DRESS REHEARSAL AT "GREAT RACE PLACE"

In five weeks' time, Santa Anita will host the 29th Breeders' Cup World Championships, and will offer a preview of the marquee event this afternoon with five "Win and You're In" races.

"We're hoping to have a great day and we'll have plenty of world-class racing," said Mark Verge, CEO of Santa Anita. "With five Grade I stakes and so many horses prepping for the Breeders' Cup here on Nov. 2 and 3, it's going to be incredible. There should be some great betting opportunities, and we expect that a lot of people will be taking a shot at the Late Pick 4."



Game On Dude (Awesome Again), perfect in four Santa Anita appearances, would likely seal favoritism for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic with the right performance in today's \$250,000 GI Awesome Again S. Rider Rafael Bejarano will take over steering duties from Chantal Sutherland. "He'll get a little test drive before the Breeders' Cup," trainer Bob Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. **Include Me Out** (Include) has established herself as the finest distaffer on the West Coast, and could add to her reputation in the \$250,000 GI Zenyatta S. The \$250,000 GI Rodeo Drive S.--previously known as the Yellow Ribbon--has a competitive group of 13 turf specialists, headlined by **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro). The younger set will get their chance to shine earlier in the card in the GI Chandelier S. and GI FrontRunner S., which in their previous incarnations went by the Oak Leaf and Norfolk, respectively. Baffert trains ♀ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♀ **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai), who will be odds-on in the Chandelier. **Cont. p8**

Belmont stages its traditional Super Saturday card this afternoon, with six Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" races anchored by the \$1-million GI TVG Jockey Club Gold Cup. The Gold Cup has produced seven winners of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, including the last two in **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) and **Blame** (Arch). Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic heroine **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) will tune up for her title defense in the GI Beldame S. earlier on the Super Saturday program. **Cont. p4**

as she extended her unbeaten record in stylish fashion in the G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile at Newmarket yesterday. Made to fight for her latest success in

Doncaster's G2 May Hill S. by Purr Along (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}), the 4-6 pick had no problem dealing with this

field once she had been committed approaching the quarter pole by Mickael Barzalona and, despite veering left in the closing stages, recorded a 4 1/2-length verdict over **Roz** (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}). Sir Robert Ogden's homebred **Amazonas** (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) rounded out the top three. "She's a top-notch filly and she's done that very well," Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented after **Certify** had emulated the operation's White Moonstone (Dynaformer) and Lyric of Light (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}) and provided a third consecutive edition. "She might have been a little bit isolated over that last furlong and was hanging a bit, but she has fulfilled all of our expectations today."

NY Task Force Issues Report

Mike Kane was on the scene in Albany yesterday after Governor Cuomo's New York Task Force on Racehorse Health issued its findings. In a perfect storm of circumstances, the task force said it was not able to identify a single reason that led to the flurry of fatalities at Aqueduct between Nov. 30, 2011 and March 18. However, it concluded that opportunities may have been missed that could have prevented the fatal injuries in 11 of the horses.

Godolphin have proven adept at nurturing juvenile talent among their fillies over the past two seasons, and Certify made an instant impression on soft ground when stamping her class on a six-furlong maiden on the July Course here July 12. Returning there to beat subsequent G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) in clear-cut style in the Aug. 11 seven-furlong G3 Sweet Solera S., the bay had her first fight in the Sept. 14 May Hill, but demonstrated grit as well as guile to repel G3 Prix du Calvados heroine Purr Along.

Showing quirkiness in the preliminaries here, she settled perfectly for Barzalona with only Amazonas (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) behind early. As soon as she was asked to engage another gear with three furlongs remaining, she produced a surge which took her to the front in less than a furlong, and her only problem from the quarter pole was her own lack of concentration due to lack of company.

"Mickael said she was a little bit funny and touchy today and she didn't want to go in the gates and a bit awkward," Simon Crisford said. "Maybe that's a sign that she's done enough this year, so we'll think about that and watch the video. She's done exceptionally well, and I would imagine she will be put away for the winter and a decision will be made whether she will go to Dubai or stay here. Over the years, lots of good juveniles haven't trained on and some you don't expect to have done well, so you can't be confident--you can only be hopeful and all we can say now is that she is the leading filly of her generation.

"If she shows the same spirit and ability at three that she has done at two, she has every chance of winning a Guineas, and she is a course-and-distance winner now," Crisford continued.

Trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni added, "She was excited before the race, which is not normal. She's run four times now and that's enough for her this season, although I will have to sit with Simon and His Highness. She's a lady and we have to look after her. At Doncaster, she showed she was a little bit green and today also, as she was in front a long time. The faster pace they go, the better, and the way she won today, I think she is better than Lyric of Light."

Certify is a half-sister to 2007 GI Oak Leaf S. heroine Cry and Catch Me (Street Cry {Ire}). Her dam produced a Street Sense filly this past March and was bred back to that Darley stallion.

TEN LINE UP FOR GOLD CUP

Today's \$1-million GI TVG Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont has attracted a solid group of 10, including a pair of sophomores that are taking on their more accomplished elders. Most of the focus, however, will be on the veterans. The Gold Cup has been the most productive prep race for the Breeders' Cup Classic, providing the springboard for seven winners, though the last two--Blame (Arch) and Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor)--were both second at Belmont prior to their winning efforts at Churchill Downs. Bill Mott, who conditioned Drosselmeyer, offers a pair of tough customers today in **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate) and **Flat Out** (Flatter). Ron the Greek showed his affinity for the BC Classic track and trip with an authoritative score earlier this year in the GI Santa Anita H. Flat Out's last win came 12 months ago in this contest, when he was trained by Scooter Dickey. The stablemates finished within a head of one other last out in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 4, albeit 1 1/4 lengths behind winner **Fort Larned** (E Dubai). "I'm very pleased with the way both of them are coming into the race," said Mott.

Fort Larned, Janis Whitham's homebred grandson of Hall of Famer Bayakoa (Arg), has not faced the starter since earning a 110 Beyer Speed Figure in the Whitney. "I'm a little bit apprehensive about getting caught up in who's going to be at the 'head of the class,'" said trainer Ian Wilkes. "I'm just trying to look at it as we've won one Grade I race, we're trying to add another, and then finish up the year in the Breeders' Cup Classic."

The last three 3-year-olds to prevail in the Jockey Club Gold Cup all went on to earn Eclipse Award honors at the end of the year: Summer Bird (Birdstone), Curlin (Smart Strike) and Bernardini (A.P. Indy). While the two sophomores in this year's field, **Fast Falcon** (Awesome Again) and **Atigun** (Istan), don't have those credentials just yet, but are improving sorts. They finished third and fourth, respectively, last out in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 25.

MORE MAGIC FROM 'MIKE'?

Priscilla Vaccarezza's **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) already has a berth secured in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf courtesy of his wire-to-window score in the GI Arlington Million last out Aug. 18, but which race he ultimately contests at the championships event at Santa Anita Nov. 3 largely depends on his performance this afternoon in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at Belmont. Having primarily campaigned at a mile while winning 11 of 19 career starts, the Florida-bred handled 10 panels in his latest, and is one of two Dale Romans trainees in this \$600,000 contest. "You're always concerned about something you haven't done before," Romans admitted. "But he got the mile and a quarter easy enough, and, hopefully, he can go ahead and get the mile and a half. It will be the right kind of pace. Automatically, a horse with that kind of speed, the shorter the better, but it's a totally different pace scenario. If he gets three-quarters in 1:15, then all he has to do is sprint home. Running a mile, he's liable to go 1:10." Stablemate **Finnegans Wake** (Powerscourt {GB}) is the lone 3-year-old in the field. Bred by Jerry Crawford and carrying the colors of Donegal Racing, the bay comes off a rallying second in the GI Secretariat S. on the Arlington Million undercard, and seems to be improving with every added furlong.

BROWN RUNNERS READY TO DELIVER

Trainer Chad Brown saddled last year's GI Flower Bowl heroine **Stacelita** (Fr) (Monsun {Ger})--who ultimately earned Eclipse Award honors--and is doublefisted this time with favorites **Zagora** (Fr) (Green Tune) and **Dream Peace** (Ire) (Dansili {GB}). Since arriving on these shores, Zagora has mainly concentrated on races in the 8 1/2- to nine-furlong range, including a course-record-setting triumph in the GII Ballston Spa S. at Saratoga Aug. 25. However, she won at today's 10-furlong distance as a 3-year-old in the G3 Prix de Psyche, and also missed by a head in the 2011 GII New York H. over this course.

"She's done it over in Europe, she's done it here," Brown pointed out. "The question is, can she run her best race at 1 1/4 miles? Is she a Grade 1 horse at 1 1/4 miles? After the [Ballston Spa] I was leaning towards the [GI] Spinster [at Keeneland], but when I watch her moving, I think she's absolutely in career form right now, physically, so I'm willing to try 1 1/4 miles again because she is doing so well. The distance of the Spinster looks appealing, but I'd rather take my chances on the turf and go a little farther than she wants to go, than go for the unknown on the Polytrack." Haras d'Etream's **Dream Peace** captured the G3 Prix de la Nonette last summer before finishing third by a head in the GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. In her final start for trainer Rod Collet, the bay split **Winter Memories** and **Zagora** in the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 28, and has been with Brown since that effort.

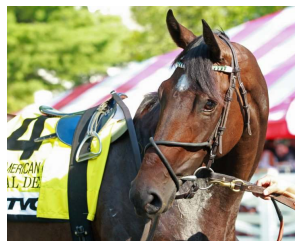

The coupled entry of **Sean Avery** (Cherokee Run) and **The Lumber Guy** (Grand Slam), installed as the 7-2 morning-line second choice, will face eight other competitors in today's GI Vosburgh Invitational S., at Belmont, a "Win and You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 3.

Last year's GI Vanderbilt H. winner Sean Avery returned from a year-long break to take the Affiliate S. at this track and trip Sept. 8, besting fellow entrants **Zero Rate Policy** (Trippi) and **Royal Currier** (Red Bullet), who finished second and third, respectively. Returning from a four-month hiatus, The Lumber Guy will shorten up after going a mile in his GII Jerome S. victory at Aqueduct Apr. 21 and fading to sixth in the 1 1/8-mile GII Peter Pan S. May 12. "I don't know how it will set up, but I think he'll be close to the pace," said trainer Mike Hushion. "I don't know if he'll be the pace or not. He's very sharp right now. We'll see how fast and how far he can run."

Morning-line favorite **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai) is due for a win, last getting his picture taken in a muddy optional claimer at this track May 4.

He has since finished runner-up in the GII True North H. behind **Caixa Eletronica** (Arromanches) June 9, rounded out the trifecta behind Royal Currier in Monmouth's Mr. Prospector S. July 8 and was necked out by **Poseidon's Warrior** (Speightstown) in the muddy renewal of the GI Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga Aug. 5.

Although the Todd Pletcher-trained Caixa Eletronica has been out of the money in his last three starts, the closer could figure into this speed-heavy field. Not only does his running style figure, but he's proven at this track and trip, having won the GII True North H. earlier in the season. "He's training as well as ever," said Pletcher. "We are hoping for a fast pace like the True North."

The Dale Romans trainee was scratched from the GI Forego S. Sept. 1 after developing a cough, but looks to be in good order, having last posted a five-panel 1:00.80 bullet work at Churchill Sept. 23. "[That] was as good of a work as he's ever had, and we did the right thing by skipping the Forego," said Romans. "We're looking for a big effort from him."

Before taking Saratoga's GI Woodward S. going nine panels Sept. 1, **To Honor And Serve** (Bernardini) was third to Shackleford in the Met Mile and finished fourth in the GII Suburban H. over this track and trip July 7, albeit with an alibi. "He was fourth, beaten [7 1/2 lengths] or so in the Suburban," said conditioner Bill Mott. "But that's the reason we skipped the Whitney and gave him a little rest until earlier September, in the hopes that the weather was cooling off a bit. And he seems to be doing well. I mean, he's bounced back since then, since the Woodward, and I think part of it is because he does better in the cool weather."

The Bob Baffert-trained Game on Dude was caught late that day by 3-year-old Dullahan (Even the Score) after breaking slowly and gaining the lead on the backstretch. Owned by Joe Torre's Diamond Pride LLC, Lanni Family Trust, Mercedes Stable LLC and Bernie Schiappa, he is the 3-5 morning line favorite, and will be ridden by Rafael Bejarano for the first time since last January. Richard's Kid has had a productive summer since returning from a two-year stint in Dubai. Decisive winner of the Prove It S. at Betfair Hollywood Park June 8, he was second to Game on Dude in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup over the same track July 7. The 7-year-old took the GIII Cougar II H. at Del Mar July 27 before a private purchase by a partnership including D. Kenney, Triple B Farms and Westside Rentals saw him transferred from Baffert to the barn of Leandro Mora, assistant trainer to the then-suspended Doug O'Neill. Richard's Kid will make his first official start for O'Neill here. "I think we should be in a good spot, and I love picking up Garrett [Gomez] for the race," said Dennis O'Neill, assistant trainer to his brother. "There's nobody better at coming from behind than him. The [Pacific Classic] was a throw out. He had a horrendous trip, got left coming out of there and just got dead stopped when he was trying to make his run." Jay Em Ess Stable's Grade I winner **Rail Trip** (Jump Start) found the winner's circle for the first time in more than two years when he took the GII San Diego H. at Del Mar July 28. The 7-year-old gelding finished fourth last out in the GI Pacific Classic after stalking the pace. **Field p9**

WHAT DO YOU KNOW?

The GI FrontRunner S.--previously known as the Norfolk S.--today at Santa Anita brings together an interesting group of 11 2-year-old males seeking a berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 3. J. Paul Reddam's **Know More** (Lion Heart) made an auspicious debut in the GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 5, then ran out of real estate when second in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 5. "He's a nice horse that's willing to cooperate," said jockey Garrett Gomez. "The way he's run his first two races, the two turns won't bother him a bit. He'll relax early on no matter if he's real close or behind, depending on what kind of pace

there is." Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' **Capo Bastone** (Street Boss) earned ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ status for his eye-catching rally first out at Del Mar Aug. 4, but encountered traffic en route to a fourth in the Del Mar Futurity. "He didn't get any kind of a trip at all," trainer John Sadler told *Daily Racing Form*. Freshman sire Street Hero (Street Cry {Ire}), who captured the 2008 Norfolk, is represented by two youngsters here in **Gabriel Charles** and **Dirty Swagg**. Gabriel Charles also had a tough time of it in the Del Mar Futurity, crossing the line sixth after drawing the rail. Dirty Swagg, a Myung Kwon Cho homebred, is a half-brother to Grade I winner Lovetheway Youare (Arch), who will contest the GI Zenyatta S. later on today's card. The bay earned his diploma when stretched out to a mile at Del Mar Sept. 1. In addition to being a "Win and You're In" race for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the FrontRunner is also the first opportunity for this year's crop to earn Kentucky Derby qualifying points under the controversially revamped system. First- through fourth-place finishers will accrue 10-4-2-1 for their efforts.

Trainer Bob Baffert has a trio of juveniles set to go in the FrontRunner, including the unbeaten **Carving**, who just happens to be the first racehorse purchased by Olympic gold medallist Bode Miller. "I would always see Bode at the [Kentucky] Derby and he would hang out with us at Del Mar," Baffert told Santa Anita's Ed Golden. "The day after the Preakness I was checking out horses at a sale [Fasig-Tipton Midlantic] for my other clients and I think he got the bug.

"He said, 'I might be interested in something in the 50, 60 [thousand dollar] range.' So we looked, but we really couldn't find anything at that price. But I gave him a video, a DVD, of the two-day sale and then he kept texting me, 'This one looks good, that one looks good,' so I kept looking, and I liked the way this horse breezed and I liked the way he moved.

"He worked OK and I told him 'I think he might be OK for us. If he doesn't work out, we can always run him for a high [claiming] tag at Del Mar.' So I had Donato Lanni check the horse out and send me a picture, and he looked great in the picture. So we bought him for \$55,000.

"He's not a big horse, and when we got him at Del Mar, Bode said, 'Boy, he's not very big,' and I said, 'Well what do you expect for \$55,000?' Carving looks a lot like his sire. After I worked him, I decided to run him for 80 claiming. He broke in a little bit, then he came on and he won [by 1 3/4 lengths at 5-1] [video], and Bode goes, 'I thought you said he couldn't run.'"

Carving built on that debut to take the C.B. Afflerbaugh S. at Fairplex by 3 1/4 lengths Sept. 12.

"The horse shows more in the afternoon than he does in the morning," Baffert added. "Bode lives on a boat in San Diego, but he will be here Saturday. He's all excited, although I told him it's not this easy, and he's going to be stepping it up."

Today's GI Chandelier S. (nee Oak Leaf) is a "Win and You're In" race for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 2, and has been a significant prep for that event when contested at Santa Anita. Three of the five previous Santa Anita Juvenile Fillies winners have come out of this race--Phone Chatter (1993), Halfbridled (2003) and Stardom Bound (2008)--and most eyes will be on **Executiveprivilege** (First Samurai) to see if she can maintain her pristine record. The **"TDN Rising Star"** attempts two turns while trying conventional dirt for the first time here, and has shown versatility in her brief career. Last out, she got up in the final jump to deny **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. Sept. 1. "When she won that race at Del Mar, she cooled out in two minutes," trainer Bob Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "She seems to handle everything. She's very easy to train. She goes out there and wins. That's pretty tough." Since the majority of the Chandelier field is based in Southern California, the \$10,000 travel allowance awarded to the winner might not be that significant, but there are a pair of fillies from further afield. **Salamera** (Successful Appeal) captured her first two starts at Calder before running an excellent second to the speedy Kauai Katie (Malibu Moon) in the GI Adirondack S. at Saratoga Aug. 12, while **Contessa's Moment** (Kafwain) ships in from Prairie Meadows. One filly that has won at two turns is **Butterfly Soul** (Henny Hughes), who roared past her rivals late in the Phil D. Shepherd S. at Fairplex Sept. 14.

In front of his two rivals including Premio Loco while racing against the far rail, he was behind the G1 St James' Palace S. winner Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) as Kieren Fallon set out to test his rivals up the center of the track. As that rival began to tread water before the quarter pole, Penitent was digging in and earned the lead approaching the furlong marker before holding on from the late-charging Side Glance. "We thought he should have been third at Doncaster, as he was hampered against the rail and was showing enough for us to think he retained plenty of ability," O'Meara said.

Waterway Run got off the mark over six furlongs on firm ground at Salisbury July 28 before finishing fourth behind Light Up My Life when in receipt five pounds from that rival in a seven-furlong nursery on the July Course here Aug. 18. Building on that effort to earn a tilt at black-type with an authoritative win in a similar event over that trip at York last time Sept. 9, the bay justified that decision and market support with a hard-fought success in squally conditions. "She has a nice cruising speed, traveled great and picked up nicely. Although she's not very big, she's a tough little filly and is very uncomplicated. She's very laid-back, so traveling overseas wouldn't be a problem for her. A mile is certainly going to be her best trip next year."

Unbridled's Note, a first-out winner at Churchill last fall, was given some time to regroup after coming up short in Oaklawn's Triple Crown preps. The bay resurfaced with a solid optional-claiming tally under the Twin Spires June 17, and followed that with a third in the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga July 29. He encountered plenty of traffic next out in the GI Foxwoods King's Bishop S. at the Spa Aug. 25, but still came within a half-length of winner Willy Beamin (Suave) while being forced to settle for third.

Trying turf for the first time on this unique course, the sophomore was sent off as the tepid favorite, and came through for his backers.

He was able to secure a good spot in fourth despite his outside post, and dashed past pacesetter Chosen Miracle in the lane for his first black-type trophy.

"We got a little updraft with him early in the year,, but this puts us in a position to make the [GI] Breeders' Cup

[Turf Sprint at Santa Anita Nov. 3] with him," said Scott Blasi, assistant to winning trainer Steve Asmussen. "I just told [jockey] Corey [Nakatani] to put him in a good spot and see if he liked it or not. They either like it or they don't, but he's bred to like the grass, and he's a really talented colt."

Previously known as the Morvich, this traditional opening day feature was renamed in honor of Hall of Fame rider Eddie Delahoussaye.

"It's an honor to win this race," said Nakatani. "Eddie was one of the guys I idolized when I first started. It's good to get that first stakes win for the meet out of the way. This horse is a good enough horse to put me in the position I needed to be in to win. The key is if they handle it, and he handled it just fine. It's Eddie D.'s day today, though. He's a great asset to the sport."

She may have one of the least possessing names in training, but Ahmad Alkhalafi's **Maureen (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) could sprinkle some stardust on Newmarket's Rowley Mile in today's G1 Cheveley Park S. Unlucky when second to **Sendmylovetorose (GB)** (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. over this trip on the July Course July 13, the Richard Hannon trainee made amends with a comfortable defeat of **Sandreamer (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and **Hoyam (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) in the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot last time July 28. "It was probably a blessing in disguise that Maureen missed the Lowther, as she has really thrived for the break and has even grown a little as well as thickening out in all the right places," her conditioner said. "She looks to have improved again since she won the Princess Margaret at Ascot two months ago, and we could not be happier with her." Jockey Richard Hughes partnered Clipper Logistics' unbeaten **Rosdhu Queen (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) to win the Aug. 23 G2 Lowther S. at York and Milton Express Limited's **Winning Express (Ire)** (Camacho {GB}) to go two-for-two in the Listed Dick Poole Fillies' S. over this trip at Salisbury Sept. 6, but opts for Maureen today. "Maureen is giving me a great feel at home, but I have also ridden what I consider the two main dangers, Rosdhu Queen and Winning Express, and, while they are two talented unbeaten fillies, if I had to choose between the three as to which I rode, I would honestly still plump for Maureen," Hughes confirmed. "The great thing about my filly is that she is so uncomplicated--I can hold her up or ride her from the front. It makes no difference--she is just very good." Sir Henry Cecil last won Newmarket's G1 Kingdom of Bahrain Sun Chariot S. in 1988 with the great Indian Skimmer, and today's renewal sees the master of Warren Place saddle one who could yet emerge as a leading light in **Beauty Parlour (GB)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). Handed charge of Ecurie Wildenstein's **"TDN Rising Star"** after her first reversal in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly June 17, the homebred reverts to the mile trip over which she won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 13. "Beauty Parlour joined us in mid-July and has had some time off since finishing second in the Prix Diane [for Elie Lellouche]," Cecil said. "She seems to be in good form and has shown us she likes plenty of cut in the ground." Cecil also puts forward **Chachamaidee (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), who was controversially awarded the G1 Matron S. over this trip on the disqualification of Duntle (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) at Leopardstown last time Sept. 8. Runner-up to Sahpresa (Sahm) as that French filly made history when taking this for the third time 12 months ago, Tony Evans's admirably consistent mare will need the ground not to deteriorate further over a trip that stretches her. "Chachamaidee, who is happier on faster ground, has held her form very well all season and we are hoping that she can run another good race," her trainer added. Last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality) has returned even better this term, building on a return second in the July 13 G1 Falmouth S. on the July course here when winning the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville 16 days later. Third in that venue's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois on her third quick appearance last time Aug. 12, Teruya Yoshida's diminutive starlet arrives here with stable confidence high. "Elusive Kate is in fine form and has been freshened up a bit since Deauville," trainer John Gosden commented. "It looks a phenomenal race, but she's run well this year and is a tough little cookie." Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Up (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is on a roll after wins in the Curragh's nine-furlong G3 Lanwades Stud Fillies S. Aug. 26 and G2 Blandford S. over a furlong further Sept. 9, and the Ballydoyle runner has only a length to make up on Beauty Parlour on their running in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches.

NY TASK FORCE CALLS FOR CHANGES

As many as half of the 21 equine deaths during the Aqueduct Racetrack winter meet could have been avoided, the New York Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety said in a report issued Friday at the state Capitol in Albany, New York.

In a perfect storm of circumstances, the task force said it was not able to identify a single reason that led to the flurry of fatalities at Aqueduct between Nov. 30, 2011 and March 18. However, it concluded that opportunities may have been missed that could have prevented the fatal injuries in 11 of the horses.

During its five months of work, the task force said it did not discover any illegal or criminal activity; specific problems with the surface of the inner track used for winter racing, which it described as "state-of-the-art"; or the use of illegal drugs that produced the unusually high number of breakdowns.

The four-person task force was appointed by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board at the request of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo's office in the wake of an unusually high number of catastrophic injuries on the inner track at Aqueduct. The task force was composed of two veterinarians, Dr. Scott Palmer, a distinguished New Jersey equine surgeon, who chaired the group, and Dr. Mary Scollay-Ward, the equine medical director for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission; retired Hall of Fame jockey Jerry Bailey; and equine and racing law attorney Alan Foreman. Due to a previous commitment, Bailey was unable to attend the public presentation of the report and the press conference.

"We operated with complete autonomy," Palmer said. "This report represents the independent work product of the task force without any influence whatsoever by any external individuals or organizations other than the professionals that we consulted or hired.

"This report is intended to be a constructive analysis identifying actions with the potential to prevent or mitigate injuries to horses and riders. It is not intended to assign blame or pass judgement."

Governor Cuomo did not participate in the meeting to issue the report. Howard Glaser, director of state operations and the point man for the administration on racing matters, including the takeover of the New York Racing Association, presided and introduced the task force members, who each spoke about sections of the investigations and the conclusions that had been reached. Glaser provided a summary of the issues and major changes that will be made in the state.

"I think this is the most comprehensive overhaul of horse racing regulations in the state, if not in the nation," Glaser said.

In its 100-page report, which was accompanied by another 100 pages of documents and exhibits, the task force identified a number of factors that may have led to the injuries and deaths:

- A substantial jump in purses, especially in mid- and low-level claiming races, from revenue from the Resorts World casino at Aqueduct led to owners and trainers running horses that were at risk of serious injuries. Eighteen of the 19 horses that died from musculoskeletal injuries were running in those type of races.
- The use of corticosteroids and other therapeutic medications may have made it difficult for trainers and veterinarians to identify pre-existing conditions.
- A lack of consistency in pre-race inspections and procedures.
- What was described as "an untenable and inappropriate dynamic" in which NYRA's staff of veterinarians reported to the racing office, which is responsible for putting together the program of races. The structure resulted in pressure on the veterinarians to find that horses were healthy enough to compete.
- The reluctance of jockeys to discuss their concerns about a horse's fitness for fear of losing business with trainers and owners.
- Unusually warm and dry weather during the period of the breakdowns on a track designed for cold weather.
- The Racing and Wagering Board's rules and enforcement policies pertaining to claiming procedures and medication usage may have put horses and riders at great risk of injury.

The task force made 36 recommendations--including a request that NYRA consider installing a synthetic surface on the inner track, that NYRA vets no longer report to the racing office and sharp changes in corticosteroids usage.

"As an industry, we all have to look in the mirror," Palmer said. "The breeders, the owners, the trainers, the jockeys, the veterinarians, the racetrack operators, the regulators, the bloodstock agents and the sales companies. In order to reduce injuries, we all have to make safety a priority."

In a statement, Governor Cuomo said: "New York is committed to placing the health, safety and welfare of the equine athlete as the top priority of horse racing. As we bring accountability and responsible business practices to horse racing, these recommendations will be an integral part of a new and improved racing product. I have requested the Racing and Wagering Board to promptly adopt the changes identified by the Task Force to create a safety-conscious environment for racehorses. I sincerely thank the members of the Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety for their important work."

NYRA issued the following statement from President and Chief Operating Officer Ellen McClain regarding the Task Force's recommendations: "We thank Dr. Scott E. Palmer, Dr. Mary Scollay, Jerry Bailey, and Alan Foreman for their extensive work on the Racehorse Health and Safety Report. The New York Racing Association is committed to safety and integrity in racing. Notwithstanding the recent Aqueduct inner track meet, NYRA's safety record has been among the best in the industry. We further thank the task force and Governor Cuomo for the commitment to continue to work with NYRA as we implement all of the recommendations. We understand that among the recommendations in the report are reform of the veterinary structure, stronger drug prohibitions, and new claiming and purse rules. While we recognize that some of these protocols are strictly in the purview of the NYSRWB, we look forward to working with the State to create an even safer environment for our horses and jockeys."

New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association President Rick Violette also weighed in: "We truly appreciate the dedication and effort that Jerry Bailey, Alan Foreman, and Doctors Palmer and Scollay have put into this report. We will take the time to go over the Task Force's report thoroughly before responding in more detail to their findings. It is, however, important to recognize that New York's horsemen have been fully supportive of medication reform. Many of the recommendations in the report, including those on corticosteroids and clenbuterol, were addressed in the five-point plan that NYTHA released in April, and we continue to support those proposals."

A release from the governor's office said that the Racing and Wagering Board will deal with a number of recommendations from the task force:

- Establish an Office of the Equine Medical Director to oversee horse safety.
- Create an independent veterinary practice structure within NYRA, which will put the health of the horses first and which reports directly to the chief executive officer of NYRA.
- Establish an anonymous reporting mechanism for jockeys to report health or safety violations without fear of reprisal.
- Prohibit Clenbuterol within 21 days of a race.
- Prohibit Methylprednisolone (DepoMedrol®) within 15 days of the date of a race.

- Prohibit all other intra-articular corticosteroids within seven days of a race.
- Prohibit all other systemic corticosteroids within five days of a race.
- Requiring trainers to maintain records of corticosteroid administrations and notify the Stewards in writing within 48 hours of all intra-articular corticosteroid administration.
- Extending the claiming rule that voids claims in the event a claimed horse dies on the race track to make a claim voidable within 1 hour of the conclusion of a race if the horse is vanned off the track.
- Amending the economic proportionality claiming rule to allow a purse-to-claim ratio no greater than 1.6-to-1. The limit imposed this year is 2-to-1.
- Requiring horse claimants be notified within 48 hours of any intra-articular administration of corticosteroids to the claimed horse in the 30 days prior to the race.
- Expanding out-of-competition drug testing to include corticosteroids and clenbuterol.
- Improving documentation of findings of fatal injuries, including the development of standard protocols for handling of horses sustaining fatal injuries.
- Requiring testing laboratory accreditation.
- Formalizing necropsy procedures.

Racing and Wagering Board chairman John Sabini said after the press conference that emergency rules will be enacted "in weeks, not months" to deal with the recommendations.

To the Editor:

Bill Finley's op/ed on Sept. 28 "NYRA Is for Sale, but Who Would Want It?" omits some important facts in its scathing criticism of NY Governor Andrew Cuomo.

Firstly, your statement "the Saratoga cash cow" was contradicted by the former NYRA president Charles Hayward who said that Aqueduct was the most profitable meet. Since Saratoga races at the time offered \$700,000 a day in purses, even with an increased handle, the profit was severely reduced by overhead and purse expenses. Saratoga was not a cash cow for NYRA. It was a cash cow for the Saratoga community which I would guess is a concern for Governor Cuomo.

Also your statement that Cuomo's vision "changes by the minute," which you supported by describing the Governor's proposal to expand the Aqueduct racino and offer Genting a full scale casino and convention center, a proposal rejected by Genting as a not profitable site for them since convention-goers like the entertainment offered in Manhattan, not Queens. Then the idea of a convention center in Manhattan was floated. **Cont. p18**



What is wrong with a Governor putting forth ideas to increase the state revenue, close the budget shortfalls, and reduce taxpayers' obligations?

And who is responsible for invalidating the franchise agreement? Wasn't it NYRA executives who decided to shortchange exotic bettors and who ignored state racing law? Wasn't it NYRA executives who left the door open to invalidate the agreement?

You cite NY Comptroller DiNapoli's statement that his office is not able to determine if the casino subsidies to racing are more productive than giving the money to education. Obviously, the casino subsidies help those employed in the racing industry, but politicians also have to answer to the taxpayers. Hopefully, the recent Aqueduct casino subsidies will be put to good use--to improve NYRA facilities and back stretch workers' living quarters as well as to pursue smart marketing to increase the fan base. Doesn't there need to be some accountability at NYRA for receiving the subsidies?

Whether or not any investors would be interested in buying a NYRA franchise remains to be seen. Certainly the recent NYRA bankruptcy and NYRA's dependence on casino subsidies will be significant factors for potential investors.

NYS OTBs were intended to contribute to local municipalities. Unfortunately, patronage abuse and lack of accountability led to NYCOTB's bankruptcy and demise. Lack of accountability and poor decision-making have led to the Governor's taking control of the NYRA Board for three years. Hopefully, some positive and realistic changes for the industry will result.



"[Trainer] John [Gosden] rang me this morning to say there was a little bit of heat in her foot and she was taken into the clinic straightaway," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe explained. "It is a possible abscess and although I don't think there is a fracture there, there might be some other problem, but I've got to see what the vet says. It's not career-threatening, but I don't want to pre-judge it. She won't run again this season on what I've heard, which is a pity as we thought a bit of her and going into the race it looked a good opportunity to get a piece of a Group 1."

Calder Announces Off Season Stabling Fee:

Calder Race Course announced yesterday that it will charge a stabling fee during its off season this year. Stall space and access to training facilities had been provided for free year-round in previous years. The track will charge a \$10/day fee from Dec. 1, 2012 to Apr. 5, 2013. "The horses that use Calder as a training facility when there is no live racing are able to compete at other racetracks, generating revenue for their owners and trainers and those racetracks," a track release explained. "Meanwhile, Calder must continue to pay for the operating and maintenance costs associated with keeping its stable area open. Current economics no longer afford the luxury of free stabling and training facilities during the period when there is no opportunity for participants to generate revenues for Calder's racing program."

The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation will host an open house at its Second Chances Farm, based at the Central Maryland Correctional Facility in Sykesville, Maryland Oct. 5. "We want to offer our supporters and anyone who is interested in our work a chance to see our programs up close," said Lisa Craig, TRF's Annual Fund Director. The open house will include demonstrations from current inmate-students as well as a discussion with one of the program's first graduates about his experiences. 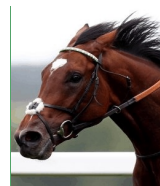
