If it was ever in doubt, conclusive proof was offered that Galileo (Ire) is the most sought-after sire in the world after he dominated the second day of trade at Tattersalls and helped set a new record for daily

turnover at the October Sale of 25,022,000 guineas, just 24 hours after the previous record had been broken. The champion sire was responsible for the top five lots of the session--and the sale so far--led by the 1.5-million guineas full-sister to this year's G1 Investec Oaks winner Was (Ire), who became the most

expensive yearling sold in Europe so far in 2012.

With Demi O'Byrne having bought the sales-topping Was for 1.2-million guineas in the same ring in 2010, it was no surprise to see the Coolmore buyer and John Magnier poised in their customary position at the top of the bidders' cage, but this time around they gave way to Nicolas de Watrigant of Mandore International, an increasingly dominant player on the European sales circuit. De Watrigant buys regularly for Sheikh Joann Bin Hamad Al Thani, but the top lot was not among the purchases for the Qatari royal.

"I can't say who I have bought her for, but it is a client of the agency," he said. "She is the one you need in your broodmare band. Not only does she have the pedigree, but she moves really well. She's one for the future."

Earlier in the day De Watrigant, who is at the sale with Sheikh Joann's recently appointed bloodstock manager Benoit Jeffroy, bought a Saeed Manana-bred daughter of New Approach (Ire) out of the Oaks d'Italia runner-up Wadaat (GB) (Diktat {GB}) for 400,000gns. This particular filly is for Sheikh Joann, who tasted Group 1 glory on Sunday with the recently purchased Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere. That colt has remained in training with Richard Hannon since his private sale by Julie Wood, and the New Approach filly will join him at Hannon's Wiltshire yard.

"She's a queen," said de Watrigant. "We love her--she's perfectly sound, has a great temperament and she can really walk. We've won the Jean-Luc Lagardere, now we want to win the Marcel Boussac!"

Along with an increasing number of horses, including the €1.2-million top lot at Arqana's August Sale, Sheikh Joann has recently bought Haras de Bouquetot in Normandy.

Magnier Nets His Own Millionaire...

The million-guineas barrier was breached for the first time in the early afternoon when John Magnier bid 1.3 million guineas for lot 249, a daughter of Galileo out of Shadow Song (Ire) (Pennekamp). Described by Demi O'Byrne as "the best filly in the sale," the Camas Park Stud offering is a full-sister to Grade 1 winner Together and a 3/4-sister to Group 1-winning juvenile Jan Vermeer (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). David Ingordo and Grant Pritchard-Gordon both made concerted

efforts to snare the May-foaled filly, but Magnier had the final say, just as he did when going to 950,000gns for another Galileo yearling out of the top-class racemare Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}). This one, however, was a colt, splitting the run of fillies which included the sister to Irish 2,000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor (lot 242). Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock outlasted Jon Kelly, then Cheveley Park Stud to secure the May-foaled filly for 925,000gns. Kelly, who brought his tally of purchases at the sale to five on day two, had leapt straight in with an opening bid of 500,000gns, but dropped out when she reached 850,000gns.

"She's been bought for a long-standing client of ours who would prefer to remain anonymous," Goff commented. "I only saw her yesterday morning, but I just fell in love with her straight away. I could watch her all day. She's absolutely outstanding as a physical specimen and, with her pedigree, she has enormous residual value."

Bred on the magical Galileo--Danehill cross, the same one responsible for Frankel (GB), the filly was consigned by Ted Voute on behalf of the Sangster family.

"I'm over the moon to get her," Goff added.

Cheveley Park Stud's Chris Richardson was outdone on this occasion, but he had better luck later in the day when buying the Galileo filly out of Aleagueoftheirown (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) for 535,000gns.

"She's a most beautiful filly--very athletic and a good mover," Richardson said. "Mr. and Mrs. Thompson were very taken with her when they saw her this afternoon." Richardson has signed for four fillies so far through the sale for a total of 935,000gns.

Waratah Wades In...

Michael Goodbody, acting on behalf of Paul Fudge of Waratah Thoroughbreds, had a busy half-hour late in the day when getting the better of Marc Keller in a duel for Croom House Stud's Galileo filly out of Witch Of Fife (lot 356) at 900,000gns. The Lear Fan mare has been profitable for Denis Brosnan's operation--a full-sister to this filly was the second-top price of the 2011 October Sale when bought for 850,000gns by Sir Robert Ogden, while another full-sister, Cabaret, was a €300,000 yearling at Goffs in 2008. She was sold at last year's December Mares Sale for 600,000gns. Twelve lots earlier, Goodbody had come in with a late, but successful bid on Churchtown House Stud's Montjeu colt (lot 334) out of a three-parts sister to G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Wannabe Grand (Ire) (Danehill), who was knocked down for 725,000gns.

"He had everything--the pedigree, the looks, and of course Montjeu is no longer with us, but he was such a good sire," said Goodbody. "We were underbidder to Coolmore on a Montjeu colt in Deauville and we failed on one yesterday."

The colt may be trained in France where Fudge already has horses, but he also has a filly in training in Newmarket. Named Red Hand (Mr. Greeley), the 3-year-old won at Bath on Oct. 1 and is trained by John Gosden.

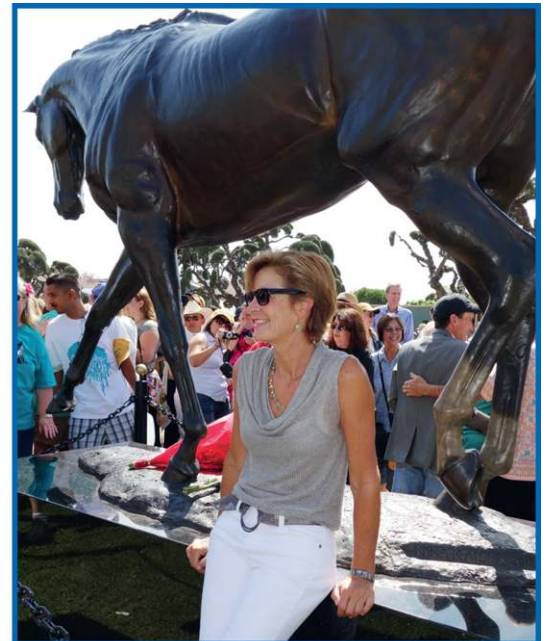

"Sea the Stars is very exciting and we have quite a few by him now," Sheikh Fahad commented. "We've been looking at most of his yearlings."

Referring to the colt out of Sadima, whose Group 1-winning sons Creachadoir and Youmzain are both at stud in France, he added, "We expected to have to go higher for him--I think we've got good value." The colt had been knocked down at 590,000gns, but was not sold when offered in the same ring as a foal last November.

Sea the Stars had three colts among the top 10 lots of the day, including Airlie Stud's son of G3 Doncaster Cup winner Alleluia (GB) (Caerleon), a brother-in-blood to Group 1 winner Allegretto. He fetched 550,000gns when selling to Shadwell immediately before the sales-topping filly entered the ring three lots before the end of the session.





Ferguson Doubles Up...

John Ferguson bought another 12 yearlings Wednesday to add to the 13 purchased during the opening session, taking Sheikh Mohammed's spending over the last two days to 6,215,000gns-- approximately 12% of the sale's turnover. Among the purchases on Wednesday were a Manduro half-sister to G1 St Leger winner Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) (lot 333) at 430,000gns and a colt by Manduro's late sire Monsun out of the Barathea (Ire) mare Pongee (GB), who cost 400,000gns and was

offered by Highclere on behalf of Luca and Sara Cumani's Fittocks Stud.

A quick-fire double earlier in the day had secured the full-brother to Dubawi Gold (GB) (lot 240) for 340,000gns, followed by the next lot, by New Approach out of a half-sister to the Group 3 winners Arctic (Ire) (Shamardal) and Shanty Star (Ire) (Hector Protector), for 320,000gns. The multi-talented Ferguson also managed to send out winners over the jumps at Ludlow and Towcester on Wednesday in his other role as a National Hunt trainer.

Henry Navigates His Way to Ireland...

Coolmore's four-time Group 1 winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) has made quite a splash in Europe with his first-crop runners, and his three yearlings catalogued in the October Sale all sold for an average of 176,667gns. Tony Nerses bought the dearest of the trio, a colt from the family of unbeaten G1 Prix Morny winner Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) (lot 205) from the Coulonces Consignment for 220,000gns. Henrythenavigator's 10 individual winners in Europe from 26 runners have persuaded Coolmore to transfer the young sire from Kentucky to Ireland for next season, where he will stand alongside champion sire Galileo plus three new additions to the roster for 2013--So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}, Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus})) and Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB})).

"We've been delighted with the start he's made and have had plenty of interest in him from breeders in Europe," said Coolmore Stud Manager Christy Grassick. "As well as his Group 1 winner Pedro The Great, they have four or five really nice 2-year-olds by him at Ballydoyle and they think an awful lot of them."

Moroney Seeking Value Stayers...

Park Paddocks has played host to numerous overseas buyers this week, but one making his debut as a yearling buyer at Tattersalls is the New Zealander Paul Moroney. Moroney, who purchased three yearlings yesterday, is best known at Tattersalls for his purchases during the Horses-in-Training and December Mares sales, which he has mined with some success in recent years. However, in the Southern Hemisphere he has of course enjoyed huge success as a yearling buyer, with 31 Group 1 winners on the scoresheet.

"I've put together a syndicate of owners from my brother Mike's stable in Melbourne to buy some staying colts and fillies," Moroney explained. "We buy a lot of horses in training up here and when I look at them they have mainly all come from yearling sales here at an average price of 50-60,000gns. We have to pay an awful lot more than that to buy them later on, so I thought well, if you can't beat them, join them!" He added, "We haven't decided exactly who will train them yet, but it will probably be a younger trainer with a smaller set up who we can work with. We see it as a long-term enterprise; it'll be for three years and by that time we will know if it works. The plan is to leave the horses here until the October of their 3-year-old season, and then we can look at where they are and either sell them on or take them to race in Australia. Nothing is set in stone, but we will run them here first and let them find their mark."

Moroney's purchases yesterday were led by a daughter of High Chaparral (Ire) (lot 313), whom he snapped up for 150,000gns. High Chaparral has enjoyed enormous success in the Southern Hemisphere, and this filly hails from a strong Australian family, which includes the 2010 G1 Railway S. victor Gathering (Street Cry {Ire}).

"I wasn't expecting to be able to get her for what we did," Moroney admitted. "Her half-sister Celebria (Aus) (Peintre Celebre) produced a Redoute's Choice (Aus) filly that sold for A\$450,000 at the Sydney Easter Yearling sale this year, and this filly was one of only three pedigrees I picked out before the sale. She might not race for the syndicate, as there are plenty of owners back home who would fall over themselves to have one like her."

Moroney's other purchases included a Pivotal (GB) colt (lot 208), bought for 100,000gns, and a Rock Hard Ten colt (lot 306) for 60,000gns.

"He wasn't one I expected to buy," Moroney said of the latter, "but he had a lot of Roberto about him and was the spitting image of Second Coming, who I won the 1997 Victoria Derby with."

It may be Moroney's first time buying at Book 1, but he has enjoyed the experience. "I love yearling-buying; for me, it's like going to war. It's a real passion for me."

Voute's Enduring Association...

The sale of a beautiful full-sister to Roderic O'Connor for 925,000gns represented a resounding success for one of the industry's most enduring partnerships. The filly was bred by the Sangster family's Swettenham Stud and was consigned by Ted Voute, who has been selling on behalf of the Sangster family, in his own words, "since Golden Fleece had his first crop."

Of yesterday's May-born filly, Voute explained, "I sold her sister last year [for 340,000gns]. Ben rang me in the spring and said 'we've got a really good one here; I think she'll make between 600,000 and a million'--well, he was dead right, wasn't he?"

Although Roderic O'Connor's Irish 2000 Guineas victory is the most recent Group 1 win on the page, the filly is from a stand-out Sangster family, with her granddam being the Group 1 winner Durtal (Ire) who went on to produce the Ascot Gold winner Gildoran (Ire).

Unsurprisingly, the latest member of the family was the subject of avid attention during her stint at Park Paddocks.

"I've never known anything like it, even when we sold the like of Russian Rhythm and Bosra Sham," Voute said. "She had 195 looks, 39 second looks and 15 vets! She is just such a lovely filly she has been a dream--except when she spread a plate just before she went up to the ring, that was a bit stressful! The Sangster family have been my most loyal clients and I'm just delighted to be selling for them."



Churchtown House On the Mark...

From just two lots catalogued during Book 1, Churchtown House Stud in Ireland hit two home runs, highlighted by the sale of a Montjeu colt from the family of the top-class 2-year old Wannabe Grand for 725,000gns to Waratah Thoroughbreds.

The team got their sale off to a good start on the opening day when consigning a Galileo colt (lot 53) who was purchased for 200,000gns by Richard Hannon Jr. The colt is a full-brother to the black-type performer Learn (Ire), sold here as a foal for 160,000gns, and is from the further family of Virginia Waters. The operation then followed up in some style with their other Book 1 yearling yesterday.

"It was a huge surprise, but a very welcome one," said Michael Gaffney of Churchtown House Stud in Co. Cork. "He's been very busy and we hoped that he would match the interest shown in him. It's really been a great team effort from everyone at home, and they've all done a great job."

The February colt represents the fourth generation of his family at the stud, whose investment began when Wannabe (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}) was purchased by the stud. After Wannabe proved a hit, the stud also purchased her dam Propensity (GB) (Habitat), from whom descends the Group 2-winning and Classic-placed Tamazirte (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), bred by the stud.

"This colt was such a good walker, we wanted to go back to the cross," Gaffney explained.

The 15-strong broodmare band at Churchtown House Stud currently includes another of Wannabe's daughters in the dual-winning mare Masseur (Ire) (Alzao). The stud also owns her 2-year-old Duke Of Marmalade (Ire) filly who is in training.

In preparation for what will almost certainly be his final race in the G1 QIPCO Champion S. Oct. 20, **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) was put through his paces on Wednesday morning with a workout on

Newmarket's Rowley Mile racecourse. The surprise of the morning was that he was without his regular lead horse and companion, his three-parts-brother Bullet Train, arriving instead from Warren Place with another

stablemate, Midsummer Sun (GB) (Monsun {Ger}). Crack work rider Shane Fetherstonhaugh, who partners Frankel in his daily exercise on Newmarket Heath, was kept on board for the gallop, while Frankel's regular jockey, Tom Queally, was legged aboard his workmate by trainer Sir Henry Cecil. It may have been a routine piece of work for Frankel, but it drew quite a crowd, many of whom had come en route to the October Sale at Tattersalls to see the superstar in action ahead of his likely swansong. The champion was calmness personified as he was led down the horsebox ramp by Fetherstonhaugh under the gaze of his admirers and, clearly now accustomed to the extraordinary attention he receives, went about his morning exercise in a completely straightforward manner. Led through the early stage of the mile gallop by Midsummer Sun, Frankel eased past him with around three furlongs left to run and quickly pulled some 20 lengths clear. "We were really happy with that. Everything went to plan," said Prince Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Lord Grimthorpe. "Frankel worked well within himself and Shane was very happy with the pace." Shortly after Frankel's appearance at Newmarket it was announced by Ascot Racecourse that Her Majesty The Queen will be in attendance on QIPCO British Champions' Day--the richest day of racing staged in the country - and will present the trophy for the race named in her honour, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S.

The following is regarding Rob Whiteley's Sept. 27 (click [here](#)) & Oct. 9 Op/Ed articles (click [here](#)).

What has occurred in the U.S. bloodstock market is in many respects similar to what has happened here in Australia: decreasing demand for bloodstock and diminished returns for broodmare owners (referred to as breeders from here on in).

Rob makes mention of competing entities in his first article. In my opinion there is one very large competition currently going on which is inhibiting a breeder's profitability. This competition is the professional breeder versus the hobby breeder. As it stands the hobby breeder is winning the battle.

By definition the professional breeder relies solely on income from their breeding operation to survive. The hobby breeder is prepared to subsidize their breeding operation from an alternative source of income or wealth. Both classes of breeders have been around from the time the thoroughbred came into existence. In more recent times the hobby breeder has grown in numbers and stature. Without the help of subsidies available to their competitor the professional breeder is now becoming more of a bit player in the market place. (Click [here](#) to read the rest of this article).

A colt by Bertrando was the top-priced lot during Tuesday's strong renewal of the Barretts October Yearling Sale in Pomona, California. A total of 174 yearlings grossed \$4,006,600. The average of \$23,026 jumped 36.4% from last year's two-day October sale, while the median rose 84.6% to \$18,000. The buy-back rate was 19.1%. Arnold Zetcher secured the day's top-priced lot with a final bid of \$150,000 for a son of Bertrando. The yearling, consigned by his breeder Willow Tree Farm, is out of the unraced Telling Stories (Tale of the Cat).

FIRST EIA TESTS NEGATIVE

German authorities have announced that the results of the initial blood tests for Equine Infectious Anaemia (EIA) of all 292 horses based at Cologne racecourse have returned negative. After a single case of "swamp fever" was discovered prior to the well-publicised lead-up to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe which the defending champion Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) was forced to miss, a three-month quarantine period was enforced to mirror the incubation period of the disease.
