., including Vanderbilt one-two **Poseidon's Warrior** (Speightstown) and **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai), and the comebacking **Sean Avery** (Cherokee Run). Nine fillies and mares are set to do battle in the grassy GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. **I'm a Dreamer (Ire)** (Noverre) makes her first start since capturing the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 18, while **Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune) seeks her second straight win off the heels of a smooth success in Saratoga's GII Ballston Spa S. Aug. 25. **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini), a game winner of the GI Woodward S. Sept. 1, cuts back to a mile for the GII Kelso H. **Shackleford** (Forestry) returns to the site of his GI Met Mile score in the Kelso after a head-scratching eighth in the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. Aug. 5.

There will also be major Breeders' Cup prep races held on the West Coast Saturday. Juveniles will have the spotlight in Santa Anita's GI FrontRunner S. and GI Chandelier S. Unbeaten **"TDN Rising Star"** **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai) is the main attracton in the latter, while a wide-open field of 11, including GII Best Pal S. hero **Know More** (Lion Heart), are set to square off in the male equivalent. **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) will put his perfect 4-for-4 record on the line at the "Great Race Place" in the GI Awesome Again S., **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro) ships in for the GI Rodeo Drive S., and **Love and Pride** (A.P. Indy) and **Include Me Out** (Include) face off in the GI Zenyatta S.

SO MANY WAYS TO SKIP BREEDERS' CUP

Undeclared **So Many Ways** (Sightseeing) has been taken out of consideration for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, owner Maggi Moss confirmed Wednesday. "I have struggled with the decision of whether or not we should push her as she continues to grow and mature for the thrill of running in the Breeders' Cup," Moss said in a statement. "After great deliberation, I have weighed what is in her best interest, versus my chance to compete at Santa Anita, and decided it is simply pushing her too hard." A debut winner at Parx, So Many Ways won the July 20 GIII Schuylerville S. before adding the Sept. 2 GI Spinaway S. in her most recent start. "One of the great things this filly did was bring me together with [trainer] Tony and Kim Dutrow," continued Moss. "They have done an amazing job with her. I think we are doing the right thing for the filly. She's already given me the thrill of a lifetime, and I look forward to what I hope is a great 3-year-old campaign with her next year."

FRANKEL POISED FOR GALLOP

Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) will be put through a mock race when he exercises on Saturday's Cambridgeshire card at Newmarket, Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe announced yesterday. After ruling out a stopover at Longchamp for Sunday's G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, Sir Henry Cecil was quick to arrange the racecourse gallop for the G1 Champion S.-bound world heavyweight. "We are going to try and make it, to all intents and purposes, race conditions, but whether Frankel will be fooled by that is another matter," Grimthorpe explained. "He will go through all the correct motions--be saddled, do a turn in the paddock and go down for a good workout at just under a mile. There is no doubt he is something incredibly special, and Henry wanted to give him a racecourse gallop to get him to Ascot in the best possible shape." Designs on Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}--Summer Trysting, by Alleged), second to Europe's leading juvenile Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) in the Sept. 15 G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at The Curragh, has been sold out of trainer Pat Flynn's Co. Waterford yard. The bay, who RNA'd at €18,000 at last year's Goffs Sportsman Sale, will continue his career in Hong Kong in a private deal brokered by Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock. "Designs on Rome has been sold to race in Hong Kong," revealed Flynn. "He's a fantastic horse and we're obviously disappointed to let him go, but I'd like to thank everyone who has been involved with him while he has been with us, including Moyglare Stud who bred him then sold him to us. He was bought by Peter Doyle Bloodstock for owners in Hong Kong, and it's very exciting for his new connections. I wish them the best of luck, and I think they are getting a very serious horse."

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

PROSPECTING AT HQ

Today's G3 Somerville Tattersall S. at Newmarket has thrown up Group 1 performers like Aussie Rules and Milk It Mick (GB) (Millkom {GB}), and one who could fit that bill on current evidence is **Havana Gold (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}). Recently bought into by Qatar Racing, his perfect record was marred after Ryan Moore's saddle slipped in the closing stages of the Listed Prix Francois Boutin at Deauville Aug. 12. Last time, he beat the smart Al Waab (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Listed Ascendant S. run on firm ground over a mile at Haydock Sept. 8 and, provided he handles these slower conditions, he sets the standard. Lady Rothschild's fellow Hannon trainee **Glean (GB)** (Raven's Pass) looked one to keep a close eye on when scoring on debut at Newbury Aug. 17, but came unstuck when favorite for a Salisbury conditions event over a mile last time Sept. 6. "Havana Gold is rated 105, so is right up there with the our best 2-year-olds," Hannon commented. "He would be unbeaten in four but for his hiccup in France and, though he won on the firm at Haydock last time, he will appreciate this slower ground. Glean won well first time out at Newbury and, though he was then beaten at Salisbury, it was a messy three-runner race and he ran a bit free. He is better than that, but he is not one who overdoes himself at home, so we are still learning about him."

CONTINUING RESOLUTION IMPACTS H-2B WAGE RULE

Congress passed a six month continuing resolution (CR) last week to fund government agencies through March 2013. For the Thoroughbred industry, the CR impacts those who employ H-2B temporary foreign workers by prohibiting the Department of Labor (DOL) from enforcing a new H-2B wage rule. This new rule could significantly raise the rates employers must pay H-2B workers.

The controversial H-2B wage rule originally was to begin on Jan. 1, 2012 but the DOL was forced by Congress last December to delay this until the start of the federal government's next fiscal year on Oct. 1, 2012. Last week's CR further delays implementation of the rule.

Congress uses a CR when it fails to pass a formal appropriations bill before the end of the Congressional fiscal year (Oct. 1-Sept. 30). Congress passed no appropriations bills this year.

Additionally, a federal district court judge in Florida is expected to soon provide a ruling in a case on the future of an H-2B program rule that would increase the administrative burden on those in the Thoroughbred industry who employ H-2B temporary foreign workers. Litigants in this case against the DOL include the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and representatives from the landscape and forestry industries.

TIN HORSE RETIRED

The Marquesa de Moratalla's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero of last year, **Tin Horse (Ire)** (Sakhee--Joyeuse Entree {GB}, by Kendor {Fr}), has been retired and will stand at Eric and Isabelle Lhermite's Haras de Grandcamp next year, according to *Racing Post*. His stud fee will be announced at a later date. Runner-up in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere as a juvenile, the homebred grey finished off the board in four subsequent Group 1 events after his Longchamp Classic score for trainer Didier Guillemin, including last term's G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly, before garnering Maisons-Laffitte's G3 Prix Messidor July 8. His final two starts yielded a sixth in the Aug. 12 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois--his eighth try at the highest level--and a ninth in the Aug. 26 G3 Prix Quincey, both at Deauville. Tin Horse retires with a career record of 14-4-2-1 and earnings of €525,597. He will stand alongside Vision d'Etat (Fr) (Chichicastenango {Fr}) at Grandcamp.

He did not breed in 2012 while recovering from exploratory colic surgery. "We're happy to have the boys back home and we're really appreciative of our partnerships with Magali and with the McMahons," said Eric Hamelback, general manager at Adena Springs. "Their teams did a wonderful job with the stallions."

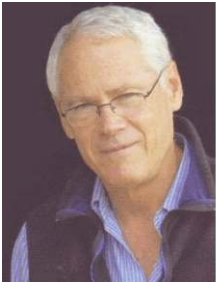

A WORLD WITHIN A WORLD WITHIN A WORLD

The Keeneland September sale is now in the record books and the dust is settling. How it went pretty much depends on who you talk to and their particular reality and agenda or intention to spin.

An industry magazine cover proclaimed that it was “Rock Steady,” whatever that means. With fewer horses on offer as a result of industry contraction, the supply and demand ratio was improved and one sale company spokesman said, “The feel of the sale is much better than last year.” Another one said, “It was an extraordinary sale.” A major consignor was quoted as saying, “There is plenty of money for the horses that buyers line up on, and for the others it’s a struggle.” One buyer said, “It’s been tough to buy with everyone looking down the same hole.” A foreign buyer remarked, “You can buy yearlings for a more reasonable price than five years ago.” A long-time major breeder said to me, “Despite a couple of good hits, I got killed again for the fourth straight year. How long can this go on?” A smaller breeder said, “They make a big deal about the drop in RNAs. They don’t get that we’re so tapped out we can’t afford to take them home and can’t protect them.”

It’s a lot to sort out. So my purpose in this article, therefore, is simply to present some fundamental facts and let the readers draw their own conclusions.

The basic picture. In many ways, the American Thoroughbred sales scene is a microcosm or reflection of the broader economy. It is ultimately a function of competing entities that have difficulty cooperating with one another in order to create a system that will “grow the whole” in a way that benefits the entire industry over the long-term.

The horse sale world, however, is different from the outside world in one respect. In the larger economy, the rich are *making more money* and getting richer, and the middle class and underclass are getting poorer. In the horse world, the middle class and underclass horsemen are indeed getting poorer, but the wealthier horsemen are simply *losing less money* than everyone else.

Service providers who do not share the costs and risks of production (such as sale companies, consignors, vets, and agents, etc.) are collectively *making about the same money* in 2012 as they did in 2011. Stallion owners in Kentucky who have modestly adjusted their fees and have had fewer mares to breed are collectively *making less money* than the previous year.

Commercial breeders, however, are distinct in that they collectively are *not making money*. The facts below show that breeders *lost well over \$100 million* during the recent September sale.

Those breeders who could afford more expensive or more “commercial” stock and obtained placements in the first three books lost much less than those who were placed in books four through six. (Yearlings in the much reduced Book One broke even or were profitable at a 63.6% rate. A 43.6% break-even or profitable rate in Book Two was an improvement compared to recent years. For those in the underbelly of the sale, however, the break-even or profitable rates were 16.3% in Book Four, 6.7% in Book Five, and 0.9% in Book Six where over two days only five yearlings made it to a break-even point.)

No matter what commercial strata breeders fell into, because of the currently diminished and stagnant sales gross or “churn,” each breeder segment was unprofitable. In addition, many individual breeders have more than one year’s results to contend with as they try to absorb cumulative losses that have piled up over several years.

Those breeders who have wealth outside of the industry and can use losses to offset other income have supplementary resources to sustain their efforts, if they choose to continue participating despite negative outcomes. Without a major change in fundamentals, however, many of those who depend on breeding for a livelihood and have no other source of wealth or revenue will probably disappear, especially if they operate with the bank as a partner. Thus, it appears that more contraction lies ahead.

The “churn.” The churn is the amount of revenue generated by the auction process that in turn becomes the source of money to feed and resupply the system. The Keeneland gross proceeds totals are the best indicator of the churn that is needed for Thoroughbred breeders to pay expenses and conduct their breeding activities going forward.

This year’s September Keeneland gross was \$219,781,500, down from \$223,487,800 in 2011. The recent total is slightly above the \$208 million average for the last four years, but is 33% below the 2008 revenue when the gross was \$327,999,100. Furthermore, last week’s gross which will become the working churn for 2013 is 47% less than 2006 when the gross was \$399,791,800. Having 50% less funding available to operate puts perspective on recent comments that we have “stabilized.”

Stud fees. Total stud fees for yearlings catalogued in the 2012 sale (bred in 2010) amounted to \$126,215,370, based on 2010 advertised prices and including 6% sales tax.

Stud fees have on average declined during the last four years, but not enough to give breeders sufficient relief, especially as the cost of feed, fuel, and bedding has risen sharply.

Adding in the other expenses required to produce a yearling from conception to auction ring, the sale gross or churn would need to be over \$350 million for breeders to break even. *(For a detailed analysis of yearling production costs and a formula for profitability, please click [here](#) for the TDN op/ed of 10/8/2010).*

The bottom line is that after paying stud fees and sales commissions, a gross of \$219,781,500 leaves breeders with about \$75 million in revenue to cover more than \$200 million in additional production costs that was paid out over the previous two and a half years.

As the breeder quoted above said, "How long can this go on?"

Profitability (or unprofitability) by sale session. Breeders' profitability by catalogue placement and assigned session are detailed in the Table below. Historical data for 2008 and 2010 are also included.

Of the total yearlings whose sales price returned the cost of production to their breeders this year, 176 broke even (4.8% or one in twenty), and 743 were profitable (20.6% or one in five).

Altogether, 2,186 yearlings were unprofitable in 2012, not counting 490 "outs" which are usually a bad story for their breeders. (Although a few of the withdrawn yearlings might have been sold privately, most early "outs" are typically withdrawn because of injury or a veterinary issue, and many late "outs" occur because the yearling has a problem or attracts no buyer interest once at the sale).

Of the total yearlings who returned the cost of production to their breeders, 176 broke even, and 743 (roughly one in five) were profitable.

Final Comment. My purpose in presenting this research has been to provide a factual basis for discussing how to develop a framework for growing our overall breeding and sales business, now and in the future. Your ideas and comments are welcome.

TATTS CATALOGUE ASSURES OPTIMISM

The strength of last October's Book 1 sale meant that, even with 85 fewer yearlings sold than in 2010 from a reduced catalogue, turnover still rose from the previous year's figure by more than £3 million to £51,634,000.

Despite chairman Edmond Mahony's claim last year that only "an incurable optimist" could have predicted that level of trade, his team at Tattersalls is entitled to approach its flagship sale with optimism as the over-riding emotion. The Newmarket sales house has amassed an embarrassment of riches to offer from Oct. 9 to 11, with the catalogue up in size from 2011 from 506 to 577. The rise in numbers is carried through to the second week of the October Sale, in which demand for Book 2 places has seen it extended to four days of trade and 1,042 yearlings.

"Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale is always regarded as the premier yearling catalogue in Europe--last year's was outstanding and this year's looks to have almost taken it to a new level," Tattersalls' marketing director Jimmy George said. "It really is a very strong catalogue."

Among the pages of Book 1 can be found the pedigrees of full or half-siblings to 56 Classic and Group 1 winners, including the full-brother to Derby winner Motivator (GB) and a full-sister to Oaks winner Was (Ire). Yearlings by Sea the Stars (Ire) have already topped Arqana's August Sale and the SGA Sale in Milan, and at Tattersalls another 30 of his first-crop sons and daughters are on offer, including half-siblings to G1 Prix du Jockey-Club winner Le Havre (Ire), dual Classic heroine Finsceal Beo (Ire) and St Leger winner Sixties Icon (GB).

While the new-boy status of Sea the Stars makes him an intriguing prospect for buyers, his half-brother Galileo (Ire) carries all before him on the track and in the ring. In Book 1 last year, he was the sire of five of the six top lots, including the sale's only millionaire, a filly out of the Irish River (Fr) mare Brigid--whose offspring include Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile winner Listen (Ire) and Henrythenavigator's dam Sequoyah, who attained 1.7 million guineas. With 42 yearlings catalogued this time around, Galileo will be hard to beat. **Cont. p12**

This season, four graduates of the October sale have gone on to claim Classic glory, and in total the sale has produced 11 individual Group or Grade I winners of 15 races and 60 individual group/listed winners of 77 races in 2012. They include the outstanding Camelot, who won the G1 2,000 Guineas, G1 Derby and G1 Irish Derby before failing by just three-quarters of a length to become the first Triple Crown winner since Nijinsky II in 1970. The Highclere Stud-consigned son of Montjeu (Ire) sold for 525,000gns and few will argue that he wasn't worth every penny, but George is quick to stress that there is also value to be found at the elite sale.

"The thing about Book 1 is, yes, it's established a reputation as a source of horses of the likes of Camelot and Was and those that dominate the top end of the market," he explained. "But equally, it's a very consistent source of Group 1 winners that were purchased for reasonable money and this year is a case in point. You've got Samitar (GB), winner of the Irish G1 1,000 Guineas who cost 39,000gns, Power (GB), who won the G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas and cost 50,000gns. It is very much a sale for everyone and that's a point we like to stress every year."

George is also proud of the success of the Tattersalls Millions series, which he believes has helped to generate repeat visits to the buying bench from those owners fortunate enough to have landed one of the six valuable races.

“It’s not just the Classic quality, but one has to remember that all 577 of the yearlings in Book 1 are eligible for the Tattersalls Millions, worth a total of £1.3 million,” George said. “Prize-money is such a key issue in British racing at the moment that to have a series attached to a sale is crucial to trainers when trying to attract owners.”

“The profiles of the Millions race winners in the last few years have been perfect,” he continued. “They have been won by a number of horses in the 30,000 to 100,000-guineas bracket. Every single one of those owners who won a Millions race in 2011 came back to buy at the 2011 sale. That, for us, speaks volumes. It’s exactly what the Tattersalls Millions series is all about. We want to bring those people back in and give them the excitement of running for six-figure prize-money, and, in the case of the big Millions races for the colts and the fillies, half a million and £300,000. So, the series is a key part of the success of the sale that caters for the middle market, while horses like Camelot and Was show the top owners in the world that this is where they can find the best horses year after year.”

Castlemartin Stud Expecting Strong October

Lady O'Reilly's Castlemartin Stud has been represented on the track this season by the G2 Mill Reef S. winner Moohaajim (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), whose win on Saturday has put an extra spring in the step of stud manager James Kelly. The Kildare-based operation is taking what Kelly describes as "our best draft ever" to Tattersalls in early October and the five-strong consignment contains another Cape Cross colt ([lot 469](#)) who is bound to garner plenty of interest, being the first foal of the homebred Group 1 winner Chinese White (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}). "She was as tough a race mare as we've ever had and she was carrying this colt when she won the G1 Pretty Polly S.," Kelly said of the 7-year-old. "He's a very athletic mover with great bone and Moohaajim has given us all a very timely reminder of just what Cape Cross can do."

Chinese White, who was trained by Dermot Weld to win seven races, including the Pretty Polly and G2 Blandford S., has a Dubawi (Ire) colt foal at foot and is in foal to Sea the Stars. Her dam, the Sadler's Wells mare Chiang Mai (Ire), produced a full-sister to Chinese White this year and is back in foal to Dalakhani.

Castlemartin sold Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) for 360,000gns at the 2008 October Sale and he has since won three group races and will attempt to defend his GI Canadian International S. title at Woodbine again this fall. His half-brother by Invincible Spirit (Ire) sells as [lot 96](#) on the opening day of the October Sale.

"In my opinion, he's a truly magnificent individual," Kelly commented. "We've retained his 2-year-old half-sister by Montjeu (Ire), Monaco Mist (Ire), and she was placed first time out. Another half-brother, Stencive (GB) (Dansili {GB}), sold for 260,000gns and has run well all season for William Haggas. He looks like a black-type horse in the making."

One of the Castlemartin Stud and Skymarc Farm-bred stars of last season was Lightning Pearl (Ire) (Marju {Ire}), who became the first top-flight winner for Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani's Pearl Bloodstock when landing the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket. Her Amadeus Wolf (GB) half-sister is being offered as [lot 44](#).

"She's a filly who hasn't stopped improving in her sales prep and that's a good sign," Kelly said of the yearling. "She's a different type to Lightning Pearl--more like her other half-sister, Jolie Jioconde (Ire), who was group-placed. She looks the type who might need [to race over] a mile at two."

Another first foal among the draft is that of Beach Bunny (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who was beaten just a short-head by Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the 2009 Pretty Polly S. Her firstborn is by Oasis Dream (GB) ([lot 419](#)) and closely resembles his sire, according to Kelly. "We think he's a star and we think he'll be among the sales-toppers," Kelly said confidently. "We've had a lot of English agents here at the farm looking at him and they agree that's he's exceptional," he said.

"He's extremely correct, a solid walker and very good on the lunge. If every first foal was like him, it would make life a lot easier."

Last but by no means least among the Castlemartin quintet is a High Chaparral colt out of the Group 3 winner and black-type producer Right Key (Ire) (Key of Luck), catalogued as [lot 222](#).

"He'd be a standout Book 2 horse but, in the words of Edmond Mahony, he walked his way into Book 1," attested Kelly, who is hoping that the colt's 2-year-old half-sister by Dalakhani, named Riviera Rose (Ire) and in training with Kevin Prendergast, will be ready to run in the week of the sale. "He's a big tall horse, but very athletic and the best walker of our draft. He's a good prospect for someone looking for a nice middle-distance horse."

There's clearly great confidence behind the stud's select consignment going into the sale, with individuals owning physiques to match their classy pedigrees.

"I've been telling my boss that these are the best yearlings we've consigned for a long time," said Kelly.

A Classic October for Voute Sales

The Voute Sales consignment, with its yellow-bedecked handlers and floral decorations, is hard to miss at Park Paddocks, but this year's Book 1 draft is smaller than in recent years.

"What we lack in numbers we make up for in quality," says Ted Voute, who is selling on behalf of Salah Fustok's Deerfield Farm for the first time.

Based just a few miles down the road from Tattersalls at Dullingham, the farm is famous for having bred 2005 Derby winner Motivator (GB) from the first crop of Montjeu (Ire) and the Deerfield team has entrusted his yearling full-brother to Voute ([lot 173](#)).

"It was an honor to be asked to sell two colts for Deerfield and I didn't have to think for too long before saying yes," Voute said. "The Montjeu colt is the fourth colt produced by Out West (Gone West) and the other three are all stakes winners. He's a Classic horse in the making with a bit of scope about him. Like all Montjeus, he's thrived in his preparation and, without tempting fate, I hope he'll sell very well."

Also in Voute's consignment from Deerfield is a Raven's Pass colt out of Motivator's unraced full-sister Sunspear (Ire) ([lot 290](#)).

"I sold [listed winner] Steeler (Ire) last year, who is also by Raven's Pass. Mark Johnston says he's the best 2-year-old he has and this one is very similar to him," Voute commented.

While Deerfield Farm is a new client, Voute is also consigning a full-sister to another Classic winner, Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), ([lot 242](#)) on behalf of the Sangster family, with whom he has had links since he started out 25 years ago.

"I sold the full-sister last year for 340,000gns," he said. "This is a May foal, very good looking, and obviously it's that wonderful Galileo-Danehill cross. I'm very lucky to be selling two siblings to Classic winners. I sold a horse for Robert Sangster in my first year consigning and the family has supported me every year."

A regular visitor to American sales, Voute is especially pleased to be consigning an American-bred three-parts-sister to G1 Spinster S. winner Asi Siempre. By Artie Schiller, a son of Asi Siempre's sire El Prado (Ire), the April-foaled filly is consigned on behalf of Hernandez Font, who owns West Stow Stud in Suffolk.

"I've always liked to sell American-breds and I am proud of my record with horses such as Russian Rhythm and Shamardal," said Voute, who also sold the Stormy Atlantic filly Ollie Olga at last year's October sale for 42,000gns. She is now unbeaten in three starts, most recently the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood.

"In recent years, there's been this attitude against American horses, but we've gone over there and persuaded people to come over with their horses and they've done well."

Despite the prospect of an elite draft, Voute admits to a familiar feeling of trepidation as he approaches the "most exciting sale of the year."

"Tattersalls have done a great job in the last five to 10 years in attracting more and more international buyers and that's crucial," he said. "We don't want the Maktoums to disappear in any shape or form, but it's very heartening that we have such a strong buying bench and I'm keeping my fingers crossed that the Japanese interest and participation will be as strong as it was in Keeneland. You never know how it will be until you actually get there, but the interest at the farm has been much higher than normal, so let's hope that continues at Tattersalls."

Clairemont Stud Debuts

Nestled among the many familiar names on the list of consignors is one that will be new to most people-- Clairemont Stud. The faces behind the operation are familiar ones, however, with the experienced hands of Liam and Jenny Norris having teamed up with Martin and Lee Taylor, owners of the 2011 Oaks winner Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), to buy the Hampshire-based stud.

Liam Norris, along with regular sales partner William Huntingdon, bought the daughter of Danehill Dancer for the Taylor brothers for €200,000 at Goffs and she will retire to Clairemont when her racing days are over. She will doubtless be the star package among the growing band of broodmares now residing at the converted sheep farm which was bought in March.

"The QIPCO Fillies and Mares S. on Champions' Day is the plan for Dancing Rain, but she will eventually come to the farm," said Norris, who has recently been renting land from Lady Rothschild in Pewsey while work is completed at Clairemont.

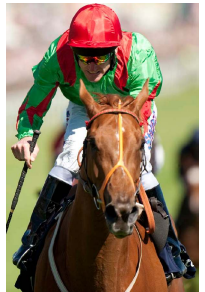
"These are exciting times for us," he said. "It's our first time consigning anywhere, but I'm really proud of the six fillies we will be presenting as the first Clairemont Stud draft. As individuals I'm really thrilled with them."

First to go through the ring will be Onereuse (GB) (Sanglamore)'s High Chaparral (Ire) filly ([lot 170](#)), a half-sister to the G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Fidelite (Ire) (In The Wings {Ire}).

"She's an absolute beauty and should appeal to breeders," Norris said. "I've tried to select some quality yearlings by proven sires. The sires speak for themselves really and I hope the yearlings will do the same." **Cont. p16**

With the other five offerings being by Galileo (Ire), Danehill Dancer (Ire), Exceed and Excel (Aus), Teofilo (Ire) and Azamour (Ire), few will find fault with the top half of their pedigrees and there's plenty underneath to recommend them. The Galileo filly ([lot 456](#)) is another bred on the proven cross with Danehill--this one out of Castara Beach (Ire), who has already produced Group 3 winner Steinbeck (Ire) (Footsepsinthesand {GB}) and hails from the family of Nannina (GB) (Medicean {GB}) and Hong Kong star Indigenous (Ire) (Marju {Ire}).

Norris has an understandable fondness for daughters of Danehill Dancer and is delighted to be consigning an April-foaled filly out of the Royal Academy mare Singing Diva (Ire), whose extended family includes Classic winners Dubawi (Ire), High-Rise (Ire) and Virginia Waters.

It will be a busy week for Norris, who will also be engaged at Tattersalls in his more familiar role as agent. But, as they say, behind every good man, there's an even better woman and Liam will be relying on his wife Jenny to front the Clairemont draft.

"Jenny's really experienced and has worked for the Irish National Stud and Heatherwold Stud among others," he said. "I think she'd rather I left it to her anyway, but she hasn't got many nails left at the moment!"

First Up for Coulonces

Anna and Etienne Drion's Coulonces consignment has quickly made a name for itself in France and the couple, who own Haras du Grand Chene in Normandy, are sending a draft to Tattersalls for the first time this October.

Star billing among the five yearlings has to go to [lot 107](#), not just because he's a half-brother to Classic winner Le Havre, whom Anna bred in partnership with her parents Jan and Maja Sundstrom (who breed under the name Team Hogdala), but also because he is by this season's most exciting freshman Sea the Stars.

"This has been a dream for me to sell horses at Newmarket, but up until now we haven't had the right ones," says Anna Drion, who settled in France from her native Sweden with her parents eight years ago. "This year, my parents thought they would like to sell at Tattersalls, so we had a long talk about it and decided to try it. Then a few other people asked us to consign horses for them. Now I'm getting pretty nervous and the sleepless nights are starting, but we're going there with five nice horses--a good number--and they are not competing against each other, they have very different pedigrees."

Coulonces is also selling the only yearling by Turtle Bowl (Ire) in the catalogue ([lot 527](#)). The statuesque son of Dyhim Diamond (Ire), who stands at Haras de la Reboursière et de Montaigu, has solid claims to being the best-looking stallion in France and has made a splash with his debutants (now 3-year-olds). From a limited first book, he has sired the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Lucayan (Fr) and G1 Criterium International winner and 2,000 Guineas runner-up French Fifteen (Fr).

The Coulonces-offered colt by Turtle Bowl is a half-brother to the oddly named filly Testosterone (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), a dual group winner in France out of the listed-placed Sadler's Wells mare Epopee (Ire).

Fastnet Rock (Aus) (Danehill) was recently crowned Australia's champion sire for the first time and, following some solid returns for his yearlings in Deauville, hopes are high that the eight offered in Book 1 will be similarly in demand. Selling on behalf of Robert Jeffcock's Haras de Guergue, the Coulonces consignment offers a filly out of an unraced half-sister to the German champion older horse Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}), who is already named Miss Rocky ([lot 251](#)).

"Robert Jeffcock is very local to us--just five minutes away," Drion said. "He has converted a stud farm and is buying mares with really nice pedigrees. He bought this filly as a foal and wanted to resell. She's a beautiful filly and we're delighted to be selling her for Haras de Guergue."

The Drions are also grateful for a very nice update for their Henrythenavigator colt ([lot 263](#)). Out of Silver Bark (GB), a full sister to Grade I winner Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), and by a hot young sire, there's plenty to like about the page already, but another half-sister to the dam, Sant Elena (GB), is responsible for this season's crack European 2-year-old Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate), who is unbeaten in four starts, with his G1 Prix Morny victory coming after the catalogue was printed.

"To have such a major update is fantastic and he's a gorgeous yearling," said Drion, adding, "Like all four colts in our draft, he is eligible for French premiums."

ILLINOIS BOARD SHIFTS DARK-DAY REVENUE

During its annual racing dates award meeting, the Illinois Racing Board approved the 2013 live racing schedule in Chicago Tuesday. After a day-long session, the motion was finally carried on a 6-2 vote. Among the biggest and most hotly contested issues on the agenda was the division of 'dark day' simulcasting revenue. When all was said and done, Hawthorne will benefit from an additional 19 days of dark day simulcast wagering, which translates into about \$800,000 in purse revenue and \$430,000 in commissions for the struggling track. Arlington Park, which in recent times has held a monopoly on January and early February simulcast days, will host 90 dark days in 2013, down from 107 in 2012. An initial proposal which would have cut Arlington's dark-day revenue by two weeks (running from Jan. 1 through Jan. 31), with Hawthorne operating from Feb. 1 to Feb. 14, was not passed after voting ended in a 4-4 tie. Beginning Feb. 15, Hawthorne offers two live racing days through the remainder of that month and is increased to four days in March. The Arlington meet runs four days a week from May 1 to Sept. 30.

BUSHRANGER COLT TOPS SEPTEMBER

Tattersalls Ireland's September Yearling Sale concluded yesterday with gains from the 2011 renewal, and it was a member of the first crop of Tally-Ho Stud's Bushranger (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}) who stole the show when selling for €75,000. At the end of the two-day Sale, the average and median of €11,670 and €9,500 represented increases of 7 and 19%, respectively, on last year, while the clearance rate stood at 87%. Consigned by Torard House Stud, [hip 414](#) is out of Clever Day (Action This Day), a half-sister to stakes winner and Grade III-placed Mavoreen (Sir Cat), and was knocked down to Pauline Marterer of Emerald Bloodstock on behalf of the Chantilly-based trainer Urs Suter.

"Mr. Suter had picked out this horse and really liked him, but had to leave before he sold," Marterer explained after outlasting trainer Ger Lyons and agent Peter Doyle. Suter had earlier purchased three yearlings, including a duo also by Bushranger.

Another first-crop sire who made a splash yesterday was Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), whose colt from the Castlebridge Consignment fetched €55,000. [Hip 356](#) is a February-foaled grandson of group scorer Hatton Gardens (Ire) (Auction Ring), later a proven producer of the likes of South African champion Kundalini (El Gran Senor). Armando Duarte signed for the chestnut.

"He is for an existing client and a trainer has yet to be decided," Duarte offered. "The client is planning on buying a few yearlings, they will go out into the field for a couple of months and then he will decide upon trainers. This looks a real 2-year-old, is by Mastercraftsman who was a good 2-year-old, and we paid a bit more than we had thought we would have to, but nice horses are costing money."

Also selling for €55,000 was another by a sire whose yearlings are hitting the sales rings for the first time. Redmondstown Stud's [hip 411](#) is by Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway) and was the subject of the most significant update in the catalogue, with his half-brother Leitir Mor (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) bagging the G3 Round Tower S. and finishing runner-up in the G1 Phoenix S. and third in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. Trainer J T Gorman was the name on the docket for the February-foaled bay.

Later on, trainer Alduino Botti was on hand to pay €44,000 for Egmont Stud's [hip 465](#), the sole offering by Exceed and Excel (Aus) in the book. The March-foaled colt is out of a sister to listed winner Handassa (GB) from the family of Pastoral Pursuits (GB). That sire had been responsible for the opening session's topper, and it was one of his daughters who enjoyed the limelight yesterday when selling to Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock for €33,000. From the draft of Baroda and Colbinstown Studs, [hip 337](#) is from the immediate family of the smart Japanese performer Grab Your Heart (Deputy Commander).

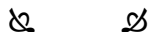
