RED-LETTER DAY FOR REDMONDSTOWN

The Goffs Orby sale got off to a strong start Wednesday in Kildare, with healthy increases across the board. A total of 152 yearlings sold for €13,553,500, compared to 175 grossing €10,686,000 in 2011. The average of €89,168 was up by 46% on last year, while the median of €55,000 rose by 31% and the clearance rate was 84%.

The only one happier than sales officials may have been Jim Bolger, who enjoyed a day of days Wednesday when selling three of the leading seven lots, including the €775,000 (US\$1,000,186) topper. While Teofilo (Ire) put the maestro of Coolcullen firmly back on the map with

his champion-making juvenile exploits six years ago, Bolger came to Kill that fall to pay €430,000 for a chestnut he was to name New Approach (Ire) and the rest is history. Yesterday's opening session at the flagship auction saw the story come full circle, as his Redmondstown Stud was on the other side of the fence as vendor, and fittingly, it was a daughter of New Approach who led the way. A full-sister to this year's top-ranked 2-year-old Dawn Approach (Ire), who remains unbeaten through two stern tests in the G1 Vincent O'Brien S. and G2 Coventry S., the May-foaled bay entered the ring as hip 12 with a weight of expectation on her shoulders and she did not disappoint. After a frantic round of bidding involving Kirsten Rausing, Peter Doyle had the final say before revealing that she is to join her full-sibling at Coolcullen. "I've bought her for a group of people who were looking for a potentially top-class filly," Doyle said. "She fit the bill and she will be going into training with Jim [Bolger]." **Cont. p3**

PLETCHER JUVENILE DEPTH ON DISPLAY

Todd Pletcher swept both juvenile graded stakes races at Belmont Park Sunday and the trainer looks for another double in Elmont Saturday. While Pletcher has only **Dreaming of Julia** (A.P. Indy), the 2-5 morning-line favorite, in the GI Frizette S., he saddles three in the seven-horse GI Champagne S. The most accomplished of the trio is GII Three Chimneys Hopeful S. winner **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday). The unbeaten colt will break from post two and is only second choice at 5-2 behind his once-raced stablemate **Archwarrior** (Arch). "We were encouraged with the way he rated in the Hopeful," Pletcher said of Shanghai Bobby. "Even though he was close to the pace, he was able to let horses go in front of him and seemed to settle pretty well. The fact he successfully got seven furlongs and wasn't desperate doing it was a good indication that a one-turn mile should be well within his scope." **Cont. p10**

Bolger Enjoys Banner Day at Goffs

The session-topping sale of a daughter of New Approach capped a tumultuous start to the Goffs sale for Jim Bolger, who sent the very first lot through the ring to sell for €300,000. From the first crop of his 2008 G1 Dewhurst S. winner Intense Focus, the May foal (hip [1](#)) is a half-sister to another of Bolger's Dewhurst heroes in Parish Hall (Ire) from the immediate family of this year's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial and G3 Ballysax S. winner and G1 Irish Derby third Light Heavy (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}). BBA Ireland's Eamonn Reilly signed the docket and later revealed that she also will be Coolcullen-bound for a new syndicate of owners. "She's a very well-bred filly and we were happy to get her," Reilly commented.

While the dams of hips 1 and 12, Hymn of the Dawn (Phone Trick) and Halla Siamsa (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), respectively, had low-key racing careers before joining the broodmare band, Maoineach (Congaree) captured the 2008 G3 Round Tower S. on her debut and the following year's G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. in the blue-and-white silks. A half to stakes winner and 2008 GII Jim Dandy S. third Tiz Now Tiz Then (Tiznow), the mare was responsible for the third Redmondstown highlight during yesterday's session when her chestnut colt by Sea the Stars (Ire) was knocked down for €400,000. Hip [68](#) was secured by Bobby O'Ryan. "I've bought him for an Irish client, although I'm not yet sure where he will go into training," O'Ryan said. "Obviously he's by a champion racehorse out of a very talented mare and he looked the part."

How It Was In the Beginning...

As far as catalogue planning is concerned, Goffs could not have engineered a start and finish with more dramatic effect, as the final yearling under the hammer helped to book-end the day's trading perfectly when selling for €500,000. Hip [200](#), by Pivotal (GB) out of the listed-winning Sumora (Ire) (Danehill), is a half-brother to last year's champion 2-year-old filly Maybe (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) from the immediate family of the 2011 G1 Epsom Oaks, G1 Preis der Diana and G2 British Champions Fillies and Mares' S. heroine Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Predictably, the April foal, whose page also boasts Dr Devious (Ire), created a bidding war between some of Europe's heavyweights and ultimately it was Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International Agency who held sway at the half-million mark. **Cont. p4**

That €500,000 sale marked a memorable day for Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud, which also consigned a son of Montjeu (Ire), purchased for that same amount by Demi O'Byrne. With Camelot (GB) Arc-bound on Sunday, the importance of Coolmore's deceased sire is foremost in the mind, and hip [26](#) is another potential star turn from his lengthy line. Out of the 2004 G2 Cherry Hinton S. and Listed Albany S. winner Jewel In the Sand (Ire) (Bluebird), the April-foaled bay hails from a family that Coolmore have enjoyed success with through the likes of Abraham Lincoln (Ire) (Danehill), Devil Moon (Ire) (Danehill) and South Dakota (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). That operation were met with competition from Stephen Hillen before winning the war. O'Byrne said, "He's just a very good-looking colt and a great mover. The stallion speaks for himself and the mare was a very good 2-year-old." O'Byrne also paid €280,000 for the Castlebridge Consignment's hip [55](#), a son of Oasis Dream (GB) out of the 1999 G1 Moyglare Stud S. third Littlefeather (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}). From Edmund Loder's high-achieving family of the champions Marwell (Ire), Marling (Ire) and Caerwent (Ire), his case was strengthened by that fact that he is the sole colt in the book by the Juddmonte magnate, and he was the center of a time-honored Coolmore/Darley tussle. "He's a nice colt and while he is a May foal, he's a good sort for his date," the buyer commented.

Enduring Spirit...

There are few sales of this type which pass without the presence of Invincible Spirit (Ire) among the upper strata and it was a case of plus ca change yesterday when two of his well-connected daughters sold to Moyglare Stud Farm for €420,000 and €330,000. Hip [141](#) was from Lady O'Reilly's Castlemartin Stud, who campaigned champion Rebelline (Ire) (Robellino) to win the 2001 G2 Pretty Polly S. and the following year's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup. Among her progeny so far is the fellow Kevin Prendergast trainee Recharge (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who was second in the 2010 renewal of that Group 1 Curragh contest after winning in the previous season's G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial. "She's a special filly and we know the dam very well, having raced against her on a number of occasions during her time on the track," Moyglare Stud's Fiona Craig said. Late in the session, Moyglare supplemented that purchase by securing Linacre House Stud's hip [189](#), a March-foaled half-sister to four black-type performers, including this year's G1 Hong Kong Derby runner-up Same World (GB) (Hawk Wing), the 2009 G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. scorer San Sicharia (Ire) (Daggers Drawn) and 2008 G2 Norfolk S. runner-up Spin Cycle (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

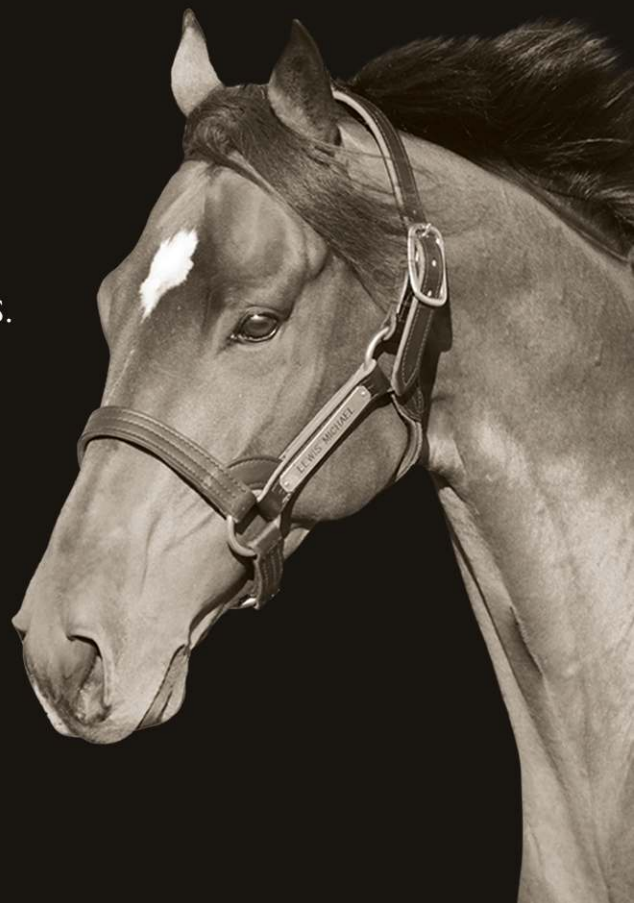

Classic-placed when runner-up in the 1999 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, Karmifira (Fr) (Always Fair) has since produced the listed-placed Keladora (Crafty

Prospector) and, more importantly, the 2009 G1 Prix Marcel Bousac runner-up On Verra (Ire) (Smart Strike), and her Sea the Stars filly was under the hammer here. Having been led out unsold at €280,000 when in foal to the Tsuis' great at the November Sale here, her March-foaled bay, consigned by Dermot Cantillon's Tinnakill House Stud as hip [35](#), was able to secure that amount in her own right yesterday when selling to David Redvers Bloodstock. "She's a filly

with a really good attitude and a lovely temperament and she was Sheikh Fahad's personal pick," Redvers revealed. Redvers also paid €170,000 for Rathbarry Stud's hip [96](#), a son of Teofilo whose siblings include a pair of listed-placed Italian runners.

Fast-Growing Popularity...

Fastnet Rock (Aus) has established himself among the most important of Australia's stallions in recent times and the earliest of his European progeny were predictably well-received yesterday, with his four offerings averaging

€137,500. Topping the list was a colt from Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud who was knocked down to Stephen Hillen for €260,000. From the family of the German champion Scalo (GB) (Lando {Ger}), hip [160](#) is a three-parts brother

to the listed winner What's Up Pussycat (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). He was purchased for Dr. Jim Hay. "I'm not sure where he will be going into training," Hillen commented. "I thought that he was one of the best physicals in the sale and he's by a sire who will hopefully replicate up here what he has done in the Southern Hemisphere."

We Just Can't Pass...

Raven's Pass has enjoyed the kind of first season many expected and just days after his initial pattern-race success as a sire courtesy of the G2 Royal Lodge S. scorer Steeler (Ire), the Kildangan Stud resident was to the fore again. Capping a profitable day for Croom House, hip [119](#) was another filly to demand close attention as a half-sister to this year's Listed Empress S. winner City Image (Ire) (Elusive City).

Her dam is a half to the 2009 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Elusive Wave (Ire), also by Elusive City, while another star of the female brigade to feature on the page is the 2008 G2 Queen Mary S. winner Langs Lash (Ire) (Noverre). Shadwell paid €240,000 for the February-foaled bay. Derrinstown Stud's Stephen Collins commented, "She is a very nice filly and Raven's Pass has gotten his stud career off to a very exciting start this year. This filly looks a very racy type and hopefully she will make up into a very nice 2-year-old."

A Merry Duo...

Later in the afternoon, Hugo Merry Bloodstock made their presence felt when snapping up a pair of colts for €200,000 and €190,000, respectively. The first was hip [124](#), a son of the recently deceased Monsun (Ger) who is closely related to Shirocco (Ger) and who was consigned by Pier House Stud. As well as that four-time Group 1-winning champion and Dalham Hall resident, Monsun's influence on this family also runs through the pattern-race winner Subiaco (Ger) and Storm Trooper (Ger), and there are likely to be scant opportunities to acquire his stock from now on. That increase in demand due to lack of supply may explain why the 105,000gns Tattersalls weanling made so much when he had been led out unsold at €160,000 at Deauville in August. Merry's shopping list also included The Castlebridge Consignment's hip [150](#), a March-foaled son of Acclamation (GB) whose immediate family includes the brilliant Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley).

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



FEATURED LEGISLATOR:

U.S. REPRESENTATIVE RICH NUGENT (R-FL)

District: Congressman Nugent currently represents the 5th district in Florida but is seeking re-election in the new 11th district, after it was re-drawn following the 2010 Census. The new 11th district includes part of Marion County that is home to numerous Thoroughbred farms, training centers, racing stables, the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners Association (FTBOA) and the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company (OBS).

Experience: Congressman Nugent is serving his first term in the U.S. House of Representatives. He had a long law enforcement career prior to entering Congress, including more than a decade as Sherriff of Hernando County Florida.

Impact on horse racing industry: The NTRA hosted Congressman Nugent in Ocala earlier this year to help familiarize him with the Thoroughbred racing and breeding industry. We visited with FTBOA and OBS officials and also met with buyers and consignors at an OBS two-year-old in training sale. Our day in Ocala concluded with a tour of historic Live Oak Stud.

The NTRA federal legislative team is constantly building and maintaining relationships with key legislators, both senior elected officials and newer Members of Congress, from states and areas where racing has a large impact.

CAMELOT SET FOR ARC, DETTORI RIDES

With regular partner Joseph O'Brien unable to make the 123-pound weight allocated to **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, Frankie Dettori will take his 25th consecutive ride in Europe's end-of-season championship aboard the G1 2000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Irish Derby hero, trainer Aidan O'Brien confirmed via Twitter yesterday. Joseph O'Brien will instead ride **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who is set to carry 131 pounds in the €4-million event. "It's a shame Godolphin doesn't have a horse in the race, but I'm really looking forward to it," Dettori said. "I was standing by for Snow Fairy, as Ryan [Moore] seemed set to ride Sea Moon, and what has happened in the last two or three days has been unbelievable. Snow Fairy was injured, Nathaniel is out and Joseph can't do the weight on Camelot, so the ride became available. It's an honor for me to ride the horse. I haven't spoken to Aidan yet, a low draw is key, but we're not going to change his pattern of racing. I'm sure Aidan will come out with a plan and we'll hope for the best on Sunday." Following the enforced absence of **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Ballydoyle's **Imperial Monarch (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who may instead point to the G1 Canadian International at Woodbine, was the only other withdrawal as the field was reduced to 16 in advance of today's €100,000 supplementary stage. Possible additions to Sunday's line-up include the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club winner **Saonois (Fr)** (Chichicastenango {Fr}), Lady Rothschild's G1 Irish Oaks heroine **Great Heavens (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) and His Highness The Aga Khan's G1 Secretariat S. victor **Bayrir (Fr)** (Medicean {GB}).

BARBE QUASHES DANEDREAM RUMORS

Rumors circulated France and beyond yesterday morning that last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) would be a surprise supplementary entry at a cost of €100,000 having initially been taken out of the contest Tuesday in the wake of the EIA outbreak at her Cologne base. However, Patrick Barbe, speaking on behalf of part-owner Teruya Yoshida, was quick to put a lid on the whispers, saying, "It is only a rumor. There is a no-go zone of one kilometer around the [Cologne] training base, and I just can't see us being allowed to go [to Longchamp]. There is always a possibility, but the chances are one in a million unless the German Jockey Club say they made a mistake."

AL THANI BUYS INTO PURR ALONG

Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani has purchased a 50% interest in **Purr Along (GB)** (Mount Nelson {GB}), and the juvenile distaffer will carry his silks in Sunday's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp. The William Muir trainee gave Godolphin's unbeaten Certify (Elusive Quality) a mighty fright when finishing a head behind that subsequent G1 Fillies' Mile victress in the Sept. 14 G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster, and she will remain in the care of the Lambourn conditioner. The deal was brokered by Mandore International Agency's Nicolas de Watrigant. "I'm absolutely delighted for everyone involved," Muir told *Racing Post*. "The current owners didn't want to sell the whole lot, so the deal is perfect and it's exciting to welcome such a big owner to the yard. I couldn't be happier with her, everything has gone to plan since Doncaster and we're looking forward to the Boussac." De Watrigant also brokered the recent deal for the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere-bound Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}). "Her run behind Certify proved she's a very promising filly and we're very excited to have completed a deal," he added. "She's from a great family and it means Sheikh Joaan, who is very enthusiastic about racing, will have two very nice runners on Sunday."

NO RISK AT ALL TO REBOURSIERE

Jean-Paul Gallorini's **No Risk At All (Fr)** (My Risk {Fr}--Newness {Ire}), by Simply Great {Fr}), who was being readied for a tilt at Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe before injury scuppered those plans ahead of his prep in the Sept. 16 G2 Prix Foy, has been retired and will stand at Aliette Forien's Haras de la Rebourriere et de Montaigu next year. Bred by Sylvia Wildenstein, the 5-year-old chestnut was awarded third in Longchamp's May 27 G1 Prix d'Ispahan and closed his racing career with victories in the June 11 G3 La Coupe, back at the Bois de Boulogne track, and the July 18 G3 Grand Prix de Vichy. He retires with a career record of 13-5-2-2, and earnings of €252,575.

NEWS TODAY

DUSSELDORF STEPS IN FOR COLOGNE MEET

As a consequence of the outbreak of EIA in Cologne, the Rhineland course's Oct. 14 meet has been transferred to Dusseldorf following emergency discussions between officials of both tracks, the German Jockey Club and Germany's Thoroughbred Breeders' Association. It is set to feature the country's most prestigious juvenile contest, the €155,000 G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten, and the Listed Weidenpescher Stutenpreis. All horses stabled at Cologne racetrack, which was placed under quarantine restrictions Monday, have now had their blood samples taken for EIA testing and, if no further case is reported, the testing procedure will be repeated after 90 days as per standard regulations.

Once all horses have been given the all clear, those restrictions will be lifted at the beginning of January 2013. However, Cologne veterinarians face a major task in notifying their Europe-wide counterparts so that those tracks which have hosted Cologne-based racehorses may undertake a testing regime of their own. Tracks to be contacted will include Milan's San Siro where Cologne-based runners filled the first two places in Sunday's G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua.

BATED BREATH TO BANSTEAD

Khalid Abdullah's 5-year-old **Bated Breath (GB)** (Dansili {GB}--Tantina, by Distant View), who broke Haydock's track record when winning the May 26 G2 Temple S., has been retired and will join his owner's stallion roster at Banstead Manor Stud near Newmarket. The homebred bay failed to strike in nine attempts at the highest level, but registered seconds in last term's G1 July Cup, G1 Haydock Sprint Sup and G1 Nearctic S., and in this year's G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 19. His two latest efforts yielded a sixth in the Aug. 24 G1 Nunthorpe S. and a third in the Sept. 8 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. "Bated Breath leaves Beckhampton this week to go to Juddmonte Farm's Banstead Manor Stud to take up stallion duties alongside his hugely popular sire Dansili," commented trainer Roger Charlton. "He has been a wonderful horse to train--genuine, tough, sound, and consistent with a bombproof temperament. I am sure when breeders see him they will fall in love with him. We will all miss his wonderful bold head looking out of his box and I will look forward to training his sons and daughters." Bated Breath retires with a career record of 18-6-4-2, and earnings of £419,945.

IMMORTAL VERSE OUT OF ARC SALE

Arc withdrawals have become an unwanted trend in recent days, and Arqana's Arc Sale has not escaped the phenomenon after it was revealed potential sale-topper **Immortal Verse (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}--Side of Paradise {Ire}), by Sadler's Wells) will not meet with her intended engagement in the Saint-Cloud ring Saturday evening. "We've withdrawn Immortal Verse from the Arc sale," Kilfrush Stud managing director Brendan Hayes told *Racing Post*. "No decision has been taken about her future, but she probably won't race again." Impressive when annexing last term's G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot, and when besting Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, the homebred 4-year-old ran third to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in October's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. back at Ascot during a banner sophomore campaign for trainer Robert Collet. She has been off the board in three subsequent starts, having failed to emulate that early spark and was a last-out eighth behind Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in defense of her Jacques le Marois title back at the Normandy track Aug. 12. If Immortal Verse does indeed retire, she will do so with a career record of 11-4-1-1, and earnings of €751,796.

However, the older generation had his measure last time when he finished third to Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) in the Sept. 2 G1 Grosser Preis von Baden, but he regained the winning thread, after a false start here, to deny Dallmayr-Preis runner-up Durban Thunder once again. Pastorius was a shade keen in third early, but settled in to a smooth rhythm four lengths off his old foe in third. Given the hurry-up on the home turn, he was pushed into second with 300 meters remaining and quickened well under continued urging to overhaul the long-time leader nearing the line. "One must not forget that Durban Thunder is a proven Group 1 winner, and he was able to do as he pleased up in front today," commented winning trainer Mario Hofer. "Maybe a start in the [Oct. 20 G1] Champion S. [at Ascot] against Frankel could be an option." A lot of companies offer you the ability to slap your company label on a bottle of wine. This is something entirely different.

Karen and Greg Crouse have lived in the Napa Valley for 22 years. Two things make this wine special.

TO THE EDITOR

My thoughts in regard to Bill Oppenheim's column in yesterday's *TDN* are that 21st century commercial breeders face an increasingly difficult task to please the market, in great measure due to a much more sophisticated buyer that is armed with so many more tools of modern veterinary & statistical technology.

To sell a Thoroughbred sale weanling, yearling or 2-year-old profitably in this environment, it has to have not only great conformation and movement, but it has to pass the buyer's standards on scoping, X-rays and in many cases heart scans, biomechanics, stride analysis, pedigree, breeze times and possibly even DNA.

When a breeder signs a stallion service contract, in most cases the only thing they get in return is the guarantee of a live foal. Thoroughbreds don't breed like cookie cutters & even the best breeders will get foals that are poor individuals or develop problems that affect their marketability.

Until the advent of pre-sale scoping and X-rays, conformation and pedigree pretty much determined the price. Elite buyers began performing their own examinations, but for the most part more of the horses offered were on a more level playing field & the breeder had a better chance for a reasonable outcome.

Today, if the horse jumps through the myriad of hoops, it sells really well, but anything less than that is hard to sell for enough to recover the cost of the stud fee. Buyers can pick and choose amongst these "non-elite" offerings that are just as well-bred for a fraction of the price. A lot of pinhookers have snapped these up for major scores, but that doesn't help the breeder who isn't in a position to put them in training.

This is rather like the difference between Tiffany and industrial diamonds. The problem is the breeder is paying a Tiffany stud fee, but may get a foal, through no fault of their own, that is only an industrial diamond or perhaps even broken glass.

The industrial diamond horse may turn out to be of the finest gem quality on the racetrack, but the only compensation for the breeder who paid the Tiffany diamond stud fee to produce it is enhanced value of the dam or subsequent siblings, which still have to jump through the modern hoops.

With 100+ books of mares, only a handful of foals from a given crop by any sire will be Tiffany quality sale horses. The stud fees should be set as a reflection of perhaps the median of the other 90% or so in a crop. In the modern sale environment, no sire is immune to offspring that sell for far less than the stud fee. When we became involved in the industry over 30 years ago, there was still more of a residual value that was based on pedigree & conformation, but today the variables are beyond the breeder's control, although they ultimately suffer the cost.

I agree with Bill that American breeding is in dire need of top European sire power to resurrect the domestic Thoroughbred, but if you're planning matings for commercial breeders whose mares have predominantly dirt pedigrees, it is hard to recommend a turf sire to them. Perhaps the European market is a bit more forgiving on some conformation flaws, especially if it goes with the pedigree, than here in the States.

I also believe there are only a handful of American sportsmen/women who are involved in racing and breeding without regard for the economics of it, in contrast to many other countries. --Elizabeth Blythe
