## BLACK CAVIAR TO RACE ON IN 2013

Undefeated superstar sprinter **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) will return to race in 2013, trainer Peter Moody told *Racenet* yesterday. The two-time Australian Champion Racehorse of the Year exited her narrow win in Royal Ascot's G1 Golden Jubilee S. in June with muscle tears, but passed Moody's inspection this week. "We're going to give her a spell now and she will be geared towards and autumn preparation," the conditioner revealed. "That's the extent of it at this stage, no races have even been thought of or discussed as potential targets."

## MEASURING UP

**Certify** (Elusive Quality) looks to add to her win in the Sept. 14 G2 May Hill S. in today G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile at Newmarket. The filly could follow in the footsteps of White

Moonstone (Dynaformer) and Lyric of Light (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}) and provide Godolphin with a third straight victory in the one-mile contest.

Although she was made to work for her May Hill success, **Certify** overcame a smart rival in Purr Along (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}), and they were eight lengths clear of the third. Prior to that, the Mahmood Al Zarooni trainee had beaten the subsequent G1 Moyglare Stud S. scorer Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) in the Aug. 11 G3 Sweet Solera S. Aug. 11.

"Certify did a nice, building piece of work on Saturday and she looks in good form at the moment," Al Zarooni said. "She showed that she is a good filly in the May Hill, because she kicked off a slow pace. It's usually not very easy to win from behind if there is no pace and she still showed a little bit of greenness. She is learning with her racing and I hope that she will be better again this time. It looks like a tough race with some nice fillies in the field, but I am hopeful of another good run."

Certify meets the similarly unbeaten **Ollie Olga** (Stormy Atlantic), who was scratched from the May Hill after coming into season. Previously, Nick and Olga Dhandra and John and Zoe Webster's won the G3 Prestige S. Aug. 25. Trainer Mick Channon is confident she will hold her own against the favorite.

"She's in great heart and we'll find out how good she is tomorrow," Channon told *PA Sport*. "I think she's very good and she's the type of filly who only does enough at home, but when she turns up at the races she's totally different. I think she'd go on any ground, but better ground suits her best. I think that's probably the case for most of them." **Cont. p5**

## BENNETT TO PERFORM AT BREEDERS' CUP

Tony Bennett will perform his classic hit "The Best is Yet to Come" at the Breeders' Cup championships at Santa Anita, it was announced during a media event featuring the legendary singer at Siro's Restuarant in Manhattan Thursday night.

Bennett's performance of the song, which has been used as the centerpiece of the Breeders' Cup new brand campaign launched in May, will come during NBC's live broadcast of the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic Primetime Hour Nov. 3 between 8-9 p.m. Bennett will perform live from the winner's circle as the Classic horses make their way to the starting gate for the race.

"I am thrilled that the Breeders' Cup chose 'The Best Is Yet to Come' as their theme for the event, as it's a wonderful song and I love it just as much as when I first introduced the song to the American public in 1960," said Bennett. "I look forward to singing it for everyone on Nov. 3rd."

Havana Gold caused an upset on debut over six furlongs at Newmarket June 9 when scoring in decisive style from his odds-on barnmate Pearl Acclaim (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), and doubled up at the expense of the subsequent black-type scorers Discernable (Elusive Quality) and Glass Office (GB) (Verglas {Ire}) in a seven-furlong conditions event at Ascot July 20. Clear when Ryan Moore's saddle slipped in the closing stages of the Listed Prix Francois Boutin at Deauville Aug. 12, the bay made amends last time when inflicting the first defeat on Al Waab (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Listed Ascendant S. over a mile at Haydock Sept. 8. Held up in rear early by a typically confident Richard Hughes, he was angled towards the stand's side for his run as the long-time leader Well Acquainted attempted to fend off challenges from Ebn Arab (Dixie Union) and Havana Gold's stable companion Glean (GB) (Raven's Pass). Mainly hand-ridden to take charge 100 yards from home, he asserted for a comfortable success to add further weight to his trainer's presence in the juvenile category. "He's doing what he has to do and he's done nothing wrong so far--he's unbeaten bar that mishap," Hughes said. "At Haydock, I kicked clear and he pulled up in front, so today I wasn't going to give it away and instead catch them after giving them two lengths head start. He didn't handle the track all that well, but it's hard for 2-year-olds racing first time here and he won quite easily."

### NATHANIEL ON TRACK

John Gosden yesterday issued a positive bulletin on Lady Rothschild and Newsells Park Stud's **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) ahead of next Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. Despite having won last year's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and this season's G1 Eclipse S. on soft ground, the 4-year-old handled a fast surface when runner-up in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 8, and his conditioner is not on weather-watch. "I was pleased with his work on Tuesday and the fact he could go inside the track record at Leopardstown on good-to-firm indicates to me he can go on anything," Gosden said. "He's a versatile horse and one of those who can go through soft ground while others struggle in it, but he'll also go on good. He's done nothing but run great races all year, he has a lot of tactical speed and can be handy, back in the middle of the pack or anything. It's a tremendous race this year and the quality of the field is exceptional."

### SNOW FAIRY HAS E.P. TAYLOR OPTION

Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) could be re-routed from next Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe to run in the G1 E.P. Taylor S. one week later, trainer Ed Dunlop said yesterday. With the going currently soft in Paris, the seven-time Group 1 winner could be headed to Woodbine as her conditioner is keen to options open. "We caused a bit of a storm in a tea cup by saying we'd put her in the E.P. Taylor, but I thought it was foolish not to have her in that just in case things change," Dunlop said. "She's in that race as a precaution and no more than that and could go to Canada, hypothetically, and then on to the Breeders' Cup. I don't want to be boring, but with a filly who's had such a significant injury, we have to take every day as we go." The Arc remains the 5-year-old's main target, according to Dunlop. "She has a couple more bits of work to do before Paris, where we are hoping to have Ryan [Moore], unless Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) runs," he said. "Soft ground will make it more of a stamina test and favor others more than us, as she loves fast ground, but it can change very quickly, so there are lots of things to chew over. We'll see, as it's a very open Arc." Dunlop added, "The owner has booked her tickets to the Breeders' Cup and we know the ground will suit--we haven't ruled out either the G1 Turf or G1 Filly & Mare Turf." Snow Fairy earned an automatic berth to the Breeders' Cup Turf with her victory in the G1 Irish Champion S.

### CONNECTIONS PONDER SEA MOON TARGET

Trainer Sir Michael Stoute is keeping an eye on the weather for Khalid Abdullah's **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}), with a tilt at next Sunday's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe becoming more likely. Not seen since finishing fifth in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 21, the 4-year-old who had previously won that track's G2 Hardwicke S. at the Royal meeting, also has the options of the G1 Canadian International and G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. "We will wait and see what the ground conditions are like, as although he's impervious to ground he really does love to get his toe in and would be advantaged by that," Stoute said yesterday. "If we think the ground has enough moisture in it, we'll have a crack. We only had one behind us turning for home in the King George and he was impressive in the Hardwicke, so he's a fair sort of horse."

### TIGER HILL EUTHANIZED

Leading German sire **Tiger Hill (Ire)** (Danehill--The Filly {Ger}), by Appiani {Ity} was euthanized yesterday at his Gestut Fahrhof home, the *Racing Post* revealed. Following a paddock accident, the 17-year-old sire of Rewilding (GB), Konigstiger (Ger) and Saldentigerin (Ger) suffered a fracture and could not be saved. Campaigned for Baron Georg von Ullmann by Peter Schiergen to win back-to-back renewals of the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in 1998-99 and the 1999 G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis, the bay quickly sired the 2004 G1 Gran Criterium winner and subsequent sire Konigstiger and 2005 G1 Preis der Diana heroine Iota (Ger). Standing at Darley's Kildangan Stud shortly after, he produced his most accomplished performer in Godolphin's Rewilding, who took the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and G1 Prince of Wales's S. prior to his ill-fated run at Ascot. Tiger Hill, who has sired 67 black-type horses and 18 group winners, also achieved notable success as a broodmare sire as a result of the recent exploits of Akeed Mofeed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Salomina (Ger) (Lomitas {Ger}). The latter is out of one of his finest distaffers, Saldentigerin, who was also one of his chief earners.

### PIERRO TO MAKE FIRST MELBOURNE START

**Pierro (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}), Australia's undefeated 2-year-old champion of last season, will make his first start outside Sydney tonight in the G2 Bill Stutt S. at Moonee Valley in Melbourne. Now three, Pierro has reeled off seven straight victories for trainer Gai Waterhouse, including the A\$4-million G1 Golden Slipper, the world's richest 2-year-old race, at Rosehill in April. Pierro followed that effort with victories in the G1 Sires Produce S. at Randwick a week later, and the G1 Champagne S. at the same venue Apr. 28, completing Australia's 2-year-old Triple Crown. Owned by Greg and Donna Kolivos and bred by Darley, Pierro kicked off his spring campaign with a win in the G3 Run to the Rose at Rosehill Sept. 1, where he defeated subsequent G1 Golden Rose S. winner Epaulette (Aus) (Commands {Aus}). The Bill Stutt will serve as a prep for Pierro for the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley Oct. 27, where he will likely face older horses for the first time.

After a smooth winning introduction over seven furlongs on Newmarket's July course Aug. 11, she was runner-up to Certify's stable companion Lovely Pass (Ire) (Raven's Pass) in a mile conditions event at Ascot last time Sept. 8. "Winsili is in good form and we hope she's progressive, as she will need to be as this is a big step up to a Group 1," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "She was staying on really well at Ascot and we hope she'll run well."

**MOST WELCOME**

Despite its upgraded status and inclusion into the British Champions Series, Newmarket's G2 Joel S. still has to prove worthy of its inflation, and the appearance of the G1 St James' Palace S. winner **Most Improved (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}) helps the cause in today's renewal. While Iraj Parvizi's imposing bay captured one of the weakest renewals of that Royal Ascot contest in recent times June 19, he has serious questions to answer after being tailed off in the Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois when last seen Aug. 12.

"It is probably harsh to describe the season's achievements of the St James's Palace S. hero as slightly disappointing, but his other two starts, both in France, have been rendered irrelevant by serious interference," trainer Brian Meehan said. "He carries a four-pound Group 1 penalty for his win at Ascot, but will still be the one to beat in this deep Group 2 event."

John Manley's **Trumpet Major (Ire)** (Arakan) is another bidding to put a below-par latest effort behind him when last of five in the Aug. 25 G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood, but escapes an extra burden for his previous Group 3 wins in the Apr. 19 Craven S. at Newmarket and Aug. 3 Thoroughbred S.

"The key to Trumpet Major is undoubtedly the ground and he is definitely a far better horse when it rides good or faster," trainer Richard Hannon explained. "I know he won the Craven S. on easy ground in the spring, but it never gets too bad at Newmarket, whereas at Goodwood last time he hated the conditions in the Celebration Mile."

## FASIG TIPTON OR THE MELBOURNE CUP? MAYBE KENTUCKY IS THE PLACE TO BE FOR THE SMART AUSSIE HORSE PLAYER

Any sale that clashes with the Melbourne Cup is necessarily going to divide the attention of Australia's horse players and if the auction is off shore, say in America, it's worse--a geographical impossibility. But that schizoid reaction is not always the case--if the sale is attractive enough, maybe even a pot of gold, then the smarter agents will be there.

Take Fasig Tipton's offering at Lexington, promoted proudly as the "Leading Mixed Sale in the World" which begins on the eve of the Melbourne Cup, Nov. 5--a sale series along with Keeneland increasingly attractive to Australians who recognise the list of local stars from American-bred mares.

Unlike their male half, the stallions, U.S. mares have done remarkably well in the wide brown land and, while they number just under 3% of the mare population, they provide 10% of the stakes winners!

Now that is head-turning stuff, attractive enough to make any breeder divert from Flemington, especially if he has talked with Randwick Bloodstock's principal Brett Howard, a devotee of the sale and an agent on a mission to convince the Australian thoroughbred industry that the USA prefix is working wonders down under.

"I am very passionate about the need for Australian breeders to continue to import blood from overseas because the results from imported mares are simply outstanding. This sale presents an ideal buying opportunity for people from Australia and New Zealand to add an international flavour to their broodmare bands," he says.

And he backs that up with amazing evidence--a roll call of the most outstanding Group 1 horses to perform here in the last decade, including of course, legendary three-time Melbourne Cup winner Makybe Diva.

"Mares bred in the United States in recent times have produced Absolut Glam, All American, Alverta, Exceed and Excel, Gallica, Helenus, Irish Lights, Maldivian, Mentality, Miss Finland, Northern Meteor, Republic Lass, Swiss Ace, Theseo, Typhoon Zed and Zavite.

"In the past 12 months alone stakes winners from the U.S-bred mares have included Group 1 winners Manighar, Foxwedge and Quintessential; Group 2 winners Hot Snitzel, So Pristine, Platinum Princess and Rekindled Interest; Group 3 winners like Smart Missile, Anabandana; listed winners Tatra, Soft Sand, She's a Fox, Nobby Snip, More Strawberries and many more," he added. **Cont. p8**



And the honor roll includes our greatest homebred sires in the past 10 years. They are either sons or grandsons of mares conceived in the U.S...Redoute's Choice, Zabeel, Encosta de Lago and Flying Spur.

Howard backs up the broader figures with some successes secured by him. "From the small number of mares we have imported from the U.S., we feel we have achieved very good results. These have included They Say, the dam of champion Australian 2-year-old Hasna; Gabbing Gloria, who produced the Caulfield Cup and Rosehill Guineas winner Diatribe; and Forest Mint, the dam of South Australian Derby winner Blue Murder. These mares were purchased for as little as \$25,000, and all were bought for under \$100,000.

"In 2009, we bought Ma Famille for US\$55,000 as a broodmare prospect, and this year her half-brother Dundonnell has been rated as one of the top three 2-year-olds in Europe. That year we also bought Easy Tee for US\$75,000, and her first foal by Northern Meteor has been accepted for the 2013 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. In 2010 we bought the multiple stakes winner Libor Lady, whose family has since improved through the 2011 champion U.S. female [sprinter] Musical Romance, as well as that year securing for US\$25,000 Banker's Choice, who this year was sold in foal to Snitzel for \$190,000 (a profit of \$90,000, given the holding costs of importing and joining her at \$100,000).

"We also bought, for US\$80,000, a Proud Citizen filly named Proud Life, who is a close relation to 2011 English champion filly Immortal Verse. Proud Life is currently in training in New Zealand.

"If we plan to keep Australasia at the forefront of world breeding, it is imperative we continue to invigorate our herd with these international female lines. My aim is to return to Australia after the November breeding stock sales with a mare or two, who in time will see their produce add to the list of top-class racehorses being imported from the U.S. and elsewhere.

"With the Australian dollar being at around A\$1.05 to the US\$1, that will definitely help buyers from Australia and should make it easier to drum up some orders," he added with a twinkle in his eye.

**HOOFNOTE:** Howard aims at buying young mares off the track and sees them as the best value and always looks for something Australians will recognise in the pedigree, but doesn't make that a dealbreaker if it is not there. He points out that Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock), a Group 1-winning stallion going to stud this season, is out of a Forest Wildcat mare, hardly a household name in Australia.

## NYRA IS FOR SALE. BUT WHO WOULD WANT IT?

So Andrew Cuomo wants to privatize NYRA, sell it to the highest bidder, which he figures will be any one of a dozen major companies who will be beating down the door of his Albany office with checkbooks in hand. Perhaps there is someone or some company out there who will want to buy NYRA, but that's only because the world is filled with gullible people.

Paying for the right to run the New York tracks would mean investing in a racing operation that has been a big money-loser over the years, dealing with a governor who has proven that he can't be trusted and venturing into a future fraught with unknowns. A smart business person wouldn't go anywhere near it.

NYRA lost \$24 million in 2011. In 2010 it lost \$17 million. Perhaps a savvy team could cut into those numbers, but maybe not. Despite Cuomo's attempts to portray NYRA management as incompetent and borderline criminal, the truth is that the New York racing operation has been run reasonably well. NYRA has had to keep three aging racetracks functional, has never been allowed to run off-track wagering in its own backyard and had to sit by helplessly while New York state government turned the process of opening a casino at Aqueduct into a pathetic circus.

Racing, unfortunately, has been transformed into a business where the only way to make money is to have outside revenue sources. Keeneland has the sales. Churchill Downs has the Kentucky Derby. Numerous tracks have slot machines. Is anyone making money selling horse racing and only horse racing? Even in New York, with big handles and the Saratoga cash cow, the racing business is not a profitable one.

With the Aqueduct casino finally opening, NYRA's finances have taken a turn for the better. It is projecting a profit in 2012, but only because of the \$20.6 million in operational support payments from VLT proceeds and \$27.5 million in VLT capital funds it will receive. Without the slots /VLT money, NYRA would have another year where it finished deep in the red.

If iron-clad guarantees could be made that the new operator would get a healthy cut of the slots revenue in perpetuity then perhaps it would make sense to buy the NYRA tracks. But Cuomo has proven that his promises mean nothing. *Cont. p9*

One day, he was hell bent on expanding the Aqueduct racino and allowing its operator, the Malaysian company Genting, to build a huge full scale casino and convention center there. Then his idea was to build a casino in Manhattan at the Jacob Javitz Center on the west side of Manhattan.

Cuomo's vision seems to change by the minute, but there is always one constant-casino companies keep pouring money into Albany. According to Common Cause, gambling interests spent nearly \$4 million on lobbying and more than \$700,000 on campaign contributions in the first half of 2012. There doesn't appear to be any rules, other than that Cuomo and other New York politicians will be beholden to whichever company puts the most money into their pockets.

So there's every reason to believe that this anti-racing governor who keeps hoovering cash from casino companies will find a way to cut racing out of the equation, whether that means taking VLT revenue away from the track operator or from purses or from both. State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli issued what was a scary threat back in August when releasing an audit of VLT-racino revenues. "We are unable to determine whether the millions of dollars that pay for increased purses (prize money), rather than for education, are having their intended effect," he wrote, referring to racing's failure to experience growth in the racino era.

When it comes to racing Cuomo continues to be slippery. In 2008, NYRA received a 25-year extension of its franchise after it agreed to end the dispute over who owned the land the tracks sit on, agreeing that it belonged to the state. That should have been an irrevocable deal, but Cuomo managed to undot the i's and uncross the t's when NYRA shortchanged bettors after failing to adjust takeout rates. He has successfully manipulated the situation so that the 25-year franchise extension can be made invalid and NYRA can be dissolved, its racing franchise put on the open market.

Fred Dicker, a writer for the *New York Post*, has been out in front on this story and is obviously Cuomo's go-to reporter when it comes to leaking stories about his plans for New York racing. Just the other day Dicker wrote: "State officials believe operators of such prestigious tracks as Churchill Downs, site of the Kentucky Derby, and Santa Anita Park, in Arcadia, Calif., as well as the managers of major entertainment destinations, will pay huge fees to run the three New York tracks."

Huge fees? Huge fees to take over racetracks that have been losing money for a decade or more? To sign on to get involved with a governor who is constantly changing the rules and his plan? To pay for racetracks when you'll never own the land they sit on? To pony up to buy tracks who compete with government-run off-track betting companies? Huge fees to become part of the horse racing business? Something that isn't making anyone any money.

There's just too much risk involved in buying the New York racetracks and the potential reward is limited. It will be a buyers' market, that is if there are any buyers. **Feedback for publication? Email [suefinley@thetdn.com](mailto:suefinley@thetdn.com).**

"It started out as a hobby and turned into a real business for us," laughed Marino.

The Marinos bought Ostourah's second dam, Witchkin--in foal to Deputed Testamony--for a bargain \$1,700 at the 1998 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale from Blue Ridge Farm, agent.

"I liked her conformation," said Marino. "She seemed really well-balanced."

For the brothers, the mare produced several winners, including stakes-placed Eddie White Sox (Deputed Testamony) and Jovanna (Minardi), in addition to graded-stakes placed Dream of Kaylee (Cactus Ridge).

The 34-acre J M Stables, which serves primarily as a boarding and foaling facility for outside clients, is also home to a pair of Marino-owned mares, including the homebred Bella Dorato, who was stakes placed during her racing career before retiring with \$103,420 in earnings.

"She was a nice racemare," recalled Marino. "She had some physical issues that cut her career short, so we thought she would make a good broodmare."

Also foaled at the Marinos New York farm, Bella Dorato was shipped down to Marvin Little's Meadowlark Valley Farm, located in Paris, to take advantage of that state's Kentucky-bred program. Her first foal, Troponin (Shaniko), proved useful, winning on three occasions. But it was her second foal that put her on the map. The Marinos opted to breed Bella Dorato to graded-stakes winner Teufflesberg (Johannesburg), who was a first-year stallion at the time, for several reasons.

"We liked his pedigree and she matched up well with him," explained Marino. "He was a first-season stallion but we took a chance because he was a hard-knocking racehorse."

Foaled at Meadowlark Valley, Trinniberg--consigned by Beau Lane Bloodstock--brought just \$1,500 from M&H Training and Sales at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale.

"We decided to let him go cheap, I can kick myself, but you can't race them all," admitted Marino.

Returned to the ring at the OBSAPR sale the following season, the colt realized a \$21,000 final bid from Parbhoo Shivananda. In what turned out to be a great bargain, Trinniberg finished runner-up in the GI Hopeful S. and GII Nashua S. at two before winning this season's GIII Swale S., Bay Shore S. and GII Woody Stephens S.

Going back to the well in hopes that lightning would strike twice, the Marinos bred Bella Dorato back to Teufflesberg in 2009 and the result was Ostourah.

"Trinniberg was a good-looking young horse," recalled Marino. "Trinniberg was a strong and tough colt. The filly was a very nice-looking filly. She was just easier to handle."

Sold for \$80,000 to Fred Hertrich at the Fasig-Tipton October sale, the filly blossomed into a \$450,000 juvenile for Hertrich and the McKathan Brothers when trainer Chad Brown, acting on behalf of AbdullahSaeed Almaddah, stepped in to secure the filly at the Fasig-Tipton 2-year-olds in training sale in May.

This year, Bella Dorato produced a foal by Bandini in May, which subsequently died. The decision was made to leave the mare open for 2013 which, according to Marino, was largely because Bella Dorato would be offered at Fasig-Tipton in November.

"Since she foaled so late in the season, I decided not breed her so, whoever buys her, can breed her to the stallion of their choice next year," said Marino.

In addition, the 9-year-old mare's 2011 foal, a filly by Bandini, will be up for grabs at the Fasig-Tipton October Yearling sale next month.

"Putting [Bella Dorato] in the sale doesn't always mean she is going to sell, and if she didn't, I would consider bringing her back to New York to be bred," admitted Marino. "But with horses like Trinniberg and Ostourah already under her, I think with those credentials she's going to sell."

While the brothers might not have directly capitalized on their homebred's successes, Marino feels they have been rewarded on a deeper level.

"I feel very blessed that things are happening the way they are," said Marino. "I have been doing this since 1985, so it's been a lot of hard work along the way. But it was so exciting when they decided to send Trinniberg to the Kentucky Derby. Just the fact of breeding a horse that was going to the Derby was quite thrilling. We're from a small town up here, so news like that, one of our horses going to the Derby, really got people up here excited. It makes it worth all the hard work."--Christina Bossinakis
