STAY THIRSTY TO RETIRE TO ASHFORD

Repole Stable's **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini--Marozia, by Storm Bird) is expected to make one more start this year before retiring to Ashford Stud for the 2013

breeding season, confirmed Mike Repole Monday. Repole said he will retain a 'significant minority interest' in the 4-year-old when the colt joins his former stablemate and 2010 juvenile champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) at stud.

"He's an awesome horse whose record speaks for itself and I'm delighted he'll be joining Uncle Mo at Ashford," commented owner Mike Repole. "As 2-year-olds, they

were together at Newcastle Farm in Florida, then they both went to Todd Pletcher at the same time, they were my first two horses in the [2010 GI] Breeders' Cup [Juvenile] and they had there 3-year-old campaigns together. I am so fortunate to own one horse of this caliber, never mind two in the same crop."

Runner up in the GI Hopeful S. at two, the bay returned the following year to annex the GIII Gotham S. in addition to back-to-back victories in the GII Jim Dandy S. and the GI Travers S. During his sophomore campaign, he also finished a close-up second in the GI Belmont S. In his best start this term, the colt found only Flat Out (Flatter) a head too good in last Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont.

"Stay Thirsty has it all," said Ashford Stud Manager Dermot Ryan. "A very fast 2-year-old, he was brilliant at three and at Belmont on Saturday [in the JC Gold Cup], he showed he retains all his ability. He's by a much sought after stallion in Bernardini and he's out of a real blue hen mare in Marozia who has produced three Grade 1 horses and invariably gets great-looking stock. He's a great addition to our roster."

According to Repole, the options for Stay Thirsty's final racetrack appearance are the GI Breeders' Cup Classic or the GI Breeders' Cup Mile--both at Santa Anita Nov. 3--or the GI Cigar Mile Nov. 24.

"He came out of the race really well," said Repole of Stay Thirsty's latest performance. "He's going to go back to training [Tuesday], will have his first official work back in about two weeks and then we will decide which race we think is the best fit." *cont. p3*

QUARANTINE ENDS DANEDREAM'S ARC BID

In a strange twist of fate, last year's Arc heroine **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) was effectively ruled out of Sunday's renewal at Longchamp after a case of equine infectious anemia (EIA), or swamp fever, put Cologne racecourse under immediate quarantine. The finding of the single case of the highly contagious viral disease, which causes severe anaemia, resulted in the horse in question being euthanized and all stabled at the Cologne track put under quarantine for three months, a time span which can be prolonged if more cases occur. Race fixtures on Wednesday and Sunday, which features the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten, have been cancelled. Patricke Barbe, spokesman for Danedream's part-owner Teruya Yoshida, told the *Racing Post*, "The horse that tested positive was stabled far away from Danedream and is not one of Peter Schiergen's horses. It was only one positive test and that horse has been removed from the area, but the stables in and around the racecourse have had to be quarantined. Danedream is in perfect health, cantering well and eating well and is not involved at all in this, but we must abide by the decision of the German authorities. In my opinion, her prospects of traveling are only very small, but we are awaiting official news from the authorities."

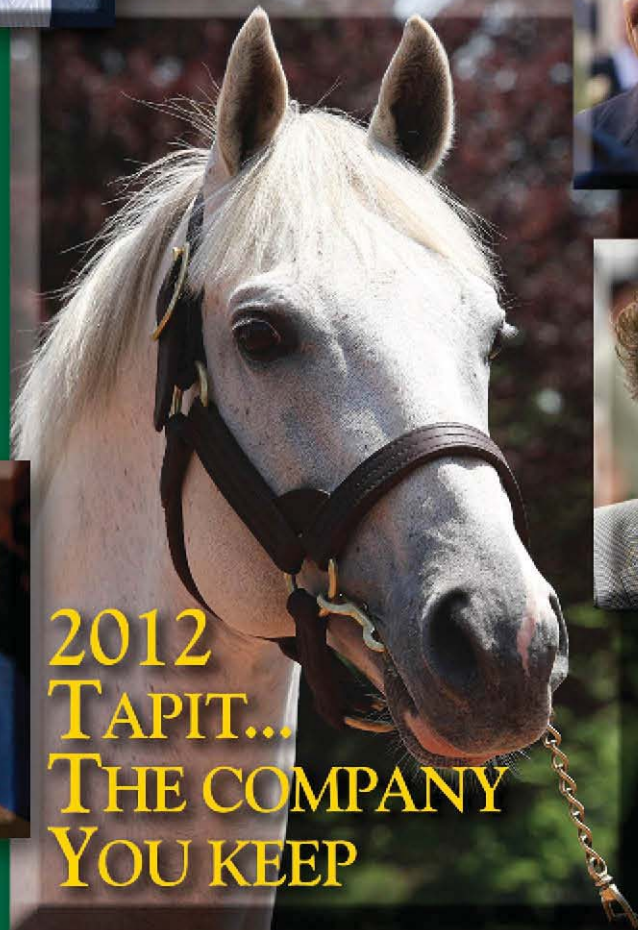
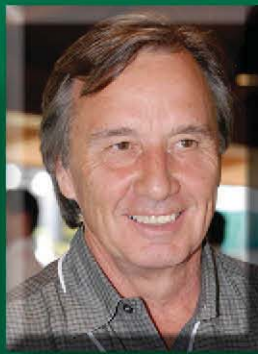

Stay Thirsty to Ashford in 2013 cont.

Stay Thirsty, a \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton February juvenile purchase in 2010, ran from two through four, finishing in the money in 10 of 16 lifetime starts just over \$1.7 million in earnings to date. Conditioned by Todd Pletcher, the bay is a half-brother to graded stakes winner and Grade I placed Andromeda's Hero (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Grade I placed Superfly (Fusaichi Pegasus).

"There was a point in time when Stay Thirsty was definitely the best 3-year-old in the country," commented Pletcher, who was trained both Stay Thirsty and Uncle Mo. "His performances in both the Travers and the Jim Dandy were right out of the top drawer. He's a very good looking horse and he put in a very good work so we had to go to \$500,000 to get him as a 2-year-old."

Regarding the decision to stand Stay Thirsty at Ashford, Repole added, "[Stay Thirsty and Uncle Mo] mean so much to myself, my friends and my family. To know that they will be together again, for me it just felt right. There were many incredible Kentucky farms that were interested in Stay Thirsty. If I could have mapped out a dream scenario for these two horses, it would have played out that they both stand at the same stallion farm. It's played out that way. When I go to Kentucky, I can make one visit and see both of them in stalls next to each other."



With two of its highest profile runners to date already retired or immanently so, the Repole Stable looks ahead with two of its latest, up-and-coming stars--

Micromanage (Medaglia d'Oro) and **Overanalyze** (Dixie Union), who captured the GII Futurity S. at Belmont last Saturday. Repole confirmed that Micromanage will be entered in both the GI Champagne S. at Belmont and Delaware's Dover S., both scheduled for Oct. 6. Plans have yet to be finalized for Overanalyze. Repole also expects juveniles **Coconut Shrimp** (Giant's Causeway) and **Notacatbutallama** (Harlan's Holiday) to start within the next two weeks, before finalizing where his juvenile team will be heading.

"We need to sort them out," admitted Repole. "That cross country trip [to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup] is a lot. I am probably overanalyzing the decision, if you want to put it that way, and I will have a lot of sleepless nights. We'll either make a decision individually or as a group. We'll see."

With Stay Thirsty's career winding down and the barn's youngster's making plenty of noise on the track, Repole admitted he was left with mixed emotions. "Stay Thirsty's loss in the Jockey Club Gold Cup will probably take another three weeks and 40 hours of therapy to get over, but I know how fortunate I am," he said. "There are people in the game that have been in it a lot longer and have spent more money than I have that haven't had the type of success I've had. I feel very blessed to have two horses like Micromanage and Overanalyze, which are probably among the top 20 2-year-olds in the country. I wouldn't trade places with anyone."

81st Annual TCA Testimonial Dinner

TCA HONORS PENNY CHENERY

In a roughly two-year stretch in the early 1970s, Helen Bates “Penny” Chenery went from being a Denver-based homemaker with four children to being the head of a racing stable that campaigned back-to-back Kentucky Derby winners, including one, Triple Crown winner Secretariat, who many consider to be the greatest of all time. During that stretch, Chenery, who was handed the reins of her father’s Meadow Stables after his passing in January of 1973, was very much the face of racing, and along with her horses helped to buoy the spirits of a country mired in political and cultural turmoil.

On Sunday evening, the Thoroughbred Club of America honored Chenery’s contributions to racing at its 81st Annual Testimonial Dinner at the Keeneland Entertainment Center.

“Penny, you were exactly the right individual to be the face of the Thoroughbred industry at that time,” said the man who introduced her, Charles H. Stone. “It was your good fortune to have Riva Ridge and Secretariat, but it was our good fortune to have you and the team at the Meadow.”

Since her triumphant run with 1972 Derby and Belmont winner Riva Ridge and with Secretariat a year later, Chenery has remained one of the sport’s great ambassadors, giving freely of her time to promote racing and its stars, past and present. As written in Edward Bowen’s essay on Chenery that ran in the evening’s program, “She served as president of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association from 1976 to 1984 and was among the first women elected to The Jockey Club. Her service to the sport and its participants reached into many other corners. She was president of the Grayson Foundation, which raises funds to support veterinary research.

And she was a champion of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and other efforts aimed at caring for and managing retired race horses. She allowed the name of Secretariat to be affixed to various fund-raising efforts, including an annual celebration in Paris, Ky, as well as other programs designed to support worthy causes.”

In fact, Chenery was at that annual celebration in Paris at the Bourbon Country Festival, and said she signed 280 autographs.

Chenery was given a standing ovation by an enthusiastic, overflow crowd of 300--the venue had to be changed to accommodate demand--and she quickly got down to business. Chenery began by playfully scolding the TCA for being just the third woman to be recognized as an Honored Guest. “All I can say, ‘C’mon guys!” she smiled.

During a roughly 17-minute speech, the 90-year-old Chenery focused on keeping racing relevant. She noted that the mere gambling aspect of the sport was easily supplanted by other, less expensive forms of wagering, but that the grandeur of the horse is what makes racing unique.

“Go to a racetrack, spend the afternoon, bring a friend,” she implored. “Maybe bring somebody you *don’t* like. We have to promote the live experience of being at the racetrack.”

She also said it was imperative for owners to promote their own horses with tools like websites and emails. “When Secretariat was racing, he had two secretaries himself,” she said, adding that much of the correspondence the stable received was answered the old-fashioned way, by hand.

“And we have more characters in this sport,” she said of racing’s human participants. “We shouldn’t be a secret.”

Typical of her generosity, Chenery shared the spotlight with a few of those characters on Sunday. She invited Secretariat’s exercise rider Charlie Davis on stage with her, and deputized racing journalist Ray Paulick to ask questions to his jockey, Ron Turcotte, who sat just under the podium.

Davis said of Secretariat, "He wasn't a 747, he wasn't a DC-10, he was a Concorde," and paid tribute to Turcotte, a close friend with whom he sometimes travels to attend events celebrating Secretariat. Davis, who is African American, quipped while pointing to Turcotte, "I tell everybody, and I'll tell you tonight, I got two daddies: I got a black daddy, and I got a white daddy."

Chenery was surrounded all night by a large group of family and friends, including her youngest son John, who filmed footage for a documentary he's making about his mother's life.

"The deal is, I get to see it, and if it makes me uncomfortable, he has to wait until I'm gone [to release it]," said Chenery.

Of course, it won't be the first movie about Chenery's life--Diane Lane played her in Disney's *Secretariat*, released in 2010--but it no doubt will provide more fascinating insight on a compelling life.

"In 1973, I got so lucky [with Secretariat]," Chenery concluded. "The horse was a ham, I was a ham, and I just had more fun."

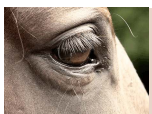

Forgive my ignorance of whether America has an equivalent to rock, a hard candy which is very popular at British seaside resorts. This candy comes in the form of a long, brightly colored stick and usually has the name of the particular resort spelt out all the way through it.

Well, if last week's Shadwell Fillies' Mile winner Certify were a stick of rock, the name running all the way through would be Hurstland Farm. This farm near Midway has been operated by the Nuckols family for a remarkably long time and Certify's pedigree charts a lot of Hurstland's finest moments.

I first became aware of the Nuckols in the late 1960s, thanks to the top-class European miler Habitat, who was bred by the Nuckols Bros.--Charles and Alfred. Appropriately, Certify's third dam, the Bold Lad mare Lodge, is a half-sister to Habitat, their dam being that celebrated producer Little Hut. This veteran of 55 races, bred by Alfred Vanderbilt in 1952, merits being described as a blue hen, as her tally of four stakes winners featured two highly successful Irish stallions in Habitat and Northfields. Even her Mr Leader colt Shack, who was foaled when Little Hut was 24, was good enough to earn a Timeform rating of 118 as a juvenile.

Habitat sired a long line of high-class performers, starting with the very speedy Bitty Girl (who currently figures as the fifth dam of Bodemeister). Although he never quite managed to become champion sire in the era of Northern Dancer, Habitat became champion sire of 2-year-olds on four occasions and champion sire of broodmares three times. Habitat was also runner-up to his half-brother Northfields among the leading broodmare sires of 1992 in Britain and Ireland. Northfields won the Louisiana Derby and Hawthorne Derby before being imported to Ireland. **Cont. p8**

The Nuckols brothers retained the stakes-placed Lodge and it is her last foal, Register, who ranks as Certify's second dam. Foaled when Lodge was 23, Register never made it to the races, unlike her stakes-winning half-sister Guinevere's Folly. This daughter of Round Table became the second dam of Suave Dancer, a brilliant winner of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and the G1 Arc.

Register began her broodmare career at the age of three with a visit to Doc's Leader, one of three stallions standing at Hurstland in 1995. By this time the farm was under the care of Alfred Nuckols Jr. As you might guess from Doc's Leader's fee of \$1,500 in 1995, he wasn't exactly a high-fashion item. Even so, he had collected nearly \$500,000 in a career which established he was tough and talented. After finishing first or second in seven of his eight juvenile starts, he raced 15 times at three and a further 14 times at four. Although a graded stakes success narrowly eluded him, he won six stakes races at up to a mile and an eighth.

Doc's Leader, who was bred by Alfred Nuckols Jr., no doubt owed a lot of his toughness to his sire Mr Leader, who had been a great servant to Hurstland and the Nuckols Bros. This homebred son of Hail to Reason regularly ranked among the leading stallions during the 1980s, thanks to such as Wise Times, Ruhlmann, Quiet Little Table, Martial Law and Hurry Up Blue.

Doc's Leader proved nowhere near as prolific or successful as Mr Leader, but his mating with the 3-year-old Register resulted in Certify's dam, Please Sign In. In a career fairly evenly divided between turf and dirt, Please Sign In won seven of her 33 starts. Only one of them was at stakes level, but she also finished second in a sizeable number of stakes races, including two at graded level at five.

Please Sign In has developed into an excellent producer for Hurstland Farm and its partners. Darley is listed among the breeders of Certify, which suggests that Please Sign In's 2009 visit to Elusive Quality was a foal share. Darley was no doubt happy to participate, as one of Please Sign In's earlier visits to a Darley stallion, Street Cry, had resulted in Cry And Catch Me, winner of the GI Oak Leaf S. in 2007.

Although Certify is a filly any farm would be proud of producing, she wasn't a commercial hit for her breeders. Despite being in Book 1 of the September sale, she was knocked down to John Ferguson for only \$80,000--only \$5,000 more than Elusive Quality's fee in 2009. I notice that two of the five members of the Monday Jury in the *Racing Post* comment on Certify's lack of physical scope, which could have contributed to the Godolphin filly's yearling price. This appears to be the main concern regarding this good-moving filly's prospects as a potential winner of the G1 1000 Guineas. No doubt observers find it hard to forget that Lyric of Light, who was also unbeaten when she won the 2011 G1 Fillies' Mile for Godolphin, finished last in the Guineas on her reappearance. Godolphin's 2010 Fillies' Mile winner White Moonstone was also unbeaten at two, but never ran again. Perhaps the durability displayed by the Hurstland horses in Certify's pedigree, such as Please Sign In, Doc's Leader and Mr Leader, will help this exciting filly to succeed where her predecessors failed. It is encouraging that Certify's sire Elusive Quality also sired Elusive Kate. This \$70,000 yearling won another of Europe's Group 1 races for juvenile fillies in 2011 and has maintained her form extremely well as a sophomore. The same could be said of Elusive Quality's top son Raven's Pass, who followed up an exciting juvenile campaign with even better results at three. Raven's Pass's first crop of 81 foals is shaping up nicely and his 10 winners include Steeler, winner of the G2 Juddmonte Royal Lodge S. last week. I'm sure there is more to come from this winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Everyone knows that Australians are famed for their love of sport, and horse racing (the third most-attended spectator sport in the country) is no exception. With an avid following from the general public and dedicated punters alike, racing-related news regularly hits the front page with champions like Black Caviar and So You Think capturing the imagination and enthusiasm of the wider population in a way that many other countries have yet to emulate.

Within our group of 12 trainees, debate has persisted as to the reason why the Australian racing model works so well. At first glance, the prize money on offer is clearly lucrative, with only the U.S. and Japan ahead of Australia in the rankings by country. The figure becomes even more significant when examined in the context that the revenue is drawn from a population of just 23 million people (in comparison to 311 million in the U.S. and 127 million in Japan). The origin of these considerable financial incentives for owners lies in Australia's highly robust gambling industry, where betting forms an important aspect of the country's culture and is embraced by many as a part of everyday life rather than just an occasional pastime.

But while Australian racing's success is inextricably linked with wagering, it must also be owed (in part at least) to the manner in which the sport has evolved and moved forward. Even from a casual racegoer's perspective, the draw to attend the races is massive, offering an exhilarating social occasion with a carnival-like atmosphere and a wealth of high-quality, modern facilities. Most importantly, eager fans now have a multitude of options in which to further their participation in the industry and even experience the thrill of racing a horse themselves. From racing clubs and syndicates to partnerships and lease agreements, purchasing a 'leg' (or more) in a horse is commonplace and offers racing enthusiasts the chance to experience the buzz of ownership with relatively little cost or risk. Perhaps the key to this approach is that it provides a mechanism not just to attract fans in the short-term, but to retain them in the future; surely a recipe for durability and success in the long-term.

Since our arrival in Australia in August, we've been lucky to have had the chance to experience the unique raceday atmosphere for ourselves, attending several days of high-quality racing at one of Sydney's two premier racecourses, Rosehill Gardens. Last month we were able to see Epaulette and Albrecht complete a thrilling Darley quinella in the G1 Golden Rose, and a victory by More Joyous in the Listed Sheraco S. was made even more momentous following the chance to see her close-up during a memorable visit to Gai Waterhouse's base at Royal Randwick.

Our base in New South Wales has also found us well-positioned to visit some of the leading studs of the Hunter Valley, including Arrowfield, Widden, Coolmore and Emirates Park and the opportunity to see some of Australia's top stallions, including Redoute's Choice and Fastnet Rock. In addition, our farm rotations have begun in earnest, with pre-training, foaling, prep-shed duties and yearlings all featuring in recent weeks. A couple of well-placed trainees recently found themselves under the direction of the cattle farming staff, with a day spent castrating, dehorning and ear tagging calves, with one or two brown snake sightings to add some further 'excitement' to proceedings!

It's fair to say that our introduction to rearing livestock, Aussie-style has been all-encompassing, with a lot more to come on the horizon. We pass on our sincere thanks to all of the Darley Kelvinside and Woodlands management for all their support and help so far, and look forward to working with them in the coming months.

OVER THE MOON

Continuing the trend of less is more, Fasig Tipton posted solid final figures at the conclusion of Monday's Eastern Fall Yearlings sale, held in Timonium, Maryland. Cut down to a single session and sporting a significantly trimmer catalog (375 head) from last year's renewal (535), the 2012 edition of the sale managed to register a slight increase in gross despite cataloging 160 less yearlings than it had on year earlier. Another high point was registered a filly by Malibu Moon, who realized a sale-topping final bid of \$300,000, up from last year's top priced yearling who brought \$200,000. Also on the upswing was average, which rose 22.5% and median, up 29.7% from 2011. The RNA rate also dropped from 26.2% down to 15%.

Listed among the session's highlights, the Liebrecht family's Audley Farm carried the momentum of a successful early sale season through to Timonium, where their homebred Malibu Moon filly fetched \$300,000 from Ellen Charles of Hillwood Stable.

The Virginia-based Audley Farm, which splits its yearlings annually between Keeneland September, Timonium and Fasig-Tipton October, made headlines in September when it sold a Smart Strike--Untouched Talent half-sister to Grade I winner and multiple classic-placed Bodemeister (Empire Maker) for \$1.3 million to Donato Lanni, agent for John Sikura and Bruce Lunsford. Audley also parted with another three six-figure yearlings at Keeneland, including a Broken Vow colt which fetched \$160,000 from British-based agent David Redvers.

Audley entered a pair of fillies into the Eastern Fall Yearlings sale, and enjoyed another positive return. In addition to Hip 81, they also sold Hip 54, a First Samurai filly, for \$120,000. Both fillies were sold under the banner of Rick Charlton's Abbott Agency. Dr. Jens von Lepel, Equine Consultant for Audley Farm, said the breeders were more than pleased with the results.

"We are very, very happy," von Lepel said. "I think this year we're having a fillies year, first at Keeneland, and now we have these two nice fillies."

Von Lepel noted that the prices were higher than they expected, but they were aware they were bringing two quality individuals to the sale.

"The Malibu Moon is a beautiful filly," he commented. "She has a lot of scope, nice conformation and the good thing is she's the only Malibu Moon at this sale, so there was no other competition. We were positively surprised to get that much money, though. You never expect that, and we're very happy."

Von Lepel noted that Hip 54 benefitted from being by the same sire as multiple Grade I winner Executiveprivilege (First Samurai).

"She's a gorgeous filly, very balanced and very racey looking," said von Lepel. "One of the good things is First Samurai is doing so well this year. If we had sold this filly last year, I don't know. But this year, First Samurai has a really nice filly on the West Coast, one of the best 2-year-old fillies this year. I think that helps this filly, so we're really pleased. We didn't expect her price to be that high, but we're sure we're on the right market here at Timonium."

"This sale has been very good to us," von Lepel added. "It's nearby and just very handy, and we have a good consignor in Rick Abbott, Charlton Agency. He's known us a long time, so it's a good combination."

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

October 2, 1943...Belmont Park hosted "Back the Attack" Day in support of the war effort. Admission was by purchase of \$25 or \$100 war bonds. The track raised approximately \$25 million.

October 2, 1976...Forego, assigned 137 pounds, got up in the last stride to win the Marlboro Cup H. by a head under jockey **Bill Shoemaker**.

October 2, 1981...At age 17, **Behavin Jerry** set the record for most career starts by a Thoroughbred, making his 307th appearance. Making his first start as a two-year-old in 1966, he raced every year through 1978, took a two-year break, then returned to race at age 17.

October 2, 1989...Winning Colors, only the third filly to have won the Kentucky Derby, secured the final stakes victory of her career when she captured the Turfway Breeders' Cup S. She was off the board in her last two starts, retiring with a record of 19-8-3-1 and earnings of \$1,526,837.
